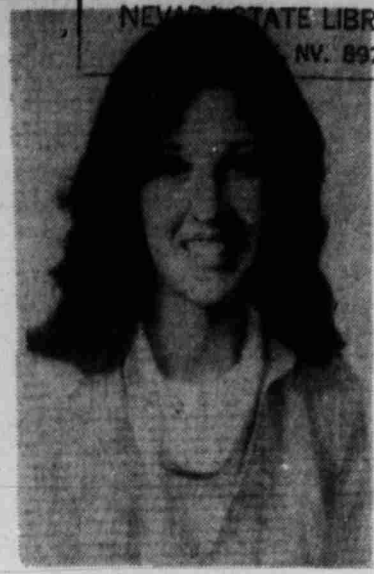

An Old House in Henderson Makes the News

There are many new homes coming to Henderson and that isn't news to most people.

But this week an old home came to Henderson and that is news for our people.

The 87-year-old home constructed in Las Vegas in 1912 for Will Beckley and his wife, Leva, arrived at its final resting place at the Southern Nevada Museum site in Henderson after a five-hour trip

from 120 South Fourth Street on Mon.

The last trip for the home began at 5 a.m. and it arrived on the site at 10 a.m., two hours prior to the time it had been anticipated by the movers. The Beckley family, Will's son Bruce, and his daughter, Virginia Beckley Richardson, donated the house to the museum. The site where it was will be turned into a parking lot.

The route followed by the 65-ton house, which was moved by Bland-Ford Moving Co., was mapped out by Jess Bachman and Henry Curtis, who spent many hours and money from their own pockets to map the route the house would follow.

"They measured and coordinated everything," Bernard Nolan, manager of the museum said. "Bachman spent three complete

weekends mapping out the course," he said. He said the two men were a "classic example of civic minded citizen" and he wished we had more.

The moving of the house turned south on Fourth Street, then west on Carson Street past the county courthouse to Casino Center Boulevard. There it turned

Officers Cleared in Shooting

Two Henderson police officers, involved in the shooting of a local man who shot and killed his wife and daughter-in-law last Thurs. night, were cleared Tuesday by the Grand Jury.

The shooting was termed "justifiable" by the jury which deliberated only a few minutes, according to reports. The two officers had been

relieved of duty until after the grand jury hearing but were expected to return to duty Wed. night.

The officers were involved with the shooting of Nevel Grimes, 71, of 119 Metropolitan, who apparently shot and killed his wife, Nannie, 59, and daughter-in-law Elqine Grimes, 23, during a family beef.

right again to Fremont St. where it moved south, then finally made its way to Henderson.

The cost of moving the house is being paid for by the Junior League of Las Vegas and they will also take care of the restoration of the house. He commended the league for its civic mindedness.

Doug Perry of the Clark County Recreation Department will be in charge of the footings and foundation and Nolan said he expects the putting down of the house to go "very rapidly."

The house, which now rests next to the old Union Pacific depot, which was moved to Henderson from Boulder City, faces south-east. It will be refurbished by the Junior League with furnishings from the era (1912) for which it was built. The fee to visit the other museum holdings in Henderson will include the Beckley home.

"We're all very happy to have it here," Nolan said, expressing the feelings of all Henderson residents.

Council Postpones Action On Rezoning Applications

Two controversial rezoning measures came before the city council Mon. night and neither was completed by council action.

A request for a rezoning of commercial property near the Albertsons market for apartment dwelling was postponed for discussion at a committee meeting next Mon. night, and a request by Halco, Inc. to rezone a development of 160 acres near Basic High School was postponed at the request of the developer.

Approximately 30 people attended the council meeting to protest the rezoning by Halco to change from rural residential (RR) to single family residential (R-1), multiple family residences (R-3) and neighborhood commercial district (C-1).

The Halco request was previously turned down by the city planning commission and J. Downey, speaking for Halco, requested the item be taken from the agenda for a period of 30 days. Downey said, "We would like time to reevaluate the project in order to possibly relieve the protests which were at the planning commission meeting."

Beverly Whitehorn, of La Habra, Ca., asked to speak to the council in protest of the rezoning since she had made the trip especially for the meeting. She said she and her husband had purchased their property to build a home where they could retire with a view of the Las Vegas Valley. She showed pictures taken by her husband of the view from their property.

The council set May 14 for a discussion of the matter unless the application is

changed by the applicant. In that event the matter would return to the city planning commission.

The rezoning for apartments near the Albertson's shopping center and adjacent to Manganese Park, was postponed for further discussion in committee.

"There seems to be a lot of information on this item," Councilman Phil Stout said, so he requested it be sent to committee.

The zone change has been requested by William and Sherry Blanca of Ohio. The change had been previously approved by the planners and it was later discovered there was a discrepancy in the legal advertisement. It was readvertised and sent back to the planners and was denied.

Michael Sitton, represented the Blancas and C and E Construction, said access to the property had been cut off by the sale of property in the area, making it unsuitable for commercial.

Darrel Phillips, owner of the adjoining property, said he sold the property in question with the understanding that it would be commercial and he opposed the apartment zoning.

Councilman Phil Stout made a motion that the zoning change be approved with the stipulation that Tuna St. be closed as access to the apartments, that Taylor Street be improved and that sewer be extended to Boulder Highway. The motion was seconded by Councilman Gary Price. Following discussion on the matter, a motion was made to table the issue for further study.

C.B. Armstrong, Manager of Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation's Henderson Plant, said today that about 135 employees have been on strike against the Company since midnight, April 12, when labor agreements with three unions expired.

Involved are employees represented by the International Chemical Workers Union, Local 218; International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 357; and the United Association of Plumbers and Pipefitters, Local 525.

"Future negotiating sessions between the Company and the unions have not been scheduled, but Kerr-McGee continues to be willing to work toward a mutually satisfactory settlement of the dispute," Armstrong said.

"Plant employees, represented by the International Union of Operating Engineers, Local 501, and the International Association of Machinists, Local 845, ratified new labor agreements April 13 and are not participating in the current strike," Armstrong said.

Bulletin

It was learned by the Home News yesterday that the Federal Mediator has called for a meeting between plant officials and striking union officials for today to try to resolve the differences. Men picketing on the line told this reporter the differences are not in pay raises as they agreed to stay in the guidelines set by the President, but the differences are in benefits such as dental insurance.

Absentee Ballots Available Now

Absentee ballots are available at the city clerk's office for the coming municipal election, according to City Clerk Dorothy Vondenbrink.

The ballots will be available until May 1. Absentee ballots by mail may also be requested until May 1.

The municipal election will be held May 8 to elect three city councilmen and a municipal Judge. Judge Jim Jensen is running unopposed.

The general election will be May 12.

Local Infant Dies

Logan Watson, two - weeks old son of Mr. and Mrs. Mark Watson, was killed Sunday night at 9:45 near Las Vegas Wash intersection in a two-car accident.

Three others were injured. Following the accident Highway Patrolmen charged Reid Colvin, 18, of Sacramento, Ca., with involuntary manslaughter, felony driving under the influence of alcohol and driving with a revoked driver's license.

