

Black Mountain-City Contract on Golf Course Discussed

A discussion on the Black Mountain Golf and Country Club lease agreement with the city was scheduled for last night's City Council meeting.

City Manager Bob Campbell has recommended to the City Council

that the annual credit to the Black Mountain Country Club be reduced to \$5,000. The current lease calls for \$10,000 which would automatically renew unless the city gives notice 30 days prior to February 12.

Campbell said that a recent news release indicates the club is in sound financial shape, having shown a profit of more than \$21,000.

According to Jerry Webster, finance director, in a given year the

city can expect to bill approximately \$5,000 for water for the golf course. As payment of that bill, Black Mountain pays the city \$100 per month (\$1200 per year) for water for the course. The city in turn paid \$10,000 for use of the golf

course in the recreation program. As a third source of payment, Black Mountain contributed 50 per cent of the driving range fee to the city.

The credit to the golf course is made from the utility fund, Dundee Jones, parks and rec-

reation director, said he could see no real value of the city's involvement with the golf course any longer.

He suggested the Black Mountain group offer discount fees on its own.

A fire station site review which calls for the possible installation of three portable fire stations was presented to the city council Monday night after receiving approval from the city planning commission.

Field studies on the report were made by Assistant Fire Chief Dale Starr and a study of fire and ambulance call frequency was made by the fire fighters association under President Don Griffie.

The plan recommends the retention of the present headquarters with improvements; the retention of the Pittman station; the development of a prefabricated station at Major street near the Henderson Boys' Club, as the first priority.

The second priority would be a station located at Horizon and Arrowhead and the third priority would be at Lamb Boulevard and Sunset Road for the Green Valley area.

The priorities reflect the largest numbers of family residences removed from immediate fire protection, and the evident major growth residentially and industrially at the south end of the city. The headquarters on Atlantic Avenue would remain the main first call service for the residential and business community in the Townsite and on the Boulder Highway.

The major area of change in the fire station report from that made in 1975 lies in the fact that the staff universally recommended that the new stations be of the portable type using trailers for administrative and dormitory usage and a Butler building as housing for fire and ambulance equipment.

"These portables, designed for fire service use, have two distinct advantages -- that of mobility because they can be relocated to the center of gravity of a growing area, and they cost less than permanent facilities," the report said.

The report said that it is conceivable that two stations can be developed with the allocated bond money instead of one. "In this climate, the portables would not be subject to deterioration from extreme cold and dampness, for example," the report said.

City Manager Bob Campbell recommended that the council adopt the report so it can be used as a basis for administrative action.

--Authorize the administration to proceed with obtaining firm prices or proposals for a "portable" type fire station facility, and for one and possibly two, mini - pumper type, quick - response fire trucks.

--Authorize the addition of three more firefighters to initially staff the added facility.

