> The next step is in the hands of the City Council to the city and the Port Holiday Assemblyman Hal Smith said yesterday that the legislature, legislative counsel, and the other legal advisors have put together a piece of permissive legislation for use by responsible, thoughtful city officials to work out a meaningful contract with Port Holiday for complete benefit and protection of the residents of

Contrary to the belief of many local people, the charter was changed in very few places from its original form, and Assemblyman Smith encouraged everyone whether they are for or against the bill, to study the changes for themselves. There are copies of the bill at City Hall, the Henderson Home News office, and in various places throughout the city.

Changes in the wording of the charter were made mereacres involved in the project.

Another change was to make it possible to take monit so as to start educational the area-that much closer. charter and sets up a reserve fund to protect the city.

The section on open bids was not changed. Smith said. except to include areas out-side the city, and for a protection, it gives the city power to inspect, collect building fees and license fees for territory outside the city which will become a part of the city. When Becomes Law

The whole project does not become part of the charter accomplished by Port Holiday Authority.

First, the Colorado River Commission must verify in writing to the Secretary of Lake Adair, a project which is estimated to take 14 months. It is expected that it may not become a part of the city for three years.

The special \$5 million revenue bond must be approved by a vote of the people prior to becoming law, and Henderson's three legislators feel after much study that the project will provide another industry for Henderson and will provide another source of revenue by broadening the ad valorem tax base by six times. The people who will work on the project will probably live in Henderson and increase the population and tax-

Senator James I. Gibson, and Assemblyman Art Espinosa and Smith were involved in a critical study of the project by other legislators who were not involved and could give a more impersonal unbiased opinion of it.

After very lengthy and serious objective study and hearings, the State, County, and City Affairs Committee and the federal, state and local government committee, felt that all necessary protective devices had been put into the legislation.

"Many rumors going around town are not founded on fact," Smith said, "and they are being circulated to the detriment of seeing this project come to a successful conclusion.

"I suggest those people making statements for or against this project, spend a little time in careful study of the provisions in AB 497. I hope that people will study the legislation objectively and not emotionally.

Ross Tucker, coordinator of informational services for the meeting was evaluated by Hal was the guest speaker at the Jones; Ralph Patterson was Chamber of Commerce meet ing Thursday at the Swanky Club.

A film entitled, "This is Your Clark County School District," was the subject of Tucker's talk. It showed the various areas of education offered in the Clark county schools and told of the future of education here and nation ally. It pointed out that there are 5,000 new kinds of jobs that didn't exist a few years ago and stressed that education must keep pace with the space age.

Tucker showed that various handicapped children, such as deaf, blind, retarded, and disabled, are being taken care of by the school district in cooperation with other programs.

The old four-wall classroom concept is disappearing in schools, Tucker said, the new buildings are being constructed to provide facilities for newer methods of teaching such as team teaching.
