# Old Vegas Fort Nears Completion

The Basic Wolves versus the Boulder City Eagles:

It makes your adrenalin flow. On the football field -- Friday night at eight -- in Boulder City. Talk about the Summit Meeting -- Sadat, Carter, Begin -- next week -- this Boulder - Henderson game has got them all beat. It's the Summit that out - summit's the Summit.

Especially for those of us who have seen all 29 of the past battles between these teams. And now -- for all of us to see again -- this 30th meeting -- the oldest rivalry in Southern Nevada -- the Minnesota - Michigan Little Brown jug of the Big Ten -- the Yale - Harvard of the Ivy League, the U.S.C. - U.C.L.A. of the Far West ... the Reno-UNLV game -- this little school contest competes with them all.

The inequality in the numbers of students attending the two schools -- has often given one school the edge in numbers over the other -- and still does -- with Basic now twice the size in student body to Boulder.

### One Car Rollover Kills Two

A one-car rollover on Highway 41 near the Lake Mead Marina Friday, took the lives of two Henderson teenagers and injured four others, according to the Nevada Highway Patrol.

According to the Highway Patrol those killed were Albert Maestas, 17 of 150 Ivy St., and Brenda Lucero, 15 of 3575 Sage Circle.

Harold Gray, 18 and Sandy Gray, 15, both of 2030 Shoshone Lane, were listed in stable condition in the intensive care unit at Sunrise hospital. Both sustained severe head injuries. Charlene Tuft, 15, of 424 Scenic Drive, was treated and released, and Kerry Hancock, 18, of 730 Center St., was listed in fair condition. Hancock sustained a fractured vertebrae and other injuries.

The car, reportedly driven by Maestas, was traveling west on State Route 41 at a high rate of speed about 3:55 a.m. when it swerved off the road and overturned, the NHP spokesman said.

