A new wastewater treatment facility for Henderson, when completed, will cost residents an additional \$8 a month increase to users, Jeffrey Yarme, professional engineer with the URS Company, told Chamber of Commerce members last week.

Yarme explained that there are presently two plants which serve the city. "The number one plant is not meeting standards and the number two plant, built in 1941, has seen better days," he said.

Following a three year study by the URS Company,

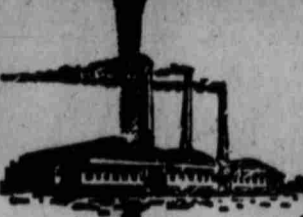
five alternative plans were presented to the City. The one chosen by the council calls for a new plant adjacent to plant number one.

Following the treatment of the wastewater, to a stage that would require the water to be basically free of any significant solid materials, the water would be used for several purposes ... for the irrigation of proposed playing fields which are planned for the Las Vegas Stadium by Clark

White will discuss the impact of industry on the local, county and state levels.

The meeting will be held at the Eldorado Club at 12 noon on Friday, May 18 and members are urged to mark their calendars. Anyone interested in attending the meeting is cordially invited to do so.

A-HIT coordinator Don Dawson said that although we would like to see new industry coming into Henderson every month, it takes many months of hard work and cooperative effort on the part of A-HIT, the Nevada Department Authority and the Nevada State De-

partment of Economic Development to eventually locate a new industry in any area. "Currently it appears some seven to eight new industries will locate in Henderson," Dawson said.

Several weeks ago the organization announced that the Board of Trustees have approved a new "Listing Service" for industrial land owners or their agent without obligation.

The purpose of the service is to provide inquiring industrialists available property to view during their site selection study. This listing service includes industrial property that may be for sale, lease or purchase option. It further provides for those persons that may wish to build to suit with long term leasing.

The association is not a real estate sales agency, but will show properties that are available and refer interested industrialists to the owner or their agent. Further details may be obtained from the HIT office at 107 Water Street.

Former Resident Mary Dooley Passes Away

Word has been received of the death of Mary Dooley, 67, who passed away May 10 in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania following a stroke. Mrs. Dooley was stricken on Sunday, May 6.

Mrs. Fox said that her father would be coming to Henderson within the next two or three weeks as soon as his health permits.

Zone Change Request Denied

A request for a zone change for Halco, Inc., from R - R (rural residence district) to R-1, (one family residence), R-3, (limited multiple residence district) and C - 1 (limited or neighborhood commercial) for 160 acres in the southwest quarter of section 9 at Pueblo and Warm Springs Road on the south side was before the city council last night.

The zone change request was previously denied by the planning commission by a vote of 4-0.

There were 28 persons owning property adjacent to the area in question who appeared before the planning commission and spoke against the petition because

they purchased land in a large lot area and wanted lower density sites with the view prevalent from the slopes in the area.

There were 20 communications, telephone calls and letters in opposition. There were seven written comments or ballots in favor of the rezoning.

The commission, in voting to deny the request, stated that the view from the site was excellent and that the higher density and commercial use would be detrimental there.

Thirty separate individuals, or firms owning 62 parcels located within the notification area received notice of the public hearing.

