Approximately half of **TIMET's workers started** back to work Monday following a vote Saturday of 502-69 to end the 18 - day strike at the large industrial plant.

J. W. Walters, plant manager, said that about 50 percent of the workers have gone back to work but he is not sure how fast the remainder of the almost 800 workers will be recalled.

"Our best estimate is that it will be from 11/2 to 3 months, we'll have a better feel after

this week," Walters said. Jim Thompson, president of Steelworkers Local 4856 said he feels good about the contract and said it is one of

the richest contracts ratified in the free industrial world." Walters said the strike was disappointing to the company since there was little

change in the wage package before the strike and after the strike. "There is less than one - half percent difference," he said.

"It's a shame it had to happen," Walters said, "and we spend a lot of time wondering why." He said that by the end of the third year the labor cost to Timet will be up by present standards by from \$10 to \$15 million.

# Danny Thompson lashes Sena's auto insurance

Lashing out at Assemblyman Nash Sena for voting for bills that were against the best interests of working people, Danny Thompson, a home grown Hendersonian, this week announced that he will file for the seat in the assembly that Sena holds.

"Nash Sena authored and voted for the mandatory insurance law that requires everyone to have insurance or face up to a \$500 fine for those who are caught without it," Thompson said yesterday in his announcement that he will run for office.

"Now don't get me wrong, everyone needs insurance but when the insurance companies are given a sellers market without restrictions this is not fair."

"It's not fair to senior citizens on fixed incomes whose incomes have been steadily eroded by inflation."


"It's not fair to young people who in some cases pay outrageous premiums because of their age."

"Nevada has the sixth highest insurance rates in the country and also has a law now that forces its citizens to be criminals," Thomspon added.

"You simply can't have your community elect you to a position and then go to Carson City and forget about the people who put you there and why. I think people are tired of getting nothing for something."

"Therefore, I have filed for the assembly in District 21, and if the people would take a better look at what has happened to them over the past several years, and will give me some support I may be able to do something about those problems," Thompson concluded.

Thompson was born July 31, 1951, at St. Rose de Lima Hospital in Henderson. He attended elementary school through high school in Henderson where in 1969 he graduated from Basic High School.

Heshas three brothers and three sisters, who except for two, currently reside in Henderson. His oldest brother, James, is the President of the United Steelworkers of America Local No. 4856.

His father is the Pastor of the Bibleway Fellowship Church on Decatur Boulevard in Las Vegas.

In 1971 he married Debora Currier. She was also born and raised in Henderson. She is employed as a teachers aide at C:T. Sewell Eelementary School. They have two sons, David who is eight, and Danny who is six and reside at 226 Navajo Drive.

In January of 1969 he went to work for Stauffer Chemical Company. In January of 1972 he was accepted by the Joint Apprenticeship Committee as an Apprentice Insulator, and after his four-year apprenticeship, he was made a Journeyman and is at present still working in his trade.

For the past seven years he has been an officer of the United Steelworkers of America Local No. 5282. He worked as the Maintenance Grievance Committeeman, the Maintenance Safety Committeeman, Chairman of the Joint Safety Committee and then in January 1979, he was elected President of the local union.

Thompson's additional complaint against Sena is explained in his following statement:

"As President of the local union I became aware of how state laws that aren't considered carefully by their creators can hurt the people they are intended to help. For example A.B. No. 241 (which is now state law) reads like this:"

'A person is ineligible for benefits for the week in which he has filed a claim for benefits, if he was discharged from his last or next to last employment for misconduct connected with his work, and remains ineligible until he earns renumeration in covered employment equal to or exceeding his weekly benefit amount in each of not more than 15 weeks. Thereafter as determined by the Executive Director in each case according to the seriousness of misconduct."

"Now that doesn't sound so bad but what this law says is that if you are terminated for misconduct you are ineligible for unemployment benefits until you get another job (which now days might not be so easy). Now you would probably say if someone is terminated for misconduct he doesn't deserve any benefits, but as President of the local union, I have seen people fired because of a company rule that doesn't allow you to see a doctor or dentist without being penalized," Thompson said.

"I can't understand why Nash Sena voted for this bill when everyone in District 21 are working people. A law like this is definitely a step backwards for anyone who works for an hourly rate," the candidate stated.

With all this, he says, voting was "not a top


"Pop, let's run an editorial, pointing to the town's need for action toward a permanent airport."

Soon after the midnineteenth century, the task of writing six volumes of a collection called the History of Woman Suffrage was begun by Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Stanton, two women who had played important roles in the political movement for getting women the vote. The first three volumes took 10 years to write and were completed in 1886, the fourth volume was published in 1902, and the last two volumes were finished 20 years later in 1922. The woman who edited the final two volumes of this work had collaborated with Anthony and Stanton from the beginning and made it her life's work to finish the collection. Who was that lady? Ida Husted Harper.
