

# Dietmeier Resigns - Basic To Fill Several Coaching Vacancies

Basic high school Basketball Coach Mike Dietmeier resigned his head coaching position last Wed. afternoon on the same day the Wolves were scheduled to play in the Southern AAA zone tournament.

Basic, under assistants Dennis Smuskiewicz and Bill Appuglise, went on to lose to

Gorman in the opening round of the playoffs 74 - 50.

The Wolves finished the year with a 1-24 record, losing their last 21 games in a row.

In five years at Basic, he compiled a 17 - 103 record.

In his written resignation to Principal Frank Brusa, Dietmeier said "in the best interest of the basketball program I am resigning my position immediately."

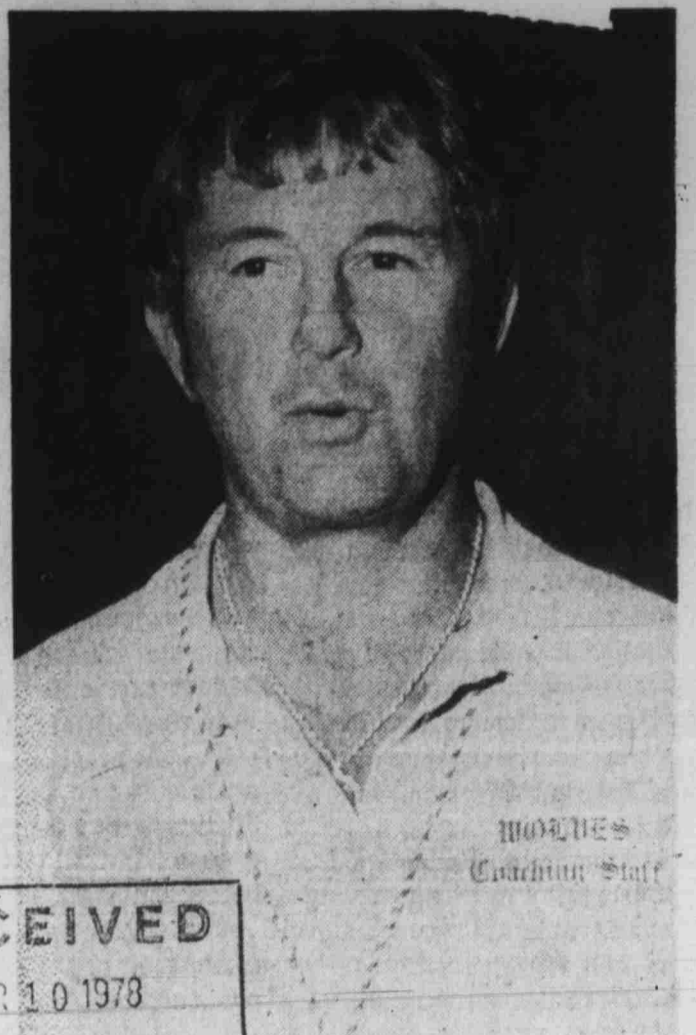
Brusa said the administration had accepted the resignation and were advertising in the school district's publication "hot line," for a replacement.

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# Groundbreaking Planned For Southern Nevada Water System II

Meetings are being held March 10 and 11 in the legislative building in Carson City. Assemblywoman Karen Hayes is chairman of the study and has announced the two - day meetings.

Meetings are open to the public.

## Building Skyrockets To \$4,138,345

Building in Henderson continued to skyrocket through February and reached \$4,138,345 for the first two months of the year, according to John Quinn, superintendent of building and safety.

This figure compared to \$1,179,161 for the same period last year which was also a banner year.

The number of building permits issued for February totalled \$1,755,348 as compared to \$488,753 for February of 1976.

There were 38 permits issued for new homes which totalled \$1,520,368. The rest of the permits were divided among one duplex valued at \$35,322; 19 residential alterations and additions, \$74,026; six concrete, \$11,774; 11 patios, \$9,198; three garages, \$17,068; three utility buildings, \$2,424; three commercial alterations and additions, \$8,920; 23 fences and walls valued at \$44,198; two signs, \$3,050 and five pools at \$29.00.

There were 338 building inspections, 237 electrical, with a combined total inspections including, plumbing and clean - up of 967. There were 17 clean up violations and 13 compliances.

A suggestion of the city's Memorial commission and the city recreation board will be forwarded to the city council to name the youth center park after a prominent citizen of the community.

