Old Vegas plans to be reviewed

The Henderson City Council tonight will consider an architectural review and use permit to allow limited gaming and a limited gaming liquor operation at Old Vegas.

The council is scheduled to meet at 4:30 p.m. in Council Chambers, City Hall, 240 Water St.

The applicant, Focus 2000, intends to re-open the Old Vegas Fort facility, including a restaurant and casino. All existing buildings will remain in nearly identical size, design and layout, but will be refurbished and landscaping will be added.

Included in the use permit application is an overall master plan for the 127-acre site. After the fort is re-opened, the applicant intends to add as many as three hotel and casino sites, three truck and recreation vehicle centers and possibly a factory outlet mall.

Old Vegas has been closed since 1986.

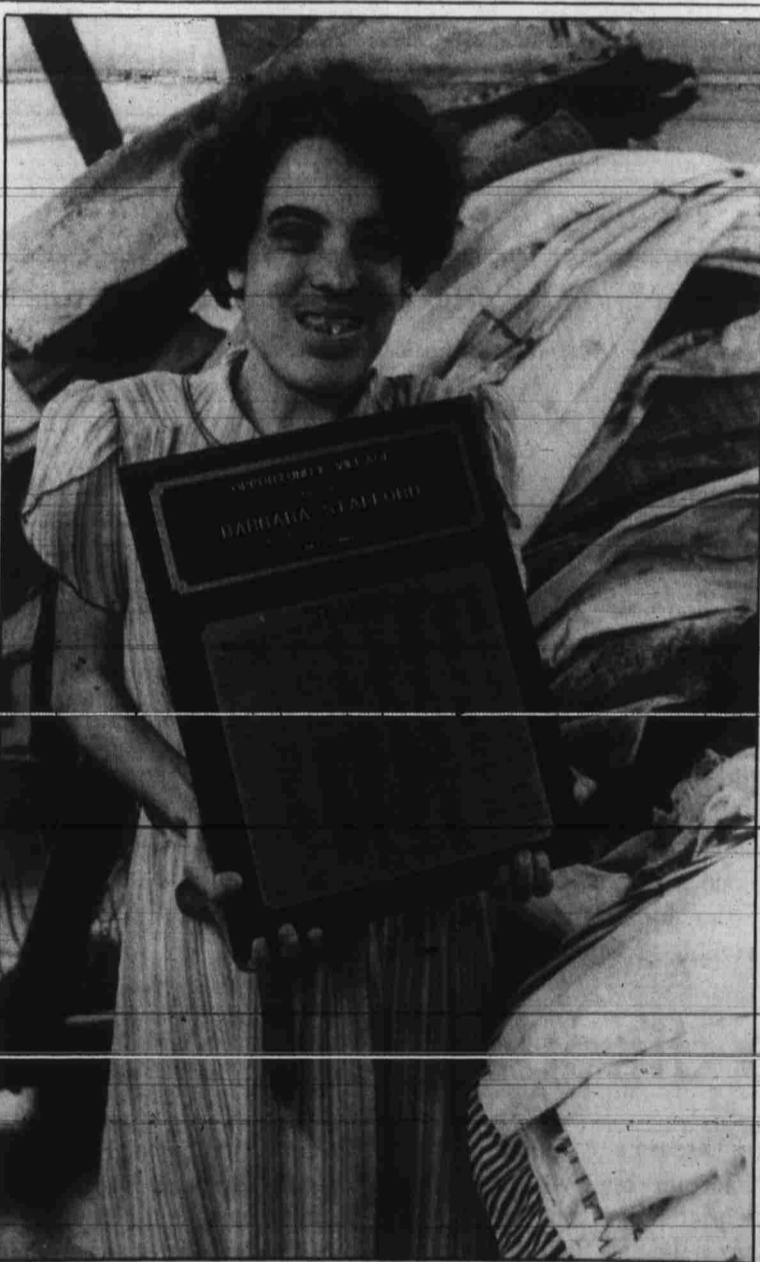
In other business, the council will consider an ordinance which adds administrative guidelines to the Water Allocation Ordinance.

