Like most of Henderson city jail inflation, the cost of prisoner meals rose during 1978, according to the annual report by Deputy Public Safety Director Jim Goff. More prisoner meals served at more cost, the report shows.

for 1978 was 74 cents while it was 33 cents for 1977 and 38 cents for 1976. The net cost for food for last year was \$4,392 as compared to \$2,605 and \$2,549 the two previous years. The number of prisoner meals served jumped from 7,759 in 1977 to 9,798 in 1978.

**\$1.8 Million Horizon**

**Drive Extension**

**Approved**

An extension of Horizon Drive from Pacific to Boulder Highway at an estimated cost of \$1.8 million, was approved unanimously by the Regional Streets and Highways Commission of Clark County Thursday.

The proposal provides for an access allowing vehicle traffic to bypass downtown Henderson and travel through an undeveloped area to reach the highway. A Regional technical committee

staff member said the new route will save about two minutes travel time.

The route takes the place of a proposed expansion of Pacific Street which would have linked Horizon Drive with Boulder Highway through downtown Henderson. The route was opposed by residents of the area and the city council killed the plan and opted for Horizon Drive.

Construction on the project would start about mid-1980.

The road would run along Horizon Drive from Pacific Avenue, to Gibson Road and in two places along Gibson Road to Lake Mead Drive and Warm Springs Road to Boulder Highway.

The \$1.8 million pricetag is relatively low, according to the technical staff's recommendation, because most of the extensive right-of-way re-

**Old Vegas Fire Investigated**

First degree arson is suspected in a fire that started in the attic at Old Vegas Friday, according to Dale Starr, deputy public safety director.

"We've had very few arson incidents in Henderson," Starr said, "but this was definitely set and if it hadn't been discovered when it was and if a copper water line hadn't melted, it could have been disastrous.

An arson investigator is

looking into the incident which occurred just before midnight. According to Starr, the fire started in the attic of the employes locker room in the rest room near the kitchen. When smoke started coming through the kitchen the fire department was called, however, it was out before the fire department arrived. Everyone was evacuated.

Old Vegas is located on Boulder Highway in Henderson.

**Store Robbed**

The 7-11 Store in the Pittman area, was robbed by an unknown suspect of about \$10 and police are investigating the incident which occurred early yesterday morning.

According to police, the subject entered the store about 4:20 a.m. and picked up a six pack of beer. When he found he did not have enough money to complete the purchase, he proceeded outside.

He returned with a \$20 bill and as the clerk proceeded to open the cash register, the suspect reached into the register and grabbed two \$10 bills and his original \$20 and fled.

**Mechanic Critical**

A city mechanic, Ernesto Urban, 46, is in intensive care at Sunrise hospital following an accident at the city shops.

Urban suffered a serious injury to the head when repairing a tire with a split rim. The rim separated causing a part of the rim to strike Urban in the chest. He fell and struck his head. Urban was transported to St. Rose de Lima hospital and then to Sunrise hospital for more extensive treatment.

He was placed in the respiratory intensive care unit and now has been placed in the regular intensive care unit. He is allowed no visitors.

**Police Dept. Explorer**

**Scouts Graduate**

Sixty-six hours of strenuous training paid off for 11 young men and women as they proudly graduated from a unique law enforcement training program before their parents, friends, instructors and city officials during a ceremony held last Friday evening at the Elk's Lodge.

The Police Explorer Post Academy, sponsored by the Crime Prevention unit of the Henderson Police Department under the direction of Officer Bob Lindsey, is designed to train young men and women between the ages of 14 and 20 in the fields of crime prevention and law enforcement.

The graduates, members of Explorer Scouts of the Boulder Dam Area Council, underwent 66 hours of specialized training including courses in criminal law, fingerprinting, homicide investigation and police ethics.

They also received training in first aid and the use of firearms which qualifies

them for special citations.

