

Green Valley Zone Change Withdrawn

A zone change request in the Green Valley area was withdrawn by its owners at a meeting of the Henderson Planning Commission last Thursday evening.

Robert Gordon, Planning Director for the city, said the owner, Jerome Mack and associates, had notified him that he would like the mat-

ter withdrawn from the agenda until the owners could speak with members of the Green Valley Homeowners Association.

Many of the association's membership are concerned that the Green Valley development is becoming too densely populated.

Gordon suggested that

members of the planning commission and the city council meet with homeowners and developers to come to a better understanding of the situation.

Originally, Mack had requested that 20.5 acres generally located on the northwest corner of the intersection at Warm Springs and

Green Valley Parkway be changed from Civic District Zoning to R-3, which is a limited multiple residence district.

The association is holding a meeting Wednesday at the Paradise Valley Country Club.

Planning commission members said last Thursday

they will try to attend the Wednesday night meeting of the homeowners association.

The question was raised whether it would fall under the provisions of the open meeting law if a majority of the council attended the meeting.

The Association will hold

their regular meeting at 8 p.m. in the Paradise Valley Country Club restaurant and will be discussing general zoning matters in the Green Valley area which they feel should be of interest to the city staff, planning commission and city council.

Last year we received numerous complaints from parents and friends of graduates for their having to fight inconvenience by going to the convention center.

We asked Lanny Lund, local principal, yesterday about this and he explained that the decision to hold it in Las Vegas was made by this year's class officers and last year's principal Frank Brusa. The decision was forced on them because of the need for more tickets for families and friends of graduates. The Las Vegas rotunda is ample and affords plenty of room and comfort for the occasion.

Principal Lund agrees a home-town affair would be better but there is just no room in the present high school building. He agreed with us that the building of a new convention center here will ease the issue.

I still think graduation ceremonies should be held outside at the football field. There is plenty of room for everyone and it would be more convenient for people to attend an afternoon session or early evening session than fighting the 9 o'clock starting time in Vegas. It will change to 6 o'clock next year but I hope by then new plans will be made to have it here in Henderson.

Boulder City has held its graduation outdoors since time began. In 26 years there has only been twice that the affair ran into bad enough weather to force it inside.

On that fact alone, I believe it is worth the gamble on the weather to have the local stadium be the scene of one of the most exciting events families enjoy in their lifetimes.

There are arguments on both sides but this column will never be persuaded to take a home-town event out of town.

City Approves Creation of a Criminal Justice Advisory Board

"If you know of anyone who would like to serve on a Southern Nevada Criminal Justice Advisory Board, let me know," Bob Campbell told the city council last week after they had approved an inter-local cooperative agreement for the creation of such a board.

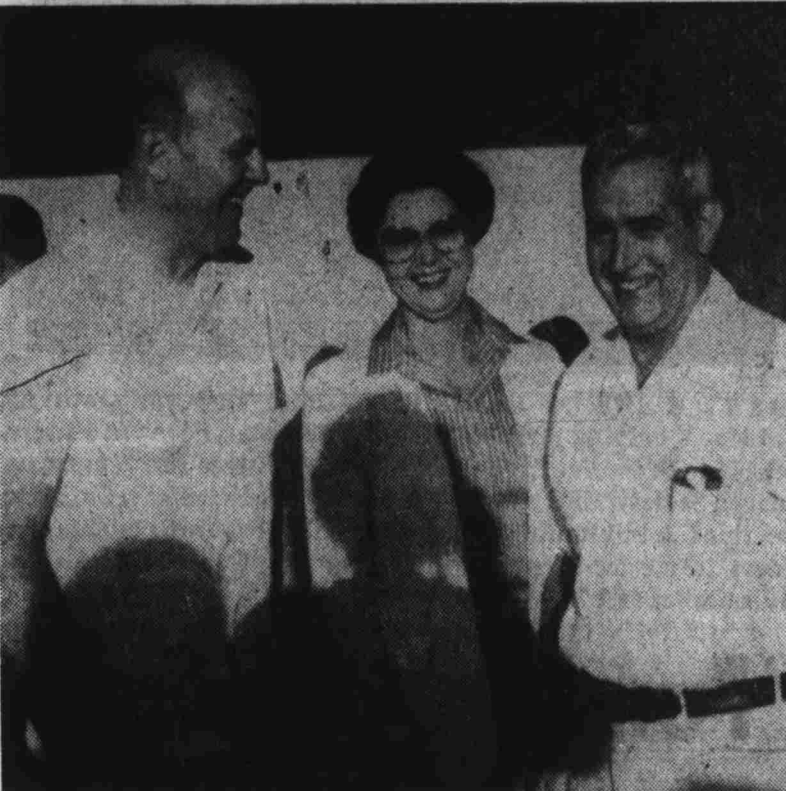
The agreement calls for a board to be created with 20 members by the appointment of five individuals from each of the four parties to this agreement, that is the cities of Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City.

