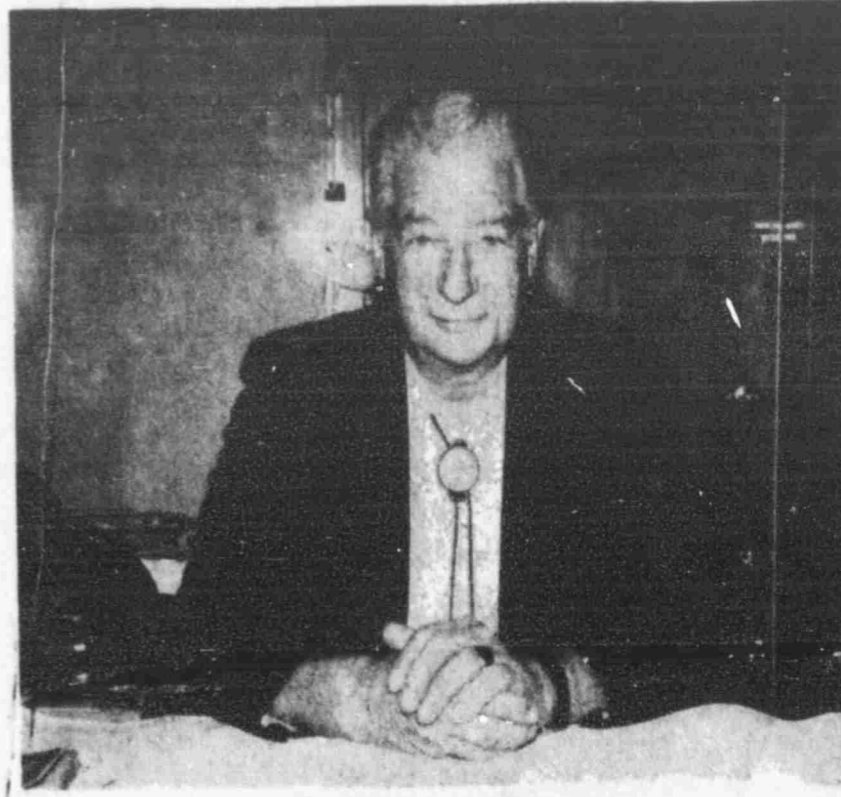


**Building Supt. Pat Doherty**

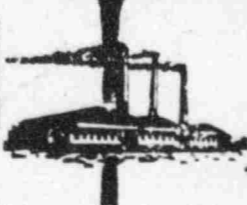
**Fire Chief Don Richard**

that he would end up as police chief within 20 years. On April 16, 1957 he was appointed a patrolman then he was assigned motorcycle duty.

In 1961 he was promoted to Sergeant and on July 13, 1964, he was commissioned as the assistant chief of police. Prior to that the position of sergeant was the highest commission under the chief of police.

Osborn is proud of the fact that he is part Osage Indian. He was born in Pickneyville, Illinois and attended school there.

He joined the army in 1941 when he was just out of high school and served with distinction in the 82nd airborne division.

When he started with the Henderson police department there were 13 people in the department including the Chief of Police. At that time the officers worked 12 days on and then had two off. They were paid the sum of \$320 per month and most departments in the U.S. were searching for recruits to be police officers.

They had no modern equipment at the time and Osborn helped build the present fire chief's office which previously was in the police department.

"The department has grown tremendously," Osborn said. Now there are 57 people in the department and where there was no training program in the early days, each officer now receives police academy training for 16 weeks. At the present time there are three ranking officers who have attended the FBI Academy and Osborn has requested that two more receive the training. He is proud of this attainment.

"There have been frustrations along the way," Osborn said. "In a small department people are treated like individuals, now sometimes it is like an assembly line with only numbers."

## Finest Equipment

Osborn praised the city's equipment and said "it is the finest". He said much of the equipment obtained by the city is due to federal help. Os-

born served for seven years on the crime commission, and as its chairman, so he was instrumental in finding favor with applications for funds from Henderson.

He and his wife, Pearl, were married in 1941. She works in real estate and Osborn encourages her in her work. She also takes time to work with her grandchildren.

Osborn received training in the FBI law enforcement training school, attended the University of Utah school on alcoholic studies, community and police relations at Colorado State University, and administration of police training at Northwestern University. He also has taken extension courses at the University of Nevada Las Vegas.

While serving in the army in the European Theater, he received many honors including the purple heart with a cluster, bronze star, and presidential citation with cluster.

Always active in the community, Osborn was cited by the Chamber of Commerce for "outstanding contribution to the City of Henderson", and he received a similar honor from the Jaycees.

Asked if he enjoyed police work enough to do it all over if he had the chance, Osborn said he would.

"Henderson's been good to me," he said.

Osborn is presently president of the Henderson Boys' club and served in the same capacity last year. He has been chairman of the Regina Hall advisory board, Nevada Safety council member of the board, mental health clinic, member of the Salvation Army advisory board and Kiwanis club.

Asked what he plans to do when he retires, Osborn said he has some property he was to develop. First, he will take a vacation, he said, and then he will consider some job offers he received.

# Pat Doherty Was Hired By Dr. French

James French who was the company doctor and later became the Mayor of Henderson. French talked Doherty into coming to Henderson and he came April 1, 1955. He worked for two weeks as an electrical inspector under Herman Muelheisen and in two weeks was named an inspector for building.

At that time the city offices were in the Bill Byrne building on Army Street.

"I thought we had really moved up when we moved to the old city yards," Doherty remembers. Just so he wouldn't become too attached to an office, Doherty has moved two more times. He first had the present city clerk's office and then was transferred to his present office in the civic center.

When Pat became building inspector he had a secretary, Ruby Hosteller and one man. Now he has four field inspectors on his crew and Doherty does inspections only in certain instances.

In the early days of the city, Doherty said, he felt the building infractions were mostly because of a lack of knowledge of the ordinances and now he feels that many violations are purposely committed rather than done through ignorance of the law.

One of the big problems the city had when it took over a government town was that the Townsite homes were built as temporary structures and there were no curbs, gutters and sidewalks. Mayor French took that on as one of his first projects and it was accomplished.

When the next bunch of houses came along, the Freedom Homes, they also had no sidewalks and so the people of the city elected to install their own. Doherty said there are still about 90 in the city who do not have sidewalks.

## Many Jobs

While Doherty was chief inspector he was also in charge of the health department, the dog pound and the licenses, and until the planning department was created, he also had planning.

When Doherty first came to Henderson, he had been on the job four hours when he was advised that there was an illegal sheet metal contractor doing the work on the Henderson Furniture building, (now McMahan's.) He was told to make an arrest which was new to him. Instead he took the contractor to the Police department, hung up the keys to his car and said he would be there until he paid the \$100 for a license.

Doherty said when he accepted the job with French, the then Mayor told him that he was hired "at the whim of the Mayor" and that when a new Mayor was elected, he may be out of a job.

As things went, French was defeated and Bill Byrne was elected Mayor. Things didn't always go smoothly between the two, but Doherty remained.

Doherty claims he's not a politician and has always tried to steer clear of getting involved.

"I always tried to play a low profile," he said. Speaking of his job, he said it has been a really enlightening experience and the closer it gets to the retirement the more scary it gets.

## good and bad times

"There have been good and bad times on the job," Doherty said. The job entails a lot of decision making and you can't always go 100 per cent by the book you have to use common sense.

"I attribute any success I've had to my excellent crew," Doherty said. "In no way could I have done the job without them."

"People always remember you if you've made them change something in their house," Doherty said. "A policeman can issue a citation and a person pays the fine and it's forgotten but every time a person sees something that had to be changed in his house, he remembers me." Doherty said it is hard sometimes to convince people that he is asking them to do things to protect themselves.

