

# Twenty-foot tower may be planted in Section 27

A use permit to allow a microwave receiving dish near Section 27 will be considered by the Henderson planning Commission when it meets Thursday night at 7 p.m. in the City Hall.

Misco Inc. a cable television company, is seeking approval of their plan to erect a 12-foot diameter dish on a site about one-half mile northeast of the nearest Section 27 homes. According to city planning department sources, the dish will sit 20 feet above ground and will

be painted desert tan. The Henderson Police Department's new transmitter tower is also in that area. A California company, Central Real Estate Ltd., is seeking an amendment to the land use policy plan segment of Henderson's comprehensive

plan. They wish to change the recommended land use on 40 acres in Green Valley from a residential designation to a light industry business park classification. The site lies east of Mountain Vista Road, at Ramroad Avenue. Another request comes from

California this week: M. Robb Davis of California is asking for a use permit to allow construction and operation of a recreational vehicle park on the northwest corner of Merlayne and Ward Drives in Pittman. The Church of God at 519 Pueblo in Henderson is seek-

ing a use permit and an architectural review. The church is currently in a RR (rural residential) zone and the use permit would bring their zoning into compliance with city ordinances. The architectural review is for a proposed expansion of the building.

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## City wants fed money for railroad line

State officials have applied for federal railroad funds on Henderson's behalf, in order to obtain money to upgrade the section of railroad track running through town.

They are asking for a grant of \$335,000 to replace ties, improve trestles and add a turnaround. The money is available under the Local Rail Assistance Act.

This action is a prologue to the city's effort to take over operation of the track from the state Department of Museums.

According to city economic development director Ann Barron, the state has approached the city about assuming control of the track. The only other state-owned track is a museum piece in Northern Nevada. According to Barron, their experience does not lie in running freight lines like the Henderson track.

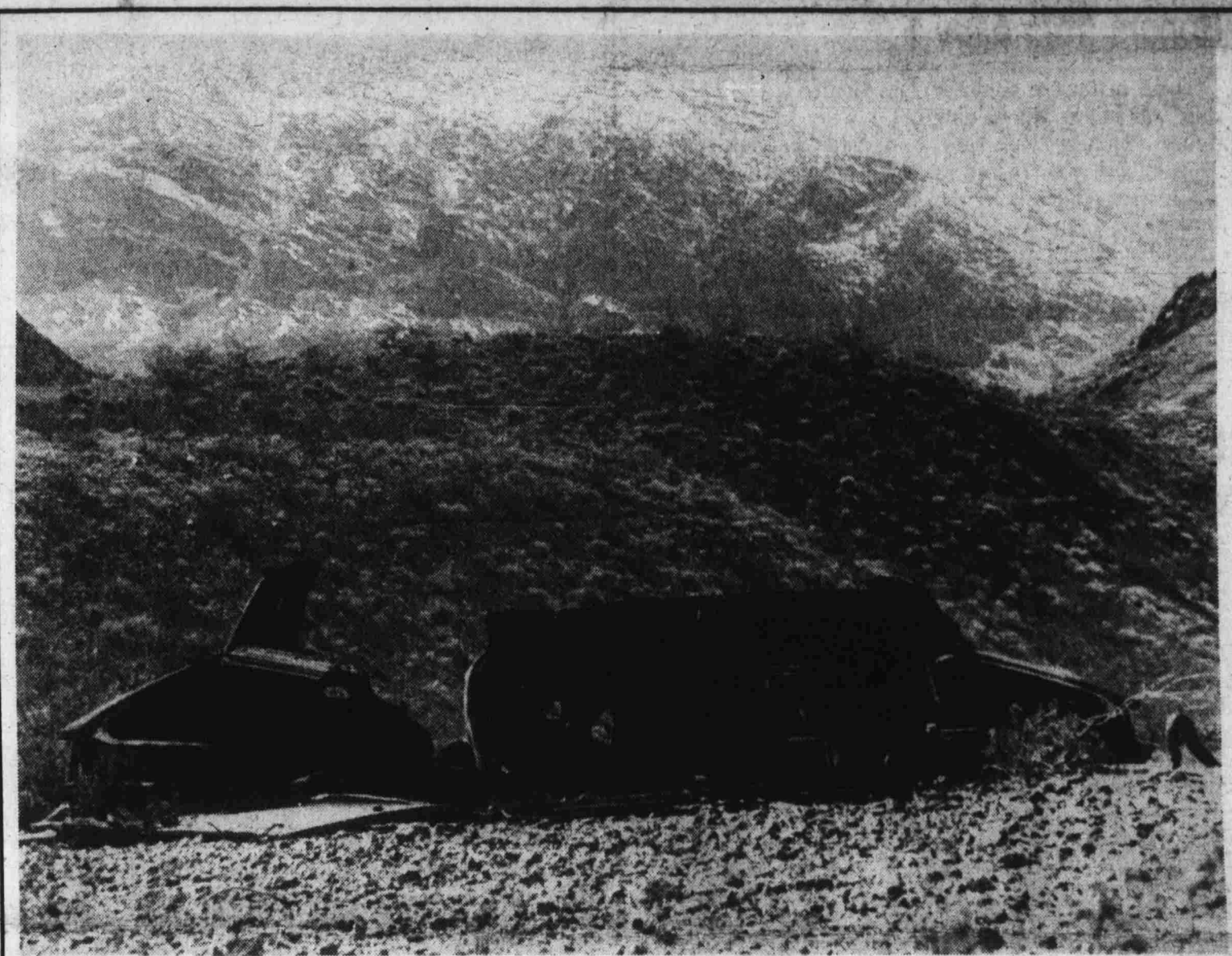
Legislation is currently before state lawmakers to give Henderson authority to own

