## Genevieve Smith Named 'Nevada Mother Of The Year'

Genevieve Asay Smith of 9600 Jessup Street, Henderson, has been named Nevada Mother of 1978 according to announcement made today by Meryl Jones, state president of the American Mothers Committee.

The organization sponsors the selection of "Mother of the Year" in all states and territories of the United States as well as the observance of Mother's Day.

All state mothers will convene on May 7 in Des Moines, Iowa for the annual Awards Week and Convention, where a national "Mother of the Year" will be selected. The group will listen to speakers of national prominence on subjects of vital interest to the American home and family.

Mrs. Smith is the wife of Raymond Larkin Smith, local electrician and is the mother of eight children. She was selected on guidelines established by the organization which include activity in civic, educational and religious groups in the community and on her success as a mother as evidenced by the character and achievements of her individual children.

Well known as an artist, Mrs. Smith has served for many years as fine arts instructor in the Henderson recreation department and to senior citizen groups in Boulder City and Las Vegas. Many of her paintings have hung in the Rose de Lima hospital. She was chairman of the Industrial Day's Art Show for six years.

A twenty-five year member of P.T.A. she served as President of the Basic High School and Henderson elementary schools organizations, and participated in the annual campaigns of Heart fund, Easter Seal and Cancer Fund. She is a member of the Democratic Central committee and participated in the Senate hearing opposing sexism in the schools. She attended the International Women's Year conference in Houston, Texas.

She was co-chairman of the Henderson activities in the three-day Bicentennial celebration in the Convention Center and was chairman of the quilt and craft displays.

Mrs. Smith has twice served in Relief Society presidencies and for fifteen years was a Stake Sunday School leader in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She organized Church libraries in numerous LDS chapels in Clark County

### Planners To Meet Wed. To Discuss Zone Changes

Members of the city planning commission will meet tomorrow night at 8 p.m. in the planning chambers to discuss a number of zone change requests, according to Bob Gordon, planning director.

A public hearing will be held on a request from Richard and Lorelei Greenwood for a zone change from R-R to R-E in section 4, excluding the C-2 property adjacent to Lake Mead Drive.

A public hearing will also be held on a request from Williams C. Holinger for a zone change from R-R to R-4 of a parcel in the NW ¼ of the SE ¼ of section 20.

Other public hearings will be held on a request from E.A. Collins for a zone change from R-1 to R-A of 64 lots in the Royal Oaks Subdivision and from Ted Metz for a use permit to operate a used furniture store at 601 W. Lake Mead Drive. Another public hearing will be held to consider an amendment to Chapter 19 of the Henderson municipal code relating to apartment-motels.

Final maps will be shown for Highland Hills Unit 9; Sunrise Subdivision 11; Green Valley Unit 2; Green

Valley East Unit 3; Village Woods Unit 2.

The final item is architectural review on a request from Clark Cabinet Co. for an office and warehouse on Elliott Road.

The Industrial Days Talent Contest will be held tomorrow night at 7 p.m. in the Civic Center Auditorium. Admission is by Booster Badge.

An annual feature of the Industrial Days celebration, the show will once again be MC'd by Walt Reno, popular television personality now associated with KBMI Vegas Country 14.

Thirty entries tried out for the Talent show, under the chairmanship of Phil Hubel, during the auditions which took place last night. Wednesday's show will consist of between 15 to 18 acts, according to Hubel.

Judging for this year's contest will be done by Coralie Hamel, a famous dancer who has performed all over the world; Norman Kaye, Poet Laureate of the State of Nevada, formerly of the Mary

Kaye Trio and now a Las Vegas realtor; Claire Keefner, radio station KXTZ-FM broadcaster and co-owner of the Kalikage Playhouse in Calico, California; and Marliza, a dancer of 20 years and owner of her own dance studio in Las Vegas.

Diane Hubel will once again act as co-ordinator of the judging, as she has done in the past few years.

Awards will be presented to winners in six categories; junior singing, dancing and variety and senior singing, dancing and variety. An overall trophy will be presented to the act judged "Best of the Show."

Judges for the Monday night tryouts were Judaline Havens, Jack O'Haley, Bill Perry and Naida Reynolds.

## School District - City, May Exchange Land

An exchange of land between the Clark County School District and the City for a school site near Horizon Drive was discussed by the city council Monday night.

The school district land is at Horizon and Greenway and it would be the next elementary school to be erected in Henderson.

