This is the season when Florida's luscious Valencia oranges come into market. Valencias are medium to large in size, oval in shape, with a smooth thin skin and deep orange color. They have few or no seeds at all, and are heavy with fine sweet juice. Enjoy eating them plain, squeezing them for juice, or in a dessert such as Florida Orange Sherbet Cups.

Orange Sherbet Cups

3/4 cup Florida lime juice Florida orange juice envelope unflavored gelatine 1 cup sugar 雪 1 egg white

gelatine To prepare orange cups cut off slice from top of orange; scoop out pulp. Make picot edge with paring knife. Strain pulp; measure juice. Add enough Florida orange juice to make 4 cups. Sprinkle gelatine on ½ cup of the Florida orange juice to soften. Place over boiling water; stir until dissolved. Add sugar and remaining orange juice; stir until sugar is dissolved. Pour into an 8-cup loaf pan or several refrigerator trays. Place in freezing com-partment of refrigerator; freeze, stirring occasionally. Break up frozen mixture in tray; turn into chilled bowl; add egg white and beat with electric mixer or rotary beater until smooth. Re-turn to freezing compartment; freeze until firm. Scoop approxi-mately ½ cup into each orange cup; garnish with mint and serve immediately. Serve remaining 1 quart sherbet as desired. Yield: 2 quarts orange sherbet. Yield: 2 quarts orange sherbet.

NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING PREFERRED BY NEVADA'S SMALL RETAIL STORES

A recent survey among small retailers in Nevada metropolitan areas shows that newspapers have the highest status as an advertising medium among these merchants.

Results of a study by the University of Nevada show that due to the housewife's habit of studying newspaper ads, small retailers consider this medium more profitable than any other form of advertising.

The summary points out that "the small retailer's advertising effort can make the difference between success and failure, yet 91 percent of the advertising in small Nevada stores is done by the owner or manager with little but intuition and common sense as a guide."

Small retailers interviewed were asked to express the purpose of their advertising in specific, immediate terms. Forty-two percent saw it as a means of bringing about immediate buying action; 37 percent said their advertising was intended primarily to promote goodwill; 16 percent was aimed mainly to build product acceptance.
