

Chamber Asks Council To Change Donation Policy On Christmas

A request from the Chamber of Commerce for \$1,000 to help with Christmas decorations, was allowed on the next city council agenda despite a previous ruling from the council that the city will not donate to any organization.

The council had made a pol-

icy for the administration not to place any requests on the council agenda.

Duane Laubach, president of the Chamber of Commerce, in a letter to the council said they were able to acquire sur-

plus garland and pole wraps due the fact that downtown

Las Vegas was changing its Christmas decoration program. He said they were able to make the purchase for about ten cents on the dollar for the whole lot. The total price was \$1,476. They paid half the amount and had planned to pick up the other half with

money from the city.

"In the interim," Laubach said, "the city was put in the awkward position and as a result adopted a policy restricting donations to civic groups and organizations. The Christmas donations were included in that policy."

Laubach said he believes that the Christmas program is not necessarily performed by a single group or organization. Others are involved such as the Kiwanis, senior citizens, Boys' club, Moose Lodge, Rotary club, the schools and individuals. He said he felt it

was a total community effort.

"We would encourage the council to reconsider the Henderson Christmas program as not being part of the intent of the policy adopted by the council regarding donations," Laubach concluded.

Water Main Bid Let

A man named Anselmo moves into the city hall in a rare new position ... as head of public safety -- more detailed -- as chief of the fire and chief of the police department.

It's a new idea among cities and in some cases results are already on record showing not only a financial savings but other plus points.

This is to state that when new city manager Bob Campbell urged the city council to consider this innovation, what with the resignation into retirement of the city's two fire and police chiefs, the manager was asking for something that could be good -- or could be bad.

At this writing we have a "let's wait and see" attitude. We assume Campbell is a well backgrounded city manager who when he makes a suggestion is willing to rise or fall on it.

Now -- this wonderful community will be a test spot for a new idea in public safety. Hurray!

But for the community's sake -- it has to work. It should be shelved in a hurry if it doesn't work ... as in this case people's lives and property are at stake all 24 hours of the day. Protection to the community is a must .. at all times. Crime must be wiped out when it arises. The streets must always be safe to walk on .. day or night.

If the firemen and the policemen can provide this safety even better than it has been, fine ... let's have it.

From one who best saw streets walkable by young and old.. and in a city of a half million (Milwaukee) ... I cling to the idea that when you put policemen on the streets ... walking their beats night and day with walkie talkies while others ride in squad cars to cover the remote areas ... we felt that was the best crime deterrent ever. Times must have changed for nary do I see a man walking a beat and mostly do I see many local officers racing after you and me on the highway when really they should be patrolling our in-city streets, alleys and side-streets. I'd let the highway patrol come from the state ... force them to be community effort, by legislative action, by pleas to the governor. That's police talk.

Now -- firemen talk. It would seem logical that the city's new safety chief will soon put into effect that method that will provide best use of men's time, best use of the equipment, best cooperation from the public as to inspection processes, education on how citizens can be a part of the safety picture. A bid of \$62,344.28 from Wirthlin's Trenching of Las Vegas, was accepted by the city council Monday night to construct a water main to Lake Mead Drive.

The bid was the lowest responsible bid for four submitted to the city, according to Jeff Billingsley, public works director.

The works consists of constructing a 12 inch water main beginning on Hillcrest Road running out to Lake Mead Drive to the west. Two change orders for work on O'Callaghan Park were approved by the council.

Jacks Trucking Co. requested an additional \$1,370 to increase the sidewalk square footage from 7500 to 9310.

Corona Construction Co., was increased \$1,347 from the original amount due to electric and wall material change. Billingsley said both amounts were justified.

In other actions the council--

--Approved the appointment of Gloria Castleberry to the city planning commission.

--Approved a resolution order the preparing and filing of plans and assessment roll 752 for water to section 4.

--Amended the uniform building code by establishing a \$20 inspection fee for V.A. and FHA and similar inspections.

--Approved an amendment to the business license ordinance deleting requirements for contractors' bond.

--Approved a financial institution of Lomas and Nettleton Co. in lieu of bond for Doorn Estates.

--Approved a tavern - package liquor license for William Gibson at the Gold Mine Tavern.

--Approved an application to the federal government, Farmer's Home administration grant for New Horizons Industrial Park.

--Sent to committee bills adopting the national fire codes and abolishing the traffic commission and recreating a citizen's traffic advisory board.

Would Employ 500

A manufacturing firm which would employ over 500 persons has had officials in the city this week looking over the possibility of locating in Henderson, it was learned here.

The firm, which asked not to be identified, send representatives here Tuesday to look over possible sites for their operations which would move here from another state. A decision is expected to be made this week.

If the firm selects Henderson it would hope to be in operation by next May.

This large firm, along with smaller ones have been looking at Henderson on almost a daily basis. The Levi Strauss selection of Henderson for a distribution plant, seems to have influenced others to look at this location. Also the location of the Buster Brown plant in Henderson which will be located near the Va-Tech School in Green Valley. Levi Strauss is presently constructing its facility on Boulder Highway across from the Old West development as a family resort, will give Henderson a new type industry to attract tourists. Previously Henderson has been known as the Industrial Center of the State.

Old Las Vegas, first phase, is expected to open in June.

SHOPPING CENTERS COMING

Three major commercial areas are developing in Henderson.

One is a six-acre parcel of land being developed by a Salt Lake City firm between McDonalds and Stepman Dodge. This will include numerous shops, a major supermarket and drug store, along with a financial institution.

Another is a shopping center in the Victory Village area of the city along Boulder Highway which will include K-Mart and related stores.

Along Lake Mead Drive in the Victory Village area, plans are formed for a travel trailer park, motel, and apartment complex. A shopping area is also being planned for the Green Valley area of the city along Sunset Drive.

There are a number of housing developments, some ready to go and some in the future. Meyers, Lewis Homes and Chism, are continuing to build homes in the Horizon Drive area of the city south of the golf course.

Approximately 1,000 homes have been approved for the Green Valley area around the Paradise Valley golf course.

