Medicare changes admission policy, establishes strict criteria

By Scott Dickensheets Major changes in the hospital ealth care field have resulted from recent revisions in the Medicare program, and according to St. Rose de Lima officials, they have had an immense impact on patient admissions.

Recent letters to the Home News have criticized St. Rose de Lima for not admitting certain patients. According to St. Rose de Lima acting administrator Dan Tar-

water, the hospital has no admission policy of its own. All admissions are handled by staff physicians, who follow admissions guidelines set by the patient's insurance carrier.

The hospital merely provides

the facilities.

In the case of Medicare, strict criteria have been established concerning the severity of a patient's ailment and the intensity of the care they will need.

In other words, Medicare patients must exhibit certain symptoms and vital signs before they can be admitted, and they must

also require a certain level of treatment.

"It's a first step towards cost containment and accountability," said Dr. George Baird, emergency room director at St. Rose.

He said that the new policy is intended to eliminate the blank check situation of a few years ago, in which a Medicare patient could

check into a hospital for a couple weeks for a minor ailment, and the hospital could bill it to Medicare,

expecting nearly 100 percent reimbursement. "People used to come in with an

earache and ask to be admitted," said Tarwater. "Now they have to realize that they can have that earache at home, and expect it to

get well there, without billing Medicare."

According to Baird, the new standards have resulted in a grey area of patients that the doctors might want to admit, but who don't meet the admittance criteria.

Historic drug raids yield probation sentences

By Katherine E. Scott Only one of the alleged drug dealers arrested in Henderson last summer during the city's largest coordinated arrest effort is serving time in Nevada State Prison.

The remaining 13 individuals were placed on probation, according to police. The last person was sentenced in June, nearly a year after the majority were arrested.

Henderson police, wanting to "make an impression" on the city's drug dealers, concluded an extensive investigation July 18, 1984 with two strike teams heading out to serve arrest warrants.

Four officers from the State of Nevada Division of Investigations and Narcotics aided in the investigation and took part in the raids on suspects' homes.

Drugs confiscated in the raids included heroin, marijuana, methamphetamine (speed) and cocaine, according to Henderson police detective John Williams.

Williams mentioned recently there was "quite a bit of heroin, that's the most of what we bought" during the investigation. He added the quality was "almost pure opium."

Ten people were arrested the first day, with warrants served on four others shortly thereafter.

Williams described the effort a "very successful operation. It put a crimp in the heroin traffic in Henderson."

He explained the majority of those arrested received probation mainly "because of lack of prior records." The courts

routinely place first-time drug offenders on probation.

Willie Lee Edwards, Jr., 29. was sentenced April 12 to five years in Nevada State Prison on one count of possession of a controlled substance. He was originally charged with two counts of sales of a controlled substance. One charge was dismissed while the other was reduced.

David Johnson, 34, was sentenced Nov. 14 to three years in Nevada State Prison, which was suspended, and placed on three years probation, on one count of conspiricy to sell a controlled substance. A charge of sales of a controlled substance was dismissed.

will make for the nation's first high-level radioactive materials dump.

At the Westinghouse-Northern Arizona University Energy Seminar for Media Professionals July 20 in Page, Ariz., Western Electric consultant-Robert E. Olson said primarily because of political factors, secondly technical concerns, Nevada's Yucca Mountain proposed site would be last on a list of three to store high-level nuclear waste from throughout the country.

Olson said the current waste area in Hanford, Wash., was responding positively toward the idea of being the nation's nuclear waste repository, and that he expected because of that, it would be the first selected.

Should another site be needed 40 or 50 years later, he said Deaf Smith County, Texas, again had the preference, however, this time it is for technical reasons.

At the salt repository in Texas, Olson said, dump overseers would only have to worry about keeping the area dry. Seismic action would have little effect on that site, because of the "self-healing" properties of salt, meaning that if it does crack it can quickly solidify again.

Geologically speaking, Nevada's "tough" (solidified volcanic ash) storage may be the best outside of seismic considerations.

But with the possibility that frequent California tremors could crack the "tough" scientists are willing to depend on salt over ash.

Council considers flood planning consultant

Henderson City Council will consider an engineering firm to develop the city's flood drainage plan at their recessed regular meeting Tuesday.

City engineer Mark T. Calhoun submitted a list of four firms ranked by a review committee after oral presentations July 10.