and operate a railroad. Barron said she expects legislation to be introduced this session to turn the track over to Henderson. The city Department of Public Works will have maintenance responsibility for the track.

On the question of liability, Barron pointed out that under the current agreement with the state, Henderson already assumes some liability.

The Federal Railroad Administration has already awarded some rail grants, but Barron said more grants are expected. Federal sources, she said, indicate that Henderson's request is high on the priority list. City officials will meet with federal railroad people when they journey to Washington D.C. this week for the National Congress of Cities.

Barron said the track is operable now, but the improvements are needed for it to stay that way. Also, a turnaround—which simply allows the train to turn around—is included in the funding request.

## DUI killer gets maximum sentence

A Las Vegas man convicted of felony drunken driving in the June 15 death of a Henderson man received the maximum sentence allowable in Clark County District Court last week.

Twenty-year-old Rodney L. Fleming was pronounced dead at the scene where he was struck by a 1985 Dodge pickup truck about 8 p.m. that Sunday. He had been riding his bicycle near Railroad Pass in training for a triathlon.

Everett J. White on Thurs-

day received a 20-year prison term and was fined \$5,000 by District Court Judge Stephen Huffaker.

White's blood alcohol level was noted to be .28 shortly after he struck Fleming from behind in southbound lane of Boulder Highway. In Nevada,

.10 is the minimum level intoxication to be legally drunk.

Police noted at the time that White, 37, had left the side of the roadway and corrected before striking the young man's bicycle on the paved shoulder.

Fleming's parents were in the courtroom for the sentencing.

As we celebrate the bicentennial of the United States Constitution, researchers find the great-grandchildren of our revolutionary forefathers know little of their work, the basis of American government and individual rights accorded to citizens.

A survey of the American people by the Hearst Corporation attempted to measure Constitutional knowledge. It revealed some embarrassing facts.

The worst survey result found that when presented with other alternatives, 46 percent of Americans believed the Constitution was created for some other purpose than establishing the federal government and determining its powers.

Fifty nine percent of the nation does not know what the Bill of Rights is. More than that percentage have mistaken beliefs about the Constitution, such as it designating English as the country's official language.

What's more troubling is that a reticence to change the founding document among those most familiar with it is not shared by majority of Americans.

For the third consecutive year, Burkholder has been named one of four Nevada nominees for the US Department of Education's secondary school recognition program. "Always a bridesmaid, never a bride," said principal Frank Lamping with a laugh.

"After a review of applications submitted from throughout our state, your school was selected as one that exemplifies excellence in education," wrote Eugene Paslov, state superintendent of public instruction, in a letter to Lamping.

The nominations were carefully scrutinized in three major categories: attributes of success, continuity of success and indicators of success. "The

# Local man charged with battering police officers

A 30-year-old Henderson man was arrested Feb. 20 for assaulting three policemen after using a six-foot steel bar to smash up the inside of his house.

