The loud cheers of the 225 members of the class of 1960 echo throughout school . . . and carry a note of pride and conviction at being the largest class in Basic's short history.






As in the city, clubs of all types provide opportunities for developing leadership abilities.

The outstanding point of the squad was the "team" as was especially shown at the win over White Pine, 14-6. The coaches agreed that their boys deserved high praise for this victory.



The Basic Wolves, with only one returning starter, cocaptain Ron Mich'l, began their season not expected to win 10 games of the 19-game schedule; the team that went onto the court for the first Boulder game, our conference opener, was green, but as each game passed, their growing experience became apparent.

January 18 and 19, for the first time in our school's history, Basic defeated Lincoln and White Pine on their home courts.

Basic won 7 out of the 9 regular season games, including a 53-41 triumph over Las Vegas, the first victory over the neighboring Wildcats since 1947—ten long years. One week later, the Wolves dropped a heart-breaker to the Wildcats, 53-50 in the overtime.


In the Southern Zone tournaments, the Wolves won the first night, lost the second and then came back with flying colors to beat Boulder City and to win a trip to the state tournaments for the third straight year. While in Reno, Basic was the only Southern Zone team to win a game with a 58-54 win over Reno. Ronnie Mich'l was named to the all-state team, the only player from the south to win the honor. Ronnie Mich'l was the leading scorer for the season, with a 21.4 average, including high scores in our major wins. Russ Williams was second with a 9.9 average, and Hal Foster was third with 6.7 average. Russ Williams led with free-shot percentage at 73.8 percent, Foster second with 72.6 percent and Mich'l third, 64.7 percent.


With only two losses, a powerful junior varsity basketball team conducted a highly successful season, under the coaching of Edward Shellinger.



Besides these musical extravaganzas, the group usually takes one trip during the sports season—this year they traveled to Lincoln County for the football game.




