St. Rose de Lima Sets Room Rate Increase

Building Reaches All - Time High At \$23,286,761

Building in Henderson will probably reach an all - time high this year according to statistics so far, Pat Doherty, superintendent of building and safety said this week.

The building to date reached \$23,286,761 after November as compared to last year's all - time high of \$8,879,014.

Building for the month of November was \$1,233,482, as compared to \$979,672 for the same month the previous year.

The largest evaluations continued to be in new dwell-

ings with \$1,075,780 with 25 permits being issued. New homes has been the biggest building factor in Henderson.

One new commercial and residential alterations and additions accounted for much of the valuations.

There were 1645 inspections made during the month of Nov. there were ten clean-up violations and eight compliances. Certificate of occupancy inspections totalled 16.

There was one case during the month and the resident cleaned his yard and was fined \$25.

After review of increased operating costs, it was recommended that daily hospital services at St. Rose de Lima be increased effective December 1.

The 4-bed wards will be raised to \$92 and the semi-private will be raised to \$96.

In spite of continued efforts to hold cost down, wage scales continue to rise. There are many other hidden costs all of which have taken a considerable rise. Among these are food, linen, housekeeping and medical supplies, utilities, telephone, social security and above all insurance rates which have doubled.

Increased occupancy is the key for cost containment. With continued community support and additional physicians, an increased occupancy rate can hope to be achieved.

No other increases are anticipated at this time.

New Fire Station Site To Be Discussed

A fire station site review will take place by the City Planning Commission at its regular meeting at 8 p.m. Wednesday, December 9 at the Planning Commission Chambers on Lead Street, according to Neil Twitchell, chairman.

A new fire station was voted by a bond issue of the people several years ago and it is now proposed to be a portable fire station that can be moved should growth demand it in the future. The possible site now is in the area of Basic High School.

Other items on the agenda are: a public hearing on a request from B & E Salvage Pool for a use permit to conduct a salvage pool for wrecked and disabled vehicles at 1239 Boulder Highway. The property is zoned industrial.

Another public hearing will discuss a request from Leon Sprouse and Michael Leavitt for a variance to the minimum lot

frontage in Hacienda del Sol, Trailer Estates with horses, in Section 13.

Architectural review will be discussed for B & E Salvage, Casa Verde Nursery for a pole sign at 402 Water Street, a request from Henderson Builder's Supply for a sign at 1245 N. Boulder Highway and a request from Tourist Information Center for a sign at 1300 N. Boulder Highway.

Tentative maps will be reviewed for units 4 and 5 Monte Vista subdivision; Hacienda del Sol; Trailer Estates with horses for Section 33, and a revised map from G.C. Wallace Consulting Engineers, Inc., for review of a map of Green Valley, and a map from VTN of Nevada for approval of tentative map of Unit 4, Greenway Gardens.

Another discussion will center around a proposed park fee ordinance.

School Bond Provides For Schools Here

A \$15 million bond election, part of a three - year \$39.8 million package, was approved by the Clark County School District Board of Trustees Thursday night and it would provide for two schools in Henderson.

Tentatively slated for late Feb. the bond election will ask taxpayers to foot the bill for a multi - million dollar series of school construction project.

Only \$14 million of the \$39.8 million bond package would be issued in 1978 - 79, if voters approve, district officials said.

Construction would include an addition to Basic high school and a new elementary school in Henderson, six elementary classrooms and a middle school in Boulder City.

DECK THE HALLS

Deck the halls with boughs of holly... and try to make light of those holiday spills and splatters. If it's your turn to entertain family and friends this holiday season, don't let accidental spots and stains spoil the fun and festivity of the occasion. Jack is mighty proud of his liver and white English Springer Spaniel who has literally walked away with trophies. His den is filled with ribbons, trophies and awards granted his pride and joy. "Hedger's Gun Flash!" Lovingly referred to by his master as "flash," this brilliant dog lacks but one point toward the Field Trial Championship. Should Flash gain that needed point, he will be the first Nevada Springer to win this coveted position and award. Already to his credit, Flash won the "Nevada Shooting Dog Championship" for four years in a row. This sprightly Springer qualified for three Nationals and several Amateurs. His awards from his "puppy" days are numerous. Now as a five-year-old he is still young, but experienced. He is a hunter, a flusher, a retriever par excellence - all rolled up into one. He is a pal, a good watchdog and worker, who just happens to love his job. Contrary to the popular belief that hunting dogs do not make good watchdogs due to their usual friendly, happy natures; the hunter is an above average watchdog because of his keen sense and "nose." Call is ESP or anything you like, but the hunting dog knows if a human is intruding for good or evil and they react accordingly. Jack Hedger has a

