cated. It so It sounds like an old story merely brought up to date ... and it is directed by satel lite, short wave, secret and lite, short wave, secret and public courier to Moscow, world over.
The men around Carter are doing their NOW thing this way ... trying to set up summits Begin - Sadat - like summits -to put all the cards on the table and get them to air out their beefs, then try to mediate by logic. Carter's hand as he meddles, is well loaded with aces ... he has most of the free world on his side if this is enough to win or scare or educate the likes of South Africa, Russia, or whomever else is lurking in the unknown back ground ... then Jimmy The Great has moved in where others fear to tread ... or is moving in at a time no one figured he needed to ... to start or thwart what you must and please believe -- à

Like any successful business, Dufus maintains a set policy. He only gives away the big stuffed animals seen hang-
ing in his booth. He ing in his booth. He doesn't reach under the cheaper, small prize like some booths. Through experience Dufus discoexpered that, although he pays more inventory, he makes more profit by giving away only big prizes: His customers are happy, and happy customers bring more business.
Indeed, Dufus knows the psychology of his business. In fact, Dufus has taken some university psychology courses and plans to major in psychology.
"I have to understand the people in my business," Dufus explained. "I've gotten to where I going to play my game or if he's just browsing." The carnival man is an intelligent operator.
"We're effected by the economy more than many businesses Dufus continued. "What people spend 'here is extra money. If the economy gets tight, then people don't come to the carnival. I've had some long dry spells where I've run out of money, didn't have enough money to stay in a motel for the night, and I've gone a couple o I've gone a couple o days in a row with nothing to eat. But I've also There have been time when I've taken in $\$ 1000$ a day."
Dufus is proud of his small business and works hard. "The carn val business is tough, he said. "We travel on Mondays, set up the car nival on Tuesdays, and open on Wednesday. From Wednesday through Sunday about 1 a.m. to midnight or later, about 14 hours a day. After a full day Sunday, we pack and leave the next morning. It's sure hard traveling on Monday after being up mos

The majority of plants hat go dormant do so between December and February.When a normally active plant suddenly stops growing or when its leaves begin to wither away, the plant is most likely becoming dormant. In the case of gloxinias, caladiums, cyclamens, and achimenes, the signs of dormancy are obvious; in other plants, dormancy occurs more subtly.
During dormancy, plants need to rest, preferably in a shaded area. They should not be fed or repotted and watering should be kept to a
minimum. As soon as new growth resumes.. the average dormancy period is six to eight
weeks .- begin weeks -- begin watering slightly more often, gradually reaccustoming the plant to its normal watering schedule
