WORK TO BEGIN ON NEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL - Ground was broken yesterday for the new Fay E. Galloway Elementary School to be located behind O'Callaghan Park. Fay Galloway for whom the school is being named; his wife, Gertrude, and Ed Schramm, general superintendent for Blanchard Construction Co. The school is expected to be completed by September of next year.

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held Monday morning for the new Fay E. Galloway Elementary School which will be located near O'Callaghan Park, south of Horizon Drive.

The school is being named in honor of Fay Galloway, a local man who started out as a janitor at the Henderson school and ended up 21 years later as director of operations for the Clark County School District, supervising over 400 people.

According to Dr. Charles Neely, assistant director of facilities for the school district, the school is expected to be open by September of 1979.

Galloway is now retired and lives in Las Vegas Valley but his two children are still in the school district. Son Charles, who lives in Henderson, is a vocational counselor and daughter, Jody Golem, teaches at Gene Ward Elementary School in Las Vegas.

The Galloway family all attended the groundbreaking ceremony including three granddaughters, Karen and Shannon Galloway and Lori Kizzia, as well as Galloway's brother, County Treasurer Bill Galloway.

Galloway, his wife Gertrude and two children came to Henderson in April of 1943 and worked at the BMI plant. In 1952 he went to work for the Henderson school district as custodian of the local school. When the Clark County School District was formed in 1956 he was named assistant director of operations and later was promoted to director of operations supervising over 400 men and women.

He retired in 1973, he has been active in community affairs as a member of the Henderson Library board, on the youth board at the old Teen club of Henderson, and was one of the founders of Industrial Days in Henderson. He also served on the juvenile board.

Jim Gibson to Serve on Three Committees

Senator James I. Gibson, Senate Democratic majority leader, will head up the Government Affairs committee and will also serve as vice chairman of the Finance committee and be on the Legislative Functions committee.

The Democrats elected Gibson as floor leader and made their choice of committee chairmen last month but the appointments of the remainder of the members of committees were made last Thursday.

With Gibson on Government Affairs will be Keith Ash-

worth of Las Vegas as vice chairman, Gene Echols of North Las Vegas, Jean Ford of Las Vegas and Jim Kosinski of Sparks.

On the Finance committee are Floyd Lamb of Las Vegas as chairman, Gibson, Echols, Norman Glaser of Halleck and Thomas Wilson of Reno.

On the Legislative Functions committee are Echols as chairman, Mel Close vice chairman, Ford, Gibson and Wilson.

Other committees include Commerce and Labor, Human

Resources and Facilities, Judiciary, Natural Resources, Taxation and Transportation.

Freshman legislators spent a couple of days last week in Carson City where they attended a "mock" school for legislatures where they learned a variety of details - from making a telephone call to introducing a bill to evacuating the building in case of an emergency.

Gibson took part in the schooling activities where, as Senate Majority leader, he wielded the gavel and explained Senate procedures.

Public Trust to Meet Thursday

Because of a lack of a quorum the Henderson Public Improvement Trust did not meet as scheduled last Thursday.

The trust has scheduled another meeting Thurs. at 5:30 p.m. in the conference room at city hall.

There will be a discussion of the Las Vegas Downs project at that time, and an update on the race track financing.

Over 7,000 Homes Approved

With approval of a number of homes expected at the city council meeting last night, the number of homes approved for this city has reached around 7,000.

The homes expected to be approved last night included 97 lots for Highland Hills; 32 lots for Henderson Foothills; 51 lots for Green Valley, phase 2; 66 lots for Green Valley phase 3; and a tentative map for Peppertree PUD consisting of 338 units on 29 acres located off Sunset Road in Section 3.

The council was also expected to approve the location of the Library at the civic center and to reappoint Councilman Phil Stout to the Regional Streets and Highways Commission.

The administration also asked the council for approval for additional personnel and equipment to initiate the water and sewer projects.

The council recessed the meeting until Friday, Dec. 22 at 4:30.

Sam Boyd Wins New Term

Eldorado Casino-California Hotel official Sam Boyd won a new two year term to the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors last week.

The LVCVA board is an 11-member body, comprised of six elected officials from Clark County, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City, along with five Greater Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce spots.

Henderson's three legislators, State Senator James I. Gibson and Assemblyman Jack Jeffrey and Nash Sena, will be the speakers at a meeting of the Henderson Chamber of Commerce at a breakfast meeting on Thurs., Dec. 21 at 7:30 in the Balboa Room at the Eldorado Club.

