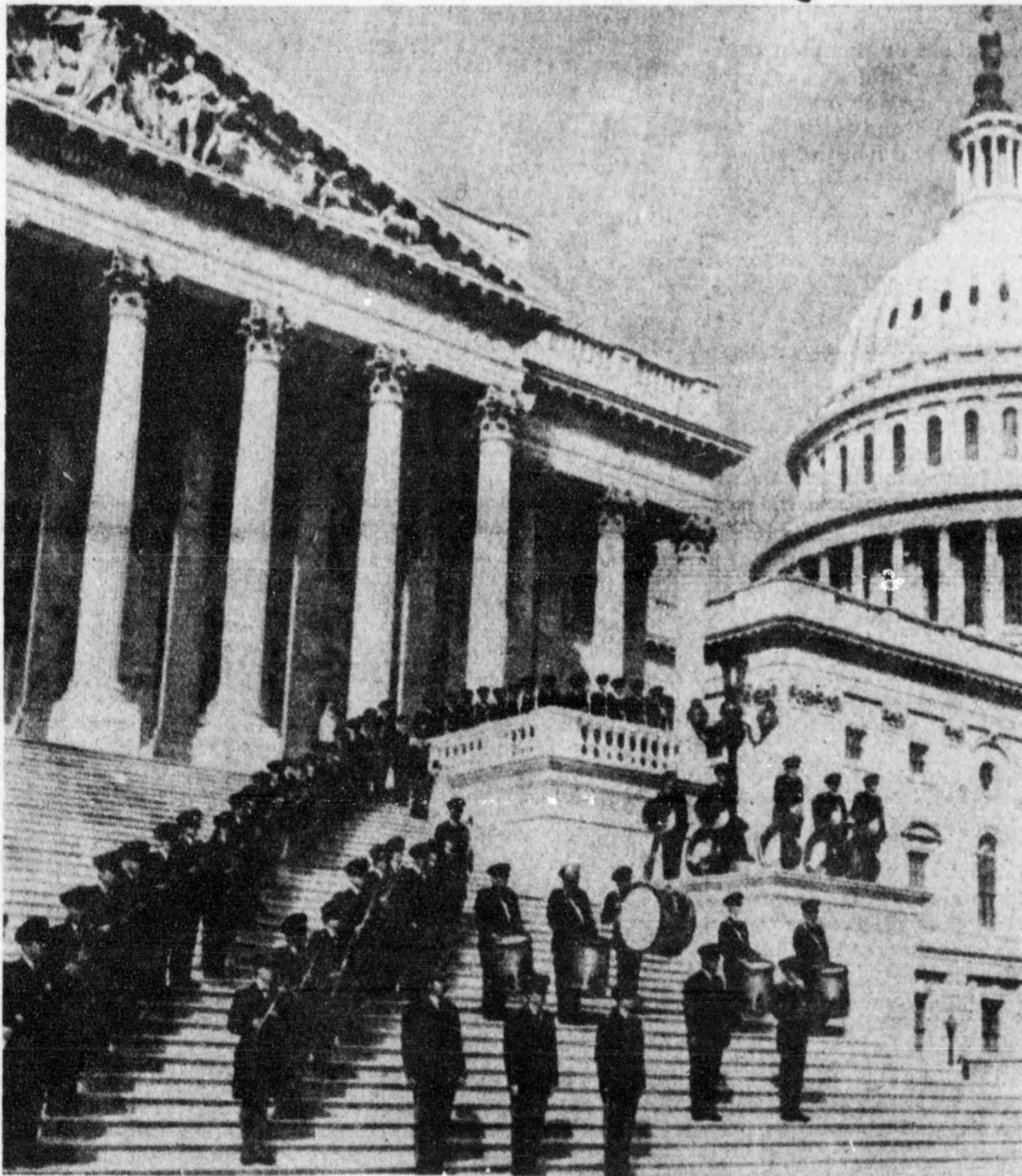

During the discussion, it is expected that the Market Street Abandonment will be brought up.

The planning is being done by Genge Consultants of San Francisco and is funded under a 701 federal grant.

# Zenoff Ordered To Testify in Mathewson Narco Case

Indictments against William Brent Mathewson, 35, of 634 St. Andrews Street, on charges of narcotics, took on a strange twist this week as HOME NEWS Publisher Morry Zenoff, a member of the grand jury, was ordered to be present in district court Oct. 19 to testify about his role as a grand juror in the indictment of the Henderson Businessman.

