

CITY LEADERS ASSUME DISABILITIES

How often have you said, upon seeing a disabled person, "There but for he go I?"

Last Thursday a group of area officials and leaders participated in an "Awareness Day" project sponsored by the Governor's Committee on Employment of the Handicapped and had a first-hand opportunity to be the temporary "he" of the saying.

The participants spent the day in wheelchairs, splints, on crutches, with partial sight and hearing loss, learning the problems a handicapped person must face.

Volunteers were supplied crutches, wheelchairs, goggles, and hearing devices which block out sound, courtesy of Las Vegas firms and Titanium Metals Corporation.

For Councilman Carlton Lawrence, Jeff Billingsley, Pat Doherty, Senator James Gibson, it was being confined to a wheelchair all day.

For Councilman Phil Stout it was a hearing loss, for City Manager Bob Campbell it was cataracts resulting in sight loss, for Bob Gordon it was being mute.

At a noon luncheon at the Sahara Hotel Space Center, many of the participants gave

testimony to the problems they had encountered during the morning hours.

Senator Gibson said he "stayed close to my desk all morning because I had problems getting through doorways in my wheelchair."

Stout, who assumed a hearing loss, said "I can't imagine what it would be like having less hearing than the 30 per cent loss I have now."

One woman, representing Good Will Industries, commented she was going to learn sign language. She had discovered that a deaf person can only communicate with someone else who is deaf or with

members of a family where there is deafness and the deaf person has such a small sphere in which they can communicate with others.

Kathie Milone of KORK-TV, who "lost" her right hand, said "the most horrible fact was that I, who have always been very independent, had to ask for help."

All those who spent the morning in a wheelchair agreed when Lawrence said "I'm getting very uncomfortable. My legs, back and rear hurt. I didn't realize how much you could hurt in a wheelchair and there's no way to get up to

stretch and move around."

Another common complaint of wheelchair volunteers was the difficulty encountered going through doorways into bathrooms. "They're just not made wide enough," commented Pat Doherty.

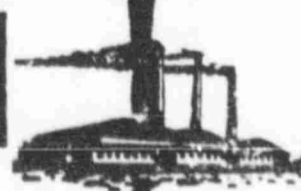
"Awareness Day" was designed so that participants might better appreciate the problems that plague a disabled person. It was also a part of the National Employ the Handicapped Week, October 2-8, a week designated to show that the handicapped are employable persons and should be called the "able disabled."

Facing a lifetime of disability is a far cry from being able to dispose of crutches, wheelchairs and splints at the end of a day. It is hoped that more and more employers will hire the able disabled so that they might become more a part of the working community.

It is also hoped that cities and architects of public buildings will keep the handicapped in mind. It only takes a door to be a bit wider, a periodic ramp an elevator as well as escalators - things we take for granted but which are very meaningful to the handicapped person.

City To Receive EDA Grants

Council Recommends "Do Pass" To Revised Budget

"The age of the high speed race is over," commented Police Chief Floyd Osborn when asked about the feasibility of using smaller vehicles such as the Nova for police use.

"Putting a 6 foot 4 inch drunk in the back seat could present a problem but I do feel a smaller car would be worthwhile."

These comments were made during a committee meeting of the City Council last Friday, held for the discussion of the revised working budget for the 1977-78 fiscal year.

This was one of the considerations being made by the City in the review of the budget which would help to insure that the City government remain fiscally conservative in the foreseeable months and years ahead.

Some of the reasons for asking for the review of the budget as previously approved were due to the appointments of a new City Manager and Finance Director; the approval of several federally funded projects; unforeseen changes in some fund balances and the recent decision involving wage adjustments.

Campbell also spoke about his original observation upon arriving, that "the City is in fact overstaffed in some areas," but this is due almost wholly to the presence of CETA personnel.

"If the CETA program were to end tomorrow, we could handle the situation," Campbell said.

