State and local dignitaries and 300 investors will attend the grand opening ceremony at 1 p.m. at the east entrance to the new building.

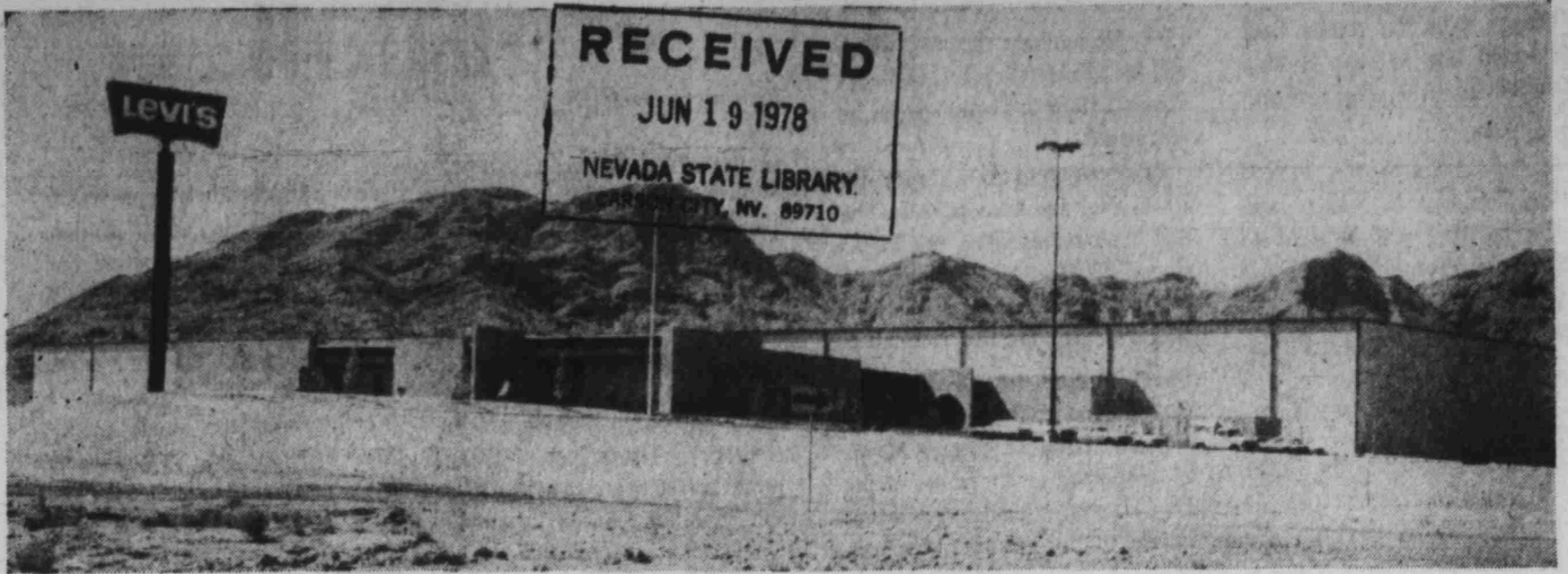
Ribbon cutting ceremonies will follow the opening remarks, followed by a tour of the facility.

### Morry Story

One giant step forward for mankind -- Henderson's mankind was made here Tuesday night when the city's Public Improvement Trust committee voted unanimously to approve a resolution to allow Las Vegas Downs to proceed with plans to finance its \$7,500,000 dog and race track by use of the tax free bonds financing system which is more attractive to bond buyers across the nation.

The resolution puts into motion now a series of meetings of the Trust Committee and the Downs' legal, financial and planning experts to iron out specifics that can ultimately put the show on the road.

Specifics like sufficient guarantees that the bond-buyers would like to secure their investment, proper guardianship by a bank trustee of the seven and a half million as it is expended during construction and early operation; like satisfying the Trust committee and the city of Henderson that the racing project has covered all the safeguards it can to reduce the chance of criticism to the city should the business not make it and the bonds go into default.

It is automatic that the city of Henderson will not have to put its guarantee on the bonds, thus the citizenry and the city are not in any way liable.

It is automatic the risk-taking will be all on the side of the bond-buyers, in this case it is believed they will be insurance company groups who are attracted by the high interest and the tax-free returns for their risk.

Thanks to the perfect handling of the Trust committee's meeting Tuesday by its chairman, Lyal Burkholder, who performed with the same thoroughness that he handled the city's school system in Henderson's pioneer years, the start of the new industry for the community and for Southern

## Dog Racing Gets Nod From Public Trust Group

### Alper Land Request

A request to purchase 21.7 acres of land in Section 35 died in committee Monday night when the City Council deadlocked in a 2-2 vote.

The request came from Arby Alper of Sky Harbor Airport who wanted the city to advertise the land for sale.

"I want to buy it and hold on to it to protect the airport. It is essential to me because it's in my flight path," Alper explained.

He said that air freight is going to be the keynote to the future. "McCarran is busting at the seams and will have to get rid of the freight ... and we're extending our runaways to accommodate jets."

City Manager Bob Campbell said he couldn't see any real need or reason to sell it and Alper replied "the only one

making it valuable is me."

Gary Johnson, director of the Chamber of Commerce, suggested that a future council might not feel the same way as the present council does while Don Dawson, HIT coordinator, said "HIT is advertising air cargo under M zoning because McCarran isn't going to be able to."

"I would like to see him acquire that land if possible," said Councilman Phil Stout. "I think we should get a new appraisal of the land, put it up to bid and hope he gets it."

Both Stout and Mayor Lorin Williams voted in favor of a new appraisal and advertisement of the land for sale while Councilmen Gary Price and Carlton Lawrence were opposed. Councilwoman Lorna Kesterson was absent due to illness.

An indication that the Henderson Public Improvement Trust will cooperate in "getting it on" for the Las Vegas Downs dog and horse race track, was given Tuesday night when the group approved a resolution starting procedures to obtain \$7.5 million in tax free bonds through the city.

Four members of the Public Trust met with officials of Las Vegas Downs, major stockholders David K. Funk and his son, David, along with bonding attorneys and financiers from the East.

To keep the momentum going, the Public Trust group, under Chairman Lyal Burkholder, agreed to meet Monday, June 20 to iron out securities which will be required by the city and to meet on June 20 to complete negotiations for the agreement between the city and Las Vegas Downs.

One member of the Public Trust, Businessman Bill Perry, resigned from the group Tuesday and he is expected to be replaced by the City council next week. Others on the public trust are William J. Farmer, Dale Roberts, and Estes McDoniel.

David Funk, Jr., spokesman for Las Vegas Downs, told the group approval had been given by the Public Trust in 1974 for the sale of municipal bonds for the construction of the race track but a declining bond market had caused them to discontinue the effort. He said the application was left in tact.

In Oct. of 1977, the program was presented to Charles Svenson, vice president and director of finances of a nationally known bonding company and he wanted to proceed.

Svenson told the public trust that such municipal bonds are usually sold by private placement to large insurance companies and they protect themselves. The bonds would not have to go through a public offering. He said the benefit of the public bond for Las Vegas Downs, is that it would save approximately \$250,000 per year in interest costs.

