

It's Not Funny To Spoof Henderson -- McIlvaine Learns

"Happy Birthday Henderson" - a satire of the recent ABC television show "Happy Birthday Las Vegas" will not be aired November 19 as scheduled.

Nor was it ever filmed as scheduled thanks to an alert, local woman who heard that the spoof was in the offing.

The idea for the show was the brainchild of KSHO TV 13

news anchorman Red McIlvaine who claims "it was all meant in good fun."

However, after a rundown of the script with McIlvaine, our heroine, who asked that her name be withheld, failed to see the humor of satirizing our city with such shots as the Lucky Club representing our downtown casino area.

"I lived in California and was accustomed to the beauti-

ful downtown Burbank jokes but when I realized McIlvaine intended to do serious interviews with the Mayor and other local dignitaries and then superimpose goodness knows what in the background, I had to let the city know," she explained.

Gary Johnson, executive director of the Chamber of Commerce, was one of those informed of the proposed

show and he, along with other civic leaders, was able to force a halt to the filming.

"Why Henderson?" Johnson asked of McIlvaine. "Why not Boulder City? Why not Searchlight? Why not Jean?"

"Because they are not as funny as Henderson," was the reply.

"In every large city there is always a Henderson outside," McIlvaine told him.

"We're tired of being the ha ha community," said Johnson.

"We're not interested in being funny. We're a straight community, with homes, schools, churches. Henderson has been the butt of too many jokes for too long."

McIlvaine claims he has always had a soft spot in his heart for Henderson and he meant no harm.

"We were planning to

satirize another television show, not Henderson," he explained.

"Henderson has gone long enough without the recognition it deserves."

The anchorman expressed shock by the reaction of Henderson's civic leaders.

Good news to learn our ex-sports and news reporter and home-towner Mark Prime is no a key news reporter for the Ely Daily Times.

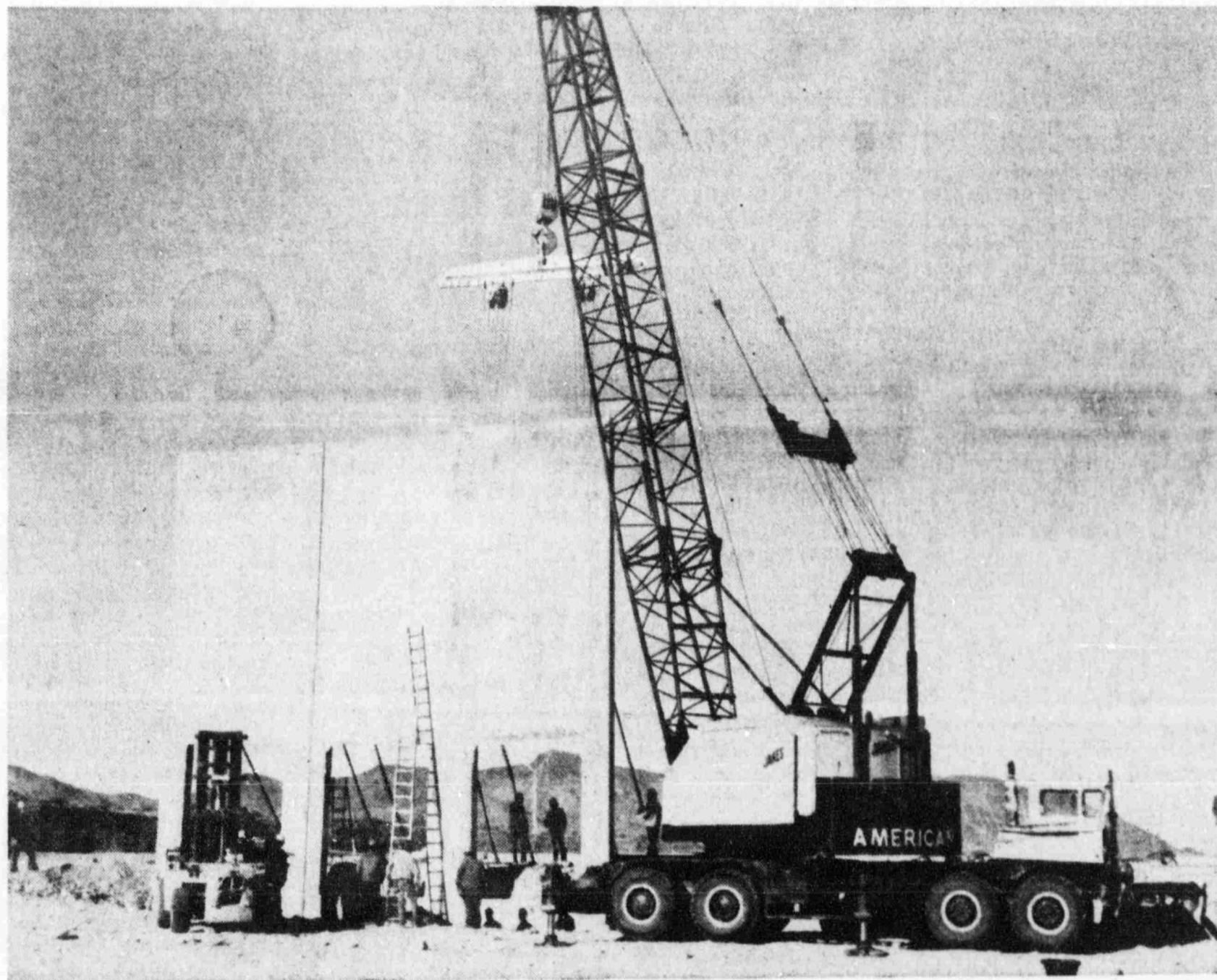

RACE TRACK WILL NOT DIE

Speaking of the Las Vegas Downs race track in Henderson at the City Council meeting Monday night, David Funk of Phoenix, said they plan to see the project through and agreed to set a committee meeting with the city council to discuss the future of the race track.