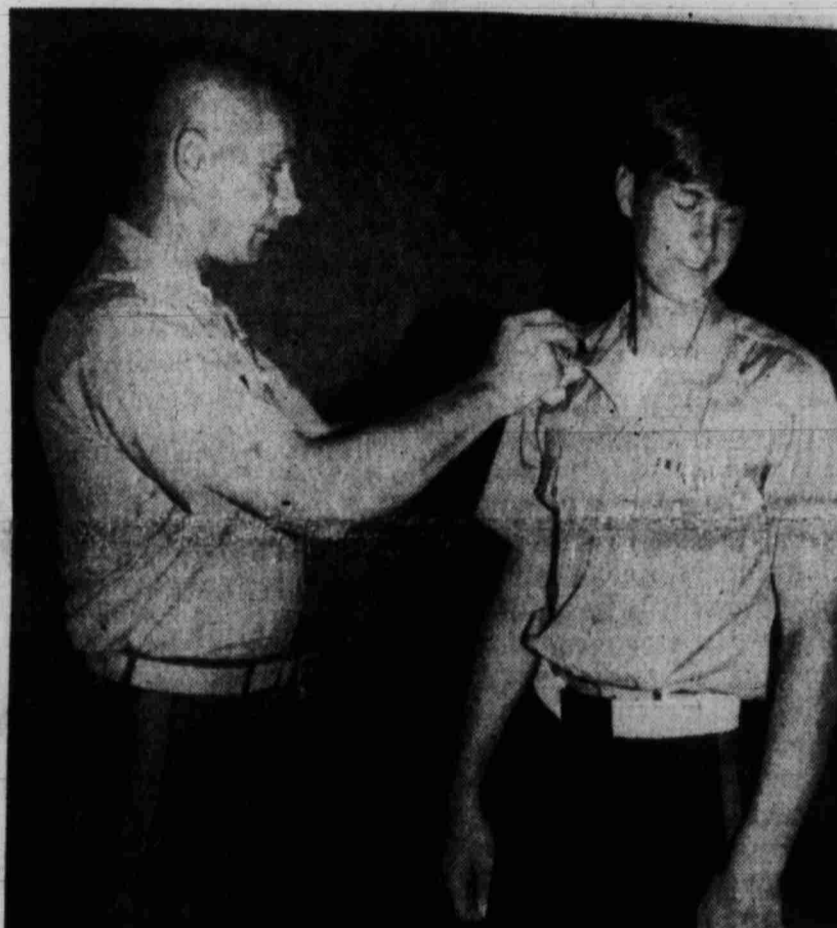
Baseball Discussion Set

A baseball and softball discussion will be held by the parks and recreation board at the regular meeting tonight at 6 p.m. in the civic center annex room 30.

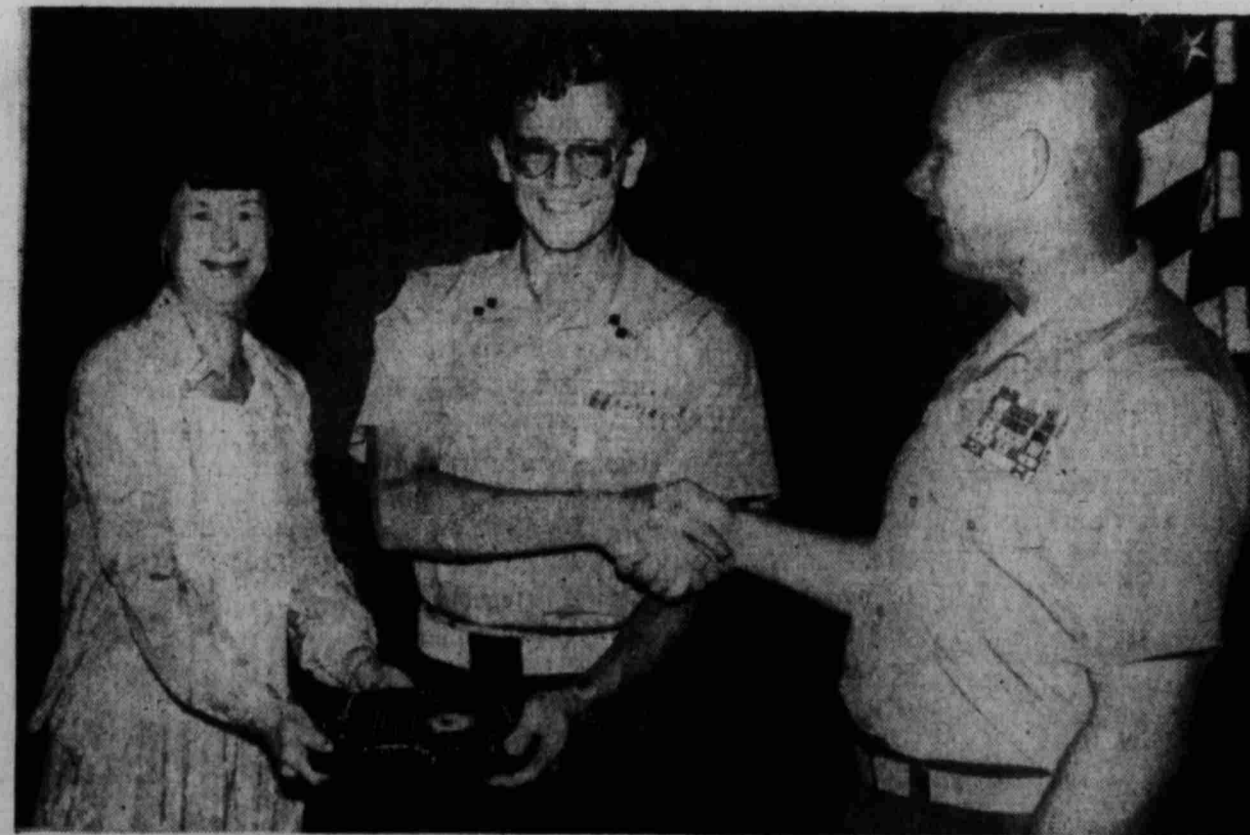

City's Gas Allocation Cut -

Although the city's allocation of gas has been cut by 15 per cent by its supplier, City Manager Bob Campbell says it has had no major effect on the city so far.