Individual home building is at an all-time high around section 19, section 27, and Mission Hills. Just recently the city council approved the sale of 120 acres to Lewis Homes in section 27 for approximately 400 new homes.

Doorn Estates, of approximately 150 homes, are planned for a subdivision near Palo Verde. Another

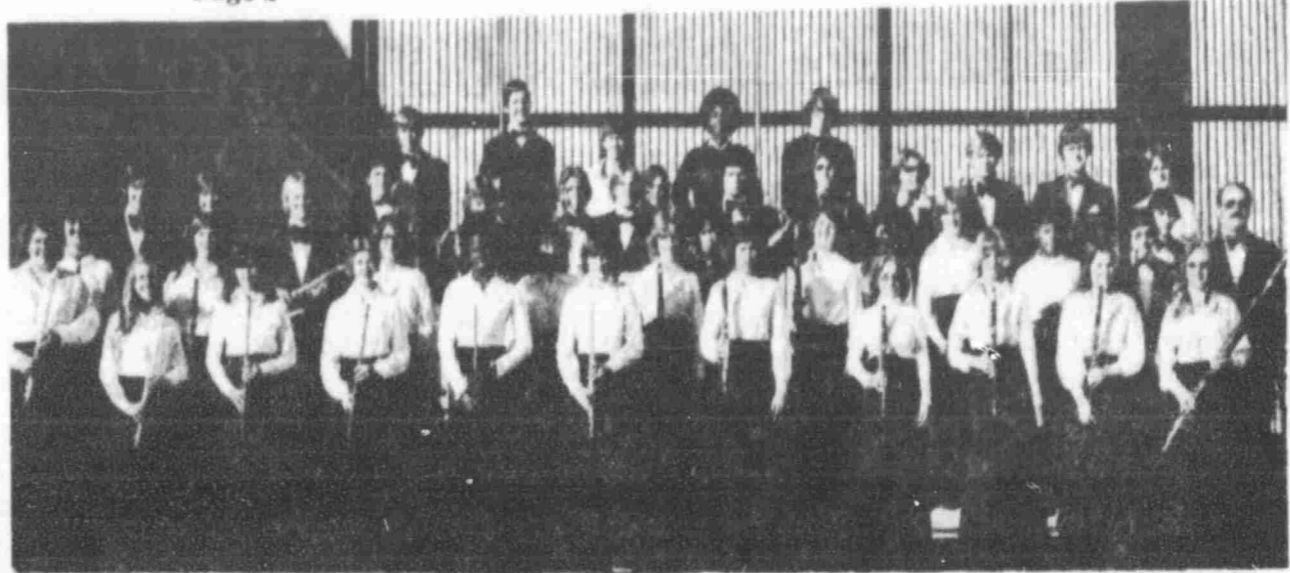

City Manager Bob Campbell said the short term improvement for the south end of the city (Mission Hills, Levi Strauss, Section 27) is to create a looping system by going under the tracks at a cost of around \$25,000.

Campbell said he is attempting to get federal funding for this project and should know within the next few weeks. At this time it "looks good," he said.

If the grant is not approved, then the city will have to approve funding from other sources.

The other area of concern is Green Valley. Jeff Billingsley, Public Works Director, said he had met with the engineer from American Nevada Corp. and would be meeting before the holidays with the engineer from Collins Bros. to see if they could come up with some kind of a program to help solve the immediate solution.

Industrial consultant Don Dawson said the city must be more positive. "It needs positive action," he warned and "you need to know what the alternatives might be."

Thomas Jester of Nelson Dies

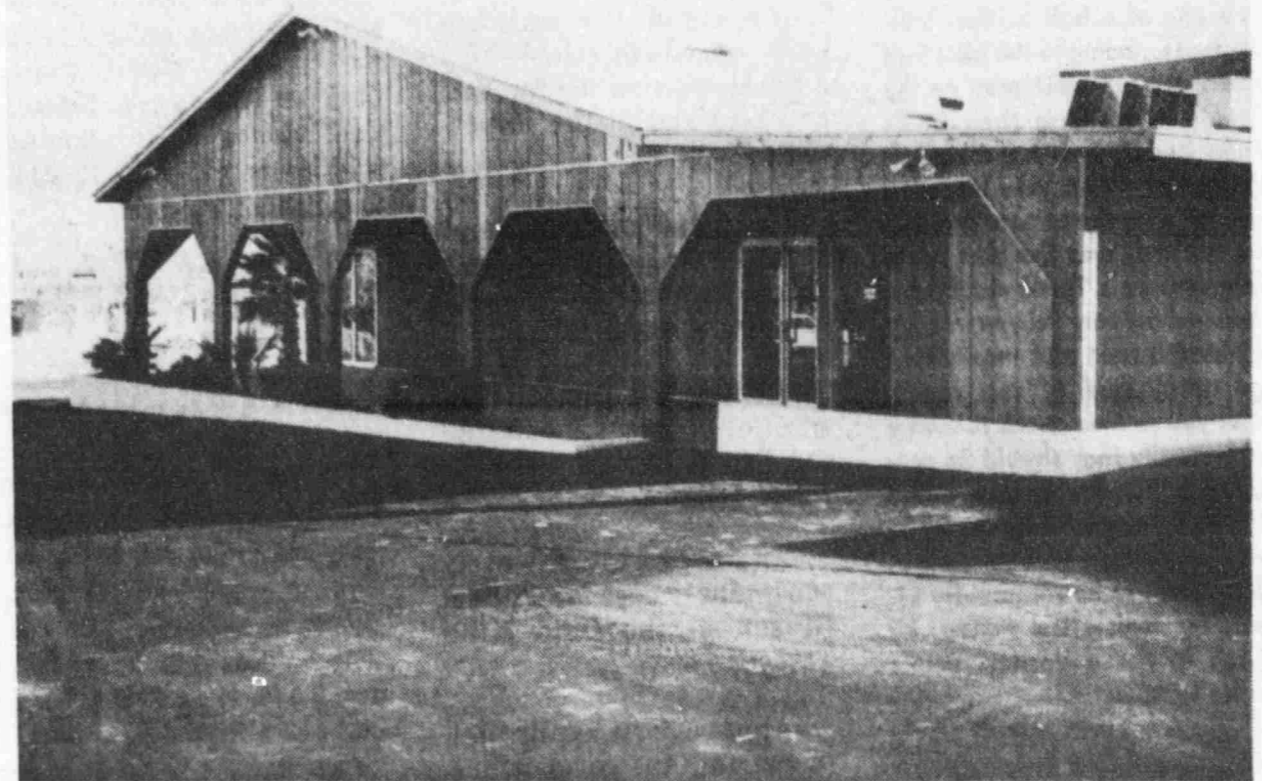
Thomas Joseph Jester, 82, passed away December 13 in Nelson, Nevada. He had resided there since 1956 and was a retired deputy law officer.