The guidelines deal with late applications, criteria for placement on the water deferral list and a schedule for council reconsideration of deferred water service applications.

Homeowners discuss Old Vegas, LIDs

Questions over the Old Vegas site and whether residents in the River Mountain neighborhood are being forced into participating in a Local Improvement District (LID) were abundant during the area's homeowners' association meeting Wednesday at Fay Galloway Elementary School.

Representatives from Focus 2000, formerly MarCor Development, presented plans to clean-up and re-open the "old fort" as a commercial site with gaming. Focus 2000 representatives also outlined a plan to re-align Boulder Highway behind the site, effectively cutting the entire property into half.

Bob O'Neil, Focus 2000 executive director of property development, told the audience of more than 75 that plans for the remaining property, approximately 80 acres, have not been set.

He added that the reason for Focus 2000's involvement with the homeowners' association is to promote a working relationship. Residents and the company's planning staff should work together to create acceptable uses for the remaining property, O'Neil said.

It was noted, however, that

conceptual plans for a recreation vehicle park and additional gaming facilities have been filed with the city of Henderson Planning Department. Focus 2000 representatives said that conceptual plans are just that, "conceptual" and that the only thing that is set is the re-opening of the Old Vegas site.

O'Neil focused the company's presentation on the positive aspects of opening the fort as well as the improvements being planned for the existing buildings.

"We get 100 people a day stopping by and looking at the site," O'Neil said. "The 'Old Vegas' site really survives itself.

People are interested."

Focus 2000 hopes to renovate the buildings, bringing them "up to code" and re-open at the same time the U.S. 95 (Henderson expressway) extension is completed.

The property, which runs northeast along Boulder Highway, is "hard-zoned" in a CC-G (community commercial with gaming enterprise overlay) district. With the CC-G zoning in place, Focus 2000 said, the remaining property's future will most likely be commercial of some type.

Man pleads guilty to lewdness charges

Sexual assault counts to be dropped

A Henderson man arrested in May for the sexual assaults of several young girls is scheduled for sentencing on July 27 after pleading guilty to three counts of lewdness with a minor, according to Clark County District Court.

Joseph Lanson, 66, who lived in the Highland Village Apartments on Taylor Street, was originally charged with four counts of sexual assault and six counts of lewdness with a minor under the age of 14, police said.

Six victims ranged in age from 3 to 7, HPD Detective Nick Roble said. He said Lanson reportedly enticed the girls into his apartment using candy and toys.

In a plea bargain arrangement, Lanson pleaded guilty on June 29 to three counts of lewdness with a minor, according to District Court records. All other charges are to be dismissed when he appears for

sentencing by District Court Judge Lee Gates in Department 8.

The records state that the prosecuting attorney agreed to make no recommendations whether the sentences should run concurrently or consecutively when Lanson is sentenced later this month. Whether he may be eligible for probation will depend on the outcome of a psychological examination, according to court records.

Lanson was arrested on May 4 after one of the girls told her mother what happened, Roble said. Further investigation revealed six victims, he said, adding the incidents occurred over a period lasting at least several months.

In addition, he said Lanson's 28-year-old stepdaughter informed police that she had been molested over a period of about seven years, beginning when she was 9 years old.

Teen's suicide threat ends peacefully after shooting

An unemployed Valley View neighborhood teenager was arrested after shooting through his bedroom wall following a family fight about 12:15 p.m. Wednesday, Henderson police reported.

Richard Luke Famam, 19, was charged with discharging a firearm where people may be endangered, police said. According to police, bullets from Famam's .22 caliber rifle penetrated the wall of the residence, exiting into the neighborhood on Fullerton Street.

Famam threatened to commit

suicide after the shots were fired, police said.

"Police quickly cordoned off the area while dispatchers attempted to get Mr. Famam's wife and child to leave the residence," stated an HPD news release.

Famam's wife and their 18-month-old baby were able to leave without resistance from Famam, police said. A police negotiator then talked with Famam, who surrendered about 12:45 p.m., according to police.