Doherty has served the city for 23 years and has been a department head longer than any other employe of the city.

Pat and his wife have long been interested in jewelry making and rocks and they plan to pursue this hobby when he retires. They plan to travel in their mobile home and Doherty said he has had a couple of job offers.

They have two daughters, Patty Rowe of Oregon and Jeanie Olesen of Las Vegas, and three grandchildren.

was the furthest idea from Richard's mind. He happened at be at a C.C. Camp and was called upon to help combat the fire.

A native of Illinois, his first career was in the family's painting and decorating business, started by his grandfather who came to the states from Ireland.

If the doctor hadn't told Helen Richard, Don's wife, that she must move to a dry, warm climate they probably would have remained in Illinois.

But move they must so with their two children they headed for Las Vegas.

"Houses to rent were impossible to find when we arrived in 1952," Richard recalls.

"The Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce had some listings - one a rental in North Las Vegas. I went to look at it and the landlady informed me people were living in the house but would be glad to move out if I just ask them," he chuckled.

"The only other listings available were in Henderson - one house had grass and trees, the other didn't. We took the house with grass and trees!"

And that is how the Richards happened to settle in Henderson.

Richard first worked as a fireman at the BMI fire station under Chief Zink.

When the city was incorporated June 8, 1953, the fire department was based at the plant. In 1954 the department was split and five men stayed at the BMI station, seven men, including Richard, moved downtown.

Richard was made lieutenant in 1954 followed by a verbal appointment as assistant chief a short time later. Two years later he became chief and has held the position ever since.

The Pittman station was added in 1957 as well as an additional five men. Through the years more manpower has been added and in 1969 the department changed from two to three shifts.

When Richard suffered his heart attack in 1966 an assistant chief position was created and in 1973 the position of Training Officer was added.

Today there are 28 fire department employes including the secretary.

Two big fires stand out in Richard's memory - one at the manganese ore mine outside of town in 1953 which caused about half a million dollars in damage. Another was the old Victory Village Market blaze in 1956.

"That was the first big fire I was in charge of and it caused about \$150,000 worth of dam-

age." Richard is very proud of three major achievements during his career.

He was one of the first chiefs in the state to change the traditional red fire engines to the white as they are easier to see and care for.

He was one of the first fire chiefs to implement the indirect method of fire fighting. This method consists of using a smaller hose with a nozzle that sprays a wider stream than conventional hoses.

"This method creates more steam in a burning building. Steam is what puts out a fire because it does not carry enough oxygen to support the fire," he explained.

"The indirect method uses less water and requires less men."

The third achievement is the high school program which has started several Henderson boys on their way to becoming fire fighters.

The program allows a junior or senior high school boy to work on a shift at the department every third day during the year. The program has become so successful that today the fire department has three captains who started their careers in this way.

Richard has always found time to take an active interest in the community. He is a charter member, since 1959, of the Henderson Kiwanis and has held every office in the local club plus being Lt. Governor of Division 28.

He is a 31 year charter member of the Elk's Lodge, belongs to the Moose and Masonic Lodge. He has been active in Chamber of Commerce activities for a number of years.

He is also active on the Salvation Army Board of Directors, serving as their first Chairman when they first started in Henderson.

The framed certificates on the walls of his office show him to be a member of numerous firemen's associations. He was also named Outstanding Boss for 1969 by the Henderson Jaycees.

The Richard's son Dennis is an engineer with the Clark County Fire Department and also owns a riding stable at Mt. Charleston and Daydream Ranch. Their daughter, Vicki Cowen, owns 2 beauty shops in Las Vegas, the Flamingo Capri and Les Girls.

They also have seven grandchildren, three of whom are living with Helen and Don Richard here and attending Henderson schools.

After his retirement in January, Richard plans to remain in town but he takes with him the distinction of being the last original city employe to leave the city's service.

**City's Animal Shelter Serves The Public**

We have all seen the Animal Control trucks driving through the streets of town but do you know that the city also has an animal shelter?

Surprisingly enough, there seem to be many people who are not aware there is as Las Vegas receives many phone calls from Henderson animal owners inquiring about a lost pet, without knowing they can call locally with their inquiries.

What was once referred to as the "dog pound" no longer really applies today as the shelter receives calls concerning cats, reptiles, goats, an occasional cow or horse, even a turtle now and then.

The shelter is located at the end of Moser Street in the Pittman area. The best, and most direct, way to find it is to turn east on Corn Street and follow Cron which shortly becomes Moser.

The shelter is operated by four gentlemen, all of whom have a great fondness for animals and would like nothing better than to be able to return lost pets to their rightful owners.

This can present great difficulty, however, as cats are not required to be licensed and many dogs are not licensed even though it is required.

If a dog is picked up and wearing a license, the owner will be notified that it is being held at the shelter but a dog that obviously is a beloved pet but has no license for identification cannot be returned unless the owner contacts the shelter.

An animal is only required by law to be held 72 hours or three days before it may be destroyed.

The shelter is open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., winter hours. Their telephone number is 564-5551 and if a call comes in after closing, there is an answering service where the message is recorded and one of the crew will get back to the caller the next day.

In case of an emergency, the caller can get in touch with the Police Department at 565-8933.

There are cases where people no longer want their animals. Please, rather than drop these animals out in the desert, bring them into the shelter where they can hopefully be adopted or put to sleep humanely. There is no charge if the animals are brought to the shelter. If Dave McKenzie or Cecil Gliem, the animal control officers, pick them up there is a \$5 per call charge for dogs, \$2 per call charge for cats.

There is also an after hours animal drop in front of the shelter where you can leave an animal.

At the present time there are several darling puppies at the shelter that would make great Christmas presents for the family. If you have been considering a puppy, you might give the shelter a call. Adoption is quite inexpensive. Only \$5 for adult dogs, male or female and \$2 for cats, kittens and puppies.

The adult dogs must be licensed and to get a license, proof of rabies shot must be shown. There will be a clinic held at the Fire Station on a Sunday in the near future at which time rabies shots can be obtained for your pet at a nominal cost.

Another little known service that the shelter extends to the people of Henderson is the loan of cat traps. Should you have a stray cat living under your house or in the yard you can borrow, at no charge, traps in which to catch them.

Last month the shelter received 134 calls for

service. Twenty-nine were for cats and 105 for dogs. The personnel try very hard to adopt out the animals rather than have to destroy them and are about 80 per cent successful with the adoptions.

Just keep in mind that Henderson does have its own animal shelter and it's here to serve you, the people of Henderson.

a cross-section of dedicated people and any job of importance can be accomplished.

Death Valley itself, to this writer, is awesome. Such rare beauty from nature's nakedness in the lowest spot below sea level on the American continent is a treasure all of us have here because the area is but two pleasant hours by car.

The fact that government has made it into a national monument means visitors will get the usual expert treatment from guides and the absence of litter is appreciated from campground to watering spots along the road.

The history of the Furnace Creek Ranch itself is interesting. It bears re-telling, which follows and we urge you visit either the Inn or the Ranch for a four dayer of your own once every year so that that piece of nature you own by virtue of being an American citizen can be a tonic to the soul.

Let's read this little bit of history:

Furnace Creek Ranch was established in the 1880's as Greenland Ranch, to provide accommodations for the men working the Borax Mines; to provide alfalfa for the horses and mules; and to raise cattle for food. In 1924-25 the Pacific Coast Borax Co., which owned the ranch and operated extensive mining holdings, planted a grove of Deglet Noor palms. Today, the 1,600 palms yield nearly 400 tons of dates each season and create the cool oasis on the floor of the valley. Dates from the grove are used in the baking of Furnace Creek Date Nut Bread.

