Firemen File Grievance For Flag Hanging

Was yesterday, Nevada Admission Day, the last Flag Holiday members of the Fire Fighters will be hanging American flags on the streets of our city?

According to a letter from Fire Chief Don Richards written to City Manager Bob Campbell dated October 3, the Fire Fighters, at a union meeting, made and passed a motion to stop hanging the flags unless ordered by the chief to do so.

Richard issued the order Sunday.

Now the union will file a grievance against Richard for ordering them to do something outside the field of fire

fighting. No reason for this action was detailed in the letter, but according to Gary Johnson, Chamber of Commerce Director, it is aimed personally at

him because he spoke in favor of a Public Safety Director during a public hearing before the City Council when the PSD position was under consideration.

Don Griffie, president of local 1883, confirmed this is the reason in a telephone call several weeks ago when word of such action first came to the paper's attention. At that time he requested the HOME NEWS not to publish the story until after the next Flag Holiday.

The flag hanging has always been a joint operation between the city and the Chamber of Commerce. The chamber agreed to buy the flags, hangers, etc. and replace lost, damaged or stolen ones while the city agreed to take care of the hanging, removing, storage and inven-

Exactly when this agreement between the chamber and city was made is unknown. Originally the program was started with volunteer help from service clubs, then became the duty of the Maintenance Department.

This became a matter of considerable expense to the city because of overtime and also caused a problem to members of the maintenance department as they could not make holiday plans with their families.

It finally was turned over to the Fire Department since certain members had to work, holiday or not. They were offered one additional shift off each year, all members except chief officers, and they accepted.

The on - coming shift comes in about an hour early relieving the shift about to go off -

duty to hang the flags. The onduty shift then removes them

around 4 p.m.

There is a memorandum dated June 14, 1966 from then City Manager Ralph Pfiffner to Chief Richard assigning the responsibility for installing and removing flags throughout the city to the Fire Department "since, in your particular department, adequate manpower is available and also since you have constant radio contact with the base station."

Campbell's comment to Richard via memo was "I sincerely regret this attitude on the part of the fire personnel, for I believe it will be to their detriment in the long run."

In a letter to the Fire

Levi to Finance Own Project

City Attorney Kent Dawson has received notification from officials at the Levi Strauss Company that they are having extreme difficulty in keeping the costs of their new Henderson distribution center under the \$5 million limitation, which they must stay beneath if they are to finance the facility with economic development revenue bonds.

Therefore, the company has decided it would be better to finance the project with funds already on hand in the company.

This will in no way slow down or stop the progress that has been taking place on the Levi Strauss site since their groundbreaking several weeks ago.

The City Council approved the bonds August 1 at their meeting. The bonds, which were not to exceed \$5 million, are tax free, for the purpose of defraying costs of acquiring land, a building and equipment and would have been repaid by Levi Strauss. There was no obligation by the city.


Ice Rink To Open In Henderson

Building Reaches All-Time High Of \$22,053,279

Building valuations for the year to date as of October 31 were \$22,053,279, the highest in Henderson's history, according to Pat Doherty, superintendent of building and safety.

Doherty said last year's figures, which to the end of October were \$7,899,342, were the highest in history.

The October building totalled \$3,339,050 for this year, as compared to \$1,751,048 for the previous year.

The bulk of valuations for October were for 63 new homes for a total valuation of

There were four plex apartments for 40 units valued at \$680,000. Commercial alterations and additions totalled \$100,000. Other valuations were for one new commercial building, fences and walls, two new swimming pools, concrete, patios, carports, garages and utility buildings.

There were 26 clean-up violations reported and 18 compliances. There were 1023 total inspections and no court cases during October.

The exchange of two properties, including the Henderson California-Pacific electric utility, has been approved by the Nevada Public Service Commission, according to Ron Langford, manager of the Henderson office.

Nevada Power Company has been negotiating the exhange of a similar facility in Elko to Cal-Pac for the Henderson operation and the final exchange is expected to take place around December 1.

The exchange still must be approved by the Federal Power Commission, and if that approval is forthcoming, the transfer of the two facilities could take place some time in November.