Kenneth Ian McMenemy was charged with three counts of battery on a police officer and two charges involving interference with police.

Henderson Police officer Fred Thompson reported that "while enroute (to the address on Navarre) officers were advised that some of the occupants of that residence had violent past histories and had previously injured officers in

combative situations."

Thompson and officers Robert Priscaro and Geoffrey Nestor were met by 58-year-old Alexander McMenemy who said his son "was out of control inside."

The officers "could hear a male yelling inside the residence and the sounds of items being broken, smashed, or otherwise destroyed."

They heard a crash as the bar tore two large holes in the wall of the house near the door, according to police reports. The officers watched as a two-foot section of steel pipe about two-inches in diameter was "being withdrawn through one of the

holes back into the residence."

After hearing someone "running, more items being broken, and then doors slamming," Thompson stated the three officers entered the house.

Police found McMenemy upstairs, at the end of a hallway lined on one side by a wrought-iron rail bordering a drop to the living room.

When McMenemy refused to put down the bar "officers present drew their sidearms and drew down on Kenneth McMenemy, again ordering him to drop the steel bar," Officer Thompson reported.

After about a minute, Thompson said McMenemy put down

the bar and the officers returned the firearms to their holsters. But as they attempted to handcuff and arrest McMenemy on charges of resisting officers and not immediately complying with them, "he swung at officer Priscaro."

Thompson reported that "during the struggle (he) tried several times to push officers onto and over the wrought iron railing."

McMenemy was subdued within four minutes. After police put him in the squad car they secured his feet with flexi-cuffs to prevent him from battering the officers.

21, of Henderson, was arrested Feb. 23 for embezzlement. Bail was set at \$3,000.

Mark Steven Rader, 34, of Las Vegas was arrested Feb. 20 for burglary and attempted forgery. Bail was set at \$5,000 for each charge.

Mary Susan Rader Stewart, 39, of Las Vegas, also known as Mary Susan Schlapkohl, was arrested Feb. 20 for burglary, forgery and possession of a controlled substance. Bail was set at \$5,000 for the first two charges and \$3,000 for the last.

Richard George Kiely Jr., 31, of Las Vegas was arrested Feb. 19 for forgery and possession of stolen property. Bail was set

at \$10,000 for the first charge and \$2,000 for the second.

Michael Paul Vargo, 18, of Henderson was arrested Feb. 18 on four charges of auto theft, two counts of attempted burglary and for possession of instruments with burglarious intent.

Bail was set at \$5,000 for each of the auto theft and attempted burglary charges and \$2,500 for the instrument charge. Total bail was \$32,500.

Patrick Kevin Montgomery, 29, of Henderson was arrested Feb. 17 on a felony warrant from the California Department of Corrections. No bail was set.

"Sixty one percent said they thought a constitutional convention should be convened to address the modern issues of prayer in public schools, abortion and other, primarily first amendment, issues (religious, speech, assembly and press rights).

And we wonder why half of our citizens don't vote? Apparently, nearly that number cannot tell what makes America different from any other democracy, perhaps any other system.

How does the society teach or train knowledgeable citizens? Our school system seems to have mastered teaching obedience among the future citizenry. Is asking the system to produce a majority of civic-minded persons too great a task?

Schools certainly could, and some do, teach the civic skills: speech, debate, ethics, and fundamentally reading, writing and

thinking.

How does society motivate a citizen to participate in his government? It has become the dilemma of modern democracy, in the absence of coercion, less than a majority of those eligible vote.

Some democracies fine those who don't vote, in others political divisions are so sharp that clear economic interests spur citizens to vote.

The historical reprisal for non-voting was disenfranchisement, taking away the voting privilege from those who would not use or abused their right. Sometimes only a few were disenfranchised, usually all suffered from an apathetic majority, because such a populace is subject to subversion and authoritarian rule.

Our constitution has provisions prohibiting disenfranchisement of any group; but in the greatest right it gives, the seeds

of apathy are sown.

Blacks have struggled for their voting rights, free from procedural and discriminatory rules practiced by some states and localities.

Others have rested in the assured knowledge that no one can or will say they cannot participate. Believe me, have they rested!

