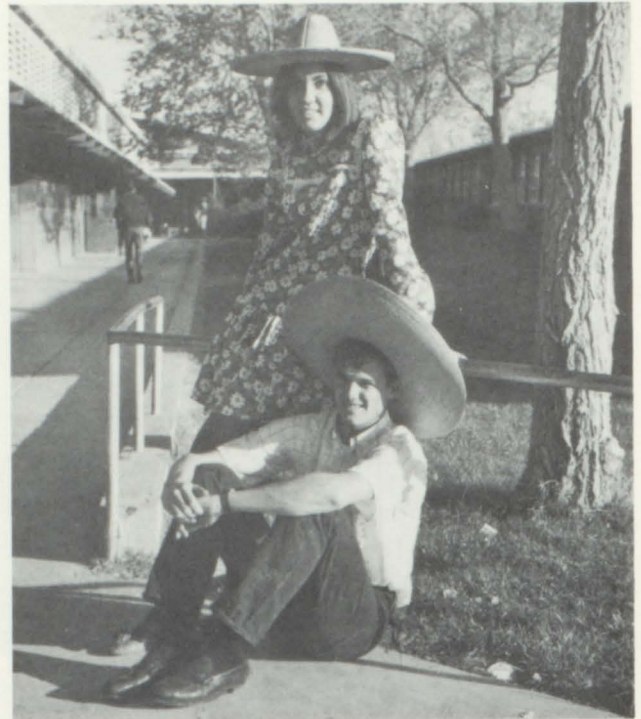

It was decided that initiation would be in the spring of the year. This allowed more room for games and races, as it was held on the football field.