Funk, who is associated with racing in Arizona, said they had obtained financing for the project several times but because of delays the financing had been withdrawn, leaving them without funds to carry on the project.

"We have a quarter million dollars invested in the project," Funk said, "and we want to see it go."

Funk said he is not associated with the Las Vegas Downs group. He said he has meetings this week with prospective investors but did not

have the answers for the city council Monday night.

The council was attempting to find where the project was. The Las Vegas Downs group had purchased acreage from the city and is delinquent in making payments on both principal and penalties.

In other actions the council--

—Approved a private investigator license for Phillips Adjusters, owned by Elton H. Phillips of 1401 Athol Street.

—Postponed action on a tavern license for the Lucky Bar at 124 Market Street for owners Liebert and Thurmond.

—Approved authorization to call for bids for five to seven police vehicles.

—Authorized the hiring of an auditor to audit the EDA grant.

—Approved a resolution of

intent to annex approximately 80 acres of land in section 32 for Tauri Investment Corp.

—Sent to committee a bill to annex ten acres in section 31 for MacDonald; Ordinance providing for the licensing and regulation of child care facilities; and ordinance to amend the water rate schedule; a land request by Stull and Morris.

—Approved an energy report made by city officials.

—Approved an ordinance reclassifying property in section 8 from R-R to R-1.

—Approved an ordinance to reclassify land for Old West to commercial.

—Postponed action on the planned unit development for Nevada Ventures (Lake Adair) until the next meeting of the city council.

Governor Back at Basic For a Day

Governor Mike O'Callaghan will be at his old home base on Tues., November 15 when he will address members of the Basic High School student council and the student council class.

Lorri Smith, student body president, said Governor O'Callaghan had agreed to address the class she was instrumental in starting to teach students to serve on the student council. The class is at 7 a.m.

Governor O'Callaghan was a history teacher at Basic high school before becoming governor. When he was in Henderson, however, the high school was in the buildings now occupied by Burkholder junior high.

A \$2.7 million shopping center which will contain a major supermarket and drug chain will get under construction on approximately five acres of land on Boulder Highway next to Stepmen Dodge, beginning April 30 or May 1 of next year.

Gary Machan, president of G.M. Associates, based in Salt Lake City, Utah, said the project will consist of three free-standing buildings on 500 feet of frontage on Boulder Highway and five acres. He would not confirm the name of the supermarket involved, explaining that the markets liked to make those announcements themselves.

He did confirm that there would be a savings and loan or bank institution and a Sambas restaurant. There will also be another fast food drive-in and several small shops.

Financing the project will be Bonnevillie Mortgage Co. of Salt Lake City.

The G and M official said the project is expected to be completed by May or June of 1979. He said the property is already properly zoned.

Murals Project Chamber Subject

Community Murals Project, a cooperative effort between the City of Henderson, City of Las Vegas, Clark County and the Clark County School District, will be the topic discussed at a meeting of the Chamber of Commerce today at noon at the Eldorado Club. Karen Morris, who is with the Clark County School District as an art resources teacher in the Department of Instructional services, will speak on the project and will show some slides concerning the murals program.

'Tis the hunting season again and many Henderson residents have come back with deer and are thinking of ways to use it. We've found one of the most fun and best ways to use roasts, etc., is to make jerky.

For those who want to try it, I'm going to print the recipe again because it is delicious.

The same recipe can be used on other cuts of meat and usually the cheaper ones are as good as the more expensive. For example, round steak makes delicious jerky.

Now if you are considering that venison is cheap, forget that theory. I figure it costs about \$2.50 per pound or more. But here's the recipe.

Jerky

1. Freeze meat until firm.
2. Slice to desired thickness.
3. Lay slices on waxed paper.
4. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Brush each piece with liquid smoke.
5. Turn pieces and repeat item No. 4.
6. Place meat in a large bowl.
7. Place plate and a weight of some kind on meat. (We eliminate this step.)
8. Let stand for some time.
9. Remove from bowl and place on racks, place so that strips of meat touch but do not overlap. Place in cold oven.
10. Set oven temperature at 150 degrees and cook to degree of crispness desired.

That's called eating the evidence.

As City Manager I hope that no one sees this as an unpatriotic act on the part of the firefighters, for it is purely a result of personal feelings. The members of the local Fire Department do provide a most valuable service in behalf of the safety of this community, and to that end they are dedicated.

City to Apply For Funds For Street, Water, Improvements

Approval to apply for an approximate \$30,000 grant from the Farm Home Administration to pave access from Boulder Highway to the Horizon Industrial Park, was granted by the city council Monday night.

The request would be for a ten inch water line crossing Boulder Highway and necessary drainage structures. As other funds become available, the project could be expanded to provide the peripheral streets and water line loops.

Irene Porter, planner for American-Nevada Corp., asked the council to consider a considerable grant request for the Green Valley Industrial park where Buster Brown Company has announced it will locate.

City Manager Bob

Campbell said he could not - in good conscience - put his signature over two applications. However, he said, American Nevada could make its own applications which would be considered along with others. Only between \$30,000 and \$50,000 will be awarded in Nevada.

