

Jeffrey runs unopposed, Gibson challenged

Assembly District 22 incumbent Jack Jeffrey will have an easier race for his seat than he might have thought. He's running unopposed.
No one filed to challenge Jeffrey, according to a clerk in the Clark County Election Department, and that eliminates the

part of campaigning Jeffrey most dislikes.
"I hate fundraising," he said. "I don't like to ask people for money."
He attributes the lack of opposition to difficulty in recruiting candidates.
"I'd like to think it's because I'm tough and all that," he said Thursday, the day after the fil-

ing deadline, "but I know how difficult it is to recruit people. It requires a lot of sacrifice. A lot of people would like to run for office but then they look at it and they can't."
"Some of the people the Republicans tried to recruit in Boulder City would have been tough candidates," he said. "But if you tell people the truth

about what they have to do, it's difficult to recruit them."
Assembly District 21
The race for the other Assembly seat involving Henderson won't be nearly so easy to call. Henderson accountant Dennis Reber is challenging the District 21 incumbent, Democrat Danny Thompson. Reber is a Republican who is

stressing education and economic diversification in his campaign.
Senate District 1
Sen. James Gibson, long-time member of the state legislature, is being challenged by an obscure Boulder City Republican named John Emerick. At press time, little was known of Emerick and at least one prominent

Boulder City Republican said she was unfamiliar with him.
A challenge from Henderson businessman Bob Glasburn failed to materialize, though he had indicated earlier in the year that he might challenge Gibson.
Glasburn Thursday said he has set his sights on a local office instead: the municipal judge position held by Jim Jensen.

Henderson building boom continues

June was another big month for building in Henderson; more than \$22 million worth of new construction was initiated.

A total of 390 building permits of various types were issued by the city, with a total estimated valuation of \$22.48 million.
Total valuation for the year is approaching \$100 million. Currently it stands at \$92.76 million.
The June total is a \$10 million increase over May, and falls about \$5 million short of April's record-setting \$27 million valuation.

in that category jumped more than \$12 million, offsetting a \$2 million drop in single

family residential building. In June, 1985, the city issued a mere \$2.22 million worth of

building permits, and the total valuation for the first six months of 1985 was \$33.01

million, slightly over a third of the 1986 total for the first six months.

Old Vegas closes for retrofit

Old Vegas, the western-style theme park located on Boulder Highway, has closed its gates, unable to meet a fire sprinkler retro-fitting deadline.

According to Henderson fire chief Dale Starr, the park has failed to comply with state retro-fitting regulations. The sprinkler system was to be installed by July 1.

Starr said Monday that Old Vegas, which is owned by the Houston-based Westworld Inc., had received three previous time extensions on the retrofit date.

"We of course couldn't recommend another extension," he said, "or it would go on and on and on."

Don French, an official of Westworld Inc., said Monday that the park will reopen in approximately 60 days.

"We decided to close it down and complete the retro-fit and do some other remodeling," he said. "Summer is a slow time for parks, and it's not uncommon for parks to close for a few months in the summer."

He denied rumors that the park had been sold.

Old Vegas opened in 1978, developed by Westworld, then known as Old Tucson Corp. It was modeled after a similar park in Tucson, Ariz.