Authorities said Colvin crossed a double yellow line on Lakeshore Drive and slammed head on into a car driven by Watson, 22. Both Watson and his wife were hospitalized. Mrs. Watson was taken to Southern Nevada Memorial hospital and Watson to Sunrise hospital with extensive head injuries.

Leveritt, who was visibly shaken by the decision of the council, tossed parting shots at City Attorney Kent Dawson and called him "incompetent."

Leveritt claimed he purchased the land "together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto or in anywise appertaining." He said that could not be extinguished or compromised by a subsequent act of the city.

Dawson, however, claimed the city paid for and has a right to charge for the fees

Library Director Tours 14 Facilities for Ideas

Tom Hollis, director of the Henderson Public Library, left early this week to visit libraries in Southern California and Arizona that are of a comparable size to the new library in the planning stages for Henderson.

The library board has been given permission by the city to build a new and larger facility on a location at the Civic Center and Hollis is interested in studying other libraries which have been recommended to him of a size between 30,000 to 40,000 square feet.

"I'm interested in looking at the libraries in the way of what they have and whether it is feasible for us. I'm also interested in learning whether the directors of the various libraries we'll be visiting are happy with their designs."

Hollis will be traveling with Bob Anderl, as-

stant director of the library at UNLV who has been assisting Henderson in an advisory and consultant capacity.

"We will be visiting 14 libraries, first in the Los Angeles and San Diego area, then over to Tucson and the Phoenix area, all during a seven work day period," Hollis explained.

"We also plan to take pictures along the way so I can give my board of directors a slide presentation of what we have

seen." He said that the new library, for which the board has applied for a building grant, would have the basic services offered by libraries all over the country.

"We are interested in having an auditorium, meeting rooms, and exhibit area, along with the regular library services. How the plans for the new library will be drawn up to best accommodate all ages is of great concern to me," Hollis concluded.

February Citation Summary

Seventy-five errant outdoorsmen paid \$6,165 in fines and forfeited bail assessments during February, according to the Nevada Department of Fish and Game.

Leading the list of prevalent violations was fishing without a valid license, with 14 anglers paying \$700 in fines and nine paying \$450 in forfeited bail. Fines and bail forfeitures averaged slightly more than \$50, five times the cost of the resident fishing license.

Fourteen were assessed a total \$2,350 in fines and bail for using prohibited trapping methods.

Other common infractions included fishing prohibited methods, with seven paying \$350. Five were assessed \$250 for hunting within a prohibited area.

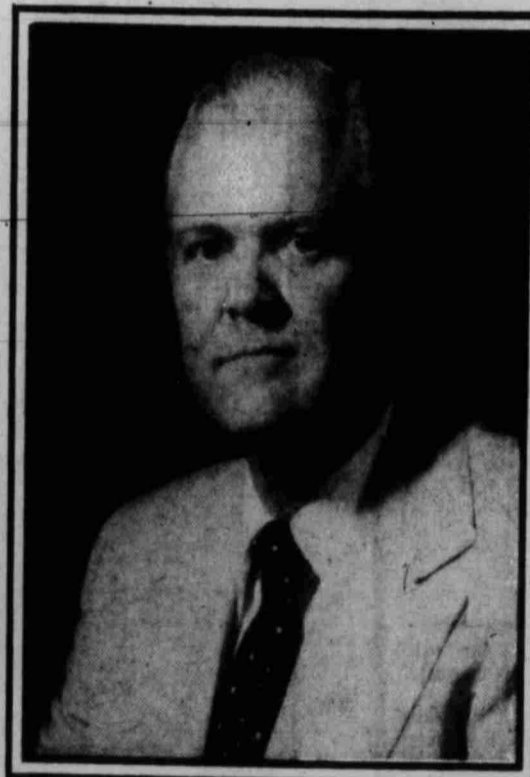

'Join in and Fight Crime'

By Officer Robert Lindsey

The most natural and frequent question people ask about crime is "Why?" They ask it about individual crimes and about crime as a whole. In either case, it is an almost impossible question to answer. Each single crime is a response to a specific situ-

ation by a person with an infinitely complicated psychological and emotional makeup who is subject to infinitely complicated external pressures. Crime as a whole is millions of such responses.

The Henderson police Department has im-

plemented a way you, as a citizen, can aid in this fight against crime, and the new system is called, "Join". That's right, it is an around-the-clock telephone hot line program at the Police Department that would allow any person having information concerning a crime or a possible crime, or possible persons involved in a crime, a chance to assist the Police to prevent the crime or apprehend the suspects involved.

This is how the system works: The JOIN program is a tape recording device which is activated automatically when a citizen dials the Join number (564-5646). Callers may remain anonymous or leave their names, if they wish to be contacted during the next business day.

At no time are the calls monitored and no attempts will be made to

identify the callers.

JOIN callers offer their taped information at the conclusion of recorded instructions. These instructions advise them, in part, as follows:

Thank you for calling our confidential reporting number. If your call is of an emergency nature or needs immediate attention, please hang up and call our main Police number (565-8933). An officer is on duty to handle such emergency calls. When leaving your non-emergency confidential information, please try to be as complete as possible. Include, if known, such things as the full name of the suspect, physical description, nicknames, license numbers, and date of birth. Please be assured that the Henderson Police Department will do its best to follow up your lead, or refer it to the proper jurisdiction. If you wish to have an officer return your call on the morning of the next working day, you may also leave your telephone number. At the sound of the tone, you may leave your message.

Join in the fight for crime prevention - call the Henderson Police Department. When you have non-emergency information that might aid the Police in our fight against crime, call 564-J (5) O (6) I (4) N (6), and JOIN IN AND FIGHT CRIME!!

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I am writing through you to all who are interested in the procedure of improving the quality of health care at the lowest possible cost to all residents of Clark County.

The communities of southern Nevada have mushroomed in population over the past ten years and providers of health care, both private and public, have increased their number and services accordingly. We are fortunate we are now able to get many specialized procedures in medicine and surgery not available fifteen years ago.

This growth has brought with it higher costs for health care. In establishing 205 Health

Systems Agencies across the country, the Congress mandated that a first priority for each area was to work toward a containment of health care costs, at the same time improving its quality, accessibility, continuity, availability and acceptability to all residents, particularly in medically underserved areas. Along with this goes planning for and encouraging the training of all in prevention care.

In order to meet the above criteria, following federal guidelines, the Health Systems Agency of Clark County (HSA-CC) has had to produce a Health Systems Plan (HSP) and an Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) which project pos-

sible ways to achieve the Congressional mandate.

The present preliminary edition of the HSP contains chapters pointing out the Plan's purpose, an area description, the present health status of our county, and a beginning description of health care delivery systems and facilities now available. Due to a lack of data, the last named subject is incomplete. Following editions will address this as the HSP is a continuing effort. This edition contains goals and objectives for the next five years, and recommended actions for this coming year.

Copies of the HSP and AIP have been placed in all our public libraries, including UNLV and the Agency itself at 625 Shadow Lane (rear area in Health District Building). The public, and that means anyone reading this letter, consumer and provider, is invited and urged to look at the Plan, its goals and recommended actions. You are asked to send written comments, whether they be corrections, suggestions for future editions (they are annual), or health care areas needing improvement, to the HSA-CC, P.O. Box 4426, Las Vegas, Nevada, 89106, Attention: Plan

Development Chairman, before April 26, 1979.