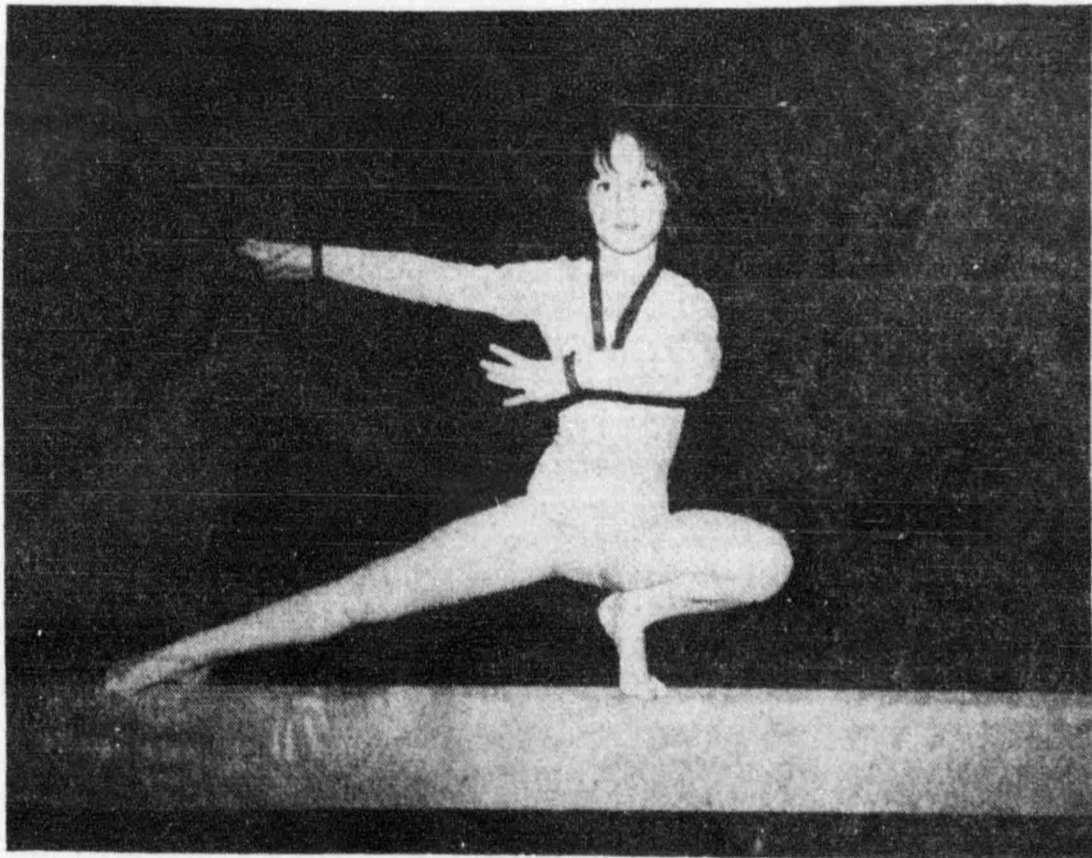

The numbers after each name indicated the length of time each girl has been participating in the local gymnastic program.

