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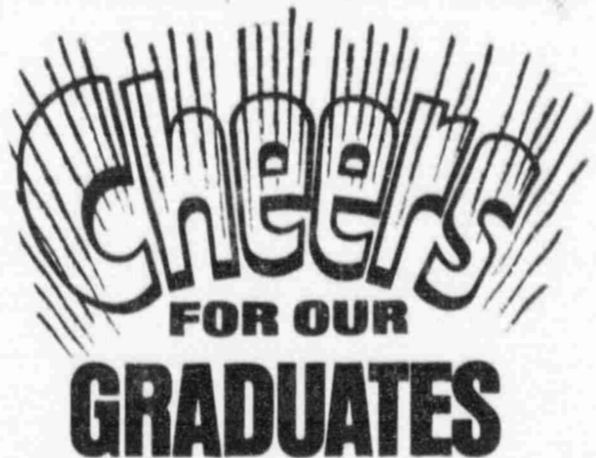

Williams Talks on Public Housing, "Blackmail", Fairness and Growth

Lorin Williams, Henderson City Councilman, was elected to his first four-year term on the council in 1961. Defeated in his primary race for mayor in 1965, he was elected to his second four-year council term in 1969. (On May 23, the HOME NEWS conducted an interview with Williams. The following story is taken from that interview--ed.)

Q. What do you think about this public housing question here?

A. I'm for public housing. You've got to give these people a place to live. But Henderson shouldn't get all the public housing in the county...The only public housing in the county is that brown stuff at the corner of Nellis Boulevard and Boulder Highway.

Henderson has to have diversified growth. It can't just be county welfare cases. You have to have diversified groups coming into the city. The economic base of this city is very low.

I disagree violently with what this guy at HUD said the other day. (A representative of the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban

Henderson Heights is public housing, even if it's built by somebody else...And we still have Carver Park.

We need taxes...you don't always want another 300 houses that don't pay taxes. We're already operating on a shoestring.

Have you ever compared the budgets of Boulder City and Henderson? With about a third of our size, they spend about as much as we do. (Bill Cottrell, executive director of the Clark County Housing Authority--ed.)

Don't misunderstand me. I like Cottrell. He's a very nice man...He's got a job to do and he's doing it. We gave them three or four out of 10 locations. It (HUD)--ed.) wants the choicest land in town.

I still think that the best bet is Carver. (To repeat, the interview was conducted on May 23--ed.)...I've said it several times. Where they're making their biggest mistake is in not breaking it (the 80 units of public housing--ed.) into 30 or 40 units.

and want to change the federal government. But it's local government that is the place to start getting interested in government.

Q. Do you talk to people who want to change the way things are done?

A. Yes, I've talked to young people here in town and at the plant. (Williams is a shift supervisor at the Montrose Chemical Corporation.) God, you can change anything if you really want to. It's not hard to effect change. Naturally, on the higher level, it's harder.