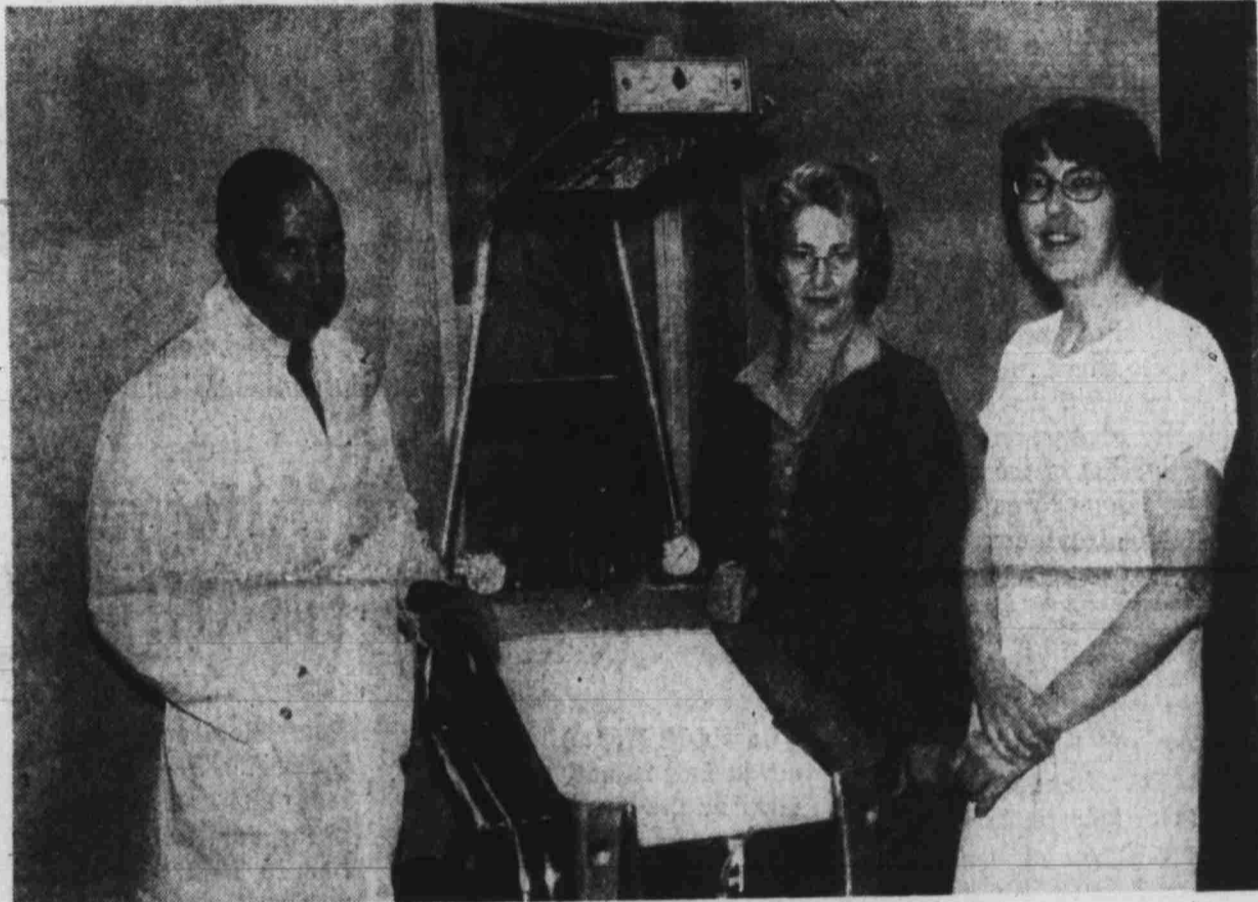

## Jones Attends Conference In Fresno

Dundee Jones, Director of Parks and Recreation Department, returned last week from attending the 30th Annual California and Pacific Southwest Recreation and Park Conference held at the Convention Center in Fresno, California.

Nearly 5000 park and recreation delegates from five Western states attended the conference which ran from February 24 to 28. It was entitled "People helping people"

and featured three general sessions and more than 130 special education sessions on subjects covering the full range of management, leisure and social service programs in the parks and recreation field.

Jones is a member of NRPA Pacific Southwest Regional Council as president of Nevada Recreation and Parks Society and also serves on the Citations and Awards Committee for Pacific Southwest Region of NRPA.