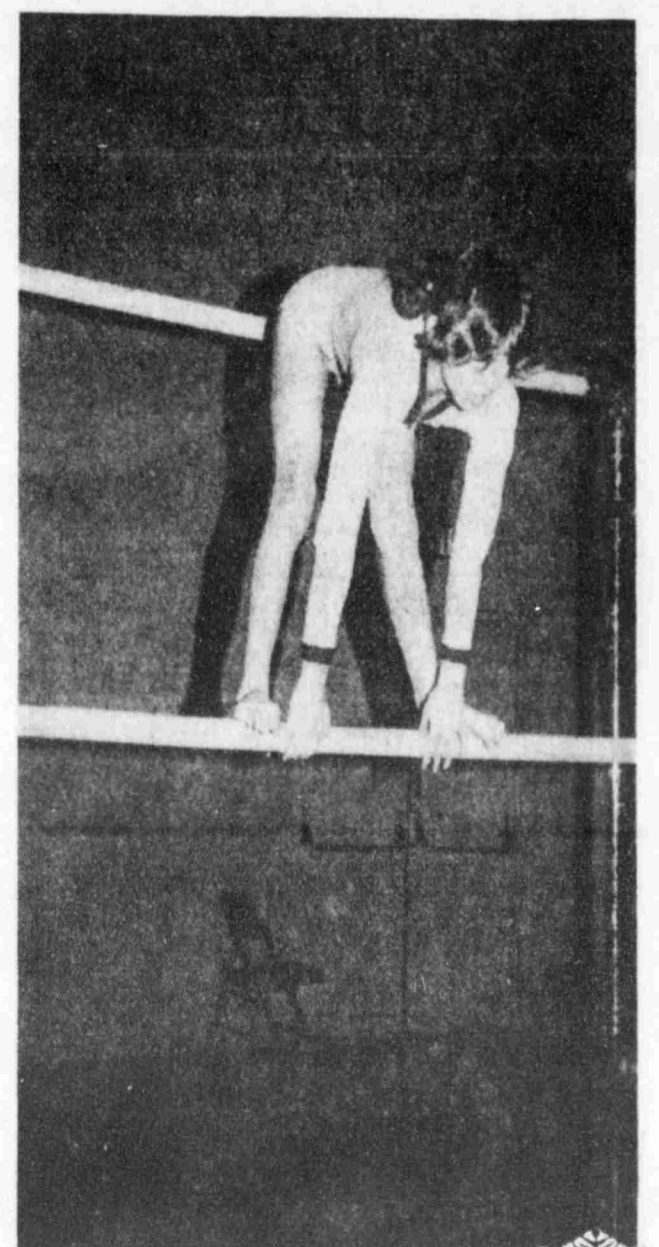

Henderson—Its Economic History

While much of the Council business would be related to sale of the new acreage during 1959, a new budget also had to be prepared. After the usual discussions and cuts, the 1959-60 budget of \$733,684 was approved, and the Council enthusiastically noted the total budget was \$40,126 less than the last year's budget. And a new income for the city came on April 6, when after much heated discussion, the Council voted 4-1 to extend gambling in Henderson by approving a 175 chair bingo parlor application for the Henderson Bowl in the present Safeway Shopping Center.

Meanwhile new expenses accumulated, and in March the council voted approval for construction of a new 2 1/2 million gallon reservoir an estimated price of \$197,840.

In the Legislature, the Assembly had already passed a primary election bill introduced by Henderson's Assemblyman James I. Gibson. During the last days of the session this bill was signed into law, creating the necessity for a primary election in Henderson within a few weeks. The expense would have to come from the General Fund, and the Council authorized the city clerk to make necessary arrangements for conduct of the first primary election in Henderson on May 4, at a cost not to exceed \$3000.

In his lengthy report on legislative activity published in the "Henderson Home News" on April 2, Gibson included a short sentence that should have served as a warning to his constituents: "The worry that is in the mind of most of the legislators is that of deficit spending," he wrote. But even though Henderson's government was already troubled by deficit spending, little attention was paid to Gibson's succinct statement.

Over the months since incorporation, it had been common practice for city officials to borrow from the utility fund when money from the general fund was not sufficient to meet various payments.

However, when bond issues were approved by the first Council, Ordinances 165, 168 and 231 were adopted regulating the manner in which income from water and sewer could be utilized. According to the regulations as outlined by Conway, Moe & Hibbs in their "Report on Examination and Financial Statements June 30, 1959," the council was advised that income from the utility systems was to be placed in a special fund.

When the city attorney examined the report, he quickly wrote the Council advising them they could not legally transfer monies from the water fund to cover deficits in the general fund. "I regret to advise

...." he wrote, "that under the provisions of Ordinance 168 those funds were restricted to maintenance and operation of the respective systems, and payments of principal and interest on the bonds issued to upgrade the system.... Any overage must be used for... for creation of a Water Improvement Bond Reserve Fund."

But only three weeks before they received this advice, the Council had voted to transfer \$24,000 from the utility fund to the general fund to meet the current payroll. At this time too, three new councilmen, Franklin Morrell, P.T. Stevens, and Pete R. Mendive

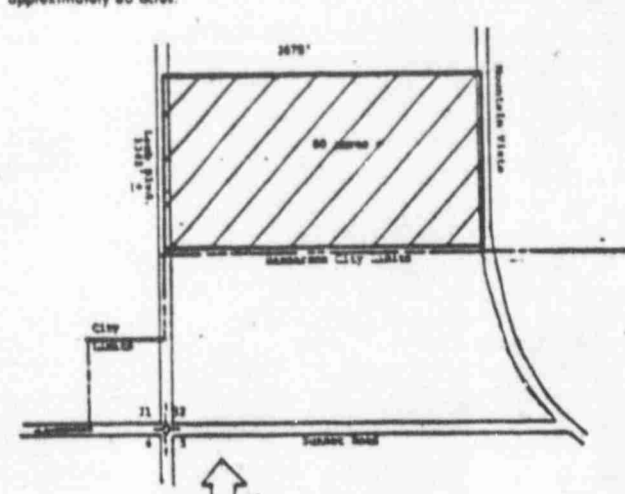

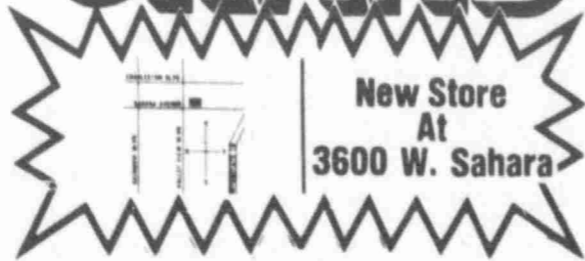
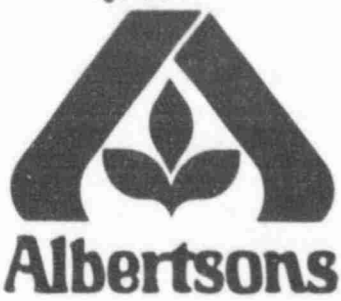

The phone rings--we soon go to 6 countries with Presidential Press

Lucille, our busy girl, phone answerer,

came into the little office cubicle wherein my world revolves and if there is a woman who never gets excited or shows one whit of emotion it is Lucille.

But on this day she is rushing in. She is shaking. She looks straight at me and throws out the statement like one would yell "Charge" at a Rebel game!

"The White House Press office is on line one," she says.

And like a blithering idiot, I start gulping, straightening my tie, brushing my hair, and then grabbing hold of

myself--because I know it's got to be a joke from Van Valey or Dick Stewart or Wendell Cutler or Jack Miller, etc., I pick up the phone and say, 'Yes, this is Zenoff talking.'

Turns out it IS the White House press section and a Mr. Lebo informs me that my name has been included as a member of the press corps that we travel with President Carter when he goes to six countries Dec. 31 to Jan. 7.

Mr. Lebo explains many things, my heart pounds and my mind wanders as I give about

sixteen hail mary's in Yiddish, how lucky I am to get such a trip... me with our country weekly papers traveling with the New York Times, maybe Barbara Walters, certainly the Washington Post, boy, you name it.

Mr. Lebo's voice drones on--as it seems he has 97 of these calls to make to officially announce to each who is going what the ABCs are.