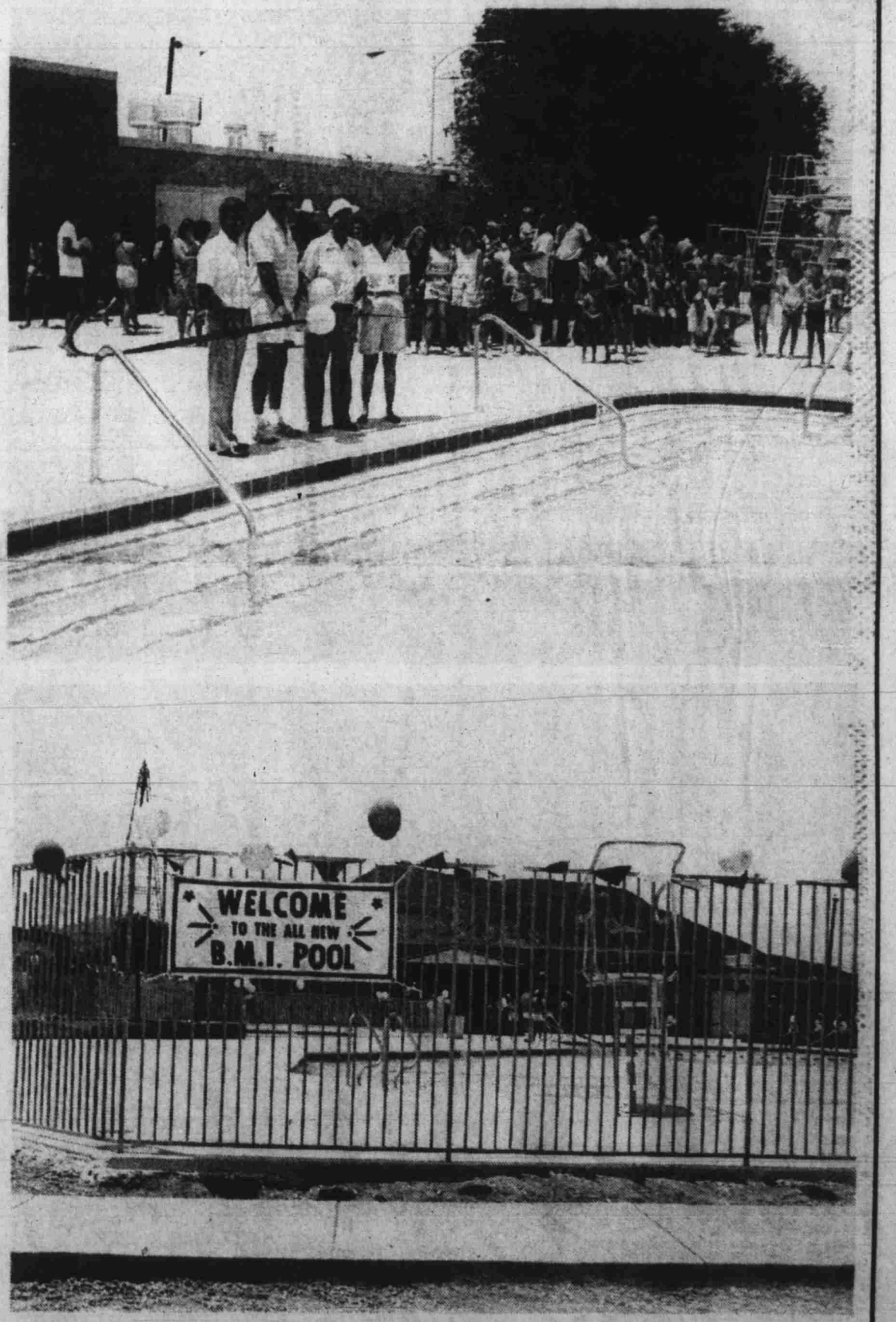
Henderson city manager Gary Bloomquist and councilmen Rob Hubel, Carlton Lawrence and Charlotte Yakubik were on hand to cut the ribbon, which was stretched across the steps leading to the shallow end of the recreational swimming pool.

At noon, just as soon as the ribbon was cut, children and their parents spread out. Some entered the largest pool, others went through gates on either side to go into the wading pool or to wait turns to plummet off the diving boards.

A few exhibited skill in diving, others obviously needed practice, and some just jumped. Several made a game of leaping off the high dive in a "cherry bomb" near enough to splash the lifeguard, perched high above the water.

The good-natured lifeguards kept kids under control throughout the day, taking

Holiday weekend takes its toll

The Henderson Fire Department responded to nine fires over the weekend that were related to fireworks, the police department took seven people into civil protective custody and two people died at Lake Mead National Recreation Area.

Although two people had been reported drowned over the weekend, Park Ranger Newton Sikes said the father of one of the young men called to report his son had phoned him in Idaho.

A 23-year-old man drowned about 5:30 p.m. Saturday, and a 20-year-old California woman committed suicide Friday night.

In addition, Sikes reported two serious accidents at the lake.

Sikes said the body of resident alien Aurel Zlataru was found later Saturday after he had drowned off North Shore Road between Las Vegas Wash and Calville Bay. Zlataru, of Romania, had lived in the United States about three years, and had no fixed address, he said.

William C. Gallagher, 22, of

Idaho Falls, Idaho, was reported missing by three friends. Sikes said the three young adults related he jumped in the water and hadn't returned to shore.

The father of the young man called to say his son phoned him, but Sikes says the case is still under investigation.

Sikes said questions remain as to where the man is now, and why he hid from his friends, leaving his clothes, wallet and all his belongings behind.