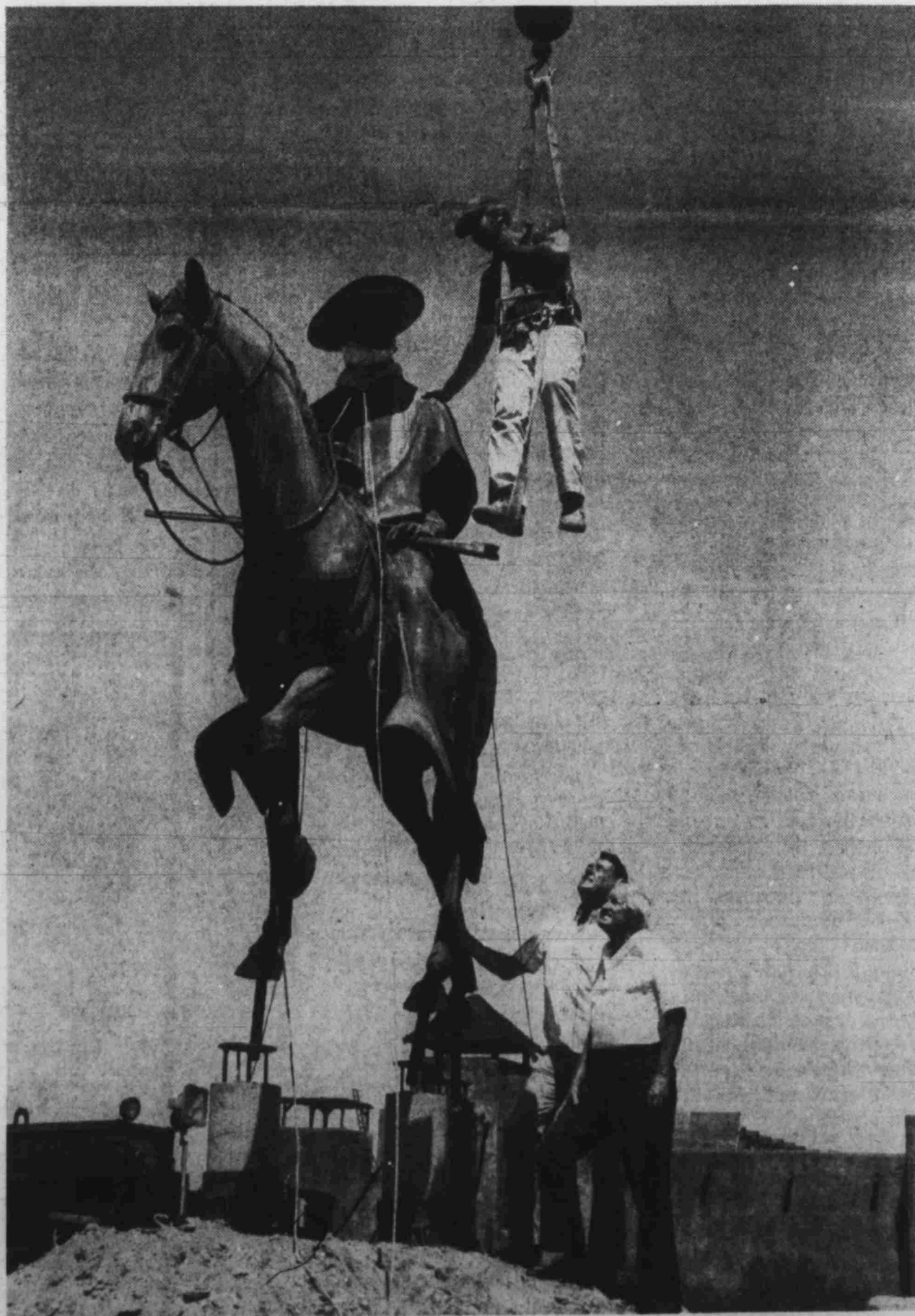
### Pittman To Be Discussed

As requested by area residents last April, the improvements will consist of park restrooms, street paving, curbs and gutter and street lights.

Area residents are encouraged to attend this meeting to review and comment on the final proposal and the alternatives that are possible.

Construction of the frontier fort of Old Vegas, located between Las Vegas and Hoover Dam on the Boulder Highway in Henderson, is nearing completion.

A replica of the Mormon outpost which colonized Las Vegas Valley in 1855. Old Vegas is geared for family recreation, tourism and motion picture productions.

The \$3 1/2 - million fort will feature a Sutler's Store, Hondo Cantina, Commandant's Quarters and Theatre, Blacksmith area and a Territorial Photographer.

An 11 - foot - tall bronze statue of Rafael Rivera near the Boulder Highway beckons motorists to enter Old Vegas. Rivera, nearly 150 years ago, was the first white man to discover the marshy meadows and taste the cool springs of the valley -- not too far away from the statue that immortalizes him.

Like early settlers, visitors will enter Old Vegas on a wooden plank bridge across the Las Vegas stream. Inside the aging adobe walls of the outpost, history of a turbulent era become a reality.

The Sutler's Store is a carbon copy of the provisionary outlet the frontier forts had, and will function as a souvenir shop as well. Visitors here will also be able to purchase a personalized souvenir edition of the Old Vegas Territorial newspaper.

A rip - snortin' saloon and cowboy steakhouse comprises the first floor of the Hondo Cantina, which will feature an intriguing and unique interior conception. The second floor will function as a 225 - seat banquet room.

Visitors to the Commandant's Quarters may partake on a brief tour and see the coming attractions of Old Vegas. In the adjoining room, the 300 - seat Commandant's Theatre, a multi - media film presentation will depict the history of the area on a huge screen with stereophonic sound. Dale Robertson narrates the film.

The Blacksmith area will buzz with activity and the Territorial Photographer will have numerous costumes on hand for visitors to pose in.