In the early days, the ranch was the terminus for the Twenty Mule Teams. Here wagons were repaired and men and animals rested from the 20-day round trip journey to Mojave with the Borax from the Harmony Borax Works.

**FURNACE CREEK INN:** Construction was started in September of 1926 and the first 14 rooms opened for business in 1927. Construction continued for 10 years until it reached its present size - 70 rooms. The Terrace was built in 1927-28, the swimming pool in 1929, north wing and lower lounge in 1930. In 1935 the central tower was constructed and in 1938 the Oasis Supper Club and cocktail lounge, service station and garage. The stone used extensively in its construction is all local.

**FURNACE CREEK RANCH:** The ranch began taking guests in 1933. At that time all the workers' cottages from the just completed Boulder (now Hoover) Dam were purchased and brought to the ranch. Other cabins, since removed, came from the Gerstley Mine at Shoshone. Additional groups of cabins were built during the '30s and '50s and the newest units along the golf course were completed in 1975.

The swimming pool was constructed in 1952 and in 1968 Furnace Creek Golf Course joined the ranks of 18 holes after having 9 holes for more than 35 years. Two additional Tennis courts at the Inn and two at the Ranch were completed in 1977.

Furnace Creek itself comes from the Travertine Springs 6,000 feet up the canyon from the Inn. The water passes through the grounds, the swimming pool and the gardens and on to the Ranch to irrigate the date palm grove and the golf course. All water is used twice, as our recycling plant recycles up to 100,000 gallons of water per day.

Fred Harvey, Inc., now an Amfac Company, has operated the Inn and Ranch since 1956, first for the Borax Company, then, from 1969 as owners. A master plan is now in development from expansion of the present facilities which are uniquely situated, surrounded as they are by the two million acre Death Valley National Monument. The valley's wild, unspoiled desert has nearly 500 miles of good road. One leads to Dante's View, 5,475 feet above sea level; another to Badwater, 282 feet below sea level (the lowest point in the Western Hemisphere). Others lead to points of great and historic interest such as Ubehebe Crater, The Sand Dunes, Scotty's Castle, Abandoned Mining Towns and Deep Canyons.

# Regina Hall - Truly A Home

The Spanish style house sits rather remotely, quite high on the hill, allowing its residents a wonderful view of the valley by day, the fabulous lights of the big city at night.

After ringing the doorbell, the friendly barking of dogs announces the visitors arrival.

Sister Riccarda Moseley greets you at the door and invites you in for a tour of the house, officially known as Regina Hall.

The occasion was an Open House, celebrating the sixth anniversary of the half way house for girls in Henderson.

The name hall is a bit deceptive as it conjures up in the mind a picture of a long, dark hall with lots of small, gloomy, poorly lighted rooms on either side.

Regina Hall is a beautiful, bright and cheery home ... abounding in love and caring between the girls and their three supervisors - Sr. Riccarda, Elmer and Pat Harrington.

There is much more floor space than one might imagine from viewing the house from the outside.

A lovely, spacious kitchen with lots of cupboard and counter space that any homemaker would envy; a formal dining room beautifully furnished from funds raised by the Regina Hall Auxiliary at a party held at Wayne and Elaine Newton's ranch; a family room with color TV, pool table, comfortable furniture, stereo equipment.

There is a formal living room complete with fireplace ... once the setting for the wed-

dining of one of the hall's former family members; a laundry with washer and dryer where the girls take care of their own clothes; six different, brightly colored

bedrooms, each reflecting the personalities of the two girls who share them; a spacious, lavender bathroom.

The large crafts room has two sewing

machines plus one commercial machine, a kiln for the ceramics which the girls have been making and selling, drawers of yarn. Each girl has been making an

afghan under the tutelage of Mrs. Christina Paul, their crafts instructor.

In the backyard is a large patio where barbecues are held, a heated swimming pool and room for expansion.

This is Regina Hall today.

Sr. Riccarda and the Harringtons came to Nevada in November of 1971 at the invitation of

the Clark County Juvenile Court. They had previously, in 1968, founded and operated the first Regina Hall in Spokane, Washington.

The first Nevada Regina Hall was housed in the old St. Peter's Convent. Within five months of being in town the City Council voted to give them two acres of land near the armory as the site for their new home.

And Regina Hall is truly a home. The 12 teenage girls who live there have had minor scrapes with the law. Many of them come from broken homes but the Harringtons and Sr. Riccarda try to make the girls feel that the halfway house is a place where they are loved and wanted. All 12 girls attend Basic High School and graduation is

their main goal. The Harringtons raised eight children of their own before working as houseparents for the first Regina Hall in Spokane. Being mother and father for a large number comes naturally for them.

Sr. Riccarda, a Franciscan nun, had taught at Catholic High schools in Wisconsin and Iowa before returning to her hometown of Spokane to be vice principal of a girl's high school.

As an avocation, she worked wherever she taught with adolescents who had gotten into trouble with the police.

Regina Hall has come a long way in the past six years and Sr. Riccarda and the Harringtons have every right to be proud of their fast progress.

A lot of the credit can go to the Wayne Newtons, Tony Orlando and the late Bobby Darin, who saw the merit in the trio's work and contributed in their own ways.

But much of the credit also goes to the numerous people of the area who have contributed much time and effort in making Regina Hall - truly a home.

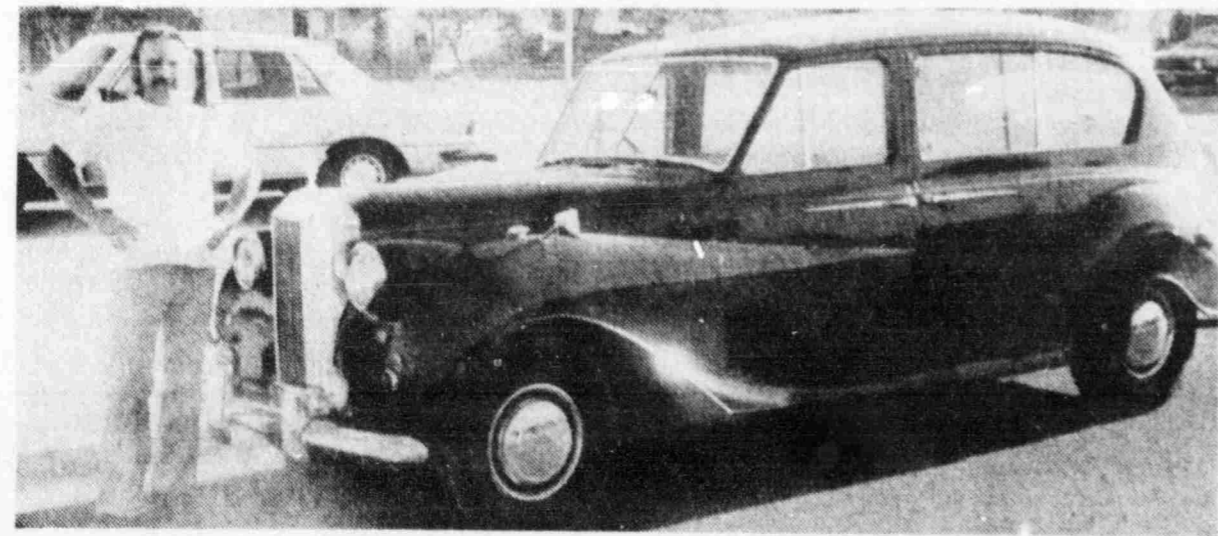
# The Editor's Camera Runs into "traffic" one morning this week -- and a side trip to Death Valley.



