He left office in 1975 after pleading "no contest" to federal tax charges. Potter' who now works as a law clerk for Attorney Pete Flangas, is attending law school and hopes to obtain his degree whether or not he decides to run for JP.

According to Potter some of his friends have a petition going around to nominate him for JP. He said if they file the petition then he has several days to make up his mind whether or not to run. Potter said he would like to run, he said he enjoyed the work as JP. but he said the news media would probably give him a lot of flack. He said he is not sure he wants to get back into the fish bowl.

The Nevada Pardons Board last Oct. reinstated Potter's civil rights which include the right to run for office. Potter, 36, pleaded no contest in 1975 and was fined \$5,000.

The Henderson city council last night was expected to take action on a request by Las Vegas Downs to sponsor a \$7.5 million public improvement bond for the construction of a dog and horse race track in Henderson.

The Public Improvement Trust last Tuesday approved security requirements and an "in lieu of taxes" payment to the city by Las Vegas Downs.

By a 4-1 vote the trust set the payment of \$35,000 for the first year and a ten percent increase per year for the 15 years the bond is in existence

in lieu of taxes to the city. By the same vote, the trust voted to accept security of \$7,130,000 for the bonds. In addition to that the trust required an additional 140 acres of land valued at \$700,000 be kept in trust as security for three years after the opening of the race track.

The approval is contingent on a financial statement from Las Vegas Downs. The turst is being used as a method of financing the project because the bonds are tax free and would save the Downs approximately \$200,000.

The city officials, from Southern Nevada gave fair warning in San Francisco they will sue the federal government to change water pollution standards for Lake Mead and stop construction of the \$52.3 million advance waste water treat: ment plant.

"The courts are the worst possible place to decide environ-· mental issues," admitted William Sullivan. a private attorney hired by Las Vegas to pursue the case against FPA. But Sullivan said with the ok of the L.V. city commission, he is ready to take this issue to federal court.

DeFalco's staff has until Oct. to approve the plan which makes the county commission the master agency for water programs.

Following the meeting the city officials toured an AWT plant in the San Francisco area and Councilman Stout said that \$67 million later, they find the plant was not necessary and the cost of chemicals for the plant have gone "sky high".

Mayor Williams said the AWT does not accomplish what they claim and the plants cost tremendously and have a "tremendous on-going expense." He said the plant would cost 30 cents a day per family to run.

"Somewhere along the line someone has to reorganize the demands of government, including the federal government," Williams said. "We're going to have a tax deduction and what money we have we should use for what we need, not what they want us to have," Williams said. Williams said he feels they made inroads with DeFalco.

Stout described the meeting as very crowded and ."stiff structured." Stout also felt they accomplished a great deal and said the highlight of the trip was the visit to the AWT plant.

He indicated he felt the AWT plant was a "scam," and that it was built at taxpayer's expense to supply water to industries.

"We saw the results of the government fouling up really bad," Stout said.

Continental Telephone To Refund \$993,000

Attorney General Robert List has asked the Nevada Supreme Court to set guidelines for Continental Telephone Co. to refund almost \$1 million to Nevada consumers.

The Nevada Attorney General successfully defended a Nevada Public Service Commission order which would refund over 86 per cent of the increased rates collected by the company since March of

In his petition, filed on behalf of the PSC, List noted that Continental collected at least \$1,150,000 in that period and asked the court to determine the exact amount of the refunds. List said Contiental should refund at least \$993,000.

In addition, he asked the justices to decide whether interest should be paid to ratepayers on the amounts to be refunded.







Bob Glassburn's Bait & Tackle Talk

A couple of years ago the Department of Fish and Game netted approximately 1500 largemouth bass from Ruby Lakes in the northeast part of Nevada.

They were trucked to the Echo Bay area of Lake Mead, tagged with



\$5. reward tags and released by barge in several areas of the Overton Arm. A number of greedy anglers, upon discovering the ease of catching these fish, decided to make a business of them. Before the slaughter was over, well over two - thirds of the tagged bass were caught before they had a chance of dispursing, thus ruining any chance for the Fish and Game Department to gain hoped for information on movements, growth rate, etc.

The identical situation is happening again, only the location has changed. Last week the Nevada Fish and Game Department, after seining for a week, gathered approximately 1000 Ruby Marsh bass and trucked them in excellent condition to Las

Vegas Marina on Lake

Several volunteer sportsmen from the Vegas area and fishery biologists from the Nevada Department of Fish and Game worked throughout the weekend tagging and releasing these bass. Due to high winds, they were not released in some of the preplanned areas, but in only a few coves in the Vegas Wash area. A few greedy fishermen with dollar signs for eyes quickly began cepitalizing. Ruby Marsh bass are notoriously easy to catch. Almost any presentable bait or lure will take them. Two of these fishermen stopped in my shop and asked me for a number of reward tag envelopes. One of them made the statement, "You might be calling us commercial fishermen

soon." They had obvi- . ously located the schools of Ruby Marsh bass.

I have to quarrel with anyone who catches a few of these fish for meat. on the table and picks up a few bucks on the side as a bonus, but a legal limit of these bass is hardly enough food for one person as they average only about 6 to 9 inches in length. The fishermen who take thse bass soley for the purpose of tearing the reward tag out and then throwing them back in the water is either misinformed about the purpose of the tagging program or couldn't care less about whether Lake Mead ever comes back as an excellent largemouth bass fishery.

FISHING REPORT:

LAKE MEAD: Strong persistent winds have

hampered fishing for nearly the entire month of June. The few times the winds subsided, fishing was good. Rising water temperature this past weekend has put most of the game fish down below the 20 foot mark. Largemouth bass fishing is good drifting small waterdogs or easting plastic worms from 20 to 40 feet deep. These methods should hold true during most of the

Although there are scattered reports of striped bass hitting shad on the surface in the canyon areas, most of the heavy fish appear to be below 40 feet.

summer months.

During the past few weeks many reports have come in regarding dead or dying stripers on the surface throughout the entire lake.

A number of people have shown concern that the stripers were dying off. This could be farther from the truth. Most of the problem comes from spawning stress. When you consider the enormous population of striped bass in Lake Mead, these dying and dead stripers are of very little consequence.

Speaking of spawning striped bass, last year's spawn was exceptional. Recently I have, on several occasions, observed acres of 10 inch stripers feeding on the surface. But compared to this year's spawn, last year's. may turn out to be very small. Stripers by the

tens of thousands have been observed spawning in the Haystack area alone, If spawn survival is good this year as it apparently was last year, look for Lake Mead to become one of the best striper fisheries anywhere over the next couple of years.

DAVIS DAM: Dale Shepard of Shepard's Sporting Goods at Holiday Shores, reports striper fishing slow from Davis Dam to the California line. A few fish are being taken but limits are rare. Pencil Poppers and anchovies splitting the take. On the lake side of Davis Dam, bass fishing is good,

waterdogs and plastic worms taking most. Trout fishing next to the dam, 25 to 45 feet deep has to be rated excellent. Limts are easy; nightcrawlers, cheese, marshmellows, redworms, corn and almost anything else is taking them.

LAKE MOHAVE: Harold Harper from Searchlight Storage and Bait reports good bass fishing from 15 to 30 feet deep off the points on plastic worms and waterdogs. Trout fishing good trolling 50 to 70 feet deep. Catfishing is excellent in the coves, 11/2