You are also invited to come to the Plan Development Committee meeting at the Health District Building Wednesday, April 18, 1979 at 7:30 p.m., where time will be given for informal discussion and comment. The Governing Body of the Agency will hear public comment at its meeting Thursday, April 26th at 7:30 p.m. in the Health District auditorium. All comments will be incorporated into an addendum to be forwarded to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare with the Plan.

We are told we all have "a time to live and a time to die." The intent of the federal law setting up HSAs is to make each one of us at the grass roots a party to assuring that our time of living has a healthy quality within financial reach. All members of the Agency Governing Body and its Committees are volunteers. Let us hear from the "grass roots," whether you be expert providers or ultimate consumers of health care.

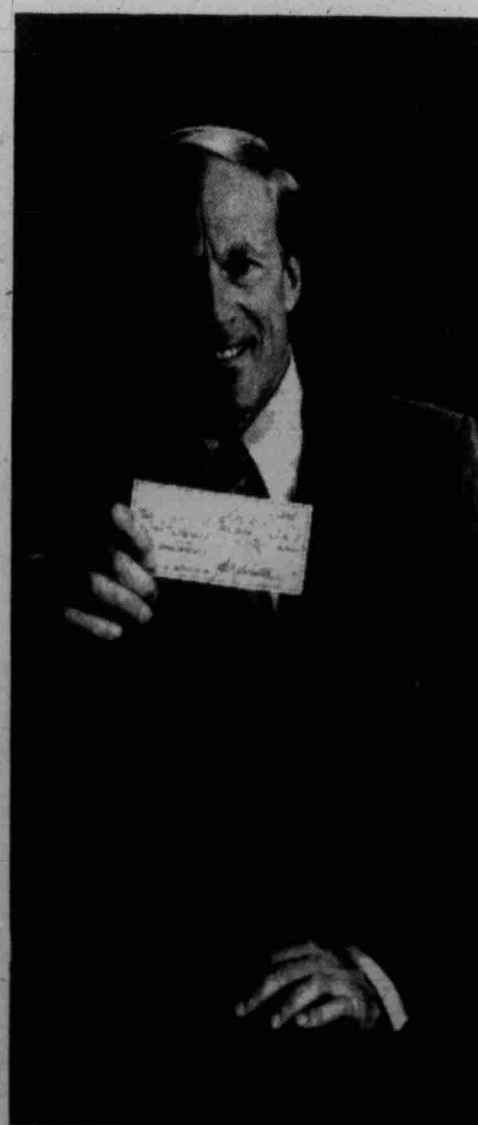

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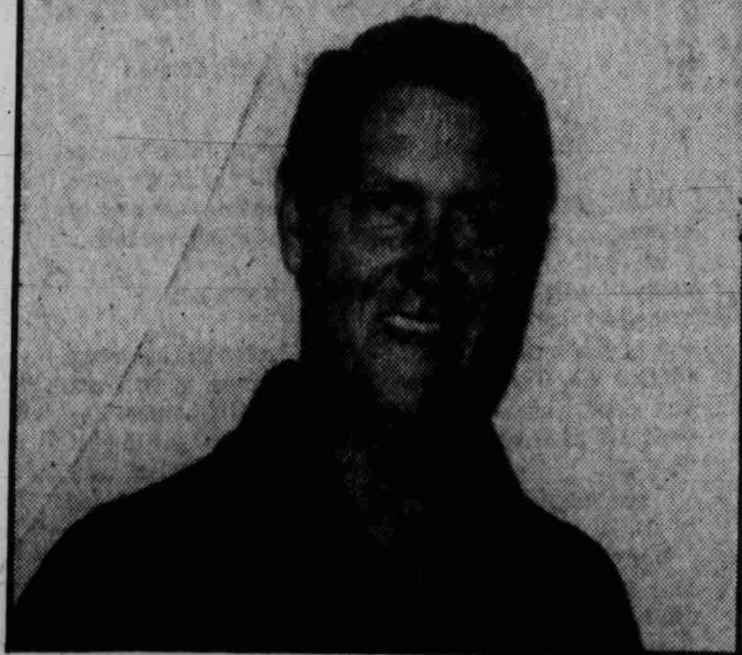

Two brothers Tom and Richard Brayford, are the owners of the nursery and have decided to get back into a business in which they were once active back in Illinois before moving to Nevada.

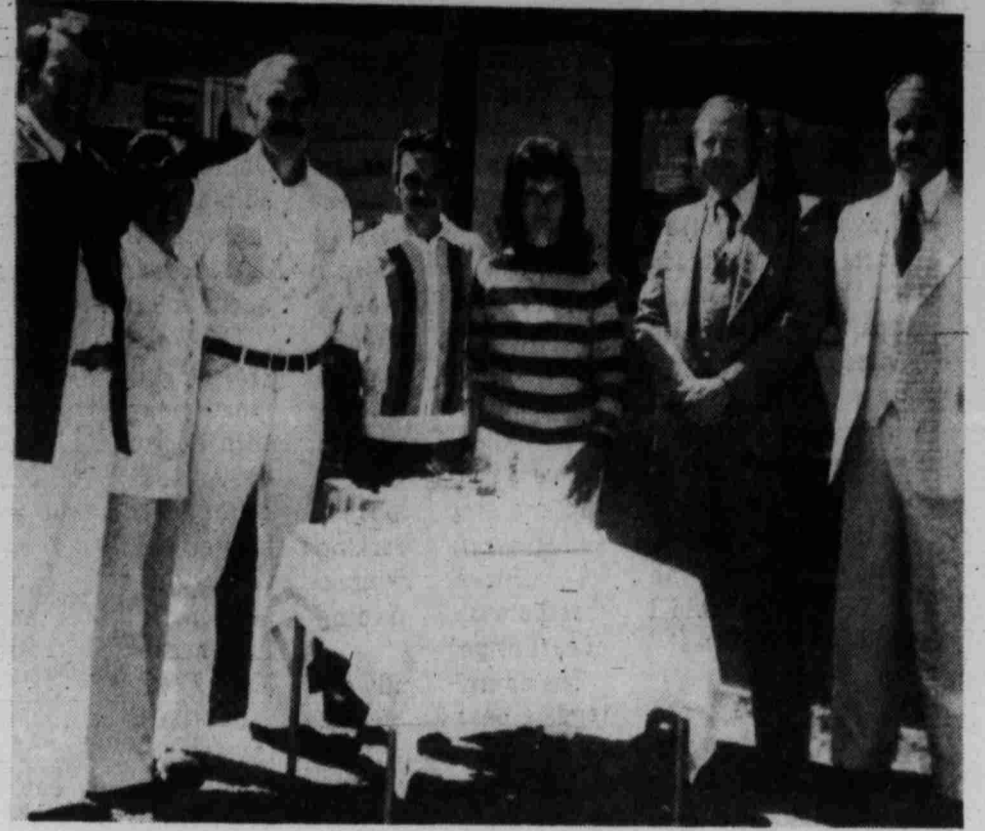


Frank Juliuson Passes Away

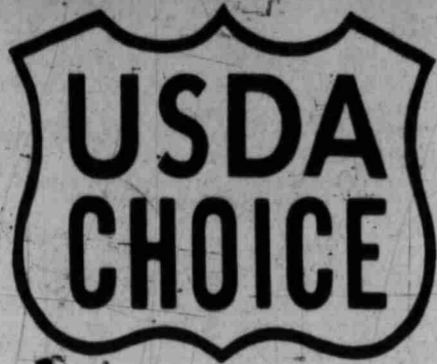

This week's chosen art object are the ceramic creations of Patsy Kubla of Henderson. Patsy has studied, investigated, created, and taught ceramics for twelve years. "I love this form of art," she expressed. "I want to keep learning, improving and teaching others the fun, the art, and the satisfaction they can receive out of creating their own pieces."

