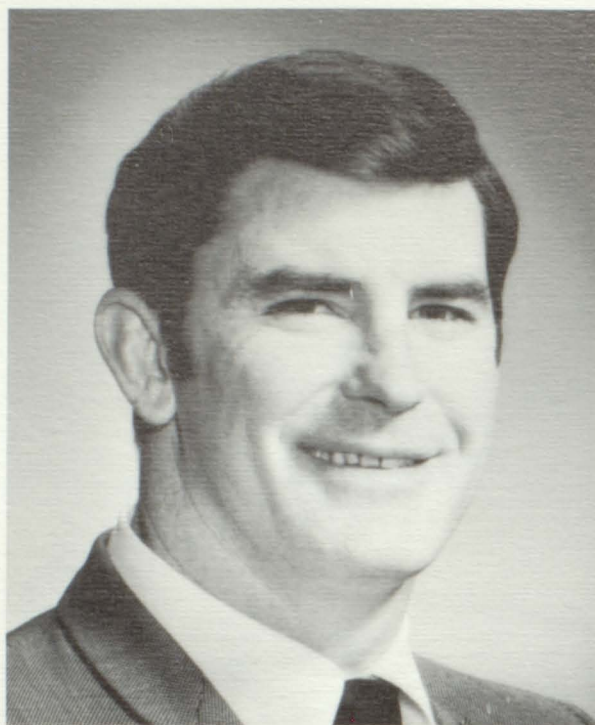


FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATION

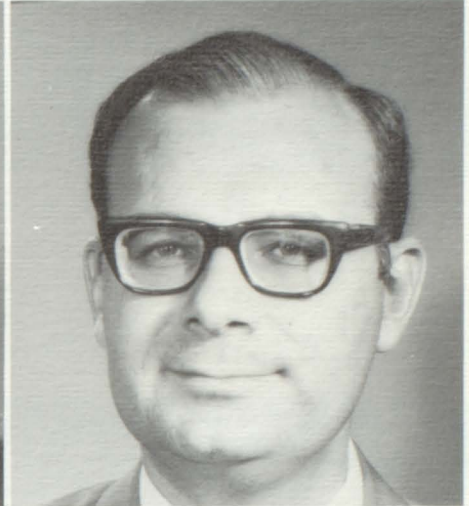
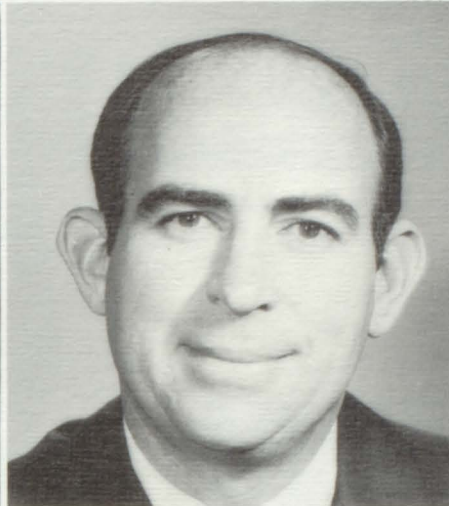
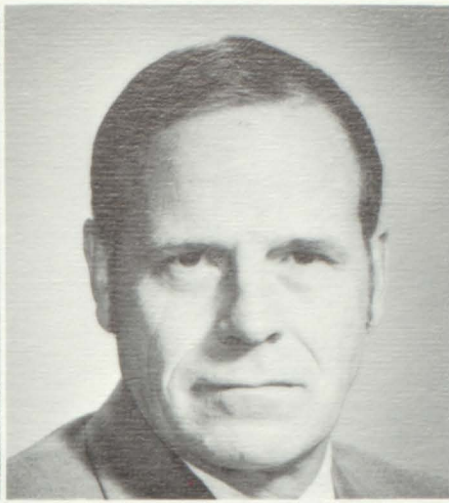

In steno first year students learned the basics of short hand. Second year students learned how to write longer words and also used the dictating machine.

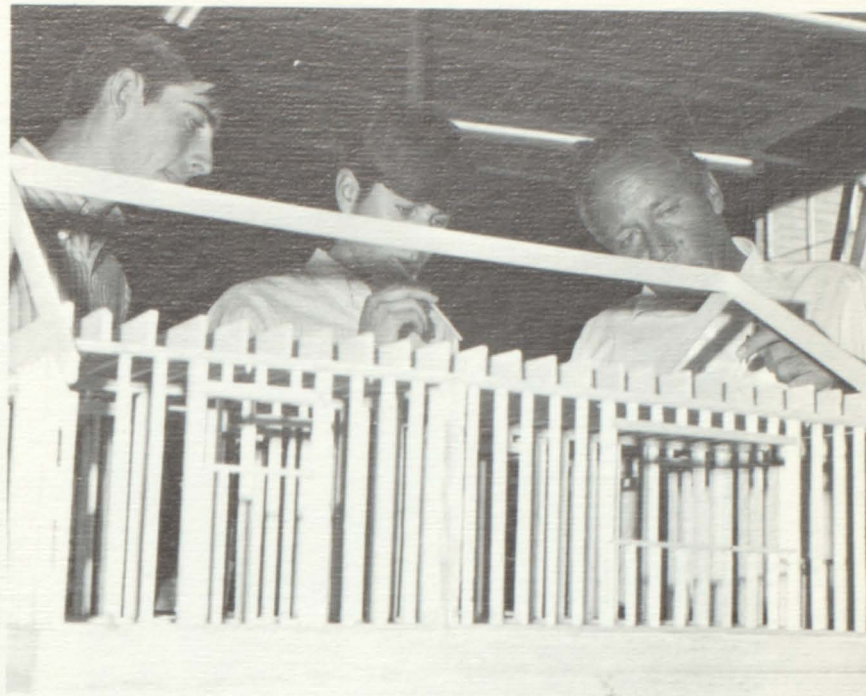
Bookkeeping classes learned accounting, how to do journals, and many different things to help them in their later years.