Svenson told the public trust they would like to have another resolution from the trust reaffirming its position.

Gary Baldwin of the Nevada Racing Commission, was present at the meeting and he said all officers and directors of Las Vegas Downs must be approved by the racing commission.

Security

The main concern of the Public Trust group was security in the project for the city.

McDoniel questioned the recent ruling by the attorney general which allows Las Vegas Downs to come in under less stringent security requirements because it was "grandfathered in." He said the Attorney General's first opinion was that they would have to come under the new law which requires security double the cost of the bond. McDoniel questioned whether Attorney Brian Greenspun's involvement in the project and his place on the newspaper might have been a factor, since the Attorney General is running for office. Greenspun replied that he wished he had the influence McDoniel was crediting to him.

City Attorney Kent Dawson said it was not unusual for the Attorney General's office to change an opinion. "I've had three opinions rendered to me on one issue," Dawson said. He pointed out the portion of the law that had been overlooked by the Attorney General's office in the first opinion.

In figuring the security for the project, Svenson said they had been very conservative. The land was figured on \$5,000 per acre and "land values have now skyrocketed in Henderson," he said.

James Richardson, attorney from the firm of Chapman and Cutler in Chicago, said that the bonds which would be sold through the public trust are similar to those being sold by Clark County since

1973. He outlined the step which will have to be taken by Las Vegas Downs before the bonding can be completed.

Brian Greenspun, attorney for David Funk and Associates, said he had been representing the Funks since 1973. He said the track would be good for Henderson not only for jobs but also for the revenue it would bring to the city, which he estimated at \$200,000.

Estes McDoniel, former Mayor of Henderson and member of the Public Trust, questioned a recent ruling by the Attorney General, however, he said he had always favored the project and had voted for it before.

The question of security was left to be discussed at the next meeting.

If all necessary steps can be taken, the Funks hope to have the race track under construction by Aug. and nearly finished by the first of the year. The funding would complete facilities for Greyhound racing and some funding for horse racing. The track is located on Boulder Highway.

Quotes From the Meeting

Charles Svensen—"Prospective lenders will come here to make sure it is a sound investment."

James Richardson—"The lenders will get the mortgage and the money will be held in the bank. Certification will be required that the money was spent on the project."

Attorney Edwin "Ted" Dotson—"I've been attorney for Las Vegas Downs and I'd like to urge the Trust to proceed rapidly. Our dream is in the area of fruition which pleases everyone."

Harry Polk, Henderson Developer—"I'm the seventh largest taxpayer in Henderson and I think this type of financing will cost more than traditional financing. We'll be keeping an eye on the proceedings but if it is done right we have no quarrel."

I've tried to get him to open the car door for me for nearly 50 years," said Sarah Barnum with a delightful smile and a twinkle in her eye, "and now he finally does ... because the door handle is broken inside."

"We were supposed to return to Mesquite that night," she continued "but we knew the folks there were planning a shivaree for us so my sister had a party for us at her house in Las Vegas that night and we returned the next day. We

The Barnum's first home was in a tent in Kaibab Forest. Barnum was working in construction and there was a small camp in which the workers could live.

"There were six or seven families, a cook shack and a dormitory for the single men," Mrs. Barnum said. "I had never cooked over a camp fire before and some of those first meals were pretty bad."

"She could even scorch the water," Barnum interjected with a laugh.

But they both admitted those first months were fun and full of adventure and have provided them with many happy memories for today.

The Barnums moved to Henderson in 1952, following six years in the dairy business in Overton. "I was in business just long enough to lose everything," Barnum said.

He was employed by, what is now, Kerr-McGee Chemical Company until his retirement. Like many other families who first arrived in Henderson in its early days, they lived in Victory Village for several years before moving to their present home on Copper Street.

The Barnums have three children, a son, John, who lives in San Diego, and two daughters, Delores Susov and Annette Winslow, both of whom live in Torrence, California. There are also seven grandchildren, three boys and four girls, and nine great grandchildren with one due momentarily.

by the newly elected president, Betty Scott - "Meld your Community."

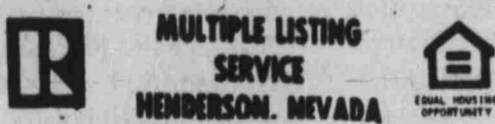

**"A Tradition of Caring"**

Levi Strauss, the creator of Levi's, never married and very little is known about his life, but he did earn a reputation as a generous philanthropist and successful businessman.

He was concerned about the welfare of his employees and was a generous contributor to the community. In 1897, he provided funds for 28 scholarships at the University of California at Berkeley that are still helping students and during his career he supported the private education of many young men and women.

**Continue tradition**

Following in the footsteps of their founder, Levi Strauss locations all over the country have formed Community Involvement Teams.

Nancy Lowe and Bruce Bennett are co-chairmen of the newly formed Henderson Levi Strauss Distribution Center team and they held their first money raising project last Monday — a lunch consisting of two hot dogs, cole slaw, beans and cake. The hot dogs were barbecued outdoors on the patio at the center and

employees could buy a homemade lunch for just \$1.25.

The Henderson Albertson's store and Utah Meats contributed cabbage, hot dogs and other items for the event. Nancy Lowe came to the DC (Distribution Center) from Levi's Cincinnati center and has brought with her several years of experience from serving on the CIT for five years in Ohio.

"We meet two times a month," she explained. "Once to determine how to earn money and once to decide upon a project to support."

"Anything to help the community in any way possible," she continued, "and a lot is time spent, not just money."

**Examples**

Nancy told of helping with children who have had problems ... "Big brother and sister-type of thing where we would spend time on our days off with these children ... just being with them, letting them know someone cares."

Another example she cited concerned a children's home in Cincinnati. She said they were unable to use the upstairs rooms

of the home because it had been deemed unsafe by the fire department so the team raised money for an overhead sprinkling system.

"Caring about other people is what it's all about," Nancy emphasized. "We find a project, then go in and start working to earn the money for it."

**Further examples**

Employees in Amarillo, Texas, raised money by raffling off their manager. He spent his Sunday cleaning up a resident's backyard.

Employees at El Paso, Texas, raised more than \$10,000 for a camp for disadvantaged children, then spent several weekends digging post holes and helping prepare the new camp site.

In Ramer, Tennessee, the CIT planted four acres of soy beans and used the profits from the sale of the

crop to help finance a new community park.

In San Francisco, the team spent a weekend painting and repairing a residence home for runaway youths.

In Blue Ridge, Georgia, the team helped to fence a new playground and park for children.

Employees at Valdosta, Georgia, made clown costumes and hosted the exceptional children from Westside School at a Halloween party.

In Albuquerque, the team raised funds to buy a new bus for the Police Athletic League, assisted disadvantaged children go to camp, donated 22 Thanksgiving turkeys and baskets to needy families, purchased a wheelchair for a handicapped individual, and organized a "shoe store" for disadvantaged children.

**"ROBBERY PREVENTIVE TIPS"**

Listed below are some of the measures that can be taken to prevent armed robbery, to protect employees and assist police in apprehending the robber or robbers.