The rustic courtyard lends added atmosphere to the fort with

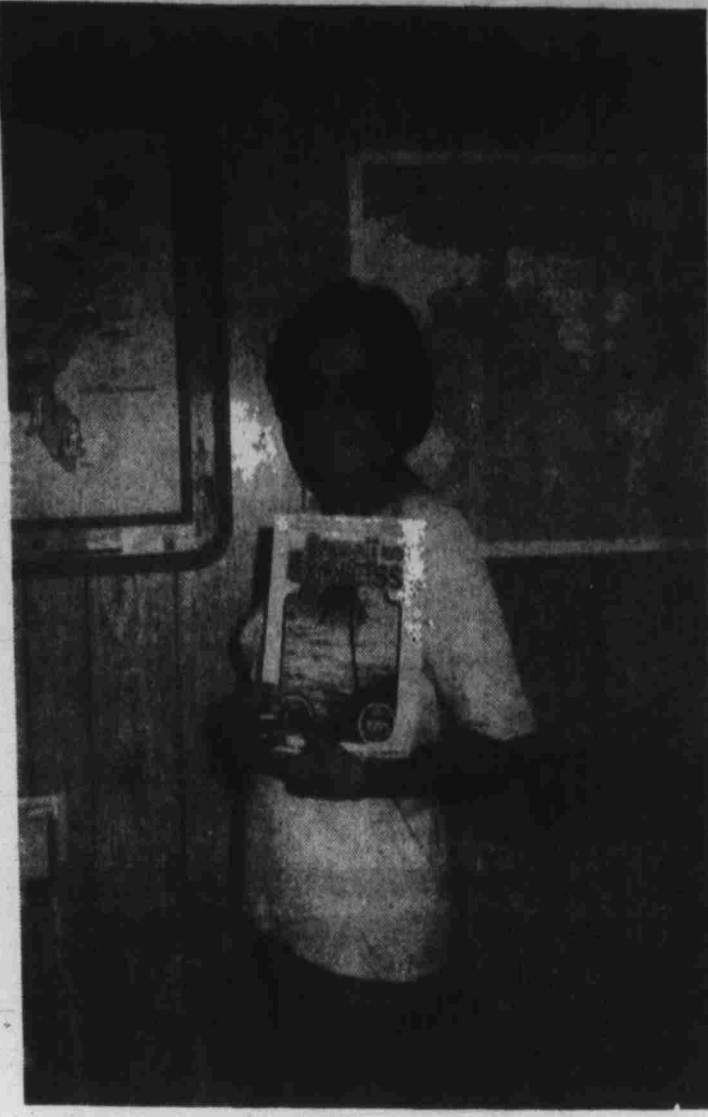

hitching posts, water troughs antique freight wagons and gunslingers parading back and forth.

Every inch of the 450 - by 150 - foot adobe fort has been carefully recreated by Academy Award-winning Hollywood art and set designers to accommodate future film crews.

Robert Shelton is president and chairman of the board of the Old Tucson Corporation which operates Old Vegas, Old Tucson and the Old West Corporation.

Shelton purchased the rundown Old Tucson property in 1959 and eventually built it into the world famous movie location that it is today. It ranks as Arizona's second greatest paid tourist attraction -- next to the Grand Canyon -- thanks to Shelton's ingenuity and enterprise.

He envisions the same success story for Old Vegas, but on a much broader scale. The frontier fort represents the first of three phases to the project.

Other officers of the Old Tucson Corporation are Johnny Mitchell, honorary chairman; Jerry Blackwell, vice president and treasurer; and Cecil Simmons, vice president and secretary.

Simmons, along with major stockholder Art Lurie, are the only Las Vegas acting in official capacities. They are co-owners of Wonderland Discount Liquors, the largest liquor retailer in Southern Nevada.

Simmons is also a veteran of the gaming industry. He was part owner of the Desert Inn Hotel & Country Club from 1960 - 67. When the Hughes Tool Company purchased the property, Simmons served as consultant and casino manager from 1967 - 71.

Key personnel at Old Vegas include Wayne Byargeon, general manager; Pete Peters, publicity director; and Phyllis Fetter, sales director.

Peters is the only Las Vegas in this group, having been an award-winning sports writer and editor with the Review - Journal. He has also worked on the Valley Times and the Sun. Peters has an extensive background as a executive in the hotel industry and is a gaming expert.

Old Vegas is situated on nearly 125 acres of land in the shadow of Black Mountain. The fort occupies only eight acres. The property slopes generally from southeast to northwest.

Casey Doss Construction Company of Henderson is building the fort. Jerry Cook of Hollywood is construction coordinator. David Welles & Associates of Las Vegas are the architects.

some projects cannot be funded at this time and others only partially funded," he said.

"Our determination is that the Henderson senior center is among the more urgent of the projects considered, however at this time we feel we will have to limit an award to \$40,000 rather than the \$84,000 requested," McSweeney said.

Campbell said the senior center will be done in phases as money allows.