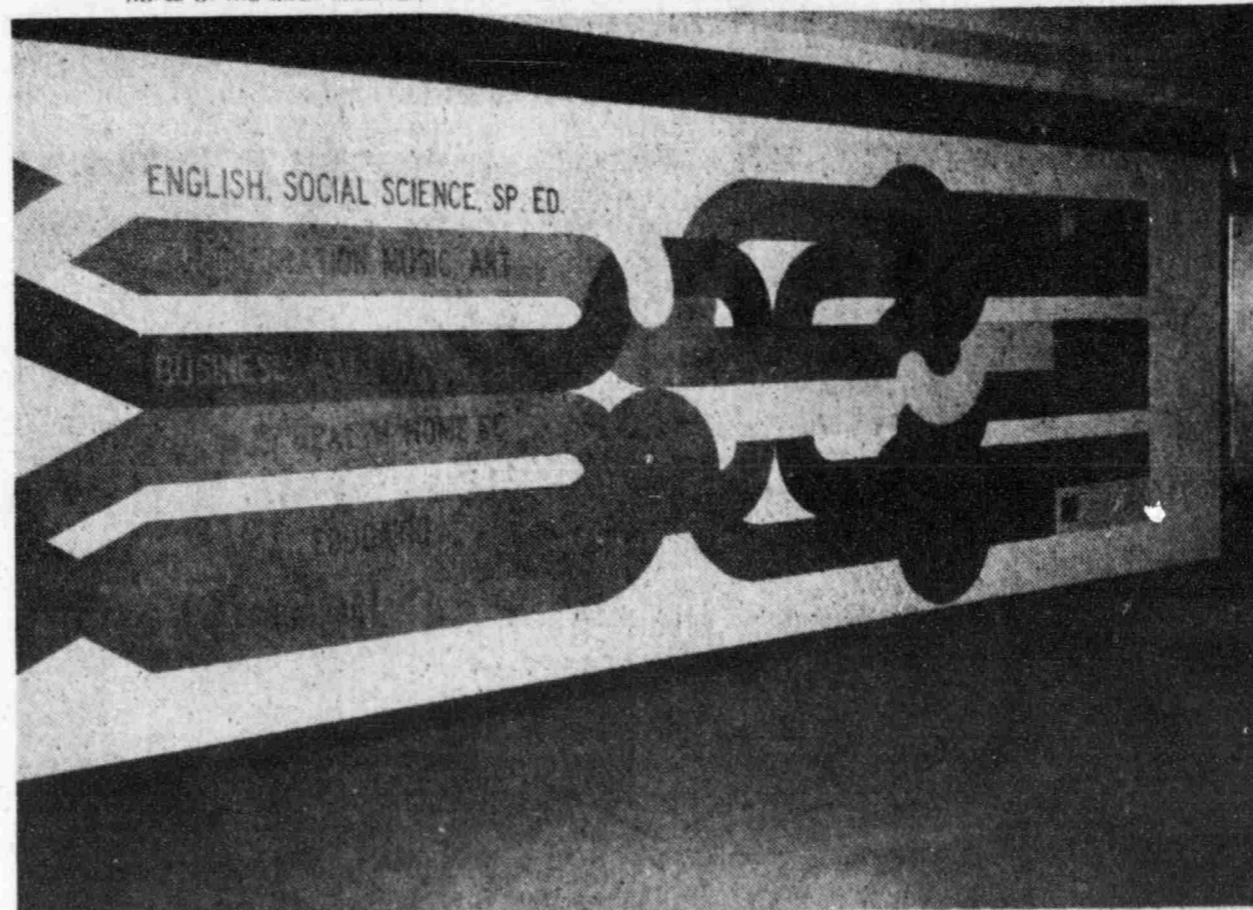
Santa's Hours Announced

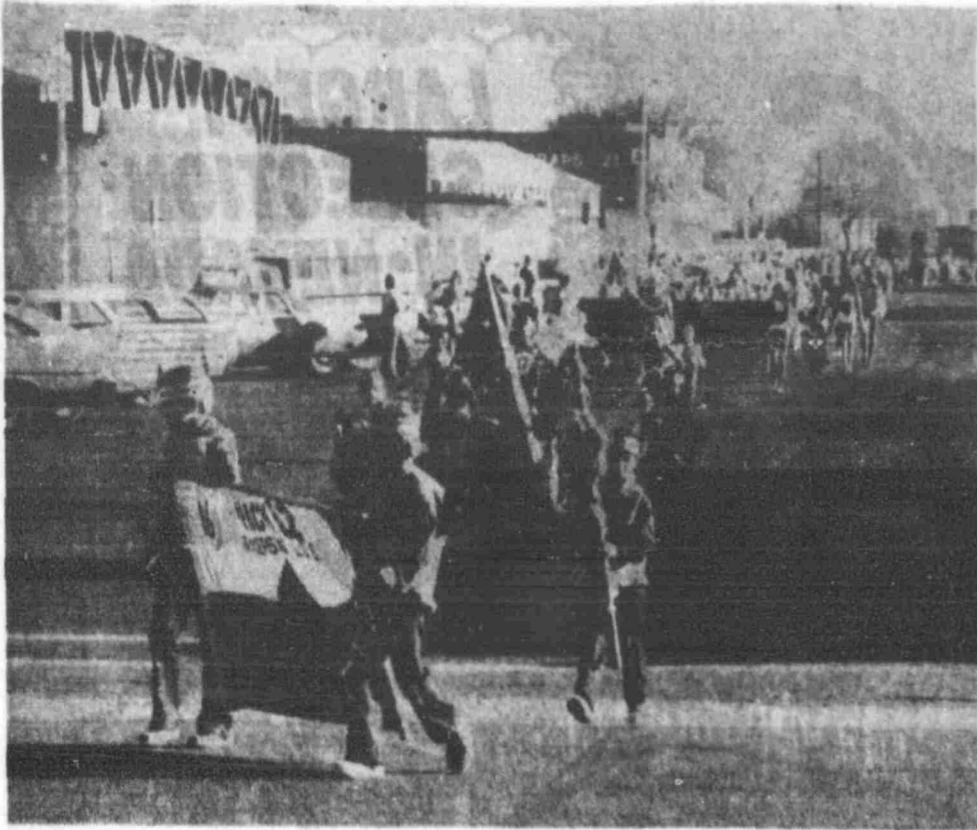

Juvenile Personnel Complete Training

Friday, December 16th marks the completion of the first Peace Officers Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) for Juvenile correctional Personnel.

The 80 hour training course has been tailored to address the special training needs of persons involved in providing services and treatment to youth in the community.

Mr. James Barrett, Director of the Nevada Crime Commission, will be the keynote speaker at the graduation luncheon. The luncheon at Two Guys From Italy will conclude the two weeks training with Mr. Barrett presenting P.O.S.T. and Department of Law Enforcement Assistance certificates.

The Demonstration Training Project is the result of a grant written by the Clark County Juvenile Court Services. It is the first organized program in the State of Nevada that is comprised of 40 hours of legal training coupled with 40 hours of in-depth training in Juvenile Law, counseling techniques and topics germane to the Juvenile Justice System.

One aim of the program is to point out the need for a total Juvenile Justice Training Program. Such a program is designed to integrate all the components of the Justice System. For the first time, the program brings together police, corrections and courts in a common training experience allowing

each of the areas to have a better understanding of the juvenile corrections field.

Members of the Juvenile Court Services, Home of Good Shepherd, Spring Mountain Youth Camp, Jean Youthful Offender Facility, Metropolitan Police Department, Henderson Police Department, North Las Vegas Police Department and Washoe County Juvenile Department have taken part in this first basic session.

Trainers for the session have included Judge John Mendoza, Agents of the F.B.I., Department of Law Enforcement Assistance personnel, State Attorney General's Office, Mental Health Staff, Treatment Alternatives to Street Crime Staff and Training Specialists of the Juvenile Court Services.

