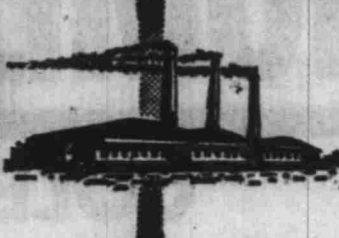

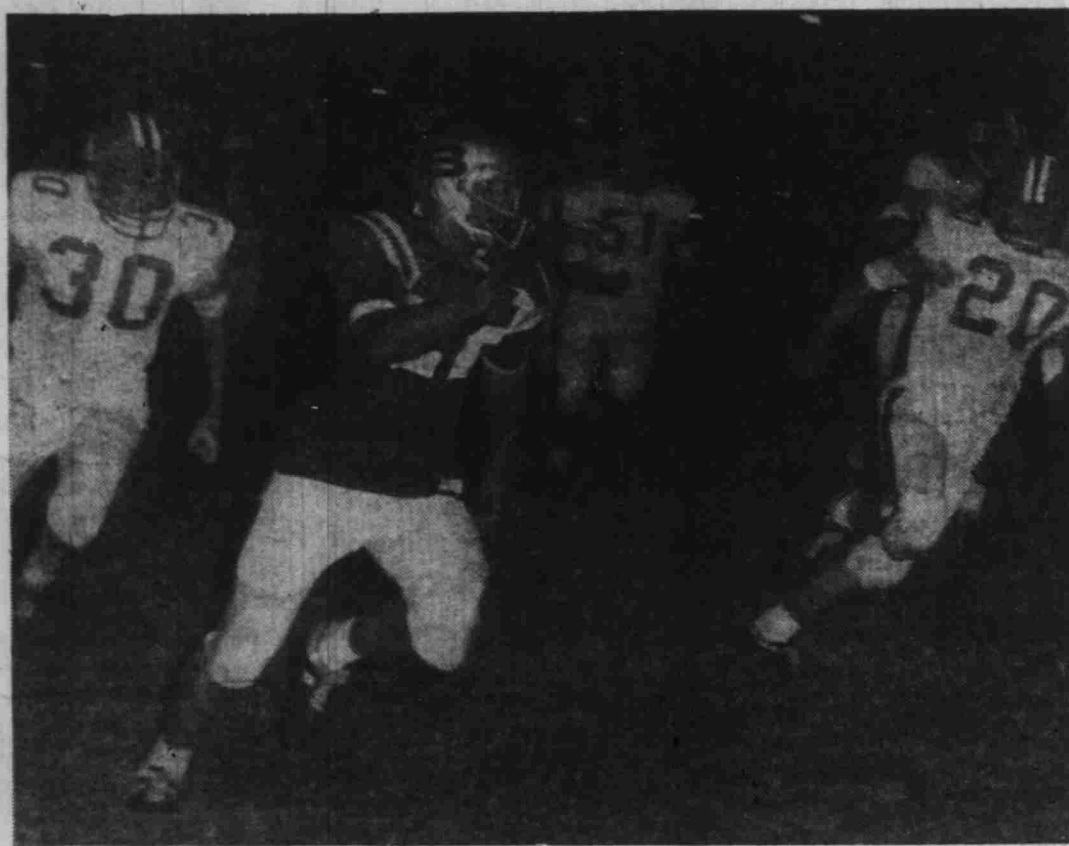

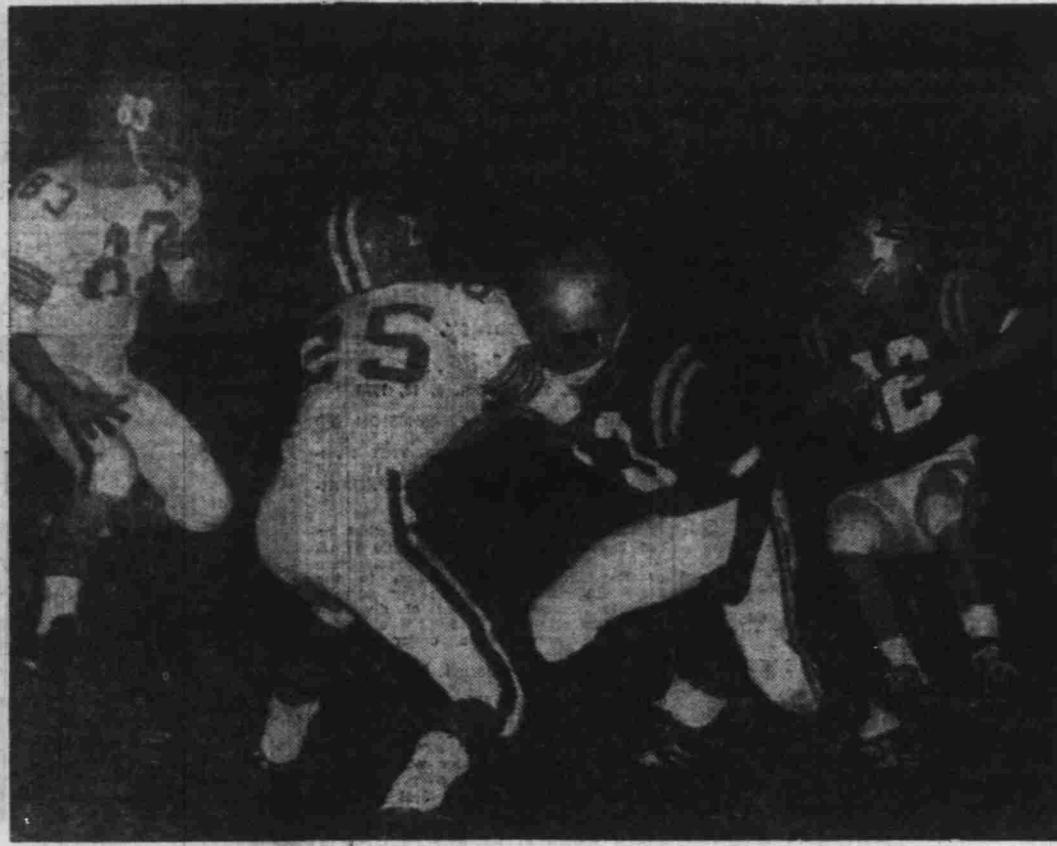

Enrollment figures for the Henderson schools increased 232 students over those enrolled in school for May of last year, according to information received from the Clark County school district.

The enrollment figures for this year, which were just tabulated last Friday, show there are 5,216 students enrolled at the five schools here this year, as compared to 4,984 for last May. (May's figures were used as more representative since some students quit school before the month of June.)

This year there are 1,298 students at Basic high school, as compared to 1,200 for last year.

There are 1,046 students enrolled at the C. T. Sewell elementary school this year as compared to 1,082 for last year.

At the Gordon McCaw elementary school, there are 1,082 students this year, as compared to 1,017 for last year.

Park Village school showed an enrollment of 904 for this year, as compared to 782 for last year.

The Henderson junior high school showed a decrease in students this year with 886 as compared to 903 for last year.

There are 73,822 students enrolled in the county this year, as compared to 69,610 for May last year.

Basic Hope for Win Over Kingman Is in the Air

Basic high school found itself able to move quite well through the air last Friday, although losing soundly to Gorman's fine football team.

In their quest for a victory against Kingman, Friday, the passing game looms as the answer to Coach Joe Blockovich's dreams.

The pass combo of Nelson-Giles proved rather valuable for Basic against Form. Stewart Giles, an impressive sophomore receiver is reaching his peak as a fine performer. With Senior Ross Kesterson back in the lineup, this should be a big factor in Basic's passing attack. Admirable ran high in the kicking performance of Gorman's junior, Bruce Wyre. He surely must be one of the nation's specialists and will be watched closely by college and the Pros in the next few months. His soccer-type kick was sensational.

The game Friday was interesting, and although down 35-0 at half-time, Basic didn't give up (as one newsman indicated they did.) but came back determined in the second half in their attempt to make a game of it. Surprisingly enough, Basic made more first downs than did Gorman. Gorman's advantage, however, was the fine running backs and much heavier front line. Final score was Gorman 55, Basic 14.

