# The streak is dead!

When the wicked witch of the West in the "Wizard of Oz" was killed by Dorothy the fantasy people rejoiced and celebrated, lauded their conquering Kansas hero and her friends and wanted to give the bright-eyed teenager anything she requested.

Even the witch's former henchmen celebrated with Dorothy at the death of the sorceress.

Basic head coach Rich Whitehead and his varsity football team must have experienced the same sort of dream-come-true experience Friday night as they disintegrated their wicked witch, a 39-game losing streak, and received the

hero's welcome on Clark's Collis Stadium field and when they returned to Kansas, home sweet home, Henderson.

Even Clark coach Jim Massey, a former student of Whitehead, and Clark players made a point to congratulate their former 10-year coach.

Yes, Dorothy, the streak is dead, 18-6.

Determination, the kind of never-say-die attitude that carried Basic down to the wire in three out of their first four non-league games this season, finally paid off Friday night as the Wolves totally dominated the Clark Chargers 18-6 to end a record 39-game losing streak and assert Basic's position in the Sunrise Division race.

Basic offensive back coach Tom Bywaters summed up the

team's winning attitude best in the Wolves post-game locker room meeting. "You were serious and intense, there was no fooling around and you won."

Although the small spread of the score might lead some to believe the game was close, Basic controlled the tempo of the contest throughout, allowing Clark their only score late in the fourth quarter, when celebrating the streak's death already had begun on the visitors' sidelines.

After an interception by Clark gave the Chargers the ball on their own 20, Basic's dominance of the game set in. Clark was forced to punt and Basic took possession on their 40 and

The Henderson city coffers will again be enriched this year with funds from the Convention Authority Room Tax.

Under an agreement scheduled for ratification last night, the City would receive 8.8 percent of the funds set aside by the convention for the cities and county.

The same amount will come to Henderson in the next four years.

Earlier this year, the county said it wanted to change the distribution formula and the new base would have reduced the amount to Henderson, Boulder City and North Las Vegas while increasing the share to the county.

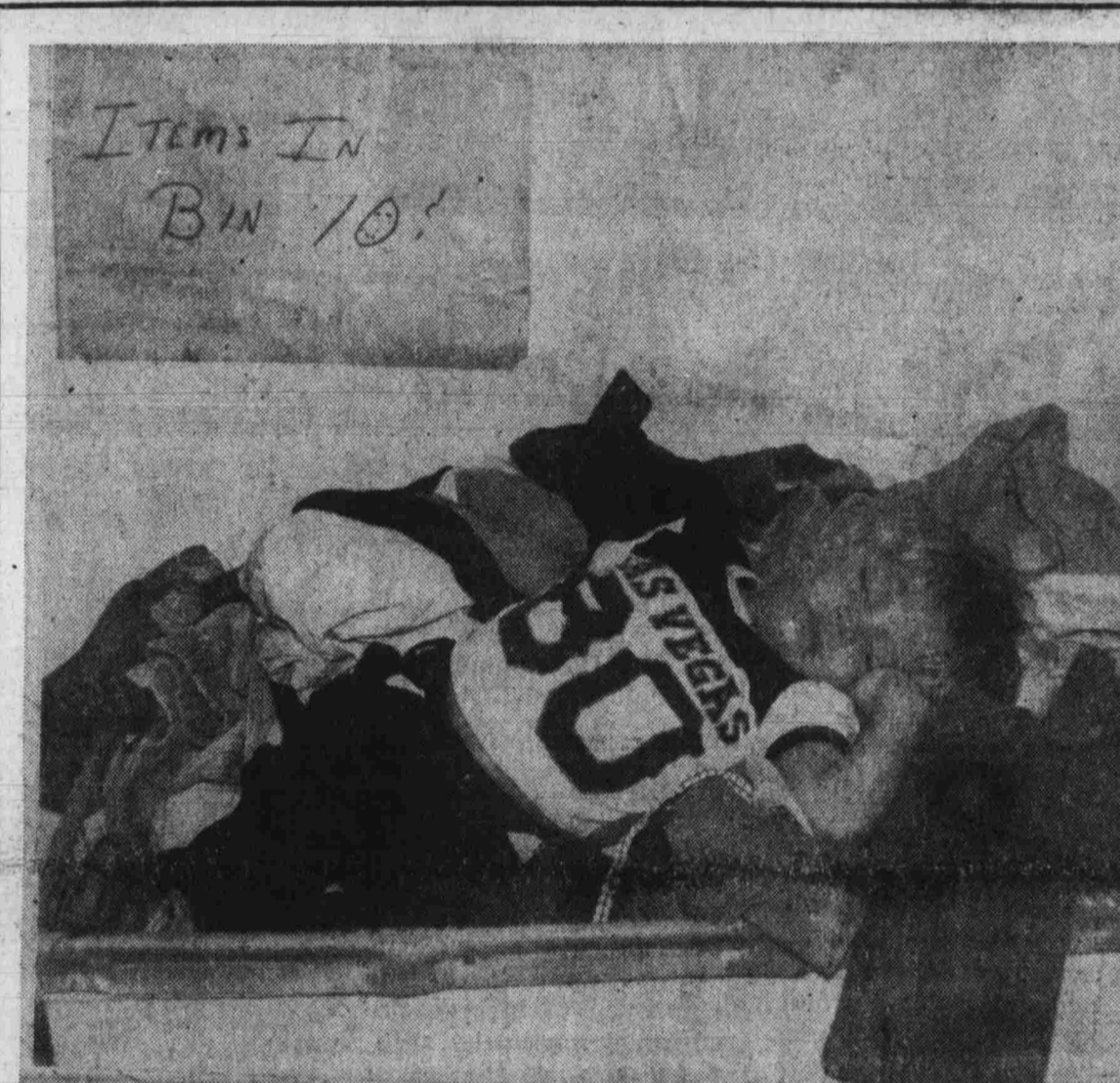
But following negotiation, it was agreed that North Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City would receive the same percentage rate as previously.

Boulder City will continue to receive 2.2 percent while North Las Vegas will receive 13.1 percent. The City of Las Vegas will receive 46.2 percent and Clark County will receive 29.6 percent.

Under the formula, Clark County will increase its take in the next four years, graduating up to 39.3 from 29.3 percent while the city of Las Vegas gets a smaller share in the years ahead, ending with 36.5 percent by 1986-87 fiscal years.

City Finance Director Bob Kasner said Monday, Henderson received \$169,000 last year from the room tax which was up \$5,000 from the year before.

The funds received went directly into the General Fund, according to Kasner.

## Police Investigating Shooting Incident

A 16-year-old local youth was pronounced clinically dead yesterday, according to a police spokesman, following a Friday night incident in which he was shot in the head.

A spokeswoman for Sun-

rise Hospital said Sunday the youth was in "very, very serious condition" and had suffered brain damage.

Henderson police found the youth about 11:40 p.m. Friday on Chestnut St. near E. Barrett St. bleeding from a head wound. An investiga-

tion is continuing into the matter, the police spokesman said, although the youth's name is still being withheld.

The youth was transported from Henderson to Sunrise Hospital by helicopter.

## Jail Expansion to Cost City \$30,000

The city council Monday night, was expected to approve a \$30,000 expenditure with money to come from the land fund, to complete the Henderson city jail.

