

The City Council is faced with a dilemma over recently opened bids for construction of the \$5 million waste water treatment plant here.

The bids were opened on February 11 and the apparent low bidder submitted a price totalling \$234,000 lower than the second contractor, but according to state statutes, the low bidder did not qualify as a legally licensed contractor in the State of Nevada when the bid was submitted.

Paragon Energy Corporation of Kansas City submitted a bid of \$4,647,000. The second lowest figure came from Nielsen Vasko & Earl, (NVE) of Reno. Third in line was Sletten Construction of Las Vegas with a figure of \$5,125,000, Tiberti of Las vegas was fourth with \$5,125,000 and seven additional bidders followed with prices ranging up to \$6,485,000.

The entire project totals \$10 million, with \$8 million coming from federal agencies and the balance to be funded by the City of Henderson through the bond issue approved last year.

But, according to the Nevada State Contractors Board, the scope of work specified in construction.of the Henderson Advance Waste Water Treatment Plant requires a licensee to possess an "A" or "AB"

Paragon Energy currently holds a "B" classification license, which would not permit the firm to work on a project with the scope of the Waste Water Treatment

Paragon has apparently filed for a hearing before the state contractors board to upgrade its license.

The final decision on the award of bids will be left to the City Council next Monday night, according to City Manager Robert Anselmo who admits the City is caught "between a rock and a hard place."

But, Anselmo said there is a legal opinion handed down by the Attorney General's office when now Gov. Robert List held the office of Attorney General. Anselmo said he did not know if List actually wrote the opinion, but it came from the Attorney General's office. The legal decision allowed for awarding a contract to the lowest bidder and enabling contractor to upgrade his license after the award.

He said a precedent was set recently when Clark County awarded a contract to the low bidder for a walkway over Maryland Parkway in Las Vegas on the basis of that decision.

Anselmo said Monday that the ruling stipulated "The proper licensing is an administrative matter and not a basis for disqualifying if they have the proper license at the time the construction begins."

Anselmo said the City has a problem regardless of the decision made by council members.

"If we award it to the low bidder, we'll probably wind up in court with the next lowest bidder. If we award it to the next lowest bidder. we'll probably be in court with the low bidder," Anselmo said.

He noted the city is far behind in construction now because of delays in the past caused by necessary compliance procedures. "If the council takes it under advisement all we will do is delay it longer and delay going to court."

He said he was not certain if the council could throw out all of the bids and readvertise for new bids.

Speaking about the University Athletic Program, Close stated, "I realize that athletics is an important part of any university, however, the athletes should be willing to repay the University by completing their degree as well as giving 100 percent to their sport. I feel that the days of the athlete going to school just to play sports is on it's way out." He

continued, "I was very concerned when the Regents voted to eliminate the soccer program at UNLV next year. I feel that soccer is an important part of the University and the community."

Close has been very active in the community by serving as a member of the Board of Directors of both the Big Brothers - Big Sisters program of Clark County and the Paradise Rotary Club. He as been active in the Boy Scouts of America little league



## City Explores Creating Its Own Cable Operation

**Boulder City** 

Should Boulder City explore the possibility of installing and operating its own cable television facility?

The possibility was discussed at a recent B.C. City Council workshop ... and the initial response to the question was favorable.

Councilwoman Hazel Debbold spoke with enthusiasm on investigating such a venture. "I feel the expenditures involved would come back tenfold," she said. "I don't see how we could miss."

City Manager Terry Zerkle told council that preliminary figures have been studied by Administrative Assistant Mike Baker. "The expenses involved would be over one million dollars," he said ... adding that the possible returns on this investment could be "pretty big."

He summarized the advantages and risks of such a venture by the city. "The disadvantages include the front end capital needed to establish the system," he said. "There's also a risk of not getting a quick market penetration."

On the positive side, Zerkle noted that a city run system would "probably" result in a higher level of service. The city itself as well as residents of the community would both receive many benefits.

"If we get into such an operation, we should provide capabilities for all the services we pinpointed in our study done in 1980," he added.

At that time, council and staff studied the cable TV market at length. Baker compiled a thorough, indepth document on the perils, pitfalls and many new ways that cable could serve a community.

Zerkle said the city could operate a system at a lower cost to the residents through utilization of city personnel.

At the present time, Community Cable of Las Vegas holds the necessary Public Service Commission (PSC) certificates to provide service to most of southern Nevada.

Following the 1980 city study, a Request For Proposal document was drawn up listing the services the city would like to see provided by an outside cable

Before the RFP could be issued, a letter arrived from the PSC stating that the city was pre-empted in this area. City Attorney Steve Parsons disagreed However, both sides agreed to hold off and present the issue to the 1981 Nevada legislature for resolution. The matter died in committee ... and both sides returned to their original positions.

Following a discussion in the council work session, it was agreed that city staff will work up a feasibility study regarding city control of its own cable system.





## Tennis Court Light Operating Instructions Explained

For you tennis buffs, and with the warm weather just around the corner, the Henderson Parks and Recreation Department offers the following instructions for operation of the lights for the Civic Center Tennis Courts and the Tennis Courts located in Wells Park.

The power to these lights

is turned on by a time clock around Sunday. After power is available the lights will not come jon until the button is pushed.

After the button has been pushed the first time each evening it will take a few minutes for the lights to reach their brightest capacity. Once one, the lights will stay on for one hour.

After 55 minutes from pushing button a horn will sound and the red light on top of the control pole will flash for five minutes until the lights go out or until the button is pushed again for another hour of play.

Each time the button is pushed it begins this cycle over again. However, at 10 p.m. daily the lights go off until the next evening, no matter when the button is last pressed.

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
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