One point of dispute still to be settled includes a power allotment from the Division of Colorado River Resources. The City of Henderson has requested that the allotment, which provides ten per cent of the city's power, to be turned over to Henderson, which in turn would allot it to Nevada Power Company

Nevada Power Company maintains that the power, which was previously held by Cal-Pac, should be transferred with the transfer of the Company, and is part of the agreement.

A hearing will be held on the matter at 2 p.m. Thursday at the DCRR offices on Maryland Parkway and both Nevada Power and the City are ex-





Zenoff Denies Influence On Grand Jury Over **Drug Arrest**


Dalmatians are the "dandy" of the dog kingdom. They had the aristocratic pleasure of accompanying the royalty of several countries traveling along side the mighty golddecked coaches in the time period when "pomp" prevailed. Known to-date as the popular "coach dog," no other breed can quite match this versatile, original type of 21 inches. They should. dog. The "dal" served in yesteryear as a work dog, After the coaches came his run along side the horse-drawn firewagons. Used in hunting (resembling the pointer), the dal can hold his own and when prizes are given out for the typical "all-around" companion dog, he can often take first prize over all breeds in the loyalty department.

Past President of the Silver State Kennel Club and the Vegas Valley Dog Obedience Club, Maxine Yeoman of Henderson owns two "top-dogs" of the breed. Crystal had her prime (eight years old now) but earned her companion dog rating and did her mistress credit with turning in many ribbons and awards during her younger years. Member of the Dalmaton Club of Las Vegas, Maxine has high hopes for Crystal's daughter, Shapely Shannon Sheba, a beautiful two-year-old, who has gained nine points toward her championship.

Dalmatians for show are expected not to exceed 26 inches in height or be less than

black or brown nose, good back and stance. Main color should be white with black markings, or white with liver markings, but only two colors per dog. Pups are usually about eight to ten per litter. Born pure white, they proceed to receive their markings in about ten days. Show quality markings should be no smaller than a dime and not larger than one-half dollar. "Patches are not acceptable," Maxine stated, "and I have to laugh when I frequently see the dalmatians that gift card artists or commercial artists create. They invariably have large patches which are not recognized or desirable in show-dog material!" She added that although the breed may have blue eyes. that dark-brown eyes. (giving a black effect) are preferred. There should be complete black or brown around the eyes, which ever matches your dog's second color. Mrs. Yeoman's dalmatians both sport the famous "tear-drop" dark

marking extending from the eyes. Known in England the "plumpudding" dog, the Dal has the circus-dog ability and has appeared in the ring often out-doing the poodle, fox terrier or chihuahua. Their endurance for longdistance runs averages between twenty to fifty miles and is one of the added obedience requirements set upon them by the Dalmatian Club of America. Excellent with horses, the Coach-Dog finds hoofing it with their pals



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

· Even after the Panama Railroad served to link the great oceans of the world, interest in a canal to provide a second link did not decline. The United States government continued to seek permission from Colombia for construction of a canal to parallel the Panama Railroad across the Isthmus.

But political problems were certain to arise when the control of such an important asset as the Isthmus of Panama was at stake, and some officials in Panama thought the area could better control its own destiny. In 1859, Panama forcefully seceded from the Republic of New Granda (Colombia). For two years, the tiny nation continued as an independent government. But during this time no nation succeeded in gaining from Panama a concession for construction of a canal, and Colombia once again extended its government over the Isthmus.

Still the interest in a canal continued. While the United States was embroiled in the Civil War and too busy to bother with an Isthmian canal, France made overtures to Nicaragua for a canal through that area, but no formal treaty was made. When the war was over, the U.S. interest was re - kindled. and in 1867 the Secretary of State wrote to the American minister in Bogota advising him of President Andrew Johnson's interest in negotiations for a canal.

"The President regards the canal as an American enterprise, which he desires to be carried out under American auspices," he wrote, "to the benefit of which the whole commercial world should be fully admitted."

On 14 January 1869, Johnson's diplomats did sign a convention with Colombia providing for a canal across the neck of the Chagres river inside a zone twenty miles wide. This land would be subdivided into lots fronting on the canal and according to the treaty, " equally distributed between the two governments," so as to alternte in sovereignty. The con-