Some concerns were expressed by the city for the location because of traffic patterns. It was proposed by the city that the school district be granted six acres south of

O'Callaghan Park, and that an additional ten acres be granted to the District out of the 80 acres still owned by the city and lying just west of the present Mission Hills. In return the district would release the 20 acres at Greenway and Horizon for some type of public recreational use in accord with the land grant patent.

It has been proposed by the city recreation director that the land be used for a sports complex with ball fields and other sports.

A petition to vacate a portion of Market Street east of Atomic Street and West of Atlantic Street, has been filed with the city council by William S. Boyd, president of the Eldorado Club in downtown Henderson.

This is the third time the Eldorado Club has petitioned the city for a vacation of this one-block portion of Market Street. The first application was withdrawn by the Eldorado Club, the second was denied by the city council.

The vacation is being requested "because there is unity of ownership of all parcels of real property fronting on the parcel to be vacated and the owners of said real property desire to develop the vacated property in conjunction with their own property."

The Eldorado Club has proposed a three-story hotel on the parking lot adjacent to the Eldorado Club which would open on Market Street. There would be limited access from Atomic Street to Atlantic Street in front of the hotel.

The request will go to the city planning commission for recommendation and a public hearing is expected to be set May 1 by the city council on the matter.

## Curb Cuts For Handicapped Completed

Several mobility specialists from the Nevada Association of the Physically Handicapped visited Henderson last week to inspect the curb cuts which have just been completed by the City of Henderson.

Twenty-four cuts were made in the downtown section which enables the physically handicapped easier access to streets when necessary to cross. The city has also installed a number of handicapped parking spaces, blue painted curbs complete with signs, in strategic areas of town.

A city spokesman noted that people are parking their cars in front of some of the curb cuts which is illegal.

The specialists expressed great satisfaction with the manner in which the city has aided the handicapped.

They explained that their job is to visit hotels, restaurants, casinos, businesses, etc. and make recommendations on how the facilities could be improved for the use of the handicapped.

The Federal Government now offers a \$25,000 tax break to private businesses if they will enlarge doorways, put in ramps in place of stairs, install railings in bathrooms and make other improvements in existing buildings for the assistance of the handicapped.

There are now laws in effect which cover the construction of new buildings or an addition to a business already in operation.

### Building Skyrockets To Over 19 Million During March

Building valuations for the first three months in Henderson exceeded the entire year of 1976, it was learned from John Quinn, superintendent of building and safety.

The valuations through March of this year totalled \$9,852,350, and for the same period last year the totals were \$5,714,005.

A new mobile home park with 298 spaces valued at \$1,200,000 helped bolster the

valuations, but the big emphasis was one new dwellings with 113 homes at \$3,883,080.

A new commercial and commercial alterations brought the totals up \$145,000 and \$320,145 respectively. Other permits included residential alterations and additions, patios, garages, fences and walls, pools and grading.

There were 816 inspections done during the month with 18 clean - up violations and 17 compliances.

### Standards For Walls and Fences Receives A 'Do Pass'

The City Council made a "do pass" recommendation to accept the recommendations for standards for walls and fences in the commercial and industrial districts along major roads in the city as made by a committee of the Planning Commission.

The committee, composed of Gloria Castleberry as chairperson and Mary Roberts, met with Planning Director Bob Gordon on several occasions. They concluded that the real problem regarding walls and fences was one of enforcement of present ordinances rather than a need for a new ordinance.

Better communication between city departments for locating violations and following up until the required improvements are made was stressed.

Gordon commented that in the past few months numerous violations had been reported and acted upon.

Council Carlton Lawrence reflected that in the four and a half years that Gordon has been Planning Director the city had improved in appearance.

It was suggested that a member of the Planning Commission be appointed to

attend Council meetings to establish better rapport between the Commission and the Council.

Another suggestion was to change the wording "block wall" in the present ordinance to an "architecturally acceptable masonry wall."

Strict enforcement of use permit conditions is needed, the recommendations state, either requiring the conditions be met before the use permit is issued or establish a method of follow up at a later date.

For those uses where a block wall is not required by ordinance, the committee felt that chain link fencing with plantings and or redwood slatting is satisfactory and more attractive than block walls. However, there needs to be assurance that the plantings will be watered and maintained and also that the slats will be maintained.

A method of bringing businesses up to standard is needed, such as setting a time limit in which to bring their property up to standard.