Each participant has been required to pass written examinations in order to receive their certificates.

This basic course for Peace Officers is required by the Nevada Revised Statutes. The curriculum has been determined by the P.O.S.T. committee presently comprised of Undersheriff John Moran; Director of Probation Services Nancy Williams; Chief of Henderson Police, Floyd Osborne; Sheriff of White Pine County, Archie Robinson and Director of Nevada Prisons, Chuck Wolff.

Daniel Ahlstrom Assumes Post As Las Vegas Justice Of The Peace

It was "local - boy - makes - good" this past Tuesday, as Danny Ahlstrom -- respectfully known now, if you please, as Justice of the Peace of Las Vegas Township, Daniel E. Ahlstrom -- donned the robe of office to preside over his new domain.

At thirty - three, Dan Ahlstrom, Boulder City born and bred, must now be considered what they call in the trade ... a "comer". He has accomplished much in a short span.

Born to the late Jack Ahlstrom, and his mother Fae -- a pair of talented people in their own right, both being

practicing dentists and Fae Ahlstrom at one time acting as the first President of the Nevada State Dental Assoc. Dan Ahlstrom grew up in Boulder City.

"They were marvelous years," he notes. "Boulder was a terrific place for a kid growing up, and I received the best public education going."

Ahlstrom knew almost from the onset he wanted to be involved in

law. After graduating from the local High School, the advanced education process saw him going first to the University of Nevada at Reno, and then on to Arizona State University where he earned his Law Degree.

It wasn't long after that, upon returning to the area, that he received his first appointment ... as Assistant U.S. Attorney, in Las Vegas. He spent three years at that post, then advanced up the ladder as the City of Las Vegas Deputy City Attorney ... a position he held until his recent appointment to Justice of the Peace.

In the early seventies Ahlstrom -- faced with a rigorous commuting

schedule -- eventually had to make the decision to leave Boulder for Las Vegas residence.