The lack of constitutional knowledge is one of the effects of this slumber. What makes American government unique? Less than half the country can give you the correct answer.

As we celebrate the anniversary of this founding document, the cornerstone of our society, we all need to make a commitment to learn more about it, if only to realize our own efforts are only a small source of our present freedom and wealth.

## Basic ROTC participates in state competition

The cadets of Basic High School's Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer's Training Corps defended their state title on Feb. 21. This year the meet was held at Reed High School in Sparks.

Reed had dominated this meet for nine years until Basic entered the competition in 1982. Since then Basic has been the state champion three of five years, with Eldorado winning the odd year.

Basic, the only Marine JROTC unit in Nevada, entered three teams in this meet, color guard, unarmed drill team and armed drill team. Each team competed in three events, inspection phase, regulation drill and exhibition drill.

During the inspection phase, each cadet was inspected by an active member of the armed forces. Each uniform was thoroughly checked over and any minor discrepancy cost the team points.

The cadets were also asked questions on chain of command, general orders and drill. The second phase of the competition is regula-

tion drill. Coordinators of the competition prescribed a sequence of drill movements and each team was given a limited area and time to complete the sequence. Teams were judged on their execution of movements and precisions.

The final phase of team competition was exhibition drill. Each team was given a specific time to perform a routine of their own creation limited only by their imagination.

The color guard, commanded by Cadet First Michelle Minear, did extremely well in the competition placing second in inspection and first in both regulation and exhibition.

Commanded by Cadet First Lieutenant Rhonda Ashley, the unarmed drill team, the largest team in Nevada, placed first in inspection and regulation. The armed drill team, commanded by Cadet Lieutenant Colonel Ramon Hopkins, after facing a few setbacks placed second in all three events.

Each commander, also, was judged on their knowledge, military bearing, proper commands, command voice and hand-

ing of their teams. Cadet Lieutenant Colonel Ramon Hopkins of Basic was selected as Nevada's best commander.

Two cadets from each school competed in the rifle twirl off. The cadets were permitted one minute to perform an exhibition routine within a three-foot area. Cadet Major Autenrieth of Basic shared his first place title with a long time friend from Reed High School, Cadet Lieutenant Commander Roy

Adams. Cadet GySergeant Keith Casas of Basic was only seven points behind the two leaders.

The Basic teams will compete at the Las Vegas Convention Center on March 7 to defend their district title against Chapparel, Eldorado, Rancho and Western High School JROTC drill teams.

