# Fireman Gives His Side On Flag Question

Dear Morry Zenoff,

I have been reading the very inaccurate articles by you and your staff in the last two printings of the HOMES NEWS. Now would you like to hear and print the truth from a fire fighter's standpoint? I am writing this letter to you on my own as a professional fire fighter. This is not to be construed as a union or Fire De-

partment publication.

It really makes me sick to see the elected officials of our town make such statements as were written in the November 3, 1977 issue of the HOME NEWS. I feel that I have been personally chastised by this article because I spoke against the new Public Safety Director position at the committee meeting of the Council

and was critized by a councilman at that meeting for speaking my thoughts. What happened to freedom of speech in this country?

The fire fighters have been hanging the flags for the last 11 or 12 years. Along with all of their other volunteer activities which never make headlines, such as hundreds of hours of schooling to make

this a better Fire Department and at no expense to the City; Scout activities; first aid classes to the public; donations of money and manpower to the civic organizations; donations and help to burned out victims; money from their own pockets to help people to get back home because they lost their money on the tables; food baskets and toys at Christmas. For years fire

fighters took care of Christmas Corner, putting up and taking down the decorations without the aid of the heavy equipment used now, revamping Santa's house and seeing that he was on the corner every day for the kids; manpower (volunteered) on the ambulance at football games and rodeos; drivers for dignitaries and flag trucks at all parades; sponsoring girls in

the beauty contests and many more that would take up your whole paper to print them. These were all accomplished from firefighters pockets and hearts. Why hasn't any of these items ever been headlines in your paper as the flag hanging issue has???

#### Left Turn Lane Needed At Palo Verde And Boulder Hwy.

"It's a potential killer left land," declared Hoss Melton in describing the dangerous situation that now exists at Boulder Highway and Palo Verde.

Melton is attempting to get the State Highway Department to make a left hand turn lane at this location a top priority. Right now it is on the low priority list for the middle of 1978.

"There are either kids driving or kids riding," said Melton, "going to or coming from school. Around 7:15 a.m. cars are standing in the left lane, the passing lane, waiting to turn onto Palo Verde while northbound traffic from Boulder City is heavy as workers travel towards their jobs in Henderson or Las Vegas."

Melton became aware of the situation early last week when he had a close call at that location and nearly turned over.

Since then he has made a point of observing the cross over early in the morning and after school.

"One day there is really going to be an accident if something isn't done to correct the situation soon," he warned.


# Don Richard To Be Honored

# 48 - Unit Motel Proposed For Downtown Henderson

The first step toward a new motel in downtown Henderson was taken at the planning commission meeting when approval was given for a zone change from residential to commercial for two lots on Victory Road.

The new motel, being proposed by Dr. Lorne Phillips, formerly of Henderson, would be located on Lake Mead Drive and Water Street where the Shell Station is now located and the adjacent prop-

The plan for the motel was given approval in Sept. of 1976 by the planners, but was held up on the council level when City Attorney Kent Dawson said that the council informed Dr. Phillips that if plans were submitted within 90 days his application would be honored. However, the plans were not submitted within that time.

The new plan includes a laundromat, a gas service area, a convenience store and a 48 unit - two - story motel. The site would have 69 parking spaces where the ordinance requires 63.

There were no protests at the public hearing of the city council meeting.

An old Henderson land mark, Victory Village, has been sold, according to Glen Taylor of Basic Management, Inc., owners of the land.

Victory Village housed close to 100 apartments in the early days of the city during the war years when the Henderson Industrial complex was Basic Manganese, Inc. Victory Village and Carver Park were built to house plant workers during World War II and were expected to be vacated in five years. After the war, however, Clark County Housing took over the management of the apartments for low cost rentals. They were razed within the last five years, giving them a life - time of over 20 years, many more than the life expectancy.

Approximately 18 acres has been sold to K - Mart in the area nearest Boulder Highway.

The second sale, which encompases about 58 acres, is based on a change in zoning to allow various uses. If the zone change is made, the sale will be completed. At the present time, both sales are in escrow. Black Mountain Realty is handling the second sale.

A public hearing is scheduled for Wed. at 8 p.m. to request the zone change from the Planning Commission. Following planning commission action, the request will go to the city council for action.

Zone changes include a general commercial, and apartments and also travel trailers. The land is now zoned for multiple dwellings At the present time, the only building in the area is the Lake Mead Furniture ware house.

Today's Question: Do you think that certain colors affect our feelings? If so, give examples. If not, why not?








East Bonanza, and Moapa Valley", noted Hoggard, "and we are particularly concerned that the residents of those areas have a voice on the Economic Opportunity Board."

The decision reached by the Colorado River Advisory Commission Thursday is that all Hoover energy currently used by Cal - Pac for Henderson be assigned to Henderson and simultaneously reassigned to

Nevada Power Co. The decision is contingent on the transfer of electrical utility operations in Henderson from Cal - Pac to Nevada Power.

Included in the commission action is the son may recapture its right to the power if it some - time in the future decides to establish "a complete municipal electric service opera-

At an October meeting, both Henderson and Nevada Power had asked the commission to assign the power.

Nevada Power spokesmen said although the company would be willing to relinquish rights to the power to Henderson if the city decided to set up a municipal utility, the company did not want the rights assigned to Henderson and reassigned to Nevada Power.

The reasoning given by company officials was

this would put Henderson on a status different than the rest of the entities served by the company.

At Thursday's meeting, Jack Lehman, chairman of the commission, said he was "naturally suspicious" about Nevada Power's reasons. He said he feared the company would be willing to give the power rights back to Henderson, but with

stipulations. The commission action to give the Cal - Pac rights to Henderson will not affect the current contractual arrangements of the Basic Management Project, according to Don Paff of the Division of Colorado River Resources.


#### Steam Tractor Model Built By **Local Hobbyist**

Hobbyists in mechanics will be fascinated by a project recently completed by Dave Odell, betterment engineer, who has put together a model of a 1902 Burrel steam tractor complete with red and green paint and lots of polished brass and copper

The scaled down (1/4 size) model of the original is a fully working, coal-fired replica. In operation, it has pulled a cart containing three adults and two children. The engine parts were manufactured in England, and it has taken Dave three years to assemble them

and to do the repair and refinishing, resulting from damage in transit. With 16 one-half inch fire tubes in the boiler, the plant works at 100 pounds pressure per square inch. The cylinder is a two-inch bore with a two and one-half inch stroke, and the engine weighs 325 pounds altogether.


