Dear Morry Zenoff,

I have been reading the very inaccurate articles by you and your staff in the last two printings of the HOMES NEWS. Now would you like to hear and print the truth from a fire fighter's standpoint? I am writing this letter to you on my own as a professional fire fighter. This is not to be construed as a union or Fire De-

partment publication.

It really makes me sick to see the elected officials of our town make such statements as were written in the November 3, 1977 issue of the HOME NEWS. I feel that I have been personally chastised by this article because I spoke against the new Public Safety Director position at the committee meeting of the Council

and was criticized by a councilman at that meeting for speaking my thoughts. What happened to freedom of speech in this country?

The fire fighters have been hanging the flags for the last 11 or 12 years. Along with all of their other volunteer activities which never make headlines, such as hundreds of hours of schooling to make

this a better Fire Department and at no expense to the City; Scout activities; first aid classes to the public; donations of money and manpower to the civic organizations; donations and help to burned out victims; money from their own pockets to help people to get back home because they lost their money on the tables; food baskets and toys at Christmas. For years fire

fighters took care of Christmas Corner, putting up and taking down the decorations without the aid of the heavy equipment used now, revamping Santa's house and seeing that he was on the corner every day for the kids; manpower (volunteered) on the ambulance at football games and rodeos; drivers for dignitaries and flag trucks at all parades; sponsoring girls in

the beauty contests and many more that would take up your whole paper to print them. These were all accomplished from firefighters pockets and hearts. Why hasn't any of these items ever been headlines in your paper as the flag hanging issue has???

Victory Village 76 Acres Sold For Development

Left Turn Lane Needed At Palo Verde And Boulder Hwy.

"It's a potential killer left land," declared Hoss Melton in describing the dangerous situation that now exists at Boulder Highway and Palo Verde.

Melton is attempting to get the State Highway Department to make a left hand turn lane at this location a top priority. Right now it is on the low priority list for the middle of 1978.

"There are either kids driving or kids riding," said Melton, "going to or coming from school. Around 7:15 a.m. cars are standing in the left lane, the passing lane, waiting to turn onto Palo Verde while northbound traffic from Boulder City is heavy as workers travel towards their jobs in Henderson or Las Vegas."

Melton became aware of the situation early last week when he had a close call at that location and nearly turned over.

Since then he has made a point of observing the cross over early in the morning and after school.

"One day there is really going to be an accident if something isn't done to correct the situation soon," he warned.