Take off is five minutes after the President, from Andrews Air Force Base, Washington, D.C. at six a.m. ... be there at five to check in.

You fly direct to Warsaw, Poland. Gads, that's behind the Iron Curtain and I'm Jewish. I wonder if he knows that isn't Kosher or maybe this new thing of Sadat and stuff is taking over.

You spend two days there, then you fly to Teheran, Iran, where you spend New Year's Day covering the presi-

dent in his conferences, etc. Then you're off to New Delhi, India. Boy, if I can but see the Taj Mahal, one of the seven wonders of the world... it'll make the trip. I think of the one statement a friend of mine said upon his return from India recently, "It smells like urine... the whole area."

And then, Mr. Lebo adds, you fly to Saudi Arabia and spend two days there. Oh gosh, that's the Arab country... where I'm not as welcome as I am when I stop in to see Selma Abdullah Bartlett. Or maybe this is the start of something else.

And then to Paris for two days, one spent in going with Mr. President to the battlefields of the Normandy beachhead... The Eiffel Tower! Gosh won't they love me at the Boulder art festival when I tell them about walking the Louvre. Or isn't that how you spell it Lorna?

And then a day at the NATO headquarters in Belgium.

Mr. Lebo says you bring clothing for two types of climate... cold as in Poland... hot as in India... that you can carry only one suitcase, a typewriter and a carry-on bag. You must get cholera shots, small-pox shots, gamma globulin shots and take malaria pills. You must fill out info cards for your visas... and you must be in Washington on the 28th to pick up your identification tags. How do I get into the White House entrance... Just phone and we'll tell you.

And Mr. Lebo says--now you phone Mr. Robert Manning and he'll go over the costs and financial matters as, you see, the government does not pay for this trip. The costs are kept of the press plane, added up and divided among the media equally. Imagine we paying the same as the L.A. Times, Boston Herald, Atlanta Constitution. Doesn't sound right--but this was not said aloud... believe me... for I might have heard a click at Mr. Lebo's end of the line.

So--I phoned Mr. Manning and got the--Oh yes, you're on our list. You're new with us so you'll have to establish a credit. Physical Therapists Lift Ban On Advertising

Action by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) to lift the nationwide ban against advertising by

physical therapists will make their services better known to consumers and will enable consumers and referring

specialists to make informed choices when those services are required, according to D. Keith Kleven, M.S., R.P.T., President of the Nevada chapter of the association.

"Because, as physical therapists, we give treatment only to patients referred to us, the 'consumers' who will receive this information include the medical doctors, dentists, osteopaths and podiatrists who refer patients to us for

treatment, as well as the general public," Kleven said.

In its newly revised "Guide for Professional Conduct," APTA's Judicial Committee interpreted a recent change in the Association's Code of Ethics as permitting the advertisement of fees for initial evaluations and for routine physical therapy services. Under the new guidelines, physical therapists will also be able to advertise certain factual information about themselves.

Kleven pointed out that physical therapy's role in health care has grown rapidly in the last dozen years. Many health insurance plans, including Medicare, now provide some coverage for physical therapy services. "Despite this growth, too many people still don't know about the service we provide and most people don't have comparative information on the costs of those services," Kleven said. "By lifting its man on advertising, APTA has removed a barrier to the public's right to information about physical therapy."

Advertising by physical therapists must conform to specific guidelines laid down by

APTA's Judicial Committee. The revised Guide, binding on all members, states that "the physical therapist shall not use, or participate in the use of, any form of communication containing a false, fraudulent, misleading, deceptive, self-laudatory or unfair statement or claim." Statements which promise a favorable result "are unethical." In providing information about himself, the physical therapist must avoid testimonials and incorrect or incomplete facts.

Kleven emphasized that physical therapists

are health professionals with degrees or post-graduate training in physical therapy. They must pass rigorous licensure examinations in order to practice.

Some physical therapists serve as consultants, teachers or researchers but most are in clinical practice where they work to reduce and prevent disability and pain. Among the patients treated by physical therapists are people suffering from strokes, arthritis, backache, fractures, amputations, spinal cord injuries, cerebral palsy,

cystic fibrosis, birth defects, and other neurologic, musculoskeletal and cardiopulmonary problems.

The APTA, founded in 1921 and with chapters in all fifty states, the District of Columbia and

Puerto Rico, is a member of the National Health Council, the Coalition of Independent Health Professions and the World Confederation for Physical Therapy. The Nevada chapter has 55 members.

October Citation Summary

According to Nevada Department of Fish and Game's October citation summary, 177 errant outdoorsmen paid a total \$11,177 in fines and bail forfeitures for infractions of state fish, game, boating and litter laws, the largest monthly total this year.

DFG figures show that the most prevalent violation processed during the month was carrying a loaded rifle or shotgun in or on a vehicle. The 21 persons convicted of this offense paid a total of \$1,050. All will be required, under state law, to take and pass an approved hunter safety course before they will be allowed to purchase another Nevada hunting license.

Also leading the list of common infractions are failure to properly punch an animal harvest tag (e.g. deer tag) with 19 hunters paying a total \$1,050 and 18 cited for fishing without a valid license who paid \$900 in fines and bail forfeitures. Other common violations included hunting prohibited hours, fishing prohibited methods, and unlawful possession of game during a closed season.

Although violations of Nevada's boating laws were light during the month, 14 individuals paid a total of \$720 for failing to carry sufficient or proper type of personal flotation devices on their boats. Two instances of reckless boat operation resulted in fined of \$100 per operator with one individual apprehended for operating his boat while intoxicated. This person paid \$250 to the state court for this violation.

Fines assessed and collected by state courts for infractions of Nevada's fish, game, boat and litter laws are

deposited in a special state school fund. Bail forfeitures are retained by the county where assessed.