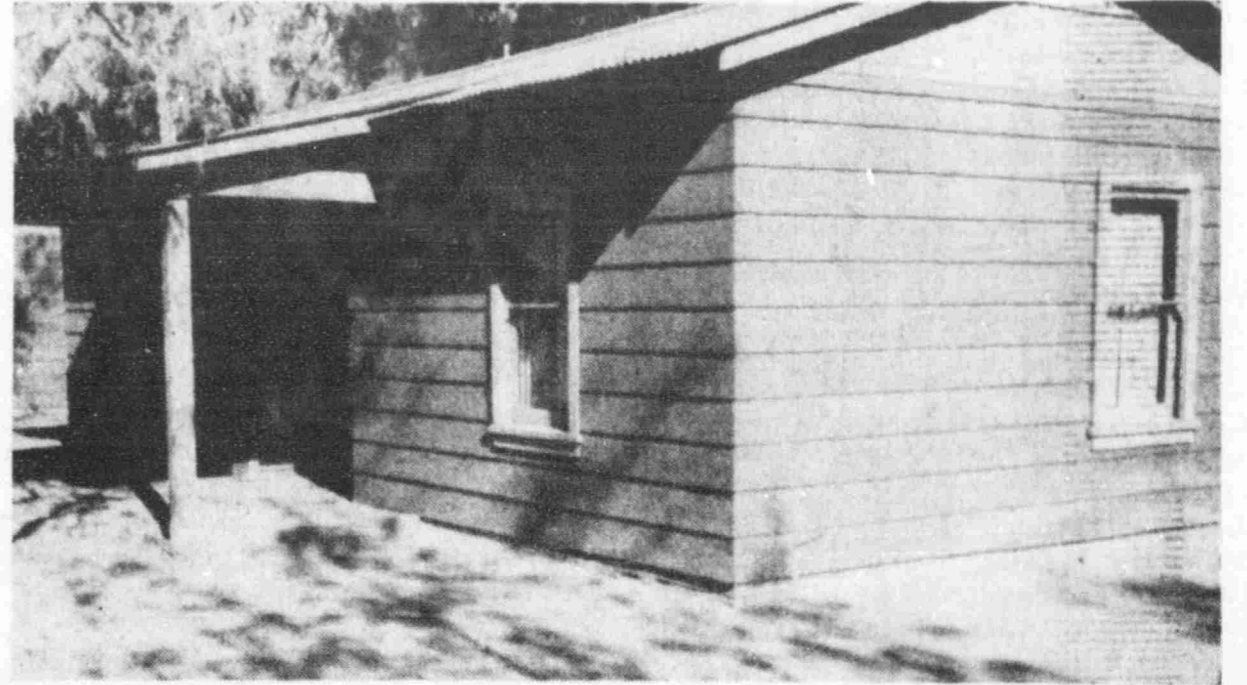

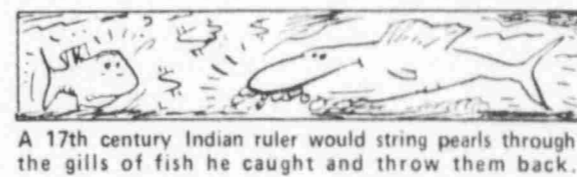

## PANAMA CANAL Christmas Contributions IS AN AMERICAN AFFAIR

### Part 23 of a Series

With adoption of the Spooner Act, it seemed the next step would have to be a treaty allowing the U.S. to construct a canal on the sovereign territory of the Republic of Colombia.

With Tomas Herran, secretary of the Colombian Legation in Washington, U.S. Secretary Hay negotiated a treaty with Colombia authorizing the Compagnie Nouvelle to sell its rights and properties to the United States, and granting the U.S. an exclusive right to construct, maintain, operate, and protect a canal across Panama. But in Aug., 1903, the treaty was rejected by the Colombian Senate.

Immediately Panama residents grew restless. Theodore Roosevelt became impatient, and the French engineer Bunau Varilla, from Room 1162 in the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York, made plans to change the political environment of Panama. During the next two months, Panama politicians, encouraged by alleged promises of assistance from the North, met in the home of Manuel B. Boyd in Panama City to plan a revolution. Coded messages flashed between the Isthmus and New York, and the first two days of November Mme. Bunau - Varilla remained in her rooms in the Waldorf Astoria, secretly designing and sewing a flag of liberation which she was confident would soon fly over a new republic in Central America.

On November 3, 1903 the district of Panama staged a revolution against Colombia, while the U.S. Naval forces stationed in the bay prevented Colombian troops from taking action on the Isthmus. Only one man was accidentally killed, as the Republic of Panama was proclaimed.

On November 6, the U.S. recognized the independence of Panama. A trio of Panamanians seized the government of the New Republic, and on the same day, Philippe Bunau-Varilla received a telegram at his Waldorf Astoria room stating:

"The Junta of Provisional Government of Republic of Panama appoints you Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary near the Government of the United States of America with full powers for political and financial negotiations."

The telegram was signed by J.A. Arango, Frederico Boyd, and Tomas Arias. Over the years, the descendants of the Boys family would continue their political activities, and the United States would not be allowed to forget the significance of the Boyd family on the Isthmus of Panama.



'Public Involvement and Support'

The Crime Prevention Unit

Henderson Police Department

Each time a citizen fails to report an offense, declines to take the common sense precautions against crime his Police Department tells him to, is disrespectful to an Officer of the law, shirks his duty as a juror or performs it with a biased mind or hate-filled heart, or refuses to hire a qualified man because he is an ex-convict, he contributes his mite to crime. That much is obvious.

A further duty of every citizen is to familiarize himself with the problems of crime and the criminal justice system so that when legislatures are considering criminal laws or appropriations for the system, he can express informed views, and when politicians make crime an election issue, he will not be panicked or deceived. The money that is needed to control crime will come, ultimately, from the Public. That too, is obvious.

Beyond this, controlling crime depends to a great degree on interaction between the community and the criminal justice system. The need for the system and the universities to work together on research into crime and the ways to prevent or control it has been mentioned.

Similarly, effective policing of slums and ghettos requires programs designed to improved relations between

the Police and the residents of such neighborhoods and enable them to work together. Community based correctional programs require that organizations of many kinds, and individuals as well, involve themselves actively in the job or reintegrating offenders into the life of the community.

Programs designed to reduce juvenile delinquency require the same kind of public involvement.

Above all, the president's commission on law enforcement and administration of justice inquiries have convinced it and many of us, that it is undesirable that offenders travel any further along the full course from arrest to charge to sentence to detention than is absolutely necessary for society's protection and the offender's own welfare.

Much of the congestion throughout the system, from Police Stations to prisons, is the result of the presence in the system of offenders who are there only because there is no other way of dealing with them. One of the system's greatest needs is for the community to establish institutions and agencies to which Policemen, Prosecutors, and Judges can refer various kinds of offenders, without being compelled to bring the full force of criminal

sanctions to bear on them.

Doubtless, devising and instituting alternative ways to treating offenders is a long and complicated process. It must begin with an understanding by the community of the limited capacity of the criminal justice system for handling the whole problem of "crime."

Until the public becomes fully aware of what the system can do and what it cannot do, it cannot give the system the help it needs.

This is the "King" of Dogdom! The St. Bernard is a husky, large dog measuring to 29 inches. His weight can go up as high as 170 lbs. His head is huge with a "smiling" type generous, but not vicious, looking mouth. His eyes are large and slant down with a "super sleuth" appearance which depicts his detective type of work in seeking out lost humans. He is an outdoorsman and can withstand any temperature, and any storm. ESP was generously given out to the St. Bernard for his sense of direction is unrivaled and his "built-in" thermometer tells him just what the weather will be. Don't tie this dog up in an apartment, the yard is his domain. His very dense coat lies smooth and he is short-haired but does not give that appearance. His color may be white with red, or red with white, white chest, feet and tip of tail. It may be a rust-red to a red - brown shade. He has freckles here and there, with very small patches of dark - brown at times.

