## Governor Signs Lake Adair Bill Into Law

### \$5 Million Project To Replace C.P. And V.V.

A \$5 million project, including a senior citizens development, is being planned by the Clark County Housing Authority as Victory Village and the old Carver Park buildings are "phased out," it was noted at a meeting of the city planning commission.

Three possible sites have been selected by the Housing Authority, and the city council has offered the land at the lowest possible price.

Speaking in behalf of the authority, Robert B. Downing, accountant, and Al Lanceman, vice chairman, said they may

make a land trade with Basic Management, Inc., by purchasing the south half of section 32 and trading it to BMI for the Carver Park property which has around 83 acres. The Carver Park area already has water and sewer facilities. The new project will be built as needed.

Downing said that BMI is willing to make the trade since section 32 is adjacent to the settling ponds which would allow them to enlarge the facilities.

The land in section 32 will be recommended for M-2 zoning.

An application to operate an auto wrecking yard on Sunset road between Gibson road and Boulder highway, was tabled by the commissioners until the next meeting.

Two written protests were made against the yard by adjacent property owners, and since Sunset will be an entrance to the city and widened to a four-lane highway, it was tabled for further information from the city manager.

Approval was given for an equipment rental, repair and sales yard at 1200 North Boulder highway.

Governor Paul Laxalt put the finishing touches to the permissive legislation approved unanimously by both houses of the legislature, when he signed the Lake Adair bill into law.

A conversation with the Governor yesterday by phone to Carson City, revealed that the Governor was happy to sign the bill which would more than double the size of the City of Henderson.

The bill was approved by the Assembly with one voter abstaining, the rest approving

the bill, and passed the Senate unanimously Thursday morning. This editor announced the passage of the bill at a meeting of the Chamber of Commerce.

The next step is in the hands of the City Council to formulate a contract between the city and the Port Holiday

Assemblyman Hal Smith said yesterday that the legislative, legislative counsel, and the other legal advisors have put together a piece of permissive legislation for use by responsible, thoughtful city officials to work out a meaningful contract with Port Holiday for complete benefit and protection of the residents of Henderson.

Few Charter Changes

Contrary to the belief of many local people, the charter was changed in very few places from its original form, and Assemblyman Smith encouraged everyone whether they are for or against the bill, to study the changes for themselves. There are copies of the bill at City Hall, the Henderson Home News office, and in various places throughout the city.

Changes in the wording of the charter were made merely to change the name of the city, and to annex the 2175 acres involved in the project.

Another change was to make it possible to take monies from other sources than were previously named in the charter and sets up a reserve fund to protect the city.

The section on open bids was not changed, Smith said, except to include areas outside the city, and for a protection, it gives the city power to inspect, collect building fees and license fees for territory outside the city which will become a part of the city.

When Becomes Law  
The whole project does not become part of the charter until a number of things are accomplished by Port Holiday Authority.

First, the Colorado River Commission must verify in writing to the Secretary of State that there is water in Lake Adair, a project which is estimated to take 14 months. It is expected that it may not become a part of the city for three years.

The special \$5 million revenue bond must be approved by a vote of the people prior to becoming law, and Henderson's three legislators feel after much study that the project will provide another industry for Henderson and will provide another source of revenue by broadening the ad valorem tax base by six times. The people who will work on the project will probably live in Henderson and increase the population and taxes.

Senator James I. Gibson, and Assemblyman Art Espinosa and Smith were involved in a critical study of the project by other legislators who were not involved and could give a more impersonal unbiased opinion of it.

After very lengthy and serious objective study and hearings, the State, County, and City Affairs Committee and the federal, state and local government committee, felt that all necessary protective devices had been put into the legislation.

"Many rumors going around town are not founded on fact," Smith said, "and they are being circulated to the detriment of seeing this project come to a successful conclusion."

"I suggest those people making statements for or against this project, spend a little time in careful study of the provisions in AB 497. I hope that people will study the legislation objectively and not emotionally."