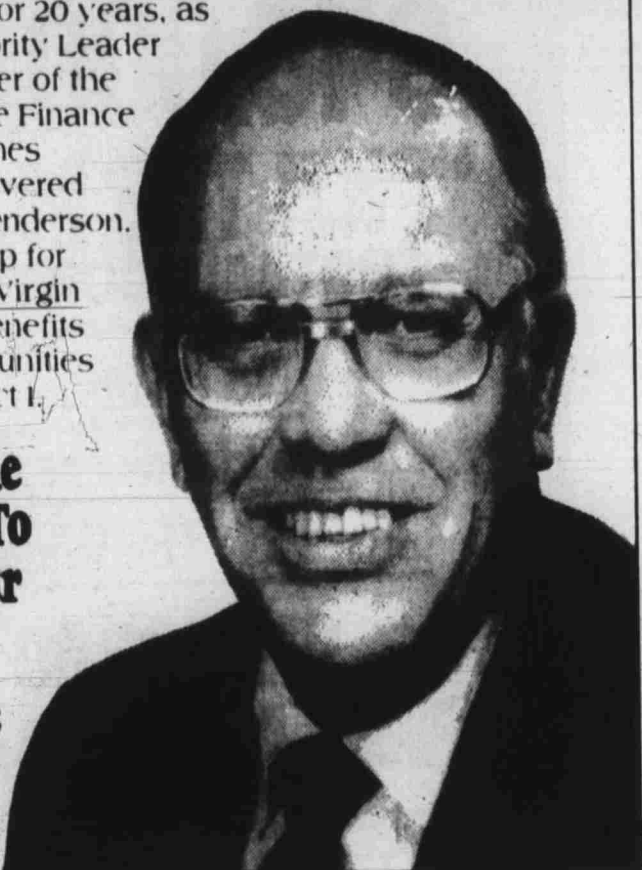

"I really got the feel of the floral industry when Mrs. Stokes took the Community College class on a field trip to the industry open house in Los Angeles. It was thrilling to watch the top 50 designers displaying highly individualistic arrangements using the same quantity and variety of flowers."

Designer Floral School in Denver, Colorado was the closest and fit best into summer vacation schedule and the weather was cooler than in Henderson. Besides lectures and research reading on floriculture, most of the time was spent in practical lab work of turning out 8 to 10 arrangements daily

in the mornings and afternoons spent in evaluation and touring top notch floral shops, wholesale growers, greenhouses, Denver Wholesale Flower Market, as well as manufacturers and distributors of vases, pottery, baskets, ribbon, ect.

The week that they each did 50 corsages, ladies of the Denver convalescent homes were given floral tributes, which they wore with pride to dinner, or even pinned to their bathrobes. The next week was wedding design with a contest to see who could come up with the most unusual bouquet. If the students wished they could volunteer to go help service a wedding by pinning on corsages, boutonnières, or handing out flower baskets to attendants. The fourth week was on funeral design

work complete with field trips to nearby mortuaries to learn how arrangements are placed on or near caskets.

In the class were students from New Hampshire to Lompoc, Calif., and from Wisconsin to Texas. Most of them either worked in a flower shop and were sent by the employer to enhance skills, or were currently owners of shops who felt the need for additional training. Mrs. Muzingo was the only novice to this type of work. She feels that it was really an enjoyable and rewarding way to spend a summer vacation.

Most bird hunters know little, if anything, about what comes out of their shotgun when the trigger is pulled; but it only takes a few minutes to learn, and it could mean the difference in the number of clean kills scored this hunting season.

All that's needed is a roll of wrapping paper or several sheets of newspaper. Draw a 30-inch circle and pin the paper target to a frame or suitable exact loads you will be shooting. The number of pellet holes within the 30-inch circle shows the effective pat-

tern you can expect on a well-placed shot at a flying target.

Around 50 percent of the shot will be within the circle. The percentage varies with the choke and can range from almost 75 percent on a full choke to only 40 percent with cylinder bore (no choke).

To determine percentage, divide the circled holes by the shot pellets contained in the load you shoot. For example, a 12-gauge shell with 1 1/2 ounces of No. 7 1/2 shot contains some 395 pellets. If the circle has 229 holes, the percentage is 58.

A few more shots on fresh paper at 20 and 30 yards are equally eye-opening. Even improved cylinder barrels "tighten" considerably at shorter ranges where the shot string, like a stream of water from a garden hose, is beginning to disperse.

# Do What's Las Vegas Really Like?

**[EDITOR'S NOTE: -Over nine million people visited Las Vegas, Nevada in 1977. As a practical guide to this world famous entertainment center for those who plan to visit in the future, we asked a former resident to give our readers an insider's viewpoint. From 1950 to 1956, Frank Plasha (a native West Virginian) worked as Personnel Manager of Titanium Metals Corp., Henderson, Nevada, a few miles from the fabled Strip. He served on a number of Mayor's commissions, was a Nevada state member of the Henderson Rotary Club. In W. Va. Plasha taught at Kingston High School received the Alumnus of the Year award from W. Va. Tech in 1966, and after World War II received his M.S. degree from Cornell University.]**

Our TWA 727, flight 3 out of Pittsburgh, was thirty minutes from Las Vegas' McCarran International Airport. The young man on the aisle seat opposite me and my wife Katy leaned over and excitedly asked, "What is Las Vegas really like?" He heard us describing the stewardess our experiences of desert living in the early 50's and now we were his "instant experts" on the mysteries of the gambling mecca.