"The training is an opportunity to prepare students interested in entering the law enforcement field. Graduates of the academy will qualify for positions as police department cadets," Lindsey said.

The cadets will aid police officers in the field, supplying officer assistance and taking reports on minor offenses.

The four girls and seven boys were screened for academy entrance according to academic levels, the ability

to get along with others and the "ability to be an all-around good person," Lindsey explained.

The graduates of Police Explorer Post No. 243 are Kim Bush, Rani Bush, William Clark, Jerry Cooper, Dominick D'Orta, Pam Keller, Richard Kilfoyle, Lance Nelson, Brenda Taney, Gary Williams and Sylvia Zak.

Three Henderson city council seats will be up for election this year, in addition to the municipal Judge, according to City Clerk Dorothy Vondenbrink.

The primary election for councilmen for Wards one, two and three and the Judge will be held May 8, and the general election is June 5.

Filing for these offices will open March 29 beginning at 8 a.m. and individuals may file during the regular working hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day until closing on April 6, at 5 p.m. The filing fee for municipal judge and councilman is \$25.

Two of the city councilmen, Phil Stout of Ward 1, and Gary Price of Ward 2, have indicated they will seek re-election. Carlton Lawrence of Ward 3 has indicated he is still thinking about it. Municipal Judge Jim Jensen has said he will seek re-election.

To qualify for the office of municipal judge the individual shall be a resident of the City for a continuous three year period immediately preceding his election and shall be a qualified elector.

To qualify for councilman, the candidate must also have been a resident for three years and be a qualified elector within the ward he is to represent.

Anyone wishing to register to vote in the primary election may do so at the city clerk's office at city hall during the working hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The office is closed at noon.

A qualified elector must be 18 years of age or over, be a resident of the State for 30 days, a resident of the county for 30 days and a resident of the precinct for ten days, be a citizen of the United States and has not been denied the right to vote by a court or law or dishonorable discharge and has registered to vote in the County of Clark.

Voting at the polls will be from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. and the precincts will be combined into districts.

The polling places will be the Pittman Women's club, the youth center, Basic high school and C.T. Sewell elementary school. A complete list of the polling places and the districts will be published in the Home News prior to the primary election.

quired for the project will be in undeveloped desert areas which have a fairly low market value.

The staff also presented a cost benefit ratio which shows the dollar amount of benefits derived by the project users for each dollar spent on the project. The ratio for this project shows there will be a benefit of \$1.09 for each dollar spent.

Chuck Brechler, managing engineer of the commission, said this is a low estimate of the benefits.

"We have made a low estimate, but I think the ratio will increase," he said.

Bill Derby, principle engineer for the Nevada Highway Department, proposed an alternate alignment of a portion of Horizon Drive.

That portion of road would go under a future freeway site and would be shorter and less expensive.

However, Brechler said, it would eventually cost the community more. By the time the highway department could finance any construction, which would be in about five or six years, 95 percent of the cost would be covered by federal funds.

Speaking briefly at the ceremony were Albert O'Neal, Director of the Exploring division of the Boy Scouts of America; James Goff, assistant director of the Henderson Police Dept.; Robert Anselmo, Public Safety Director, and class speaker, Gary Williams.

In addressing the graduates, Anselmo said they were ... the positive side in a world full of negatives ... a negative job but there are very positive aspects of the work.

"Young people should continue to be involved ... be active in a positive manner to change laws which need changing. Don't sit back and leave it to others. Learn to use the knowledge you've obtained," he concluded.



# 'Bosses Should Set a Good Example' Gov. 'Mike' Says

"Hard work, long hours and understanding people ... these are the key to becoming a successful boss," former governor Mike O'Callaghan told students and bosses at the annual "Boss for a Day" luncheon held last Thursday at Nick's Supper Club.

The former Basic High School teacher spoke before about 200 Basic High students and members of the Chamber of Commerce who participated in the yearly event.