### Morry's Story

An historic state legislature, reformed for the first time through reapportionment, closed its first session last weekend in a blaze of glory, as it answered not only the chief needs of the state's people, but it also took care of providing a chance for this city to win its way into top importance among cities of the southwest.

The legislature, urged on thru the education and leadership of local Assemblymen Hal Smith and Art Espinosa and local senator, Jim Gibson, passed this equally historic legislation that will enable the city council to go ahead on the fantastic multi-million dollar Lake Adair project, as soon as the council and the project complete a contract of operation backed by sound financial security.

Hardly had the ink dried on the legislative law when other municipalities across the country asked for details on it so as to start educational

programs directed to adopt their effort to attract large projects to their locales.

Meanwhile, here at home the developers of the project are looking to get started shoveling dirt as quickly as possible. They have a 22 month completion date for both the dam and lake bottom, while buildings will be far under way along the shoreline during the latter months of the dam's construction.

The entire county is teeming with excitement over this wonderful project. Even J. Carlton Adair, the developer, is finding his time doubly busy. Last night he flew in from the coast to address the Associated Contractors of this area, who called him in to give them the details so they can try to become a part of the construction program.

The show is on the road now—and every day brings fruition of a marvelous asset to the area—that much closer.

### Council, Clark County Housing Officials Hassle Over Land

Clark County housing officials and City Councilmen clashed at the city council meeting last night and their differences were resolved when a motion was made and approved by a 3-2 vote which gives the authority an option

to purchase 320 acres of land in section 32 at the cost of the land from the federal government.

Housing officials, led by Bob Downing, auditor for the authority, and Al Landsman, acting chairman of the board, asked for the land to exchange it for 83 acres of land from Basic Management Inc. where Carver Park now stands.

Councilmen were reluctant to have the housing authority use the city land which would be given to them at the city's acquisition cost, to bargain with BMI, and asked to sit in at the negotiation meetings.

At one point, Mayor W. R. Hampton said he didn't feel the city had to subsidize BMI, and that the city could start its own housing authority.

Housing officials told the council they had 83 acres of land in the Brown project on Boulder highway and Nellis Blvd., and did not need to bargain with Henderson but wanted to stay here.

Councilwoman Ida Belle

Riggins said she felt the council had been placed in an awkward position, and Dale Roberts made a motion to approve the sale with a two-year option on the land. The sale will be done in accordance with the charter and will give housing officials land with which to request a \$5 million loan from the federal government to construct new housing.

Riggins and Hampton opposed the motion. Housing officials said that of the 800 housing units in Carver Park and Victory, 300 are vacant. They said only 5 of the Brown houses are empty.

### City Must Act In Lake Adair Legislation

"The Nevada Legislature, through the legislative counsel bureau, forged a very important act in AB 497, the Lake Adair Bill," according to Assemblyman Hal Smith.

"This act is only permissive in nature and in addition to the 'built in' protective devices, requires that further protection will be provided by the city council.

"This act is merely a special tool that may be used by responsible local government to the distinct advantage of the city and its inhabitants.

"Any person now in the local government or aspiring to be a part of that government that feels unwilling to use the special features of this act to the distinct advantage and the complete protection of the citizens of Henderson, certainly shows an unwillingness to provide the intelligence and mature judgment necessary for a part in the leadership of a progressive city," Smith concluded.

Two members of the Henderson Police Department were among the trophy winners in the fifth annual Clark County Law Enforcement Golf Tournament held April 9 at the Las Vegas municipal course.

Sgt. Loren Ogle placed second in the handicap division with a low net score of 69, while Officer Jim Frei garnered second place in the Galloway division with a net 70.

This year's tournament was hosted by the U. S. Immigration service and held in three classifications, Handicap, Callaway, and Guest. There were 112 entrants participating.

### Deadline for Parade Entries Set for Friday April 21st

The closing date for Industrial Days parade entries is April 21, according to the Chamber of Commerce office. There is no entry fee and all entrants are urged to get their entry forms in on time so the script can be written and their position in the line of march can be set up.