A. Work closely with law enforcement agencies, ask questions and seek our advice. Prevention of crime is as much ... concern and responsibility as apprehension of criminals after a crime has been committed.

B. Be suspicious of strangers lurking about. If a parked car containing several men has been noticed on several occasions, get the license number and a general description of the men and notify the police. A discreet investigation will be made and no one will be embarrassed in case the situation is an innocent one.

C. Vary office routine, set up a rotating schedule of employee arrivals, lunch periods and coffee breaks. Even though this may cause some slight inconveniences, employees will cooperate if they understand the reason.

D. Leave safes unlocked during business hours. This could prevent an employee being seriously harmed if he did not know the combination or was too nervous to remember it. Never try to thwart an armed robber — let him have the money.

E. Install a "buddy arm" system. A simple bell or buzzer installed in the business next door is a most effective and inexpensive "robbery alarm". It should not be hooked to lights, for a flicker could warn the robber that an alarm has been sounded. It should not be loud enough to be heard by the robber. The alarm should only be sounded if there is no possibility of detection by the robber. He's very alert to alarm systems and a slight movement could panic him and start him shooting.

F. Plant "bait money" in cash drawers and safe, make a list of the series and serial numbers of a few bills in various denominations. Place these with regular cash so the robber will be sure to get them. This money is invaluable to police since a suspect who is apprehended can be charged if he has identifiable money in his possession. The bills can also be traced even though the robber makes a getaway to other states. Always remember that law enforcement agencies consider any armed robber for what he is - a dangerous criminal -- and will go to any lengths to apprehend him.

G. Other precautions: Keep the office or business establishment well lighted and blinds and drapes open to view of passerby; locate the safe in a conspicuous place,

preferably near the front window.

Do not block the police officer's view of safes or cash registers by window displays, banners or advertising streamers. Remember -- make yourself unattractive for robbery to protect your property and enhance your personal safety; make it evident to the would be robber that robbing you would be a poor risk because of the precautions you have taken.

Keep store window displays low so that all areas can be seen, and so the potential robber knows he's in the lime-light, exactly where he doesn't want to be. Counters should be uncluttered and in plain view and arranged so customers' face the street. Install an alarm button near counter areas and have your phone there also -- no on the wall.

Maintain a well lighted business area, both outside and inside. A carefully located mirror or window, by itself, can act as a strong psychological deterrent to a possible holdup man. Have a radio or TV playing in a rear room or office, and try not to work alone. Above all, help spread the word of how safe you are.

You should be protected by alarms, but if you're not, have signs made that say you are protected. Surveillance cameras offer some good protection and help make you place of business look unwelcome to the robber.

Debbie Wellman, active area clerk, reported that two of her section's employees had celebrated