respect and love for all breeds, but is partial to the English Springer Spaniel - Field Variety. They must pass water-retrieving often matching the Labradors, and they must know how to flush, and do a very good job. Making championship is hard, stiff competition, and once a dog accomplishes this; the trainer, the owner, the dog-fancier know what the dog has been through to gain this coveted station." Jack stated. Having served as President of the Southern Nevada English Springer Spaniel Club during 1974 and 1976, Jack Hedger is an authority on the breed. The field-dog differs from the show-dog in a few aspects (although as stated before, a Springer may place equally in field and show) as follows: Springer-Show may show more feathering, grandeur, beauty and, of course, trained for show. Springer-Field may have a keener "nose," less feathering, more accuracy, slimmer and faster, and trained for field-duty. Some Springers show up tops in both phases of field and show but it is one breed that is more separated in their specific classifications. Jack remembers his

Rolling Boulders Xmas Party

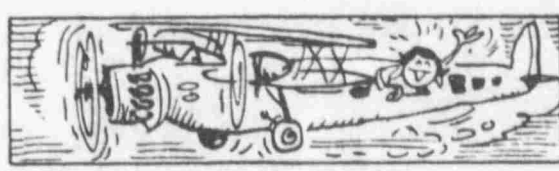

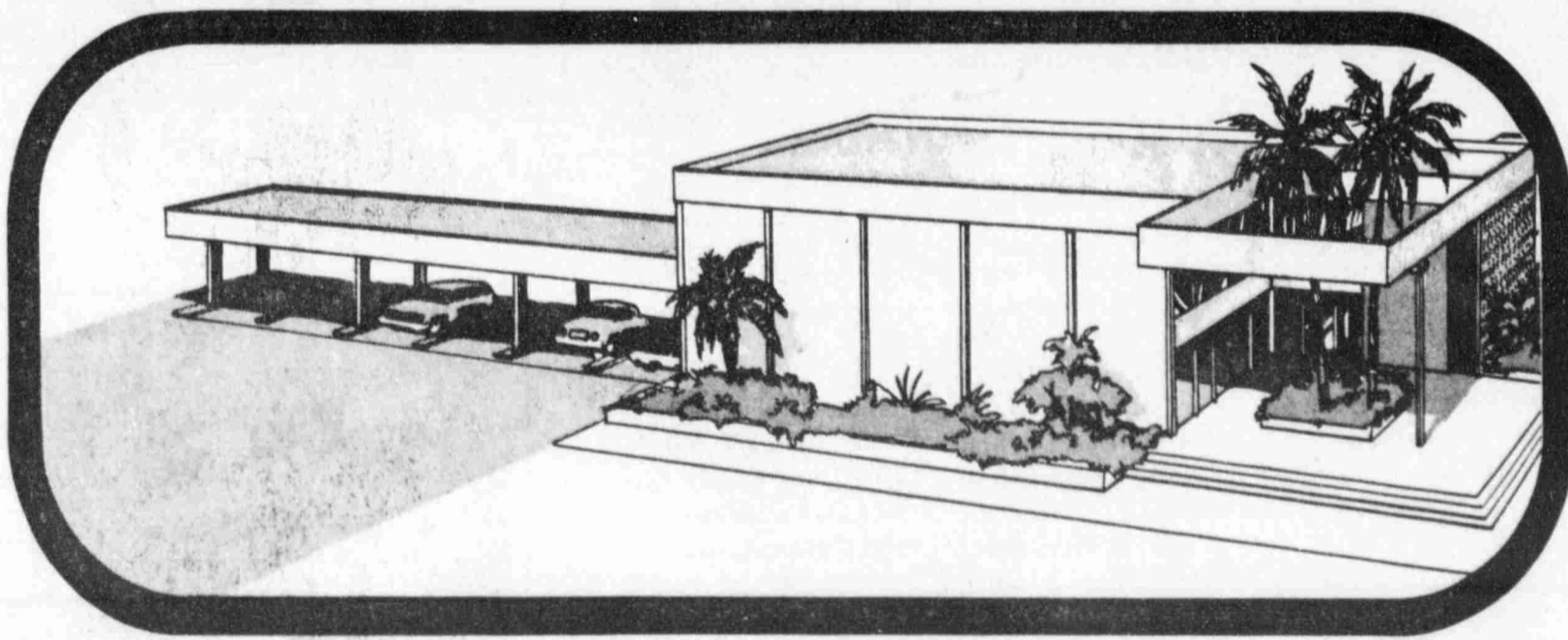

Getting Your Christmas Cactus To Bloom

Do you have a Christmas cactus that refused to bloom for you last winter? If so, your plant probably was not exposed to the proper environmental conditions necessary for flower bud development. Allen D. Boettcher, Horticulture Agent for the Cooperative Extension Service says nighttime temperatures determine

whether these plants will bloom.

For example, flower buds form when cacti are exposed to nighttime temperatures of 55 degrees F., regardless of day length. However, when exposed to 63 - 65 degrees, the plant must have total darkness from 5 p.m. to 8 a.m. nightly. When nighttime temperatures are 70 - 75 de-