The theme for the parade is "The Frontier Story," however, any entry will be accepted as long as it conforms to the parade rules.

In order to lend color and glamour to the occasion, the parade committee has established a minimum decoration requirement.

All autos and trucks must have 100 per cent decoration coverage, from the bottom window level down to the hub cap level. The only exception to this rule is special industrial equipment, and automobiles more than 36 years old.

### Dolores Zenoff Watches Anti-U. S. Demonstration In Rome, Writes of It

One Henderson resident, Dolores Zenoff, co-owner of this newspaper, and several Vegas members of a touring party thru Europe, were ensnared in the midst of a 1,000 person left-wing and Communist demonstration and sit-in in Rome last week, a letter from Mrs. Zenoff to this newspaper revealed yesterday.

Demanding an end to American aggression in Vietnam and according to Mrs. Zenoff, shouting anti-Johnson remarks, the demonstrators clashed with police and used tables and chairs picked up from sidewalk cafes for weapons.

A newspaper story included in the letter in an English reading Rome newspaper stated scores of people were

hurt, some seriously in the clashes.

Mrs. Zenoff and her party watched the entire goings-on from the Majestic Hotel balcony just over the Via Veneto, site of the outbreak.

In her letter, Mrs. Zenoff said:

"This was in front of the U.S. embassy, one block away from our hotel. We were having aperitifs at our hotel and stood on the balcony watching all this.

"According to the way you count, I figure there were less than a thousand and more than 700. Police did guard the end of the Via Veneto man to man—but were water hosing them from both sides—forceful like—and got them off the streets. Almost all of them sat

down in the street.

"Looking down at them, I would say there were not all students. A lot had bald heads—and seemed older than students. It seems the militia was protecting the embassy only.

"The shouts anti-Vietnam mentioned in the article were correct, however they also did shout anti-Johnson remarks. We could tell that.

Mrs. Fran Moore, wife of Julian Moore, who is the tour leader included a foot-note stating "Would you believe we were hosed down in Rome in front of the embassy just trying to be good U.S. citizens?"

The letter also included the fact that the Nevada tourists had a picture taken of them with the Pope.

## Tucker Tells Chamber About Future in Education

Ross Tucker, coordinator of informational services for the Clark County School District, was the guest speaker at the Chamber of Commerce meeting Thursday at the Swanky Club.

It showed the various areas of education offered in the Clark county schools and told of the future of education here and nationally. It pointed out that there are 5,000 new kinds of jobs that didn't exist a few years ago and stressed that education must keep pace with the space age.

Tucker showed that various handicapped children, such as deaf, blind, retarded, and disabled, are being taken care of by the school district in cooperation with other programs.

The old four-wall classroom concept is disappearing in schools, Tucker said, the new buildings are being constructed to provide facilities for newer methods of teaching, such as team teaching.

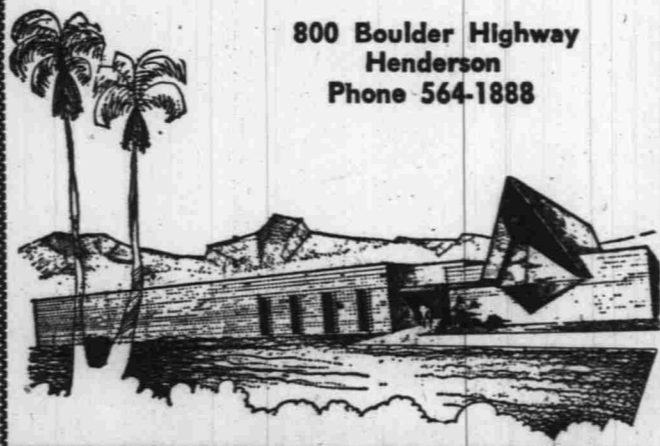

ORDINANCE NO. 370
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 4.44 SECTION 4.44 AND 4.44 OF THE HENDERSON MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED "REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES."