On that same date Mathewson will have his trials set on four separate indictments.

District Court Judge Carl Christensen granted the motion to examine Zenoff and ordered his appearance, despite opposition by the District Attorney's office.

Douglas Clark, deputy district

attorney, characterized the motion as "an attempt to pierce the traditionally secret deliberations of the grand jury."

Another member of the Staff of the DA's office, said that Mathewson's attorney Randall Mainor, had alleged that Zenoff, in an article written June 16, 1977, answered to criticism of the grand jury. The motion filed by Mainor alleges that articles printed in the Home News quoted police sources with facts not presented to the Grand Jury.

The DA's office said that jurors can only testify to certain things but a Judge can look at the transcription of the Grand Jury Proceedings to determine if a crime has been committed.

Mainor said the indictments should be dismissed because deliberations of the Grand Jury are "tainted with prejudice" as a result of Zenoff's participation.

Mainor, in his legal briefs, said Zenoff had knowledge of the case not obtained from evidence presented.

sented to the jury. He noted that Zenoff and Mathewson are both long-time residents of Henderson. Mathewson was arrested by Henderson Police April 1. He had \$4,200 worth of narcotics with him at the time, police said, and later a search of his fashionable Black Mountain home on a search warrant resulted in seizure of another \$90,000 worth. The arrest climaxed a two-month undercover investigation of Mathewson's activities. Mathewson, operator of a Henderson air conditioning firm, was released on \$18,500 bail. He was then indicted by the county grand jury Aug. 10 moments before his

preliminary hearing was scheduled to begin in Henderson Justice Court. Two of the four indictments charge him with selling a controlled substance, one charges him with giving away a controlled substance, and one charges him with for counts of selling and possessing a controlled substance. The narcotics were cocaine, marijuana and mescaline, police said. In seeking dismissal of the indictments because of Zenoff's involvement as a newsman and grand juror, attorney Mainor submitted an affidavit: "On Tuesday, April 5, 1977, five days after the defendant was

arrested for the alleged offenses," the affidavit reads. "Mr. Zenoff published in his newspaper a front page headline story relative to the charges against the defendant, including a full-blown photograph of what appeared and is purported as such to be narcotics." "The article further quoted Henderson city police detectives who worked on the case and contains many facts not presented to the grand jury."

Mainor claims the grand jury has exceeded the bounds of its authority, since it has a duty to receive only legal evidence.

## Kurt D. Christensen Services Thursday

He was a member of the LDS Church, 6th Ward and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. Mr. Christensen is sur-

vived by his wife, Linda; two sons, James and Nicholas Christensen of Henderson; two brothers, Stephen L. Christensen of Flagstaff, Arizona and Peter Christensen of Las Vegas; sister, Jeanne Church of Germany; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Layron Christensen of Las Vegas and maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Lionel Davis of Henderson. Services will be held at the Cholla Street LDS Chapel at 2 p.m. October 6. Bishop Robert Adams will officiate. Interment will be at Palm Memorial Park.

Henderson's building boom continued to climb through the month of September as it is three times higher than last year's banner year at this time, according to Pat Doherty, superintendent of building and safety.

This year's building total to date is \$18,714,229, as compared to last year's \$6,148,294.

The September figure for this year was \$6,217,238, which was higher than last year's entire year. Last year's September figure was \$450,397.

Most of the building for September were three new commercials at \$4,094,000 and 47 new homes, valued at \$1,808,716.

There were 989 inspections made during the month, 10 clean-up violations and 7 compliances. There were no court cases during September.

## Clark County Housing Pays \$7,499 In Lieu Of Taxes

A payment of \$7,499.82 has been made to the City of Henderson by Clark County Housing Authority in lieu of taxes for the past year, according to W.F. Cottrell executive director.

The City and the Housing Authority have a cooperative agreement, entered into in March of 1968, in connection with the Authority's development of 300 new units of housing in Henderson and the phasing out of the 842 old wartime

units in Carver Park and Victory Village.

One of the provisions of the agreement is that the authority will make a payment in lieu of taxes each year equal to ten percent of the shelter rent.