The council voted to approve the administration's implementation of the revised working budget and gave it a "do pass" recommendation for Tuesday's recessed meeting where it will receive a final vote

Two Chiefs Get Retroactive Pay

"I consider it a slap in the face ... a penalty for retiring ... you are basically saying everyone deserves a raise by Floyd Osborn ... I consider it unfair since I have worked one half of the fiscal year," Police Chief Floyd Osborn said agitatedly to the city council when they met last Friday to discuss a classification and salary schedule for employees.

Due to the retirement of both the Fire Chief and Police Chief the first of January and to the creation of a Director of Public Safety; the positions of the two chiefs

become void upon appointment of the latter and salary schedule was not taken into consideration for their positions.

"It was in no way a reflection on them as individuals," City Manager Bob Campbell explained. "The reasoning was based on the fact that the positions will cease to exist."

Osborn explained that he was speaking only for himself but he had discussed the situation with Don Richard, fire chief, who then said, "It is very discouraging to me. We wrote letters of intent six

months ahead of time when all that is required is a two weeks notice. If the city hadn't had our letters, our positions would have been included on the salary schedule."

The City Clerk and City Attorney are to receive raises retroactive to July 1, 1977 and the council gave a recommendation to include a seven per cent increase to the two chiefs as well.

New figures will be brought out at Tuesday's recessed meeting for final action.

COUNCIL TO HOLD PUBLIC HEARING FOR ANNEXATION OF LAND

The City Council will meet for a recessed meeting tonight in the Council Chambers at 7 p.m.

On the agenda is a Public Hearing for the annexation of ten acres of land in Section 31 for Richard McDonald.

Other items include:

-Award of bid for water and sewer pipe and fitting.

-Creation of an appointed position, Director of Women's Rights, to represent Henderson.

-Architectural review for a car wash by applicant William Waltz, to be located near St. Peter's Church on Boulder Highway.

Work should begin within the next few weeks on three projects for which the City has received Economic Development Administration grants totaling more than \$572,000.

Notification of the grants was received last week and all projects will have to go to bid and be awarded before construction can take place, which usually takes about three weeks.

The projects to be financed are the following:

-\$473,652 for the construction of water pumps, a water line and reservoir which will provide reliable water pressure to the Mission Hills and Levi Strauss industrial site areas.

-\$76,465 for the installation of water lines from the Lake Mead Drive and Victory Road intersection part way toward Green Valley.

-\$22,877 for construction of curbs, gutters and sidewalks on Horizon and Skyline Drives and O'Callaghan Park.

The grants stipulate that the City must begin construction within 90 days.

enough to carry the ball just enough to give your hot runner a chance to play decoy. Then you want your offensive team to have two pass catchers -- ends or backs -- who are above average. Then you want your offensive linemen to be fast, quick on the charge to develop split second openings. You want on that team a punter who can pound them out there consistently for 40 or better.

That's the offensive team. And, of course, you have a defensive team big enough, smart enough, alert enough to stop any team that comes to town ... stop them from making their 10 yards and a first down most of any Saturday afternoon.

Stanford has the hot runner in Darrin Nelson, a freshman out of L.A. It has that fullback in Phil Francis and that pass catcher in Jim Lofton and that quarterback who can fire them in on a dime, under pressure, in Steve Dils, also a freshman. It has a punter in Brad Fox who averages 48.

More than that Stanford has a

new coach ... Bill Walsh ... who is experiencing the thrill of going back to college coaching because he wanted his thruthers -- college coaching -- instead of a more money job as a pro coach, where he was doing very nicely up until a year ago.

More than that, too, Stanford has something else going for it.

It turns down about 10,000 applicants each year ... each of them being straight A's or close to that ... because the school can't handle all that want to attend this "Harvard of the West". Those who get in are, therefore, tops in brains, muscles and thus easily coachable. The intricate plays the pro coach has thrown at this year's bunch ... are accepted and when the patterns were called for in Saturday's game, the play execution was so smooth.