"Hire good employees," he continued. "You must have a large pool to pick from. You can't be a successful boss unless you have employees competing for your job."

When drawing from a pool of potential employees, you should also utilize women and minorities. O'Callaghan said that during his two terms of office he discovered women and minority employees to be "some of the best administrators" in government.

"Hire people who have pride in their work," he said. "Find people who are skilled ... competing for your own job. There is no such thing as JUST a secretary, JUST a ditchdigger. Every job is im-

portant and what makes it important are the people who do them.

"You have to recognize people who have pride in their work. Give them pride in the job ... loyalty can not be replaced by anything I can think of and you can't teach loyalty, you must show it.

"Praise your employees in public," O'Callaghan continued, "but reprimand them in private. Don't be afraid to praise them. If it should be necessary to reprimand, pull the sliver out ... don't let it fester. Never send someone away crushed."

O'Callaghan reiterated "hard work, long hours and set good example," throughout his brief speech. If you expect your employees to work hard and long hours you must do so yourself, he told the group.

Chamber of Commerce president Caesar Caviglia introduced the former Henderson resident, saying that O'Callaghan, upon leaving the governor's office, had opted to live in the "little town to the north of us, that little town that gives us black smoke that we have to chlorinate."

## Dr. Guinn Addresses 'Boss for a Day' Breakfast

As "Boss for a Day" students prepared to set out for a morning with people from the business world, Dr. Kenny Guinn, former superintendent of the Clark County School District, gave them several points to watch for during their participation in the program.

"Watch to see if they are actively working with one another," Guinn said. "You have to earn the right to be the boss so watch how they operate."

His second point was to observe the dress, decorum, attitude. Being well groomed is important, he pointed out, and you can't always dress the way you want, he told students.

When a person comes in to apply for a job the employer will look at the applicant and think, "Is that the person I want to meet the customers?"

A third point Guinn brought

up is educational background: Is a general education sufficient for the job or are special skills required.

The former educator pointed out that it would not be a true situation to be with the boss but observe and you could get some idea of how the business in which the student is participating is run.

Following Guinn's talk in the multi-purpose room at Basic High School, students left with their "Boss for the Day" to learn more about the local business scene.

The annual event is sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and the school's chapter of the Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA).

Nearly 50 Henderson and Las Vegas businesses participated in the activity which has grown tremendously over the past 17 years since it was first started by Ron Langford.

## Union Loses at Levi Strauss

In a narrow union election at Levi Strauss and Co. in Henderson Friday, workers voted not to join the United Steelworkers of America.

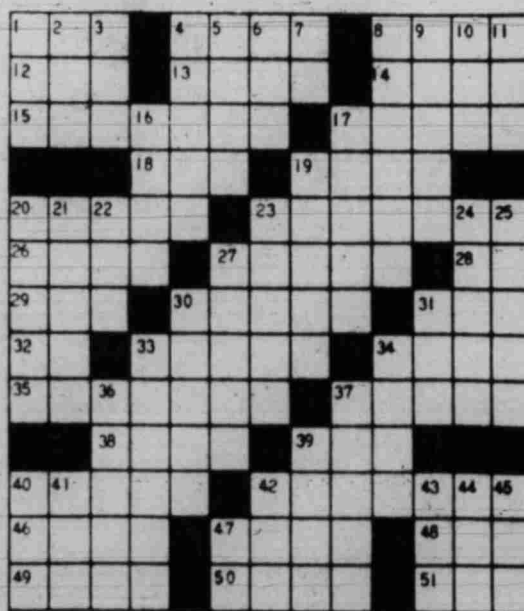
According to figures released by the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB), 69 workers voted against the union, with 64 voting for joining it.

Workers voting were production and maintenance employees, plant clerical employees, shipping and receiving employees, quality assurance and product integrity employees.