## Disasterous third quarter dooms Lady Wolves in zone tournament

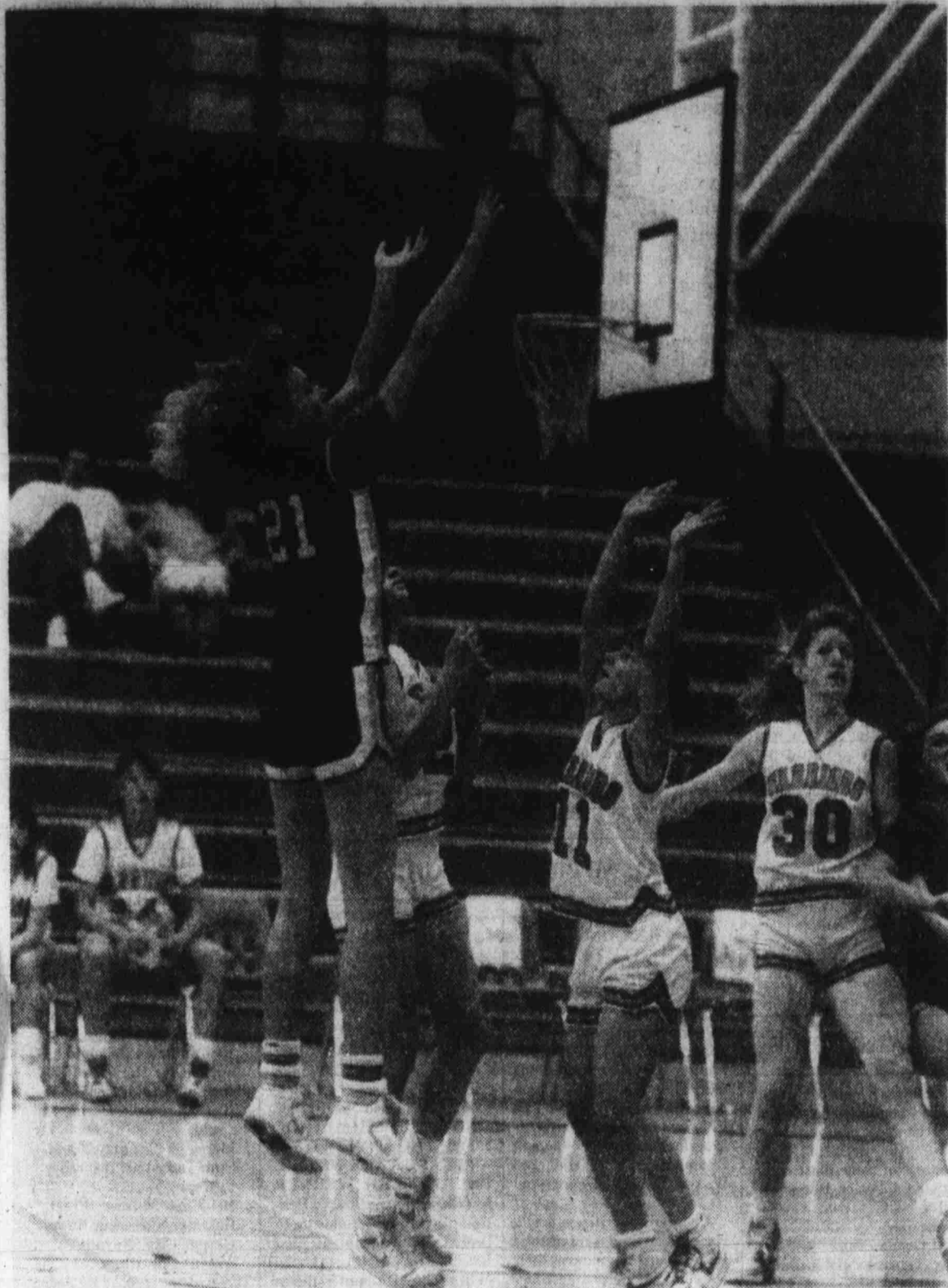