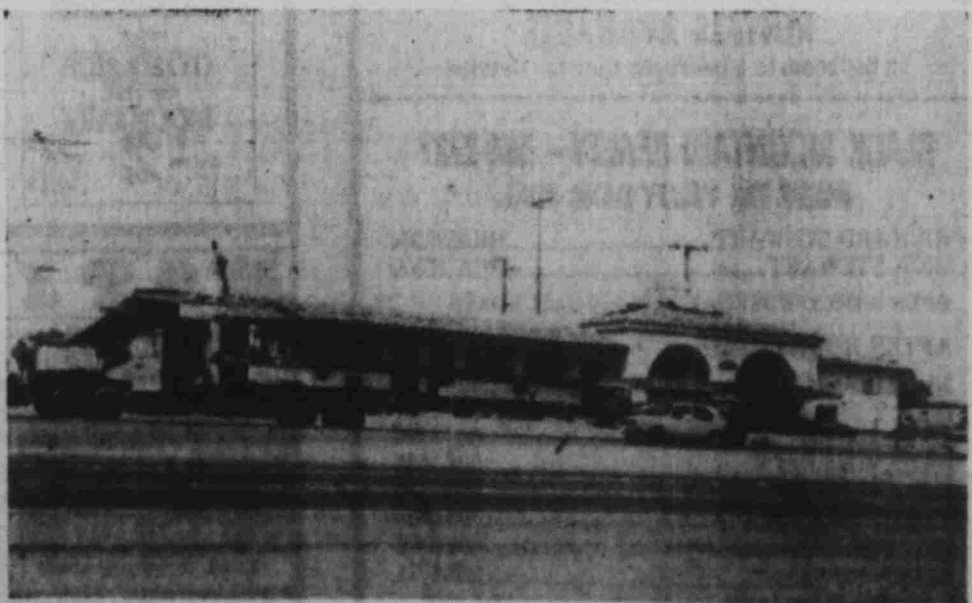

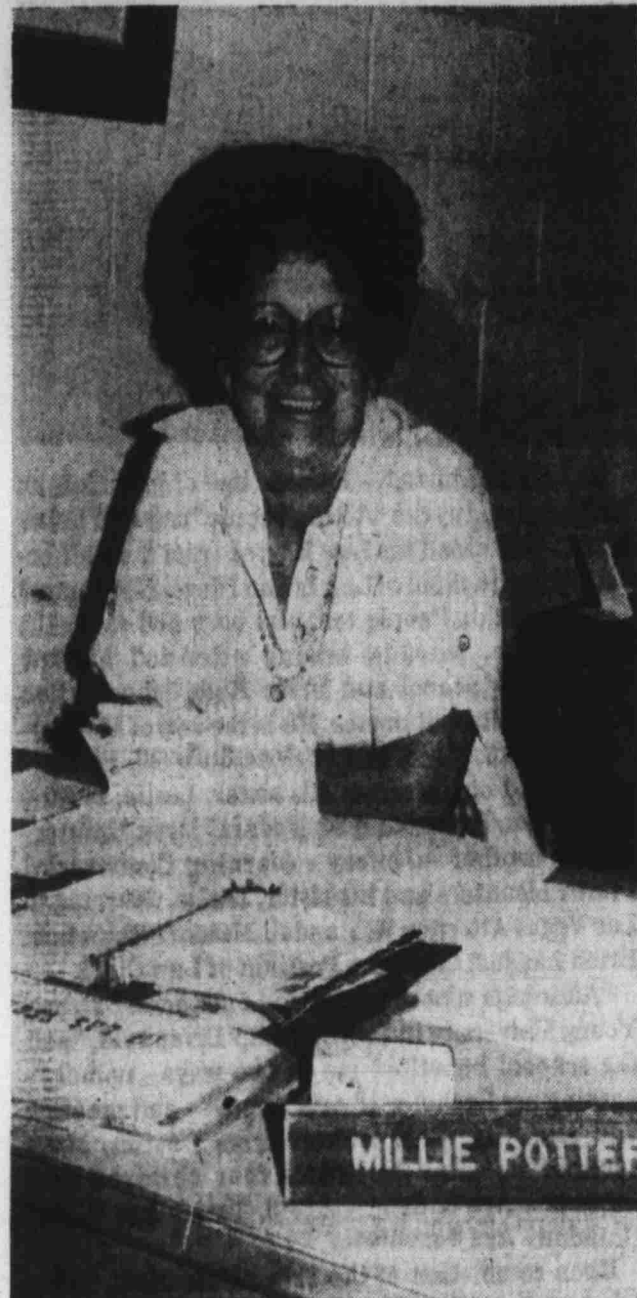

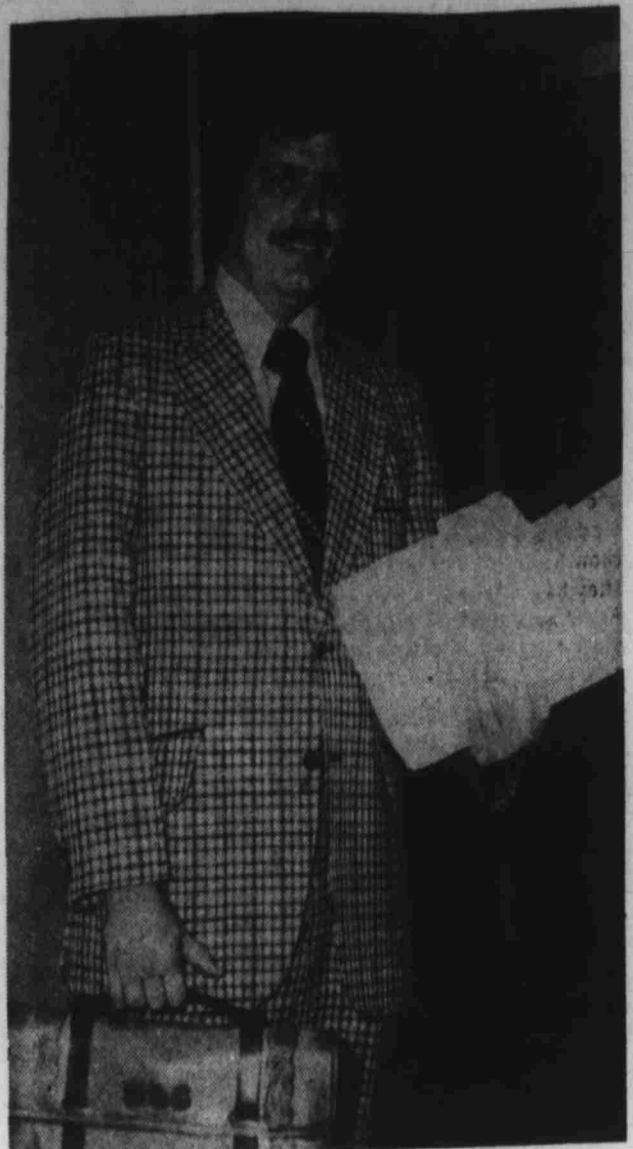

This program is designed to provide a summer educational enrichment program in a fun setting. Instruction will be given in the UNLV physical educa-

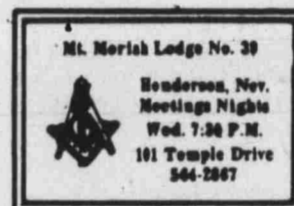
tion complex.

Trailer Estates. The roof was peeled right off the trailer but fortunately no one was injured. Mrs. Peders was in the kitchen at the time the freak accident occurred and Peders was in the backyard in his workshop.

The first house on the right of Equestrian Street off of Boulder Highway in Henderson is most friendly and exudes the charm of a cross between old Spanish and Roman-Greco in architecture. The soft white stucco exterior is enhanced by the rounded archway doors, surrounding garden, and a lovely Greek Goddess statue which was treated and painted by Doris Kubla. A mail box type radio plays "inter-com" FM music giving the visitor as well as the Valley and Mountains the musical background it deserves. Once inside - Doris makes the visitor feel very welcome with her own charm and more FM music. The home is fresh, romantic and charming - carrying out the theme of music and art. The hallway leads into the living-room and the family room. It is the introduction of things to come about the Kubla home with its Italian marble flooring.

Ushered into the living-room is an experience in its own. Another Greek Goddess statue (made by Doris) stands in the room while in the Southwest corner a good sized statue - fountain of the Lotus girl of Japan stands surrounded by foliage - both live and synthetic. Doris is quite a devotee of ceramics - turning out some lovely pieces. Ceramic statues, works, and wall plaques are seen throughout the home with oil paintings hand painted by Doris. 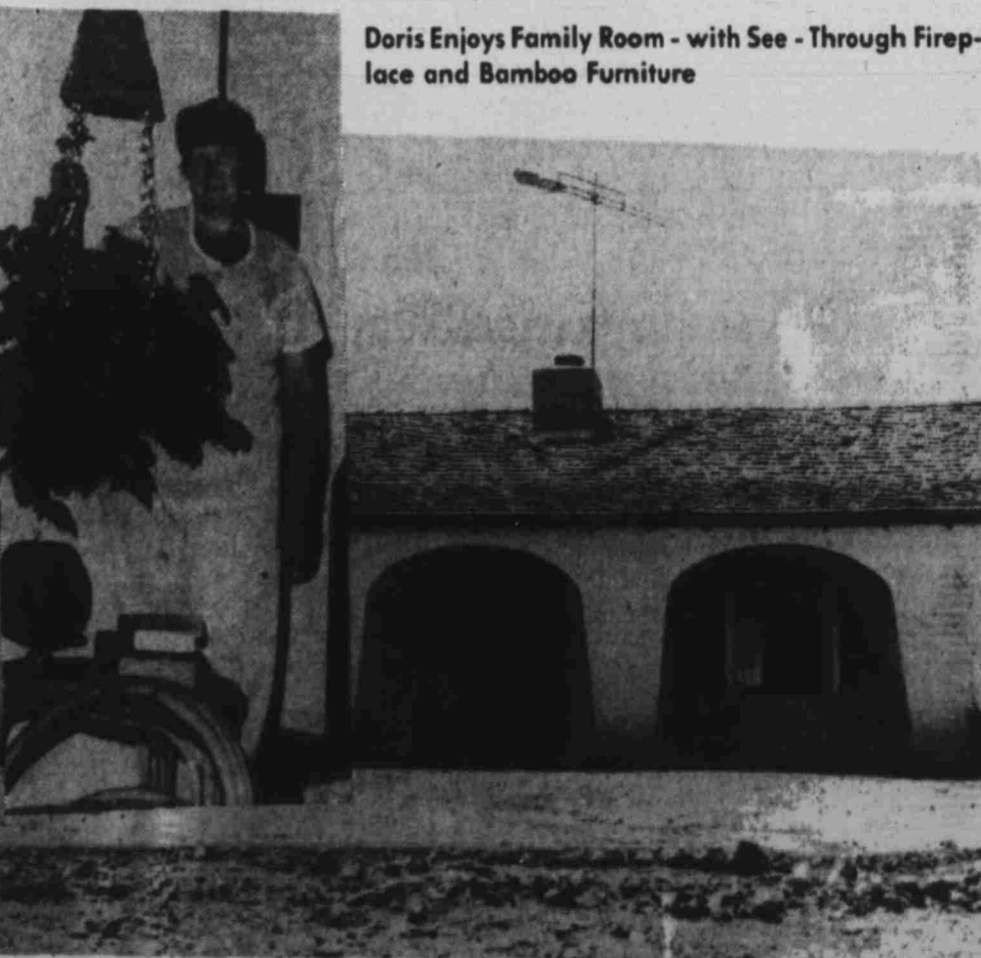

## Henderson - Its Economic History

Maryellen Vallier Sadovich, a noted Nevada historian, and a Henderson resident since 1954, treated our readers with a most unique bicentennial series during 1976. This year, she has researched the local newspaper files and the archives of Henderson's City Hall, the Chamber of Commerce, and BMI, to produce an economic history of Henderson from the first day of incorporation to the present.

part 54 of a series

It was only February of 1969, and numerous methods of adding revenue to the city coffers had been put into motion, when City Manager George Charchalis appeared before the city council with a request for approval of a new budget that required \$1,044,475 for the General Fund including the city's debt service.