He received his name from the famous monk, Bernard de Menthon, and from the Hospice of the St. Bernard Pass in the Swiss Alps. First mention of him was in 1774 when he was referred to in the hospice records. Sir Edward Landseer, the noted British artist, added to the dog's popularity when he painted the romantic conception of the St. Bernard fighting his way through a snow storm

with a keg of brandy around his neck for the lost mountaineer. Their work was to seek out lost travelers and warm them until help arrived. Some believe his origin may be traced to Tibetan ancestors or ancient dogs of Central Asia. They are also excellent forest and mountain guide dogs due to their uncanny sense of direction.

Hendersonites Robert and Betty Nielson own the typical St. Bernard. His name is "Herman" and he shows all the beauty, devotion, lack of malice, gentleness and warmth that is expected of his breed. "Herman was wished on us," Betty confided, "in that a friend asked us if we couldn't but take this St. Bernard for a few days as a favor for a couple who lived in a trailer and did not have enough room. We said that we would! Well the pup was 6 months then and he is 4 1/2 years now. We were asked to please keep him.

Well my husband and the dog became very good friends and we had the room so the decision was easy. We have not been sorry since. He is a wonderful dog and fine with young people."

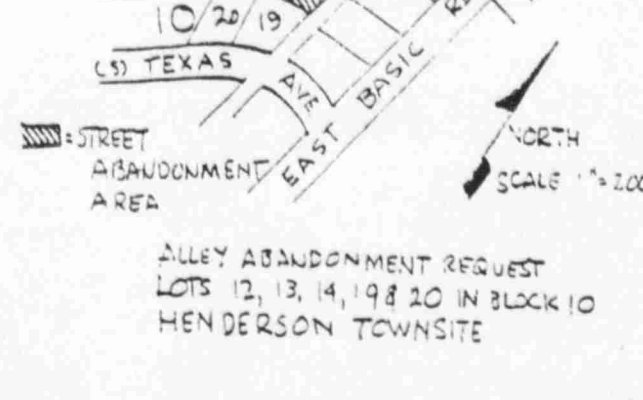

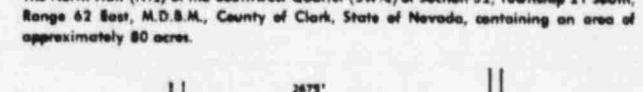

**USDA Amends  
Regulations  
On Food Donations  
To Nutrition Programs  
For The Elderly:**

Assistant Secretary of Agriculture Carol Tucker Foreman announced that the U.S. Department of Agriculture will provide cash in lieu of commodities for federally-funded nutrition programs for the elderly, in states which elect the cashout option during the fiscal year which began October 1, 1977.

The rule change, mandated by Public Law 95-65, enacted July 11, 1977, to amend Title VII of the Older Americans Act of 1965, will allow states the option of receiving cash payments for all, or part, of the donated foods the states would otherwise receive. Whichever option states elect will be binding until the end of the fiscal year. Previously, only a state which had phased out its food distribution facilities before June 30, 1974, could elect cash in lieu of commodities for such programs. Kansas was the only state affected.

The Assistant Secretary also announced an increase in the level of commodity assistance to nutrition programs for the elderly from 27.25 cents per meal to 29.25 cents per meal, effective October 1, 1977 through September 30, 1978. The increase is based on a minimum 25 cents per meal which was set by a November 28, 1975 amendment to the Older Americans Act, and which must be adjusted each fiscal year to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for food away from home.

The amended regulations are scheduled to be published in the Federal Register of November 22, 1977.

**Drop In Water Temperature Means Drop In Fish Luck**

Is it the moon phase, a change in barometric pressure or has it been the recent rapid drop in water temperatures? Whatever it has been, it has slowed fishing success for bass, trout and catfish in Southern Nevada to a snail's pace. Most of Lake Mead's striped bass action has taken place in the Overton Arm with an estimated 10-day catch of 60 fish from the mouth of the Muddy River on south to Echo Bay. These strippers are ranging in size from three to 16 pounds and are being taken late in the day and during the early evening hours. Anglers taking

stripers are in the minority with fishing success related to the angler's ability to find the fish. Once a school is located, however, the catching is relatively easy. Successful stripper fishermen, regardless of which area on Lake Mead they fish, claim they are spending most of their current efforts in 25 to 35 feet of water over favorable bottom contours. They are locating their fish based on previous experience, by the presence of diving birds or where disturbances on the water's surface indicates a school of shad. Anglers trolling for stripers have shown a

preference for redbfin, rebel, rapala, hellbender and spot lures with casting enthusiasts claiming good luck using pencil poppers and other surface types. Jigging spoons, worked just off the bottom in 25 to 35 feet of water have also produced some fair catches in recent weeks. Trout plants scheduled for Friday, Dec. 2 at Hemenway Harbor and at Callville on Dec. 9 are expected to produce some stripper action in these areas.

Two days of creel checks at Overton Landing and Echo Bay recorded 27 fishermen, 19 of whom were successful in creeling 15 largemouth bass, 20 bluegills, 35 crappies and 11 catfish. On the lower basin of Lake Mead, the only bass reported were a few taken accidentally by anglers jigging for stripers. Harold Harper of Searchlight Storage and Bait rates Lake Mohave bass fishing as slow with some action off the points in 40 feet of water with waterdogs, night-crawlers and occasionally a trolled hellbender lure. Bag bass of the week tipped the scales at five pounds with one lucky angler creeling a limit of bass from one to three pounds in size. A recent plant of trout at Cottonwood Cove has boosted shoreline success for pan-sized fish. An occasional rainbow of two to three pounds forecasts better fishing as winter progresses and lake temperatures cool even further. In the lower basin of Lake Mohave, deep trollers are taking trout at 60 to 70 feet with needlefish and flatfish lures. DFG checks at Cottonwood Sunday recorded 53 of 147 anglers successful in taking 25 largemouth bass, 16 bluegills, three crappies, six channel catfish and 67 rainbow trout.

### Golden Age Passport Provides Free Entry To National Parks

Are you 62 or older? If so, you're entitled to a lifetime Golden Age Passport that will admit you free to national parks and other federal recreation areas that charge an entrance fee.

What's more, the Passport gives you a 50 percent discount on fees charged for certain park visitor uses, such as camping, boat launching, parking, etc. The Passport does not, however, apply to fees charged by private concessioners.

"Although the Congress authorized the free Golden Age Passport in 1972, many eligible people are still unaware of the program," said Howard H. Chapman, Western Regional Director of the National Park Service.

"Any citizen or permanent resident of the United States who is 62 years or older is eligible for this free lifetime pass to all national parks," he pointed out.

In addition to the National Park Service, other Federal agencies

issuing the passports at various locations in Nevada include the U.S. Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Army Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation.

The Golden Age Passport admits both the holder and accompanying passengers when entry is by private car. When entry is not by private car, the passport admits the holder, spouse and children.

The Golden Age Passport is issued free and can be obtained only in person, accompanied by proof of age such as a driver's license showing your birthdate, or a birth certificate. Medicare cards are not acceptable because they are also issued to people under 62. If you don't have proof of age, you may sign an affidavit attesting to your age.

