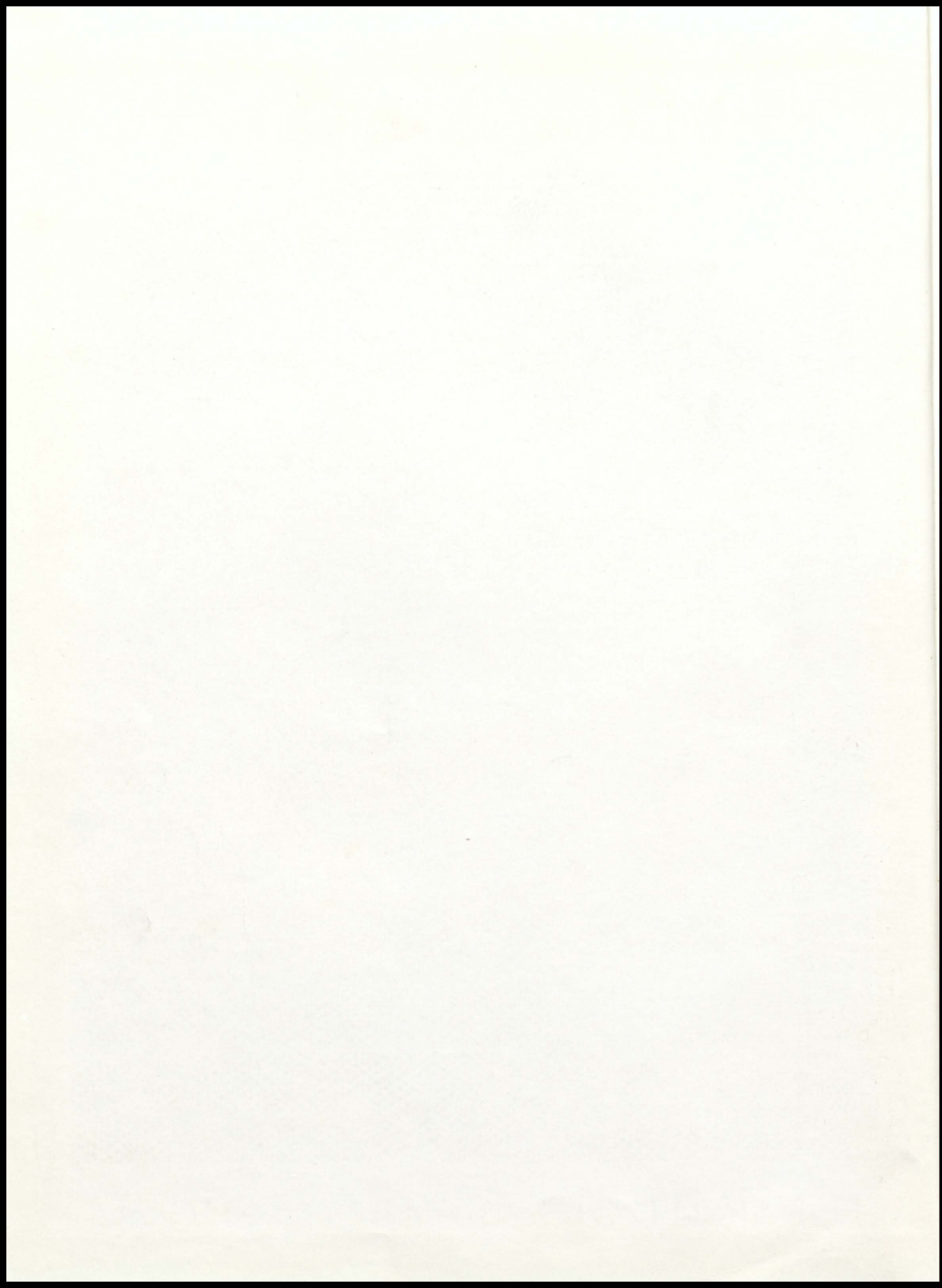

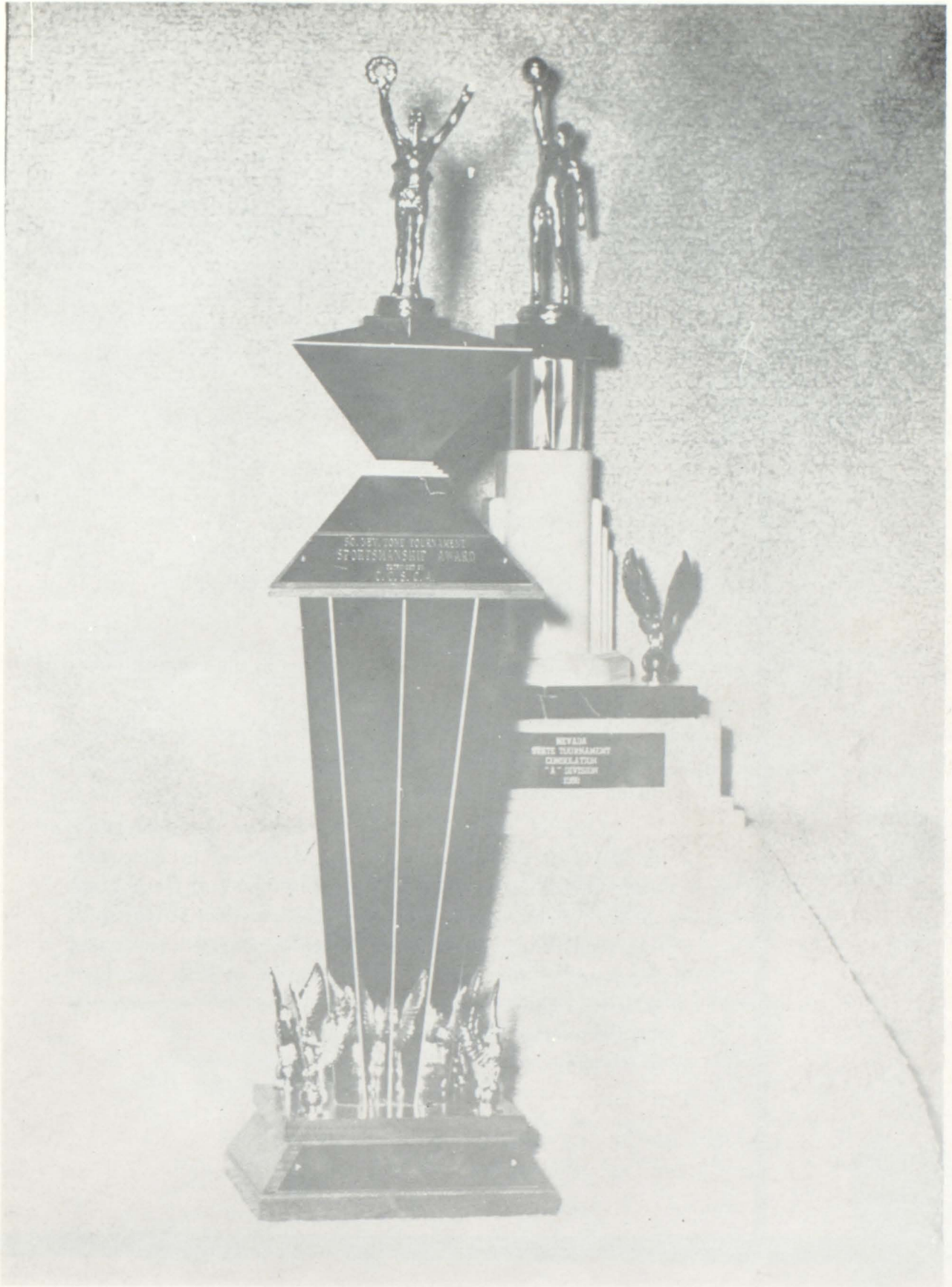