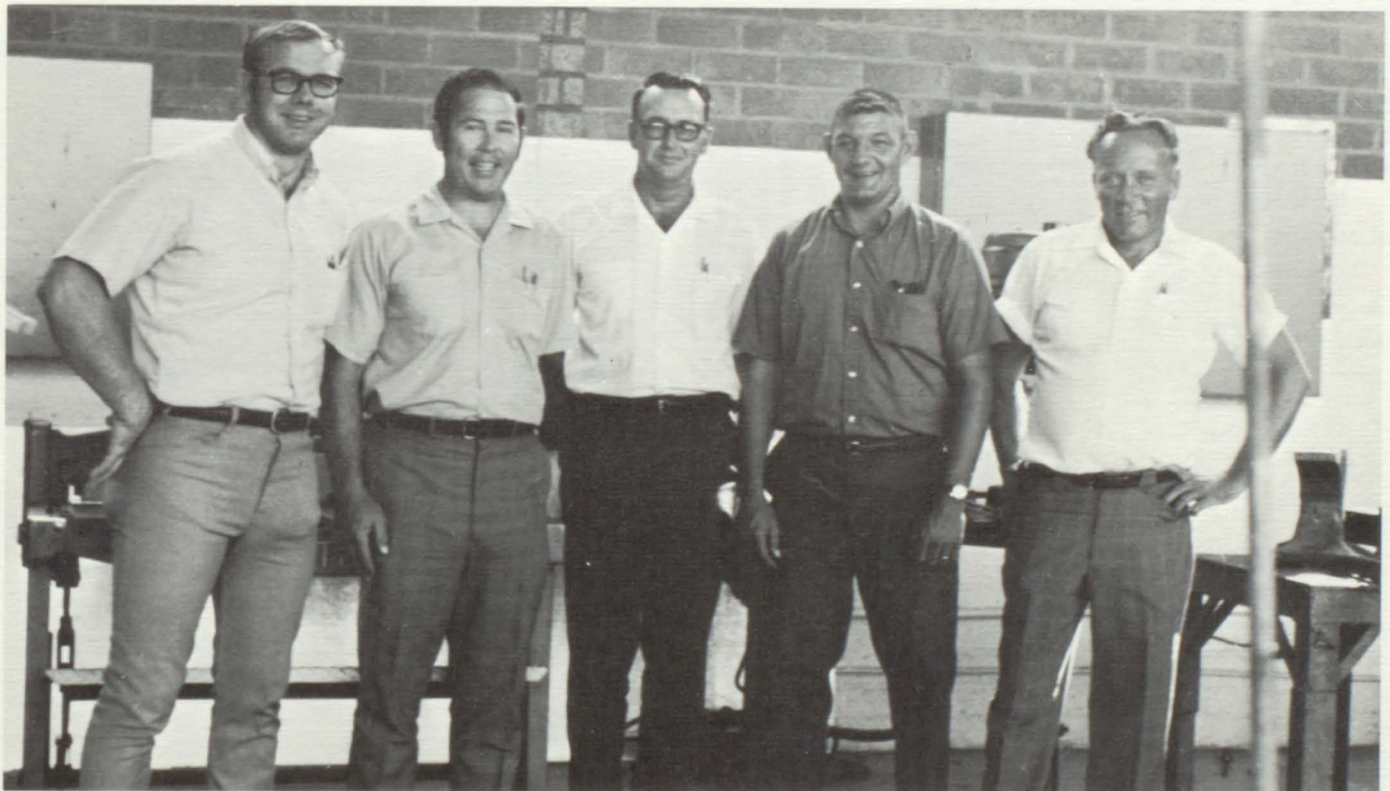
The upholstery class is in its second year at Basic, and is proving to be quite successful.

This year in Spanish we learned verbs, learned to write in Spanish, and the advanced students read short stories, went to Spanish movies, and later in the year wrote essays.