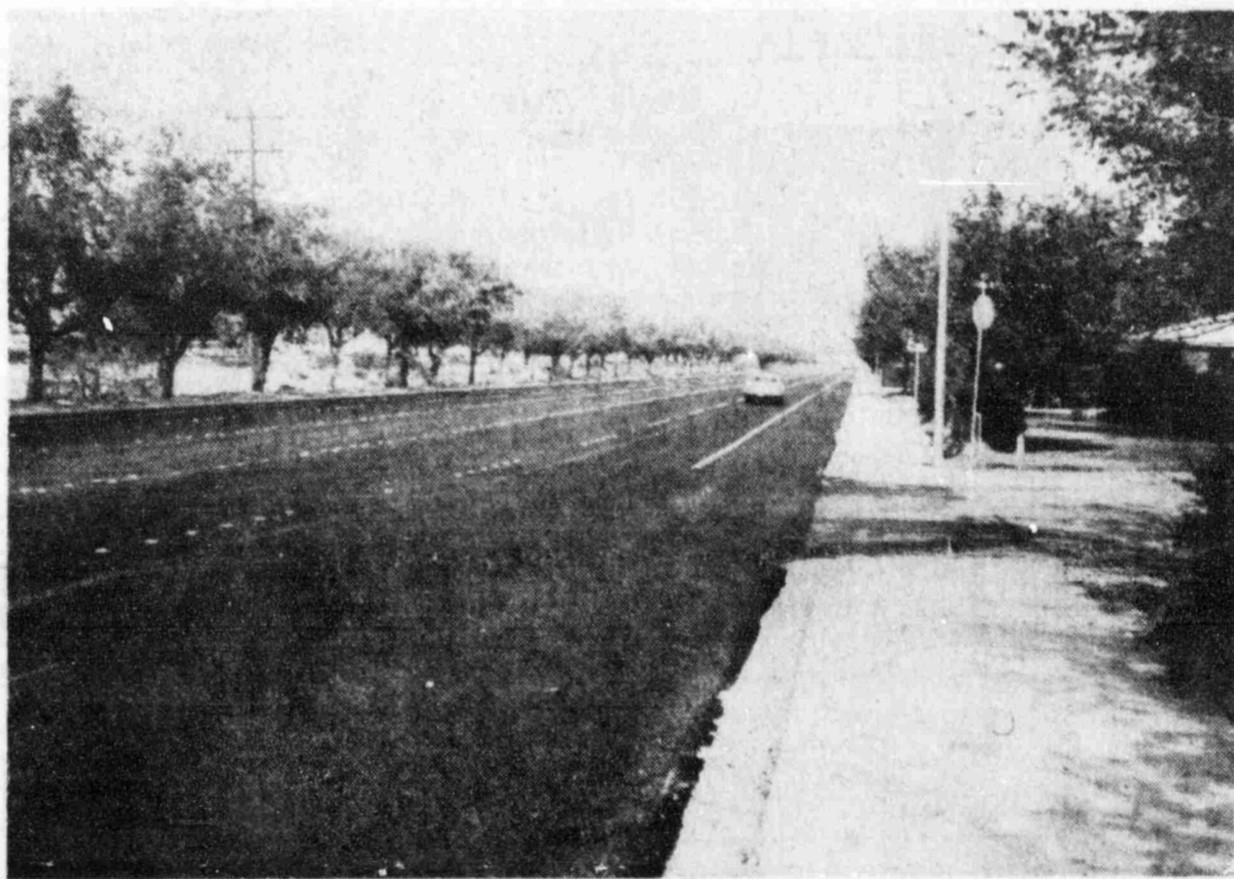
Don Richard To Be Honored

48 - Unit Motel Proposed For Downtown Henderson

The first step toward a new motel in downtown Henderson was taken at the planning commission meeting when approval was given for a zone change from residential to commercial for two lots on Victory Road.

The new motel, being proposed by Dr. Lorne Phillips, formerly of Henderson, would be located on Lake Mead Drive and Water Street where the Shell Station is now located and the adjacent property.

The plan for the motel was given approval in Sept. of 1976 by the planners, but was held

up on the council level when City Attorney Kent Dawson said that the council informed Dr. Phillips that if plans were submitted within 90 days his application would be honored. However, the plans were not submitted within that time.

The new plan includes a laundromat, a gas service area, a convenience store and a 48 unit - two - story motel. The site would have 69 parking spaces where the ordinance requires 63.

There were no protests at the public hearing of the city council meeting.

Sonic Burger Approved By Planning Commission

Sonic Burger Drive-in restaurant, to be located at 400 Boulder Highway, received approval of the architectural review committee of the city planning commission and the city council was expected to act on the request Monday night.

Sonic Burger is a chain, similar to MacDonald's.

The planning commission also approved a use permit for Hubert Morris, 803 Eduardo,

to raise game birds in the Mission Hills area.

G.H. Billingsley testified that he lives next door to where game birds are raised and he said "they are quite pleasant to have around."

Morris planned to build a block fence except for one side which is owned by the city and if it ever becomes available he would like to purchase some of the land.

Planners to Study 80 Acre Annexation

A request for annexation of approximately 80 acres of land in Section 32 by Richard Mac Donald of Tauri Investments, will be studied by the City Planning Commission at its regular meeting tomorrow night at 8 p.m.

The proposal for annexation was brought before the City Council and sent back to the planning commission for recommendation.

Monte Vista Subdivision, Units 2 and 3, will come before the commission for approval of tentative maps for subdivisions in the former Lake Adair property.

Other items to come before the planners will be:

- Architectural review for a sign for the Eldorado Casino to be located at Water Street and Lake Mead Drive on St. Rose de Lima property.

- Architectural review of a sign for Pizza Hut at 308 North Boulder Highway and Valley Bank at 107 Water Street.

- The City Council has requested a recommendation from the Planning Commission on the request for vacation of an alleyway in Block 10.

An old Henderson land mark, Victory Village, has been sold, according to Glen Taylor of Basic Management, Inc., owners of the land.