The firms, in order of

preference, are James M. Montgomery Consulting Engineers, Inc., Black and Veatch, Engineers, Architect URS Engineers and Boyle Engineering Corporation.

Council previously authorized up to \$100,000 for a master drainage plan.

The interview committee selecting the firms was made up of Calhoun, city manager Gary Bloomquist, public works director Goeffrey Billingsley, building superintendant Ron Maynock, John Murchie from the city of North Las Vegas and Dennis Bectel from Clark County Comprehensive Planning.

According to Calhoun, following Council's authoriza-

tion to enter into negotiations each firm will be considered in order of their ranking.

"Should negotiations fail with the first firm, negotiations will then commence with the second firm and so on," he stated.

On Tuesday Council will also consider approval of an unspecified amount of sewer refund bonds and a \$40,000 change order for the wastewater treatment plant.

In addition, two \$25,000 professional services awards will be considered, as well as two street paving contracts totalling more then \$55,000.

The recessed regular meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday in Council Chambers at City Hall. The public is invited to attend.

Unfortunately, a patient not admitted can have a change of condition in a matter of seconds. This may explain the recent criticisms of the hospital, in the form of letters to the Home News, that refused admission allegedly led to the death of one person and the anger of another as her father was not admitted.

"There is still an area of subjectivity," he said. Tarwater added that hospitals may face Medicare sanctions if they admit too many of those grey area patients.

"They can very easily say that since you admitted those patients that we didn't want you to admit,

we're not going to give you any more Medicare money."

Long-time local tells of California fires

former owner of Randall's Piano Emporium July 5--In light of what is now, hopefully, history, and in response to the calls of concern and worry, we're fine and the people of Ojai are okay

During the last five days, the news reports going out to the country regarding the fire here, were essentially very accurate.

But there's no way they could truly reflect what has happened here. Through the no less than heroic efforts of all the firefighters, police, and residents themselves there were no lives lost, and only minimal structural damage (one trailer, one garage, a small number of outbuildings, and approximately eight or nine homes total.

There were times when the fires surrounded Ojai and Meiners Oaks on three sides and it is only a miracle that homes literally surrounded by flames were saved entirely, and often by only the residents themselves, as it was impossible, try as they did, for firefighters and equipment to reach them in time.

As it was, God did indeed help them who helped themselves.

And there is no opinion in Ojai today that anyone was let down by the firefighters.

Only by superhuman effort was so much saved by so few.

Tuesday night, when the winds picked up, there was so much fire, in so many locations, and all moving at frightening speed, it was more than they could do to move from one location to another.

I doubt if the inner workings of a work force of this magnitude will be fully understood by those of us not involved, but the result is astounding.

The bleak landscape surrounding the houses around Ojai is humbling, yet they remain.

And the fact also remains that those whose homes were directly threatened survived and saved their homes by fighting.

They did not leave it up to someone else, for at times there wasn't anyone available.

They have a right to be proud.

Such as the 69-year-old man who, after evacuating his wife and animals, went back and utilizing a gas generator, pump, and two 5,500-gal. tanks (foresight!) fought valiantly and saved his home, which was completely surrounded by flames, although help simply could not reach him.

And my own nephew, who lost an entire orchard, did manage to save his home, his barn and a trailer, with the help of the Forest Service, by digging in and fighting hard. The stories are countless.

And thank God for the borate-bombers and the water-drop helicopters.

From sunup to sundown they made the difference.

And after five days the fire is still moving.

The threat to us here directly is over now, but we will never again ake for granted what it means to be close to something like this. On another, sadder, note, while the spirit of comaraderie was strong among those who were evacuated during the night and those who banded together to fight the fire, there was a strange, frenetic disruptive factor throughout the valley this week...the spectators.

Please Stay Home ... There's nothing you can do but get in the way or cause trouble ... stay home and wait for reports on television or radio, but please stay out of the way.

Emergency personnel have a hard enough job without fighting you for the road.

In my opinion, in the event of a fire or disaster of this magnitude, martial law should be instituted at the onset.

All police agencies would then at least be able to enforce laws eliminating onlookers, looters and arsonists who are, for some perverse reason, drawn to these scenes.

So, for now, those of you who have friends and family here in Ojai, everyone is fine and thankful today.