By law, the Passport is not available by mail, nor can it be obtained at a post office. However, you can obtain it at most federal areas where it can be used, so it may not

be necessary to get one before beginning a vacation trip. But if you want to get one in advance of use, the following offices and areas in Nevada issue the Passport:

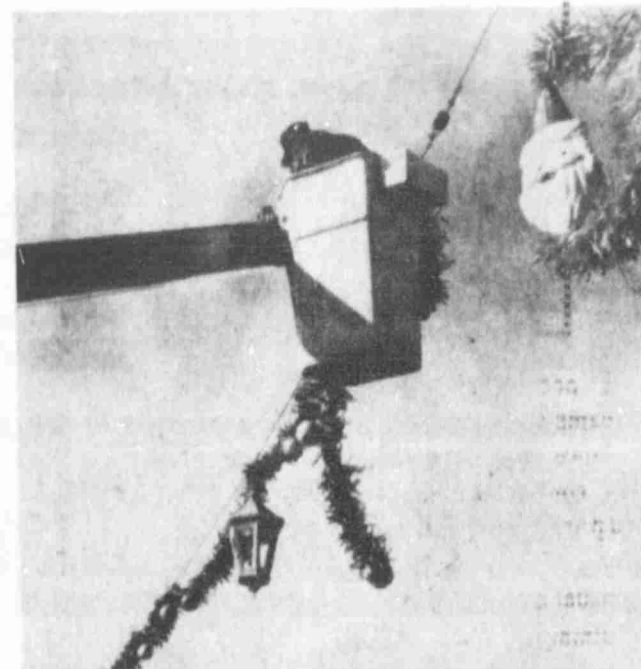

### Santini Does Brisk Business Locally

#### Boulder City

A good number of Boulder City voters turned out last Wednesday morning to visit with Congressman Jim Santini as he arrived here in his mobile office.

An innovation developed by Santini several years ago, the idea of bringing his Nevada office to the people in the rural areas through utilization of a motor home has proved most popular with Nevada residents.

Santini arrived here early Wednesday to meet with Mayor Heber Tobler and members of the City Council. From 10 a.m. to 11 a.m., he held "open house" in the motor home office to meet with residents.

The response was gratifying. Residents, including members of the Boulder High School political science class, visited the Congressman. Some had personal problems to discuss; others just stopped by to say hello. Subjects of discussion included the future of

solar energy in Boulder City as well as the uncertain future of the Nevada Test Site.

On the latter topic, Santini said, "I'd like to see the test site used for solar energy research if a ban on nuclear testing comes to pass. The site is an ideal place for this type of pursuit."

Commenting further, he added: "Whatever comes of the SALT II negotiations... test site is ideal for many testing purposes. Back in Washington, it's very easy for Congress to forget the little man. We're a long way from Washington." He said that it was his responsibility to insure that the

working people in Nevada were not ignored or forgotten in this issue.

Jim Chachas, Rural Representative for the Congressman, said the mobile office created by Santini has received "tremendous acceptance" throughout the state. The large number of persons visiting the office at each stop has often caused the day's schedule to be altered. Indeed, the Boulder City turnout was such that the Congressman's scheduled 11 a.m. visit to the Senior Citizen Center had to be slipped back half an hour.

On the other hand, when I begin to experience what my inner senses are recording, my concupiscence is transformed, bringing an influx of compassion and gratitude, with their natural accompaniment, peace of mind.

I sense that concupiscence is to true joy what drowning is to water skiing.

"But drowning is so much fun, everyone's doing it," complains the concupiscent part of me.

## Don't Forget To Plug It!

With the second portion of Clark and Lincoln County's split waterfowl season scheduled to begin Monday Department of Fish and Game is reminding hunters that if they have removed their shotgun plugs for upland game hunting, these devices must be replaced before they hunt ducks or geese.

Federal and state law prohibits the hunting of any migratory game bird (waterfowl, dove, snipe) with a shotgun of any description capable of holding more than three

shells unless it is plugged with a one-piece filler, incapable of removal without disassembling the gun, so that its total capacity does not exceed three shells. In other words, the magazine of the shotgun cannot be capable of holding more than two shells since the firing chamber is capable of holding one.

According to a department spokesman, "Most Nevada hunters are well aware of the three shotshell capacity law that applies to mig-

ratory game birds, although some simply forget to replace their shotgun plugs after pursuing upland game birds where a limit on the number of shells does not apply."

"Probably the safest practice for those who might hunt quail one day and ducks the next, or who might hunt both species during the same day, is to never remove the plug from the gun."

The department suggests that if a hunter arrives at his favorite hunting place and finds

he has left his plug at home, one can be fashioned from a tree branch or other stick. "Excuses won't work, the weapon must be appropriately plugged."

Other laws and regulations pertaining to up-

land game and waterfowl hunting, are listed in the 1977 Upland Game Bird, Waterfowl, Rabbit and Furbearing Animal seasons brochure available at all NDFG offices and license agents throughout the state.

# A Report From Janet Sobel: Clark County School District Trustee

Now that school has been in session for a while, I thought that I'd report to the citizens of Henderson and Boulder City. A year has passed since I was campaigning and heard from many of

you on what you thought were areas of need in the school district. At that time, also, I told you what my priorities were and felt that now I should give you a progress report on my ac-

complishments and on-going projects.

The major problem I expressed before taking office was the tremendous lack of communication between parents and teachers and the top administrators in our school system. I feel strongly that my presence on the Board has opened communications a significant amount. I am always pleased to hear directly from parents and employees of the Clark County School District and have always returned phone calls and followed up on individual problems and concerns. I have assisted in the solutions of individual parent problems, such as transportation, classroom problems and the like. I have also been directly involved in the badly needed facility

expansion in the rapidly growing Boulder City area. My phone number is listed in the telephone directory and I am always happy to be contacted by anyone with a school district problem. It is always good, however, to deal directly with the local school administrator first, for often they can bring about a satisfactory solution to problems much quicker than I can. But I am always ready assist anyone who is having trouble finding satisfactory solutions at the school level.

There are many areas of educational need that I am presently involved with. As chairman of the subcommittee on Special Education, I have been directly involved with this district's local plan for meeting the needs of

our handicapped youngsters through the new federal law, PL. 94 - 142. Also, as part of that committee, I have been examining our English as a Second Language program (ESL). In my opinion, our present ESL program is inadequate and we are now looking at alternative bilingual programs which should be significantly more effective. I am aware of the large Hispanic community in Henderson and want all of my Latino friends to know that I am working hard in their behalf. I would welcome contact from the Henderson Spanish speaking people so that I can become aware of their feelings and needs in the area of bilingual education.

As a member of the competency subcommittee I am now involved in examining our present curriculum. We want to be sure that our youngsters are being properly challenged and not just sliding through school here in Clark County. There may even need to be an upgrading of graduation requirements recommended by this committee some time in the near future.

Henderson is growing, and we must be sure that the Henderson facilities are adequate to meet the needs of the community. I am particularly concerned about Basic High School and its needs.

Another project of mine is taking a look at our district's policy towards meeting the academic needs of all students. I feel strongly that we must not only teach to the average child; children who need extra help should receive it, and children who are above - average must not be allowed to become bored with school. Sometimes the teachers are not given the assistance they need in solving these special classroom situations. Teachers need the time and the materials to accomplish what we want of them.

I have been working very hard as your trustee. The only thing I regret is the amount of time it takes to see changes come about. The Clark County School District is a large bureaucracy, and changes take a while. The individual problems are usually quickly solved, but the major educational problems take much longer. But, be assured that I am staying involved and am working hard to become as informed as possible before I make any decision as your representative. I am encouraged by my progress and by the contact I am keeping with the residents of Henderson and Boulder City.

It is a mistake to wait until problems grow larger, as they frequently will. Any citizen who has a problem should contact the principal of the school, or an administrator at the education center on Flamingo Road. And, please, feel free to contact me. I was elected by you to serve you, and I shall always strive to do that.