Other suggestions included publishing a newsletter in the HOME NEWS urging business people to comply with city ordinances and instigating a clean - up campaign with the assistance of the paper.

The use of the Civic Center gymnasium on May 6 from 7-12 p.m. for an employees picnic at St. Rose de Lima hospital, was approved by the city parks and recreation board at its last meeting. 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### "Living Legends" David Niven & Helen Hayes Co-Star In Disney Suspense Comedy

For a couple of living legends, David Niven and Helen Hayes are pretty offhand. "Living legends, heavens how pompous," Miss Hayes demurred. "All we do is still go to the office."

The two Academy Award winners, with a century of acting between them, co-star in Walt Disney Productions' suspense comedy, "Candleshoe." Miss Hayes plays the mistress of a mansion that conceals pirate gold. Niven jumps from one role to

another as her butler, chauffeur, gardener, and a cavalry officer from India.

"David dislikes labels as much as I," Miss Hayes said, returning to the business of living legends.

"I have been called the first lady of the American theater, and recently the veteran actress. That bothers me so much that I made up my own label: the great white goddess of the American stage. Sometimes I call myself the

holy cow."

Miss Hayes, 77, has been acting since she was five. She made her reputation on the stage, and retired from it reluctantly when she grew allergic to theater dust. She went into motion pictures only because her husband, the late Charles MacArthur, was employed in Hollywood as a screenwriter.

"At that time I was a star in the theater in New York with a couple of big hits behind me and I didn't want to go to

California," Miss Hayes said.

"I wasn't bitten by the film bug, but Charlie wanted me there. He wanted out family to stay together.

MacArthur wrote the screenplay for his wife's movie debut, "The Sin of Madelon Claudet," and it brought her an Academy Oscar. Thirty-eight years and 13 pictures later, in 1970, Miss Hayes won another Oscar for her performance in "Airport."

Unlike Helen Hayes,

David Niven has never felt comfortable in the theater.

"I came to Hollywood in 1934 without any acting experience, and so I enrolled at the Pasadena Playhouse nearby. Thus I came to hate the theater," he said.

"I resented going to work when everybody else was going home to dinner. I liked opening nights because the possibility of disaster is very great and that's fascinating. But then you are

either in a flop, which goes on forever into boredom.

"So I am just a miserable stage actor. I love being part of an audience, but I loathe being up on the stage."

Niven was completely at ease in front of movie cameras, however, and never regretted the year he put in as an extra on the road to flicker fame.

"It was very rough going, but like all the extras in those days I had another job. I worked as a deckhand most of the time, which I enjoyed hugely."

Niven's luck improved when film producer Samuel Goldwyn made a mistake. Thinking he was signing the unknown actor away from Irving Thalberg, his archrival, Goldwyn put Niven under contract. Their turbulent association lasted many years.

Niven won an Academy Award as best actor in 1958 for "Separate Tables." Characteristically he waves the applause away from himself.

"I always thank Deborah Kerr and Wendy Hiller. They won it for me," Niven said.

"They had to cry in the picture, which they did so beautifully that when I spoke the camera panned to them sobbing ... and I got the Oscar.

A member of the Disney alumni association along with Helen Hayes, Niven returned for "Candleshoe." He made his bow for the studio in "No Deposit, No Return," while Miss Hayes had done "One of Our Dinosaurs Is Missing" and "Herbie Rides Again."

"Candleshoe," adapted by David Swift and Rosemary Anne Sisson from a book by Michael Innes, also stars Jodie Foster and Leo McKern as fortune hunters on the trail of hidden treasure. Norman Tokar, under Ron Miller's executive producership, directed the color by Technicolor film for Buena Vista release. Starts April 12 at the Rainbow Theatre.