Victory Village housed close to 100 apartments in the early days of the city during the war years when the Henderson Industrial complex was Basic Manganese, Inc. Victory Village and Carver Park were built to house plant workers during World War II and were expected to be vacated in five years. After the war, however, Clark County Housing took over the management of the apartments for low cost rentals. They were razed within the last five years, giving them a life - time of over 20 years, many more than the life expectancy.

Approximately 18 acres has been sold to K - Mart in the area nearest Boulder Highway.

The second sale, which encompasses about 58 acres, is based on a change in zoning to allow various uses. If the zone change is made, the sale will be completed. At the present time, both sales are in escrow. Black Mountain Realty is handling the second sale.

A public hearing is scheduled for Wed. at 8 p.m. to request the zone change from the Planning Commission. Following planning commission action, the request will go to the city council for action.

Zone changes include a general commercial, and apartments and also travel trailers. The land is now zoned for multiple dwellings. At the present time, the only building in the area is the Lake Mead Furniture warehouse.

The price the property sold for was not disclosed.

I would like to see you

get 24 volunteers and the same 24 hang them for the next 10 years. And then tell me who is patriotic. I feel that the people who are using the word patriotic had better find out what the word means and the look at their lives and not the fire fighters. I've had my uniform on for Uncle Sam, how many of them have?

You have printed the feelings of the politicians and yourself and now I am asking the same courtesy, that you print my feelings on the front page as you have theirs.

Henderson Given Power

Henderson was declared the winner of a bout with Nevada Power Co. over who would receive the power from Hoover Dam which presently is delivered to California - Pacific Utilities in Henderson.

The decision reached by the Colorado River Advisory Commission Thursday is that all Hoover energy currently used by Cal - Pac for Henderson be assigned to Henderson and simultaneously reassigned to Nevada Power Co.

The decision is contingent on the transfer of electrical utility operations in Henderson from Cal - Pac to Nevada Power.

Included in the commission action is the

stipulation that Henderson may recapture its right to the power if it some - time in the future decides to establish "a complete municipal electric service operation."

At an October meeting, both Henderson and Nevada Power had asked the commission to assign the power.

Nevada Power spokesmen said although the company would be willing to relinquish rights to the power to Henderson if the city decided to set up a municipal utility, the company did not want the rights assigned to Henderson and reassigned to Nevada Power.

The reasoning given by company officials was

this would put Henderson on a status different than the rest of the entities served by the company.

At Thursday's meeting, Jack Lehman, chairman of the commission, said he was "naturally suspicious" about Nevada Power's reasons. He said he feared the company would be willing to give the power rights back to Henderson, but with stipulations.

The commission action to give the Cal - Pac rights to Henderson will not affect the current contractual arrangements of the Basic Management Project, according to Don Paff of the Division of Colorado River Resources.

St. Andrews Outlines Land Plans

Boulder City

After listening to an explanation of future plans for St. Andrew's Church regarding their attempt to purchase slightly over 11 acres of city land, the Council Planning and Land Sales Committee this week agreed to support their request.

The church is seeking to acquire three of the 11 acres for one dollar with the option of purchasing the remaining eight acres at a mutually agreed price.

Father Baldus, Rector of St. Andrew's, told the council committee of the plans for the property. "There's been talk of our owning two parcels of land," he began. "We don't want two parcels. Our plans are to move out parish activities to the new site as soon as possible. We will then dispose of our present location."

"Some of our plans are pie in the sky right now," he continued. "I can say that our Bishop supports the project and wants it." Father Baldus spoke of constructing a new

church, rectory, school, convent and a retreat house. A future retirement home was also mentioned.

The initial appraisal report for the 11 acres quoted a selling price of \$8,500 per acre. In addition, the off-site improvements will cost St. Andrew's another \$60,000.

A long discussion on the possibility of obtaining a second appraisal followed. If desired, the church would have to foot the bill. Although several appraisers were invited to submit costs, only one has responded ... to the tune of \$400.

Father Baldus told the committee he would have an answer for the council at their next meeting next Tuesday.

Councilman Robert Ferraro then made a motion to recommend to the full council that St. Andrew's be given three acres for one dollar, and sold the remaining eight for an appraisal price agreed on by both the council and the church.