## Vehicle Registration Due For New Residents

The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles reminds all new residents of Nevada whose out-of-state vehicle license plates expire in December to act now in obtaining 1978 Nevada registration and license plates.

John Ciardella, registration chief for the Department, reminded motorists that late penalties will be assessed if their registration is not completed by Dec. 31.

"There is no grace period in Nevada, nor does Nevada law recognize the grace period of another state," he added.

Motorists who have out-of-state license plates on their vehicles expiring this month and registering their vehicles in Nevada for the first time must have the vehicle identification number of their vehicle verified before registering the vehicle. Trucks and trailers weighing over 1,000 pounds must have a certified weight certificate accompanying their inspection and registration certificate in order to register their vehicles in the State of Nevada for the first time.

Ciardella added that persons registering out-of-state vehicles in Clark County for the first time must also have the vehicle inspected for emission control compliance and should contact the Department's Las Vegas office for a list of authorized inspection stations.

He urged all new residents with expiring plates to "act now and avoid the year-end rush."

# TOPICS FOR TAXPAYERS

Several years ago Nevada cities (Reno - Sparks, Las Vegas - North Las Vegas, Elko, Carson City, Boulder City and Henderson, principally) were joyously grateful for a federal - state program that undertook the construction of city streets. The program is called Urban Highway and was added to three earlier federal programs of Primary, Secondary and Interstate highways. The program was a boon to cities beleaguered by rising standards and costs made necessary by heavier traffic and inflation.

The construction standards were much higher than had been experienced in the building of city streets; but were not unreasonable in the light of greatly increased traffic and much heavier vehicle loadings. And the cities were strapped for money with which to construct the needed network of city streets. As the state moved into the construction of these roads, the cities were relieved of construction costs and the program was not all that big, compared with the major costs of the other three federal programs.

Only recently has the bite started hurting. The usual pattern is that when the state (with massive federal participation) undertakes the construction, the costs of

maintenance of those city streets becomes a charge on state revenues and must be funded without federal participation. Aye, there's the rub.

When the state suggested to the cities that they "take back" the "urban" system for maintenance purposes, there was great anguish. "Where do we get the money?"

One answer might be, "These are not 'new' streets. You cities maintained these streets before they were added to the urban system. Now that they are built and in much better condition than when the state took them over, you should be grateful that the maintenance cost will be much less than it would have been had the streets not been built to the higher specifications."

The construction and maintenance of highways is one of very few functions of government that is supported almost entirely by user charges. Taxes on gasoline and diesel fuel, taxes on trucks and tires and mileage taxes levied on carriers are added to registration fees and license fees to carry almost the entire burden of highway construction at both the federal and state levels. Some of the money for city streets comes from general taxation and, in some cases, construction charges are

paid by abutting property owners.

Some of the pressure on city finances could easily be relieved if more and more functions of government were paid for by user charges — particularly those functions which serve a minority of the city population.

# Need Foster Homes For B.C. - Henderson Areas

The Henderson District Office of the Nevada State Welfare Division is presently

seeking foster homes and emergency shelter homes in the Henderson - Boulder City

area for children of all ages. Presently the need is acute as an increasing number of chil-

dren require placement outside the parental home. Homes of both types in the local area are needed so that children may remain in their own community near their own schools, relatives, and friends.

The Foster Home Care Program is designed for the child who requires a stable family living situation on a relatively long term basis when placement with the natural parents or relatives is not possible. In this situation the foster family provides a home like place for the child providing the stability, care, and supervision so often lacking in the parental home.

The Emergency Shelter Home Program also provides a stable home - like environment but is designed to provide a short - term temporary

placement while a permanent living situation can be established for the child. Prospective parents for both the Foster Home Program and the Emergency Shelter Home Program must meet State licensing and other criteria and be willing and able to provide a safe, healthy and loving environment.

Basic expenses for children in either such as board, clothing, medical and dental are provided by the State Welfare. The Foster or Shelter Home parents provide a safe and secure home. Each child has a caseworker to help the foster parents with each placement.

Foster Home and Emergency Shelter Home parents come wide cross section of the community. Most

find the experience very rewarding finding satisfaction in meeting a very critical community need. The children needing placement are often unwanted, abused, or neglected children from all sectors of the community. Some children enter our custody through the court system where it has been determined that their own families are unable, for whatever reason to meet their needs.

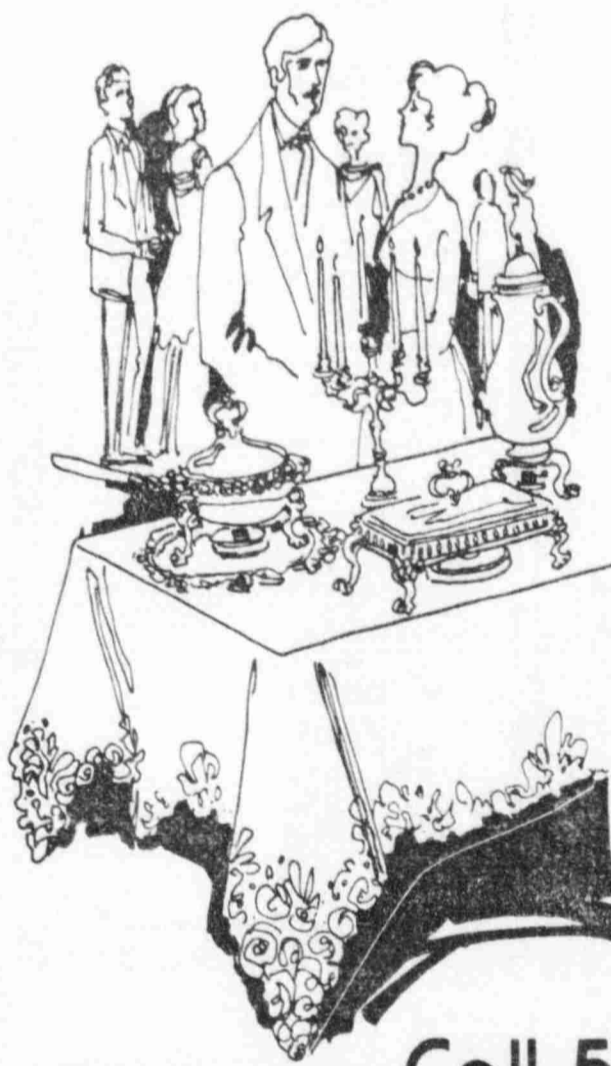

**'ROOTS'**

The fall and winter months are generally stagnant time for most plants. To keep from becoming bored or neglectful of your plants, use this time to groom, rearrange and decorate with your plants to make your home a warmer, greener, and more pleasant place during the gray months to come.

Make or buy a terrarium. Bottle gardens and terrariums provide ideal climatic conditions for your plants, thus protecting them from cold

draughts and dry heat. Terrariums must be kept out of direct sun to prevent scorched leaves.

Invest in some decorative containers, pots, trays and baskets, or find something interesting around the house that you can use to create an effect. Winter is not the time for repotting and since many of the more attractive containers are unsuitable for potting anyway, they can be used to costume plain pots. Merely slip a potted plant inside a decorative container and cover the soil over with moss.

Set up a winter cleaning schedule. Plants need considerably less water in the winter (the soil should be kept barely moist, but not completely dry), but daily mistings are still appreciated. This is also a good time to bathe leaves. Use warm, soapy water and sponge gently, rinsing with clear water.

This is a good time to get your planting and potting equipment in order. Take time to scrub clean all your dirty pots and tools and check to see that you have the materials you need.