Councilwoman Lorna Kesterson questioned whether one application would be considered over the other because the city had endorsed one and not the other. Campbell said he did not think so. Kesterson asked if the installation to the New Horizon park would be on city property and was told it would.

The council agreed it would consider the American Nevada application should it need the city's endorsement.

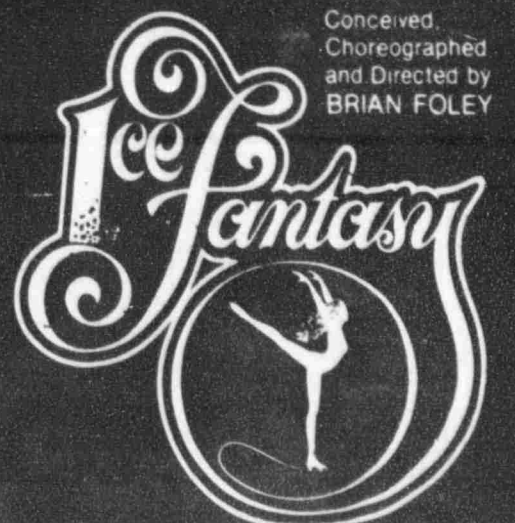
Over the years it has

Karen Ruth, "I like playing with my friends."

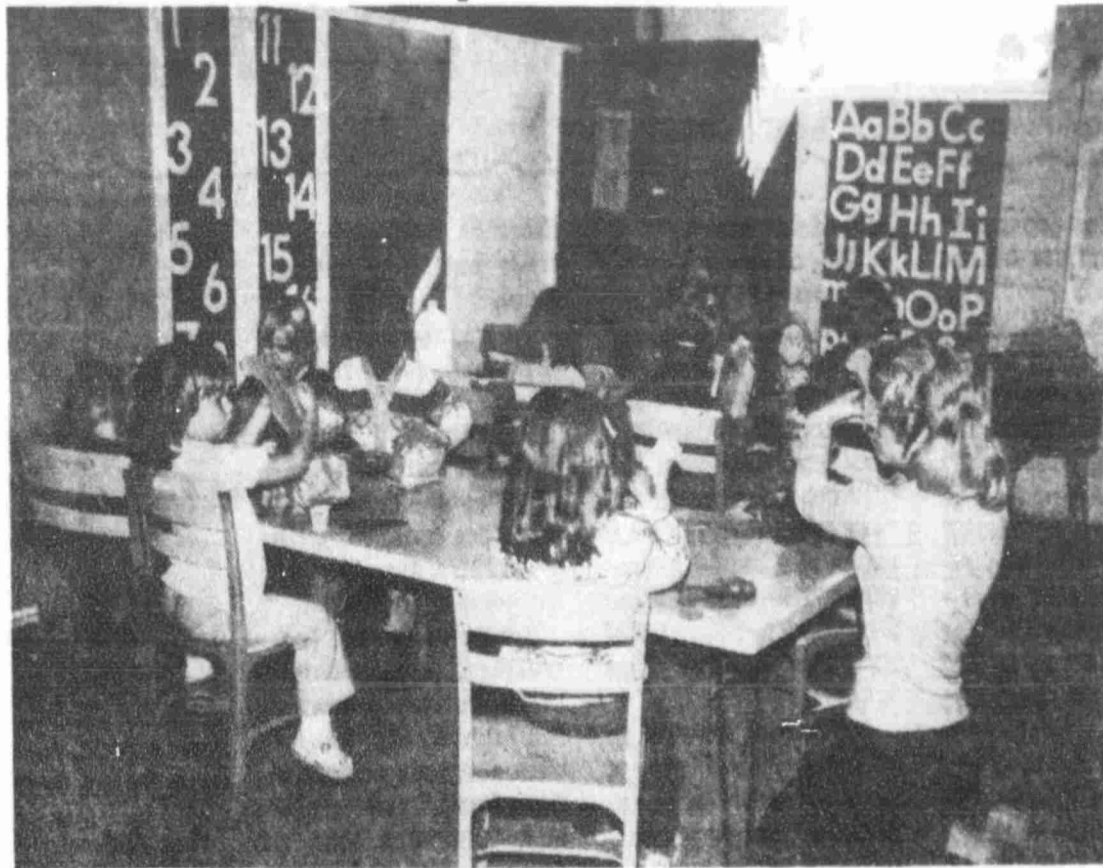
Michelle Copp, "I just like staying here."

