Laxalt, dignitaries attend Chamber's 40th anniversary bash

The rest of the state might have suffered a lack of important people last Wednesday evening, but not Henderson. Dignitaries were piled on top of dignitaries at the Henderson

Convention Center as the city's Chamber of Commerce celebrated 40 years of service to the community.

Special guest at the \$20-perplate dinner was Senator Paul Laxalt.

Also attending were Gov.

Richard Bryan, state Attorney General Brian McKay, sheriff John Moran and a horde of other politicians and businessmen including officials from Gold Bond Ice Cream and Hanes (Co.).

"The fact is, you have done

wonders here in Henderson," Laxalt told the audience of 226 in a brief after-dinner speech. He went on to favorably compare Henderson's efforts to crawl out from under the shadow of Las Vegas to Car-