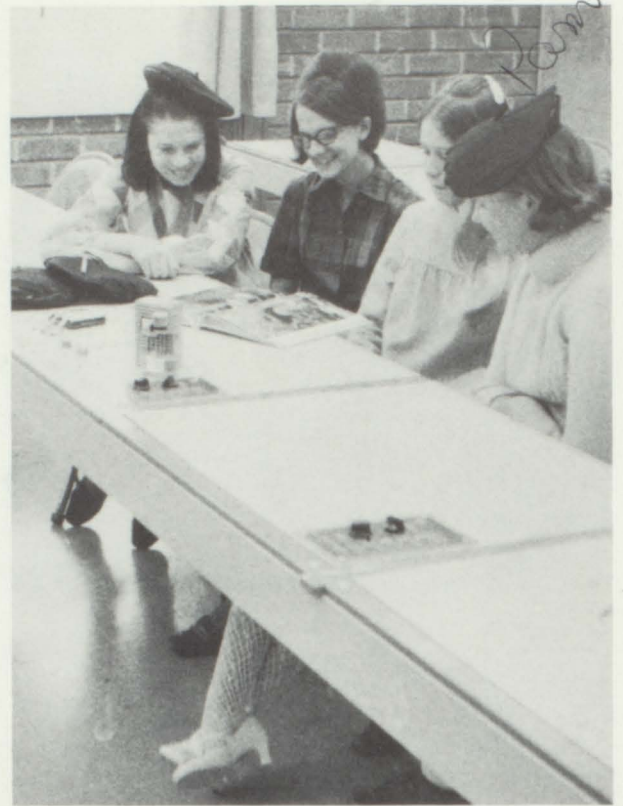

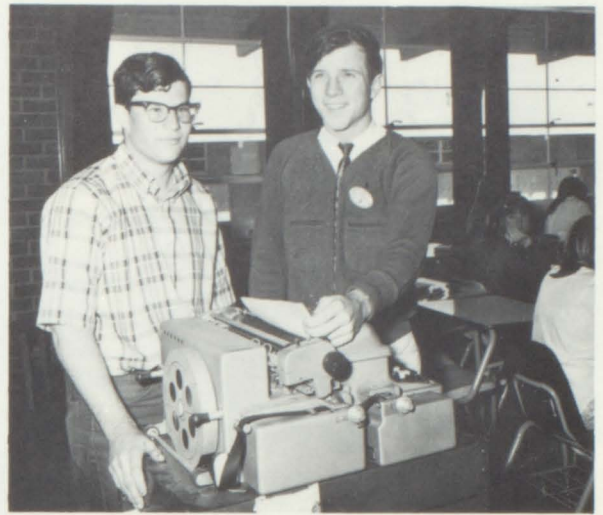

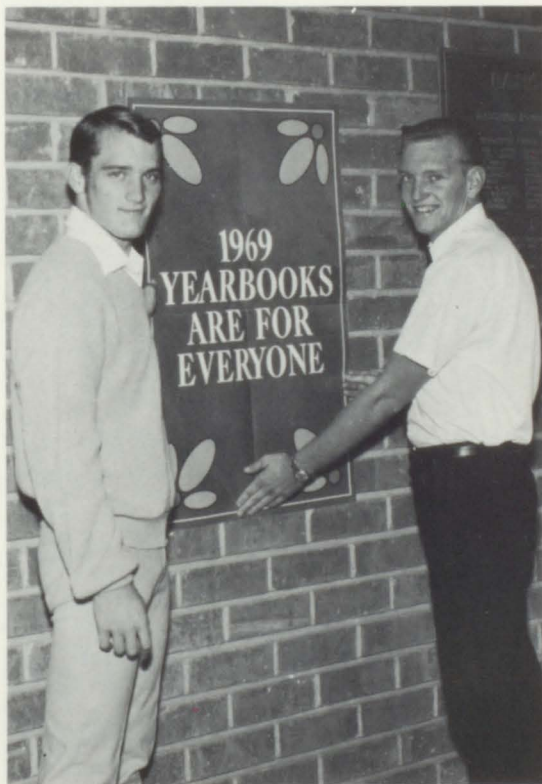

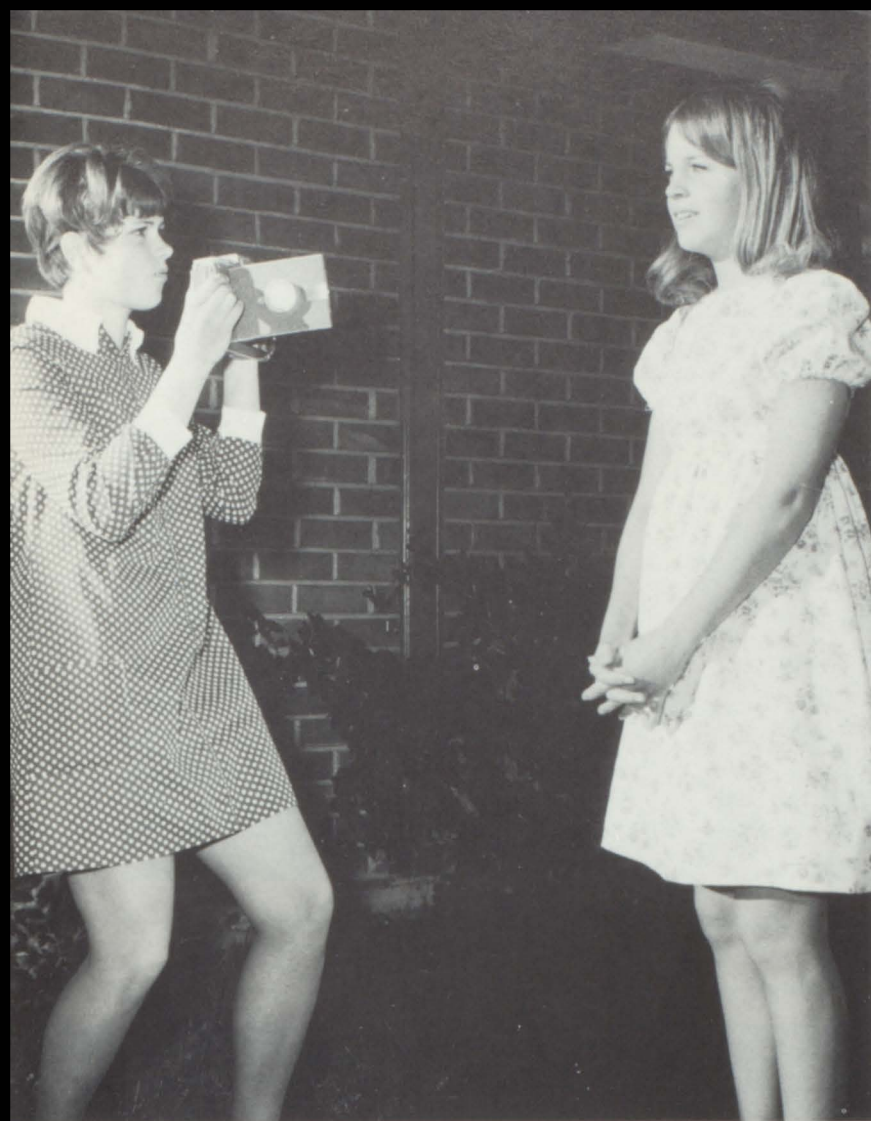

