Surely you all of Boulder City and of Henderson remember that little, pert, bespectacled woman with the kindly face, the pleasant smile -- the little swoosh in her words as she explained or discussed or served.

Virginia during a 15 year part of the 30 year history of this newspaper was as vital to its weekly service to you as any other two or let's call it three people on the staff.

She was a part of the newspaper that took care of the front counter, the telephone, the countless newsboys, the purchasing for the presses, the linotype machines. She handled the payroll, then went out to collect accounts so we could make the checks good at the bank.

If there was ever a left hand to the publisher it was Virginia. The right hand position has always been held by Lorna, as I hope will continue to be forevermore.

Virginia Campbell had great loves in her life -- her husband George and her son Kurt, and her grandson -- Bobby. For them she was the typical mother, wife, grandmother ... always there to serve, always there to advise, always there to iron out the problems -- always there to be a part of the fun that always pervaded the air of the household.

Virginia lived for the wonderful days George brought her. He always being an out-going fellow, it was natural that he was popular and always called upon to serve the public in some capacity. In both Boulder and Henderson you'd always catch Virginia -- or "Hootie!" as George nicknamed her, always sitting at George's table as he headed the Chamber of Commerce, Rotary, charter committee work, Masonic matters.

These were vital people during the history of each city's fight for democratic home rule. In fact, one night "Hootie" ran a victory party for George, as the early results showed he was elected to one of the then three spots on the county commission. After a hectic evening of celebrating at The Campbell's Six-Company house in Boulder, it developed George lost the election during the night when the valley votes came in.

Virginia, if plied with questions, would agree to talk a bit about herself. About her brother's part in the building of the dam. About her brother-in-law's helping Jake Dieleman get the "I Pick 'em up" business started in Vegas, how nice and thin George was when he came out of the Navy after the war, where he served as a diver fixing blown out submarines.

Virginia was the only stable part of our newspaper for awhile and while arguments between bosses blossomed into heated scenes -- she would quiet us down and caution us to be quiet or we'd lose our customers.

Virginia Campbell passes on, a victim of cancer, but this is one thing for sure -- her family and friends will keep her alive as long as all of us live -- with stories and thoughts that will be rekindled wherever conversation of the good old days come up.

Fire Burns Schmidt Home On Tungsten

Sometimes you get bad news and good news all in one story.

The bad news was that the Harold Schmidt Home at 238 Tungsten Street was burned Friday evening, but the good news was that there was no one home at the time and no one was hurt.

According to the fire department, it was believed the fire started in the couch area. Cheryl Doolin, one of the residents of the home, had left at 5:15 p.m. at it was estimated the fire broke out some time after 6 p.m. When the fire department arrived the front room was fully involved.

The rest of the home received smoke and heat damage. Although there is no official estimate of the damage, Assistant Fire Chief Dale Starr said it would probably be from \$4000 to \$5000. Jean Schmidt was in Carson City at the time.

Later, on Saturday, Miss Doolin and her mother who were traveling were struck by another car and Miss Doolin fractured her jaw and her mother was also injured.

Starr said two birds that made their home in the roof of the Schmidt home, were burned.

In Sex Abuse Case

A Boulder City man was held Sunday in Henderson City Jail on \$57,000 bond, charged with eight counts of sexual offenses against two minor children.

Henderson police identified the suspect as David Milton Tyrrell, 28, of 4007 Nevada Highway, Boulder City.

Tyrrell, identified as an unemployed student, was arrested by Boulder City police Saturday at the request of Henderson authorities

after it was learned he had returned to Boulder City.

The alleged offenses, which reportedly occurred over a period of a year against the suspect's two stepdaughters, ages 12 and 14, were investigated jointly by Henderson and Boulder City police departments.

Tyrrell was charged with one count of statutory rape, four counts of infamous crimes against nature and three counts of lewdness with a minor under the age of 14.

derson, for the papers. For the past few years she had been a homemaker.

Survivors include her husband, George of Henderson; son, Kurt E. Campbell of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho; Bobby Campbell of Coeur d'Alene; sister, Ruth Harrison of Long Island, New York; brother John Eichleay of Hilton Head, North Carolina.

RALPH CUNNINGHAM - Retired Sales and Service Manager - No! One: We had a shining example in Watergate. Two: When the President is elected to do us a job, it shouldn't take seven years to complete it. Three: If they can't fulfill expected duties, another three years won't help. Four: If they couldn't get co-operation out of both houses in four years, they won't in seven!