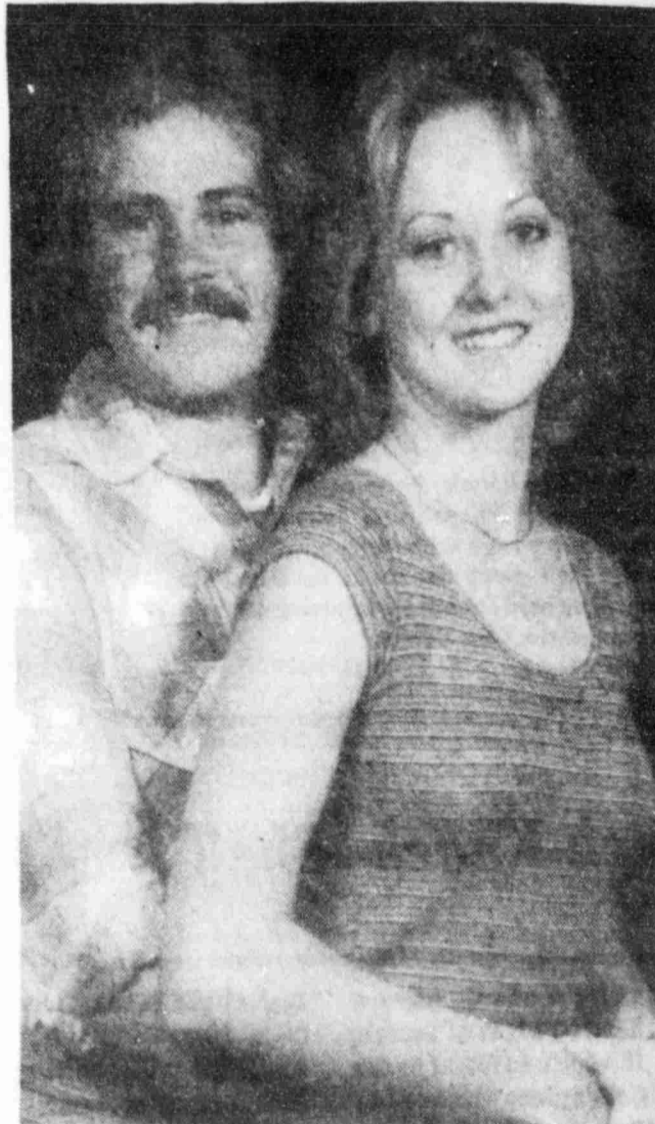
Debra Koye Mecham will become the bride of James Gordon Miller of Henderson November 18 in LDS rites at the St. George Temple.

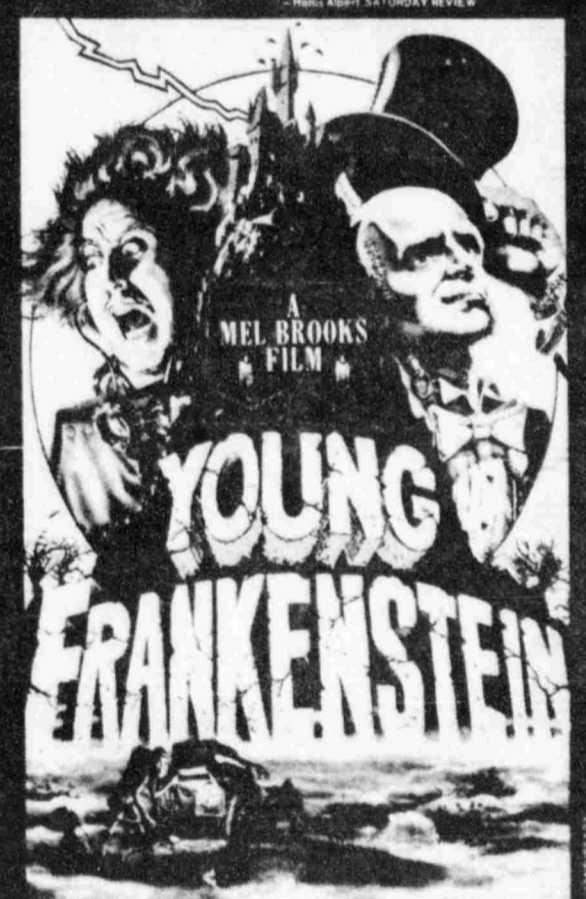

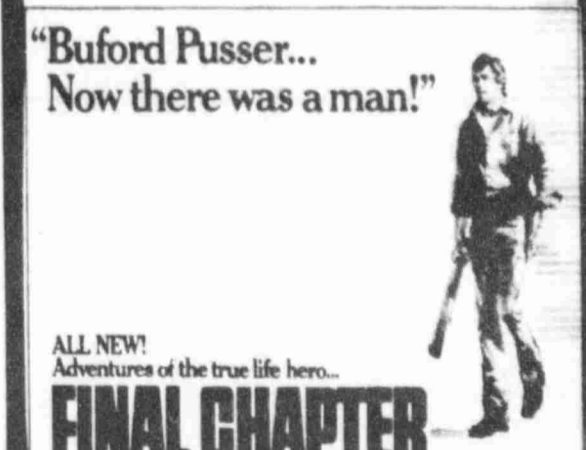

"He had a teenaged son who loved to do imitations of his dad and he was forever calling me out into the hallway to show me a new imitation

he had devised."

"The early days of the business were much different than it is today," Mrs. Bender explained.

"When a new show was preparing to open at a hotel, people from the other hotels would go over several days in advance and help them get ready. There was a great closeness between all of us which doesn't exist today.

Sometimes I would go hours without sleep, preparing for an opening, and thought nothing of it. We had to make all the costumes and gowns for the stars and show girls. Now they bring their own wardrobes with them."

From the El Rancho Mrs. Bender worked for a short time at the Last Frontier, where she was employed when Liberace made his Las Vegas debut.

"He had the most exotic clothes and it was almost a full time job just keeping all the sequins in place."

In 1948 she joined the Thunderbird upon its opening and remained

there as wardrobe mistress until her retirement.

"It was the only hotel that had good family shows," she said.

Barbara Walters, ABC's \$1 million a year news co-anchorwoman, was once a dancer with whom Mrs. Bender was well acquainted.

Barbara's father, Lou Walters, put on some large extravaganzas - "immense big shows with gorgeous costumes from Paris," she recalls and "Barbara was a dancer, but not very good."

"Mrs. Walters had died and Barbara had a much younger sister who traveled with the family. I would take care of her during the shows - send to the kitchen for a hamburger and coke and then she would nap on the cot in my room."

And there were many others who befriended Mrs. Bender - show girls who were never big names, but nice girls.

"I remember one - Thelma King, a contortionist. I don't think she had a bone in her body!"

