Buster Brown Moves Ahead For Warehouse

Public Hearing On Budget Tonight

A public hearing on the Henderson city budget and revenue sharing funds will be held Tuesday, March 28 at 7 p.m. at the city hall for comments from the public, according to City Manager Bob Campbell.

The total budget, including utility funds is \$8,977,016, Campbell said, which is in compliance with state requirements.

The budget, according to Campbell, carries on with the present level of services to the community with essentially the same number of personnel. He said some of the figures may appear different because some personnel have been moved to be funded from the General fund instead of revenue sharing funds.

The budget does reflect an increase in personnel since the city will hire four new firemen. The addition of three new corrections officers will come from federal funds.

According to Campbell, the "hold the line" budget is figured on an ad valorem tax base of \$1,3327, which will yield revenue of \$938,992.

The budget is \$330,047 over the previous year.

Also on the agenda at a recessed meeting will be the selection of an independent auditor, and an agreement between the city and Union Pacific Railroad for a crossover to install an eight inch water pipe line from Mission Hills to Levi Strauss.

There is also a request for a business license for an ice cream truck to be operated by Ralph Alexander for "Ralph's Ice Cream."

The committee meeting following the recessed meeting will be for the purpose of discussing policy on sewer and water extensions and standards for walls and fences along Major Streets.

Frank Shattuck, corporate attorney for Hilton Hotels and client - contact committee chairman for the Nevada Development Authority, met recently with principals of the Buster Brown Textiles Corporation in anticipation of the company's warehousing operation here.

Shattuck said he met with Richard Goldbarth, president of the firm, Al Hunter, vice president, and Robert Gibbons, Pacific director, "in a final meeting before going to the Henderson City Council with a proposal before that body at a public hearing."

The City Council passed a resolution which cleared the way for Buster Brown to construct the 62,000 square foot warehouse complex at Sunset Road and Mountain Vista.

Goldbarth said the firms will break ground on the project this spring and that he hopes it will be operational in September of this year.

The move to bring Buster Brown here culminated a two-year drive by the Nevada Development Authority, the State Department of Economic Development and the Henderson Industrial Council to persuade the international firm of children's wearing apparel to locate in Southern Nevada.

Goldbarth said the plant will employ between 35 and 50 area residents in various capacities of warehousing and data processing.

report.

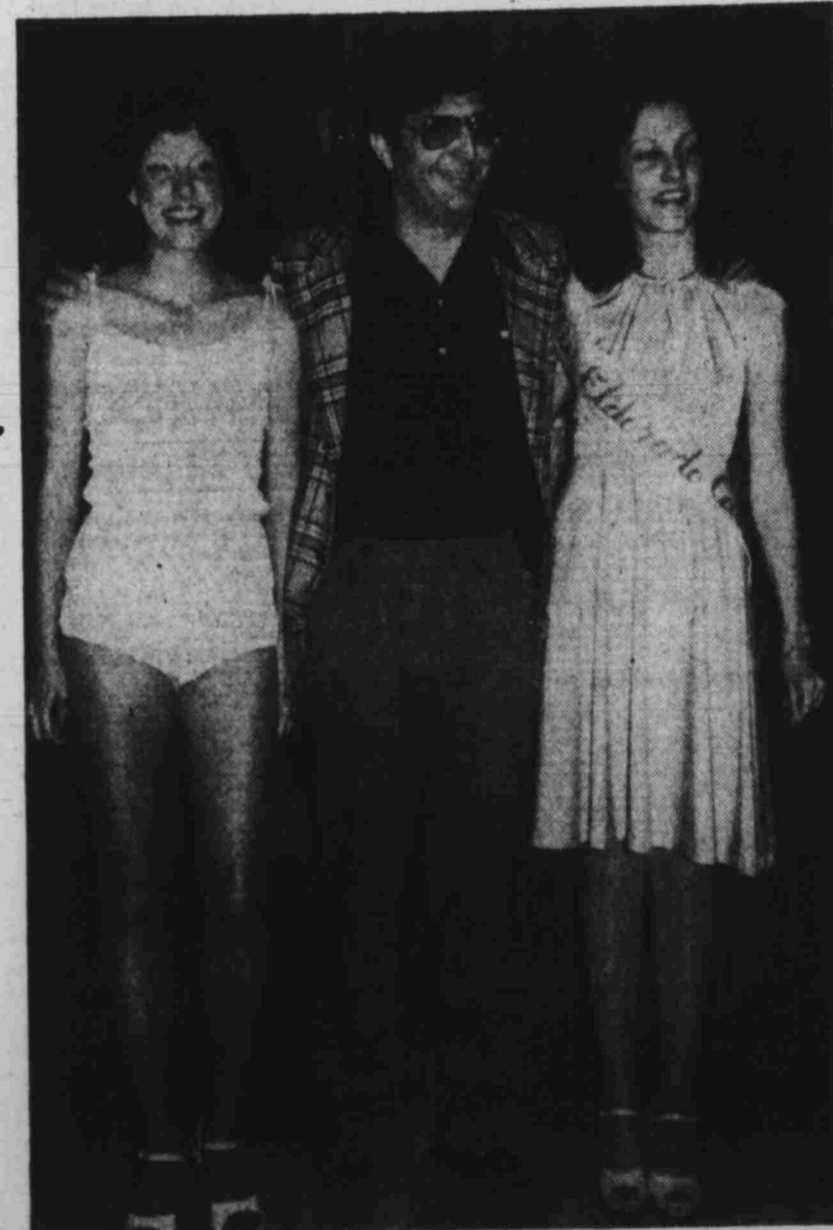
That is, unless plans change.