Members of the Advisory Board would be representatives of criminal justice organizations as well as community groups. The chief executive officer of each entity, in Henderson the city manager, would make the appointments with the eventual approval of the city council.

The advisory board is being established for the purpose of receiving federal financial assistance and any other services and benefits authorized under the Justice System Improvement Act of 1979.

Members of the board will serve without compensation and their decisions will be advisory in nature only. They shall meet a minimum of once during each 12 month period, and may meet more often as required.

"Discussions have been going on for several months," Dawson said. "The financing would be not to exceed \$10

million, and would be for the construction of a downtown hotel and addition to the casino.

The city council approved the abandonment of a portion of Market street to make way for the hotel. The hotel construction would also include downtown parking.

The public trust will also discuss a partial reconveyance for the Hesse Corporation, approval of the March 11 minutes, and a contract for a secretarial position.

Basic High School Teacher of 25 Years Dies

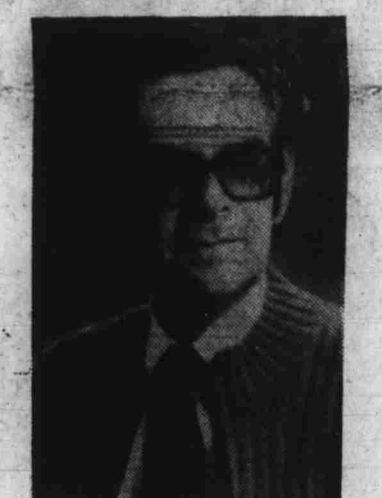

City Endorses May 27 Bond Election

A resolution of the city council endorsing the proposed capital improvements plan to keep Southern Nevada Number One in the Convention industry was approved last week by the council.

"Not to approve it would be like voting against grandmother's cookies," said councilman Gary Price.

In part the resolution says that "the convention industry is of such importance to the financial well-being of all Southern Nevadans that we cannot afford to fall behind other cities; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Las Vegas Convention/Visitor's Authority has proposed an election to approve the sale of tax-free bonds to finance needed capital improvements at the Las Vegas Convention Center as well as to provide recrea-

tional development funds to Southern Nevada communities including \$1 million for the City of Henderson; and

WHEREAS, these bonds will be retired with revenues from the tax on hotel and motel rooms at no cost to local taxpayers;

now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Henderson City Council does endorse the proposed capital improvements plan to keep Southern Nevada Number One in the convention industry; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we, the undersigned Mayor, and City Council of the City of Henderson, do urge all residents of the City and all other residents of Clark County to vote in support of the bond election on May 27, 1980, to finance these vital improvements."

Taylor Receives O.K.— No Handicap Parking Space Needed

Last week the city council reconsidered the requirement for one handicapped parking space as a condition of approval of the architectural review for Dan Taylor's State Farm Insurance office on Lake Mead Drive and rescinded their previous action.

It had been previously indicated to the council that a handicap space was required by either state or federal law and this requirement was then included as a provision in the architectural review approval.

Staff later determined they were in error and no such handicap space requirements apparently exist unless it is a publicly owned building or a private development involving federal money.

In other actions the council:

- Approved a use permit to allow the utilization of the building directly behind 46 Magnesium Street by Alcoholics Anonymous Meetings, 51 Club, with the building facing onto the public parking lot behind the northwest corner of Pacific and Waters Streets

at the request of Jack Elliott.