State, Federal, and local water officials will officially break ground at 2 p.m., (PST), March 15 for construction of the Southern Nevada Water system's second stage. The public is invited.

The announcement was made today by Lower Colorado Regional Director Manuel Lopez, Jr., of the Bureau of Reclamation, and Administrator Donald L. Paff of the State of Nevada's Division of Colorado River Resources, whose agencies are building the \$150 million system.

Lopez said a brief symbolic groundbreaking ceremony will be held near the State's Alfred Merritt Smith Water Treatment Facility at Lake Mead. The informal event will commemorate the start of construction on the second stage which in the early 1980's will join the first stage in delivering nearly 300,000 acre - feet of Colorado River water annually to the Las Vegas metropolitan area.

A joint venture of Kordick and Rados, Irvine, California, holds the first major contract of 3.2 million for building the second stage. The work calls for construction of the "B" line, about 19 miles east of Las Vegas. The "B" line, paralleling the existing first stage main aqueduct "A" line, will begin at the site of proposed Pumping Plant 1B, to be built at the water treatment facility. It will extend to Regulating Tank No. 2, adjacent to the east portal of the system's River Mountains Tunnel. The contractor has a little over a year to complete the work.

The second stage will consist of five new pumping plants, modifications to four existing first stage pumping plants, and 30 miles of new aqueduct and pipelines to be built by the Bureau of Reclamation.

The State of Nevada is participating to the extent of approximately \$80 million with \$43 million going toward expansion of the water treatment facilities. The State will double the capacity of its water treatment facilities to 400 million gallons per day.

Participants in both the first and second stage facilities are the Las Vegas Valley Water District, the cities of North Las Vegas, Henderson, and Boulder City, and Nellis Air Force Base. The first stage has been delivering water to these entities since 1971.

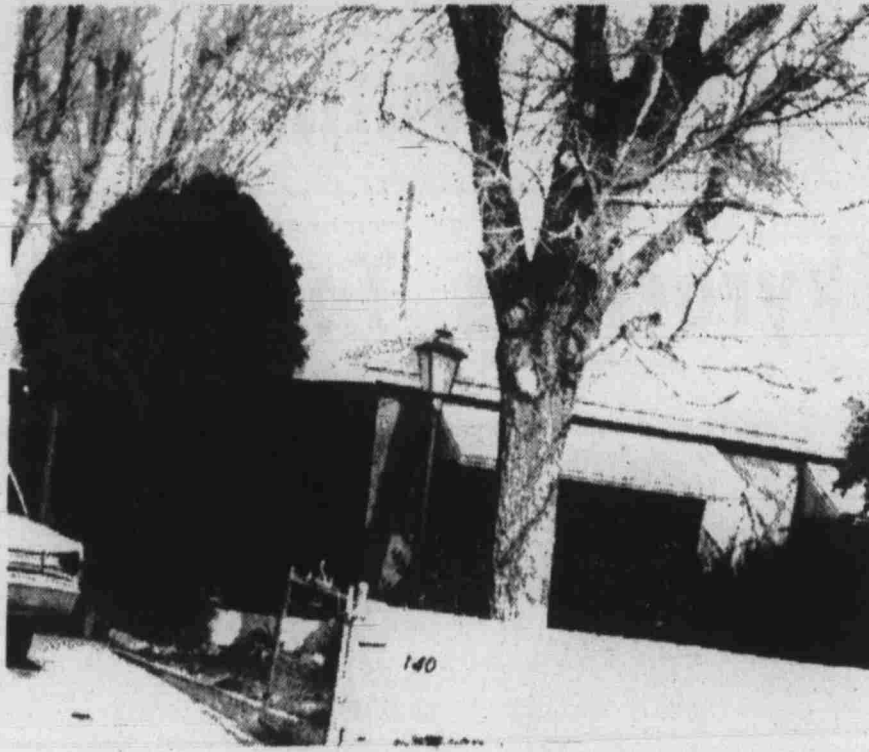

## A Preview Of Basic's Spring Sports



Basic's spring sports season opens this week with men's golf, men's and women's track, women's softball, and varsity baseball.

The men's talented golf team won second place at state competition last year and begins the spring season today at 3 p.m. against defending state champions Chaparral at Black

Mountain Golf Course. "Our golfers aren't strong drivers," said Coach Dennis Smuskiewicz, "but they're very accurate golfers. The team has the potential to do as good or even better than last year.