"For the 1970-71 budget period, Henderson could be in trouble financially unless something is done," Charchalis told the many spectators who crowded the council halls.

"Thank God for you people who smoke," the city manager told his audience, "because the cigarette tax yields the city \$330,000." However, Charchalis also told the residents of Henderson that their city had been estimated to have 14 percent of the population of the country. According to the water and sewer hook-up records, this figure was high, and the official indication that when 1970 census would probably indicate that the city had only 7 percent of the county population, and as a result Henderson would suffer a loss of \$180,000 in revenue.

Since one-third of the city's budget came from the cigarette and privilege tax, the loss

would pose a serious problem for Henderson. In addition, the city was required to begin paying for the Southern Nevada Water Project at the amount of \$44,000 per year plus \$22,000 for operation and maintenance of the system.

"We aren't going to panic," Charchalis said, "but this is something I feel the residents should understand."

In view of this dire financial situation, city officials once again turned to BMI for a solution to their problems. Many of those who had only a few months earlier endorsed a Charter that permitted the industrial complex to remain out of the city limits now changed their minds.

In compliance with desires of the entire council, a bill, officially sponsored by the city of Henderson, was drafted and presented to the legislature. This bill would enable annexation of the four mile square plant complex onto the present Henderson city limits as soon as the law was passed and signed by the governor.

"The multi-million dollar complex will add two great features to the city's economy," one editor wrote. "ONE, the increased ten million

dollar valuation to the city's total property valuation giving it greater bonding capacity. And TWO, the additional ad valorem taxes the city will receive as a result on the annexation." The city, in turn, would supply fire and police services to the plants.

In April, 1968, BDR S-2, a bill providing for the proposed annexation was introduced in the State Legislature. But the move proved to be untimely. Another bill introduced by the Henderson delegation was a proposal to consolidate southern Nevada cities and entities into one super city, with the exception of Henderson and Boulder City. This move angered the North Las Vegas and Pahrump officials, and they used their floor strength to stop passage of BDR S-1.

Nevertheless, when the vote was taken on April 15, the Assembly passed the bill with a majority of 27 to 8. The jubilation felt by Henderson officials following the Assembly vote was only temporary. The Senate Committee that studied the bill refused to vote it out on the floor for a general vote. The Committee Chairman stated that he felt this was a Clark County matter and not one for the legislature.

"If Henderson really wanted annexation of the plants," he said, "they could amend their charter to include annexation, and abide by the county annexation procedures that had been adopted just a few months earlier."

## Re-Zoning In Sec. 33 Approved

Following a 50 minute discussion, the City Council made a recommendation to approve a zone change for 20 acres of land in Section 33 from residential rural to Trailer Estates with horses at the same time approving a moratorium on all future TE-H zoning until they have had an opportunity to adapt uniform growth standards.

City Manager Bob Campbell, Planning Director Bob Gordon and Public Safety Director Robert Anselmo all voiced their objections to the zone change.

"The TE-H zone apparently does not exist for a number of reasons," said Campbell, referring to the fact that Henderson appears to be the only entity to have such a zoning.

"No one knows what these areas look like and I would like to see some developed first."

The areas, which was requested for re-zoning by Vera Love, president of Kathwend of Las Vegas, is located north of Sunset Road. An adjacent parcel of 20 acres has already been zoned TE-H and is under construction while yet another 40 acre parcel in the same area was similarly rezoned in January of this year.

Anselmo expressed concern over the problem of providing public safety to the remote area.

"I do have to go along with the remoteness of the area and response time," said Councilman Phil Stout, "but they are building mobile homes better than they used to."

"It is the combination of the two," replied Anselmo. "...not only the trailers but the construction of the corrals. And there is no access to the equestrian area ... we would have to go across private property plus we must leave the city limits to get to it."

Mayor Lorin Williams

based his objections on the fact that there are other trailer areas in Henderson already zoned.

"We have our share of trailers now. There are 1000 lots already zoned but no rush has been made to fill that space ... just more requests for rezoning of land for trailers."

Councilman Carlton Lawrence said we would be seeing a much greater use of trailers as time goes by. "Because of the high cost of single dwelling homes we have to face up to having more trailers around with the help of the legislature. The ad valorem tax just doesn't cut it."

Gordon said he was concerned not only with the problem of providing public safety, in the way of fire and police protection, but also "concern for the tax return on the property due to the nature of the dwelling."

Senator Mel Close, speaking for the developer, said they were impressed by Henderson and this development would offer a desirable life style. The lots would be one-half acre in size with between 35 to 40 spaces.

"It won't be overloading the property and there would be large trailers, not little ones. It hasn't caused a problem in the county," he concluded.

City Attorney Kent Dawson pointed out that the council has to give a valid reason for refusing to re-zone the land and suggested the adoption of uniform standards for controlled growth.

The approval was given with a resolution of intent for six months with roads for public safety to get in.

"If they don't start, they'll lose it," said Stout, "but people shouldn't be restricted to trailer parks."

Final action on the re-zoning will take place at the next regular city council meeting Monday, June 19.

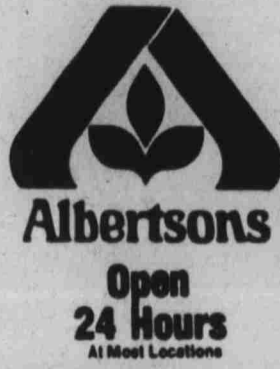
If newspapers and other combustibles pile up, take the time to clear them away. All it takes is one spark to make bad trouble.

The inside of trash cans tell a story of America's wasteful habits. During their searches, they uncovered eight full cans of beer, two unopened bags of pretzels, two perfectly good pairs of sunglasses, three packs of gum, a three pound salami (fully wrapped) ... and a woman's purse.

The purse story deserves further explanation. It contained a driver's license bearing the name and address of a Kansas woman and also pictures of young kids. Sheila and the kids took the purse home and attempted to contact the woman by phone.

It wasn't to be that simple. They reached a relative of the woman but the relative wasn't sure

but what the call was some kind of scam. They finally convinced her otherwise and reached the owner of the purse. It was mailed away...and in gratitude, the woman sent a small reward to the Fava family. The reward was added to the kitty.

One day a British lady approached them and asked directions to Lake Havasu ... producing a map of Idaho. Sheila tactfully exchanged it for a map of the southwest and traced out the proper route.