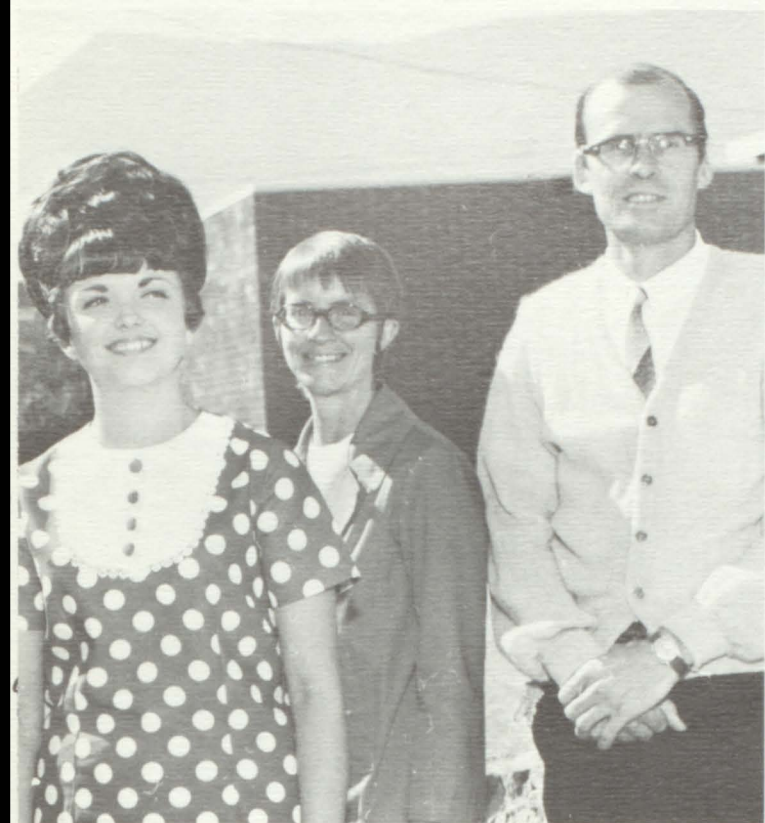

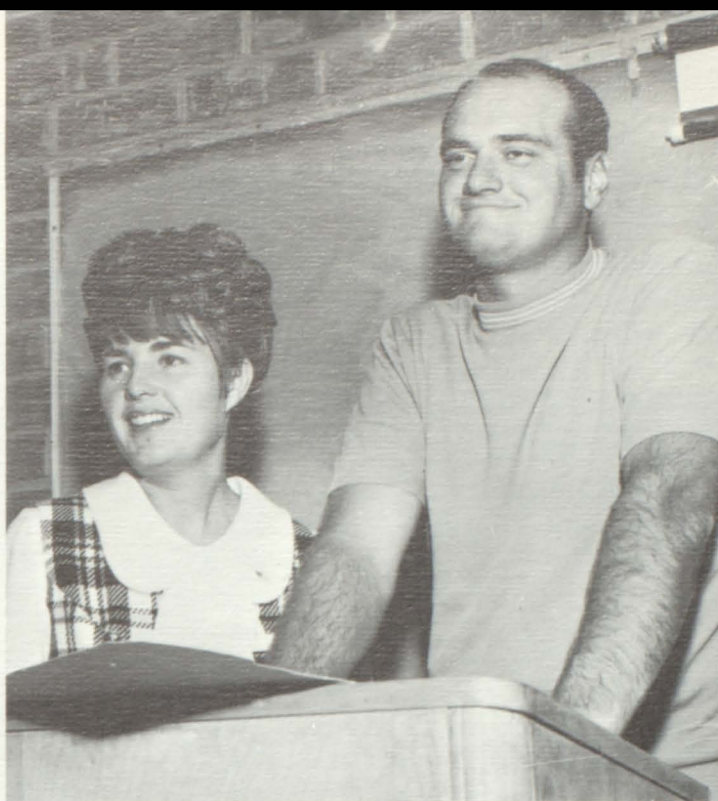
Keep Physically Fit

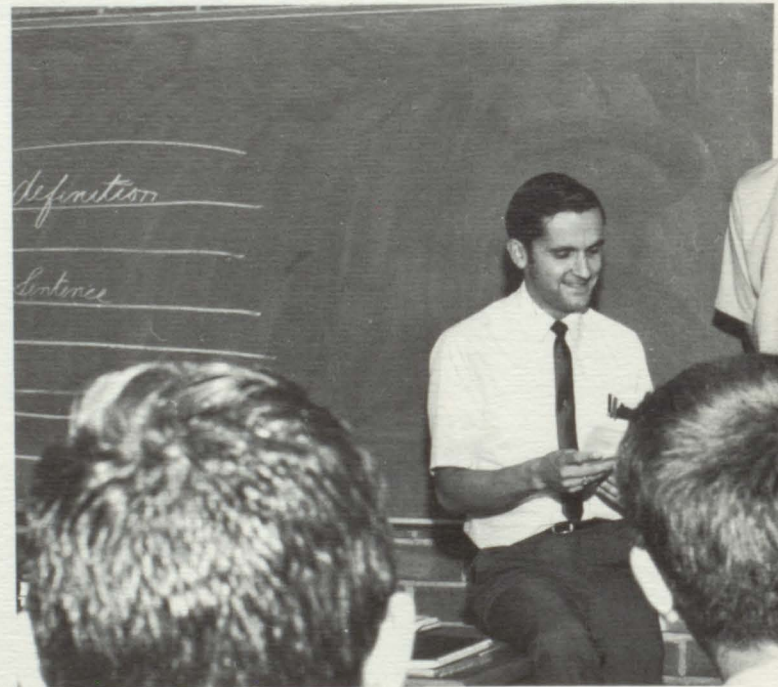
A student to be admitted to this class, must obtain permission form Mr. Cooke.