Junior Varsity

Our Junior Varsity displayed itself well, although losing to Gorman 16-14. Basic took an early lead 14-0, and lost it by half-time, with the final two quarters being scoreless.

Basic's defense held Gorman three times within the five-yard line. This is a fine tribute to the young upstarts Basic is counting on heavily for next year.

Basic's junior varsity reserves showed great potential in downing our fine Freshman team 42-6 Saturday. During the final part of the game, both teams kept each other from reaching the goal line, showing that progress is being made. The freshmen gridgers are finding it difficult to get opponents from other schools to play. They are a determined group and should be commended and supported by everyone.

Council Tables Action On Three Land Applications

A request for 40 acres of land in section 33 by Doctor M. J. Bagley, local optometrist, will be delayed for several months until a further study of the area is made by the city.

The postponement of the sale was approved of by Dr. Bagley, who had requested an assessment district in that area to provide for water. The land is located on Lake Mead Drive near the water tank across from the dump area. Bagley offered the city \$125 per acre with certain improvements.

ATTEMPTED SUICIDE

At approximately 4:30 p.m., Sunday, 9-6-70, this Officer was contacted by Fireman Webb reference to a subject that they had just transported to Rose de Lima Hospital in the City Ambulance.

Webb picked this subject up at the Texaco Bait Bank with numerous cuts on his feet and arms. Subject stated that he had been working on a rotary type lawn mower and had cut himself on the mower. Webb felt that these cuts could not have been made by a mower.

I proceeded to the hospital where I made contact with the victim who related the same story. After looking at victim's feet, I could see no way that a lawn mower could have done this damage. Victim states that this occurred at Allen Street. I went to this house and I found the residence locked and no one home. I contacted Sgt. Mason and he met me at the hospital where we learned after talking to victim, that he had attempted to commit suicide but had changed his mind and gotten in his car and driven to the Texaco Bait Bank where he had then called the ambulance.

Due to the nature of the injuries and the suspicious circumstances, I felt that the residence at Allen Street should be checked for further injured people. Detective Lattin was contacted to meet me at the residence and we entered the house and found a large amount of blood in the living room, which substantiates victim's story.

No further action taken by this Officer, investigation turned over to Detective Lattin.

BURGLARY

At approximately 8:45 a.m. 9-16-70 I was contacted at the Henderson Police Department by Terry Sullivan, who stated that on 9-8-70 person or persons unknown gained entry into his home and stole a tool box containing various tools. Victim stated that he could determine no point of entry and that he was reporting this due to the fact that his insurance company advised him to do so.

Said tool box was taken from the living room of his house. It is described as being 15" x 22" x 22" x 2 1/2" with a formica cover, padded on the inside — value \$35. 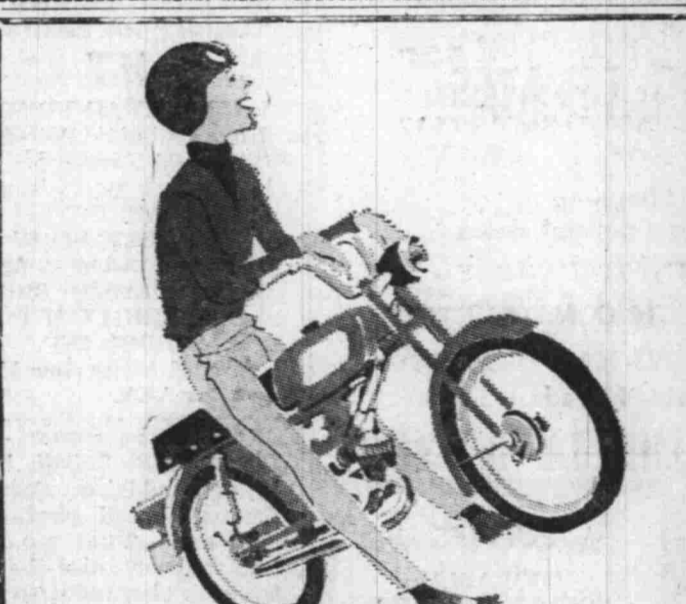
