In addition, the focus of HUD's investigation, Newburgh director of economic development John Steller, was cleared also from any charges, according to New York State HUD operation division director Joseph Parker.

At contention was the possible misuse of \$350,000 of federal money, specifically a

\$189,000 loan approved by Steller, who then received funds from the same loan as a consultant.

Begun in April, 1984, Parker said the focus of the investigation from the outset was the reimbursement of Steller as a consultant from a company receiving a \$189,000 HUD economic development loan.

Bloomquist said Monday the loan in question was given under HUD's Urban Development Action Grant (UDAG) program to a small, multi-residence developer in Newburgh.

The now Henderson city manager said Newburgh was at the forefront in using HUD funds for economic development and that Steller was hired by him to lead that effort.

"We were the second largest recipient of UDAG funds (in the state) . . . second only to New York City because of his (Steller's) efforts," Bloomquist said Monday.

Bloomquist denied the investigation's serious underpinnings and noted the end of this current probe found the same result of an earlier HUD inquiry into Newburgh that ended in

He said he knew certain Newburgh officials spurred HUD's initial decision to further investigate and those persons had done "serious" harm to the city's revitalization effort.

Henderson's city council was criticized by a Las Vegas newspaper and by some local persons because background check of Bloomquist did not reveal the then ongoing HUD investigation.

A Las Vegas Review Journal article in August, 1984, linked Bloomquist's June, 1983 resignation in Newburgh to the on-going HUD audit and quoted Newburgh councilman Joseph Rossi saying that Bloomquist had been forced to resign.

Bloomquist said at the time he thought the HUD investigation was not serious enough to

bring before interviewers and the council during his job recruitment process for his pre-

A subsequent Henderson-led inquiry into Bloomquist's background after the city manager had been hired cleared him also.

At the time, HUD officials in New York would not confirm or deny Bloomquist as a focus of their investigation. Bloomquist worked in

Newburgh from January, 1981 to June, 1983, the longest term for any city manager in that city for ten years. He then moved to Ketchikan, Alaska, where he again ad-

ministered significant amounts of federal grant dollars, \$20 million in one airport construction project.

He was hired here last August.

## Police investigate Old Vegas fire

"We have not ruled out arson," the detective noted.

Damage was estimated at some \$100,000. MacNeal credits the local fire department and the people in charge of the park when the fire occurred for preventing further damage.

By Katherine E. Scott The jury in the trial of Donald R. Hanes was scheduled to hear closing arguments yesterday after presstime in the District Court courtroom of Judge Carl Christensen.

Hanes was tried last week on two counts of felony driving under the influence stemming from the July 16 deaths of Terry Urbantke and her fiveyear-old son Gregory.

Two counts of possession of a controlled substance for which he was charged during the same incident will be tried separately, according to a woman who has observed the

Karen Keele, secretary for the Clark County chapter of Mothers Against Drunk Driving, has participated in the group's monitoring of the Hanes trial.

She said the Arizona resident's defense was that he could not remember anything beyond leaving the Stardust casino at dawn the same day.

Hanes, represented by Las Vegas attorney Peter Flangas, testified Friday he had been gambling at the Stardust and left when it started getting light about 5 a.m. He awoke after the 1:45 p.m. accident

feeling as if he had been struck by a baseball bat.

Hanes, who told the court he had been on a two week vacation with his new Dodge Caravan, said he had just intended to go home. He suffered an injury to his lip, and a broken left leg.

Testimony from expert witnesses revealed Hanes had left a 76 foot skid mark prior to hitting the Urbantke vehicle. His blood alcohol level was revealed to be .13, above the

legal limit in Nevada.

A Nevada Highway Patrol officer who looked at Hanes' broken leg while he was still in the van noted a beer can he had seen under the seat was open and felt cold when he removed it later. Numerous other beer cans and bottles were also discovered in the van, testimony revealed.

Eyewitnesses included a man who said he was almost hit by Hanes' van when the latter turned north in the southbound lane; and another who

drove parallel to the vehicle, but on the correct side of the highway.