The legislators are expected to tell what they think the important issues of this session will be and it will give the Chamber of Commerce members a chance to meet with them prior to their going to Carson City.

Two of the important issues the Chamber will seek help on include the possible steps that would allow for the moving up of the Henderson portion of the expressway to around 1985 rather than 1992. The other is establishing a community college campus in Henderson.

The Boulder City Chamber members have been invited to attend the meeting which will be an "Eggs and Issues" breakfast.

Wolves Waste Warriors

The Wolves, now ranked fifth in the state and fourth locally in the wrestling standings, came of their impressive showing at the Chapparral Invitational to crush the Western Warriors 59-12 with seven pins and three favorable decisions in a twelve bout dual match Thursday night (the Wolves forfeited the 191 pound classification).

In the lower half of the Wolves roster it was Dan Rhodes (98), Norm Serano (112), and Eric MacKelprang in his first match, standing in for Ken Briggs out with the flu in the 133 pound weight class, who delivered pins for their team.

Mike Gonzales, a first year wrestler for Basic, came through at 127 pounds with an excellent 5-0 decision while Mike Butler (103) received the same treatment from his Western opponent being decided 9-3. Robert the Wolves 120 pounder was the victim of a superior decision 18-6 at the hands of Victor Tankley, Western's best wrestler, who finished first in the Chapparral Invitational at his weight and is ranked tops nationally.

On the upper half of the team Joey Montoya (138) started out Basic scoring with a superior decision over his man 17-3. He was followed by Jim McGovern (145) and Kevin Burrows now 7-0 at 154 pounds who both pinned their men.

Leo Hernandez (165)

put it to his man in a 12-11 close decision and then Ward Twitchell and Rich Perkins, also along with Burrows undefeated at 7-0, put the icing on the cake with their pins at 175 pounds and heavyweight.

The varsity is now 2 and 1 one of the season, having had an earlier tie with Clark disqualified for having an ineligible wrestler on their program.

In junior varsity action the younger Wolves were taken 45-30, fielding an inexperienced team but coming along with time. The squad received points for forfeits at 95 and 103 pounds but gave up eighteen points at the top of the schedule not having wrestlers at the last three weight classifications. Eddie Brinks evened out points on forfeits by being handed the win for Basic at 133 pounds.

Ken Palmer was a standout at 154 along with Jeff Branscum at 120 who both pinned their opponents. Jeff Bondurant decided his man in a tough match 9-7, but the other four wrestlers for the junior varsity all fell in pins as Western went on for the match win.

The varsity team will be appearing at the Quartz Hill Invite in California at the beginning of this week and then at the close of the vacation will host its own invitational on December 28th and 29th.

despite her sixteen point average and eighteen rebounds per game. Gail is a well-rounded three letter athlete. Besides her role on the basketball team she is a valuable spiker and co-captain on the Varsity girls' volleyball squad, as well as being a stand-out on the girls' track team her favorite sport where she excels in the

mile run.

This young lady who according to her coaches has a super attitude and is an important leader on teams will be a star on next year's basketball team to keep an eye on and should be expected to for a second year lead the Wolves at center and as team captain. Congratulations Gail!

It looked as if Basic might have their first win of the season and a nice early Christmas present for coach Ron Montoya last Tuesday night against Valley, but it was not to be as forward Leroy Strawther who bothered Basic for fourteen points stole the ball, the win, and Montoya's present in the last minute of play driving for a layup to put the Vikings ahead 46-45 and then dropping through two free throws