Among the "loot" found were eight Billy Beer cans...empty. These were removed from the collection and held as souvenirs.

Each trip's haul was brought to the family garage where the cans were stomped, whomped and crushed to make them easier to package. Then they made the trip to the Coors Recycling Center in Las Vegas.

As for the trip, the foursome will travel on one month unlimited travel tickets from Greyhound...although they'll actually use a mixture of bus lines before they're through.

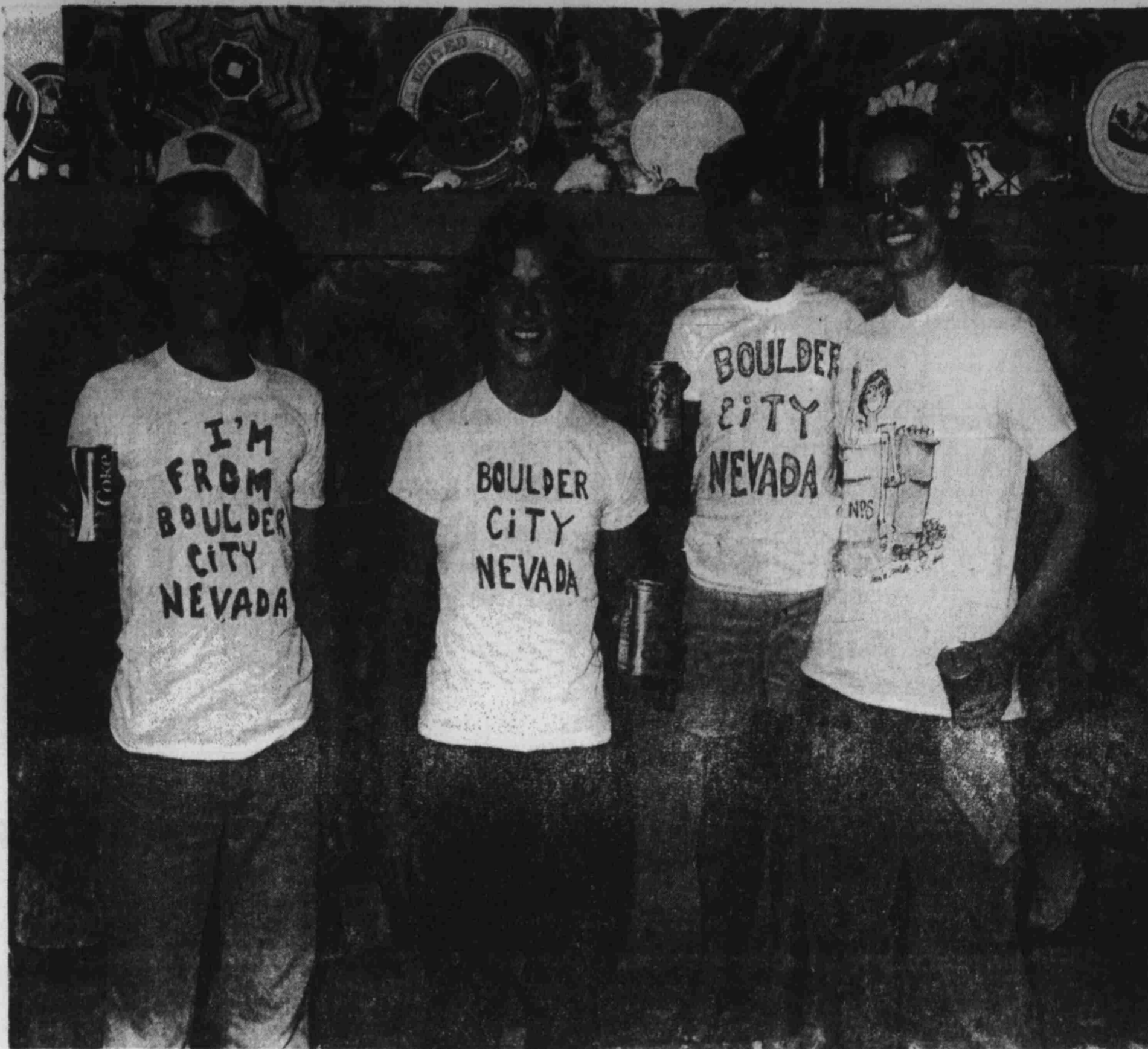

### Interior Proposes Public Involvement In Contract Negotiations

Secretary of the Interior Cecil D. Andrus

announced today that he is requesting public comments and suggestions on proposed procedures for public participation in all new or amendatory water service and repayment contract negotiations conducted by the Bureau of Reclamation.

The proposed procedures are being published in the Federal

Register. Andrus said the repayment of reimbursable costs associated with Reclamation activities requires consummation of contracts between the United States and project beneficiaries.

The terms and conditions of such contracts may affect a wider range of the public than the immediate parties to the contract. In establishing the terms and conditions of the contract, Andrus said, the view of all affected parties should be considered and ample opportunity provided for review of and comment on a given contract prior to its execution.

Under the proposed procedures, Andrus said, all meetings scheduled by the Bureau of Reclamation for the purpose of discussing terms and conditions of any proposed new or amendatory repayment or water service contract would be open to the public as observers.

The Commissioner of Reclamation would determine if, when, and where public hearings would be held to receive comments on any proposed contract. A summary of all written comments received and testimony presented at any public hearing would be prepared and submitted to the Secretary of the Interior for consideration prior to approval or disapproval of a given contract. The Commis-

sioner of Reclamation would establish a point of public access to each contract under consideration and make copies of each contract available for review upon request.

It is proposed that whenever the Bureau of Reclamation intends to enter into negotiations with potential contractors for new or amendatory contracts, or hold hearings on drafts of contracts, notice should

be published in the Federal Register.

The Secretary stressed that he is not establishing final procedures at this time, but is only

requesting public comments and suggestions on his proposal.

Public comments and suggestions should be sent to R. Keith Higgin-

son, Commissioner, Bureau of Reclamation, Department of the Interior, 18th and C Streets, NW, Washington, D.C. 20240.