## Basic Matters Only

# Basic Takes Third - Sends Seven to State

The Wolves varsity wrestling team finished a close third in last Saturday's zone wrestling championship, close to host team Chaparral's 133½ points finishing only six points behind the Cowboys at 127½ who themselves placed second to team champion Eldorado which posted a 144.

In collecting their third place Zone ranking Basic qualified seven wrestlers for next weekend's state tournament, more than any other southern Nevada school - the three top wrestlers at each weight classification in the zone championships are eligible for the state tour-

namment.

The surprising wrestler for Basic was Leo Hernandez at 168 pounds who tagged Bonanza's Alan Nicholson with his first loss this season after twenty eight straight wins. Leo made a spectacular escape move to tie his match with Nicholson 5-5 in the third period then bested the Bengal wrestler 2-1 in the deciding overtime period.

Along with Leo's first place zone finish the Wolves picked up another first from their most consistent wrestler this season Kevin Burrows who extended his record to 39-1 with a nine to one decision over

Rancho's Mike McGinnis after beating Eldorado's Mark Norcia the wrestler responsible for Ke-vins only loss this season.

Basic picked up second place finishes from Mike Butler at one hundred and six, Ward Twitchell at one seventy eight, and Richard Perkins at Heavyweight who reached the championship round in a crowd stopping performance over Valley's Joe Davis which saw Perkins twice knocked unconscious by the Viking's three hundred and fifty pounder before rolling the big man on his back for the one count pin. Perkins lost a close decision

to Chaparrals Jorge Navarro in the finals 7-6.

The Wolves also seeded two men, Joey Montoya at one hundred thirty six and Ken Briggs at one thirty, by virtue of their third place finishes taking wins to top the consolation bracket - Briggs in a referee's overtime decision over Eldorado's Shorty Scrivens and Montoya with an 11-6 decision over Rancho's Bob Raudenbush.

These seven wrestlers will be among the thirty nine contenders from Southern Nevada competing in Saturday's State Championships also to be held at Chaparral High.

# Rancho Tops Basic tourney

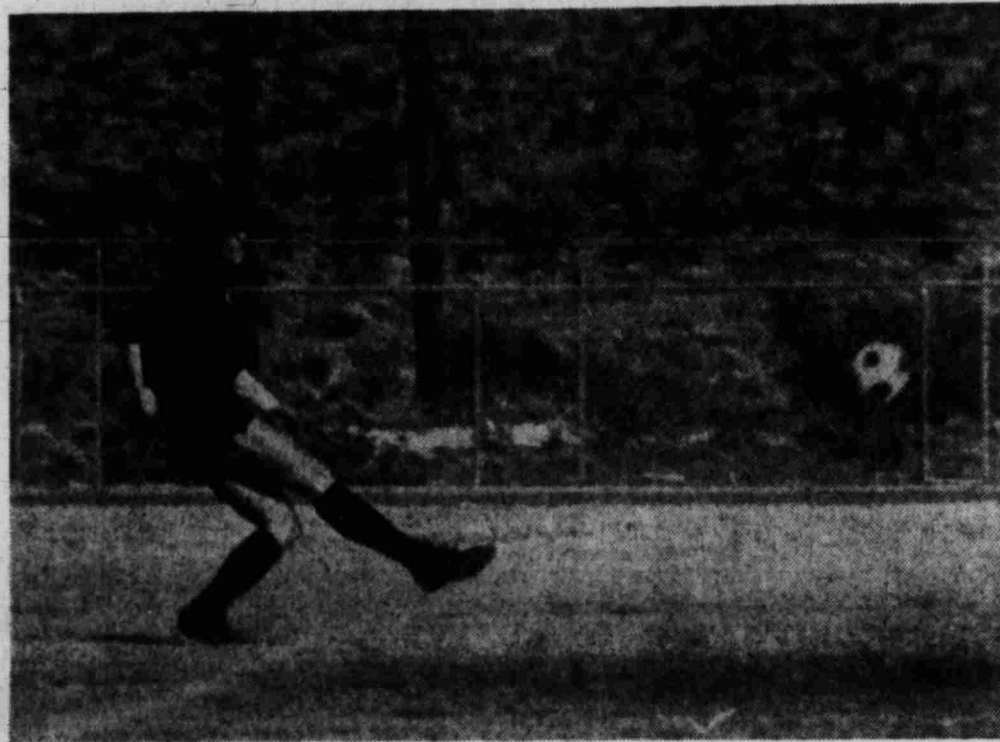
The Rancho Rams topped off an undefeated regular season record of 12-0 by taking wins over Clark's Chargers in the Southern Zone Soccer semi-finals 6-1 and the Gorman Gaels in a 3-0 finals shutout to clench this season's Zone championship.