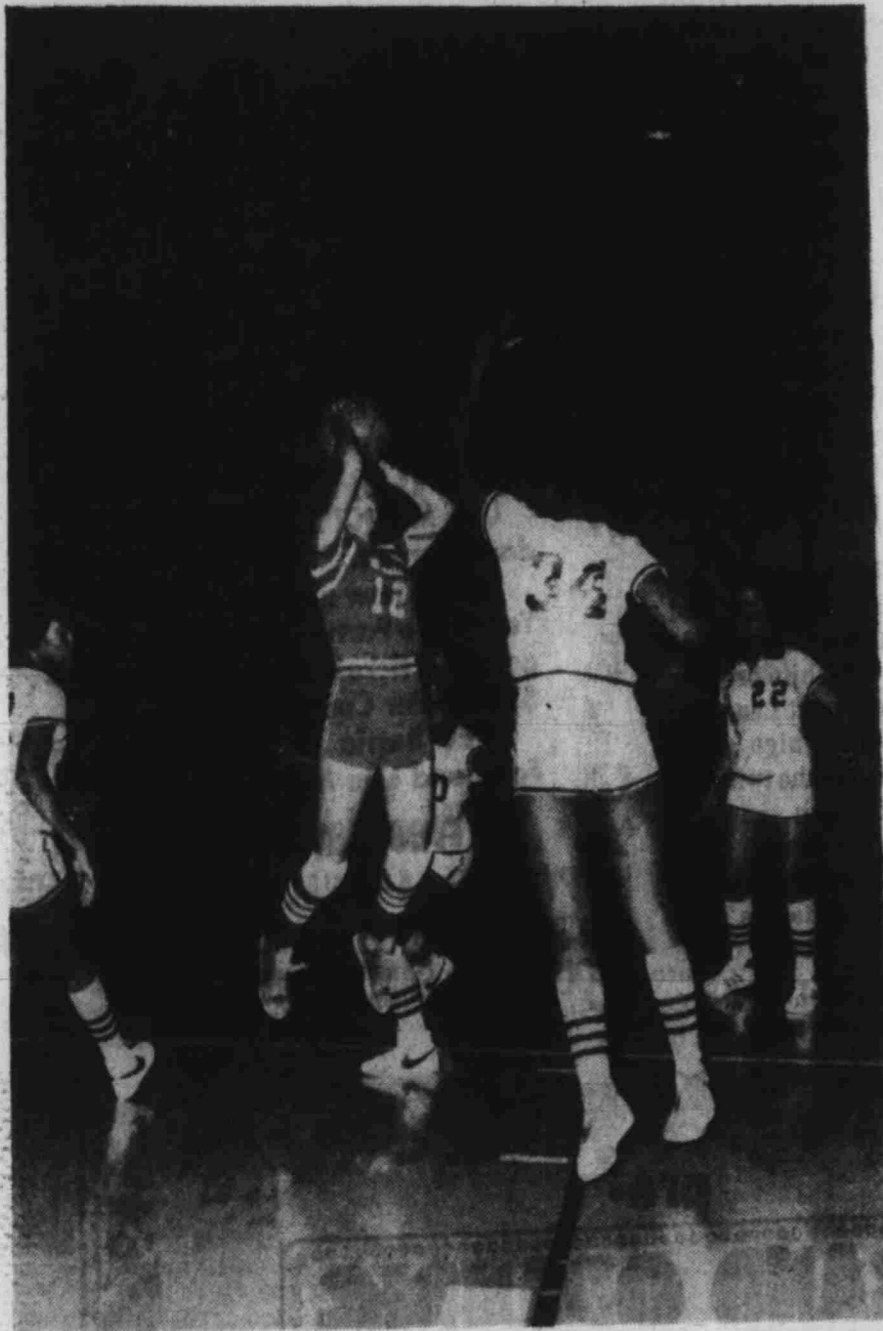

J.V. Leads Basic Volleyball

The junior varsity squad under Diane Hernandez has scored wins over Rancho in two games and Eldorado in a tough three game series this past week and thereby raised their record to 3-2 to lead the Basic volleyball program.

Playing really tough in their first game with Rancho the junior varsity came back off a 1-6 deficit scoring five unanswered points to knot it 6-6, before going on to take the game 15-11. Dawn Johnson played well in receiving and setting the ball for Basic while Diane Youngmans had two good spikes in the game and Jackie Holliday a spike and a key block.

In the second game, an

even tougher one than the first, the Basic girls with much improved communication and teamwork opened an 11-6 gap which the Rams fought hard to erase, however, in the neck and neck stretch run it was the Wolves who prevailed 15-12 on several well placed spikes.

Against Eldorado the junior team took the first and third games in their match 15-7 and 15-13 to post their second win in a row. Coach Hernandez praised the play of her team which exhibited cool and consistent teamwork to take the match. Especially singled out was Jackie Holliday for her improved spiking and blocking along with nine service points in the team's tremendous comeback in the third game.

The varsity had trouble with both the Rams and the Sun Devils going down in two to the highly experienced Rancho team and then being clipped in the last two games of three by Eldorado.

Solar Tax Deadline Approaching

December 31 is the final date for taxpayers to qualify for a solar tax credit this year. Carl's Air Conditioning of Henderson said.

Under energy legislation recently passed by the United States Congress, homeowners who install a solar system are eligible for a 30 percent tax credit on the first \$2,000 spent on a system and 20 percent on the next \$8,000.

To qualify for the 1978 Tax Refund, homeowners must have the system installed before the end of the year, Mr. Butler said.