Campbell attributed the city's preparedness to a study made by the employees over a year ago to try to cut down on energy consumption by the city.

"We have already gone to smaller vehicles," Campbell said, "and we have reduced our vehicles by ten or 12, so we were already cutting back."

He said the city makes fewer trips to Las Vegas by pooling their purposes. So far, he said, the city has had sufficient gasoline and the police department has had no problems.

The end of an era in Hollywood film-making was marked recently when Paramount Pictures began dismantling its famous Western street.

Fortunately, much of the well known movie set will be preserved by Old Tucson Corporation, which has acquired many of the items from Paramount and the Metzner Construction Company.

"It is our intention to preserve as much of this western memorabilia as possible," said Burt Sugarman, chairman of the board of Old Tucson, which will incorporate the acquisition into its west-

ern street at Westworld, the theme park operated by the company in Henderson.

The Westworld Park includes rides, two fine restaurants, stores, a gaming casino and will include the previously announced home movies of Priscilla Presley, which Sugarman is editing into a one hour showing. As announced there will be new footage of Mrs. Presley narrating the events of her life with Elvis and their daughter Lisa.

Among the more important pieces of western memorabilia purchased by the company are windows, doors and arches from the bank, jail, hotel and opera

More than three truckloads of windows, doors, arches, porch posts, cornices, corbeling, finials and other pieces of western memorabilia were shipped to the park. Porch posts, paneling and other items such as cornices, corbeling and finials, which were used to give the buildings character, were also acquired.

Among the noteworthy television series and movies filmed on the street were several segments of "Gunsmoke" starring James Arness, "High Chaparral" starring Leif Erickson, Cameron Mitchell and Linda Cristal, "Bonanza" starring Lorne Green and Michael Landon and the movie "Gunfight at the OK Corral" starring Kirk Douglas and Burt Lancaster.

"It's of even greater significance to us to be able to preserve these priceless pieces because portions of these shows were also shot at our famous movie location in Tucson, Arizona called Old Tucson," said Sugarman. "In fact, Old Tucson was the home set for 'High Chaparral'."

Other well-known movies which were filmed on the street were "Beau James" starring Bob Hope, "Showdown at Gun Hill" with Burt Lancaster and "Lucy Gallant" with Charlton Heston and Jane Wyman.

Old Tucson Corporation (OTUC) is traded on the NASDAQ system.

County for the Parks and Recreation Department, for the irrigation of Black Mountain Golf course, for the irrigation of the highway medians, and the balance to irrigate 33 acres of land for agricultural purposes, land located below the BMI tailing sites.

During the study Yarme said that extensive soil tests were made of the acreage and it was found to be feasible and economically feasible to grow crops such as bermuda grass and alfalfa. "Agricultural irrigation has been used successfully on the Mormon farm where they grow alfalfa and other crops."

Secondary effluents have been used on the Paradise Valley Golf course and Winterwood has used it exclusively for 15 years without any adverse effect. "This practice is gaining a lot of popularity throughout the country," he said.

As for the medians on Boulder Highway, a pipe could be run through to irrigate the plants, trees etc. and improve the aesthetic quality of the city.

Yarme said that this plan would have the lowest costs of any of the others presented. There are several major issues which must first be considered such as salinity, acquisition of land and obtaining the water rights through the state engineer.

Step two would be the design and for the city to obtain the funding for the project. It would take about 18 months for construction and hopefully would be in use by December, 1981.

Yarme estimated the cost of the project at around \$14 million. Henderson would seek to get a federal grant for the project which would be around \$11 million, or the federal share could be higher, he said. The remaining \$3 million will have to come from the city. He also estimated it will cost around \$355,000 a year to maintain the facility.

In the proposal, the users of the treated wastewater would pay for the costs of delivery at a charge of about 10 cents per 1000 gallons.

The future growth of the area and the capacity were important factors in the study and the facility is aimed for a population of 81,000 which they feel will be living here by the year 2000.