### DMV Driver's License Office Begins New Program To Aid Customers

Las Vegas residents changing or renewing their driver's licenses or seeking a duplicate may now set up a special appointment time at the Department of Motor Vehicles Driver's License Sahara Blvd. office in Las Vegas beginning Tuesday, December 6th.

The new pilot project was announced today by Sharon Alcamo, chief of the Department's Driver's License Division. A special phone number has been established for customers to call and make an appointment convenient with their schedules.

The new number is 457-CARS.

Alcamo said that assuming the new pilot program is successful, it will be expanded to other larger Driver's License offices in the near future. Although the pilot appointment program is beginning in the Las Vegas office on Sahara Avenue effective Tuesday, December 6th, it will be extended on an experimental basis to the North Las Vegas branch beginning Monday, December 12th. Appointments for both offices must be made by calling 457-CARS.

"When you phone 457-CARS, a driver's license staff member will set up

an appointment day and time convenient with your schedule and will answer any questions you may have regarding your specific transaction. We have also set up a special "appointments only" window. This will allow you to proceed directly to the window where you will be taken care of quickly. An appointment can also be made by a customer while in the Las Vegas office," Alcamo explained.

"For North Las Vegas, if a customer comes into the office and there is a time available during that day, an appointment can be made to come back at a later time. If the customer wants to make an appointment for another day; the person must still call 457-CARS."

Alcamo emphasized that the pilot program applies only to driver's license renewals, duplicates and changes of address and - or name. The program does not apply to those seeking a driver's license for the first time due to the additional testing process involved and the additional information required in this type of transaction.

Alcamo noted the Department will start accepting telephone calls for appointments beginning Monday, December 5th. Signs announcing the program will be placed in the Las Vegas and North Las Vegas offices.

She stressed that the new telephone number serves two important functions: it allows customers to set up convenient times to come into the office and to obtain information as to what documents will be needed to complete the transaction when they come in.

Alcamo noted that the Department was able to

begin the pilot program because of a new computer system just instituted.

"The new computer system has already decreased our computer processing time by one-third." She said the driver's license staff has just finished training in the new system and is "quite excited about the results."

As Shirley Gurry, driver's license clerk in the Las Vegas office, describes the system ... "I find I am able to process 130 transactions daily compared to 100 under the former computer system."

The new driver's license pilot program is the second phase of a statewide Department project to improve service to the public. The first phase involved a special system in the Department's Registration Division which allows customers in Re-

gistration Division branch offices in Las Vegas and Reno to leave their documents in certain types of transactions and pick up the completed documents the following day. The new driver's license pilot program will apply only to the Las Vegas office beginning December 6th and the North Las Vegas Driver's License office beginning December 12th. Similar programs are being considered for other Driver's License offices statewide.

Larry Franklin, supervisor of the Driver's License Division Southern Nevada offices, urged the public to use the 457-CARS telephone number only for appointments.

"For any other questions or information, please call our regular telephone number, 385-0231," he said.

### Vehicle Registration Renewals Due

If your Nevada vehicle license expires this month, you are urged by the Department of Motor Vehicles to apply for your 1978 registration renewal sticker now and to make your application by mail.

Harold Harmon, assistant registration chief, noted that the deadline for December registration renewals is the 31st and "there is no grace

period in Nevada."

## Nevada Observers Tell About Women's Conference

A number of local women who attended the International Women's Year conference recently in Houston, made their report public this week.

The women, who paid their own way to the conference said, "It is impossible to relate in just a few words the impact and the evil fury of this conference -- it was a trip into intellectual darkness and moral depravity -- all in the name of women's rights."

They deplored the fact that \$5 million of federal tax dollars was spent on the conference which they said was a pre-packaged and pre-written media event, staged to sell to the Congress the "radical women's platform for social revolution in the United States."

"A few of the states managed to send conservative delegations, however, the liberals were ready for even this eventuality and they 'balanced' the conservative delegations by the appointment of delegates at large which minimized the conservative influence," they said.

"True to the pre-planned program, 25 of the 26 conference resolutions were overwhelmingly passed," they said. The program included the equal rights amendment, abortion, lesbian privileges, more money to minority women, more money for welfare, and sex education in the schools.

"People opposing the ERA were shouted down," they said. Alternate resolutions and amendments were not permitted. Female homosexuality is wearing a new dress called "sexual preference," and at the time the lesbian resolution was considered between one-third and one half of the delegates and the gallery were wearing the orange armbands which were the badge of the lesbians. On a prearranged cue, hundreds of pastel balloons with the slogan "We are everywhere," were passed out to people at the conference.

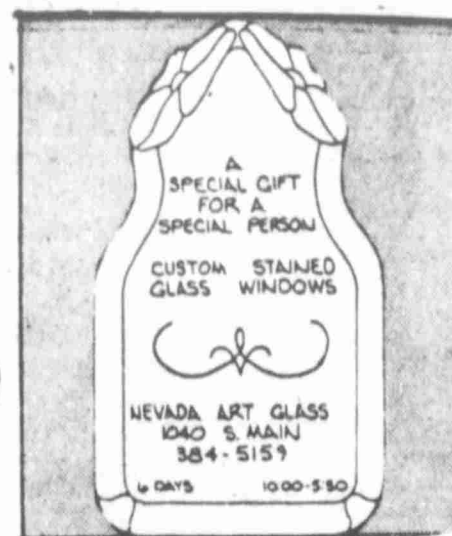
A comprehensive resolution dealing with increased benefits to welfare and minority groups was adopted and when a delegate rose to inquire about the estimated cost of this program, she was ruled out of order.

"Housewives were told that they were beneath contempt and that they should stop doing what they do so lovingly until they are paid in dollars," they reported.

On Saturday afternoon over 15,000 Christians gathered at the Astroarena in Houston to protest the IWY conference and the pre-packaged plan.

The people attending this counter conference were told, "The United States is the last beacon of hope and liberty

where parents have the right to determine what road their children will take, not the state."

### BLM Recruits For Summer Jobs

The "Summer Help Wanter" sign is out at BLM.

Most of the positions offered by the Bureau of Land Management are fire fighter jobs in the federal agency's six districts state-wide. Some districts will have jobs for aides or technicians in the range, recreation, wildlife, engineering, or surveying programs as well.

In Las Vegas, summer jobs are currently limited to fire fighting, according to Phyllis Shaw, administrative officer in BLM's Las Vegas District Office. Of the 21 slots to be filled, 11 will be located in the city and 10 at the district's Caliente office.

The jobs will run from mid-May to mid-October, depending on the weather and fire season. Salaries can range from

### Southern Nevada Water Project II Moves To Permanent Office

The Bureau of Reclamation's Southern Nevada Water Project II construction staff has moved from temporary quarters in Boulder City to a permanent office at 834 East Lake Mead Drive, Henderson, Lower Colorado Regional Director Manuel Lopez, Jr., has announced.

Making the move were Project Construction Engineer Don Fillis and 29 members of his staff. The new mailing address is Post Office Box

E. Henderson, Nevada 89015, Tele; 702 - 565 - 6471.

Construction is expected to get underway in December on the first major contract to build the \$110 million Southern Nevada Water Project's second stage that will deliver additional Colorado River water to the Las Vegas metropolitan area. The \$3.2 million contract was awarded last September to a joint venture of Kordick and Rados, Irvine, California, for construction of the second stage Main Aqueduct "B" Line.

The "B" line will begin at the site of proposed Pumping Plant 1B, to be built at the Alfred Merritt Smith Water Treatment Facility near Lake Mead. It will extend to Regulating Tank No. 2, adjacent to the east portal of the Project's River Mountains Tunnel. The "B" line will parallel the existing first stage main Aqueduct "A" line.