Claude Howard, who recently constructed a justice court facility for the city, agreed to build at least part of the addition to the jail which would add eight new two-person cells and a trustee dormitory. This would, with modification to the existing facility, give the city a capacity of 34 beds and bring the city into compliance with jail housing standards.

Once the outer shell, cell walls, plumbing, and electrical are installed, (the portion agreed to be built by Howard,) the city will be required to add a number of items to make the unit usable. The largest expenditure will be to install the necessary steel cell bars, locks, beds and doors for each cell. The cost of this is estimated at \$28,000 fully installed. Added to this it is estimated the city must expend approximately \$1,700 for towels, sheets, uniforms, mattresses and covers, food service items, and personal hygiene items. Additionally an estimated \$2,500 will be required to tie the new building into the existing fire warning system and to provide an appropriately secure outside area for fire emergency evacuation.

According to Tom W. Thompson, deputy director of the public safety department, support services, the Henderson city jail is currently holding approximately 17 persons on a day-to-day basis, with population spikes going to 24 or more on weekends. The facility was originally built to hold a maximum of 26 persons under the then ex-

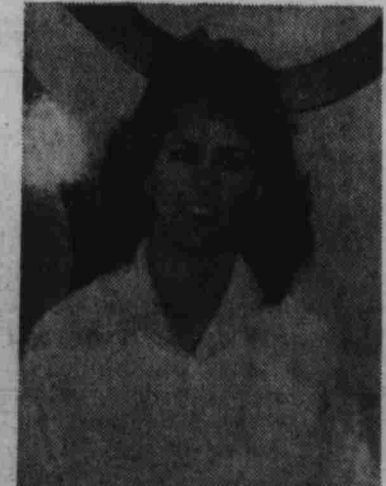

# Police Department Armorer Saw Need For His New Skills

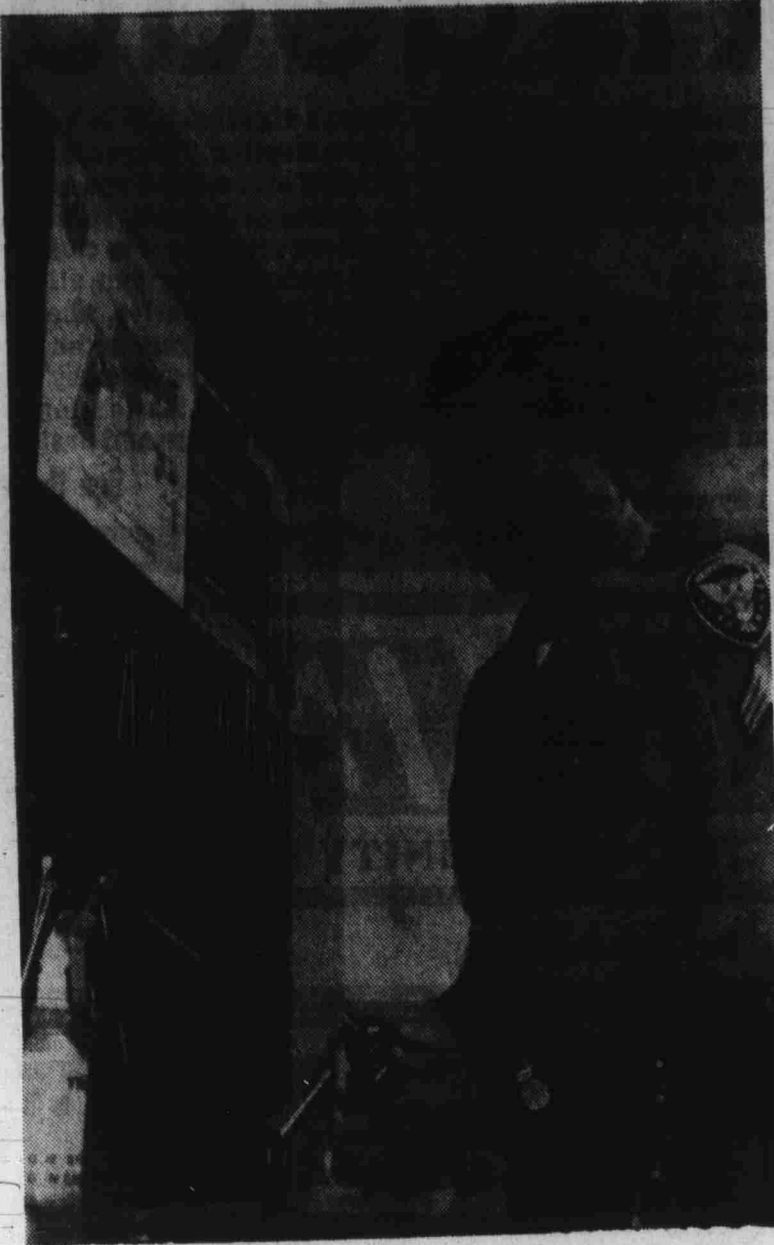
Sgt. Verl Smith, a 12 year veteran with the Henderson Police Department recently completed training that expanded on his professional skills and combined his hobby -- he is now the police department armorer.

"What's an armorer?" The word is usually found when military activities are discussed, but an armorer is necessary wherever there are guns and ammunition in use, most police departments have a section that repairs and maintains its weapons.

The Henderson Police Department has not had the services of a recognized armorer on its roster in recent years and Smith decided there was a need for an in-department expert. Until he completed his training, all department weapons were sent out for repair.

But though there was a need for someone on the staff who knew how to break down and repair their guns, Henderson police had no money to send a man back to the factories for training -- so Smith decided to do it on his own.

The department gave him time off from his duties but

he paid his own way to the east coast where he attended the 40 hour course offered by Sturm Ruger in South Port, N.H. The firm specializes in several types of police weapons including hand guns and shotguns and in the week of instruction he learned the intricacies of Ruger's .38 cal; 357 and 44 handguns as well as the 243 rifle, the 308 rifle and the

firm's shotguns.

Following his completion of Ruger's course, he paid his own way through Smith and Wesson's 80 hour course in Springfield, Mass. He has received certificates of completion from each of these manufacturers. Smith then purchased the equipment needed to make repairs and adjustments to the department's weapons and

set up shop in his own home.

Always interested in weapons and their maintenance, Smith said, "I did not pursue the repair of weapons per se -- but I always felt the department had a need for a program of this type and that I would like to do this type of work."

He also says he feels the experience will come in handy when he does retire from the force.

Continued development in the higher elevations has significantly changed the groundwater patterns within our community. In the past few years we have had flooding damage which, in the past, was unheard of. As we continue to grow and develop more and more of our flood control capabilities must be enhanced for the welfare and safety of our community. The rapid growth in the

Green Valley area will require the development of a storm drainage channel in the area of Stephanie Street and this particular part of the bond issue will provide for the acquisition of right-of-way in order to provide for the future development of a flood control channel. This channel will be critical for future development in the area between Whitney Mesa and Boulder Highway.

The proposed right-of-way will extend from the existing mouth of the Whitney Wash at the Mesa to Duck

Creek near Boulder Highway. Since the area in question is presently in private ownership, it is in the City's best interests to acquire the needed right-of-way prior to actual development of the area taking place.

Your vote on this \$1,200,000 question will directly impact the continued growth of our community. Your support will help ensure the safety of present and future citizens of the Green Valley area from the ravages of flood damage.