Famam was booked in Henderson City Jail with bail set at \$2,500, police said.

Shots fired into home may be gang-related

Henderson police are seeking suspects in a possible gang-related shooting in the Pittman neighborhood last week.

Officers were called to an apartment on Sunset Circle shortly before midnight Thursday after several shots were fired through a window, HPD Detective Lt. Tommy Thompson said Monday.

Thompson said nobody was injured during the shooting. He said the victim was a 17-year-old youth who may have had connections with the Compton, Calif., "Tortilla Flats" gang before

moving here some two years ago.

Investigating officers were unable to locate any suspects in the area, according to a news release issued after the incident. At least one possible suspect had a valid alibi, Thompson said.

He said it is possible the shooting was not gang-related, but said police believe it did involve either gang members, associates, or "wannabe's."

Of equal importance to River Mountain homeowners was the question of a new ordinance recently passed by the Henderson City Council that requires off-site improvements to be installed. Off-site improvements include any combination of pavement, curbs, gutters, sidewalks and street lights. Other improvements include sewer and water hook-ups which must be brought across the face of the lot in order for the next lot owner to continue the process.

The ordinance requires anyone seeking a new building permit to construct off-site improvements before the permit is issued. Some residents were concerned that requiring improvements on an individual lot basis would create "patchwork" pavement throughout the neighborhood. Others cited the ordinance as a way to make an LID creation look like a better alternative than patchworking.

Councilmen Andy Hafen and Lorin L. William were on hand

with Public Works Director Mark Calhoun, Chief Planner Bill Smith and other city staffers to explain the ordinance.

Williams said the ordinance's intent was not to force homeowners in the River Mountain neighborhood into choosing between patchwork improvements or an LID, but rather to stop homebuilders in Henderson from circumventing their responsibilities as developers.

"We have never forced an LID. I truly believe the council will defer off-sites when you come in," Williams said referring to the option of asking the council for a deferment of off-site improvements.

Hafen agreed, adding that he "does not believe the intent of the resolution is to require someone in Section 27 to put in full off-site improvements if they come in for a building permit."

Despite the assurances, resi-

dents noted that the deferrals of off-site improvements will be conditioned as the City Council sees fit. Williams refuted the argument, saying that the "deferments will most likely be until an LID is developed."

He added that LIDs are brought forth as a citizens' project and are not forced or required by the city. The process of creating an LID starts with a citizens' petition in favor of some types of improvements—something River Mountain neighborhood residents are not doing, Williams said.

City officials told the group that a survey sheet has been sent to homeowners in areas such as the River Mountain neighborhood to see if residents are interested in improvements and if so, what types.

Calhoun said that recent numbers indicate that property owners in the River Mountain neighborhood are two-to-one against "any types of off-site improvements."

Rotarians discuss public broadcasting

Public Broadcast Station KLVX-Channel 10 reaches 238,000 television households in the local market and close to a quarter of a million including the outlying areas, Dan Goldfarb, president of Friends of Channel 10, recently told Henderson Rotarians.

Goldfarb, Charlotte Hill, founder of the Friends, and Marian Murphy, administrative specialist in institutional services for the station, were introduced by C.T. Sewell.

Sewell was a member of the Clark County School Board when Channel 10 was established by the Nevada State Legislature in 1967 and Las Vegas chosen as the site for the first PBS facility.

The first station was located at the Southern Nevada Vocational Technical School. In December 1978 they moved to their present

larger building, the result of a U.S. Department of Labor grant along with monies from the school district.

There is now a second public TV station in Nevada, Channel 5 in Reno.

Channel 10 not only transmits to Southern Nevada but the signal via translator is received in Lincoln, Nye and White Pine Counties plus Indio, Calif.

They have a budget of \$2.5 million, half of which comes from the Clark County School District. The Corporation for Public Broadcasting contributes about 20% and the remainder comes from the community through memberships and fundraising activities.

Hill, who heads up the station's volunteer efforts, said they have a membership of 10,000 which increases with each fundraiser.