"What are you looking for?" I responded. "If you want a family vacation, great fishing in Lake Mead, spectacular scenery, peaceful stillness of desert night -- it's there. If you want a frenetic merry-go-round of incomparable entertainment, super stars galore, unbelievable food to satisfy any gourmet or ethnic taste, azure blue skies and searing sunlight -- it's there."

"And of course, there's the legalized gambling, decide in advance how much you can afford to lose (famous last words) and don't be greedy when you win." I'm certain the young man never heard our last advice; our plane was coming in for a landing and he had the glazed look of anticipation common to all first-time visitors.

What is Vegas really like? It's a kaleidoscope of vivid impressions and faint memories. One cannot do justice in a single article to the varied cross-currents of the Vegas world of work and world of entertainment. So stay with us through this two part series for a different viewpoint.

Let's begin at the beginning...

Temperature 110. We're on the final leg of our long journey to a new job at a place we've never seen and a place not on the map -- Henderson, Nevada. "We" are my wife Katy and daughters Pam (4) and Cindy (2) in an asthmaic Ford 6 with a block office in a pan on the

floor to keep us cool. It is August 1951 and after we left Kingman, Arizona on our desert journey to the oasis of Boulder City I began wondering if I had made a terrible mistake in accepting a job in such a barren wasteland.

First impressions: shimmering, blinding waves; miles and miles of nothing but miles, and miles; long-eared jack rabbits confused and bowled over like ten pins by night drivers' weary gas station attendants fatigued by the oppressive heat. What hardships those pioneers endured! Then, as we turned a sharp curve, there it was -- Boulder Dam! Spectacular! And the heart quickens it beat at the sight. A few more miles and we come upon a true oasis -- Boulder City. Green, cool, trees, lawns, water, civilization. We stay in Boulder overnight and next morning drive to our new home in Henderson. 1950 population of Henderson less than 4,000; population today over 20,000. In 1950 a total of 160,000 people lived in the entire state of Nevada. Las Vegas' population was approximately 25,000 in 1950; the 1980 projec-

tion is 500,000 by the University of Nevada. What accounts for the meteoric growth of Vegas and Henderson and Clark County?

Recently we visited with Oran and Bonnie Gragson in Vegas. Oran served as Mayor of the city during the late 50's and through the 60's as the area experienced boom and growth. We also visited with one of the pioneer publicists of the strip -- Art Force of the M.G.M. Grand Hotel. We're grateful to both Oran and Art for their inputs.

### RECREATION.

Your "recreation" in Vegas can be limited to a cab ride from the airport to your hotel and an escape from real values to the fairland of air conditioned casinos, plastic chips, screaming crap shooters, lounge entertainment, and main room shows. Pity! Sad! For you have answered the siren call of the blazing neon signs and neglected the other side of a genuine Nevada vacation.

Combine the sybaratic indoor man-made pleasures with the outdoor natural attractions -- this is the ideal Vegas vacation

which so many tourists miss.

Nature has been kind to the Vegas area. Fishing? I have caught mountain trout in the wilderness of the Utah Uintahs and the Ruby Valley mountains of Northern Nevada. I have fished W. Va.'s New-River and Greenbrier and caught my first redeye with a homemade pinhook in Paint Creek. New York's Finger Lakes and Eries Presque Isle lagoons have given me many hours of fishing joy. The ultimate? Lake Mead, Nevada has everything. Size: over 500 miles of shoreline, 115 miles long, 255 square miles. Beauty: miles of towering cliffs and secluded inlets plus picnic areas and beaches make up Lake Mead. Fishing: no closed season to catch blue-gills, trout, and my favorite large mouth bass. A tip: ask the natives to point out the location of gypsum beds, cast towards the beds, and I guarantee the large mouth bass will hit.

If fishing is not your turnon, then take a drive to the Mt. Charleston area about 35 miles northwest of Vegas. You'll be surprised. Yes, there is an alpine forest, cool summer temperatures, and snow

in winter on Mt. Charleston. There are wildflowers, desert type trees such as Joshua and yucca, and familiar pine, and waterfalls and trails for hiking. The area has camping and picnic area and skiing.