Cottrell said "Our fiscal year ended on June 30, and the fiscal audit has been completed and approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. There-

fore, we are now in a position to make the payment.

This represents twelve months of operation of Project NEV-13-2 Espinoza Terrace, and Landsman Gardens and four months of operation of Hampton Court, since that project was purchased by the Authority and converted to conventional low-rent public housing effective March 1, 1977.

A native of Hungary, Dr. Fazekas first came to the United States in 1956.

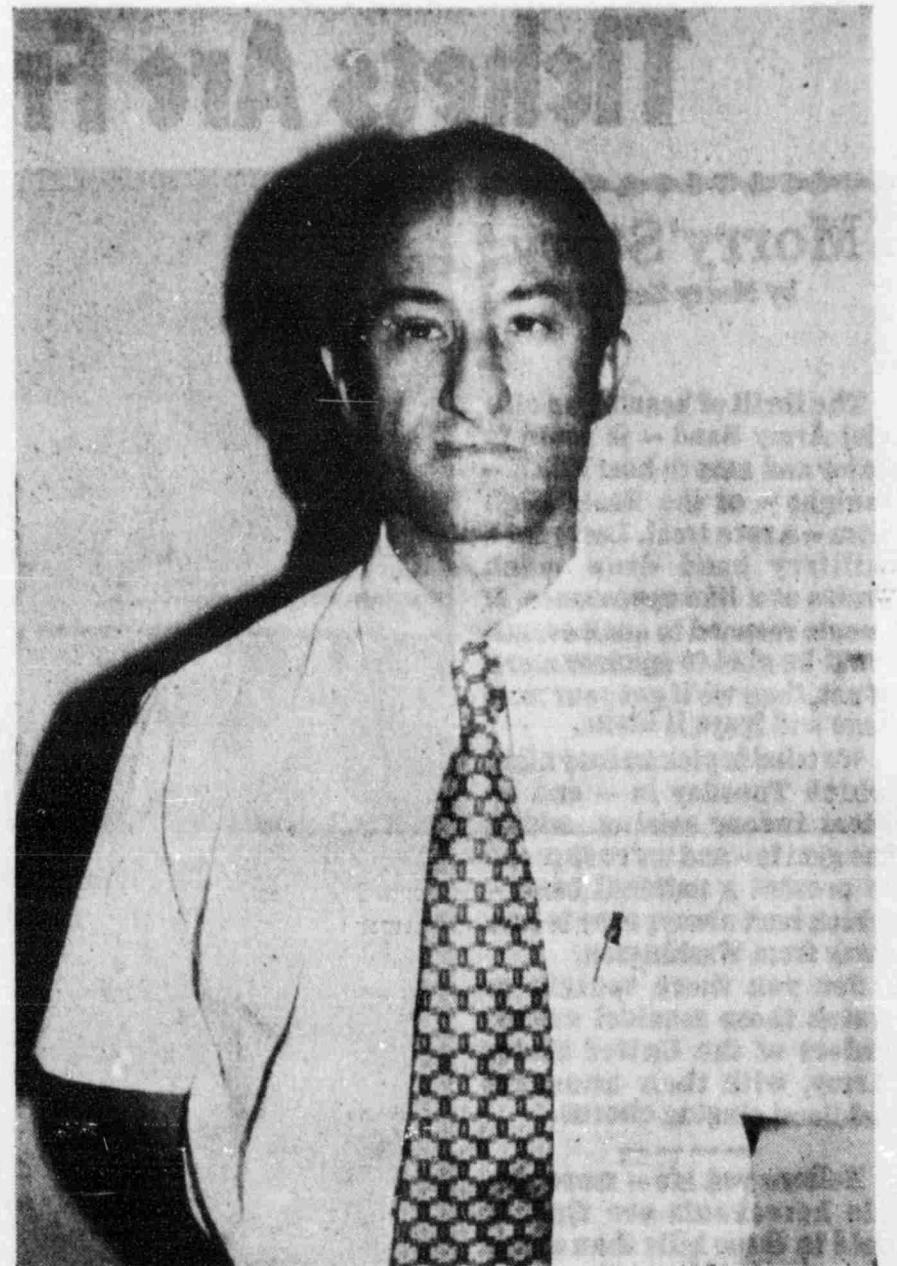
His training in medicine has been most diversified and complete as he has attended school in Budapest, Hungary, Baylor University in Houston, Texas and in Vienna, Austria.

