\$4.9 Million Apartment Complex Approved By HUD

Green Valley is Nevada's largest master planned community, and is located in Henderson, Nevada, just outside Las Vegas.



A loan for a \$4.92 million apartment housing complex, to be located between Safeway store and Morrell Park, has been approved it was learned here.

The 40-year-loan was sought by Stanford Building Group for apartment housing. The approval included using some of the apartments for low rent housing. Out of 160 apartments, 32 will be subsidized housing.

Bud Walker, (formerly of Henderson) who represents the Stanford Building Group, said the anticipated starting date for the apartments is Dec. The apartment complex will include garden apartments, swimming pool and recreation area.

The loan is from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Jeff Lewis represents the company's home office at Palo Alto, Calif.

Dallas Firm Joins Westworld

Is It Who You Know Or What ?

It's who you know, not what you know, or so it seems with the Clark County School District.

Just last week a principal was named for the Burkholder junior high school.

What would seem more logical -- to appoint a local man who has been with the same school for 24 years, or bring someone in from out of town?

We have no quarrel with the man who was appointed as principal. He served well at Basic high school as an assistant principal, but we do believe that Charles Dear or Kent Anderson should have been considered seriously.

Charles Dear was with the junior high school when it was located where the present civic center is now located. He has served faithfully for 24 years and while the past principal of the school was ill much of the time, he and Anderson took over the operation. They are familiar with all facets of the school. Anderson has been there for 20 years.

What would be wrong with elevating one of these two men. They have all of the qualifications, education, years in service, and apparently passed their exams and interviews.

We have a similar situation at Basic high school right now. What would be wrong with appointing a local man as principal? One who doesn't feel an 8-3 daily schedule is enough, one who knows the community.

We believe we have local talent who can do the job but maybe it's not what you know but who you know.

American Flag?

The new design has one large star representing the first state of the Union which was Delaware in December 1787.


Each point of the large star consists of ten small stars representing each state totaling 50, with the large star making 51. She was a graduate of the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, and received additional training at Columbia University following her graduation.