Transportation Commission To Be Studied

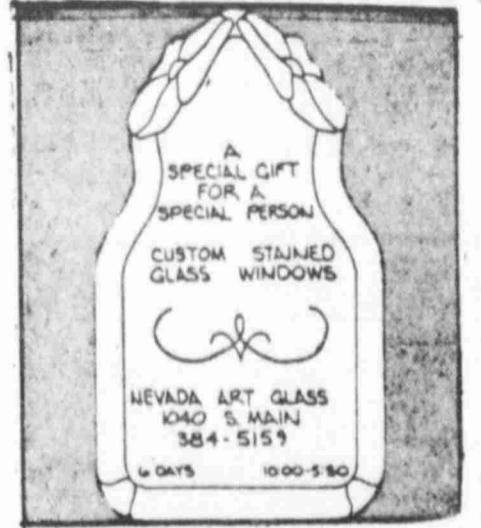
The Subcommittee to study the Creation of a Transportation Commission in Nevada will meet in Elko on December 16 at the Elko County Library, according to Assemblywoman Karen W. Hayes who is chairman of the study.

Committee members include Assemblymen Jack Jeffrey, Nick Horn and Jim Schofield from Clark County; Bob Barengo, Washoe; Alan Glover, Carson City; and Senators Keith Ashworth and Bill Herndstadt, Clark County.

The agenda for the meeting will focus on the two problems. Anyone with knowledge of problems in either area, as well as possible solutions, is invited to attend the hearing.

DMV Launches New Computer System

The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles has begun a new distributed processing computer system ... the first of its kind in any Nevada state governmental agency.

Hale Bennett, chief of the Department's Automation (data processing) Division, today said the Department is utilizing "mini-computers" in four of its offices.

The "distributed tele-processing system" allows the Department to continue processing customer transactions through the mini-computer even when the State's main computer in Carson City may be down.

Bennett said the Department has placed the "mini-computers" in the Reno, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas and Carson City offices.

The new system will have its greatest effect on the Department's Registration and Driver License Divisions which process hundreds of vehicle registration and driver license requests daily.

Senior Computer Systems Analyst Donna Marsing, who is also manager of Computer Systems Analysis for Automation Division, designed the wrote the specifications for the entire Registration project on the new system. She is now training and implementing the Registration procedures in branch offices.

"After only two days experience on the new system, each Registration employee in the Reno office was able to process up to 25 per cent more transactions daily," said Marsing. "The new terminals are currently being installed in the Department's Las Vegas and North Las Vegas offices."

"Not only should the new system increase output," added Marsing, "but it will improve the accuracy rate in our branch offices."

Marsing noted that the new program will greatly reduce the customer transaction time at the counters.

Jim Whitworth, computer systems analyst for the Automation Division, is handling the implementation and training of the program in the Department's Driver License Division.

He noted that in just a few days of training, driver license personnel have been able to cut their computer processing time on the computer terminals by one-third.

"Multiply that transaction time by hundreds of customers daily and the resultant time savings is truly substantial," he said.

Division Chief Bennett noted the Department has just touched "the tip of the iceberg" in using the new system.

"There is a whole litany of transactions which this computer system can handle which we have not yet even begun to tap." Bennett said the Division will be working on future projects including: an accounts payable system for the entire Department; an automated vehicle title program; a microfiche retrieval system and the Failure - To - Appear Warrant project scheduled to begin next July.

Bennett added that the cost of the new system is no more than the Department cost under the former computer system.

Wanna Live To Be A 100?

Let's Hear It From "Death Valley Johnny"

May 15.

We've told this story before -- a few years back -- but because we ran into the strange little fellow again recently, and because maybe it'll give you and yours and me and mine another day or two of life hereabouts, we tell it to you again today.

It's the story of little Frances John "Johnny" Marcy of Death Valley who will be 83 come this

You say there'll be a lot of guys named Johnny who'll be 83 and more come this May 15, but we say listen my children and you shall hear the nuts and bolts on this particular Johnny who is more active than Joe Namath, nearly as good a goer as Jimmy Connors at this date in his working life.

For Johnny is the night cleaning man at Furnace Creek Inn. He works five

during-the-nights a week scrubbing the tile floors, cleaning the acres of carpets that line the halls of the fabulous spot that is world-famous to visitors.

Death Valley and Death Valley Scotty are always said in the same breath thereabouts -- since the latter fellow in the early 1900s was a most fabulous character. But Scotty's story dealt with gold in them thar hills and hidden wonderlands that grew and grew as man's tales often do on the re-telling.

Now, though, this man Johnny is the living Scotty for tales of today and not yesterday. This man Johnny's story is one where a fellow about 37 years ago decided to go straight...take hold of himself and see if he could quit drinking, smoking, tearing his body apart by wine-women-and-song... and counter attack by putting into effect a battle plan...the plan being how to live to be 100.

In his fifties he decided this and he is now going to on 83. He is now a scamp-

ering, muscular, active little man who might well be on some country's Olympic rapid-walking team you see in the movies every four years.

What makes it come home to roost is that Johnny tells us how to do the same...he tells you here and now how to live to be a 100.

"Our body is a temple, given to us to destroy or live to be a 100," he starts. "Remove all bad habits and replace them with good habits."

Now that's preaching and you didn't turn to this column today to get a sermon.

So we get down to the nitty gritty.

Here is what you mix together and eat every day. Almonds, pecans, walnuts, dates, figs, raisins, prunes, fruits [peeled], a spoon of olive oil and three spoons of honey. Apple juice poured into this concoction and there you have it -- the elixer of life.

You eat this main dish at noon and at times of the

day you get hungry. You make up fruit dishes for between meals naashing.

Now sticking to just this is tough, Johnny explains, but only until you become used to it. Self control -- you must keep hold of that.

"You get it" is his start of every sentence and often the finish as you get up and walk the floors in the early hours with Johnny, listening as he pours you coffee, as he says...don't forget, a bowl of mixed fruit, no sugar, little honey, olive oil -- boy what a clean bowel you'll have -- and no odor, he assures you -- because of nature's cleansing. His preachings urge you to be a "fruitarian" with him.

"You get it"...eat the right food. Fruit [no skins] and nuts, no vegetables. It's the olive oil and honey that make the difference. No sugar. Don't worry if you are a short sleeper. Quit that coffee, as he pours me another. Johnny sleeps four or five hours a night. He climbs up the little mountain behind the Inn each day, carrying his cuttings off the Inn's throw away food from the guests...cuttings and slicings from the steaks, chops, fish, etc...and when he gets up there high he has his little garden spot where the birds come and eat and sip water and they sing to him. He raves about how smart they are and how they intercommunicate.