Basic in its role as this year's tourney host could do no better than an opening appearance in the fourth game of the competition opposite Chaparral's Cowboys on Wednesday evening the second of the five day tournament.

The Wolves, despite playing without the services of their season first string goalie Chuck Quadlin and top playmaker and scorer Russel Crew ended up on the short end of the 4-3 score and in the same position they have occupied numerous times this season - outplaying, outshooting, but not outscoring the opposition.

The first quarter between Chaparral and Basic went scoreless, the Wolves being somewhat hesitant on offense but playing excellent defense to hold back several attempts by the Cowboys. It wasn't until late in the second period that the Cowboys exercising coordinated crossfield support were able to score on Basic catching the Wolves a bit slow in getting back to break open an open shot on goal off the toe of John Schofield with four minutes left in the half. Just short of a minute later Robbie Malloy of Chaparral who capitalized on a similar situation to score, despite Wolves' substitute goalie Doug Kemker getting a hand on the ball. This gave the Cowboys a 2-0 lead going into half-time.

It was all Basic in the second half shotwise as by the end of the match the Wolves had a 20-13 shot on goal edge. Th Cowboys added two more goals on misplays by the less experienced Wolves. However, Basic's Mark Gutierrez answered back in due kind with a pair of second half goals teaming

up with saavy Randy Garrison, up from the junior varsity for the tourney, and Billy Kephart added another as the overly aggressive Cowboys were slapped with a direct kick penalty which Kephart banged in for Basic.

The entire match was a bit on the touchy side with tempers flaring on the field and on the sidelines with many close plays and official calls adding to the tension.

Though the Wolves were forced to bow out after their opening game Coach Cahill said that he was extremely pleased with the play of the team against the stronger more experienced Las Vegas schools this season. And the Basic team has this to be proud of - the new coach Randy Minagil who has brought the champion Rams together this season is a Basic product. Congratulations Wolves!