# Community College Has Come A Long Way Here

Yes... we have come a long way. In just over a year, the Henderson Campus has added measurably to its offerings, and student enrollment has reached an all time high. In retrospect, the service area of Henderson, Boulder City, and East Las Vegas has come a long way from a dream to reality. The first year of operation as an outreach program, there were less than 100 students. They attended classes at a variety of community based sites, in churches and community centers. By the time the 1979 legislature convened, it was evident that the area needed a full scale facility. On November 6, 1981, the campus, located at 700 South College Drive in Henderson, was dedicated. For the students and the community, the Henderson Campus is a dream that has come true.

The Henderson Campus has a staff of five full-time instructional faculty and over 50 part-time faculty. Dr. Janice Reid teaches English Composition and is currently developing a new course, "Women in Literature," for Spring 1983.

Melvin Pedras, who is active in the State and National Associations for Voc-

ational Education, teaches in the drafting program.

Jim Stacy, with over 20 years of experience in welding and fabrication, has developed a welding curriculum to meet the needs of industry in Southern Nevada.

The Electronics program is coordinated by Arnold Friedman and includes course work in industrial electronics, small business machine repair, electronics service technology and electronics engineering technology.

The newest program on the Henderson campus, Ornamental Horticulture, offers course work in landscape technology, floral design, and parks-nursery management. This program is headed by John Smith.

Mary Malley is the Evening Coordinator-Counselor for the Henderson campus. Ms. Malley also does high school recruitment and career interest testing. Jeanette Toohey is in charge of the Learning Resources Center. The LRC provides reference materials, books, periodicals, and audio-visual services for students and faculty and also serves the community at large.

Dr. Mary Burnett, Director

of the Henderson campus, has been with CCCC since 1973. She was an instructor in Child Development and Psychology and Director of the Division of Social Science and Service Occupations.

Support services are provided by Marjorie Shoemaker, Jill Odell, and Polly Torres. A part-time Community Relations Coordinator, Judy Ferraro, is employed to expand the college-community relationship. Since January of 1982, more than 75 businesses, industries, and government agencies have been contacted in order to ascertain current and future needs.

In addition to academic and vocational classes the college offers Community Education classes. These are aimed at the special interests of the community. Classes such as upholstery, calligraphy, and dancercise are offered.

The Henderson staff has also been active in implementing the "Institute Program" in the community. The Institute Program provides individualized training for businesses that desire additional staff development but do not want the expense of setting up an in-house training program.

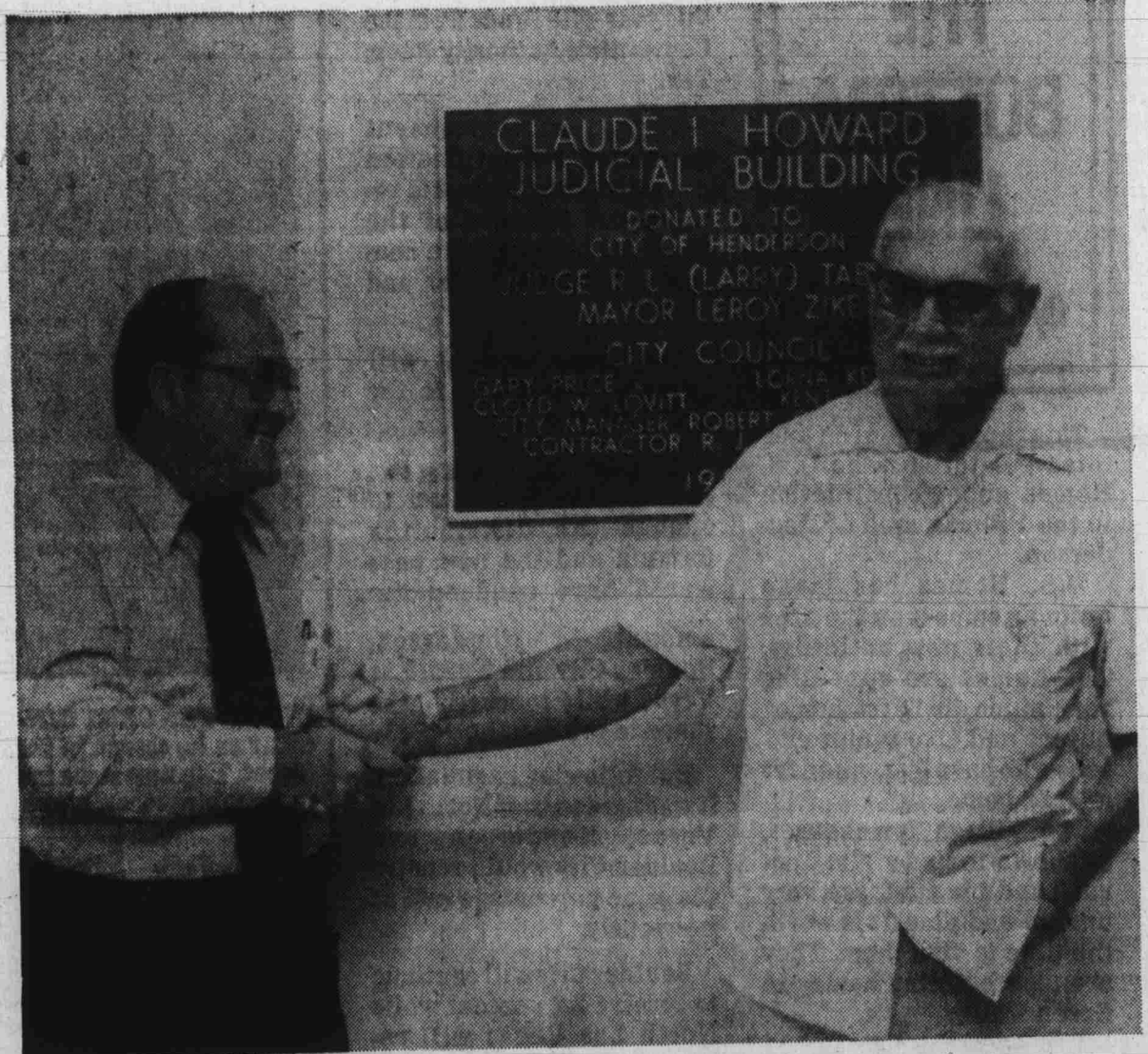
Since then the icemaker has controlled itself in keeping with the use so I am not up in the middle of the night emptying out the ice.

A 42-year-old Henderson woman was stabbed early Sunday morning and her husband was subsequently taken into custody on a charge of attempted murder, according to police.

At approximately 2:23 a.m. Sunday the police department received a report of an

isting standards as to space per inmate, and under the current standards the city should be holding no more than 18 persons.

Projecting the jail needs for the next ten years, Thompson said that a 50-bed facility is needed. In projecting the future needs an annual figure of plus 24 percent was used based on the increase observed from July, 1980 through June, 1982. Based on this figure the daily population will exceed 36 persons towards the end of 1984 or early 1985. Thompson said the expansion should be sufficient for the next three years.

# Would Be Artist Brightens Day Care Center Walls

A child's fantasy of a forest filled with soft, furry creatures, butterflies, and flowers brightens the walls of the Henderson Day Care Center on Kay's Parkway.