We are displaying two of Patsy's newest creations; a beautiful and original platter for decor or table service, and one of the famous "Three Graces" - a nude.

Patsy received the effect she wanted by patience, fortitude, originality and talent. She obtained the greenware platter and prepared it for firing at cone .05 but first applied Beauty Stroke air gun. After the first firing, the piece turned to bisque. The platter has a white underglaze and Patsy secured the slate look by mixing black with white and painting "free hand" a simple scene of a tree, a field, a fence and some birds. She applied the glaze and fired the platter again - this time at cone .06.

"I purchase greenware, clean it off with trimming utensils to remove excess clay and sand it. I put in grooves or finishing touches with still another tool. My desire is to enhance the piece of greenware before proceeding on to firing and painting," Patsy pointed out.

Mrs. Joe (Patsy) Kubla, not only purchases greenware for herself or

her students but pours her own molds or hand-molds original designs.

The nude (Three Graces) was purchased as greenware on which Patsy added grooves and finishing touches by the same process. She turned the nude to bisque by firing in her home studio kiln at .06 cone. She applied the stains through the use of the air gun and did not fire it again for she wanted to achieve the soft statue-like surface - and succeeded. The statue is a work of art!

Patsy Kubla mainly works in ceramics for her own enjoyment, as a teacher, for gifts - personal, or for sale. She has exhibited at various shows and has received a blue ribbon for a blue dish. She also holds a deft hand at oil painting. She was born in Vandergrift, Pennsylvania (Pennsylvania Dutch forefathers) and is of Scotch - Irish descent. Her fifteen - year - old daughter, Melissa, follows in mother's footsteps as far as ceramic application and appreciation is concerned. Mrs. Kubla is a Member

Crime Resistance for Runners

familiar city, ask a law enforcement officer or other responsible person to suggest an area in which it is safe to run.

- If you run at night, select a route with adequate lighting and wear light-colored clothing that will allow you to be seen by passing motorists.

- Avoid secluded areas or locations containing hiding places for potential criminals.

- Avoid running alone whenever possible.

- Obey traffic controls and avoid running on the road or engaging in other conduct which may antagonize motorists.

Dolan Springs, Arizona, is about forty miles from here, in the heart of the desert. It is a small, peaceful settlement, just beginning to grow somewhat, with water and electricity available commensurate with its growth.

wife, May, have a spread there that is almost beyond belief. With loving care they have created a fascinating desert garden spot as a setting for their home. And as we approached their home, we were amazed at the rock work that has been put into it and we learned that Cliff did all this work him-

self, with the ready assistance of May. When they first arrived there they had a four wheel drive Ford pickup and they started traveling over all the nearby trails. When they began to realize how many multi-colored rocks and stones there were they started to collect them. And as their

collection grew too large to handle, Cliff built a small shed to serve as a studio and they went into the costume jewelry business. It was at that time they decided to come west. They looked around generally, but didn't choose any particular spot. Finally they bought their land at Dolan Springs without having seen it. However, they say they never have regretted buying it, even before they had electricity or running water.

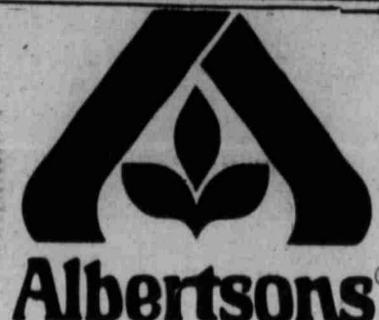
Cliff says when he was in the Service his outfit was 80% p.c. Indians and as Patrol Leader he came to know and like them very much. And he says if they liked you (and they liked him) they would do anything they could for you, but if you didn't earn their liking and respect they would obey orders but they wouldn't speak to you except when compelled to do so.

One day Cliff and May went to Window Rock and chatted with an Indian woman who was eighty years old. As they had enjoyed talking with her, they decided to go back and pick her up and take her for a ride with them. In the Reservation they came across an Indian walking along with a small boy, and each carried a musical instrument. Cliff and May stopped to speak to them, and the Indian said, "We are practicing a recording to send overseas". Cliff had heard that in the Tribal Council no outsider is allowed to enter, but he commented, "I'd like to hear your band". The Indian replied that although it really was for Indians only, he would take them in as his guests. So Cliff and May went with him into the Council Room, and Cliff says they had beautiful mahogany desks where the Council sat. Before the orchestra started playing the Director warned all of them not to talk or even whisper, because the recorder would pick up the slightest sound. There were old people and children playing in the band, and Cliff says the music was beautiful, and that this was one of the greatest treats they have had since they have come to know the Indians. And they were pleased to learn that two or three years ago they had an Indian band in the Rose Bowl parade.

While we talked we realized how comfortable and interesting the Fellows' home is. One wall displays paintings that May had done, and at one end of the living room was a set of shelves which held some of her choice work with stones - some of it is delicate and lovely, and some pieces have a humorous aspect - all of it is delightful. They showed me an album full of photographs of the animals and birds that have come to them for food. And as I sat on the divan, there was a

At one time Cliff was President of the Dolan Springs Chamber of Commerce, and started a campaign to preserve what he describes as "the loveliest and largest stand of Joshua trees outside the Holy Land". So far the U.S. Department of the Interior has agreed to hold this land, and has assured them it will not be included in any land sold at auction. Cliff would like to see it as a park area, including a ghost town (White Hills) and a magnificent overlook known as "Quartermaster Viewport", offering an impressive view of Granite Gorge of the lower Grand Canyon. And he can direct you to these impressive spots if you've the time to go on.