Another recreational surprise is Tule Springs ten miles northwest of Vegas. Here is an oasis of nearly 700 acres owned by the city which features good picnic facilities, tropical palms, a man-made lake, and archeological diggings. I color photography is your hobby then a "must" on your trip is a visit to the Valley of Fire. Here is a state park that combines vivid colors with unusual rock formations and Indian rock writings. It's an easy drive via routes 91 and 40 to the upper area of Lake Mead.

Just a few hours of driving time takes you to Grand Canyon, Bryce and Zion Parks, and Death Valley. And, of course, one of the seven wonders of the world is located about 30 miles from Vegas -- Hoover Dam, or Boulder Dam according to many of the natives. Special tours are conducted by government guides and your elevator trip down is an experience to be remembered forever.

Take time on your visit to Vegas and really smell the roses nature provides. Fish and swim in Lake Mead, marvel at the uniqueness of Mt. Charleston, Tule Springs, desert

National Wildlife Range. Take time, one clear night, to shut out the blazing neons and casino clatter, and walk into the desert quiet to listen to the

stillness and study the sharpness of heaven's jewels - this is solace, comfort, exhilaration without need for artificial stimulus.

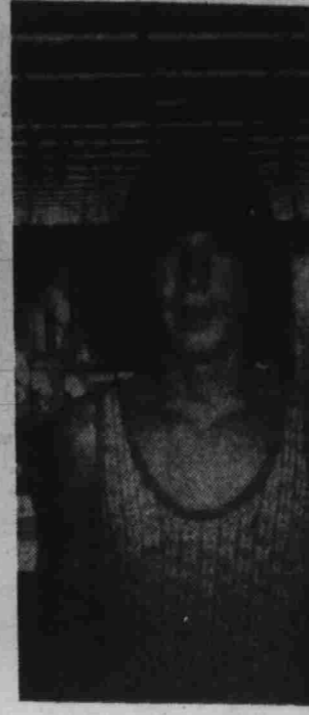

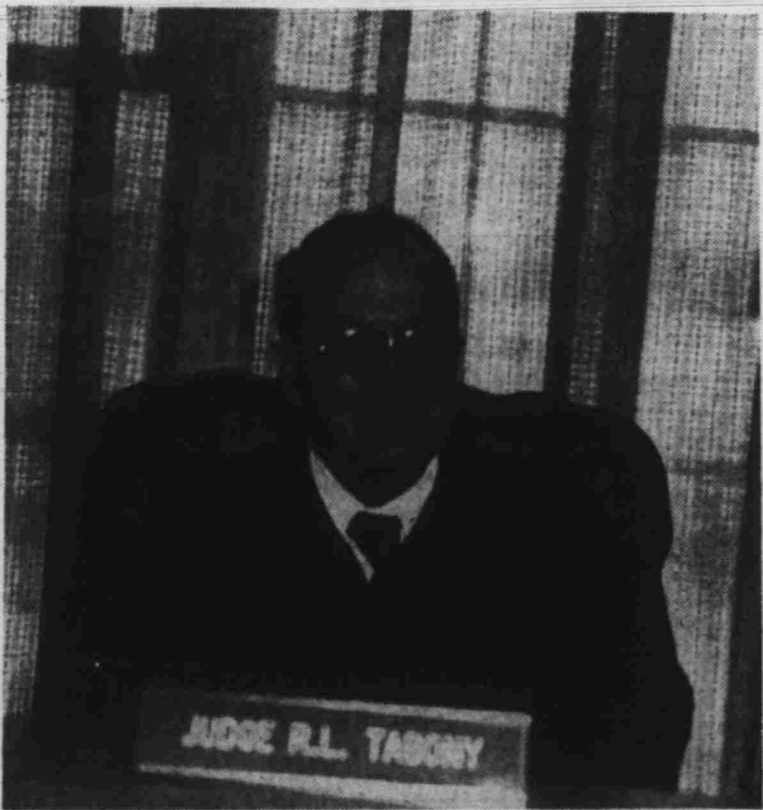

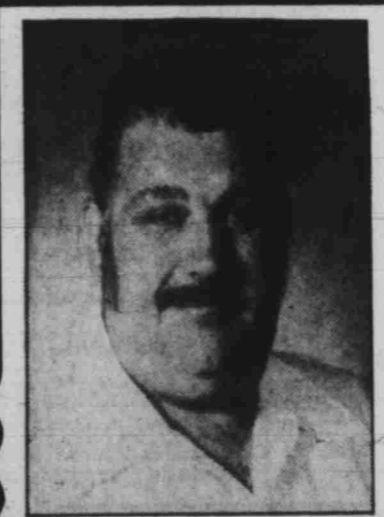