The wall-length mural is the work of Barry F. Hannant, an artist and professional carpenter, whose son Tarver attends the center.

"My mother-in-law, Dorothy, works here and kind of talked me into it," smiles Hannant, who said his 4½ year-old son is very proud of his father's work. "All the kids say, 'Tarver's daddy did that!'"

Temporarily unemployed, Hannant said he had extra time to work on the mural, which

took approximately three eight-hour days for the actual painting time. The theme for the mural was based on an illustration in a children's book, "Wonders of Nature," to which Hannant adjusted the proportions and added many of his own touches.

"I used a high gloss latex enamel so that the kids could touch it and their fingerprints could be wiped off," said Hannant. The mural is located in the dining area of the center.

"When he was in here working on (the mural) the children wouldn't eat," laughs Jeanne Prait, assistant director of the center. "All they would do is watch him!"

Hannant, 28, said he studied art at Yankton College in Yankton,

South Dakota in 1973 and 1974.

"I feel better about myself when I paint, but it doesn't pay the bills," said Hannant, who would prefer to make his living by painting. "The thing that's keeping me from (painting professionally) is a degree in art and the right contacts."

Hannant also creates oil portraits and recently presented one, as a representative of the Elk's Lodge, to the 1981 Miss Heldorado, Robin Phillips. He also carves wood sculptures, and has worked with marble, creating sculptures and trophies.

Hannant said he would like to paint more murals because he likes working with a large area.

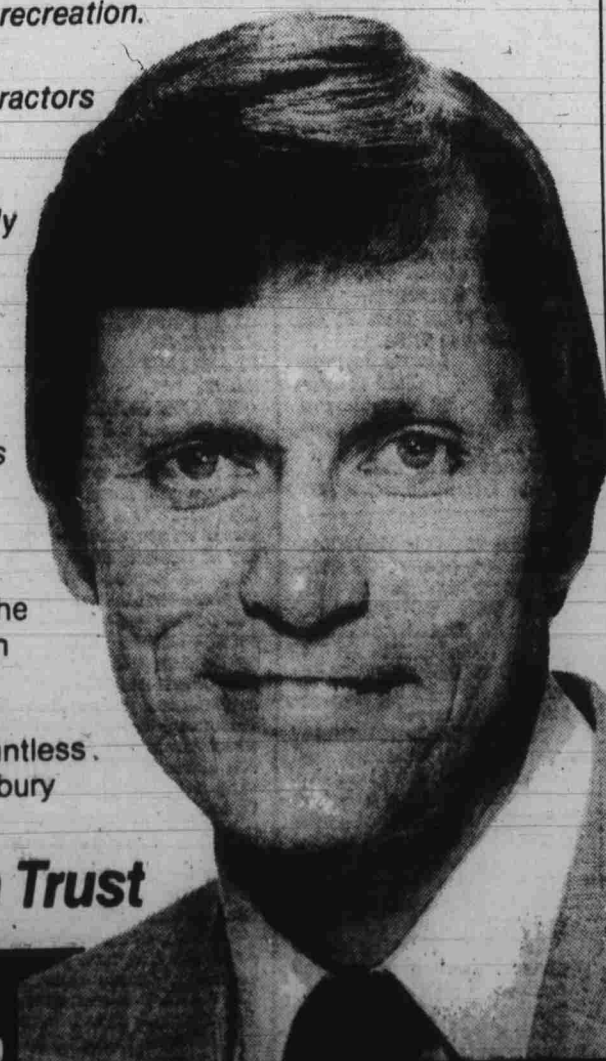

# CP National to Acquire Denro Laboratories

Ben W. Agee, Chairman of CP National, today announced that in line with its corporate strategy to continue its diversification into the nonregulated telecommunications field, the Corporation has signed a letter of intent to acquire Denro Laboratories, Inc. of Rockville, Maryland from First General Resources Company (OTC). The definitive agreement is subject to the approval of the Board's of both companies.

Denro Labs, a subsidiary of the New York based First General Resources Company, is a designer and manufacturer of electronic

telephone and radio communications systems for air traffic control. In May, 1982, Denro was awarded a major contract by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to install state-of-the-art communications systems for a minimum of 53, and a potential for 132, FAA Centers across the United States. With the successful bid for the FAA program, Denro Labs is producing a new system which is microprocessor based. They also are builders of air-ground communications systems for the Navy, Air Force and Army.

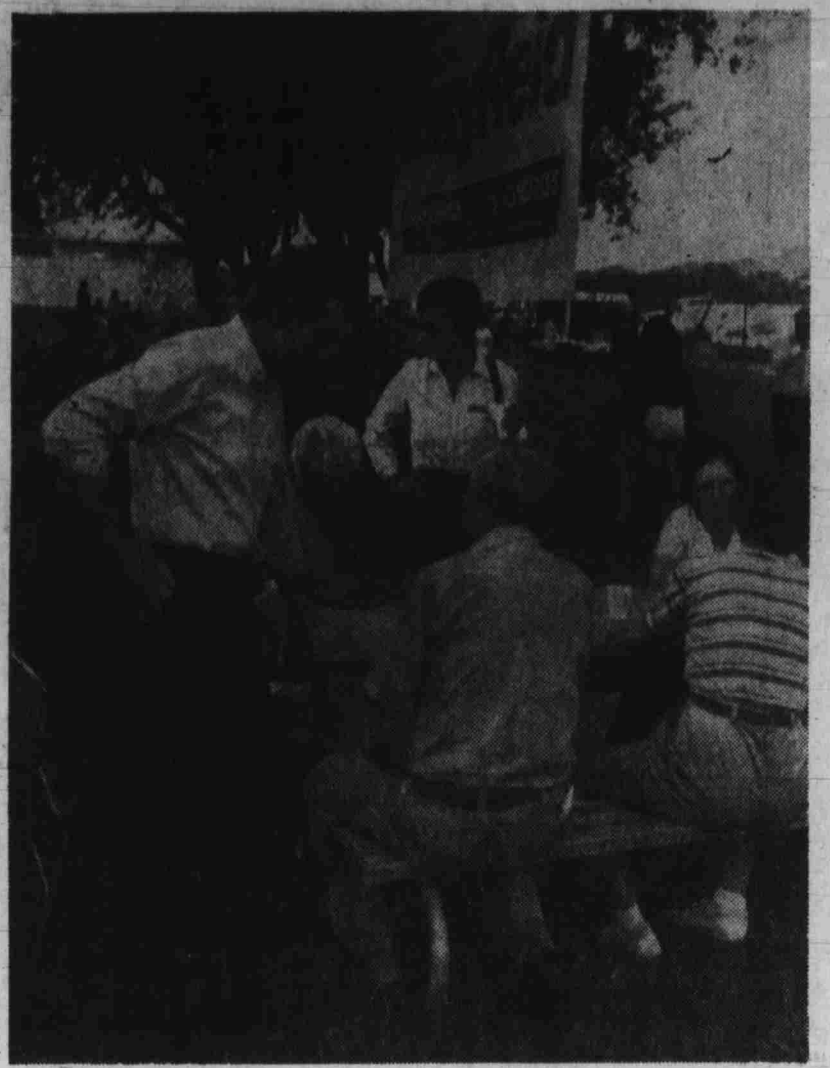
CP National will buy all of the capital stock of Denro from First General Resources for \$6.5 million cash, with a potential additional amount payable of up to \$1.75 million, dependent upon the total number of systems ultimately ordered and installed for the FAA.