VINCENT'S first involvement with the HENDERSON BOY'S CLUB was during his early youth as a member, and as a boxing aspirant, under the instruction of Mike O'Callaghan, now Governor, developed a love and respect for sports and an appreciation for the programs of the Boy's Club, which was first started in Henderson in 1956 and used an abandoned Bowling Alley as its meeting place with boxing the primary activity, and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 1971 VICTOR B. VINCENT was appointed as Director of the Henderson Boy's Club which had a membership of 93 boys and over the years has had locations in Carver Park, a two bedroom townsite home and the present Club on Drake Street, and has been through some very rough times when membership dropped to 15 boys and looked as though the Club would not survive, and.

WHEREAS, VIC VINCENT and his belief in the benefits of the Boy's Club, through initiative and determination worked to provide the present facility and with a bank account of only \$18,000 he was instrumental in constructing a Club House which was started in September of 1973 and completed in June 1974 and provided the Boy's with the needed space, 5,000 sq. ft. including a library, game room, photography room, kitchen and woodworking room, and at the time the new building was opened in June 1974 there were 100 boys on the membership rolls and by the end of the year the membership hit a high of 300 members, and

WHEREAS, VIC VINCENT has always kept an eye toward the expansion and improvement of the Henderson Boy's Club, and through various grant and funding programs has enlarged the facility with a \$210,000 Grant from the Max C. Fleishmann Foundation which provided for the construction of a Gymnasium, completed in January 1977, costing a total of \$240,000, and through his resourcefulness was able to realize the balance of \$30,000 through donations of materials, labor and gifts; and through a Bicentennial Grant of \$7,750 was able to furnish equipment for the new Gymnasium, and

WHEREAS, with the new facility, and the programs that are offered the Henderson Boy's Club has grown from a beginning membership of 93 to 1,000 and an anticipated membership of 1300 boys by the end of this year and is serving a real purpose in the community as demonstrated when the Boy's Club took over the troubled Football Program and kept it alive:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, since any program that serves a community, and especially the youth, can only survive and grow when individuals who direct and promote the programs are dedicated and untiring, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, since the HENDERSON BOY'S CLUB has grown and prospered under the Direction of VICTOR B. VINCENT, and is serving over 1,000 members, teaching them good citizenship, through sportsmanship, and crafts; and giving them a purpose and direction for their lives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, because of his dedication to, and concern for the boys of our Community, I, Lorin L. Williams, Mayor of the City of Henderson, do hereby express the thanks and appreciation of the Citizens of Henderson to VICTOR B. VINCENT, and

DO HEREBY PROCLAIM Friday, March 24th, 1978 as VICTOR B. VINCENT DAY in the City of Henderson.

