But Petitti, warned by officials and advisors around him to cancel, preferred to listen to the Convention Board's advertising agency chieftain, Ed Kelly, of Kelly and Reber (who incidentally earn 15 per cent commission on all or any part of the \$300,000 when used). Kelly urged Petitti to let all advertising run.

The ill-fated advertising ran and the resultant effect of tourists coming here a weekend ago and getting stranded without gas and being otherwise inconvenienced is now history -- with it all having created a stain on Las Vegas' credibility that could prove irreparable.

This all was brought to light to this writer during a chat with County Commissioner Bob Broadbent a few hours before this writing, when we

NEVADA STATE LIBRARY insisted on knowing the Takes of the most criticized boo-boo in recent county board history.

Broadbent himself was dismayed at Petitti's go-ahead signal and explained he was unaware of the situation as it was happening while he was explaining taxation legislation to a strip hotel group at another meeting.

**Convention Center Manager** Len Hornsby, it was learned, also took a stand against the ads ... but was also ignored.

It was also learned that Harry Wald, executive at Caesar's Palace and a member of the advertising committee of the Convention Board, was asked what should be done about the advertising that had been placed in California and his answer ... also well in advance of the running of the ads, in time for cancellation ... was "Cancel

His advice was ignored. And Wald is considered the most expert of them all ... other than the agent Kelly.

A meeting of the Convention Board will air the problem this morning (Tuesday) and it is very probable that these facts will out then ... unless a white-washing will be attempted to get all the perpetrators of the damaging action off the spot.

# Local Schools Observe Arbor Day

Back in the 1800's, a Nebraska newspaper publisher by the name of J. Sterling Morton lived on the treeless plains of that state. He realized trees would enrich the soil and conserve the moisture in it and thus began his drive to plant trees on the plains of Nebraska.

Through his efforts April 10, 1872 was set aside as Nebraska's first Arbor Day. The state government offered prizes to the groups or individuals who planted the most trees on that particular day and the people of the state responded and over one million trees were planted.

After Morton died, the state legislature changed the date of Arbor Day to his birthday, April 22.

The original trees were planted to beautify public grounds but eventually the importance of forestry and of foresting wastelands was stressed. The date of the observance varies in different states but the last Friday of April has been adopted by many of the states.

Last Arbor Day, 1978, the Henderson Parks and Recreation Dept., aided by the Nevada State Forestry Service, planted fruitless mulberry trees at each of the three local grade schools with the hopes that each of the schools would then take it upon themselves to continue

with the tradition.

Friday morning at C.T. Sewell School, members of the student council planted a flowering plum purchased by the school's Parent Awareness Group.

In the afternoon, hundreds of students from Gordon McCaw Elementary School gathered to plant a fruitless mulberry in honor of assistant principal William Ostrowski who died April 25. This large tree was purchased with the nickles and dimes students donated.

Ostrowski, known to students as Mr. Ski, was loved by all the students and during the special ceremony Neil Twitchell, McCaw principal, explained to the students the reason for planting the tree in his memory on that particular day and told them in future years they should return to the school grounds and see how the tree has grown and then they can say, "That's the tree we planted for Mr.

This year the Parks and Recreation Dept. also planted fruitless mulberry trees at Basic High School and at Burkholder Junior High. Accepting the tree at the high school was principal Frank Brusa and student council members and their advisor as well as assistant principal Charles Dear accepted for the junior high.

# Nevada Power Company Seeks Rate Hike

May 23rd - 25th. Courses

Nevada Power Company today filed an application with the Nevada Public Service Commission to recover \$3.9 million of deferred fuel expenses for the period September 1, 1978 through February 28, 1979. If approved, the rate increase would amount to \$1.46 per thousand killowatt hours on customers' bills during the June 1-September 30, 1979 period.

According to C.A. Lenzie, Nevada Power's Vice President of Finance, the deferred fuel cost procedure was enacted into law by the Nevada Legislature in 1975. It permits the state's utilities to recover increased fuel expenses in an orderly manner; he said. "Prior to the establishment of the deferred energy accounting system, the only way utilities could get reimbursed for increased fuel expenses was by filing monthly rate applications," he said. "The new procedure cuts down on these frequent applications and instead allows a utility to recover over a six month period monies actually spent for increased fuel costs during a preceding six month

While the number of rate applications is greatly reduced with deferred energy accounting; the application filed today will be considered at a public hearing in accordance with the Public Service Commission's practices, Lenzie said. The Public Service Commission will name a time and place for this hearing which is expected to be held sometime during May.