That doesn't keep him from returning, however, and he relishes the idle hours he occasionally puts in at a local pub, sharing a few brews with old friends.

Old friends remember him, too. One longtime

resident, eyes a'twinkle, recalls Ahlstrom as a youth -- "...when he and 'Tick Segerblom used to steal bricks from my front yard -- just to get to watch me chase 'em."

This old - timer recalls Dan as a "hellion ... but a good one. He was a regular Tom Sawyer."

Ahlstrom roars when he hears the story.

Future plans? Ahlstrom indicates that for the time being he's "...dedicated and committed to doing the best job possible of filling my office." He also expects to be running for re - election to the post next fall.

He can also see, down future roads, the prospect of again one day making Boulder City his home -- wherever else his appointments may take him.

Ahlstrom filled the vacancy recently created by former Justice of the Peace, Mahlon Brown, who is now the United States Attorney in Las Vegas.

SCHNEPP RESIGNS HIGH SCHOOL POST

Boulder City

Assistant Superintendent of Clark County Schools, Charles Silvestre, confirmed to the NEWS Monday that Boulder City High School Principal Jack Schnepf has formally tendered his resignation from that post.

Indicating that Schnepf had submitted a letter "...expressing a desire to return to the classroom, or possibly to return to college in pursuit of high school counseling studies," Silvestre speculated that the request could be honored as early as the school's mid-term break in January.

Contacted by the NEWS, Schnepf issued the following statement regarding his decision:

"I've been an educator for seventeen years, twelve of them as a principal. In those years the job has changed a great deal in the requirement of curricular knowledge. I have not kept pace with those changes and feel I'd be doing a disservice to my work if I didn't take the time to re-educate myself -- which I plan on doing by attending UNLV, to study in the areas of curriculum and counseling."

Schnepf added that he has "...enjoyed my four years at Boulder City High, and feel that -- with the help of Mrs. Nikki Howard (BCHS Assistant Principal) -- our curriculum has steadily improved,

as test scores have indicated." When queried as to whether his request was in any way connected to a previous dispute between himself and Dean of Students, Kenneth Andree, Schnepf commented:

"Absolutely not." It was at the close of the last school year that a flap had erupted within the local high school administration, over Andree's position as Dean of Students. Schnepf contended the post was superfluous and had slated Andree for a teaching assignment beginning this fall.

Andree contended the re-assignment was motivated for more subtle reasons -- principally his outside involvement in both the City Council, and with the Las Vegas Convention Authority -- and during the summer filed a suit

against Schnepf and the School District to block his transfer away from the post of Dean. He was successful in his efforts and thus maintains his present position.

Neither Schnepf nor Silvestre would speculate as to who would be the former's successor. According to Silvestre, a formal announcement would first be made anent the opening, followed by an administrative assignment from the Clark County School District.

Introducing Mrs. Katharina Boenigk

Katharine Boenigk is the mother of Karin MacBride, of whom, with her family, I wrote two weeks ago. Katharina purposely was not included in that article - although she's a vital part of their lives - be-

cause her life is worthy of an article all her own. This sweet, courageous lady was born in Berlin, Germany and she and her husband lived there until the second World War, when of course he was called into German Military Service and she was left alone, pregnant, and with a small daughter to

care for. With others, she was evacuated, and with her daughter she left Berlin on a flat - car, going to Oberschreiberhau, where Karin was born the following March. The courage to start off on such a journey, not knowing whether she'd ever see her home or husband again, must

have been terrific. The town of Oberschreiberhau was small and quiet, where they could relax safely - until the Russians came, and then they fled to Czechoslovakia. There they really had a hard time. Food was scarce, and sometimes they would be fortunate to get even a little bread and coffee made from grain. However, there they remained until the war was over.