Sikes mentioned park rangers spent two days looking for Gal-

agher's body.

Shortly before midnight Friday, Sikes said 20-year-old Veronica Pintos of Los Angeles committed suicide by taking 190 sleeping pills of the brand name "Sleepinals".

The young woman was staying at Lakeshore Trailer Village on Boulder Beach with relatives, he said. He added she was despondent for unknown reasons, and had attempted to kill herself about a month ago.

A Las Vegas man was seriously injured after diving off the back of a boat at King-

man Wash Saturday night, according to Sikes.

Eric L. Ansteth, 33, was taken to Valley Hospital by Flight for Life after diving into the water of the Wash, Sikes said.

He said Ansteth and two or three others had beached their 22-foot boat at the Wash when the man dived off. He added the man has a compressed vertebrae and a complete diagnosis will take several days.

Flight for Life was also called

Dumping in desert may bring heavy fines

One man faces charges tomorrow and another was fined last week in cases involving dumping trash in the desert. According to city sources, Henderson is attempting to crack down on the problem. However, city employees cannot issue a citation unless they witness the dumping themselves. Still, residents who witness such illegal dumping may make a citizen's arrest. Leonard Lang of the city's business license department said he accidentally came on Steven Petriello of Bivins Construction Company as he dumped trash in the Camarillo Valley neighborhood June 18. Petriello, who told Lang his supervisor told him to dump in the desert, was fined \$200 plus \$10 court costs on June 25. The maximum fine is \$1,000, and perpetrators can be sentenced to six months in jail. On July 2, Lang witnessed a man working for Bradshaw Landscape dumping a trailer load of grass clippings in the area of Green Valley Parkway and Wigwam. Chad Ficklin is scheduled to appear in court on the charge tomorrow evening. The law describing "prohibited methods of disposal" is one of the oldest on the books. Ordinance number 33, adopted in 1953, is spelled out as Henderson Municipal Code 5.16.050. The law states that no trash may be placed on the premises of another, nor in any street, alley, gutter or highway, nor on one's own premises in such a manner that it "may be blown or carried over to other public or private property." Trash is described in the municipal code as any garbage, rubbish, dirt, dead animal, ashes or other material whatsoever. Lang said if anyone who witnesses illegal dumping wants to bring charges, they should call the police, himself or environmental control officer Clara Monscvitz. "We would help them in the process," he explained, adding, "they would have to make the citizen's arrest." Dumping locations Monscvitz and Lang noted there are two sites where trash may be legally dumped. Silver State Disposal, the company that collects trash in the area, has a main dumping site on Sunrise Mountain and a transfer site in Henderson. A spokesperson for Silver State said citizens may dump trash for free, as long as they show a cancelled check or a previous bill for garbage service. Commercial dumping is charged \$2 per cubic yard. The Henderson site, located south of Lake Mead Drive near the Valley View neighborhood, will take most trash. However, a spokesperson mentioned they will turn down "big items, such as appliances, furniture, things like that." Large rocks and broken concrete blocks will also be refused there, she said. However, she said the Sunrise Mountain site will accept all trash. That site is located in Las Vegas at the end of Vegas Valley Drive, at the foot of Sunrise Mountain. Both locations are open 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week. Large-trash pickup is available to Henderson residential customers every Saturday. There is one alternative for some contractors who do not want to take dirt, asphalt or broken concrete all the way to Sunrise Mountain. Mike Glancy of WMK Builders Products said selected contractors may deposit "solid waste" in an open pit on their property. However, he said monitoring has been hard to control, and anything that might decompose within the fill is not permitted. Contractors with such "solid waste" might get in touch with WMK for a local area to dump dirt, asphalt or broken concrete. Otherwise, the city warns they should take the trash to the authorized dumps, or face being fined in court.

to rescue a seven-year-old girl who was underwater for several minutes in the Las Vegas Wash area of Lake Mead. Tiffany Carson of North Las Vegas was taken to Humana Hospital Sunrise in very critical condition. Sikes said she was not breathing when brought out from the water where she had been playing near the sewer line. Sikes said there were many other incidents at the Lake over the holiday weekend, including rescues on beaches caused by high winds. Several DUI arrests were also made, he said.