This variety of attack brought results. Touchdowns. Some by land and some by air. Long runs by this kid Darrin Nelson reminded one of Mike

Thomas, a little guy slippery, sneaky, snakey, turned many third down situations into first. Pin point passing by Steve Dils to Jim Lofton was professional, really, and this included Lofton twice pulling in passes from among four other hands on the ball at the same time. The second time he did it he kept on running and twisting until he made the end zone just before the final gun ... it was the deciding touchdown. Dils was a substitute quarterback, taking the place of the touted for all-American Guy Benjamin, now injured and certainly now not a cinch to get his old job back. If I were the coach, I'd string along with Dils for his having used cool, and savvy and thus beaten UCLA. Believe us -- UCLA is no slouch with its Freeman McNeil, who did a 78 yarder right thru tackle for a touch, and all-American Theotis Brown, who did a 75 yarder off the same tackle for a touch. Other than these breakaway runs, though, Stanford's defense held well enough to convince all 64,500 fans it was Stanford's first chance to talk maybe Rose Bowl this year since Jim Plunkett's time, and John Brodie.

You who like a football team that varies its game plan will like Stanford. You who like smart players rather than power smashers will like Stanford. You'll find them rated nationally this week, among the first 20. You'll find they lost to Colorado early -- but it was a close one and now look at Colorado -- in the first ten.

Go see Stanford and see one of the finest teams money can haul you to -- or better yet -- sit right down and write yourself a letter to the ticket office at USC 'cause Stanford plays in the Coliseum in a biggie in November -- Stanford also plays Cal., also plays Washington this very week.

WHILE WE'RE TOUTING YOU -- KEEP Nelson in mind and Lofton and Steve Dils ... if you'll want to name drop come all-star picking time.

Hope you got yourself a deer while we got ourselves a greater than great football game.

