CITY'S FIRST K-9 UNIT

First K-9 unit commands respect

"Most people are more afraid of one dog than of five policemen," said the Henderson Police Department's K-9 officer. That feeling certainly stacks points in favor of Henderson's first K-9 patrol, but accomplishments of the unit have also been earned.

According to Officer Gary Urbantke, K-9 officer, Apollo, the city's first police dog, has made two arrests in his short career, which began in July of this year.

Urbantke explained that arrests, in Apollo's case, mean stopping a suspect from running. In doing this, Apollo is trained to first apply a mouth grip on the fleeing subject's buttocks. If that doesn't do the trick, Apollo maneuvers to the front of the subject's body where he can really hurt him," said Urbantke.

Although having only two arrests, Apollo's duties have entailed many hours of just looking mean. As Urbantke

noted, just the sight of a police dog can cause more fear in unruly crowds than four or five armed officers.

Although Urbantke said he usually instructs the 20-month old black and white German Shepherd to stay in his vehicle, Apollo is commonly used to watch crowds when there is a large number, for both "officer safety and public safety."

Urbantke said he may then give Apollo the watch command, which means a growl or two now and then. Upon seeing a 100 pound German Shepherd growling and generally looking frightful, "usually (crowds) will calm down.'

During his time of service, Apollo "has been very well accepted by the other officers," pointed out Urbantke, the dog's only handler. In fact, other officers expressed praises for the department's first police

"Apollo makes me feel we have a progressive police

department, and it's a comfort to me to know he's there," said one officer.

Whenever Apollo is actually used in any incident, whether just sitting outside watching as a guard or chasing someone, it is documented, Urbantke said. The K-9 patrol will be coming off its probation in January and the department will be determining its effectiveness.

Chief James Goff and the Henderson Police Department administration will be reviewing Apollo and Urbantke and send any recommendations to City Manager Bob Anselmo.

Urbantke, a three and a half year veteran was instrumental in obtaining a K-9 unit for the city as he submitted a letter to the administration requesting K-9 duty and permission to start a patrol.

altead, Urbantke chose to train with the North Las Vegas K-9 Patrol as they had a smaller department and utilized police dogs similarly to what Henderson would be doing.

During Urbantke's three month training period, he used two dogs before staying with Apollo. Urbantke said his first dog became ill and the second was too gun shy for duty. Apollo turned out to be the one.

Apollo is not a native Nevadan, having come from Bob Biddle's Astro Dog Training in Riverside, Ca. A man working at the training service owned Apollo and saw that he would be good pólice dog material, so he sold him to Urbantke for \$750 a good price, Urbantke noted, for police dogs.

After obtaining Apollo. Urbantke and his canine companion trained with Sergeant Tom Collins of the North Las Vegas Police for a month.

Henderson's first police dog is not just your average. run-of-the-mill German Shepherd. Urbantke smiled and said that Apollo is trained in English, German, Vietnamese and sign language -- a four-language pooch.

The only time Apollo will respond to a situation without any sort of signal is when an aggressive move is made toward Urbantke. Apollo leaps with ease through the open window of the K-9 Unit's specially built, 1983 Dodge Ram blazer, so it would be ill advised for anyone to attempt to strike Urbantke within sight distance of Apollo.

with Apollo and Urbantke one night, it's advised not to make any sort of quick motion. Very friendly while inside the truck with Urbantke, Apollo is quick to become suspicious of anyone outside the truck. After riding two hours with the K-9 unit, Apollo's goodbye was a harp, loud bark.

Urbantke noted, however, that Apollo will bark at his family (the dog actually belongs to Urbantke, who paid with his own money) once his collar is slipped on and he knows it is time for work. A friendly bark is higher pitched.

When Urbantke first bought Apollo, he borrowed \$500 from the Policeman's Association and used \$250 out of his own pocket. Once the program was underway, however, the Kiwanis Club sort of adopted it and now is in the process of trying to pay Urbantke his money back.

After Apollo and the K-9 unit were on duty, the police department began picking up the tab for his food and veterinary bills. Before that, though, Urbantke had to use his own funds.

Although a certified police dog, Apollo and Urbantke constantly trained to keep the animals senses, reflexes and signals in shape, Urbantke said. Just like humans, he noted, dogs are continually learning.

As of now Apollo's abilities include sniffing out marijuana, searching for article's ("dogs can smell anything made by humans," noted Urbantke), and tracking. Urbantke said Apollo is able to take up a scent with or without clothing articles

from the subject.

unit. roving Henderson's K-9 Patrol roams the entire city instead of one area so it is available for all assigned units. Urbantke does not transport suspects arrested, either, in order to be available.

Apollo's hours have been shifted throughout his career so that the department could determine the hours he is most needed, Urbantke poined out.

"It would be ideal to have two dogs," noted Urbantke, as two shifts have proved to be the times Apollo is most needed. Whether the department receives another K-9 police dog will be decided in the future.

As anyone knows, dogs, as well as humans, often have nature calling, to put it in colloquial terms. When this calling affects Apollo, he begins whining and walking up and down the inside of the truck. Urbantke said with a grin. At this point, Urbantke knows what he must do -- stop the truck and let Apollo do his thing.

Though Apollo exhibits a gruff exterior, he is just a big, lovable baby, said Urbantke, while scratching the dog's ear. Urbantke has lived in Henderson with his family since January "She knows some of the commands in German," said Urbantke.

Apollo will respond to signals given by a few other officers, explained Urbantke, if he should ever get injured, but it is obvious that Apollo mainly respects Urbantke. And anyway, who's going to argue with

I think my favorite heroes are still fire-