Upon the announcement of the execution of the letter Chairman Agee stated, "Our desire to be involved in providing the governments with communications systems and services commenced in 1981 with the formation of our government services unit. 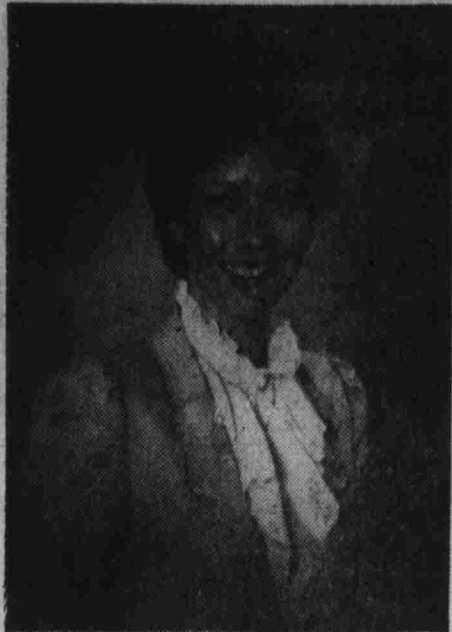

## Laxalt Bill Attacks Crime And Drugs

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Legislation sponsored by Nevada Senator Paul Laxalt, which "will go a long way toward alleviating the violent crime and drug-pushing epidemic in the country," won near unanimous approval from the United States Senate yesterday.

The bill, titled "The Violent Crime and Drug Enforcement Act of 1982," will: --provide fixed sentencing for federal crimes committed with a firearm. --disallow parole and limit "good time" credits for federal crime violators.

enforcement officials to claim the proceeds convicted drug pushers gain through their offenses.

Laxalt said, "This is the type of gutsy legislation needed to attack the escalating crime problem -- a problem that has reached epidemic proportions in some areas of the country."

The Senate, through a parliamentary procedure, hopes to force the House of Representatives to bring the measure up during this session, according to Laxalt.

"I am extremely confident that this anti-crime package will eventually pass, whether in this Congress or the next, due to the wide bipartisan support it enjoys," Laxalt said.

### Nonregistration Cause Is Ignorance

Most young men who have not registered under the selective service system failed to sign up because they are ignorant of the system and how it works, or because they believe nothing will happen to them, says Charles Fulkerson, Nevada state director for the selective service system. Registration was not a one time effort, but is an

ongoing process requiring all eighteen (18) year olds to sign up within 30 days of their birthday. It is a quick, simple, painless process of filling out a registration card at any post office and handing it to a postal clerk. Failure to register is a felony and can result in prosecution and conviction with a fine of \$10,000 and five (5) years in jail. Although the grace period has passed, it is never too late to register and it does not mean prosecution will occur nor that one will be drafted.

Registration, the director points out, is not the same as the draft since no one can be drafted without an act of Congress. There is no change in civilian routine as a result of signing up, and it does not obligate a person for military service if he qualifies for an exemption should he be called to service.

Nationally, as of July 1982, approximately 93 percent of the eligible individuals had registered. With about 97 percent registered statewide, Nevada ranked third among the states for the number of individuals complying with registration.

As of June 30, 1982 Nevada has 96.65 percent of compliance.