"The project will be done in stages," he explained, "so the present population doesn't have to pay for the entire thing."

Sandpipers Collect Long Course Title

Deep team strength plus first place age division, individual championships by the Mock sisters, Pam and Kim, and by John Futrell helped the Southern Nevada Sandpipers capture the Third Annual Southern Nevada Invitational long course swim meet as they more than doubled the points totaled by runnerup Las Vegas YMCA.

The Henderson based AAU swim club did best for itself in the midrange age groups being led by the Sandpipers top performer for the meet Pam Mock who scored six first places in the girls eleven and twelve year old division - in the fifty meter freestyle, one hundred free, two hundred free, one hundred backstroke and one hundred breaststroke, and in the two hundred meter individual medley. Pam also took second in the one hundred meter butterfly. Also scoring in that girls age group for the Sandpipers were Shannon Hamlin with a fifth in butterfly, another fifth in the two hundred free, fourths in the one hundred breast and in two hundred medley, and sevenths in the fifty free and one hundred free.

Toni Cerrone picked up a sixth in the fly and a sixth in the breast while collecting a fifth in the hundred back and a seventh in the two hundred medley. Courtney Parochniak had a third in the breaststroke

and eight in the fifty free while Eva Tomeu collected another seventh for the Sandpipers in the one hundred back and a sixth in the fifty free and Debbie Goodman came in eighth place in the hundred back and a seventh went to Lisa Price.

The medley relay team of Cerrone, Parochniak, Mock, and Hamlin placed first as did the two hundred free relay of Tomeu, Hamlin, Parochniak, and Mock. The freestyle relay of Goodman, Edwards, Price, and Cerrone placed third while another relay third went to Goodman, Edwards, Price, and Tomeu in the medley.

Pam's sister Kim placed first in three individual events as took the high point individual trophy for thirteen and fourteen year old girls - in the one hundred freestyle, the two hundred back, and the two hundred medley. Kim also took seconds in the two hundred fly, the one hundred fly, and the two hundred meter free while collecting a third in the one hundred back and an eighth in the two hundred breast. Anna Walls had a seventh swimming the one hundred meter back and an eighth in the two hundred fly while Michelle Ferraro swam for a fourth and sixth in one hundred and two hundred back.

Both the freestyle relay team of Walls, Ferraro, Shehan, and Mock,

and the relay team of Walls, Ferraro, Parochniak, and Mock in the medley collected a first.

In the same age division for boys John Futrell collected the last of the Sandpipers three individual trophies - he swam for firsts in the one hundred meter fly and two hundred meter breast along with the one hundred free. He had seconds in the one back and breast and two hundred free while collecting a third in the fly at two hundred meters and another in the medley, and a fourth in the two hundred back.

Ned Busch followed close behind for the locals with firsts in the two hundred back and one hundred breast, a second in the two hundred fly and in the medley. Ned also swam for a third in the hundred free and in the hundred back, and had fourths at two hundred meters in the free and breast along with the same at one hundred meters in the fly.

Ron Inman swam well in this age group collecting a fourth in the one hundred breast and a sixth in the one hundred fly while Jim McCarthy finished fifth in the two hundred free, fifth in the medley, fifth in the one hundred back, and eighth in the one hundred free for more Sandpiper points. Scott Fielden swam a seventh place in the two hundred back while Billy Schrader added a sixth, a seventh, and an eighth

place finish in the two hundred fly, two hundred breast, and two hundred medley. Another eighth went to Todd Wyrick in the two hundred breast.

The relay team of Inman, Futrell, Busch, and McCarthy placed first in both the freestyle and medley events for this age group.

In the age division for girls under eight Heather Caldwell was the top scorer for the Sandpipers with a fourth in the one hundred free, fifths in the fifty fly and fifty free, sixths in both the fifty back and two hundred medley, and a seventh place in the fifty breast. A dual scorer for the team was Holly Allison with a seventh in the fifty fly and an eighth in the fifty back.

The relay squad of Allison, Caldwell, Werbicky, and Smith finished first in the freestyle and second in the medley. The younger boys did as well in relays scoring a first in freestyle with the quartet of Goodman, Jensen, Schubert, and Cruzen, while Parochniak replaced Cruzen on the medley and aided in winning another first for the team. Individually in the fifty fly for this age group Brian Schubert had a seventh and Rhett Brewer an eighth.