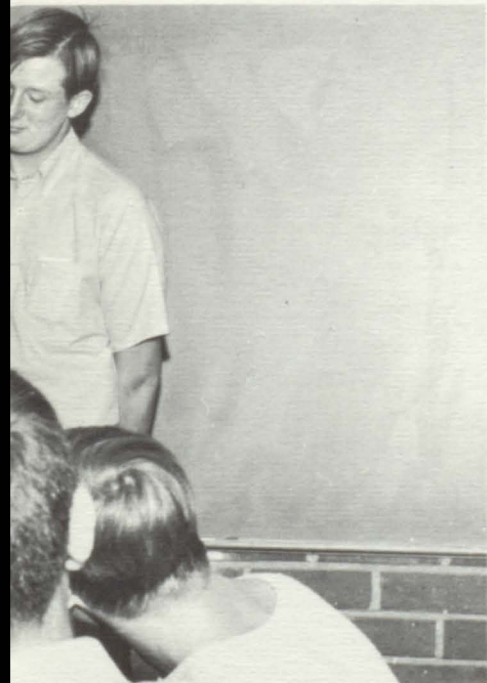

In Geology, we did many experiments and went on a numerous number of field trips in our local area.

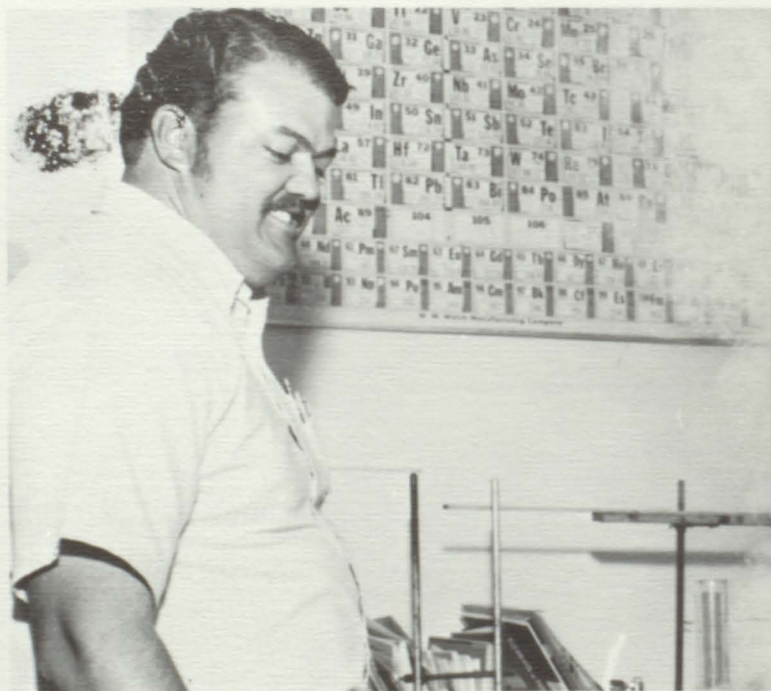
In Math classes this year many classes were on independent study. We started where the student was and took him from there.

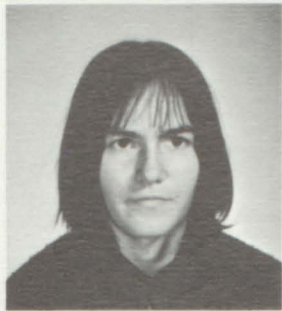
The Class of '74 reflects the spirit necessary to continually build a great student body at Basic.