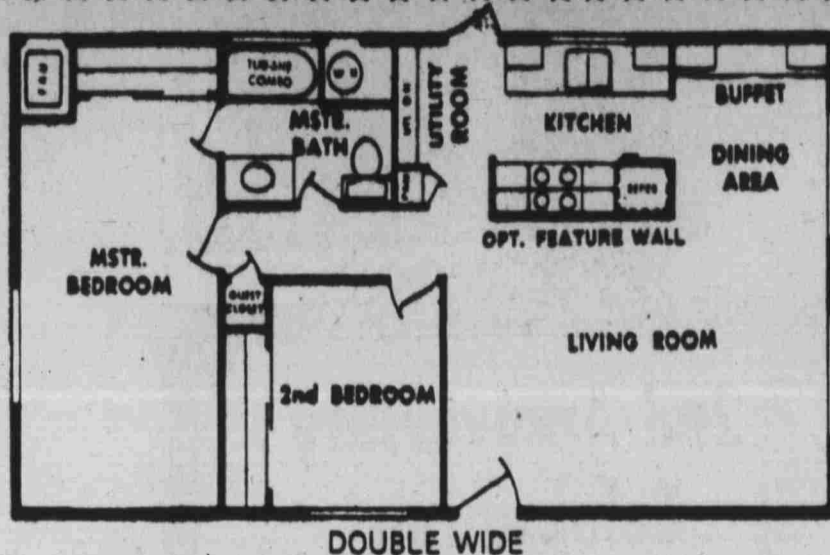

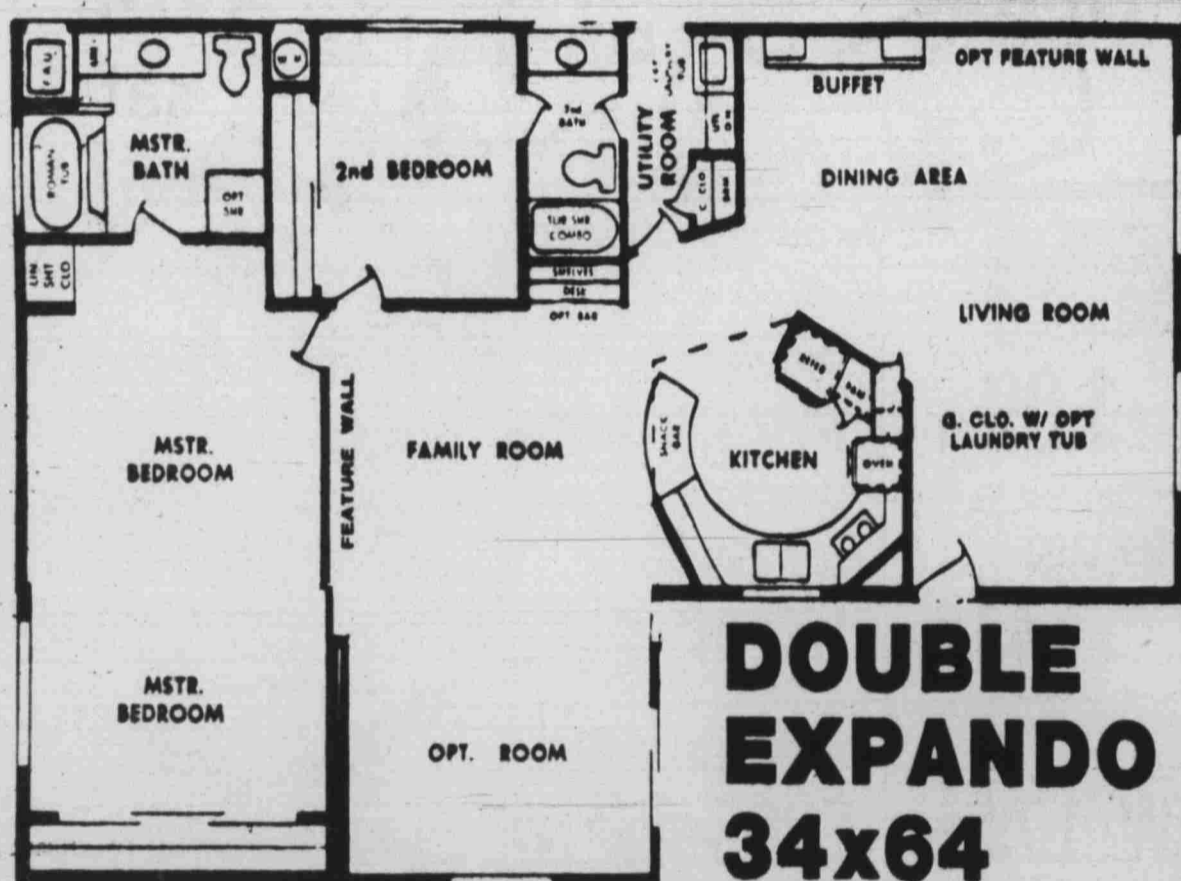

### Tax Reduction Is The Hot Issue

Everybody wants to get into the act. Legislative candidate filings so far have a common denominator. Every candidate has a dream for reduction of taxes. And it is about time.

But it is also time to recognize the difference between proposals to "reduce" taxes and proposals to "shift" taxes from one group of taxpayers to another. Nevadans can look at the results of the campaign in California for the Jarvis - Gann amendment and get an idea of how to go about the implementation of a responsible program of tax reduction.

Jarvis - Gann (in California) had two major features: It proposed the reduction of property taxes by some \$7 billion a year, and it required a two-thirds vote of both houses of the legislature before other taxes could be raised to make up the reduction in property taxes. The initiative was opposed under the leadership of the special interests who gourmandize at the public trough.

les from government if government will take less from us." And another idea needs promotion. That is the policy that governmental activities that are operated for the benefit of special interests must be paid for by those special interests.

government are "demanded" by the "peepul". That just isn't so. An examination of the bills introduced in the 1977 legislature discloses that more than half the bills were promoted by governmental departments or agencies. And almost half of the other bills (non-departmental) were proposing a reduction in the government intrusion into the lives and pocketbooks of the citizens of Nevada.

But the winds of change are blowing. A referendum petition is being circulated which would change the method of assessment of property taxes which, to some extent, copies one feature of the Jarvis - Gann amendment. Several bills are being prepared which will reduce the intrusion of government into private lives; and so reduce the costs

First of all let me start with a few nice things about Morry, since I have known him for over fifty years and also pride myself with being one of his very good friends. We who knew him as a youngster, have always had a great deal of respect and admiration for Morry because he was always, as now, first, last and foremost honest and would always speak that way or write in the same manner. Besides his thirst for seeking out any worthwhile news or topics of the day or sports incidents would bring Morry running. A hard worker who always applied himself from boyhood on, one who was certain to succeed in any chosen field for Morry was always seeking out news and writing about it. In grammar school, high school at the University of Wisconsin in Madison, Morry Zenoff has made hundreds, yes thousands of friends, that have been life - long. I sincerely feel that one can be greatly complimented by having Morry call him a friend!

During our college days at the University of Wisconsin in Madison, Wisconsin there were some crazy incidents that occurred that might be worth repeating.

The time that Morry and I cut classes and left Madison to go and see our girl friends in Milwaukee and on the way back to the University, about 1 a.m. with Morry driving, since it was his car, we raced a Milwaukee Road train to a certain crossing and just missed getting killed (by about 2 or 3 seconds; at said crossing, but thank god we made it!

The various times are being offered to accommodate schedules of tip earners working different shifts.

Swanson added, "Free IRS publications will be

given out to assist tip earners in complying with reporting requirements. We solicit responsible commentary from tip earners in all occupations and encourage their participation in these public meetings."

# John Foley files for governor

Burkholder from the first moment brought logic and expertise into the discussion -- and as the evening progressed, each of the attending experts was allowed to in A-B-C simplicity explain his own part in the picture. Then Burkholder logically pulled out the parts together and at evening's end the parties on hand as well as the audience had a clear cut story of what had to be done, what had been done, what will be the end result.