In the nine and ten year old girls division the team of Lisa Perry, Wendy Martin, Rachel Torrez, and Lorrie Klosowski took second in the freestyle relay and

third in the medley relay while on the boy's side John Wouldridge, Todd Drietzler, Patrick Cruzen, and Chris Thongborisuite took second in freestyle and another second in medley with Morgan Bunker swimming a leg. Todd Drietzler added a fourth in the fifty fly and an eighth in the fifty back.

The squad of Norman Ballard, Jed Busch, Paul Effertz, and Bobby Werbicky picked up firsts in both their eleven and twelve year old age division relays while Norman himself got fifth in the one hundred back and Bobby an eighth at that distance in the breaststroke.

The open division for boys and girls scoring was wide spread for both sides of the Sandpiper lineup. In the one hundred breast Becky Bond placed seventh as well as in the two hundred breast. Anna Walls took a fifth in the fifteen hundred free while Geo Schrader placed seventh in the two hundred back and took the same spot in the two hundred fly.

Mari Barlow was by far the tops among the older Sandpiper girls with her first in the fifteen hundred free, fourth in the 400 I.M., thirds in the one hundred fly and two hundred free, an eighth in the one hundred back, second for the two hundred fly, fourth in the four hundred freestyle, fifths in the one hundred free and two hundred back, and sixth in the two hundred medley.

Andrew Parker added a sixth to team scoring in the fifteen hundred free and also sixths in the two hundred back and fly. Harriet Daley added an eighth in the backstroke at two hundred meters. Also Toni Cerrone, Shannon Hamlin, and Pam and Kim Mock advanced to this division to score extra points for the Sandpipers.

Ron Miller was the top older boy on the Sandpipers in scoring with a sixth in the medley, seventh for the hundred

fly, second in the two hundred free, fifth in the hundred back, third in the two hundred fly, and third in the four hundred free. Mark Hillstead also scored big with second in the hundred breast, sixth in the hundred free, and fourth in the two hundred breast.

Jon Garcia added a fourth in the two hundred back, an eighth in the four hundred medley, and a fifth in the two hundred fly, while Mike Polk placed fourth in the one hundred free and eighth in the two hundred back and Roger Effertz collected a sixth in that same race.

Basic Golfers Forth at State

There was an exciting ending to Thursday's state AAA prep golf championship with two players locked dead even in the lead after eighteen greens at Hidden Valley Country Club in Reno, the issue of gold medalist having to be decided on two sudden death playoff holes. The problem as far as Basic was concerned, however, was that neither of the two golfers contesting was Russell Sloan, the Wolves' defending state champion from 1978 who might have been expected to be in the midst of the top finishers.

As it turned out Jerry Foltz and Mike Decker of Western High and Bonanza both of the southern zone carried a one over par 73 tie after regulation play into the second play off hole before Foltz pulled away for the state gold medalist honors sinking a three foot birdie putt.

In addition to Sloan's unsuccessful attempt to regain his state individual championship Basic's golf team faltered in their attempt to put together back to back state titles as the team showdown turned out to be a battle between Foltz's team the Western Warriors, southern zone champions, and Reno High School, the northern zone champs.

As Basic's golf coach Dennis Smuskiewicz predicted it took a sub four hundred score to bring in the state title as Reno's 396 took the honors followed by Western's 404. Basic had to settle for fourth team place behind Bonanza's Bengals with their 423.

Basic's 427 was led by Sloan's 79 while other Wolves scores were Ray Cummin's 85, and 87's for both Ed Thuro and Luke LaPorta. Tom Smith had an 89 for Basic while Paul Jeffery carded a 93.

Control Board Approves Westworld

The Nevada Gaming Control Board, meeting in Carson City today, May 9, approved by unanimous vote the application of Burt Sugarman, chairman of the board of Old Tucson Corporation for an unrestricted slot machine gaming license for Old West Corporation, a subsidiary of Old Tucson Corp. Next week, Thursday, May 17, Sugarman will appear before the Nevada Gaming Commission to receive final approval.

Old West Corporation is the developer of Westworld, a western theme park and movie location in Henderson, 12 minutes from Las Vegas. It contains stores, two restaurants, a gaming casino and recently purchased the rights from Priscilla Presley to show her home movies that she made with Elvis. Sugarman, a well-known West Coast television producer became involved with the company in March of this year.

Old Tucson Corporation (OTUC) is traded over the NASDAQ system.

A change in the corporate name of Old Tucson Corporation to Westworld, Inc. became effective May 14.