PATTI FORRESTER - Homemaker - Yes! Let us lengthen the term to ten years with no re-election. They would have time to complete their jobs and put more ideas into operation. It also gives us time to size up other candidates and get to know them. We, at the same time, would have a chance to become acquainted publicly with the President, understand his motives and witness more accomplishments.



HAROLD ROBERTS - Test Technician - No! Although I feel that the Senators and Congressmen's terms could be a bit more limited, the President's term should remain the usual four years with re-election possibilities. If we don't like them, we can get them out. Lengthening the Presidential term, may invite more mistakes if he isn't a good one!



EDWARD DENTON - Retired Chef - No! Because if we get a bad one in, we're stuck with him! We had a poor experience with Nixon and should we get someone in who doesn't live up to our expectations, it would be added trouble if the term was extended. Leave it at four years with re-election possibilities to one more term open.



TAL KLOUCHEK - High School Student, Delivery and Baby-Sitting - Yes! About seven years ought to do it with re-election if they do a good job. The four years is not long enough for them to accomplish the job or know what is needed. After awhile they can see what is needed and make changes. It is a tough job with complications and they need time to fulfill their ideals and promises.



KATHY WARD - Homemaker - Yes! I certainly would like to see the term extended to seven years, but that and no longer with no re-election! I feel we have a lot of good Presidential material in this country but we just haven't heard about it. Seven years would give a President a fair amount of time to accomplish what he promised. I takes two years to "get into the groove" alone once he is elected. Four years does not seem a long enough time. I also would like to see some younger

people take office to represent the vast amount of young in this country. Of course, the ones elected would have to be highly intelligent and experienced.

SUMMARY: *Opinions expressed on this one were split right down the middle! Notice that the younger generation preferred the extended term. All interviewed had very good reasons for their own particular opinions.*

FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF NEVADA PUBLISHES HISTORICAL TABLOID

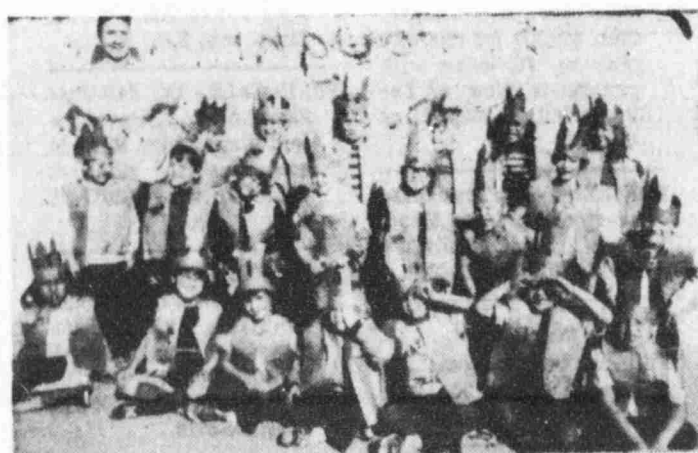
What Thanksgiving Means to Me

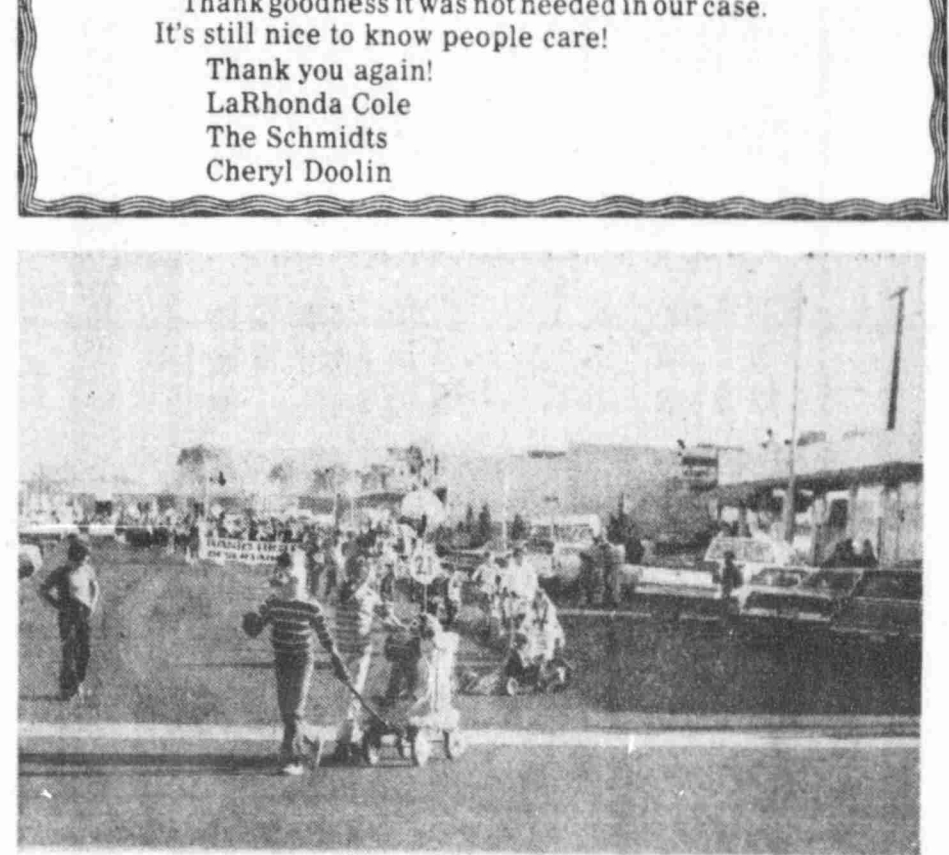
Letter to the Editor:

Salvation Army Conducts Christmas Drives

Christmas kettles will be seen in Henderson between now and Christmas as the Salvation Army conducts their annual drive for contributions to assist the needy during the holiday season.

Lt. Bobby Wingate said the kettles will be at Safeway and Albertson's stores each day and at the post office during the morning hours. Donations will be greatly appreciated to help provide relief for those not as fortunate as we.

There will also be barrels located inside the two above named stores as well as Top's Market and Shop 'N Bag Market for those wishing to contribute canned goods for the Christmas baskets.

The Salvation Army and their Christmas kettles are a familiar sight to all of us, most anyplace we have lived, but are you aware of the origin of them or that they date back almost 86 years?

The Salvation Army Captain in San Francisco had resolved, in the December of 1891, to provide a free Christmas dinner to 1,000 poor persons. But how would he pay for the food?

As he went about his daily tasks, the question stayed in his mind. Suddenly, his thoughts went back to his days as a sailor in Liverpool, England. On the Stage Landing he saw a large pot, called "Simpson's pot"

into which charitable donations were thrown by passers-by.

On the next morning, he secured permission from the authorities to place a similar pot at the Oakland ferry landing, at the foot of Market Street. No time was lost in securing the pot and placing it in a conspicuous position, so that it could be seen by all those going to and from the ferry boats. In addition, a brass urn was placed on a stand in the waiting room for the same purpose.

Thus, Captain Joseph McFee launched a tradition that has spread not only throughout the United States, but throughout the world.

By Christmas, 1895, the kettle was used in 30 Salvation Army Corps in various sections of the West Coast area. The Sacramento Bee of that year carried a description of the Army's Christmas activities and mentioned the contributions to street corner kettles. Shortly afterward, two young Salvation Army Officers who had been instrumental in the original use of the kettle, William A. McIntyre and N.J. Lewis, were transferred to the East. They took with them the idea of the Christmas kettle.

In 1897, McIntyre prepared his Christmas plans for Boston around the kettle, but his fellow officers refused to cooperate for fear of "making spectacles of themselves." So McIntyre, his wife and his sister set up these kettles at the Washington Street thoroughfare in the heart of the city. That year, the kettles provided Christmas dinners for 150,000 of Boston's needy.

In 1898, the New York World hailed The Salvation Army kettles as "the newest and most novel device for collecting money." The newspaper also observed, "There is a man in charge to see that contributions are not stolen."

In 1901, kettle contributions in New York City provided funds for the first mammoth sit-down dinner in Madison Square Garden, a custom that continued for many years. Today, however, families are given grocery checks so that they can buy and prepare their own dinners at home. The homeless poor are still invited to share holiday dinners and festivities at hundreds of Salvation Army centers.

Kettles now are used

in such distant lands as Korea, Japan, and Chile, and in many European countries. Everywhere, public contributions to the kettles enable The Salvation Army to bring the spirit of Christmas to those who would otherwise be forgotten - to the aged and lonely, the ill, the inmates of jails and other institutions, the poor and unfortunate.

In the United States, The Salvation Army annually aids more than 2,000,000 persons at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Kettles have changed since the first utilitarian cauldron set up in San Francisco. Some of the new kettles have such devices as a self-ringing bell and a booth complete with public address system over which the traditional Christmas carols are broadcast. Behind it all, though, is the same Salvation Army message, "Share With Others."