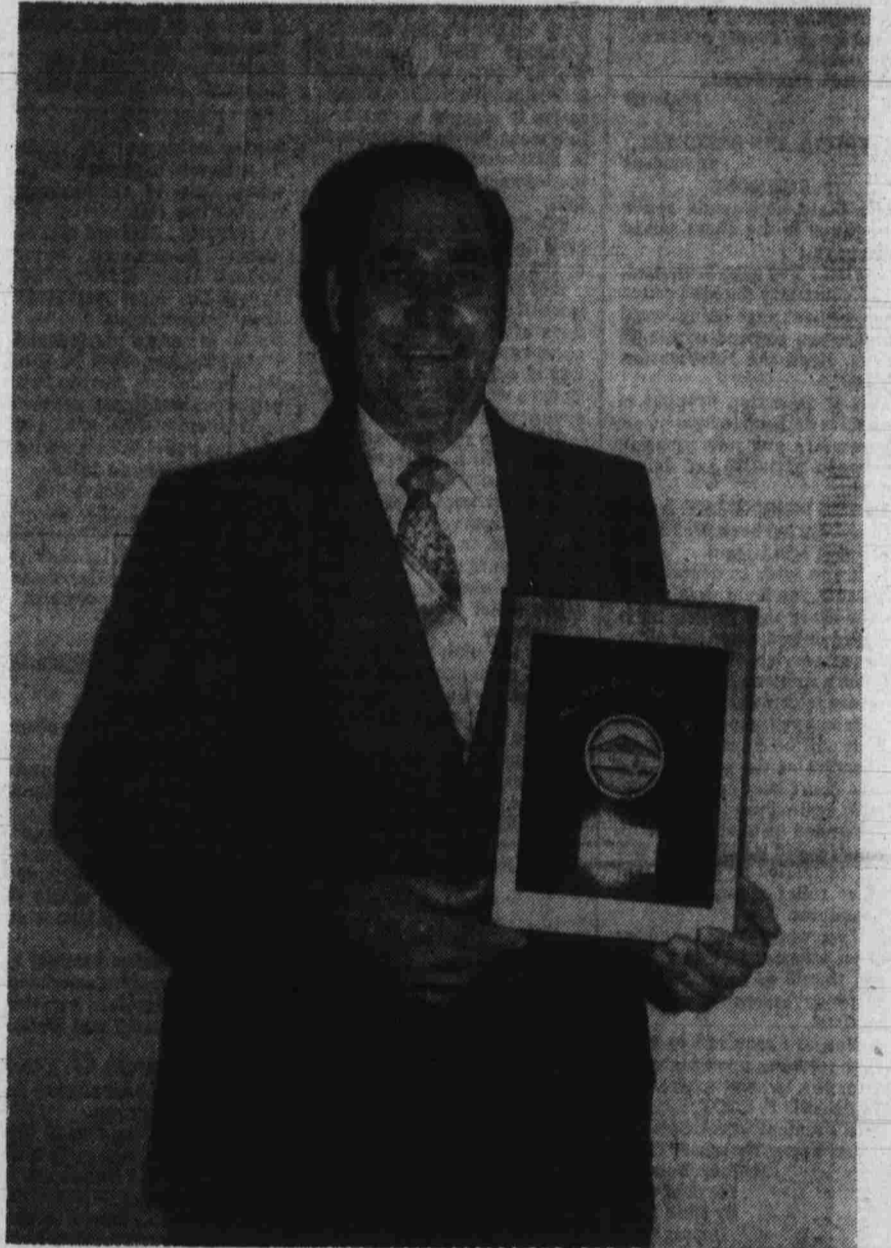

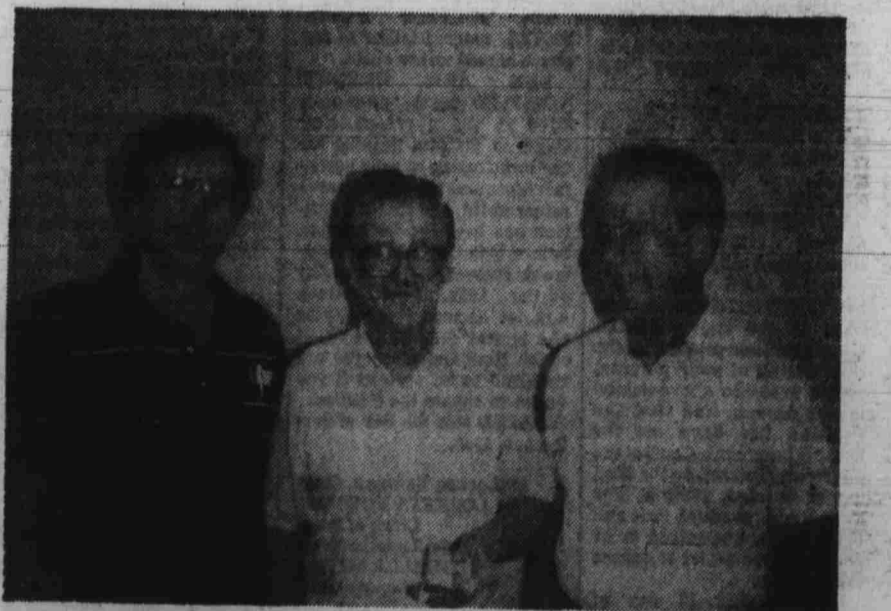
Reid, however, has accepted an Oct. 26 debate at channel 10 and this debate will also be sponsored by the Review-Journal.

"I'm pleased the voters of Nevada will have an opportunity to hear both Mrs. Cavnar and me in this type of forum," Reid said.

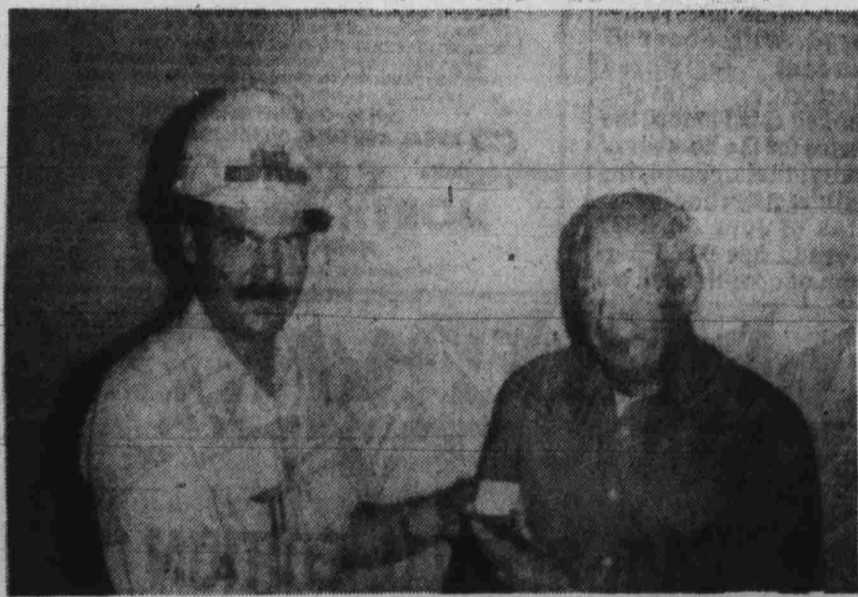
## Fire Fighters Endorse Bryan

eventually scored on their second try.

Junior tailback Randy Venerable keyed the drive with a 25-yard option run around left-end to the Chargers 33 to keep it alive. Classmate Jack Dunigan got the Wolves closer when senior quarterback Jeff McComb hit him on an inside curl pass at the Clark 10. Two plays later Venerable scooted around right end for the score and senior kicker Loren Wolfe converted on the kick to give the Wolves a 7-0 lead.

Basic unexpectedly capitalized on a Clark error for their next score. A McComb punt was downed inside the Clark five and on the second play from scrimmage after the punt Clark quarterback Jeff Pettit sailed an option pitch over the head of running back Phillip Kleinpeter. Kleinpeter prevented a Basic touchdown but not a safety when he retrieved the ball in the end zone and was tackled by a pack of Wolves led by defensive tackler Elmer Brown. Brown, in his first start, no doubt showed coaches he should be a permanent part of the sustaining Basic defense with his excellent play against Clark.

With the field position given by the Clark safety kickoff and a drive that ended at the Charger 18, Wolfe expanded the Basic lead to 12-0 with a 35-yard field goal, his fourth three-pointer this season.

The Wolves took that lead to the half-time locker room and on the opening play of the second half it looked as if Basic were destined to end the streak at Clark's Collis Stadium.

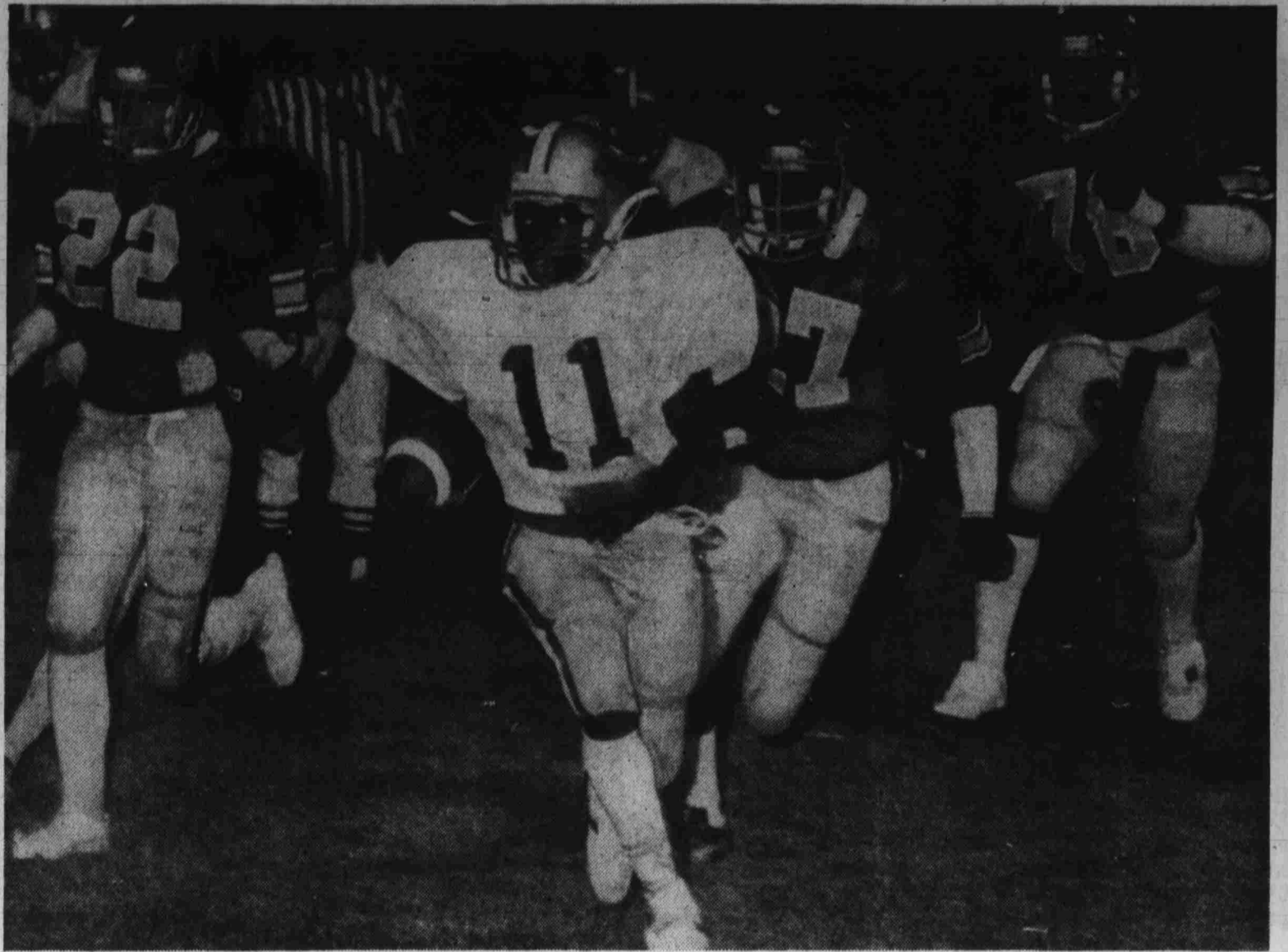
On the opening kickoff Clark's Gary Gunny returned the ball to the Basic 45 only to have the pigskin stolen by a Basic tackler and set up the Wolves final score. Culminating a 65-yard drive Venerable converted for a first down with a 22-yard jaunt to the Clark 3 and then when over on a same-styled left end run to score. Basic led 18-0 mid-way through the third quarter.