grees, the plant will never bloom, regardless of day length.

Therefore, providing the proper temperature will encourage your Christmas cactus to bloom this winter, says Boettcher.

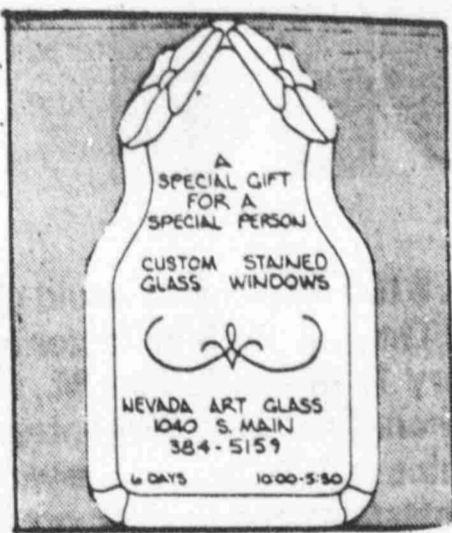

Gregory Peck turns MacArthur, The Legend Into MacArthur, The Man, In Film Portrait

Universal's "MacArthur," a Richard D. Zanuck/David Brown Production opening Dec. 7 at the Rainbow Theatre, begins when the 60-year-old general, his position in the Philippines made hopeless by Japan's destruction of more than half the planes in his Far East Command, leaves Corregidor pledging, "I shall return." The film, produced by Frank McCarthy, directed by Joseph Sargent, and written by Hal Barwood and Matthew Robbins, ends when MacArthur visits West Point two decades later to deliver his famous "Duty - Honor - Country" speech, striking a dramatic contrast between himself, The Old Soldier, and the young cadets. In between, it traces the career of one of the most idolized and disliked public figures of our time, one whose effect on history is still being felt.

The first announcement that "MacArthur" would be brought to the screen touched off renewed controversy over the man and a worldwide casting game in which scores of established stars were suggested to play the general. Nearly four years later, Gregory Peck took his place as General of the Army Douglas MacArthur aboard the U.S.S. Missouri, standing tall and grave while an actor portraying Japanese Foreign Minister Mamoru Shigemitsu signed the document of surrender. For filmmakers Richard D. Zanuck, David Brown and producer Frank McCarthy, it was the realization of a motion picture project that had been painstakingly prepared with meticulous attention to biographical fact, historical accuracy, period authenticity, and the full dramatic values inherent in MacArthur's life.