One day, while walking down the same flight of iron steps she had trudged up and down many times a day for 22 years, she said to herself, "I'm not going to walk those steps one more time."

She gave her notice that day and officially retired following the opening of the hotel's next new show.

That was 1969 and Mrs. Bender was in her early 70's.

She and her family moved to Henderson in 1941 from Cleveland, Ohio.

Her husband was one asked by the government to come lay out the plant.

It was a difficult decision for the couple to make - to leave a large, comfortable home and good position for an undeveloped area in the middle of the desert.

They had been married in 1912, twenty-nine years, and it meant starting over again. "But Dad wanted to so we came."

Their daughter, Kay, was the first nurse at the BMI hospital which had just been completed.

Unfortunately, the plant eventually took

Mr. Bender's life through an accidental dose of gas.

Kay married "Butch" Leyppoldt, Clark County Sheriff for many years, and they reside in Las Vegas.

Another daughter, Betty Phiris, works at the local Bank of Nevada branch and a son lives in South Bend, Indiana.

One of the nicest tributes to Marceline Bender was made by June Havoc, sister of Gypsy Rose Lee and performer in her own right, when Miss Havoc dedicated her book to Mrs. Bender, a tribute to mothers.

"Do you need a seamstress?" she asked Bel-don Kattleman, owner of the El Rancho.

"Why don't you go ask," was his reply.

Upon arriving backstage she encountered Ava Gardner and Virginia Mayo, both appearing rather distressed.

Miss Gardner was sewing sequins on a gown while Miss Mayo, very tartly commented, "I don't know one end of a needle from the other and I have no intention of learning."

Obviously the El Rancho was in dire need of a seamstress and thus began a career that was to span 27 years for Marceline Bender, both as a seamstress and wardrobe mistress in several of our famous strip hotels.

That incident occurred in May of 1942.

After coming back out

front, three servicemen approached her and asked if she thought Ava Gardner would dance with them.

Once again she went back stage and told the lovely performer of their request.

Mickey Rooney, to whom Gardner was then married, gave his immediate approval and three young men enjoyed an evening about which they might still be telling their friends and grandchildren.

During those 27 years back stage, Mrs. Bender has worked with numerous stars such as Judy Garland, Edie Adams, Liberace, Morton Downey, Hildegard, Barbara Walters, opera singer James Melton and many, many more; and she has numerous stories she can recount about them.

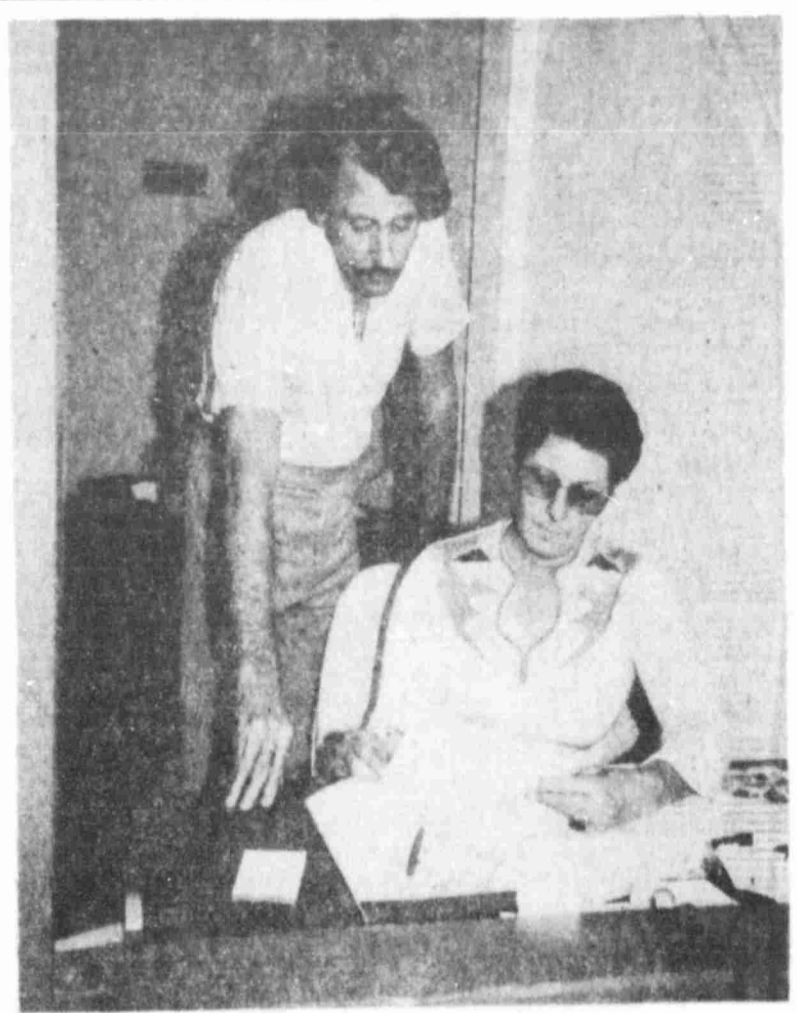

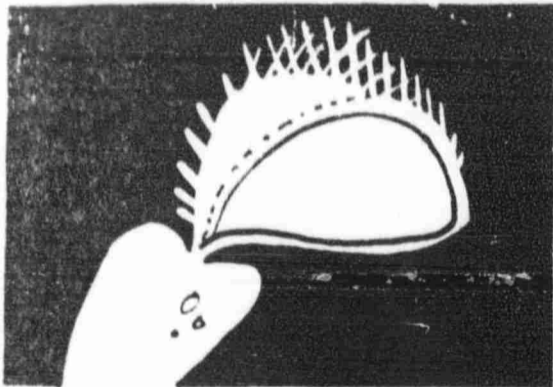
Venus's Flytrap

The Venus's flytrap is one of nature's bizarre creations. Its carnivorous feeding habits are almost frightening; consequently this active little plant lends itself well to the science fiction imagination.