The only missing number is how much will be taken in at the gate. Projections show the city of Henderson could make a quarter million dollars a year -- out of its one per cent of the gross receipts, while at the same time the Downs people will be paying off its bond-buyers, paying a stiff state racing tax -- and paying up to a thousand employees.

Trust Committee member Dale Roberts, who once served so well as city councilman, made the motion to pass the resolution that will open a series of meetings leading to a final drafting of a final paper. New member, Bill Farmer, a local CPA, seconded the motion and when a voice vote followed -- Burkholder's yes and fourth and remaining member -- Estes McDaniel chimed in with his affirmative.

Insisting on the meeting being consistent with the open meeting laws of the state, Burkholder called for all parties to comment whatever which way. Audience opinion came forth from Kirby and Hersh Trumbo, who are also members of the Downs, incorporated. Harry Porik, long time investor in Henderson properties, insisted on having proper watchdog points to oversee the huge project and make sure everything conforms to law.

Trust member McDaniel likewise insisted on district guidelines. He hung the "dirty clothes" out on the line, reciting previous tries of the same group or others allied to it and how promises were made but nothing came of it.

This the Downs operators explained away Tuesday as being the fault of the then softness in the investment market. McDaniel also questioned Attorney General Robert List's allowance of the Downs application from four years back to be grand-fathered into being used now -- thus enabling the Downs to avoid a law change that came in the last legislature session and which insists on posting two to one guarantees before projects are okayed for public trust financing.

McDaniel, who several times during the evening said he was confused did manage to bring onto the table, also, other personal opinions such as inferring that one of the Downs lawyers, Brian Greenspun, had used "politics" to win List's favorable opinion. The clear-thinking city attorney, Kent Dawson, repeatedly explained to McDaniel and the committee that the change in opinion came as a result of the attorney general's office re-reading of the wording of the law and finding it had overlooked the grandfathering feature -- which Dawson further explained was not unusual in his city doings that called on special readings from the attorney general's office.

Eastern agents on hand for the evening when asked by this writer at the close of the evening whether the McDaniel and Polk argumentative points would serve to block their efforts to sell insurance companies the bonds when and if they complete final phases of drafting. We were told the fact that the pros and cons were well-aided in public would serve them even better, since it would be best to have criticism come early rather than later

when huge amounts of time and money had been expended.

From many of the details that were presented, the audience learned that the Funk family, generally considered the No. 1 dog racing operators in the nation (four tracks now going successfully in Arizona), have been licensed by the Nevada Racing commission as operators; that they have applied to become stockholders and are being processed for re-licensing as stockholders, which the gaming law calls for; that horse-racing will come later and will be paid for out of revenues from the dog project; that much detailed paper work is necessary before the bonds are sold and the money becomes available for construction; that the Funks did advance \$300,000 to the Downs, Inc., which was to clear debts, one of which is a paid up-to-date time-payment plan to the city on a \$51,000 indebtedness; that insurance company investors have invested in gaming operations and sporting ventures in the East and then like the high return for high risk factor.

Among the experts on hand Tuesday evening were:

James Richardson, Chicago, attorney, bond counsel; Charles Burton, Washington attorney for the Funks; Charles Svenson, of the bond selling firm of Donaldson, Lufkin and Jenrette of Wall Street; Ted Dotson, Las Vegas, attorney for the Las Vegas Downs; Brian Greenspun, attorney for the Funks at their earlier application; a member of the state gaming control board, attorney, and whose findings are used by the Nevada Racing commission; David Funk senior and David Funk, junior, race track operators.

It should be noted in closing that before the next meeting of the board, next Tuesday night, a new appointment will be made to replace businessman Bill Perry, resigned. Farmer's spot on the board became necessary when Dr. Harold Miller resigned several months ago. In addition to next week's meeting, another was set up for two weeks hence, at which time the above-named experts will return to work on next steps.

Next week's meeting will be spent, it was explained, in getting informational input up to date as to appraisals, state licensing, explanations of previous legal opinions and reviews of laws.

Well -- What do you know? The White House press corps has included me in on President Carter's visit to Panama tomorrow, where he is to exchange documents ratifying the pacts with Panama's chief of government, Omar Torrijos Herrera in re the ownership of the canal.

As a matter of fact, while you read this my aching bones will be aboard a TWA-er to Washington, D.C. where the schedule says I pick up the whole touring party tomorrow morning, leaving Andrews Air Force Base 15 minutes ahead of Air Force One with "The Man" ... about 9:30 a.m.

The bitterness of the senatorial debates which lead up to the point where our senator, Howard Cannon, was the key vote that made it yes could possibly bring some unusual things happening on this quick jaunt. We return Saturday night and I get back in my own sack on Father's Day afternoon.

It will be a pleasure serving as your eyes and ears on this historical -- and maybe hysterical occasion.

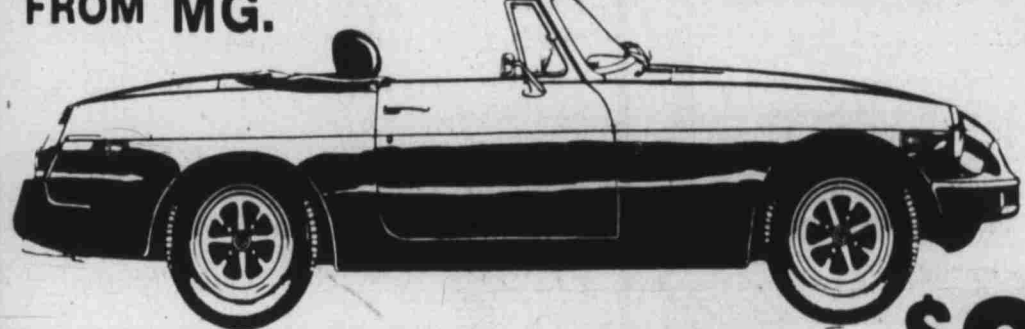

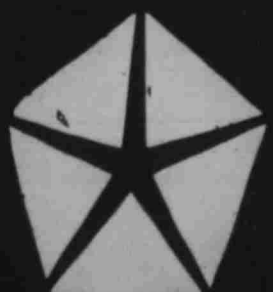

### Father's Day — First Proclaimed By The People!

During the years between 1931 and 1972, Father's Day became one of America's best-loved holidays — without benefit of an Act of

Congress or Presidential Proclamation.

Then, in April 1972, Congress passed the Father's Day Act, signed shortly

thereafter by President Nixon, which made Father's Day a National Holiday, to be supported by a proclamation from the sitting president each year.

Research indicates that in 1971, the majority of Americans observed Father's Day in some form or other. In fact, by 1974, nine out of ten Americans celebrated Father's Day, and in 1977, the total had risen to almost 95%!

Father's Day comes the third Sunday of every June, and so it never can be earlier than June 14 and never later than June 21. That makes it an ideal time for outdoor celebrations, and the family cook-out has become one of America's preferred ways of saying, "I love you, Dad."

According to the Beef Industry Council, something like 75 million pounds of beef will be sold for the Father's Day weekend, 1978, suggesting that steaks, hamburgers, and other barbecue delectables will reign supreme on Father's Day this year, Sunday, June 18.