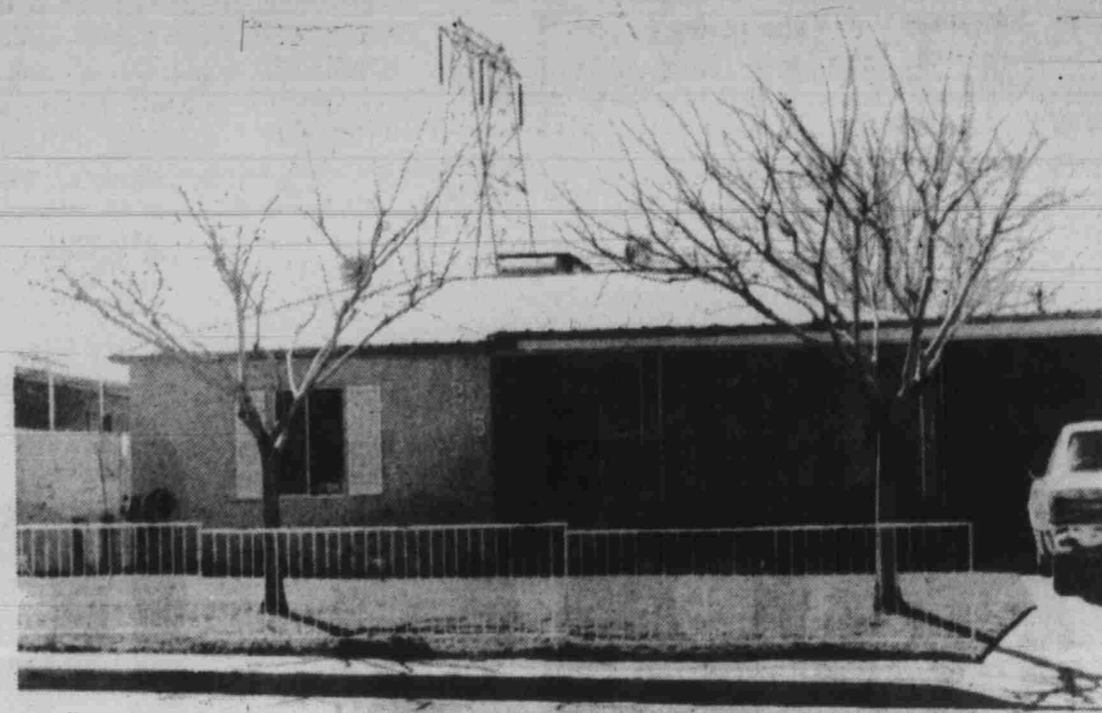

Coach Zane Miner remarked on the very successful season the Boys' Club wrestling team had enjoyed and presented each member a well deserved award for the 1977-78 season.

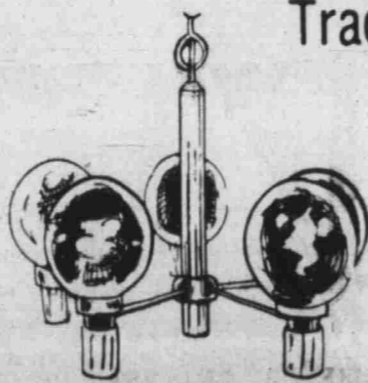
Mrs. Baca presented a certificate of appreciation to Coach Miner on behalf of all the parents and the Boys' Club.

The remainder of the evening was spent enjoying the club's facilities.

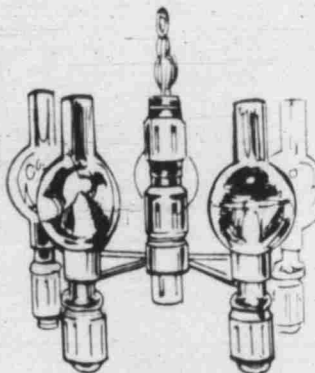
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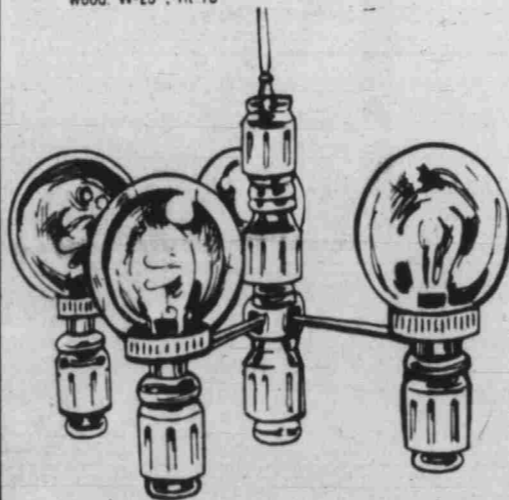

