course in the recreation program. As a third source of payment, Black Mountain contributed 50 per cent of the driving range fee to the city. The credit to the golf course is made from the utility fund.

A fire station site review which calls for the possible installation of three portable fire stations was presented to the city council Monday night after receiving approval from the city planning commission
Field studies on the report were made by Assistant Fire Chief Dale Starr and a study of fire and ambul. ance call frequnncy was made by the fire fighters association under President Don Griffie.

The plan recommends the reten vion of the present headquarters with improvements; the retention of the Pittman station; the develop. ment of a prefabricated station at Boys' Club, as the first priority The econd prionity prouldy. the second priority would be a rowhead and the thind pioriry owhead and the third prioriny would be po ber bir area.

The priorities reflect the largest numbers of family residences removed from immediate fire protecion, and the evident major growth residentially and industrially at the south end of the city. The headquarers on Attiantic Avenue would remain the main first call service for the residential and busines on the Boulder Highway.

The major area of change in the fire station report from that made in 1975 lies in the fact that the staff niversally recommended that the new stations be of the portable type sing trailers for administrative and ormitory usage and a Butler building as housing for
"These equipment. These portables, designed for fire senice use, have two diskinct advase they can be relocated to the center of gravity of a growing area and they cost less than permanen tacilities," the report said.

The report said that is is conceive ble that two stations can be de eloped with the allocated bond money instead of one. "In this climate, the portables would not be subject to deterioration from ex. treme cold and dampness, for example," the report said.

City Manager Bob Campbell recommended that the council adopt her report so it can be used as a basis for administrative action.