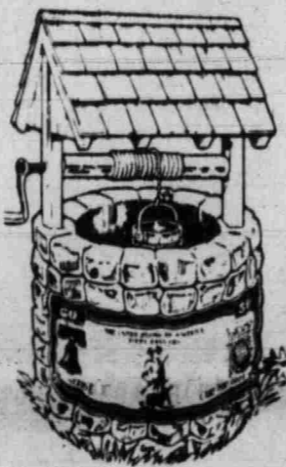

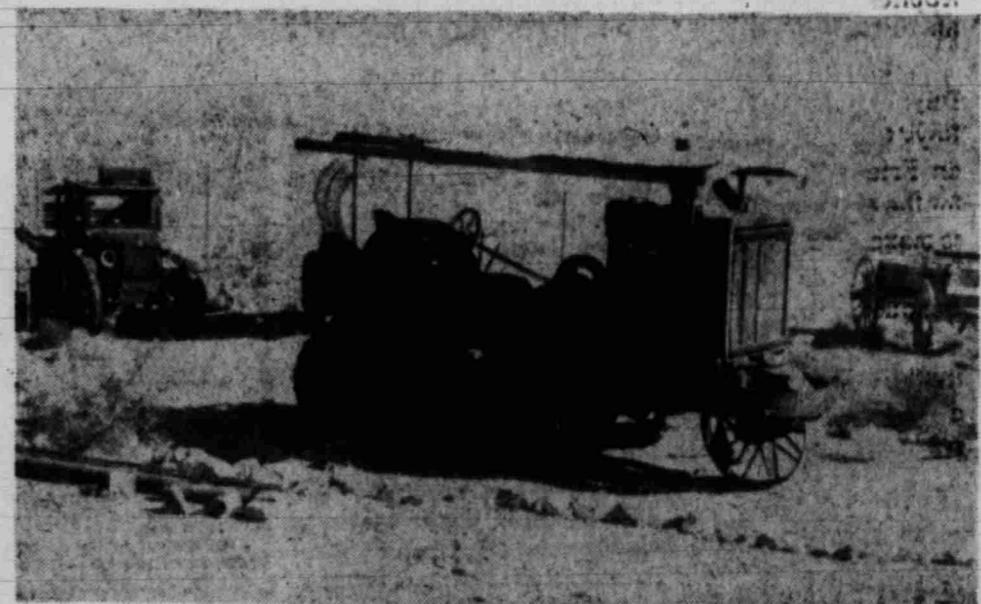

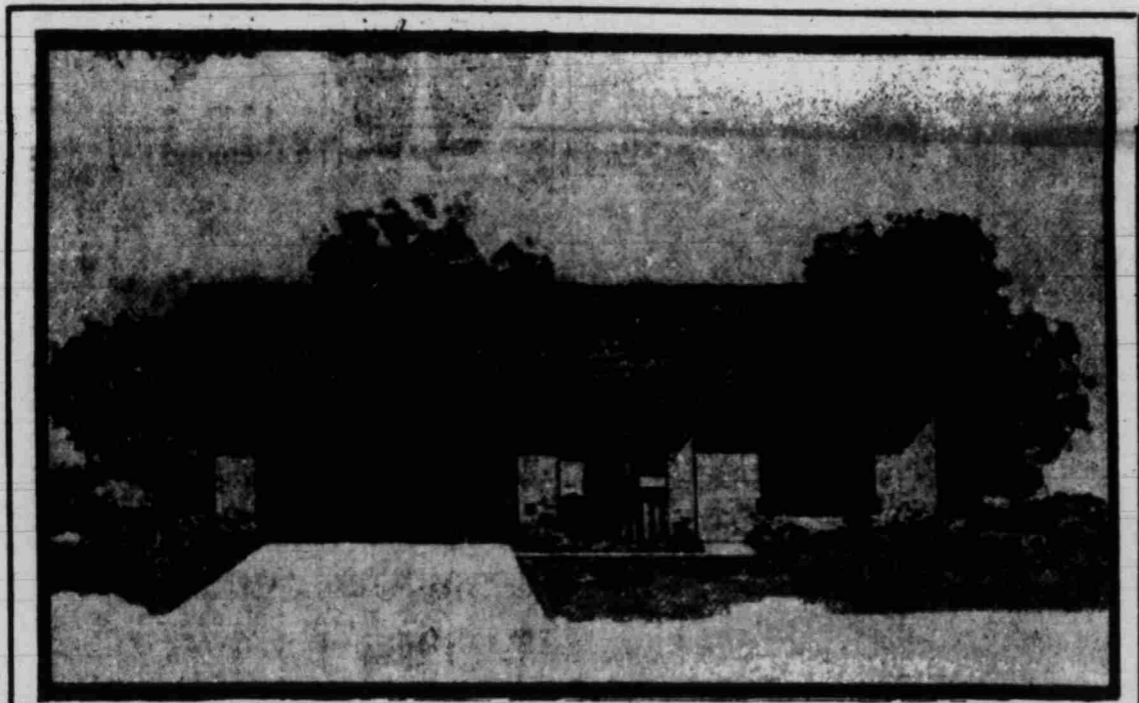

Though it is being suggested that Ron Montoya may be a likely candidate for "top basketball coach of the year" having brought the Wolves to nine victories already this season an astronomical figure compared to past Basic win-loss stats, his team is not performing in top form on a consistent basis.