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"What Everyone Should Know About Vandalism" Officer Robert Lindsey

What is vandalism? It's the deliberate and pointless damaging of property, sometimes called "ripping up", "trashing", "yard farming" etc. Whatever it is called, vandalism is not a "harmless prank". It's a crime that wastes time and money that causes

suffering, even death. In cities, suburbs and towns throughout America, vandalism is rapidly increasing. Millions of incidents are reported every year. At least twice as many are unreported, and types of vandalism are becoming more vicious, such as:

(a) Cruelty to animals.  
(b) Damage to vital emergency equipment.  
Whenever vandalism occurs, you pay directly when your own property is damaged. Indirectly you pay via higher taxes to repair and replace public property through higher insurance costs.  
Who vandalizes? Most vandals are youngsters. There is no "typical" vandal. Involved are girls and boys, good students and drop-outs, whites, blacks or Latins, the well-to-do and the poor.

(a) Grade school children as young as 6 or 7 may vandalize schools, parks, etc. It is hard to believe that young children can be deliberately destructive, and harder to decide how to correct the problem.

(b) Teenagers often have "growing up" problems which may lead them to act more destructively, misusing vehicles, spraying graffiti in public places, etc.

(c) Older youths account for more serious damage involving vehicles and machinery. They may also be involved in such crimes as burglary, arson, etc.

Vandals often work in groups (gangs, packs). They often damage property on a dare, or as part of being initiated. A group usually feels "braver" than a single person would, so incidents may happen more often and damage may be more serious.

Why do people vandalize? Most vandals don't have a clear motive; they don't know why they vandalize. Probably because of basic social problems, attitudes are at the root of the vandalism.

(a) Anger against society in several may cause a desire to "strike back."

(b) Boredom is a major problem for youngsters, both in ghettos with few recreational facilities, high unemployment and, in wealthier areas, where they have few responsibilities and much free time.

(c) Drug abuse and alcohol abuse make vandalism more likely. Youths who are feeling "high" may use less judgment, act irresponsibly. Vandalism is sometimes connected with thefts for drug money.

(d) Disciplinary problems, when discipline is too strict, is lacking, or is inconsistent, may cause children to rebel via acts of vandalism.

(e) Personal problems such as family difficulties, school or social troubles, may be behind acts of vandalism.

Parents and everyone in the community can help prevent vandalism. The best time to fight vandalism is before children begin to vandalize. From early childhood through the growing up years, parents and all members of the community, teachers, community leaders, neighbors, etc. can make the kind of world in which children have no "need" to vandalize.

(a) Teach by example. Example is the most important influence on children's behavior.

(b) Be a responsible citizen; show that vandalism is no solution to problems or to anger against society. Work for constructive change: Be informed, take the time to think about what's happening, discuss your thoughts with local, state, national powers, vote responsibly.

In the meantime, everyone can help fight vandalism when it does occur. Today, vandalism has reached epidemic proportions. We must take effective action now, individually and as a whole, to combat this senseless crime. Individuals should be alert and act promptly. Protect personal property against vandalism. Keep gates, garages locked, use out-door lighting, always remove keys from parked cars. Contribute your time and energy to youth programs which provide young people with constructive alternatives to vandalism. Report suspicious persons or activities around your home (or your neighbors'). If you spot unusual activity at odd hours, in school, church, etc., notify authorities. Cooperate with law enforcement personnel and other concerned

groups in their efforts to stamp out vandalism. So help keep our

community safe from vandalism. Know why vandalism happens, who

is involved and what you can do to help prevent it. Report vandalism when you see it happening. Join in community efforts to stop vandalism.

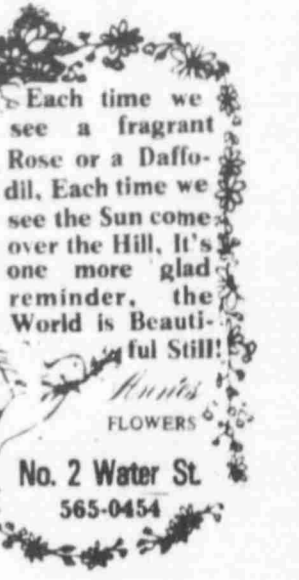