Dedicated to Diana, the goddess of love, the Venus's flytrap bears the scientific name 'Dionaea muscipula' and is a member of the 'Drosera' family. Dros-

er-like bristles inside the leaf trigger the closing of the two lobes, dooming the insect as the plant's digestive juices dissolve the prey. Unsuitable prey -- beetles or inanimate objects are rejected by the plant.

The flytrap is native to the moist sandy area of the Carolinas. In captivity, it grows best in a terrarium or miniature

era means "sundew"; when the Carolina sun shines on the flytrap, its secretory juices glisten like morning dewdrops.

The Venus's flytrap creeps along the ground, growing in a rosette formation. Its hinged, double lobed leaves are margined with spikes which interlock when the leaf closes upon its prey. The flytrap feeds on spiders, ants and flies, attracting the little suckers with its irresistible scent. Once the prey has lighted on a leaf, its legs are secured by the flytrap's sticky secretions. Small tenta-

greenhouse and survives well on twice - weekly feedings of small bits of hamburger.

The nutritive demands of the flytrap are somewhat of an enigma, as discovered by a North Carolina doctor who conducted the following experiment. When fed a diet of beef, the flytrap thrived, blooming and producing new leaves. When fed a high - protein cheese diet, the plant died. It's reassuring to know that Venus's flytrap seldom grows more than five to six inches in diameter.

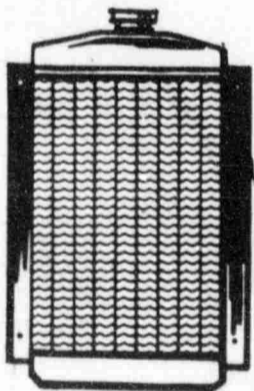

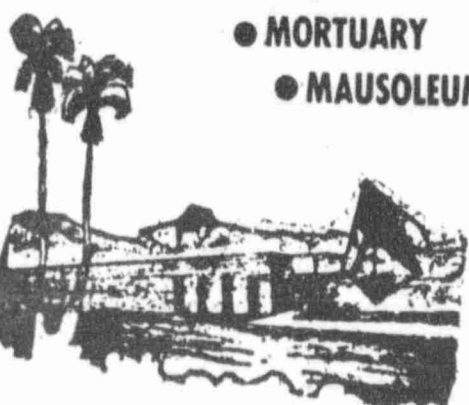

Topics for Taxpayers

Late last month President Carter announced that he would delay announcement of his plan for federal tax reform until after the first of the year. Some of the details of his proposal had been "leaked" as trial balloons. Those details gave cause for real apprehension in the Congress and in the financial markets. The prices of common stocks fell to new lows.

From what is known about the president's plan, it appears that the goals he has been considering are mutually exclusive. In announcing the delay he stated those goals as (1) improved equity, which means more progressivity and an end to many of the unnecessary tax incentives and loopholes; (2) to create investment capital; and (3) to greatly simplify the entire tax structure.

It is a certainty that more progressivity would dry up investment capital. One just can't have one without the other. In fact the present apprehension in the capital markets has resulted from concern about the discount of capital for losses caused by increased payments to the tax collectors.

The last thing this economy needs is more progressivity in the tax system. For the last 13 years, Americans have been thrust into ever higher progressive tax brackets by inflation alone. With the new social security tax rates tacked to personal tax rates, the \$20,000 worker will soon be in the 51 per cent bracket, not even counting state and local tax rates. And those state and local tax rates need to be included. Capital assets (homes, factories, business buildings and machinery) have been re-valued upward by the tax assessor until property taxes have increased by 100 per cent in less than ten years.

Indeed, loopholes crept into the tax laws to offset the destructive progressivity of personal income taxes. They are wasteful. They are inefficient. But if they were suddenly removed, so many incentives would be withdrawn from the economy that Mr. Carter's plan to "create investment capital" by tinkering with business rates and credits would go down the drain.

It would be much more reasonable for employees to take income in cash rather than in "sheltered" fringe benefits. Income taken in cash (and not subject to horrendously progressive tax rates) would be available for investment in solid, wealth producing projects that will be taxed; rather than spent for sheltered goods that the buyer doesn't really want.

Mr. Carter still hasn't thought the problem through; but given another three months of study he may get the message.

Handicapped Seminar Set

Proceeds of the banquet will benefit the City of Hope Children's Hospital.





Nevada Department Of Fish And Game

TRAPPING SEASON OPENS

According to an announcement by Nevada Department of Fish and Game the statewide trapping season opened Saturday with a record number of trappers expected, because of the exceptionally high prices paid last year for nearly all commonly taken species.

The season on beaver, otter, muskrat and mink is open to residents and non-residents and will continue through April 9, 1978 in most counties. The taking of otter is prohibited in Pershing County. The bobcat, gray and kit fox season is open statewide to residents only and is scheduled to close on Feb. 19, 1978.

The reported harvest of six of Nevada's furbearing animals and the average price paid for each rose last year according to NDFG's furbearer harvest survey questionnaire. Average pelt prices were: beaver \$13.70; otter \$44.10; muskrat \$4.70; mink \$10.92; bobcat \$155.66; and gray fox \$25.65.