Basic's guards Perry and Lozano could muster only twenty one points between them and no one else on the team did much better in the loss.

and again on Friday in a game with Las Vegas. Coach Montoya feels that if the offense is clicking properly then there is no reason why the team shouldn't be in the thick of all their remaining games.

**SWATTING AT INFLATION**

You may blame inflation on those two-legged creatures in Washington, but you can also blame the six-legged variety called insects. By devouring crops, insects increase food costs and eat into our budgets.



Competing for our food are more than 10,000 kinds of destructive insects, such as beetles, flies, grubs, weevils and hoppers. Other pests including rats and some 1,800 varieties of weeds also attack crops.

By controlling these thousands of pests, chemical pesticides help keep food prices down. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, without pesticides crop production would drop 30 percent, livestock production would go down 25 percent, and food prices would jump as much as 75 percent.

Pesticide-producing companies like Monsanto Company spend up to 10 years and \$10 million developing each weed or other pest killer and testing it for safety. The use of these products means the bite put on our wallets in the supermarket will have less of a sting.

## Trustees Postpone Action on Shannon Reinstatement

Clark County School District trustees Thursday postponed action on a request for reinstatement by a teacher who was charged with sex offenses.

After meeting in a closed personnel session for almost an hour, the trustees took no action on a recommendation that former Basic High School teacher John Shannon be reinstated.

Dr. James Lyman, president of the board, said the trustees would meet again at 5 p.m. Tuesday to discuss the matter.

Shannon, 39, was suspended in September, 1976 after he was charged with two counts of lewdness with a minor. The charges were later dismissed in Justice and District courts.

A hearing officer recommended last week that Shannon be reinstated and, under state law, Superintendent Claude Perkins was required to accept the recommendation or make a different recommendation to the trustees Thursday.

Neither Perkins nor the trustees would comment on the superintendent's recommendation.

Several persons who attended the meeting had requested to speak to the trustees before they acted on the Shannon recommendation, but those requests were denied.

As the trustees pre-

pared to go into closed personnel session, three women confronted Lyman and asked why they were denied an opportunity to speak.

Lyman told the women that he didn't think it would be appropriate for them to speak on the matter, because it might prejudice the trustees.

Earlier in the week, a group of some 20 persons picketed the school dis-

trict headquarters to protest the recommendation that Shannon be reinstated.

Phil Prisbrey, a Henderson resident who organized the protest, was one of those who requested to speak at Thursday's meeting.

Prisbrey is the father of the two youths who accused the teacher of making sexual advances toward them.

**Ax for Aged Programs?**

The following article was taken from the November - December 1978 issue of "Perspective on Aging"

The Ax for Aged Programs?

My Administration will not sacrifice the needs and, more importantly, the rights of the elderly on an altar of fiscal austerity or human insensitivity. I am committed to a program that guarantees to older Americans the right to an adequate income, affordable health care, transportation, housing and the freedom to live long and productive lives. These are rights that older Americans have earned, that a just and sympathetic nation should generously support."

They were the words of a presidential candi-

date who articulated a list of goals he pledged to achieve on behalf of older persons. Jimmy Carter at the end of his second year in the presidency now faces a severe test of his credibility. He has proposed an anti-inflationary budget, a program of fiscal austerity that means cutbacks, less of what there was before (and there wasn't enough for the elderly) and a further squeeze on the aged already seriously affected by the shrunken dollar. The President clearly intends to wield an ax, with no sparing of domestic welfare programs.