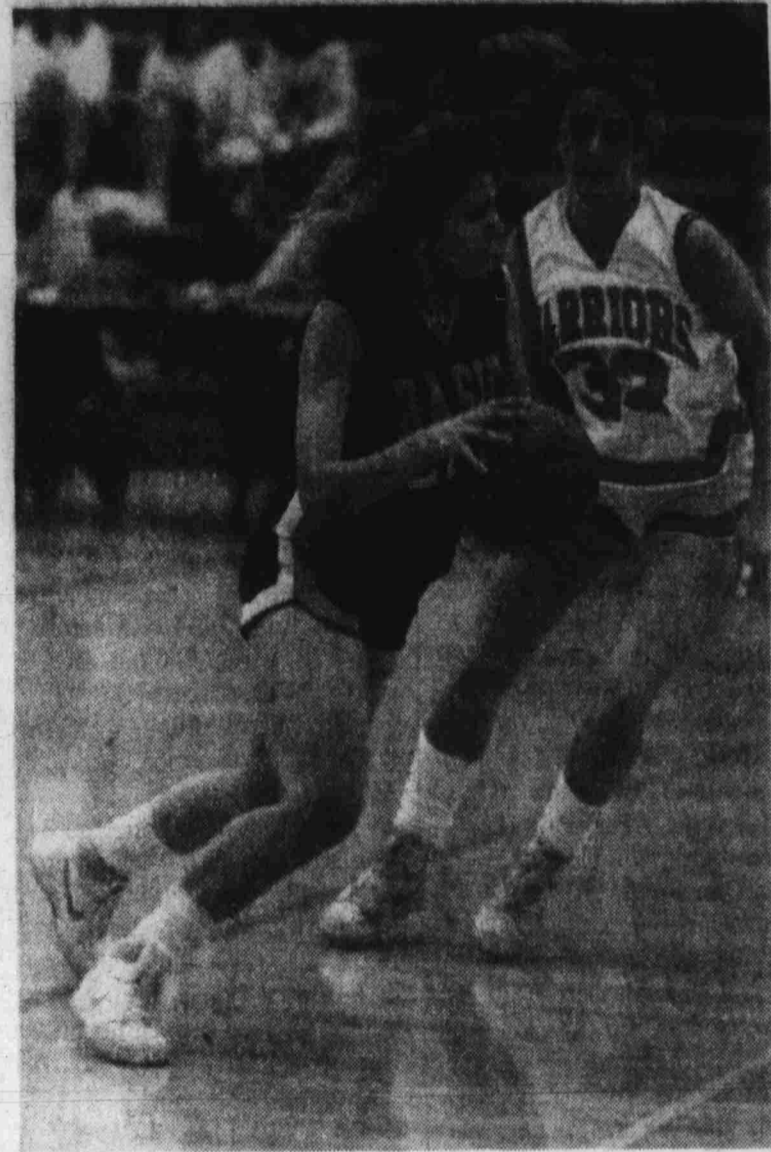

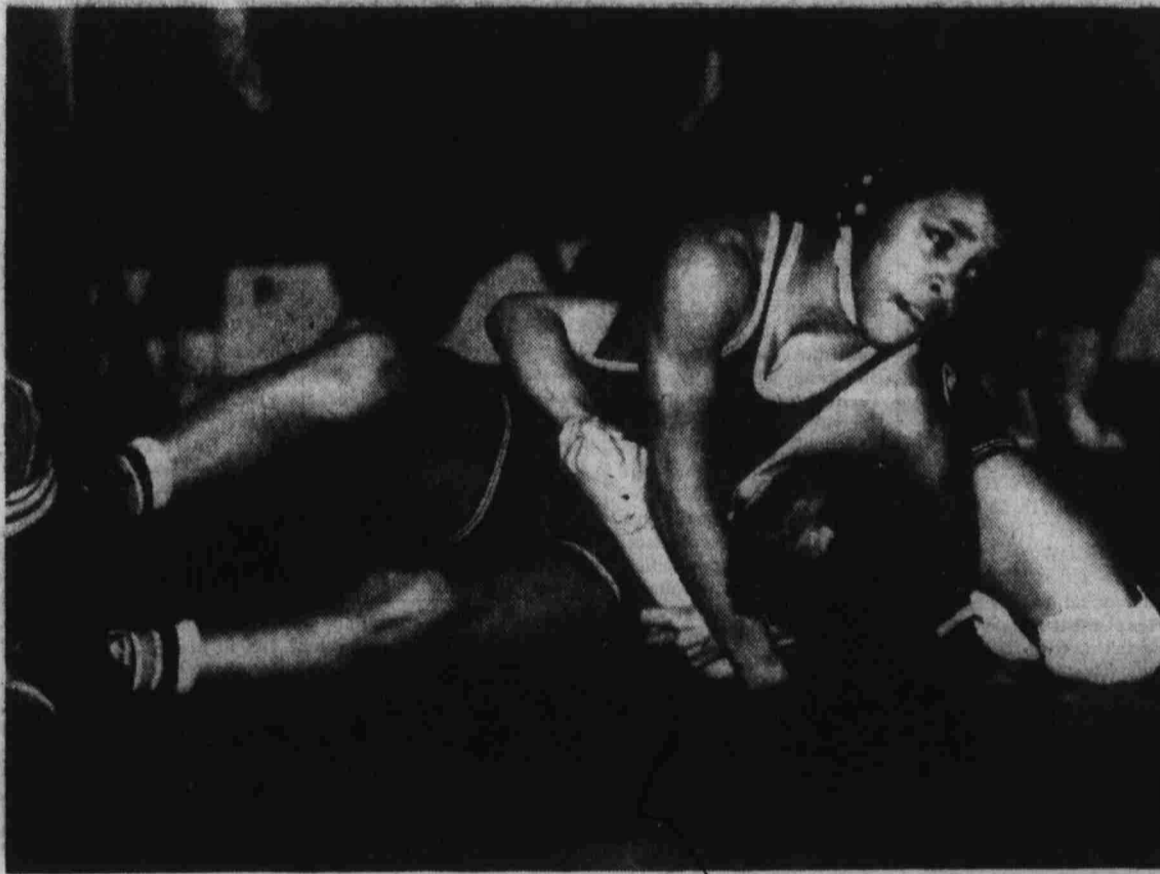