Gary Urbantke, husband and father of the deceased who was driving at the time of the accident, also took the stand. The Henderson Police canine officer was off that day and running errands with the fami-

They were on their way to pick up their nine-year-old daughter at school when Hanes' van crashed into the family's compact car. Terry was killed on impact. Greg died at the hospital while his father's wounds were still being treated.

Urbantke's injuries, including cut tendons, bruised ribs and whiplash, took some three months to heal.

The trial began Wednesday afternoon, following jury selection on Tuesday. Testimony continued all day Thursday and Friday. The jury was scheduled to hear instructions yesterday morning before closing arguments.

## Public Service Commission to hear energy case

The Public Service Commission has rescheduled for Friday. May 17, a public hearing on an application by Nevada Power Company for a deferred energy rate adjustment. The hearing is scheduled at 9:30 a.m. in the PSC office in the Bradley Building at Sahara and Atlantic.

If approved, the average

residential customer's bill will increase three percent or \$1.90 per month for a six month period starting June 1, 1985.

The total application is for \$5,409,123. This amount represents expenses for fuel and purchased power not collected in rates during the September 1984-February 1985 period.

Nevada Power's application is its 13th deferred energy filing. Under this procedure, electric utility companies in Nevada must submit an application every six months to either increase or decrease electric rates because of the changes in fuel costs over the previous six month period. The adjustment permits the utility to charge customers for the actual cost of fuel with the result that the increase has no effect on the utility's earnings. In the 12 months ending February 28, 1985, Nevada Power's total fuel and purchasing power costs exceeded \$126 million.



## Colorado River runoff forecast increases slightly

The forecasted April-July Colorado River runoff is now 10.8 million acre-feet, or 145 percent of normal, Bureau of Reclamation Regional Director Bill Plummer announced today.

Plummer based his comments on the May 7 final forecast issued by the Colorado. Basin River Forecast Center in Salt Lake City, Utah, which reported that a wet April in the Rocky Mountain watershed of the Colorado River has increased the forecasted runoff from the previous 138 percent level.

Although April inflows into Lake Powell are the second

highest on record, Plummer said there did not appear to be any likelihood this year of damaging flood control releases being necessary. He explained that higher than average forecasts earlier this year have provided an opportunity to create additional storage space in the Colorado River system to the extent that a sufficient amount exists to adequately control the forecasted inflow without difficulty.

Releases from Hoover, Davis, and Parker Dams are now in the range of 19,000 -21,000 cubic feet per second (cfs). With the present forecast, this release level is expected to be increased to the 22,000-24,000 cfs range by early June and be maintained throughout the summer.

Although spillways at both Davis and Parker Dams will be used intermittently this summer, Lake Mead elevations are expected to peak about 10 feet below the top of the raised spillway gates at Hoover Dam.

Plummer pointed out that because of unseasonably warm weather during April, the runoff started early and is expected to peak a few weeks earlier than in recent years.

Tuma led the race until the final lap when he was passed by eventual winner Ernest Collins of Western and second-place finisher Todd Murphy of McQueen.





# YOUR GARDEN

**Caring For Your Roses** By Carl Totemier Member, The American Horticultural Society

Is everything coming up roses in your flower garden? These popular flowers bloom in abundance from early summer until frost arrives in the fall, if well-tended. Here are tips to help your rose garden



Transplanting roses? Exerts say transplanting old bushes is advisable only on a limited scale. Transplant in the fall and take as much soil as possible with the roots.


\*Roses are heavy feeders, so remember that fertilizer is the key to vigorous and productive plants. An established rose benefits from fertilizer application when it is pruned in the spring. Plants from which roses have been cut also need extra-nutrients so that the new flowers can develop. Re-apply fertilizer when the new buds become visible.

\*Dry fertilizers are difficult to apply with accuracy and slow to take effect. Many gardeners use a water soluble fertilizer such as Stern's Miracle-Gro All Purpose Plant Food. Already dissolved when applied, it allows quick penetration to the roots and rapid absorption into the plant. Miracle-Gro also feeds through the leaves.

\*Do not fertilize during the six weeks prior to frost in cold climate regions. This allows the plant to mature so that it will be less susceptible to winter injury.