Clark ran for their only touchdown mid-way through the fourth quarter when Kleinpeter powered his way in from the 25 on a left end run.

Basic ended Clark's only other serious scoring threat late in the fourth frame when Anthony Marquez intercepted a Clark pass and returned it to the Basic 45.

The win was the first for Basic since a 15-0 shutout of Bonanza Sept. 8, 1978 and ends a state record 39 straight losses for a school still in existence. Stewart Indian School lost 49 in a row before the school closed in the mid 1970's.

More importantly though, Basic's dominance of Clark should warn their Sunrise Division opponents of the potent

offense and defense that the Wolves have this year. Basic chewed up 165 yards in total offense in the first half against a Charger defense that limited Western to 102 yards through a whole game.

Those four teams now have a collective record of 15-5 through the first five games of the nine-game Southern Zone football regular season. On that night Venerable led Basic's offense with 118 yards

Both Basic's men's and women's cross country teams won a four-team meet Thursday and the men continued to consolidate their grasp on the zone title by winning the five-team Indian Springs Invitational Saturday.

Basic cross country coach Larry Burgess was totally surprised by the ease in which his team won Thursday's match at Eldorado, against chief rival Chaparral. The men's team was one point away from a perfect sweep in the meet as Basic scored the first four places and overall filled the first six out of seven spots. Their 16 point total devastated the nearest rival, Chaparral, who scored 46 and Bonanza who tallied 91. Eldorado did not run a full five-man team.

Leading the men's team Thursday senior Richie Newton won the race despite his continued recovery from the stomach flu with a time of 16:26. Freshman Kevin Curtis earned his best varsity finish this year with his second spot with a 17:04 time and senior Jerry Goodman, despite his flu battle, came in on Curtis' shoulder for third place and a time of 17:05. Finishing the first four was sophomore Rodney Ford with a clock of 17:15.

Chaparral's Alex Turner spoiled the sweep for Basic with a fifth place finish and a time of 17:31. Junior Chris Tuma completed the final five for Basic with a time of 17:41, good for sixth place overall. Classmate Maurice Hernandez further asserted Basic's dominance of the meet with his seventh place finish with a 17:47 time.

Sophomores Abran Salazar and David Hall made it in the top 20 in the more than 40 runner field with Salazar running 11th with an 18:12 time and Hall coming in 16th with a time of 19:23.

Newcomers Tim Watkins and John DiLauro came in together at 34th and 35th with times of 22:09 and 22:14.

Basic's women won their first meet of the season Thursday at Eldorado, but by a much narrower margin than the men. Junior Uvette Gonzaque led the team with her second place finish with a time of 21:30. Senior Mercy Hernandez followed in third with a 21:55 time. Freshman Gina Kim also earned her best varsity finish this year with a fifth and a time of 23:35. Sophomore Ann Mackie earned seventh with a 24:05 time and Angie Belingeri completed the final five in 17th place.

With 34 points the Basic women outdistanced Bonanza by 18 and Chaparral by 28 with Eldorado not running a full women's team.

Saturday at Indian Springs the men had better competition but the outcome was still the same as Basic again ran over all competition on their way to a 33-point team total to win the meet easily. All seven of Basic's varsity runners in the race placed 16th or better. Western was the closest team to the Wolves, 44 points behind at a team score of 77.

Although Basic did control the meet as a team, they didn't win the individual race as Rancho's Tony Mosley and Western's Art Castle placed first and second, respectively.

Newton led the team again with a third place finish and a time of 17:09. Burgess hinted that Newton's strategy may have been sprung too early as the senior team captain passed Mosley at the mile marker only to fade, when Mosley ended the run with his characteristically strong kick. Burgess said Newton may have expended too much energy to catch Mosley early in the race and didn't put enough distance between themselves during the middle of the race.

Times overall were a lot slower than Thursday's due to the slow, desert and wash course at Indian Springs. Four Basic runners came in with 24 seconds of each other with Curtis leading the pack with a fifth place finish and a time of 17:52. Hernandez placed sixth with a 17:56 time, Goodman ran for eighth with an 18:06 time and Tuma completed the final five with an 11th place finish and a clock of 18:16. Sophomores Ford and Salazar finished the 52-man race in 12th and 16th place with respective times of 18:34 and 19:05.

Burgess entered four runners in the junior varsity race and had he entered a full five-man team he estimated they would have placed second behind team winners and Class A school Moapa Valley.

Leading the junior varsity were Hall and junior Lynn Erling with second and third place finishes and times of 19:03 and 19:11. Sophomore Gilbert Gomez placed 12th in the race with a 21:09 time and DiLauro ran 22nd in the 35-man race with a time of 23:04.

## Schools Make More Cuts

Clark County School District Superintendent Bob Wentz delivered a speech on closed circuit television to CCSD employees.

He outlined his position on impending budget cuts within CCSD. Emphasizing that the district has already made \$6,728,802 in cuts in their 1982-83 operating budget, Wentz said, "It has become clear that the Clark County School District is going to be forced to make still further budget cuts."

"We are faced with cutting approximately five million dollars from this year's operating budget. A cut of this size will probably eliminate a couple of hundred positions."

Wentz indicated the district's administration is reviewing the entire operating budget, "from top to bottom." He said that one basic guideline is being used when searching for cuts.

"We will try not to cut direct instructional programs, or direct student extra-curricular activities that remain in operation at this time."

Wentz insisted that the school district is not wasting money, saying, "We are thrifty. We are not a wealthy district. Having served as superintendent of three other school districts in the United States, I am impressed with our district's fiscally sound budget."

During the televised speech, Wentz referred to a chart of comparative per pupil school district expenses. The chart showed that CCSD has the lowest per pupil expenditure in the entire state of Nevada. "During 1980-81 our district spent \$1,941 per pupil. As you can see from this (chart), our expenses are less than every other school district in Nevada -- far less than

some."

