"It is anticipated that by mid-summer many inquiries will be forthcoming."


Dawson also said that hopefully GEC, Industries and GTE-Sylvania will be breaking ground by mid-summer.

Thoughts On Why Women Outlive Men Given By Specialist

"Maybe you've noticed that there are more older women than men in our society -- and, if you're a youngster, you're apt to have more grandmothers than grandfathers -- and great grandmothers too."

That's because women in the United States live longer than men -- an average of 8 years more notes Dr. Barbara Gunn, State Cooperative Extension Specialist in Health, University of Nevada Reno. Women can now expect to live 75 years, and men 67 years.

Why the difference? "Well, for one thing," says Dr. Gunn, "women take better care of themselves. They have fewer accidents, are quicker to seek medical care, and, in general, find it easier to admit they're tired and need a rest." There hasn't always been this difference. During the 30's, life expectancy was about the same for both men and women. (Women used to die in childbirth, but that risk now is greatly reduced.) Between 1960 and 1970, the number of women over 65 increased TWICE as fast as the number of men 65 and over, Dr. Gunn stressed.

"Fewer men live to old age partly because they are, in general, more careless with their lives," Dr. Gunn said. Accidents take the lives of men and boys much more frequently at all ages. Even as young as one to four years of age, little boys are more apt to die in accidents than are little girls. Boys five to 14 die in traffic accidents three times as often as girls do. They drown four times as often. Young men 20 to 24 years of age are five times as apt to die accidentally as are young women.

Men succumb more frequently not only to accidents, but to all major diseases. But Dr. Gunn concluded as more and more women enter the work force and hold high pressure jobs there is mounting evidence they'll be as subject as men to some risks.

Childrens Hospital Needed ... 'If I have to Build it Myself'

Last week the City Council granted a two-year extension on a land option to the Cystic Fibrosis Childrens Foundation, much to the delight of Justice of the Peace Larry Tabony.

But this is just the first step in a long walk toward Tabony's goal.

He is trying desperately to get a children's hospital and research center built in this area, and the land, in excess of 40 acres in the vicinity of Horizon Drive and Boulder Highway, is close to the site of the Community College which is soon to be started.

that there is no hospital just for children in Nevada and the Cystic Fibrosis Childrens Foundation is trying to get one built ... "And what better place than near the Community College where student nurses could receive some of their training right at the hospital," he said.

The disease itself affects the functioning of certain glands, the exocrine glands. These are the glands that secrete mucus and sweat, tears and saliva.

The mucus that is secreted by the body of a cystic fobrosis victim is abnormally thick and gluey. Instead of the usual





makes it harder to breathe. This thick mucus often clogsthe breathing passages and traps air as well as germs, which can become-infected and cause serious problems.

tic fibrosis victim actually

Sweat glands in the cystic fibrosis victim also go awry, secreting sweat that is extremely salty.

Tabony explained that often the symptoms of cystic fibrosis are not very obvious in babies and it takes an exceptionally observant doctor to detect it.

"One way a new mother can test her baby is by licking the skin," Tabony said. "If the skin is exceptionally salty, consult a doctor ... might sound funny but that is one test for the disease."

That evening, five years ago, after seeing the film and meeting little Amy, the foundation was formed with Tabony heading the group as the first president.

"One of the things we are trying to do is make people aware of a child who coughs a lot, or doesn't gain weight as it should ... these are some of the signs and a doctor should be consulted."

Other symptoms along with the coughing, are difficulty with digestion, unusually large appetite, frequent bowel movements, small stature and enlarged fingertips, although different victims are affected in different ways and with varying degrees of severment of the disease although there is no specific course of treatment.

The group started raising funds and their first project was purchasing "birds" which are used to inject moisture and medication into the lungs of a victim when they can't breathe. These "birds" have been spotted around the state to the various victims ... "between 80 and 90 that we know of," Tabony said.


He also explained that a child suffering from the disease must take special medications, often times many times during a day, and must also eat special foods as the disease causes nutrients in the food to be flushed right out.

"There is even a special cooking oil especially made for the cystic fibrosis victim which costs around \$40 a gallon."


The judge gets very emotional when speaking of Amy, who is not ten-years old and weighs about 35 pounds, and the lack of a facility for the treatment of this and other childrens diseases.

"Why do we have to send children out-of-state for treatment?" he asks. "There is a need for such a hospital here and even if I have to go out and start digging the foundation myself, I am going to see that we have a hospital."




Abernathy faces a mandatory prison sentence of at least five years. According to witnes-