State furbearer trapping regulations are listed and fully explained in the 1977 Up-land Game Bird, Rabbit and Furbearing Animal Seasons brochures printed and distributed by NDFG. Copies are available at all Department offices and license agents throughout the state.

Trappers are required to strictly abide by trapping laws and regulations and are strongly urged by NDFG to obtain a copy and acquire a complete understanding before setting out their traplines.

Although Nevada's furbearers may be taken with either trap or gun, those doing so must obtain and have in their possession a valid Nevada 'trapping' license. State 'hunting' licenses are neither required nor legal for the taking of designated furbearers. The taking of marten and red fox will be closed this year.

1978 Fishing Regulations Set

The Nevada State Board of Fish and Game Commissioners met recently in Reno and established the fishing seasons and regulations

for the 1978 calendar year.

Glen Griffith, Department of Fish and Game Director, noted that, "Although most fishing seasons and regulations set by the Commission are similar to last year's, there are a number of significant exceptions that the state's sportsmen should be aware of."

Griffith explained, "One of the most important changes is the reduction of daily and possession limits for trout on the reservoirs of Elko County. Beginning on January 1, 1978, daily and possession limits will be five trout, which is only one-half of the 10 fish limit currently in effect."

Other changes in fishing seasons and regulations effected by the Commission include a change in the trout limit from three to five fish with no minimum size restriction on Walker Lake in Mineral County and a removal of the 12-inch minimum size limit on black bass in the Lahontan Valley.

According to George

Reed, Chairman of the Clark County Game Management Board, "The Commission was unable to consider Clark County's request for a reduction in Lake Mead's bass and trout limits and an increase in the striper limits because of Arizona's recent refusal to go along with Nevada's suggestions. A committee has been appointed by the Commission, however, to follow up on this matter

Cannon Says "Old Crows" Winging Way To Las Vegas

One of the nation's foremost defense engineering groups will bring some 3,000 delegates to its annual convention in Las Vegas next Oct. 1 - 5, Nevada Sen. Howard W. Cannon has announced.

Cannon, who addressed members of the organization here last week, was advised of the decision by directors of the Association of Old Crows, a worldwide group of specialists in electronic warfare.

The Nevada senator said the group is heavily involved in many of the secret electronic counter - measures conducted at the gunnery ranges of Nellis Air Base.

"The Crows are one of those groups you don't hear much about, but their work is essential to national security and defense," Cannon said.

The organization works on highly sophisticated radar sensing and jamming equipment and other electronic gadgetry used by U.S. air defense units.

"Any pilot who has used one of their devices to tell him when enemy radar has picked up his plane or to jam an enemy SAM missile can vouch for the value of electronic counter measures," Cannon said. "They are the unsung heroes."

"Furthermore, the attempt to deny and ignore the rights of the three states, Idaho, Nebraska, and Tennessee, which have already rescinded their original ratifications of E.R.A. is hypocritical, arbitrary and totally unfair," concluded Janine Hansen.

Subdivision 11 Was a Bad Scene

"It was a baaaaaaad scene," says the first resident of Boulder City's Subdivision 11 in referring to the tornado-type wind that swept through the City last summer.

A bad scene indeed! The battering breeze tore the roof off the home of Robert Kenneston and dumped it squarely in the front yard of our subject's habitat. If that wasn't calamity enough, there were two young kids to protect from the hurtling debris. On top of it all, a neighboring beehive was tipped over in the process and an angry swarm of bees swarmed over the area looking for the culprit that destroyed their hive.

It was not one of the better days of life in the new development, but the subject of our interview took it all in her stride. After all, she's lived there since 1973...long before the modern roads and utilities were pushed in to pave the way for later arrivals.

If you haven't already seen the drift, the very first resident of Subdivision was not a human being but was...and is...a somewhat Toggenburg goat named Daisy. She has lived in Robert Kenneston's small barn and corral situated on San Felipe Drive at the subdivision's entrance since the quarters were first erected in 1973.

But even she takes second place to the fencing and fruit trees that are situated just downhill on Kenneston's property. The very first permit ever issued in the subdivision was for that fencing.

Whatever! Daisy has seen the seasons come and go. Oblivious to such trivia as assessment districts, rising costs, etc., she has lived a mostly quiet and sedate life in her hillside home raising kids...and kids...and more kids.

When Kenneston began construction of his house in June of 1976, Daisy was given the opportunity to watch progress from the ground up. When the debris had settled from the awful afternoon of June 9, she was temporarily taken to Crawford's corral along with her two kids, Robert (Redford) and Dustin (Hoffman). After a temporary fencing was erected around her home, she and the kids were brought back and life returned to...almost normal.

Other Does have shared the quarters for a spell...Henrietta (a goat with no brains at all) and Shasta, who was given away. Robert and Dustin are destined for a future Sunday dinner unless someone steps forward to ask for them. It's a topic Daisy doesn't prefer to talk about.