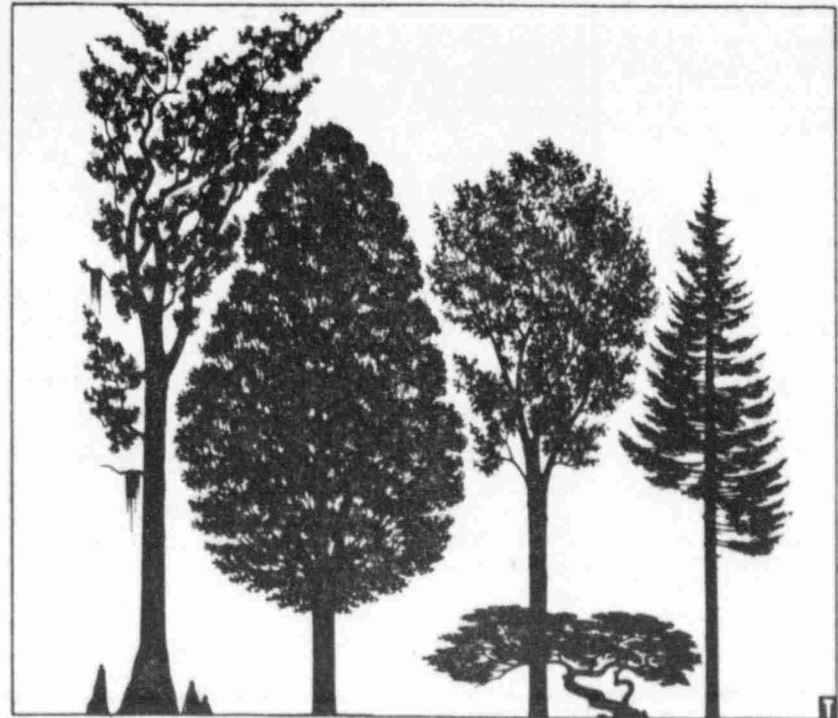
Then they went back to Silesia with a woman who had an apartment there and suggested they join forces with her. However, they found the whole town in ruins as the Russians had left it. Finally they went into one apartment which could be made livable - every building had been ravaged and they felt they were fortunate to find a place they could use. Even though there were seven of them in one small space, they were grateful to have a place to live.

Then in September of 1945, Katharina returned to Berlin with her two daughters, the older one twelve and Karin not yet two years old. They rode into Berlin by train to Liegnitz. Fortunately their home was in West Berlin, as the city by then had been divided into East Germany and West Berlin. On their arrival Katharina was informed that her husband had been killed on the Russian front. Also, she discovered that her home had been bombed just before the end of the war, so she took her children and went to live with her father in Kladow, a suburb of Berlin.

The Secret Life Of The Forest

THE SHAPES OF SURVIVAL

The shape of a healthy tree can tell you much about how that tree has won its struggle for existence against weather and competing species. It may be that its wide branches and dense foliage have shaded out other trees. Or its symmetry has allowed the sunlight to reach more leaves, making more food to build a stronger, taller tree. Or perhaps the species, like some of those shown here, has developed unusual shapes that help it to thrive under extremes of cold, wind and moisture.



Baldcypress Sugar maple Paper birch Black spruce Balsam fir

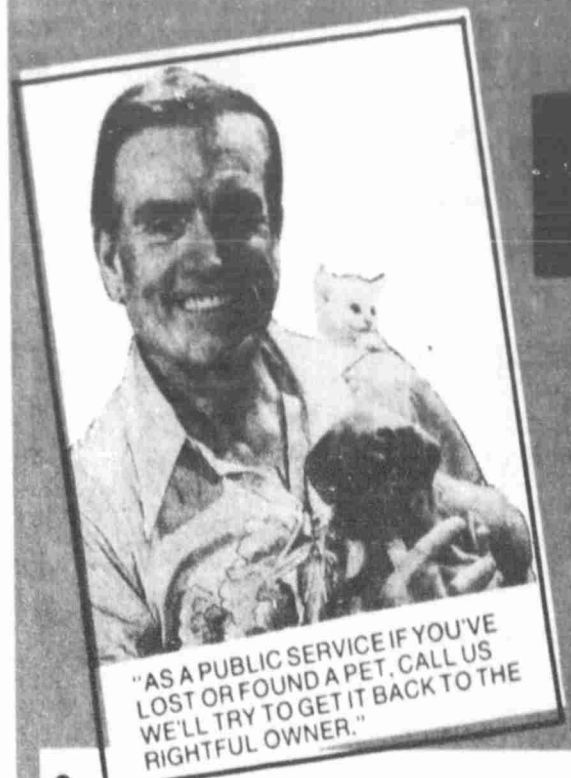