When Cliff and May started prowling about the countryside, they went through the gate to visit the Indian Reservation. Cliff is a great champion of the Indians and feels they have had a bad deal ever since we opened up this country. And he says they have had their troubles in and around Dolan Springs, in that people would tramp through the Reservation, shooting holes in their water tanks and cables, so now they

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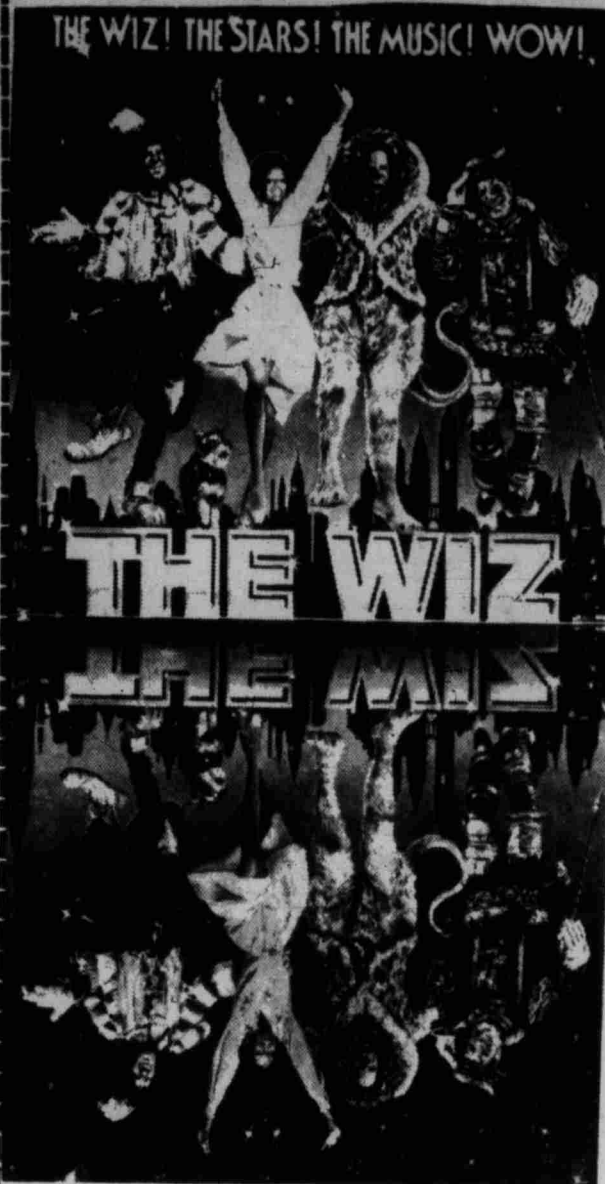

Topics for Taxpayers

LEGISLATORS CAN'T PLEASE ALL WITH TAX REDUCTION PLANS

By Ernest L. Newton

No matter how well intentioned legislators are in their efforts to devise a responsible and effective tax reduction plan, it is one of the facts of life that no plan is going to please everyone. Looking at the criticism of the plans so far unveiled, one cannot escape the conclusion that

most of the criticism comes from two groups of people: (1) people who don't pay much in taxes now, and (2) people who want some advantage at the expense of their neighbors.

Some legislators are convinced that the apparent charisma of Proposition 6 can be countered with a tax reduction program targeted toward residential property. It is an intriguing idea for it presumes that most voters don't realize that "all taxes are paid by consum-

ers." Taxes levied against business enterprises are added to the cost of the things and services people buy. The people pay the taxes, but the taxes are hidden. The same is true of sales taxes (and, in other states, of income

taxes withheld from pay checks) and of the various occupational taxes and fees that business organizations are required to pay.

Tax reductions targeted on residential property entails another problem.

although the legislative counsel is somewhat secure in the belief that that problem can be overcome. Nevada's constitution says that "assessment and taxation shall be uniform and equal." It is freely admitted that a tax program that provides lower tax impact on residential property than on other property presents the problem of uniformity. Whether that problem can

be solved, or not, will require a court test. Even more inequitable are proposals to amend the constitution to provide for forthright inequality. Those proposals would frankly admit that Nevada penalizes business enterprises (in varying degrees) in order for politicians to be able to "point with pride" at the savings to special interest groups of voters.

Again is demonstrated the value of Nevada's constitutional amendment procedure. Such a proposal (differential assessments) would have to be approved by two separately elected legislatures, and by the voters in the following election. Surely somewhere along the line

voters will see such proposals as just a sop to the taxpayers in an effort to gain votes.

No state that has differential assessments likes it. In those states, every session of the legislature is importuned to grant special assessment favors to this or that special

interest group looking for some real or imagined advantage over the other taxpayers.

The bills were heard in committee last month. Perhaps the arguments mustered against the idea are gaining converts to "uniform assessments and equal taxation."

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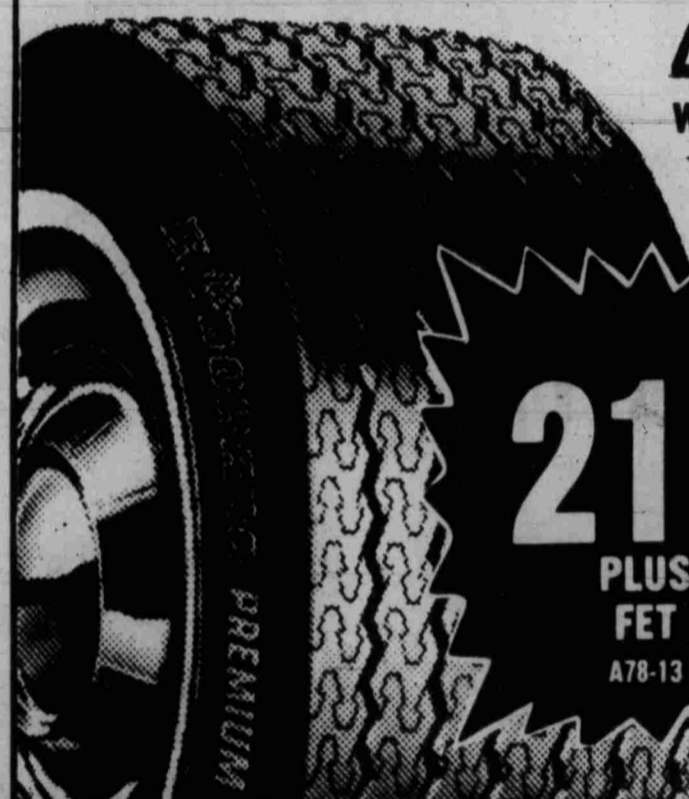

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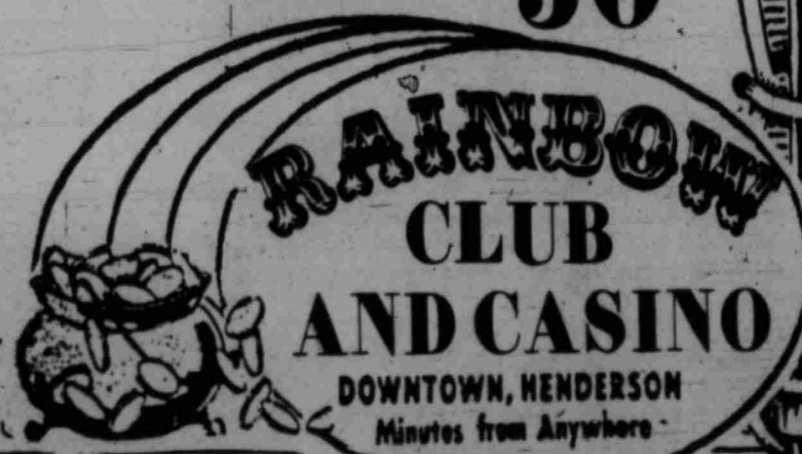

Ultimately, it was four men - producer Rob Cohen, director Sidney Lumet, screenwriter Joel Schumacher and production designer Tony Walton - who initially took on the task of creating a lavishly mounted production that would be driven by the high-energy music of today and boast the look of a highly imaginative tomorrow. Starring in this fantastic, fun-filled and often awe-inspiring filmed trip through a magical land are Diana Ross, Michael Jackson, Nipsey Russell, Ted Ross, Lena Horne and Richard Pryor as The Wiz.