"Skip Tabar and Russell Sloan are our top two top golfers" he added. "We also have two good young golfers, Tommy Smith and Luke LaPorta."

This will be Smuskiewicz's sixth year as coach.

On Friday the men's track team will begin its season with a three-way meet against Bonanza and Chaparral.

"We've got a good chance to win," Coach Frank Hester said.

Hester pointed out that most of this year's track athletes also competed last year and that the team is experienced.

Strong track athletes this year include hurdler Tim Balderson, long jumper Len Green, pole vaulter John Hague, and sprinter Don Williams.

"Tim Balderson placed third in the 120 high hurdles in last year's state competition," Coach Hester said, "and he's got an excellent chance of winning this year.

"We're real strong in the hurdles and middle distance running," Hester continued. "We need some work in the sprints and field events, though."

Frank Hester has coached the track team for seven years. Doug Balderson (hurdler Tim Balderson's father) and Kermit Fayless are the assistant coaches.

The women's track team will also compete Friday against Bonanza and Chaparral.

"We've got nearly every girl back from last year's team," said Coach Richard Huggins, "plus we have a good crop of freshman."

Some standouts are distance runner Gail Driscoll, who placed second last year at state competition, hurdlers Roxanne Herwick and Denise Wade, and shot putters and discus throwers Anita Kelly and Teresa Holliday.

"We'll be strongest in the relay and distance running events," indicated Coach Huggins. "I think we're capable of finishing within the top three in our division."

This is Huggin's second year as women's track coach.

Next Tuesday, the women's softball team begins its season with a game against Western. The Basic team is an experienced unit.

"We have six seniors who've played softball together since junior high," Coach Nadine Laughlin said.

"Our defense is strong

and our pitching is excellent," she added. "Pam Sloan and Sheron Golden lead the pitching lineup."

Last year the team's record was nine wins and seven losses. Coach Laughlin remarked that she wants to cut the losses by three or four games this year.

"If we can get our offense going, we'll have the potential of winning the state championship," she added optimistically.

This will be Nadine Laughlin's second year as coach.

Next Wednesday, March 15, varsity baseball starts its season against Gorman at Sunset Park.

"It'll be close," head baseball coach Gary Chaires said. "Last year we split with Gorman."

Basic's baseball team has a strong infield. "Most of our infielders played last year," coach Chaires said. "They're experienced and in good shape."

The team, however, has lost several key players to graduation last year. "We'll be happy with a 500 season," the coach said.

Junior Greg Gammon is a strong new player this year. "Greg plays good ball and will be a fine addition to the team," Coach Chaires pointed out.

Gary Chaires has coached the team for four years. Gary Velasquez, who played first string college ball for Santa Barbara is the new assistant coach.

Overall, Basic has five good sports teams this season. The next few weeks will be full of Basic's spring sports events.

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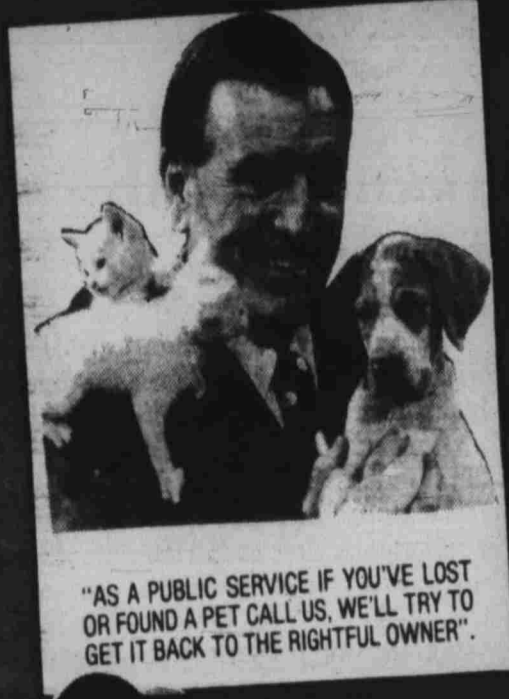

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**Pet Peekin' FEATURING: THE WILD MUSTANG - Part 1 - IN SEARCH OF LOVE**

"Any horse could turn out wild," states Carol Sullivan of Henderson, "without care or the opportunity to become acquainted with the human being!" Carol grew up with the love for horses. "I bought my first horse with a little money I earned and saved while in High School," Carol mused, "and purchased the horse, which I still own - a beautiful and highly intelligent Quarterhorse." She went on to talk about her semi-new and young part Arabian horse but this interview was on her newest - a sweet little eight-month old wild Mustang colt. Carol is thrilled with the colt, as is her husband, John, in that the little "boy" horse was acquired - free of charge - from the Bureau of Land Man-

agement in Sparks, Nevada. Sparks is not too far from Reno and the wild horses in Palamino Valley are numerous. "The corrals enclose about five hundred wild horses," Carol said, "and the Bureau recently shipped about 150 head to a mid-western state - Kansas, I think. This aids the cause of saving the horses. The people are beginning to acquire the horses now, and if they are young enough, taming and training them into riding horses should be easy."