As with "Patton," which McCarthy produced for 20th Century-Fox when Zanuck was the studio's young president and Brown was the executive in charge of creative operation, it was the man, with all his sterling qualities and all his shortcomings, with whom the new film drama was concerned. Legend gave way to

other distinguished film credits are "Spellbound," "Duel in the Sun," "The Paradine Case," "The Man in the Grey Flannel Suit," "On the Beach," "The Guns of Navarone," "Captain Horatio Hornblower," "Moby Dick," "Roman Holiday," and "The Snows of Kilimanjaro."

Richard D. Zanuck and David Brown, who first joined forces in 1970 with their own production company at Warner Bros., have chalked up a formidable record. The Zanuck/Brown Production of "The Sting" for Universal won seven Academy Awards, including Best Picture, and their production of "Jaws" now stands as the most successful film in motion picture history, with record grosses and world film rentals.

Prior to their association with Universal, Zanuck was in charge of production at 20th Century-Fox Studios. During his tenure, the studio won Academy Awards for Best Picture for "Patton," "The Sound of Music," and "The French Connection." Other box-office and critical successes were "M*A*S*H," "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid," and "The Planet of the Apes." Earlier, as vice president of his father's Darryl F. Zanuck Productions, he produced "Compulsion," "Sanctuary" and "The Chapman Report."

David Brown's initial association with Zanuck began at 20th Century-Fox in 1964 as executive in charge of story operations, then as executive vice president in charge of creative operations. Pre-Hollywood, Brown was both associate and executive editor of Street and Smith Publications, editor-in-chief of Liberty Magazine, and managing editor of Cosmopolitan Magazine. He is the author of numerous books, a lecturer of note, and has held a number of important public relations posts.

Frank McCarthy, a retired brigadier general, was secretary of the War Department General Staff, and military secretary to General of the Army George C. Marshall, Chief of Staff

during World War II. He has been a college professor, journalist, and government official in the military and diplomatic services. From 1937 to 1939 he was press agent for Broadway producer and director George Abbott. He joined 20th Century-Fox in 1949. Three years later, he proposed the filming of "Patton" to Darryl F. Zanuck, then president of the studio.

Joseph Sargent helmed the suspenseful "Pelham One, Two, Three," and won an Emmy for "The Marcus Nelson Murders," a two-hour movie for television that served as a pilot for the "Kojak" series. He also directed "The Night That Panicked America," "Sunshine," "Tribes," and the highly acclaimed "Hustling."

In their anxiety to avoid instant audience recognition that vitiates full screen illusion, the filmmakers selected featured and supporting actors from the ranks of established Broadway and Hollywood players, but not from the star category. Among the historical figures for whom actor look-alikes were used were Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry S. Truman, played by Dan O'Herlihy and Ed Flanders, respectively.

Determined to make the film totally accurate pictorially as well as editorially, producer McCarthy and key members of his production staff scouted the locations where many events actually occurred. After researching the Philippines, Korea and Japan they returned to Universal with one all-encompassing evaluation - none of the overseas sites existed as it did when history was originally made.

The sea wall at Inchon in Korea which MacArthur's troops scaled to cut enemy supply lines was right next to the city when the attack was made. Now the city was a full mile away. Malinta Tunnel on Corregidor and Leyte beach in the Philippines, on which he waded ashore on his return, were totally different, the latter filled with vacationers playing

volleyball. And Tokyo, 1976, is a far cry from the way that city looked in 1945. Each and every site had to be authentically recreated at U.S. locations.

Mississippi State University History professor D. Clayton James, who wrote what producer McCarthy terms "the most definitive biography ever written about MacArthur," was brought to the studio as technical advisor to assist screenwriters Hal Barwood and Matthew Robbins in the final draft screenplay. The two writers, whose "The Sugarland Express" won Best Screenplay honors at the Cannes Film Festival, currently reside in San Anselmo, commuting to Hollywood for assignments. Both were too young to remember the war; Barwood was born a year and a half before Pearl Harbor, Robbins two years later.

Jerry Goldsmith, eight-time Academy Award nominee and winner of three Emmys, composed the music for "MacArthur." It marks his second association with both McCarthy and Peck, having previously scored "Patton" and "The Omen."