For Cohen, "The Wiz" has been almost a total way of life ever since he first saw the smash hit show on Broadway early in 1975. Later, after he persuaded Universal to buy the movie rights, he got down to the real challenge of how to adapt the show to the screen. He soon realized that he couldn't simply re-make the classic 1939 MGM musical, "The Wizard of Oz," starring the then teen-aged Judy Garland. To merely film the stage musical, with its setting also in turn-of-the-century Kansas, was also totally inadequate to the broad conception he had in mind. The only way to go, he decided, was "to do something radically different."

Hollywood was just a step away and Miss Ross turned that step into a bounding leap by being nominated for an Academy Award as Best Actress in her first film, "Lady Sings the Blues." This was followed by "Mahogany," for which she was not only the star but the costume designer.

Michael Jackson, who makes his motion picture debut as the Scarecrow, was only five years old when he joined his four brothers in what was to become a musical phenomenon, The Jackson Five.

At 19, Michael has become the lead singer of the popular group, now renamed The Jacksons and, for his efforts as a solo performer, he has five Gold singles and two Platinum albums on his walls.

Nipsey Russell, a "regular" on the long-running television show, "To Tell the Truth," has been seen nationally on many other shows including "The Tonight Show," "Rhyme or Reason," and the Dean Martin Celebrity Roasts. He now plays his first motion picture role as Tinman.

As the highly-imaginative concepts began to take a shape, Lumet signed on other key production personnel, including Ossie Morris, as director of photography, Dede Allen, as film editor, Quincy Jones, as musical director, and Louis Johnson, as choreographer.

At about this time, Miss Ross, who, as it turned out, had always dreamed of playing Dorothy, was set to fill the key starring role.

As the pre-production plans progressed, it developed that the film would have 52 sequences - 32 of them to be shot on location and 20 to be filmed at the recently revitalized, Astoria Studios in Long Island City.

Finally, on October 3, 1977, "The Wiz" began principal photography. By the time the filming was completed, on December 29, 1977, the extraordinary production had become the most expensive film ever made in the City of New York.

Lena Horne makes her first screen appearance in nearly a decade in her starring role as the good witch Glinda. She was last seen by motion picture audiences as Richard Widmark's wife in "Patch."

Richard Pryor, world famous for his incisive, zany and even outrageous humor, stars in the title role of The Wiz. Among his nine previous feature films are "Lady Sings the Blues," "Which Way is Up?," "Blue Collar," "Greasd Lightning," "Car Wash," "The Bingo Long Traveling All-Stars and Motor Kings" and "Uptown, Saturday Night."

"The Wiz," a Motown Production for Universal release, stars Diana Ross, Michael Jackson, Nipsey Russell, Ted Ross, Lena Horne and Richard Pryor as The Wiz. Produced by Rob Cohen, with Ken Harper serving as executive producer, it was directed by Sidney Lumet from a screenplay, by Joel Schumacher.

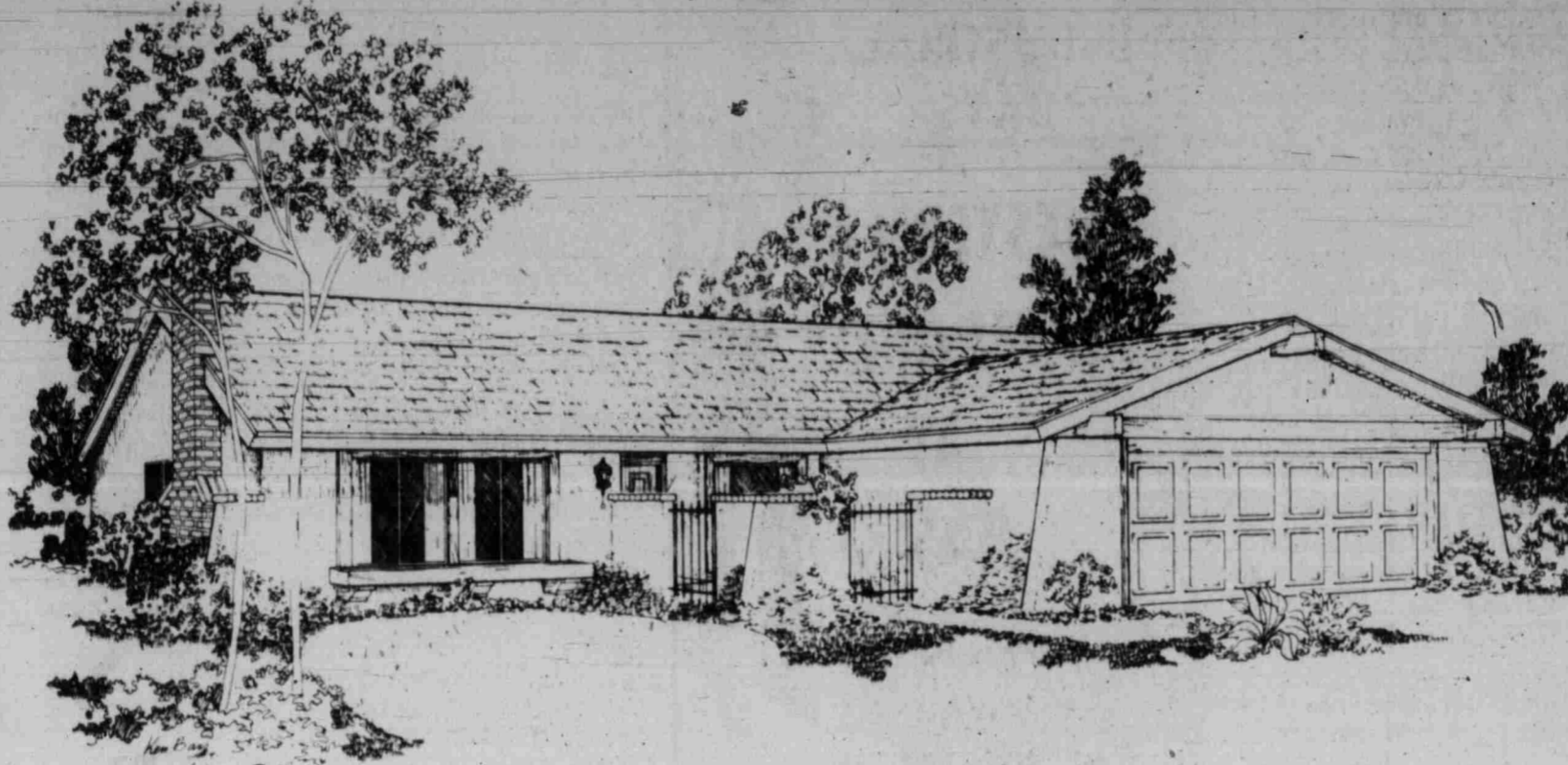

2 1/2 cups unsifted all-purpose flour
3 cups sliced rhubarb (can use frozen)
1 cup light brown sugar
1/2 cup chopped walnuts

TOPPING (optional)

1/2 cup butter or margarine
1 cup sugar
1/2 cup light cream or evaporated milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
Coffee Cake - Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 13x9-inch pan. In

medium bowl, mix butter or margarine, sugar, egg, buttermilk, soda, vanilla, salt, flour, and rhubarb - pour into greased pan. Sprinkle brown sugar and nuts over the top and bake for about 45 minutes.