The Bureau of Land Management is, of course, governmental. For someone wishing to secure a horse, the way it is at present - the horse is somewhat like a "foster child" in that the Bureau periodically checks on the horse to see that it is being cared for and fed properly. In the case of one "foster" parent, the Bureau re-deemed the horse after

finding the owner was mistreating and starving the animal. This doesn't happen often but the horse does not fully belong to the recipient and can not be sold in the future under any circumstances. Mrs. Sullivan believes that many more people will raise the horses and want them when the law is changed full ownership rights. "The law is in the midst of revision and change," Carol mentioned, "and that means the one securing the horse fully owns him and may sell him if he wishes."

Carol and John went up to Palamino Valley early last fall; filled out an application; stated their preference for a young one and went on the "wait" list. In November they were informed that the little five-month-old colt was there waiting for them. "He was darling and we loved him from the start but the poor little things was in pretty bad shape

with his coat and a case of malnutrition," Carol said. "I don't know who loves him the most but John calls him his "baby" so we named him "Baby." His coat is thick and shining now after the Sullivan's loving care.

The coat was helped by proper feeding of calf mana and grain with a little wheat germ oil added. After a few days with the Sullivans, Baby (an orphan) attached himself to Carol who served as the colt's mother image.

Little Johnny Sullivan, Jr. - Age 4 - helps his parents comb and brush the colt with a curry comb. "We handle Baby a lot," Carol added, "and he knows us now and we have his trust. Later on we'll start him off when he is old enough with a saddle blanket and he will break into the saddle as well as any horse.

Baby is a beautiful bay color with black mane and tail standing on black legs fitting him with the "latest boot-like fashion."

Most wild horses originated from the Spanish Barb. When settlers occupied the West, their run - aways would mix with the Wild Horse bringing many breeds inter - mixed into the Wild bands. "There is quite a bit of Quarterhorse, Apaloosa, other strains and color strains in the Wild Horse," Carol concluded. "The Wild Horse, because of the droughts and starvation, is stunted in growth in most cases, but Baby will reach a good size if not a little larger than the domesticated horse!"

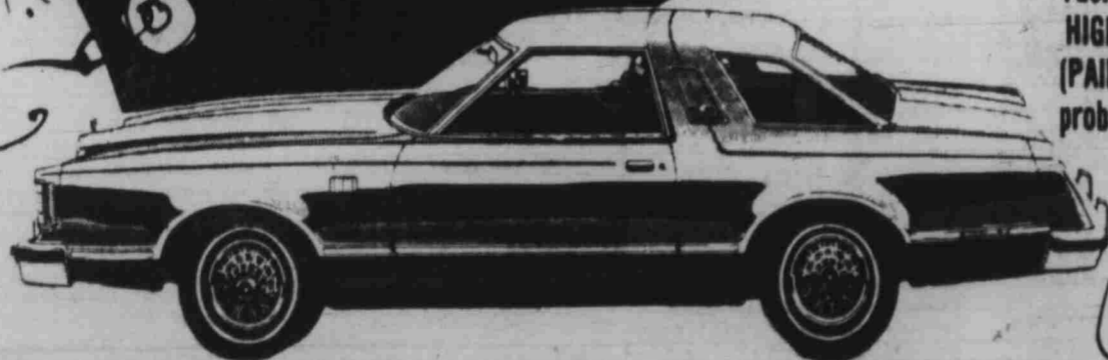

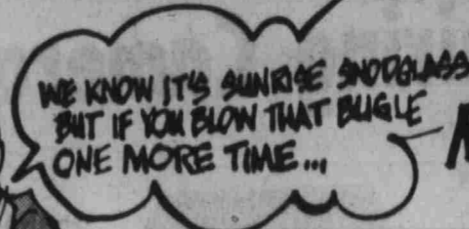