"This is between you and me" is another Johnny saying as his story continues...this strange little man with the Kojak bare-head and the little Irish smile.

"I go to the bar and have a drink of orange juice. A fellow called me a religious fanatic...and I took his hand and said... God Bless You...you talked as you wanted and I had the freedom to bless him...right at the bar in front of them all. My orange juice satisfied me," the irrepressible little Johnny said.

Deep breathing is important. Pull in that fresh air, and he demonstrates. "You get it"

Pull that air in. Then hold it. Hold for three seconds. Then blow it out. "That sends out the old foul air from down Here."

Personally, speaking man to man, he says, "I found out women dissa-

pate when they are pregnant...it all goes into the child. Love is beautiful if you can live as one. He explains he learned it from living from a wife who was paralyzed and he learned to have the self control to take care of her as long as she lived

There's nothing wrong with me, Johnny goes on, I like sex. I'm just trying to see how it feels to live to be a 100. Doing it on fruit and nuts and self control. It's easy.

"I don't condemn nobody. That's up to them what they do. But I see it all. When you talk to a drunk, it's like talking to a wall. Lack of control and soon your body can't take it anymore. You lose the red corpuscles and the whites take over...and you die."

"I eat when I'm hungry. No chickens. No eggs. No dead flesh of any kind...and that includes fish. I can do two men's work and think nothing of it. Fruit and nuts. You get it. Peel the skin off peaches, pears, apples when making fruit juices in your blender. Grind nuts fine. Take a spoon and chew them as you would fruit. Don't overdo it. Live moderately. You don't have to eat so much. When you drink a liquid you should sip it, enjoy it. Most people gulp it. Let your saliva masticate your food." When Johnny smoked, he said, his saliva dried up and the taste was gone. Now, he says, he gets the natural taste from natural foods.

"We have a colon. Not a stomach. Food sticks in there unless we let saliva work on it. A gorilla lives on berries and nuts and fruits. No dead flesh. That's why a gorilla is ten times stronger than man. We don't have a stomach tha grinds it up like a bird can eat stones and a separate stomach grinds it into a powder. Camels have four stomachs to digest the different foods it eats. Cows have three. Calves get well drinking milk from mother. Air spoils milk. Milk isn't pure when the air hits it."

"You get it. I call it being reborn again. Same person in a higher self. By self control you become a different person. You must wake up and realize we must master the habits. Same man, same body, but complete change. Fruit and nuts

and olive oil and honey. Get it. That's between you and me. Man to man."

Frances John Marcy went back to his broom and mop. We went back to our bed...four-thirty ayem...convinced God had sent a message for me...thru his man Johnny -- which we could pass on to you -- so we can all live to 100.

Real Estate Taxes Due

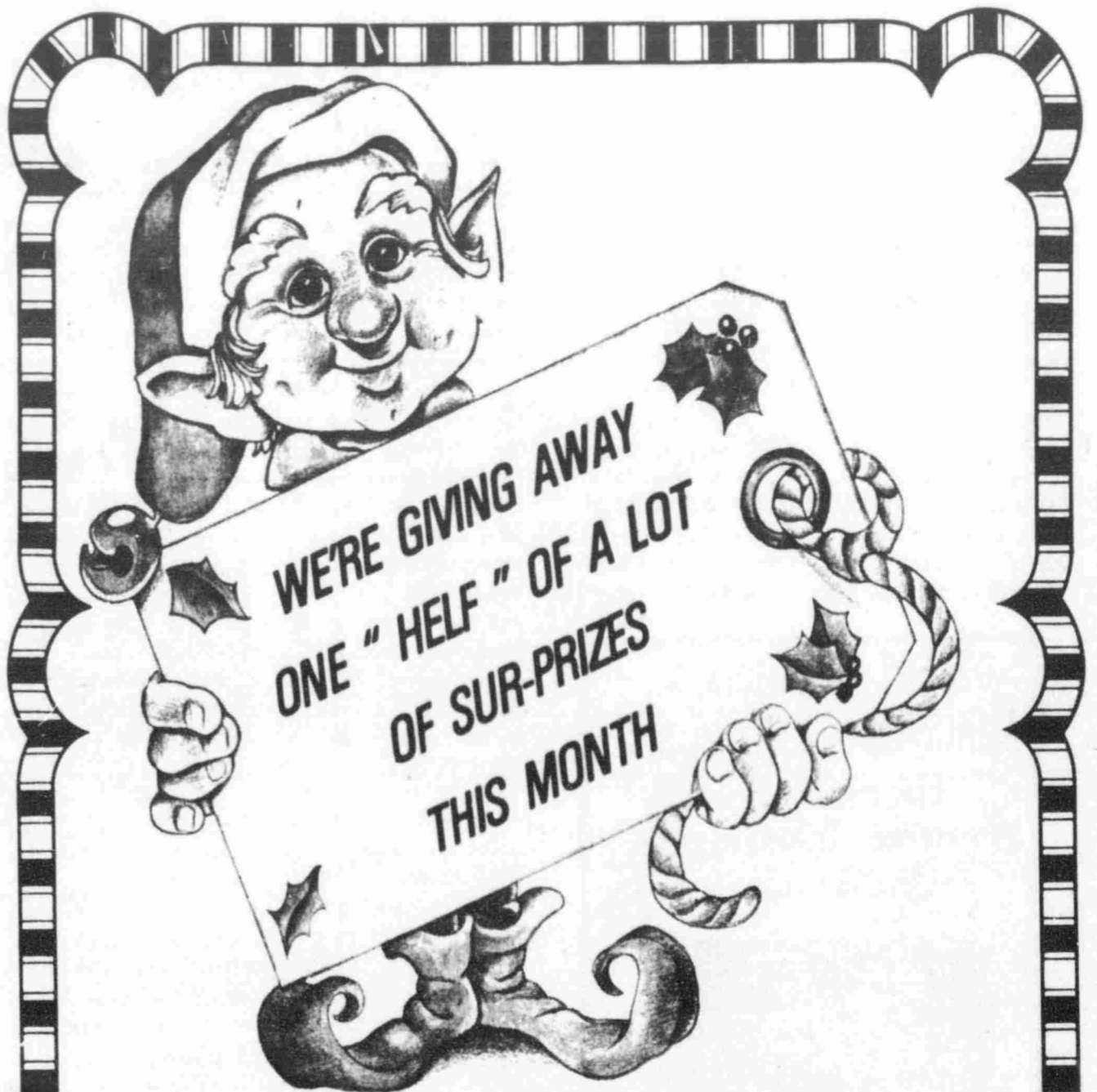

Teachers Hired By School District This Year

The Clark County School District hired 560 new teachers this year -- 307 to fill vacancies and the balance to handle increased enrollment and to make at least some inroads into teacher workload at the junior high level.