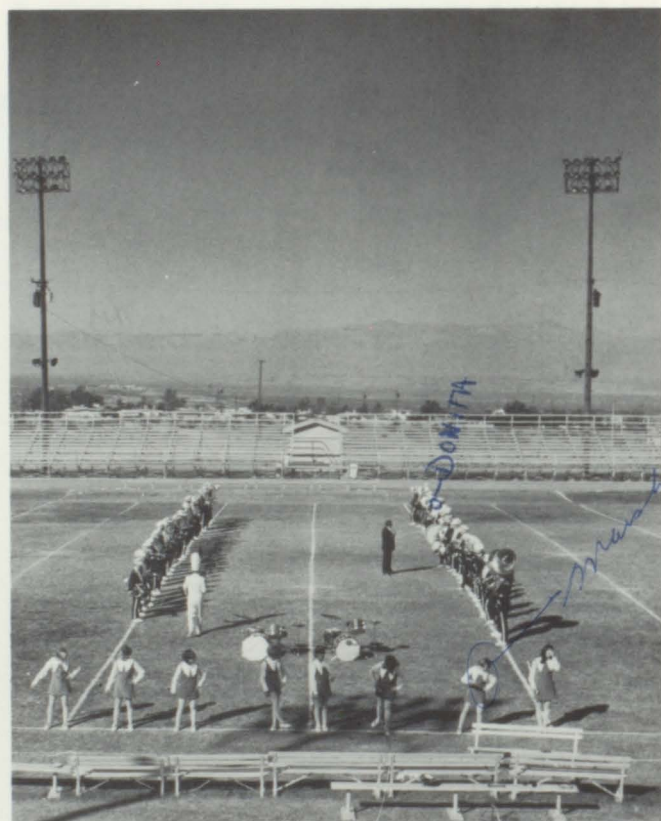
BASIC HIGH SCHOOL BANDS

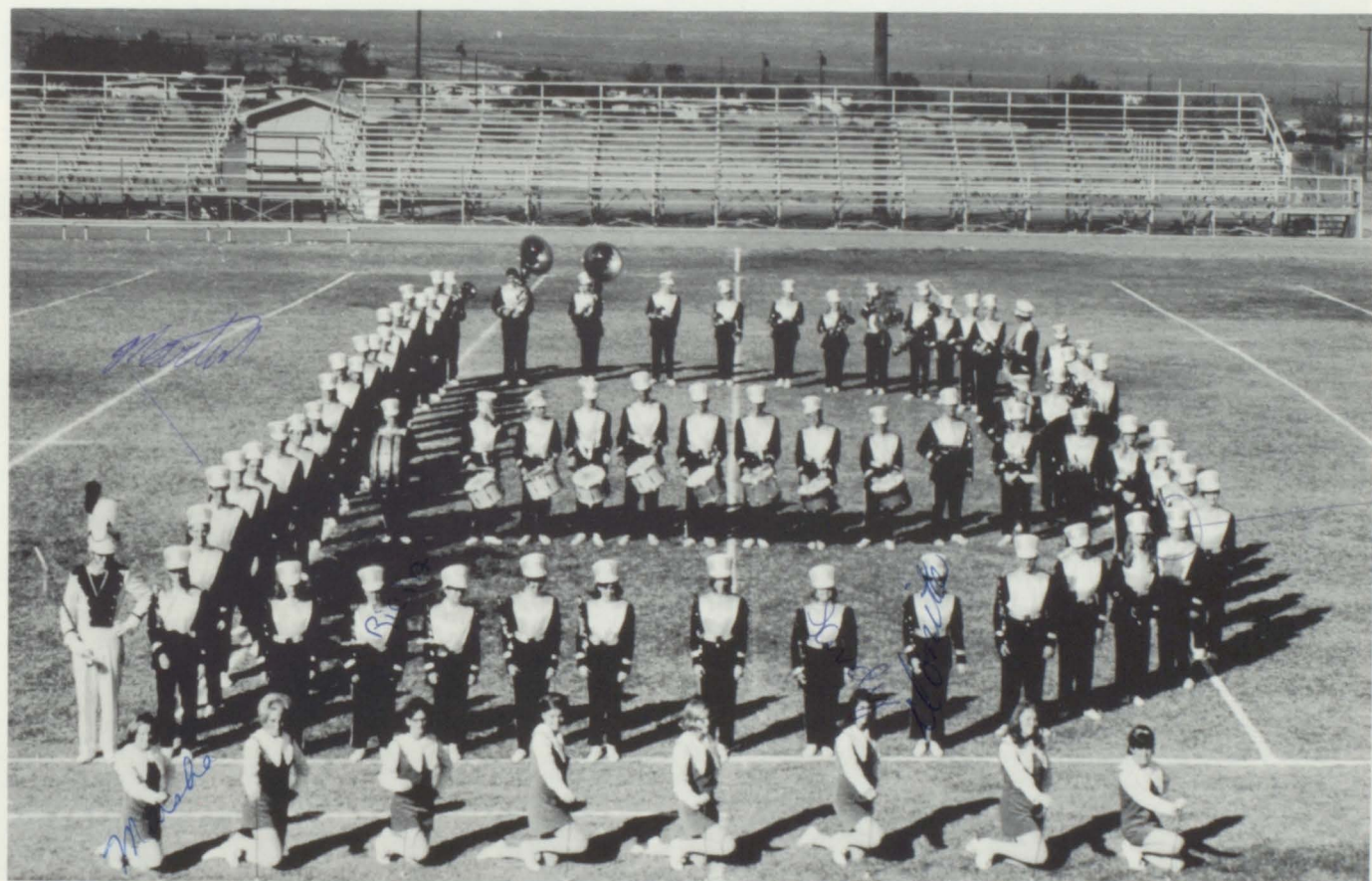
In the spring there is a concert and a district music festival, at which the band's performance of three musical compositions is evaluated. Of course there are always parades for the band to march in.