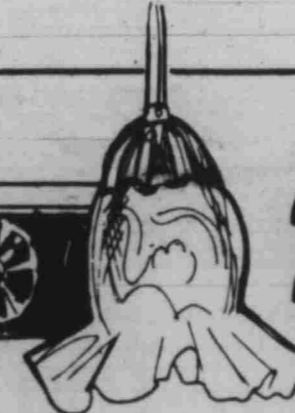
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Bagley Returns At Student Teacher

Assemblyman Lloyd W. Mann (D-Las Vegas) announced today that the next meeting of the Legislative Commission's Subcommittee to study the conditions at the State Prison will be held on Friday, March 31, and Saturday, April 1, 1978, in room 222 of the Legislative Building in Carson City.

The March 31st meeting will begin at 11 a.m. The April 1st meeting will begin at 9:30 a.m.

The Subcommittee, created pursuant to A.C.R. 1 of the 1977 Legislative Session, consists of Mann, who is Chairman, Assemblyman Lonie Chaney (D-Las Vegas), Vice Chairman, Senator Richard H. Bryan (D-Las Vegas), Senator Jack L. Schofield (D-Las Vegas), Assemblyman Lawrence E. Jacobsen (R-Minden), Assemblyman John Polish (D-Ely), and Assemblyman Nash M. Sena (D-Henderson).

In announcing the subcommittee's plans Mann noted, "The subcommittee is quite concerned about the events that have occurred at the prison and believes that its recommendations will act to ensure the proper functioning of the prison's institutions and wellbeing of the inmates."

Mann added that the meeting will be a work session, the purpose of which is to give direction to staff concerning the subcommittee's final report and proposed legislation for the 1979 legislature. No public testimony is planned.

Former Resident Gregory Gates Dies

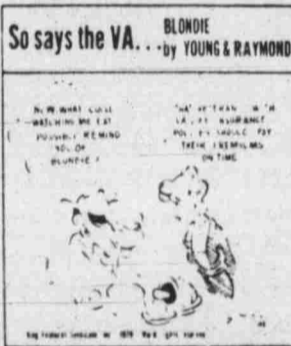
Private cremation services were held for Gregory Ellis Gates, 30, who was killed in a traffic

LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

I want to take this opportunity to thank the City of Henderson for the many steps taken during the past year to eliminate obstacles facing handicapped citizens. The two most obvious improvements are the establishment of handicapped parking spaces and the installation of curb cuts in the downtown area.

For the benefit of all, I would like to point out that each handicapped parking space is designated by a blue curb and a sign showing the International Symbol of Access (a stick figure in a wheelchair) and the word "Handicapped." City ordinance states that any motorist who parks in one of these spaces without having special handicapped license plates on his vehicle or a special parking permit in the windshield will be subject to a fine.

Applications for the parking permits can be secured from any Department of Motor Vehicles office. They must be mailed to the Carson City office together with a Doctor's certificate describing the extent of disability.

The curb cuts I have used in the downtown area are among the most easily traversed I personally have seen. Thanks are also due to the Public Works Department for their design and to the maintenance crews who showed such care in their installation.

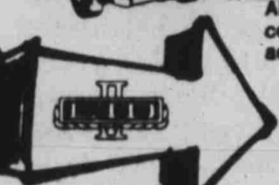

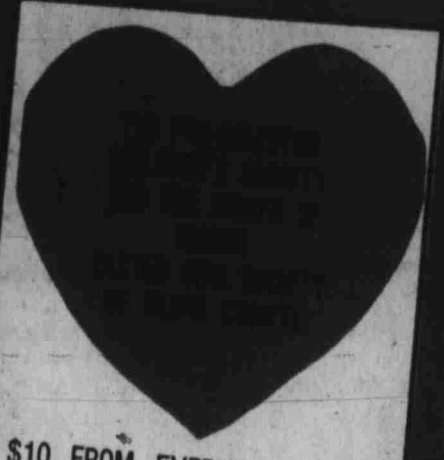