Fires
Most of the fires that involved fireworks which the Henderson Fire Department was called to over the weekend were brush or grass fires. The first came about 1 p.m. Friday, when a power pole owned by Nevada Power Company caught fire on Coogan between Palm and Chestnut. About 6:15 p.m. a fire in vacant property across the street from Ballerina was put out before firefighters arrived. A palm tree caught fire about 7 p.m. on Shoshone Lane, which was also put out before firemen arrived. At about 8:30 p.m. a grass fire in a vacant lot near Horizon and Greenway was extinguished by a garden hose prior to firefighters' arrival. Another lawn fire outside a home on Ash Street was put out by property owners about 9 p.m. About 10 p.m. Henderson firefighters put out a tree and brush fire on a vacant lot near Happy Lane and Sandhill Road.

The fire was blamed on children playing with fireworks. Although the scene is located in Clark County, Henderson firefighters arrived first and put out the fire. However, about 12:10 a.m. Saturday, Clark County firefighters put out a brush fire in a vacant lot near Bluegrass and Eastern. The final fire blamed on fireworks occurred about 1:30 p.m. Saturday on the railroad right of way behind city yards. Children were also blamed for that fire. Of the seven people taken into civil protective custody over the weekend, three were women and four were men. Their ages ranged from 24 to 33. They were charged July 4 at 11:22 p.m. and 11:25 p.m.; July 5 at 12:22 a.m. and 1:20 p.m.; two were cited July 6 at 12:35 a.m. and the last was taken in at 12:55 a.m.

another extension, park owners will now have to put up or shut down. Hopefully, the closure for repairs is temporary and not a guise to ease into worse circumstances. Park managers have kept Old Vegas' local profile very low and seem to only actively recruit bus tour and other visitor-related customers.

The temporary closure of Las Vegas Downs has lingered and only recent plans that would radically alter the area's first use as a dog racing track have promised any hope of revitalization.

Those concerned have said the track has little chance of success with dog racing and betting as its only income.

Henderson needs both facilities to be prosperous, but those involved in the management and ownership of them seem recalcitrant at the oddest of times.

Editors note: The cliché "Jack is back" certainly applies to our 'new' but veteran sports editor Jack Fourcade. By way of reintroducing our main man, I have resurrected an original article on Jack that appeared in the Aug. 11, 1983 Boulder City News sports page. Jack will be joining our Henderson team as sports editor after having just completed 2½ years as sports editor-writer for our Boulder City News publication.

From coaching and teaching to the ranks of journalism! Impossible or rather improbable? No—not really.

That is exactly what has happened to the newest-assigned member of the Henderson Home News staff. By way of fourth-estate formalities, we'd like to introduce Jack Fourcade, our new sports editor, who will begin duties today.

Fourcade is not a newcomer to sportswriting, even though most of his efforts and energies the past 31 years have centered around teaching duties, practice fields, stadiums and gymnasiums in California.

Our newest News staffer has served several California community high schools and newspapers in a most unique manner dating back to 1952.

Along with his teaching duties, mostly in the business subjects field (typing, shorthand) at Jackson High School ('52) followed by pedagoging duties at Alisal, Salinas, and North Salinas High Schools, Jack found the time and enthusiasm, not to men-

tion coaching techniques, to head championship level football and track teams at all four schools at one time or another.

In more recent times, Jack has been teaching in the business and vocational subject areas until 1983 (Salinas High, Calif.), Fourcade has also served as student body activities director, work experience coordinator, amateur boxing official, and a track meet starter for most of the bigger track meets in California's central coast section.

Jack was the Boulder City News sports editor-writer from Aug. of 1983 until Nov. of 1985 to account for his latest sportswriting chores.

Journalism background you ask?

Fourcade developed the 'ink' in his veins in a most peculiar manner.

In an effort to make ends meet while attending San Jose State College (Calif.) during the 1947-51 era, Fourcade turned to boxing and a berth on the crack SJS Spartan leather slinging unit.

While representing the Spartans in the ring sport, Fourcade, at that time a 130-pound junior lightweight, found out that he could make a little extra spending money by stringing out-of-town college bouts for the San Jose Mercury-Herald sports department.

Thus, in addition to helping publicize the late coach DeWitt Portal's boxing team's fetes, Fourcade managed to gain a little publicity and fame as a pugilist, plus a piece of change in the form of walk-around money for his writing.

"I was probably no great shucks as an amateur or intercollegiate boxer and my stories that were 'inked' may or may not have reflected this—but I did pick up certain writing techniques in addition to throwing hooks and jabs and ducking some," recalled Fourcade about his San Jose State experiences.