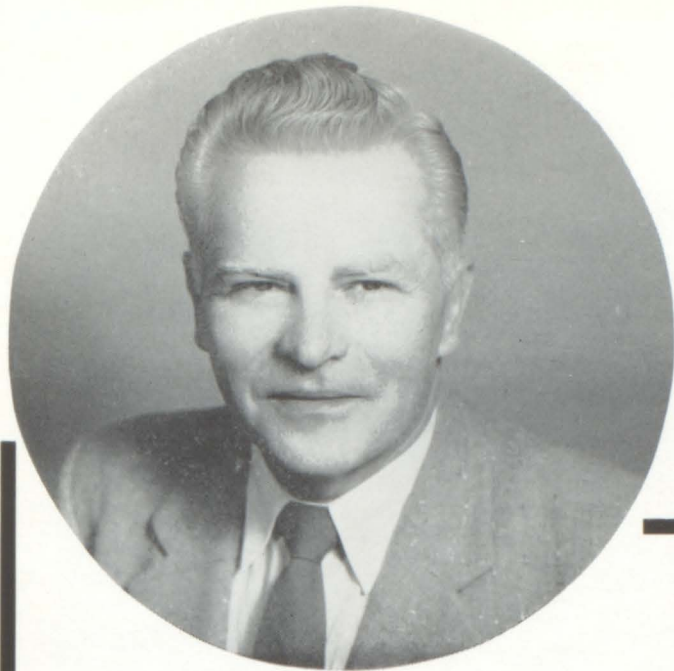