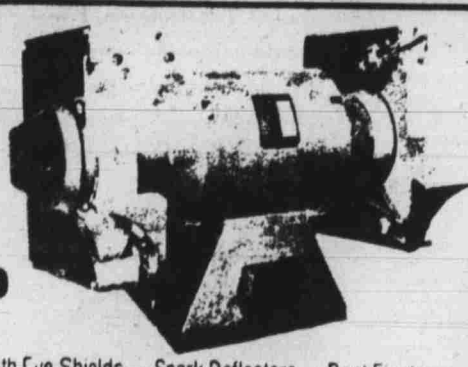
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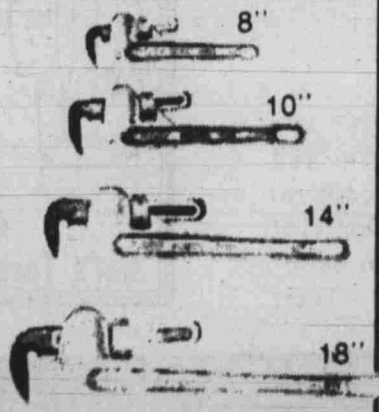
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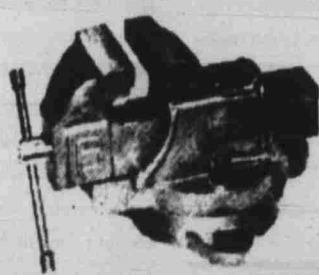


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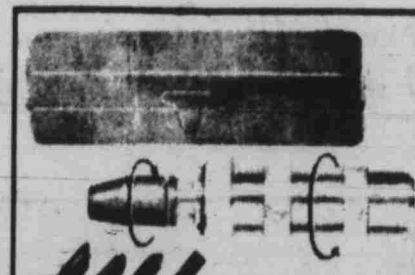
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# Inquiring Camera Girl

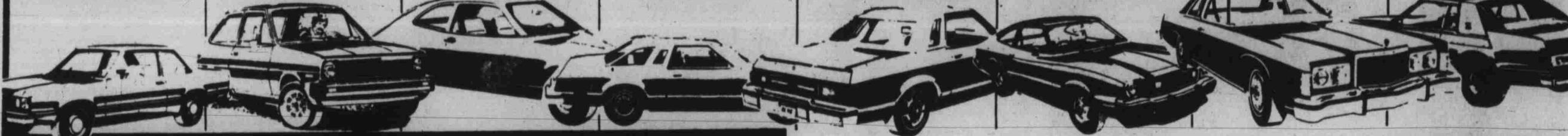

### PROTECTING AMERICAN JOBS

#### First Year Of 200-Mile Limit A Success

The chances have increased this year that the next fish you and your family eat will have been caught by an American fishing vessel.

Much of the reason for this is because the first year of America's 200-mile fishing zone which went into effect March 1, 1977, is now considered a success.

Overall, the domestic catch equaled the 1976 level, while foreign fishing declined dramatically giving depleted stocks of fish an opportunity to begin rebuilding. In addition, an increase in the U.S. catch, consistent with conservation and management requirements, is expected during 1978.

"The Fishery Conservation and Management Act of 1976 is beginning to work," points out Richard A. Frank, head of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). It effectively reserves the allowable catch off our coasts to U.S. fishermen, permitting foreign vessels to catch only amounts in excess of the U.S. catch. This assures that vital resources are conserved and that depleted stocks can be rebuilt to be available in the future.

Interestingly, the Act, which established the 200-mile fishing zone, also established regional Fishery Management Councils. These Councils develop fishery management plans for the stocks of fish off our coast, subject to the approval of the Department of Commerce. The plans establish quotas for foreign and U.S. fishing. "The Councils are a new and interesting

experiment in government," Frank said. "They prepare Fishery Management Plans to cover specific fisheries and the federal government provides the clout to enforce these plans." Since their formation, the Councils have moved vigorously to prepare these plans so that NOAA can regulate U.S. and foreign fishing in the conservation zone.

With this help, American fish lovers will not only be assured of fish on their table now, but they'll also be assured that an adequate fish supply will be available in the future.

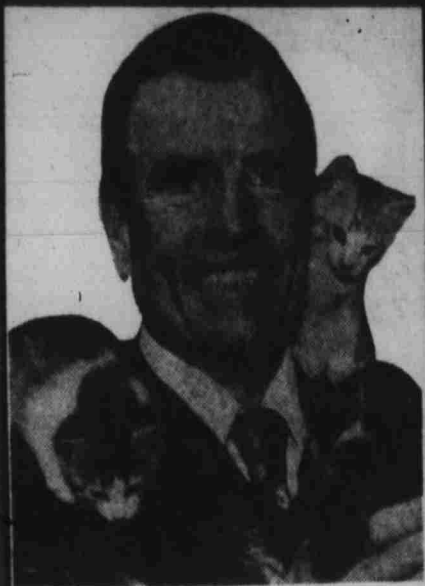