When moving into football coaching for the first time Fourcade saw to it that his Jackson High Tiger (52-54) gridders were well publicized by continuing his sports writing duties for the Amador County Ledger in Calif.

Fourcade next continued to write, coach, and then publicize his city of Salinas football and track teams in the Salinas

Californian newspaper.

While teaching and coaching in Salinas, Fourcade wrote under the pseudonym of Ed Acruof—Fourcade spelled backwards. His athletes or readers never did catch on to this bit of journalistic deception according to Fourcade—he just didn't want his athletes or rival coaches to know who was scribing the stories.

Many California sports journalists have utilized Fourcade's unique skills in writing over the years.

Included on Jack's friends list would be Art Rosenbaum and Glen Dickey of the San Francisco Chronicle, Eric Brazil and Mark Soltau of the San Francisco Examiner, Ward Bushee of USA Today and Fran Erotta of the San Jose Mercury.

The list of athletes who have come under the influence of Fourcade either through his coaching, teaching, officiating, or writing techniques resemble a mini-Who's-Who in the world of sports—past and present.

For starters, and to name but a few, Fourcade has worked closely with current University of California football coach and ex-Minnesota Viking quarterback Joe Kapp; former base tamweight boxing champion, the late Manuel Ortiz; Del Rodgers, currently an NFL free-agent after having just completed four seasons as a punt return specialist with the Green Bay Packers, and Anthony Toney—making his debut with the Philadelphia Eagles as a running back following a distinguished football-track career while cavorting for North Salinas High, Hartnell College and Texas A and M.

All of these name athletes were associated with Fourcade at one time or another while passing through or living in Salinas (Calif.)

For some, it was a teacher-pupil relationship, for others a coach-athlete togetherness, but for all, an experience in sports and a study in writing techniques as captured by their coach and friend.

Players on both teams were cited for having played some outstanding baseball, the Henderson Recreation Department's Jerry Woods in attendance and supervising both tournament games.

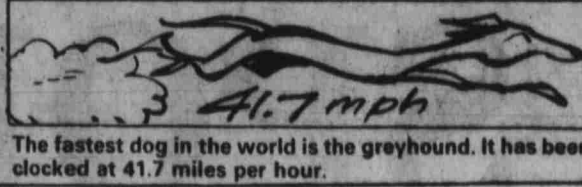

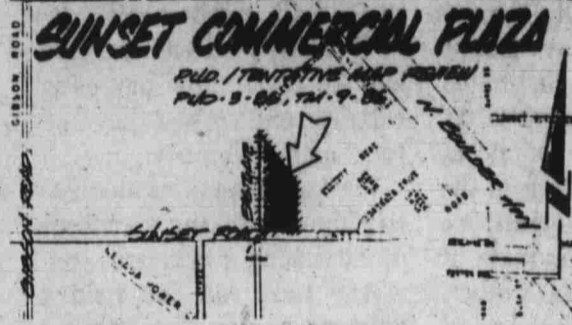

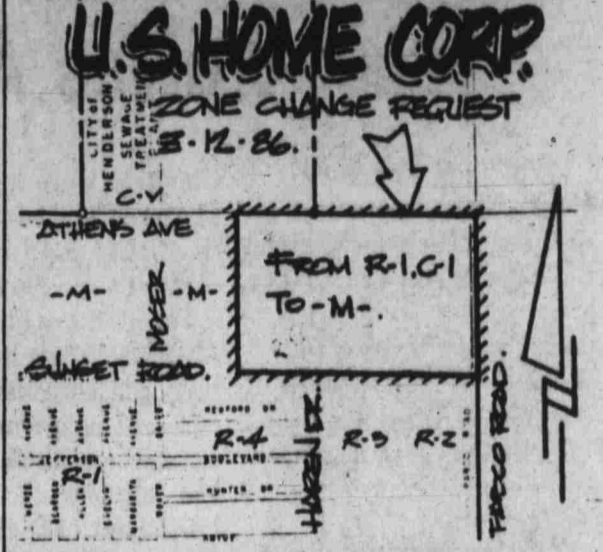

The depreciation study, based on depreciable plant balances as of December 31, 1984, results in an accrual increase of \$6,710,207 or approximately 28%. The recommended account rates are as follows:

Brady challenging for bareback bronco lead

HENDERSON'S BAREBACK BRONCO—Riding champion Danny Brady is set and ready to ride in the Calgary Stampede July 13-14 in the Canadian city and then double back to catch more bronc riding time in the California State Rode in Salinas, Calif. July 17-20th.

