





The Student Council, organized for the purpose of student participation in school government, helped direct and instigate many successful activities during the school year of 1951-52.



Coach Gene McDowell, in his first season of coaching at Basic High School, has started a very successful building program and is deeply admired by his athletes as well as the rest of the student body.