FOREWORD

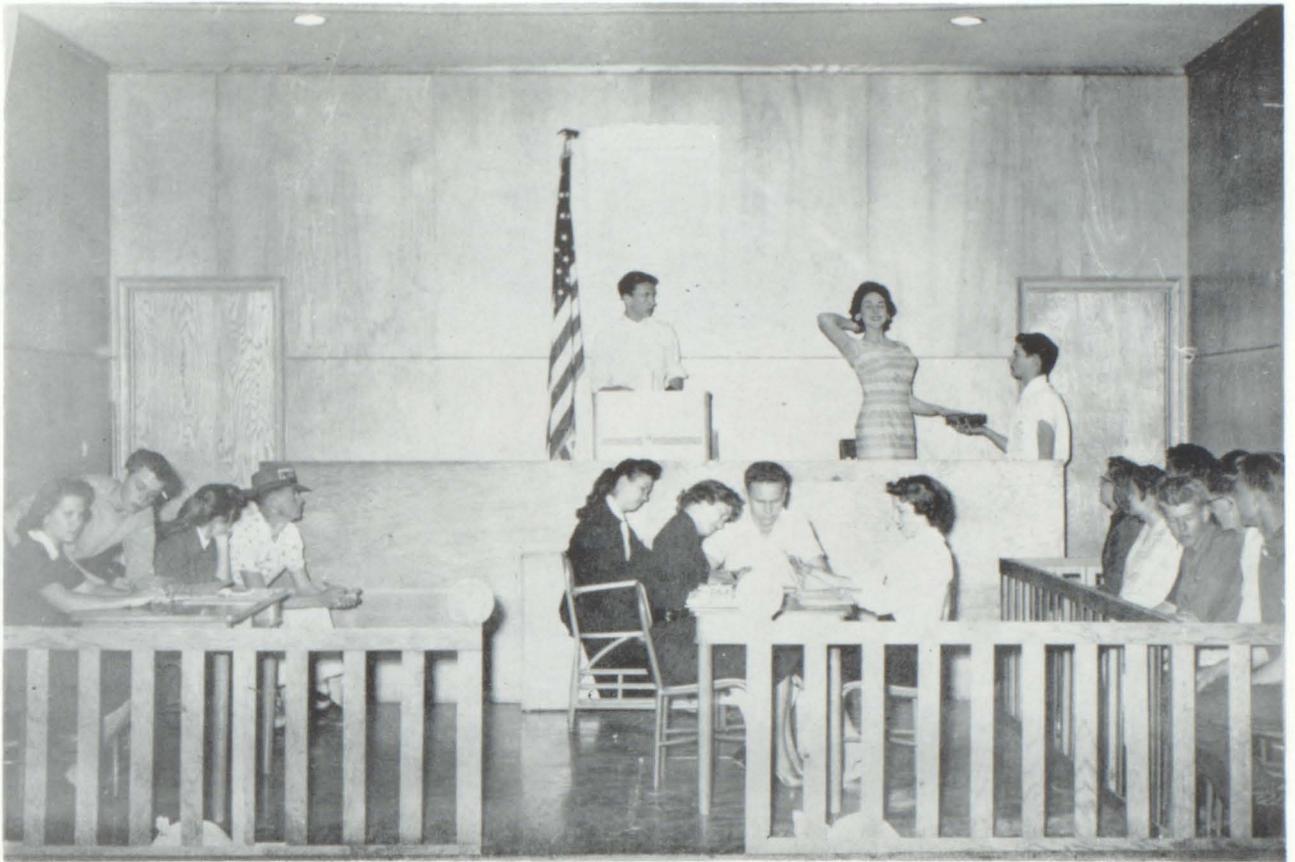
SENIOR PLAY