It only takes eight seconds but what a wild and woolly experience for an athlete to go through!

For Henderson's Danny Brady, riding bucking broncos is a way of life. The Basic High graduate (Class of '76) is currently the third ranked bareback bronc rider in the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association.

Last weekend found the wiry tough Danny competing in and winning top money in the prestigious Reno Rodeo.

Brady was the PRCA bareback bronc riding kingpin in 1983 while winning gold and silver belt buckles along with prize money after competing in all of the biggest rodeos in the country. His prize money totaled in the \$65,000 bracket during his championship year.

So far this season, Brady has earned \$36,000 in prize money after concluding his customary eight second rides in the daily go-arounds of bareback bronc riding competition.

Veteran bronc buster Chuck Logue of McKinney, Texas is the current leader in the bareback bronc competition as indulged in by the PRCA cowboys. Brady is in hot pursuit of the number one ranked Logue.

Brady got the best of a bronco with the catch name of "Dreamboat Annie" when hooking 'em in during the Reno competition. Danny won

third place in Monday's go-around and then came back to win it all in Sunday's finale aboard "Dreamboat Annie."

Brady left the northern city (Reno) \$6,500 richer, his prize money safely tucked away as he boarded his charter flight home along with fellow rodeo competitor Louie Fields, an Elkridge, Utah PCRA cowpoke.

Danny's work load just won't let up. Fourth of July weekend found the Henderson cowboy competing in the Cody (Wyo.) Stampede, Greeley (Colo.) Roundup and the Prescott (Ariz.) Frontier Days Show.

Rodeo fans attending this weekend's prestigious Calgary (Canada) Stampede will get another look at Brady. The Basic High graduate has competed many times in the Canadian city and is a highly popular bronc-busting rider who has always thrilled the Stampede spectators.

Soon after Brady returns from his Calgary shute-bolting experiences, he will again take off in his airplane and head in the direction of the Salinas (Calif.) Rodeo, July 17-20.

Danny was the California State Rodeo champion bareback bronc riding champion in '83 and with Salinas being the site of the CSR, it is safe that the Salinas fans and rodeo aficionados. Brady is on his way and to think—it just takes those mere eight seconds a day... the toughest and most rugged eight seconds out of the day in the life of a PRCA cowboy.

in response to Public Works director Geoffrey Billingsley's warning that low water pressures and shortages may be experienced in an area receiving water line and valve improvements.

Billingsley said Green Valley rapidly expanding subdivisions south of Warm Springs Road on either side of Valle Verde could experience peak-period shortages and low pressures

this summer, before and during city-planned improvements that will place a 30-inch water line with appropriate pressure valves beneath Warm Springs Road.

Mayor Lorna Kesterson suggested the meeting as a way to communicate the coming problems to local residents.

The American Nevada Corp. planned community has had a history peppered with water

pressure problems, some of which were alleviated by the completion of the largest local improvement district in state history.

However, Billingsley said Tuesday night the city had let subdivisions south of Warm Springs Road grow and multiply too rapidly before adequate water lines could be placed in the area.

Compounding the problems

could be delays in water-line construction and completion.

Billingsley said Tuesday valves that must attach to smaller water lines cannot be obtained immediately and may take as many as five weeks to deliver.

Council voted unanimously to schedule the meeting despite their experience with previous poorly attended neighborhood gatherings in Green Valley.

Air Conditioners

Q: How can I prevent water dripping from the air conditioner into the room?

A: According to home economists from Whirlpool Corporation, improper installation can cause dripping into the room. If the unit is tilted incorrectly, water will drain inside instead of outside. Follow the manufacturer's instructions when installing the air conditioner unit. Dripping usually occurs during times of extreme humidity. To minimize drippage, keep doors closed, turn thermostat to a warmer setting, use a medium rather than low fan setting and make certain the drain hole in the back of the unit is not plugged.



Q: What causes my air conditioner to "ice up"?

A: Freeze up usually occurs because of miscalculation on the part of the user. It most frequently happens for the following reasons:

- Using the unit when the outdoor temperature is too cold.
- The filter needs cleaning.
- The thermostat setting is too cold.
- The area to be cooled is too large for the capacity of the air conditioner.
- The fan speed is set too low.
- The unit runs for a long period of time at very cold setting.