- Approved a zone change request for an extension of time on a resolution of intent to rezone five plus acres in Sec. 20, generally located behind Vista Mobile Home Park, at the request of Ray Martinez.

- Approved a use permit to allow an auto repair garage at 1100 N. Boulder Highway in a general commercial district for Arnold Cole.

- Approved a request for the deferment of sidewalk installation for Ethel M. Chocolates at the request of Alan Thomas, general manager.

A request from Ferdinand Gunther for consideration for reinstatement of his liquor license at "Boobees," located at 1024 N. Boulder Highway was tabled by the council to give staff time to see if his license had really expired.

Gunther said he had had to close the establishment due to a lack of parking facilities and lack of funds but that both of these problems had been reconciled.

Santini Supports Nevada Radiation Study

In a letter to the director of the National Institutes of Health, Rep. Jim Santini has urged approval of the first phase of a study to determine the effects of nuclear weapons testing at the Nevada Test Site.

The \$2.6 million, three-year study would be performed by the UNR School of Medicine in conjunction with the Reno Veterans Administration Hospital and the Desert Research Institute. Phase I will lay the groundwork for a full-scale study to be conducted later.

"I feel the proposal is a request for funding that commands federal support," Santini wrote to Dr. Donald S. Frederickson. "Data acquired through this study will provide an essential scientific base for determining the effect of low-level radiation."

At Santini's urging the Commerce Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee held hearings in Las Vegas and Salt Lake City last year on the problem.

"We have a moral responsibility to find out what effect above-ground testing of nuclear weapons in the 1950's will have on our residents," Santini

said. "People in Nevada are concerned, yet no one has been able to provide them with answers so far. This study is a step in the right direction.

The study should be done by local researchers and not by the federal government, however, he explained, in order to ensure the credibility of the findings.

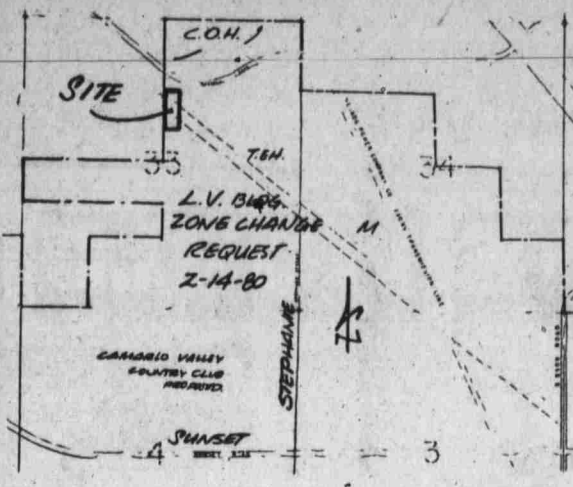

THE FOREST AND YOU

RENEWING THE FOREST



Some 1,200 Douglas fir seedlings can be planted in one day by a forester with a special backpack.

Getting new trees to replace old, keeping the land in full production is a continual effort. The part of scientifically trained foresters - and they do it in a variety of interesting ways. Foresters sometimes sow seed from the air, using helicopters or agricultural biplanes. The potential number of trees per pound of seed dropped depends upon the species. A pound of Southern pine seed will average 18,400 seeds while a pound of Douglas fir seed averages 42,000 seeds.

Some super seedlings are placed in the ground by hand, usually at the age of six months or more. Styrofoam boxes of seedlings fit onto special backpacks worn by planters. Each seedling, with its well-formed roots, is plucked from the box and planted. In flat lands, it is possible for a quick planter to set out as many as 2,500 trees a day, but in steep areas, hand-planting 1,200 trees is a good day's work.

When a coast redwood is cut, the stump almost immediately puts up sprouts all around itself. The most dominant of these will develop into full-grown adult trees standing in a ring. This species, one of America's fastest-growing

trees, has been called "almost immortal."

In new and growing forests, three practices contribute to the speed with which the trees mature: using chemistry to kill weed species that compete for nutrition and light, fertilizing, and thinning to provide room for growth. Weed species are subdued manually, or by fire or spray where needed, forests are fertilized from huge buckets suspended below helicopters. Forests too thickly populated with trees are thinned to give remaining trees more food, water and sunlight, creating quick new growth.