BASIC WOLVES SOCK-IT-TO-'EM THIS YEAR

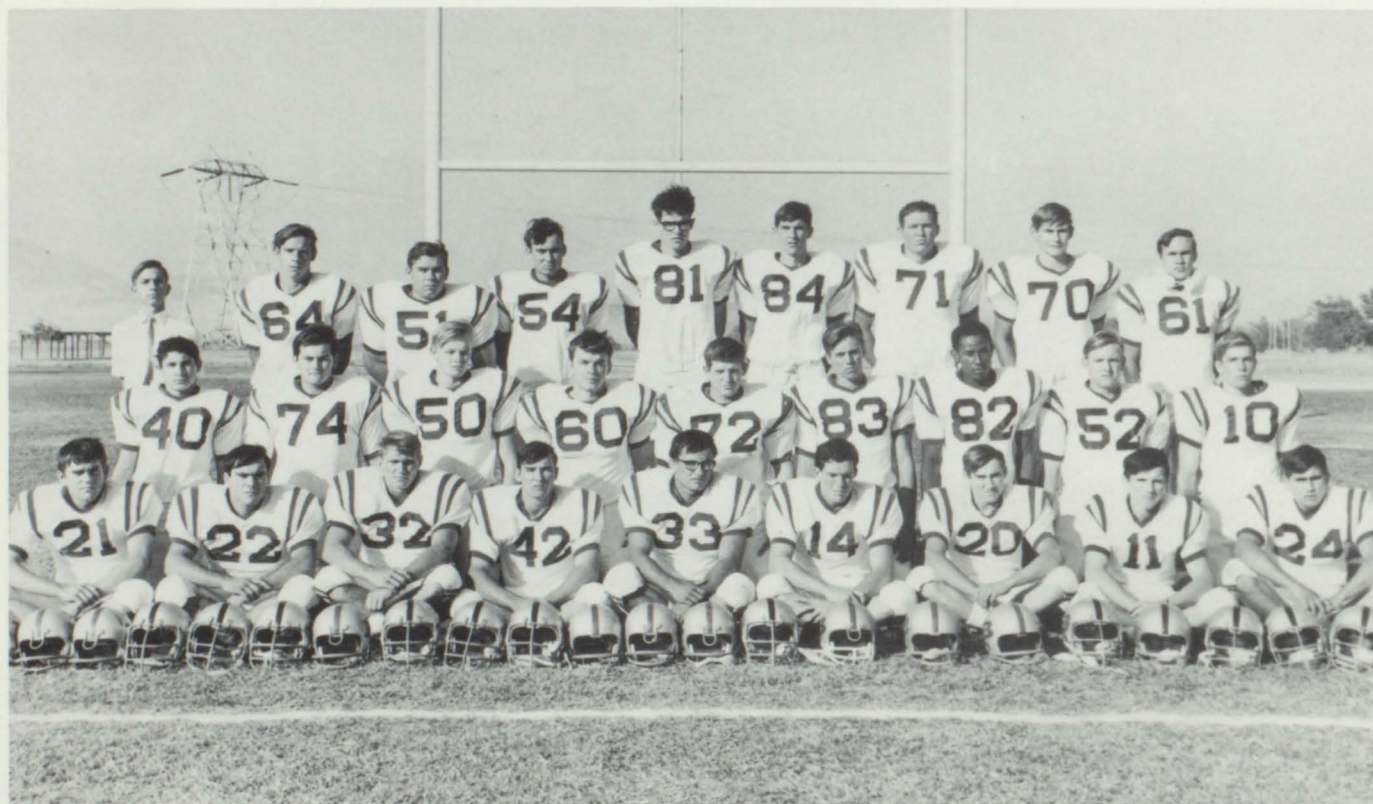

