We, the Seniors, regret that we haven't been in the new school longer, but the memories of our time here shall never be forgotten.






Principal's Message


This is the government of Basic High School. Under the direction of Mr. John A. Dooley, these people work diligently to provide a better student government.




MOST VALUABLE PLAYER

In the 1954 session of Boys' State which is sponsored by the American Legion, Basic representatives literally had "control" of the government.