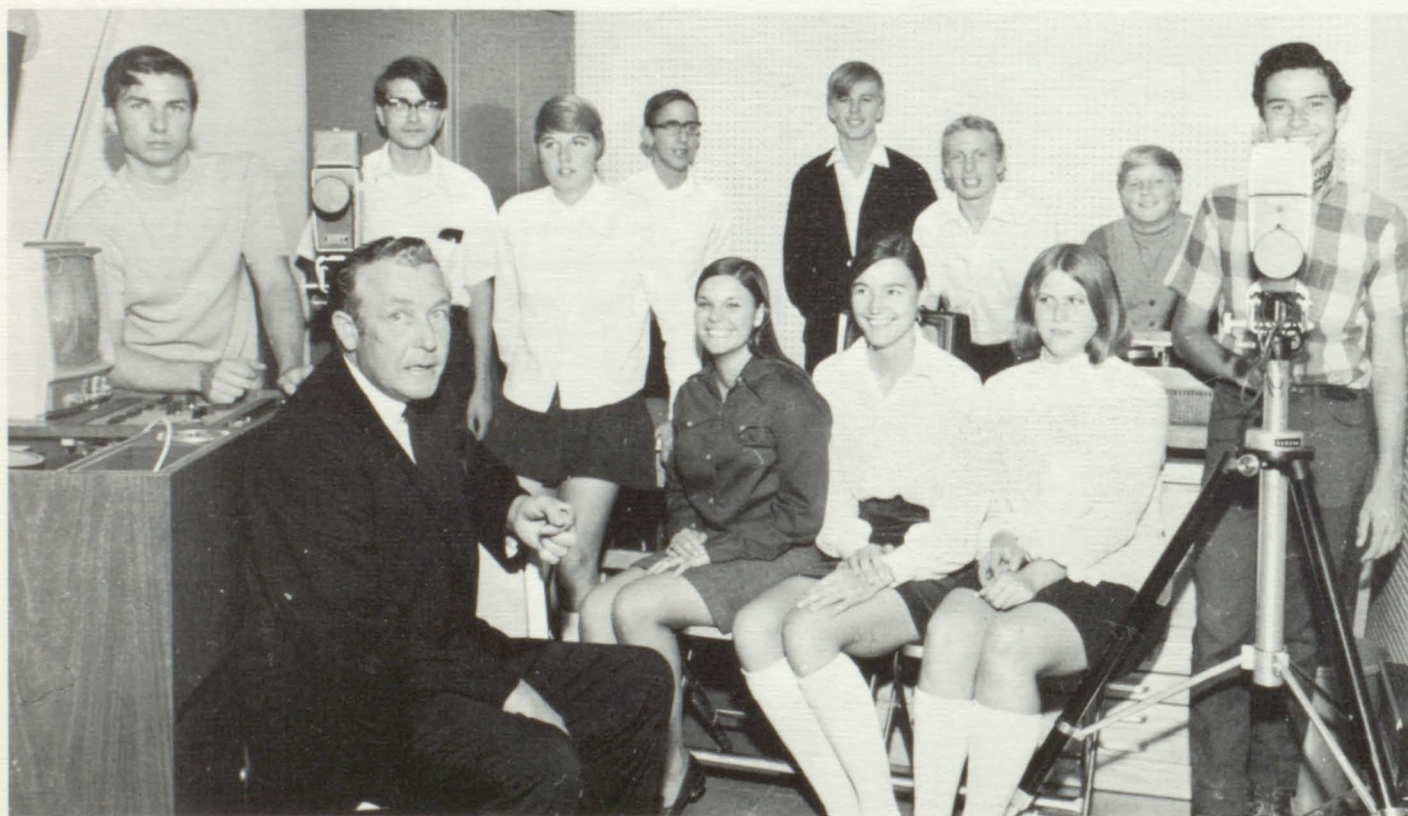

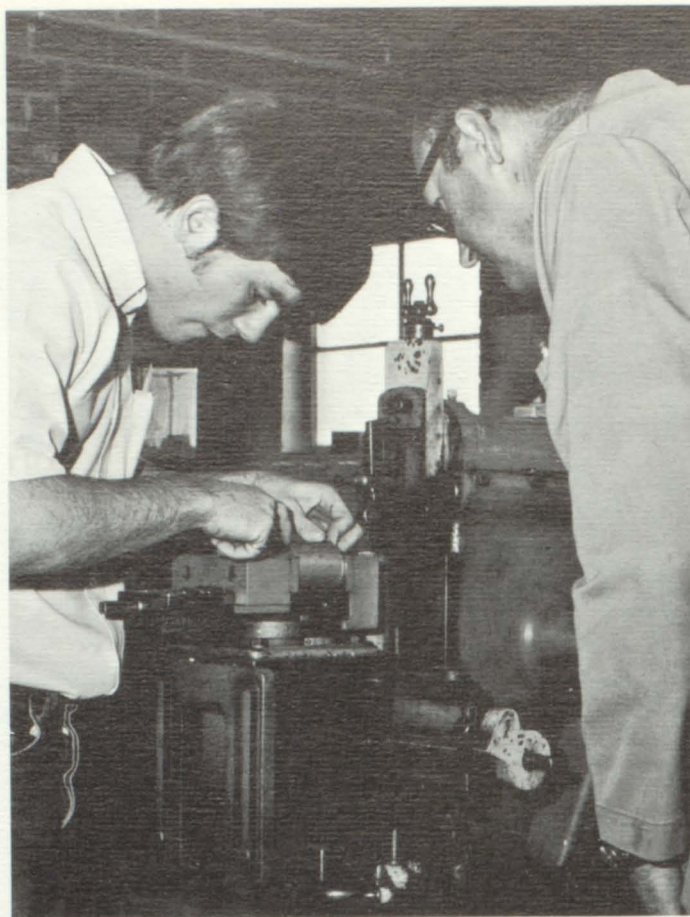

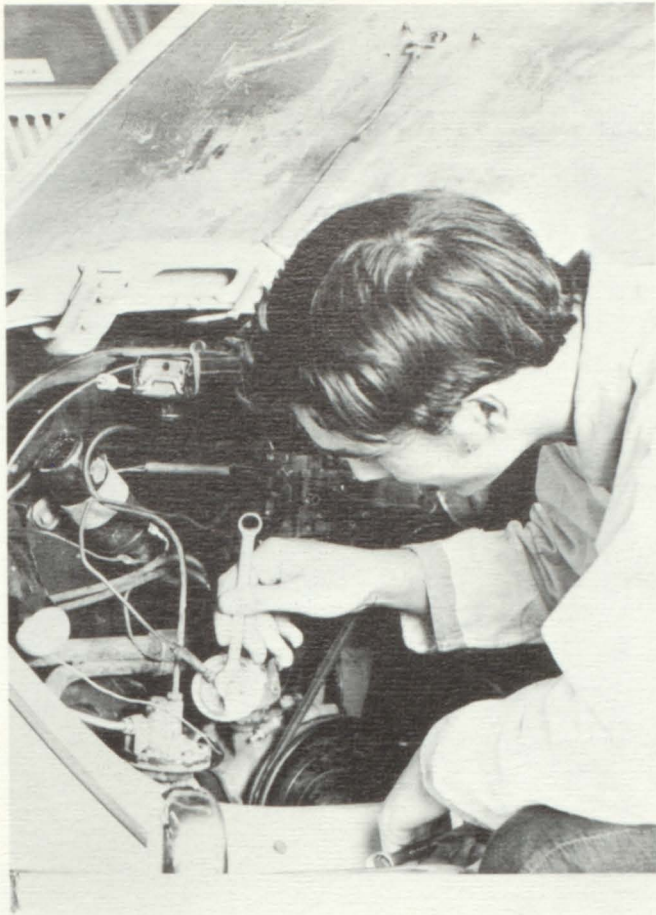

Our new uniforms arrived barely in time for our Mexico City trip.