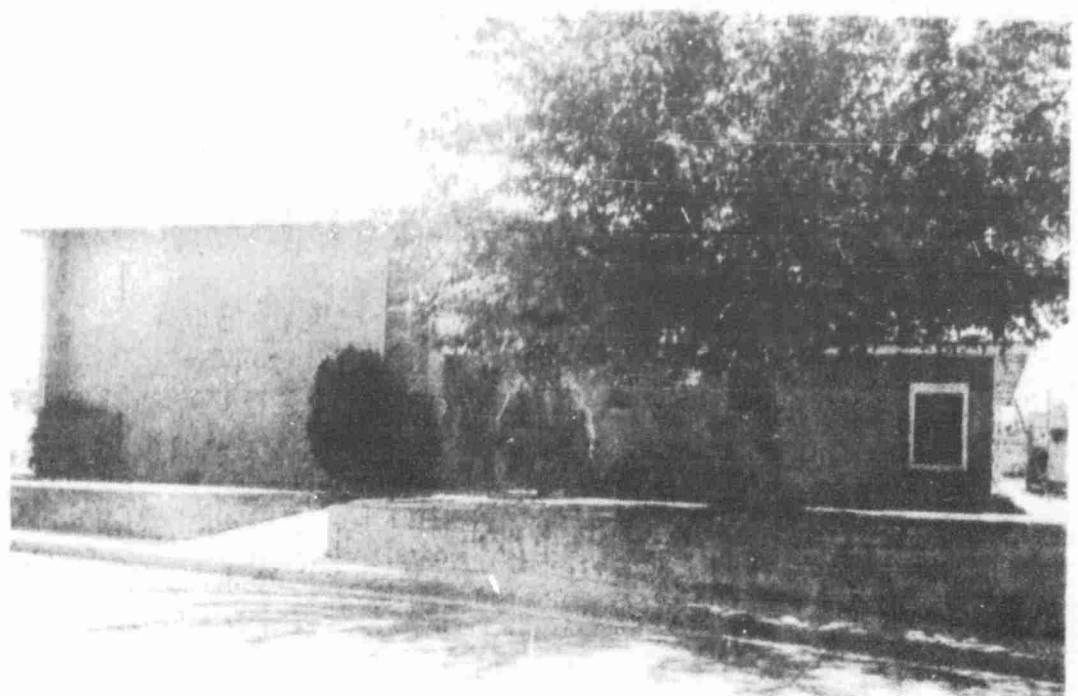

OUR SAVIOR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH TODAY

History of Our Savior's Lutheran Church

Our Saviors Lutheran Church was organized in 1952 under the direction of the California and Nevada District of the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, and under the sponsorship of the First Good Shepherd Lutheran Church of Las Vegas, Nevada and its pastor, the Rev. E.A. Wessel.

The first elected officers of the new congregation were Earl Oetter - President, Robert Barr - Vice President, Henry O'Whene Secretary and Philip Schaht Treasurer. The first worship service was held Aug. 10, 1952, under the leadership of Vicor Mann with 20 people present.

The Ladies Aid was organized and their first meeting was held on Sept. 11, 1952 at the home of Mrs. D. Shortt. Confirmation classes for children and adults were organized and Sunday School Teacher Training courses were taught along with a weekly Bible Class by Vicor Mann.

The Couples Club was organized in December 1952. The first adults confirmed were Mr. and Mrs. Rober Barr, Mr. and Mrs. Henry O'Whene, Mrs. Leila Oetter, Miss Joan Lopeman, Mr. Robert Weidman and Nancy Vegas. Members, their Weber. This class was confirmed by Rev. E.A. Quebe on June 14, 1953 by Rev. E.A. Wessel. They were and Philip Schacht, Jr. Pastor Quebe accepted a call to another congregation and Rev. Terrill J. Kramer accepted our call Auditorium for devine and began his pastorate services in July of 1953. When Vicor Mann returned to Concordia Seminary and later the property was

seeded and landscaped and a sprinkler system installed. The 10th Anniversary celebration was held on Aug. 12, 1962. Al Fritz and Elvin Friedrichs headed the committee. Special guests were Rev. Holm, Mr. View Luth. Rev. Theo Hoiliter, Good Shepherd and 2nd Vice Pres. of the Cal-Nev. District, and Rev. John Ulrig executive secretary of the Cal-Nev. District. After Rev. Kramer left Our Savior's the Rev. Robert Schmidlke came to Henderson to serve for a year. Our Savior's was without a pastor for a period of 8 1/2 months. Rev. Trenton Ferro was called in 1965 - he served the congregation til 1969 when he accepted a call to a Cal. parish. Pastor Ronald Blou of Reedemer Luth in N. Las Vegas filled in during the vacancy. In Feb. of 1969 James Rieker, Sunday School Supt. was repainted and the Walther League was reorganized. A call was extended for a retired pastor on a contract basis, a year at a time. The Rev. Elmer Zivibrick responded to our call and served the congregation from 1970 til June 1973. A call was placed for a graduate from the Seminary with a request that Ronald Meyer would be assigned here as he was a vicor at Good Shepherd, Las Vegas earlier. He accepted and was installed July 8, 1973. In 1974 the interior of Our Savior's was remodeled. Lowell Naumberg redone the altar, pulpit and lecturer and built the new communion rail and wall candle holders. Pews were purchased from a church in Arba, Colo. Joann Stiltz succeeded James Rieker as Sunday

School Supt. in 1972. She served several years and Jane Englebrecht was appointed acting Supt. Ted Debban was appointed to the past of Sunday School Supt in 1976. Early in 1977 plans were made to build on to the existing structure to include more class rooms, new kitchen, utility room, storage facilities and rest rooms. Work was begun early in Sept. by the Grove Construction Co. The architect is Gilbert Grove. Present officers of Our Saviour's are Albert Fritz pres., Larry Matzke, Vice pres., Doris Simon, sec. and Ellen Debban treasurer.

On Oct. 16 Our Savior is planning to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the church in Henderson when the remodeled church will be rededicated and the new building to be used for the first time will be dedicated also to the glory of God.