Wentz told school district employees he would report again in the near future and ask for employee input on the actual list of cuts being proposed. "Before we go to the Board of School Trustees for final consideration of our proposed cuts, we will come again to you, our staff. At that time, if anyone has a preferable alternative, we will take time, make a cost analysis, and give it full consideration before taking the recommendations to the School Board for final action."

Wentz ended his ten minute talk asking employees to be patient. "We all need to work together on this. Most of all, let's not let the problem confronting us hurt our work with the children in our schools. For all of us, that should be the bottom line."

late Saturday afternoon. Police say Dwayne Walter Ward, 42, was apparently westbound on Sunset at a high rate of speed when the

driver lost control. The vehicle vaulted across the median, ejecting the driver and came to rest on the sidewalk facing eastbound.

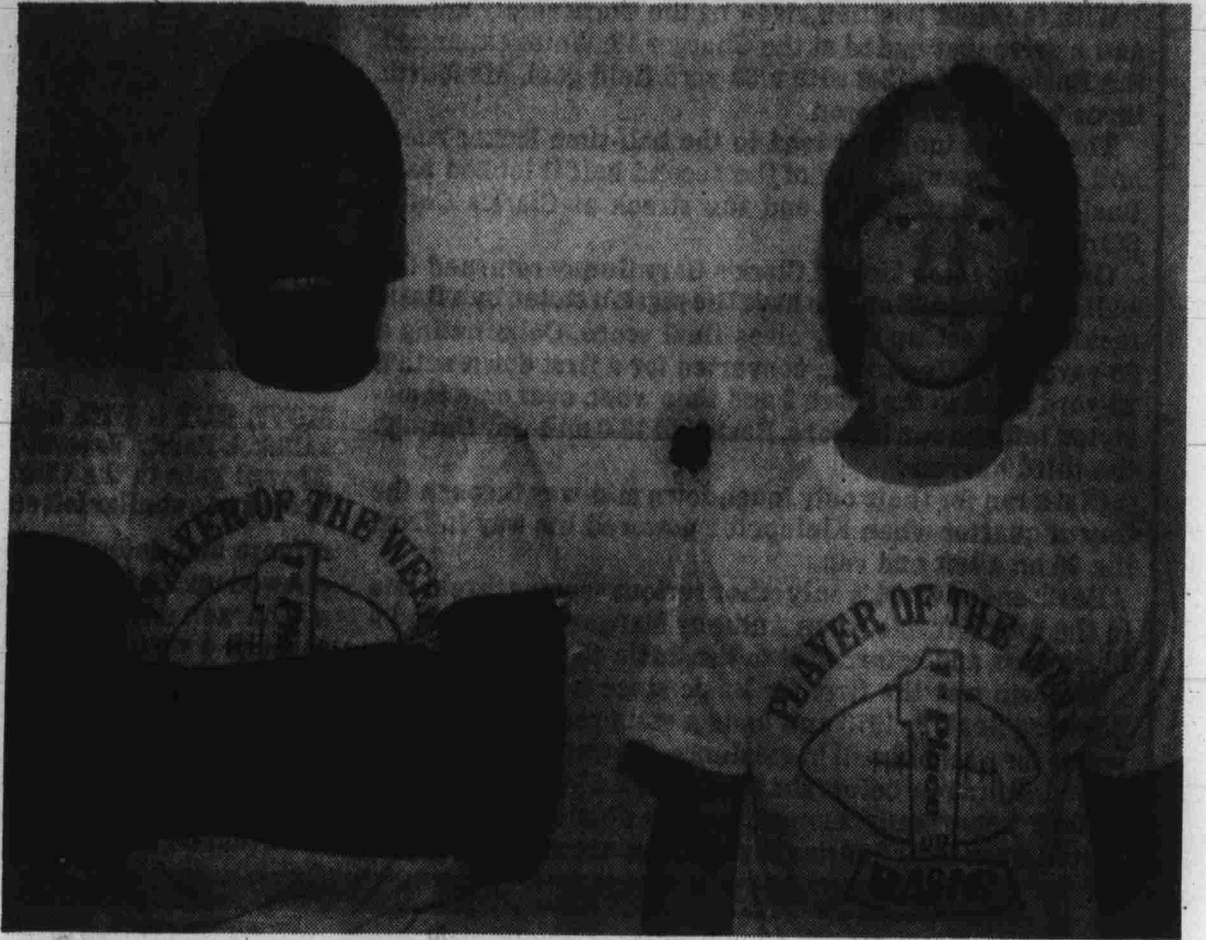

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

• Always try clothes on before you buy — no matter how valuable your time and how little of it you have. While consumer groups are currently trying to standardize clothing sizes, there is now a great variance in the correlation between numbered sizes among various manufacturers. Clothes which are made in the Orient — even those with American labels — tend to run as much as several sizes smaller than the number indicated, and design clothing is usually larger than the size specified.  
• Combating robbery is an expensive proposition, but with crime on the rise, leaving your house unprotected can be even more expensive. The least costly alarm system — a control box and siren — for windows or doors, costs about \$300. Accordion-type gates for windows run about \$150 for an average window; the more attractive and more effective welded-iron, door-type gates cost an average of \$250 per window. Some inexpensive alternatives: Put a broom handle, cut to size, in the track of sliding-glass doors; install key locks to replace casement window handle-type latches (\$14); invest in window-sash locks with key-controlled pins for double-hung windows. Attach timer-controlled light switches to fluorescent lights instead of incandescent bulbs; the fluorescent bulbs last longer and use less energy.  
• Retail dental centers can be a way to save money on your dentistry bills. These dentists' co-operatives, often located in shopping centers or on city streets, usually don't require appointments and have late hours to facilitate visits. Additionally, their rates tend to be lower — an average of \$30 for a cleaning, X-ray and exam, and \$10 for one silver filling, for example. Dental schools and societies in your area can tell you if there have been complaints about such group practice centers.

### ITALIAN OMELETTE

Here's an easy cheesy omelette, fast and fabulous. To serve 4 you'll need:

- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 medium-sized onion, chopped
- 4 tbs. butter or margarine
- 1 large ripe tomato, peeled and chopped
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. leaf oregano, crumbled
- 8 eggs
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup shredded provolone cheese (4 oz.)

Saute green pepper and onion in 2 tbs. of the butter in a small skillet until soft, about 5 - minutes. Add tomato, the 1/2 tsp. salt and the oregano. Cook slowly, 10 minutes, stirring occasionally until all the liquid is absorbed. Set aside. Beat eggs with the remaining salt and pepper in a medium-sized bowl until light and fluffy. Heat a 10-inch skillet until hot. Swirl the remaining 2 tbs. butter over the bottom and sides of the skillet with a fork. Pour in egg mixture, cook, stirring, and shaking pan until omelette is firm on the bottom and almost set on top. Spread tomato mixture evenly over top. Sprinkle with cheese, cover skillet for about 2 minutes, or until cheese starts to melt. Cut into wedges and serve with hot buttered whole wheat toast.

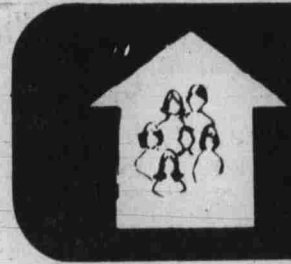