By far the largest group -- 189 teachers -- are Nevada residents, but they came from 43 states and one foreign country. 296 have college training beyond their Bachelor's Degree, including 91 with Master's Degrees and three with Doctor's Degrees. 305 have previous teaching experience, while 182 are new to the classroom and another 73 have had experience only as substitute teachers.

80 of the newly hired teachers have worked for the Clark County

School District before and are returning after leaves of absence or are simply reentering the profession after resigning some time in the past for a variety of reasons.

The 560 hired come from more than 5,800 people who contacted the school district's personnel office. From that number 2,341 completed employment applications and were interviewed here or in 64 locations visited by representatives of the Clark County School District.

Ethnically, 474 are Caucasian, 48 Black, 12 Oriental, eight American Indian and 18 Spanish American.

388 are women and 172 are men. They range in age from 20 to 63 and average just over 29 years of age.

But what about the 307 who left last year? 44 retired and another six died during the course of the school year. Another 67 took leaves of absence and say they expect to return next year or at a later time. 190 resigned for a variety of reasons, including other employment, leaving the state and family responsibilities.

Those hired this year bring the total teaching staff in Clark County up to 3,870, as opposed to about 3,650 last year.

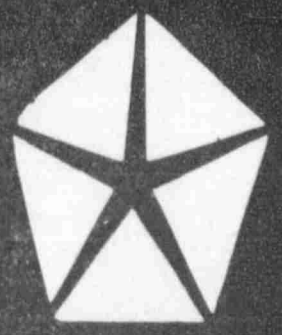

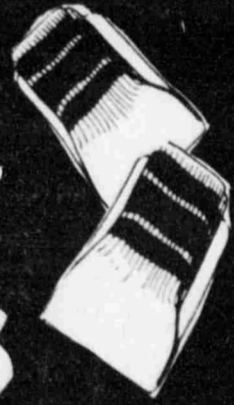

ROOTS

Vegetable Hanging Baskets

To make a simple and stunning little hanging planter, you need only a vegetable, some string, and a few household tools.

Begin with a carrot, beet, parsnip or turnip. Remove any leaves that may be on them. Slice about one-half inch off the end opposite the stem end. About one-half inch below the slice, make three holes an equal distance apart. These small holes will be used for hanging the vegetable.

Using a knife or an apple corer, core out the center of the vegetable, taking care not to go all the way through. The hollow center will be used to hold water.

Take three equal lengths of string or wire and knot these through the three holes you made. Select a relatively bright spot for our vegetable and than hang it. Now fill the cavity with water. Be sure to keep the center filled with water at all times.

In a few days, sprouts will begin to show from the bottom of the plant. Eventually they will start looking like ferns and will curl up towards the top. Gradually they will cover the entire vegetable.

For experimentation sake, you might try making several of these unique little planters using a few different vegetables. This is one very economical and self-satisfying way to increase your plant collection.

In their most literal sense, zenith and nadir are terms to describe the celestial coordinates directly above and below a particular observer. The point in the sky which is directly above the observer is called the zenith. At high noon for an observer standing on the equator, the sun is at the zenith; it's directly above, at its highest point.

Nadir is the opposite of zenith. It is that point which is directly below the observer at any given point or time. Because we can't see through the earth, we can't see the nadir -- that point directly below us, in the space of the solar system.

In common usage, zenith refers to any high point, or culmination. "The zenith of my career was when I played at the London Palladium," Grandpa might recall, talking of his vaudeville days.

Local people who will be employed by Levi Strauss when they start operations next year will be eligible for one share of company stock for each year of service.

According to a story in the Wall Street Journal, the company, beginning next year, will make this award. The shares will be awarded to an employee every five years along with other service awards such as a pin. An employee would receive five shares of Levi Strauss stock the year of his or her fifth anniversary, five more on the tenth anniversary and so on.

An estimated 8,815 employees who already have at least five years service will receive next year five shares for each full five years employment to date. The distribution is expected to be made next April, according to a company spokesman. The initial distribution will involve about 60,000 shares valued in the

current market at about \$1.7 million. Thus far this year, the company's stock has reached a high of \$31.625 and a low of \$24.25.

Levi Strauss estimates that, at current employment levels, the awards annually will involve about 10,000 shares to 2,000 employees.

As of August 28, the company had 22,159,392 shares outstanding and an authorized level of 30 million. The spokesman said that initially the company probably will be using treasury stock for its awards, but it does have the option of buying shares on the open market for awards distribution.

Overton Beach Development Concept Plan Released

An Environmental Summary describing the Overton Beach Development Concept Plan for Lake Mead National Recreation Area has been approved by Howard H. Chapman, Regional Director, Western Region of the National Park Service. The document, which discusses development plans for the Overton Beach area, has resulted from an extensive planning development process which included public workshops, public meetings, a concessions economic feasibility study and an archeological survey and environmental assessment.

Included in the summary are plans to upgrade water and sewage systems, expand camping facilities, development of comfort and fish cleaning stations, removal of the motel and expansion of other visitor use facilities. "We were very pleased with the public response during the planning process and believe that we have developed a planning document that properly reflects the needs

and desires of the public," Chapman said. An informational meeting to answer questions from the public will be held Tuesday evening, December 20, 1977.