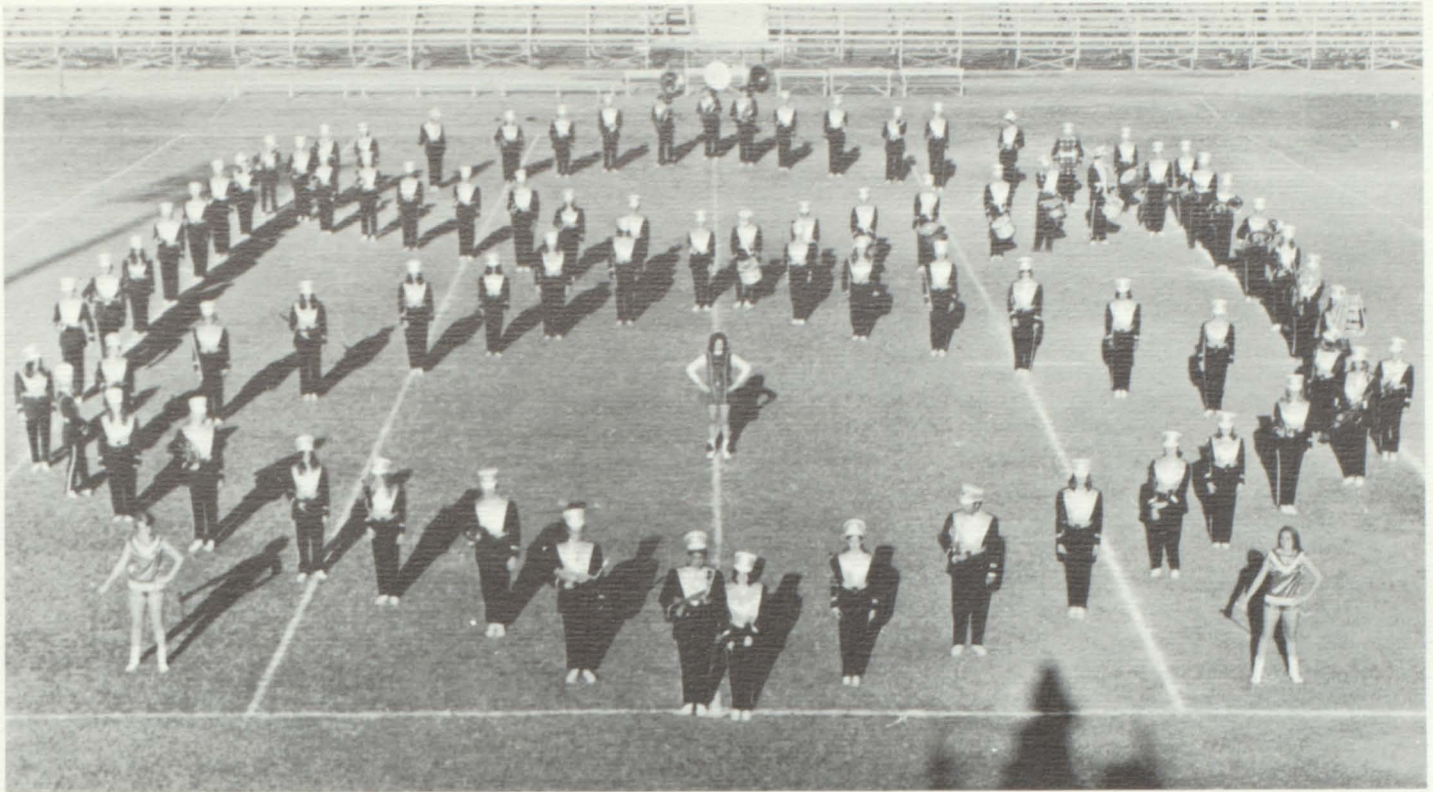

We took honors in Squaw Valley cheerleading camp last summer and we learned many new cheers and skits.