SECTION 1.
Section 4.44 of the above entitled Chapter of the Henderson Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

DEFINITIONS: Wherever used in this Chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the following definitions will be given effect:

EMPLOYEES OF LIQUOR DISPENSING ESTABLISHMENTS: All persons gainfully employed by any establishment dispensing alcoholic beverages in or on having gambling within or without the premises of said establishments, shall be within the definition of this chapter, whether employed on a contractual basis or by payroll.

EMPLOYEES OF NON-LIQUOR DISPENSING ESTABLISHMENTS: All persons gainfully employed by any establishment which does not dispense alcoholic beverages, nor has gambling, but which is completely or partially owned by an establishment which does dispense alcoholic beverages, whether employed on a contractual basis or by payroll.

EMPLOYEES OF GAMBLING HOUSES: The term "employees of gambling houses" shall mean all persons gainfully employed by any establishment having gambling within or without the premises of said establishment except slot machines, pinball machines and any other mechanically operated game where no attendant is required.

EMPLOYEES OF ESTABLISHMENTS, ETC.: The term "employees of establishments, etc." shall mean all persons gainfully employed by any establishment dispensing alcoholic beverages, or on the premises of said establishments.

TAXI DRIVERS: The term "taxi drivers" will include all persons who drive any motor vehicle or conveyance used in the city of Henderson, for the purpose of transporting persons for hire save and except those persons employed for hire to operate buses which operate under a city franchise.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: The term "alcoholic beverages" shall mean and include any and all distilled or rectified spirits, potable alcohol, brandy, whiskey, rum, gin, aromatic liquors, wine, and every liquid or solid containing alcohol capable of being consumed by a human being.

SECTION 2.
Section 4.44 of the above entitled Chapter of the Henderson Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATE: It shall be unlawful for any person to accept employment in any gambling house, or as a driver of operator of any vehicle in any establishment where alcoholic beverages, as defined in Section 4.44, are sold at retail or consumed on the premises unless such person first obtains a signed, registration application from the employer, and then submits same to the Henderson Police Department and have fingerprints, fingerprint and photograph taken and filed with the Bureau of Identification and receive a certificate showing compliance therewith.

1. Any applicant may be required to furnish satisfactory documented proof of his age.

2. All minors under the age of 18 years must submit with the application a letter of approval to work obtained from the Clark County Juvenile Department.

3. All police card numbers obtained under the provisions of this ordinance, are to be registered by the employer personnel or payroll section and kept as a part of the record of said employee.

4. The person or persons designated by each business establishment as the person responsible for having said employees under the provisions of this ordinance, shall examine each prospective employee's police card for the purpose of determining the validity of the card for use in the business establishment concerned. Such validity is to be determined by the name of the concerned establishment being stamped on the backside of the police card in red ink. If the prospective employee's card is found to be unexpired he will be issued a new, signed application form which must be completed and presented to the Police Department for validation prior to commencing employment.

B. FEES: Every person seeking to be registered under the provisions of this chapter shall first pay to the city of Henderson a fee based as follows:

All employees directly connected with gambling \$ 3.00
All employees dispensing liquor 5.00
All other employees employed in liquor and gaming establishments 3.00
Provided, however, that no fee shall exceed five dollars to any one individual.

C. CERTIFICATE REPLACEMENT: Every person registered pursuant to the provisions of this chapter seeking a replacement or reissuance of a certificate previously issued to him or her shall pay the city of Henderson the sum of two dollars for such replacement or reissued certificate.

D. DEPOSITS, FEE DEPOSIT: The chief of police shall keep a true and correct account of all fees received by him, and the fees shall be deposited with the city treasurer for credit to the general fund.

SECTION 3.
This amended section shall be in full force and effect upon its final passage and publication in the law provided.

SECTION 4.
Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published once in the Henderson Home News, a newspaper published and having general circulation in said City.