Topping (optional)

Heat butter or margarine and sugar and evaporated milk but do not boil. Take off stove - stir in vanilla and stir until consistency is right. Spread on cake - and for glazed look - put back in oven for about 1 minute.

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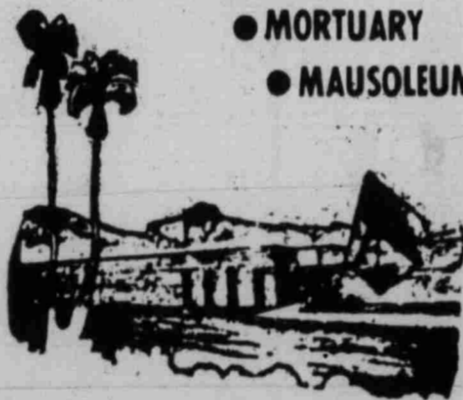
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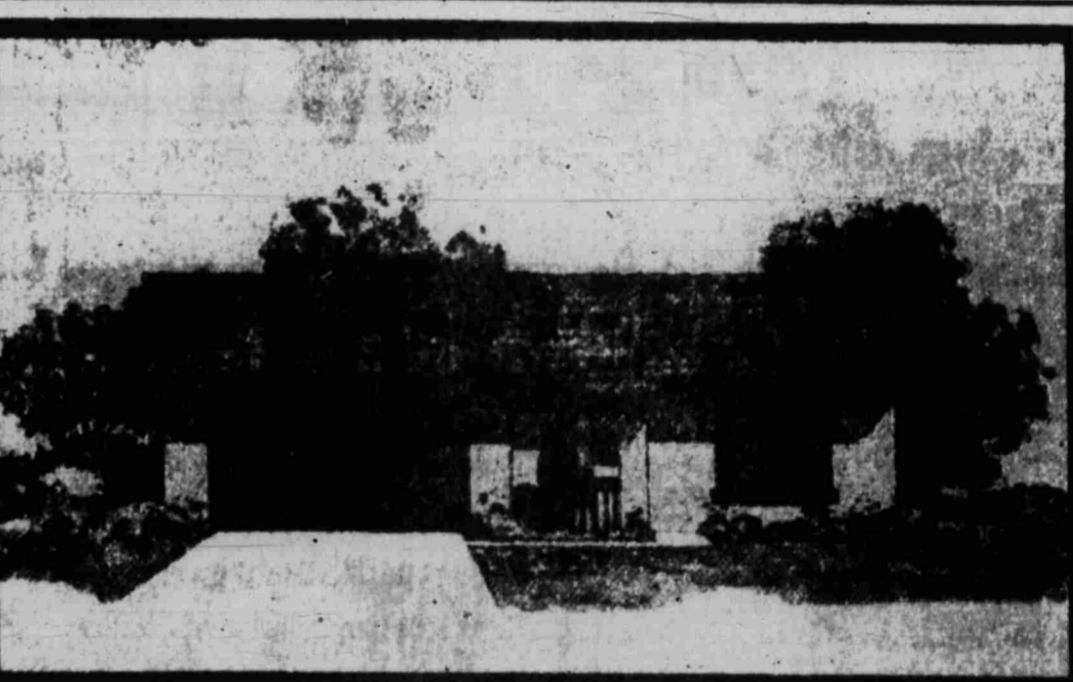
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Ranch Rally April 22

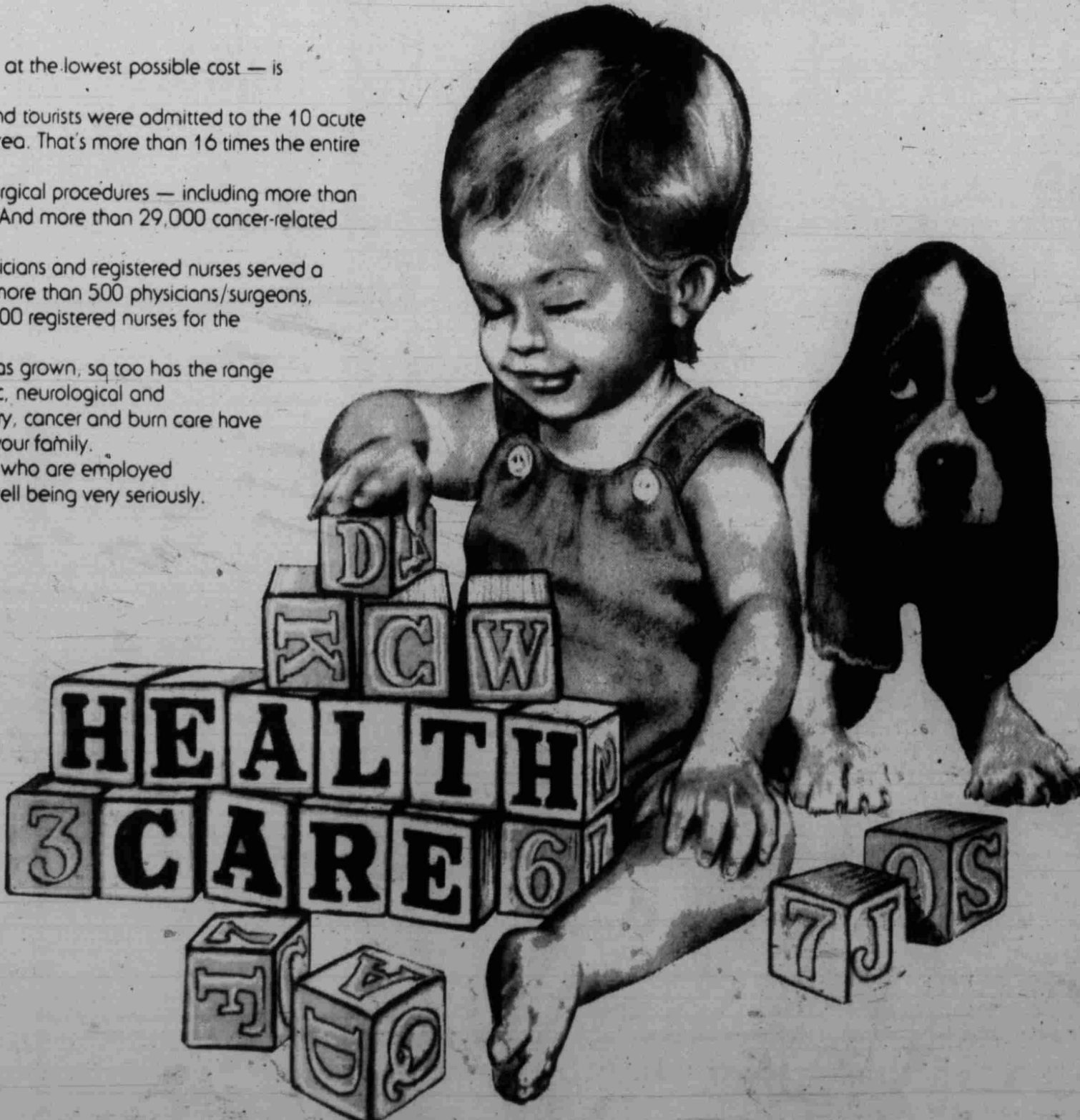

The Day 'NIG' Died; Herb Oliver Laid Him To Rest

Herb Oliver of Boulder City was among those working at Hoover Dam on February 21, 1941 ... the day that "NIG" died.