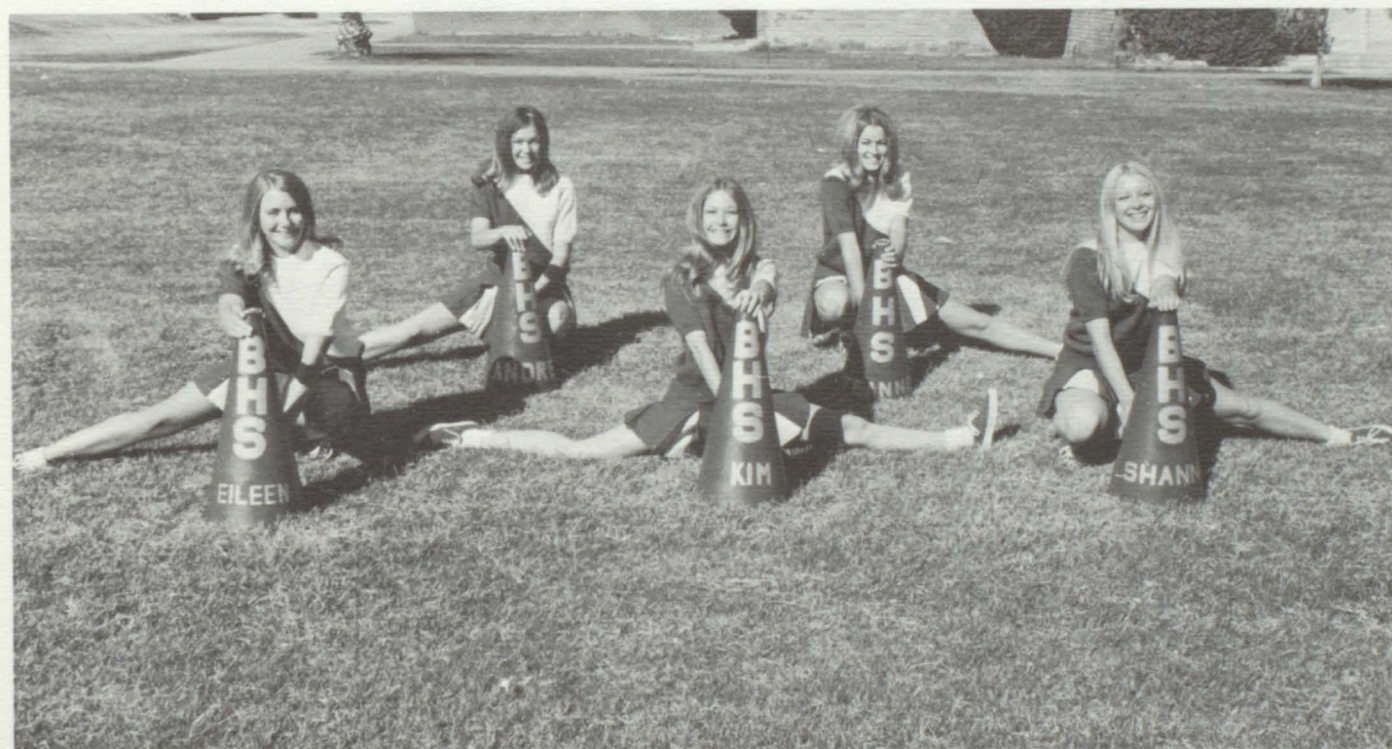

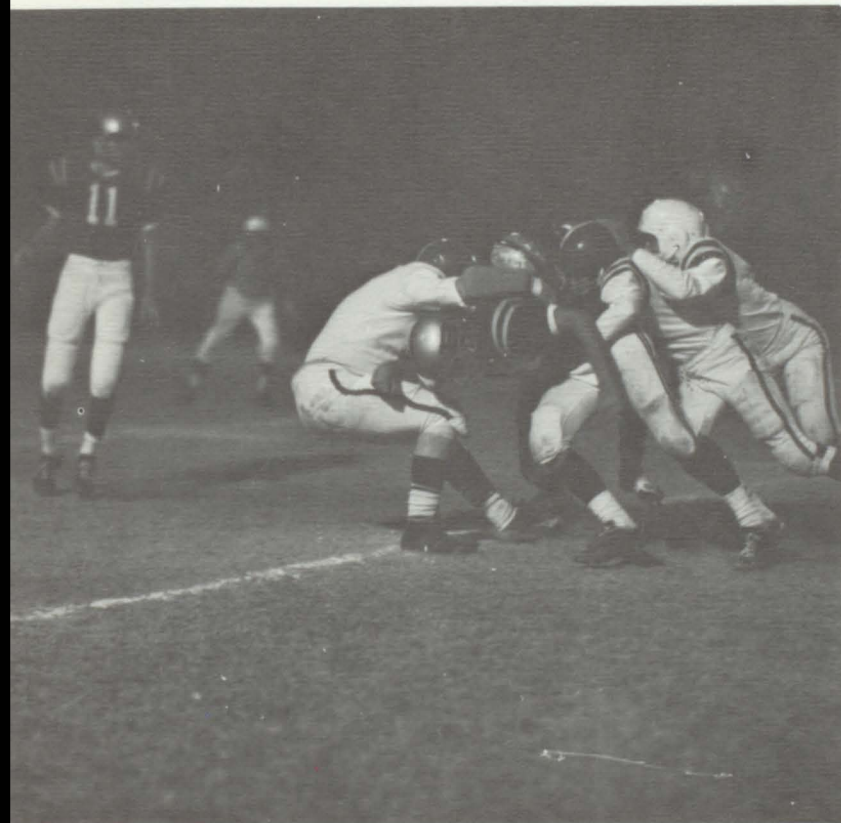