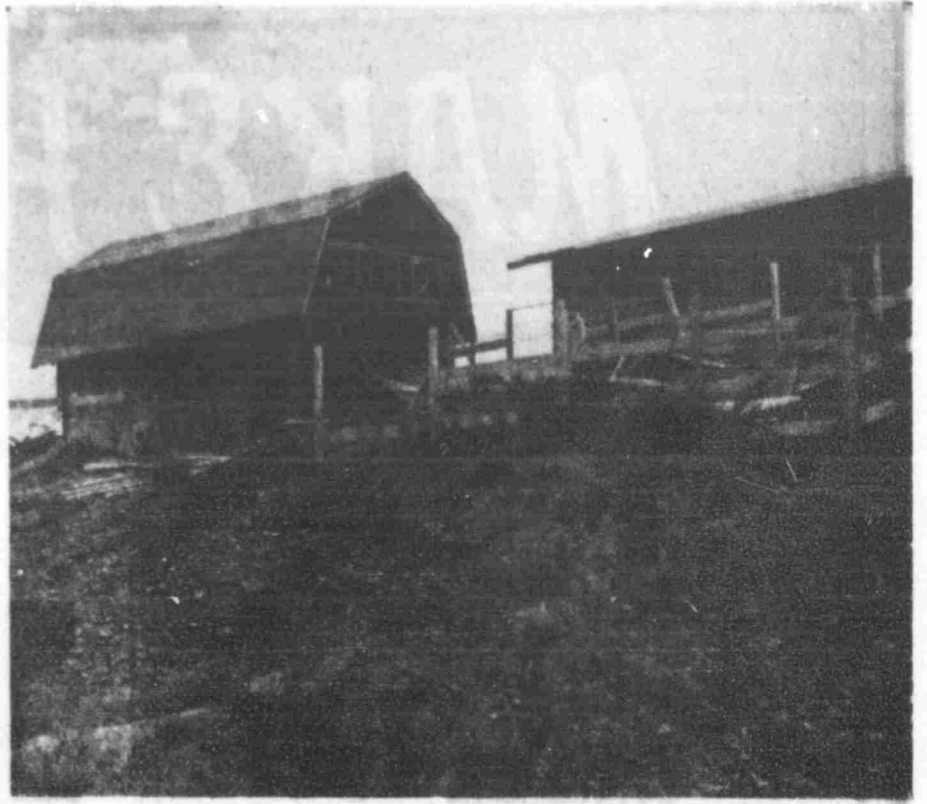
Although Kenneston's home was the first residence to be started in Subdivision 11, the unexpected loss of the roof created a setback in the construction timetable. Kenneston is doing his own work whenever he can find time. His job as Traffic Control Supervisor for Las Vegas keeps him occupied during the week.

Meanwhile, other homes in the development have appeared and are now completed and occupied by their owners.

One of Subdivisions 11's first occupants is Tom Hine, an attorney with the U.S. Department of Interior. Tom and his wife Irene and their children, Cassandra and Stephen, are fully enjoying their five level home that they've been in for about two months. Designed by noted architect Barry Greene, A.I.A., the interior features sloping ceilings and "non-square" rooms. The generous window areas offer a most spectacular view of Boulder City, the golf course and the Red Mountain range.

Tom is doing the finishing touches himself...and the Hine family is wholeheartedly in love with their new residence.

So much for Subdivision 11. The long period of waiting is at long last finished. The months ahead will see more and more construction as additional families realize their dreams of living in the rolling hills in the southeast corner of Boulder City. Next week, we'll move down the road a few blocks and discuss the development on Adams Blvd. known as La Dolce Vita.

So. Nevada Fishing and Hunting Report

Largemouth bass fishing is good in all areas of Lake Mead, according to a variety of reports, with smaller fish frequenting the shallow waters and lunkers hitting well in the depths. Nighteraw-

lers and waterdogs are taking the majority of fish with amateur anglers faring as well as the more experienced. Leadhead jigs and plastic worms are also catching fish but right now are

best left to the man who knows his lake and the current mood of the fish. Channel catfish are making up a good part of the catch at Callville Bay and in the Overton Arm with shrimp and night-crawlers and occasionally waterdogs taking fair sized fish. Biggest cat caught recently was a 14 pound plus specimen from the mouth of the Virgin River.

The second annual Lake Mead Striped Bass Derby got underway Tuesday and from all reports, not a day too soon. Stripers are coming in to the catch from all over the lake but Las Vegas Wash, the upper end of Overton Arm and the Haystacks near Temple Bar are being singled out as the best producers this past week. Large lures trolled anywhere from the surface to 40 feet deep are credited with the highest catch rate although jigging spoons and even waterdogs are taking a few fish too. Most recent stripers have been below 20 pounds in weight. Anglers can register for the seven month Lake Mead Striped Bass Derby at Bob Glassburn's Bait and Tackle Shop in Henderson.

From Harold Harper of Searchlight Storage and Bait are reports of increased action for both bass and trout. Small bass are hitting in

the brushy shallows early and late in the day with lunkers at 35 to 45 feet hitting nightcrawlers and waterdogs in the rocky point and ledge areas. Bass up to four and one-half pounds are coming into the catch on a fairly regular basis. Harper rates trout fishing as improved with good catches of fish to five pounds trolling need-fish or flatfish lures at 70 to 90 feet in the canyon area downlake and in the Nelson's Landing area.

The Nelson's area is also producing trout for shore anglers dunking cheese, nightcrawler or salmon egg baits. Go-getter lures and minnows have accounted for a fair number of crappies in the one pound class with cats reportedly continuing to hit stink baits in the Sandy Coves in and around Cottonwood.

Willow Beach's fishing success dipped slightly this past weekend along with a slight decline in fishing pressure. DFG's creel census checks on Sunday recorded 70 fishermen, 44 of whom caught three bass, seven catfish and 107 trout. Most of the rainbows were pan-sized and caught with cheese baits drifting in the nine to 11 mile areas. Shore fishing in the resort area was slow.

Everett J. Pollard of the Cooperative Extension Service states that the foods you prepare on this day are probably not unusual, but they are different enough to warrant the curiosity of your child. Let him help

you shop for the turkey, clean it, and break up the bread for the stuffing. With a little thought and pre-planning, you can make Thanksgiving a time for your whole family to cherish and enjoy.