The company, incorporated in Delaware in 1973, operates the western theme park and movie location, Old Tucson, near Tucson, Ariz. and recently acquired all of the outstanding stock of Old West Corporation, the operator of a

western theme park and gaming casino in the Las Vegas area.

Westworld, Inc. has been structured as a holding company and parent for three wholly owned subsidiaries: Mescal Corporation, an Arizona corporation that has a western street; Old West Corporation dba Westworld, a Nevada corporation; and Old Tucson, a newly formed Arizona corporation.

The assets of the Old Tucson Corporation, excluding the stock of Old West Corporation and Mescal Corporation, will be transferred to the new Old Tucson subsidiary.

The company's stock is traded over-the-counter. Its NASDAQ trading symbol has been changed to WEST from OTUC. Currently there are 2,516,200 shares of the company's common stock issued and outstanding, excluding 16,600 shares owned by a subsidiary.

In announcing its intention to change its name, Burt Sugarman, chairman and chief executive officer, told shareholders on April 24, 1979 that Westworld, Inc. is more reflective of the scope and nature of its business which it describes as the operation of family entertainment theme parks in Arizona and Nevada. The name of its Nevada theme park, located in Henderson and originally called Old Vegas, has been changed to Westworld.



poration of America was fined \$500 for discharging heavy white titanium dioxide fumes into the air on March 5.

Air Pollution Control Assistant Director Mike Naylor said titanium dioxide is classified a 'nuisance,' but is not harmful.

An ammonia leak in a plant compressor, plus \$100 for not reporting the leak to the air pollution control division within an hour.

Air Pollution Control Director Donald Arkell said an enforcement officer noticed the ammonia gas escaping at 7:45 a.m. March 7.

Your skin weighs about an average of nine pounds, or at least six percent of your total weight. The largest organ of your body, it covers over 3,000 square inches.

Just one square centimeter contains approximately four yards of nerves, with 3,000 sensory cells at the ends of nerve fibers and 200 nerve endings.

But if your skin is sensitive, it probably reacts more dramatically to your environment than normal skin—perhaps burning faster in the sun or drying out more in overheated rooms.

If you're one of the millions of Americans who owns a 10-speed bicycle, you might want to conduct your own spring "tune-up" before putting your machine on the road again, says Fred Teeman, manager of consumer relations at Schwinn Bicycle Company.

A little "preventive maintenance" goes a long way on a well-built lightweight 10-speed bicycle, like the Schwinn Le Tour IV, keeping it operating efficiently for many miles and giving you a sense of pride and satisfaction.

Whether you're a serious cyclist or a novice, it's time to pull your 10-speed out of the basement or garage and check that everything is in order.

To make bike rides this season more enjoyable, Mr. Teeman suggests following these spring check-up tips:

• Make sure the wheels are in

good working order. Turn the wheel to see that there are no bits of glass, wire, sharp stones or cinders sticking in the tires.

If your bike has been standing for a while, the tires will need air. It's best to use a foot pump and pressure gauge to avoid over-inflation.

• Pick up the front and then the back of the bike, and give the wheels another spin. If a wheel is wobbling from side to side, or if the spokes are loose, the wheel needs to be trued.

Truing wheels is something of an art that requires skill and patience, so take your bike to a reputable shop, like a Schwinn Bicycle Dealer.

• Check the brakes. The secret of good brakes is more often in the rims than in the brakes, because wobbly, lumpy rims prevent the brakes from working properly.

If the rims are fine, check the brakes by squeezing the levers firmly and then releasing them. They should snap back with a good solid feel.

If the brakes are sluggish, a cable may be binding in the housing. Check to make sure there are no sharp kinks in the

housing and, if necessary, spray an aerosol lubricant into the housing and on brake pivot points.

• Check the chain. While slowly rotating the pedals backwards, check to be sure the chain is free of twists and that the links are not too tight.

If a link is tight, it can generally be loosened with a generous amount of oil.

If this doesn't do the trick, or if the chain is twisted, take the bike to your dealer. This may be a job for a pro.

• Check both the front and rear derailleurs by supporting the bike so the rear wheel can spin free, and make sure the chain will move smoothly from one chain sprocket to the other. A drop or two of oil on pivot points will usually free up a sluggish derailleur.

• Make sure the bolts are tightened securely in the stem and handlebars, seat clamp and seat post, and check accessory mounting screws.

If everything is in order, all you need to do is clean out the cobwebs and polish the frame for another season of fun-filled cycling!