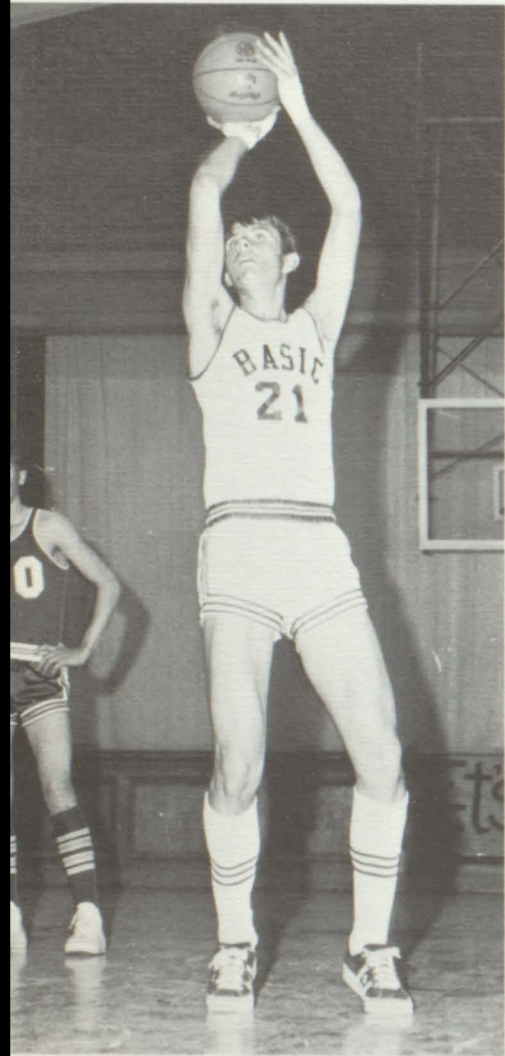

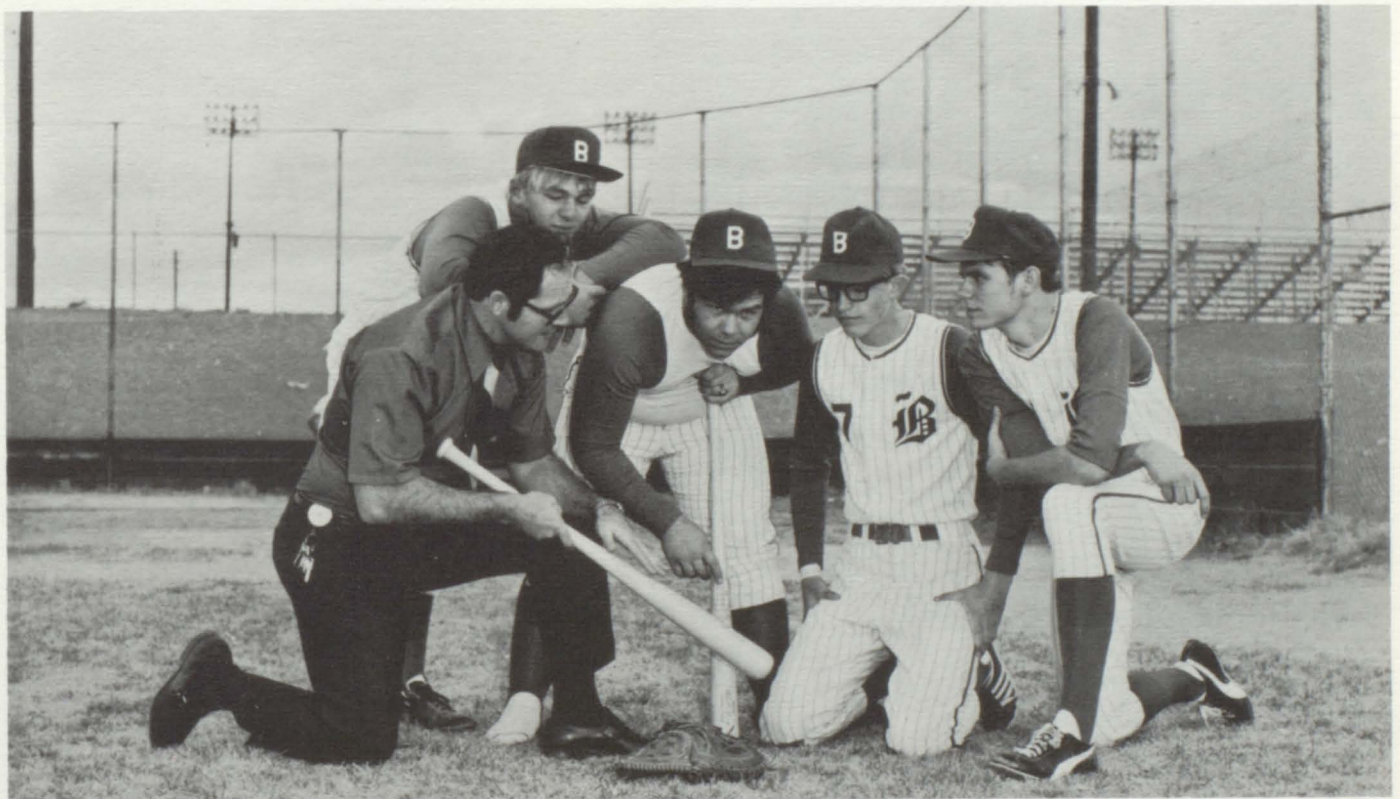