There is excellent reason to fear the undoing of legislative progress made in 1978 to benefit older Americans. Carter's free-swinging hatchet may dash the hopes engendered by earlier passage of crucial legislation, and danger looms large on all fronts. Amendments to the Older Americans Act (OAA), for example, are currently funded under a continuing resolution - at last year's funding levels. The 1978 amendments authorize new and reorganized programs, but no additional Federal money is expected to support the new programs or to soften the ravages of inflation on present projects.

Title XX of the Social Security Act is another, shocking case in point. It is a major funding source for services to Americans with low incomes. But with its allocation increased for only one year, Title XX by the close of 1979 will revert, incredibly, to its 1975 funding level. The present economic trend seems to negate any chance of a boost in funds to counteract the unrealistic turnabout. The Comprehensive Employment and Training Act and the Community Services Administration, both slated to receive improved authorizations, will not get the money unless it is appropriated by CONGRESS % AND, AGAIN, THERE IS VIRTUALLY NO CHANCE. The outlook for additional funding of older persons in rural areas is just as bleak.

Unfortunately, the state-level response to inflation's onslaught

Proposition 13 and similar legislation that sharply reduce local property taxes and set caps on state budgets, which mean less public money for support services to older people.

It appears that citizens least qualified to serve as shock troops in the war against inflation are pushed to the front lines despite their obvious vulnerability. The nation's older population was the first to be victimized. We urge the President and Congress to recognize that older persons could be the last to suffer from economic curtailments by the Federal Government.

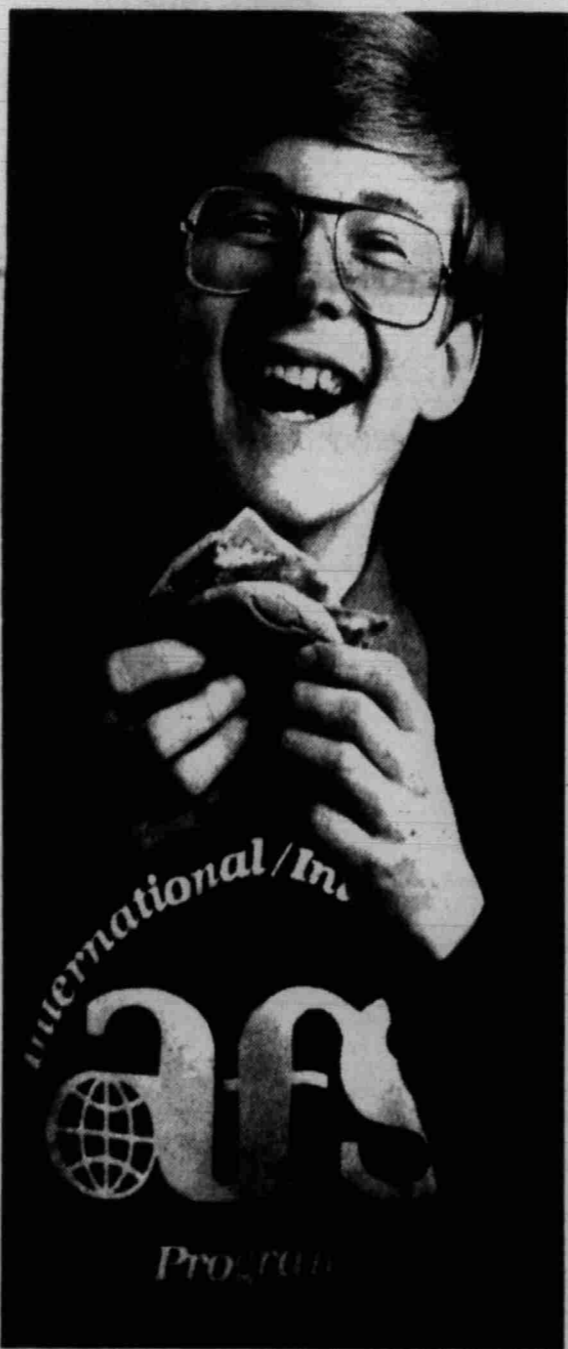