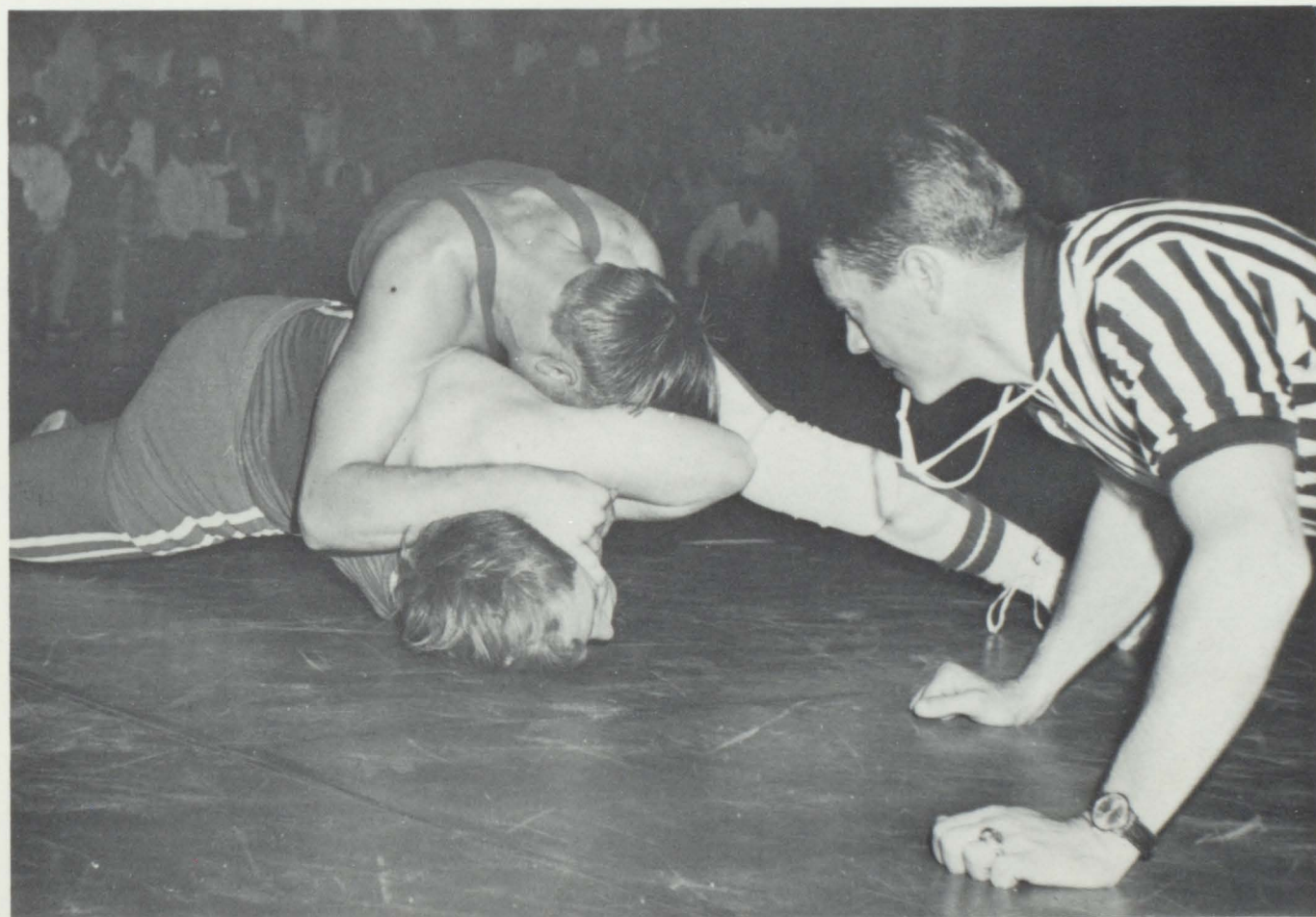

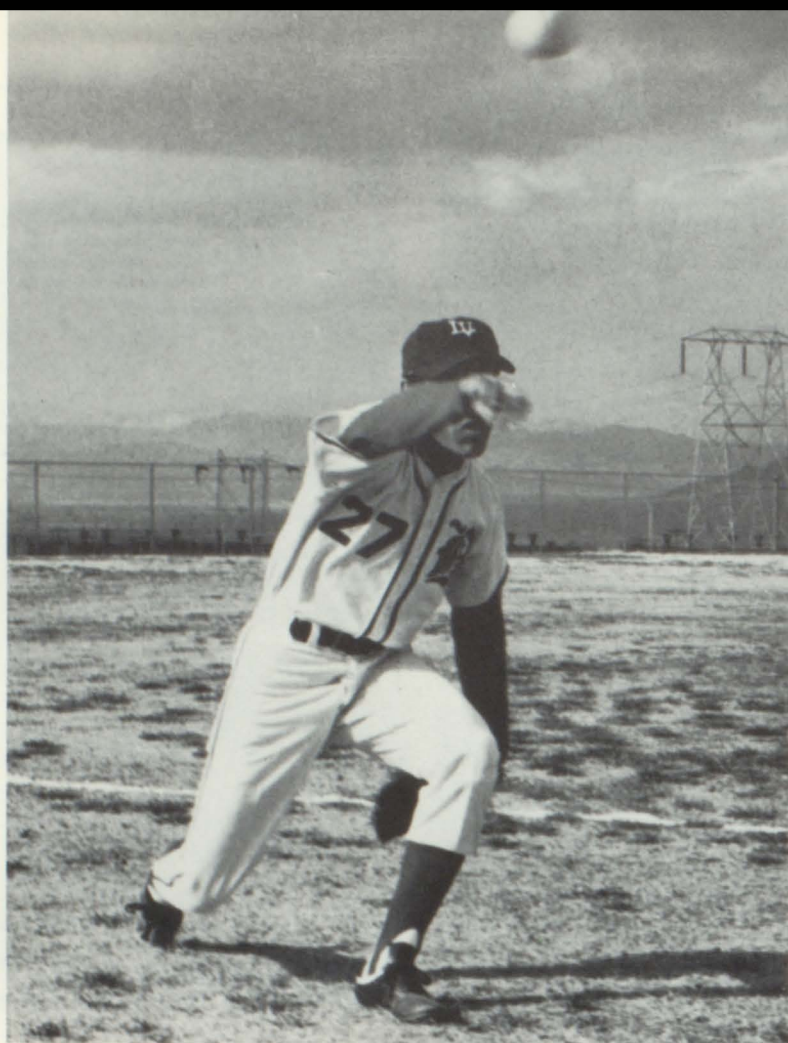