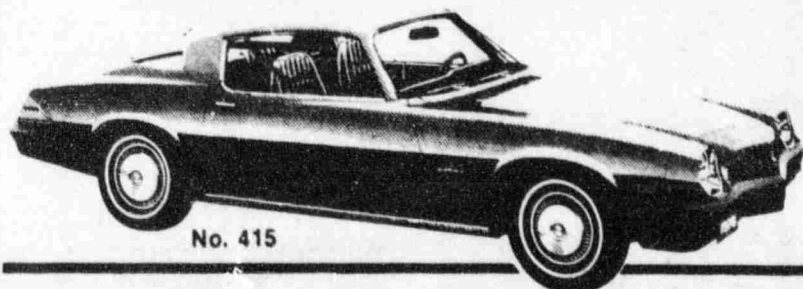

The Panama Canal Is An American Affair Part 17 By Maryellen Vallier Sadovich

From the United States a great cry of distress sounded from hundreds of editorial pages, as Frenchmen went forward with their canal project, in violation of the Monroe Doctrine.

dered secret surveys of the naval sites and coal-ing stations along the Gulf of Dulce, and the American press was over-loaded with stories of North American naval vessels moving in Caribbean waters to

investigate French influence. On March 8, 1880, Hayes sent a message to Congress. "The policy of this country is a canal under American control. The United States cannot consent to the surrender of this

control to any European power or to any combination of European powers..." he said. The secretary of State reinforced this presidential declaration by delivering a protest to Colombia on April 19, 1880 for granting the canal right to France. He declared that the interests of the United States could not condone the granting of rights to canal projects to "imperialist interests."

Many U.S. journalists voiced their disapproval. There were sarcastic editorials about the folly, inefficiency, and poor promise of the Panama project. But just in case it should by some mischance succeed, most of the editors urged the U.S. balance such French achievement

and its influence by construction of its own Nicaraguan canal. The Maritime Canal Company of Nicaragua was incorporated as a result, with Ulysses S. Grant and James Roosevelt, father of Franklin D. Roosevelt, as members of the corporation. On May 22, 1880, they obtained a ninety-nine year concession from the Nicaraguan Congress for a canal.

But someone remembered the old Clayton-Bulwer Treaty with England, which required British permission for the U.S. to build a canal. While negotiations went forward to break the British-U.S. treaty, the Maritime Canal Company began construction of a canal through

Nicaragua in June, 1890. For two years the company worked, then the necessity for new financing brought the builders back to the U.S. But the panic of 1893 was already underway cutting off further credit advances and the company was sent into bankruptcy.

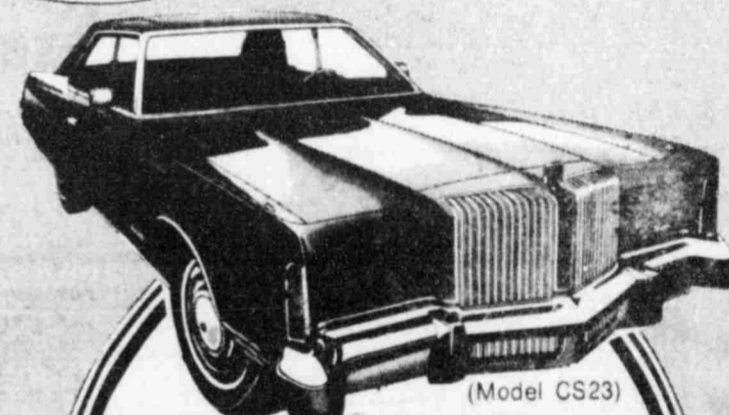



Steam Tractor Model Built By Local Hobbyist

Hobbyists in mechanics will be fascinated by a project recently completed by Dave Odell, betterment engineer, who has put together a model of a 1902 Burrell steam tractor complete with red and green paint and lots of polished brass and copper.

The scaled down (1/4 size) model of the original is a fully working, coal-fired replica. In operation, it has pulled a cart containing three adults and two children.

The engine parts were manufactured in England, and it has taken Dave three years to assemble them and to do the repair and refinishing, resulting from damage in transit. With 16 one-half inch fire tubes in the boiler, the plant works at 100 pounds pressure per square inch. The cylinder is a two-inch bore with a two and one-half inch stroke, and the engine weighs 325 pounds altogether.