The beloved black dog known as the mascot of Hoover Dam had sought a shady spot for a quick nap directly beneath the rear wheels of a large truck. The driver, Bob Fisher, didn't see the sleeping dog as he began

backing up and the dog that had won the hearts of thousands of workmen since his arrival on the project in 1932 was instantly killed.

Fisher was stunned. His grief was shared by others as the word quickly spread that NIG was no more.

Oliver was shift chief on the swing shift at the time. The current project underway was the construction of the exhibit building on the Nevada side of the dam.

By the time he arrived for work that sad day, permission had already been obtained to bury the faithful canine friend next to his true master, Hoover Dam.

M.O. Dodge gave the O.K. for a small grave to be carved in the rock floor of the small turnout area just above the exhibit building. It was done.

The body of the dog was wrapped in a tarp and placed in a box to await burial.

Oliver remembers the day well. Work on the digging of the grave had just begun when he came on the job at 3 p.m. It wasn't until around 9 p.m. that all was ready.

And so on that February evening in 1941,

the simple funeral was conducted. It wasn't a big affair; not many were there. Mickey Thomas, cement worker; Francis Stay, air tool operator; Walter Klann, concrete ... and Oliver were in the small group.

NIG was laid to rest, his days of play and joy were done. His feats of daring and his unbridled love for the great dam and its men continued on in the hearts and minds of all who had been fortunate enough to know him.

The legend grew ... while NIG rested in an obscure grave passed by thousands of tourists each year. Few even noticed the simple slab with the letters N I G. Of those that did spot it, few

understood its significance.

Finally, a year or so ago, a simple small plaque was installed on the canyon wall directly above the slab. It read: "NIG ... The dog that adopted a dam. Born about March 1932, died about June 1936." Actually, the date of death is incorrect ... but the sentiment expressed is not.

Last summer, a Wisconsin tourist, Clarence Kailin, saw the plaque and demanded it be removed. He termed it "racist" in nature. He launched a barrage of letters which finally resulted in the simple

memorial being removed from the wall in March of this year.

Reaction was immediate. Hundreds of persons have signed a petition circulated by Betty Rovacchi requesting the plaque be returned. Letters have been written to Nevada's representatives and Congressman.

To date, no action has been taken. Bureau of Reclamation officials here said plans will be made to replace the plaque with an informational sign with "revised" wording. No firm plans have yet been started to this end.

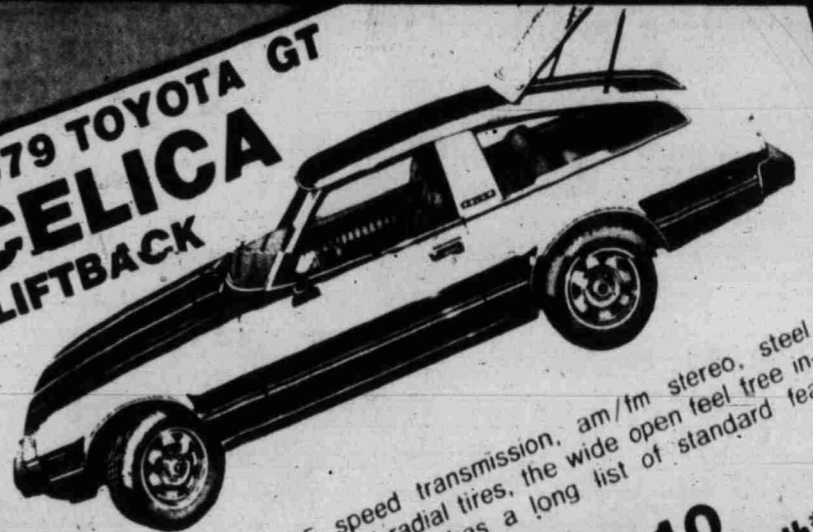

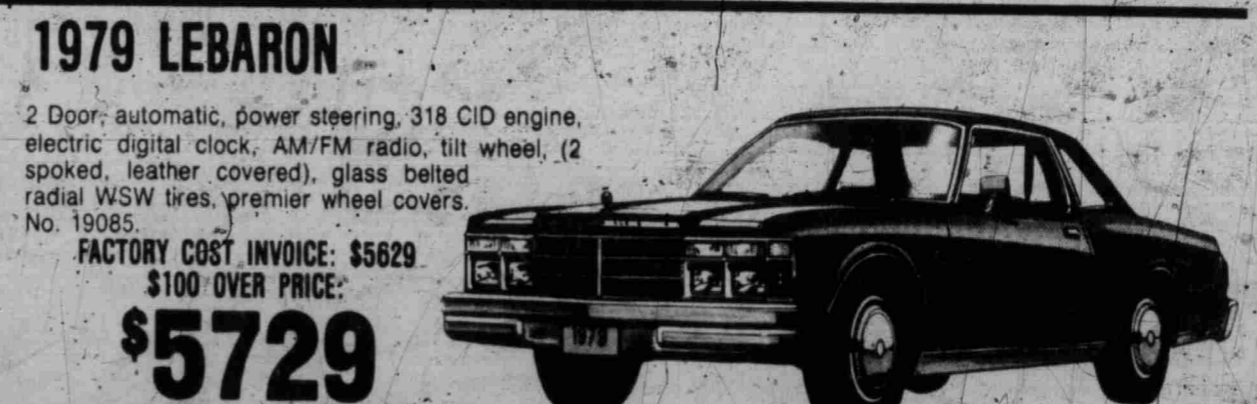

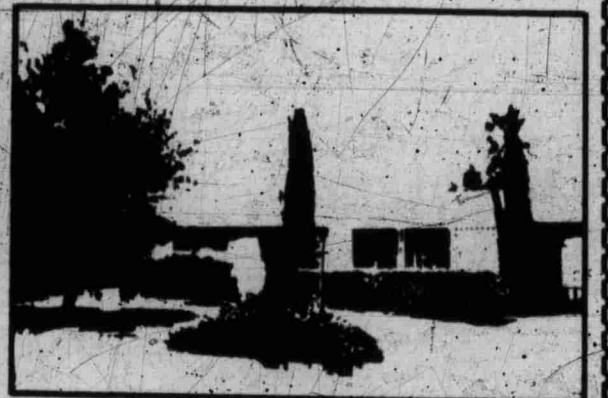