Volunteers are always needed for the membership drives, secretarial work, mailings and special events.

Murphy emphasized that the instructional programming between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. offered teachers in the schools is not entertainment but has definite educational value.

"The teacher has access to the world through the tapes and so then does the student. It's a wonderful tool to use in education."

Voters to receive new polling place information

The Clark County Election Department is mailing more than 300,000 notices to every registered voter in Clark County advising them of their precinct and the location where they will vote in the 1992 elections, Registrar of Voters Deborah West announced.

Due to reapportionment of political districts, more than 40,000 registered voters will find that their precincts have changed since

voting in the 1990 elections. This, combined with an estimated 20% increase in the number of registered voters, has necessitated the creation of 200 new precincts in addition to the 640 assigned in 1990, West said.

To assist voters in locating their polling place the names of cross-streets around the polling place will also be provided as a part of the notice.

"Because so many voters are affected by these changes, we wanted to provide this information as early as possible," West said. "For the first time, we are giving voters the opportunity to locate their polling places months before the election, rather than at the last minute after sample ballots are received."

Sample ballots also contain precinct and polling location in-

formation, but are not mailed until 10 days before the election.

Residents who do not receive the notice are encouraged to pick up a mail-in registration form at a library, public utility or post office. Completed forms must be received by the Election Department by Aug. 1 to be valid for the Sept. 1 Primary Election. Voters may also call the Election Department at 455-7370 to request a mail-in form.

Management professor advises Russia

A UNLV management professor will visit the former Soviet Union this month to offer advice and information on how Western management practices can help Russian managers adjust to a new climate of business autonomy.

Rotarians updated on gang activity

Lt. Mike Hawkins, Unit Commander for Metro's Special Enforcement Detail (Gang Detail), recently brought the Henderson Rotary Club up-to-date with the gang problems facing the entire Las Vegas Valley.

Beginning with some history, the 21-year Metro veteran explained the definition of a street gang as "a group of individuals that have a common identifying sign or symbol and whose members engage in criminal activities." The Crips started in South Central Los Angeles in the late 1960s. They were kids attending school who started muggings, robberies and extortions. They adopted the color blue for identification.

Another group was formed at Washington High School as protection from the Crips who were coming in. This group adopted the color of their school, red, and called themselves Bloods.

These gangs spread out over the neighborhoods and "the cycle has kept perpetuating itself," Hawkins said. The Los Angeles area has approximately 100,000 gang members.

"There are five basic categories in Las Vegas, along ethnic lines," he explained. Metro has identified 68 different black gangs (Bloods and Crips and their sub gangs) with a membership in excess of 2,000. They comprise 63% of the total gang membership in the valley.

There are 25 Hispanic gangs with 500 members, 12 Asian gangs

with close to 500 members, 12 mixed race gangs with about 200 members and four white gangs with 170 members.

There are seven separate gangs in Henderson with a membership of 200, according to Hawkins.

Why do kids join gangs?

"Ninety-one percent of all gang members are from minority races, kids facing what they see as a hopeless future. Most coming from single family homes with no positive male influence in the home.

"They lack basic social skills. They lack basic educational attainments, have low self-esteem."

Hawkins explained gangs provide outlets for kids who can become somebody. "Best drug dealer, best shooter, best thief."

He said they learn at a very young age our criminal justice system is lacking, that they won't be held accountable for their

crimes in most instances.

"They can commit robberies, burglaries, sell narcotics, especially as juveniles, and once in the criminal justice system, there is very little done either as punishment or as correction for that behavior. They hold the system in contempt."

In Las Vegas in 1991 there were 17 homicides in which either the victim or the suspect was a gang member.

There were 130 reported shootings. Many go unreported. There have been 11 innocent people shot in Las Vegas over the past two years. Fortunately none have died as a result of gun shot wounds.

"People say this only happens in ghetto areas. It doesn't affect me.

"These kids are packing guns, going to the same social gathering

you and your family go to. If you go to the movies, go shopping or out in public, you are going to be exposed at some time or another to the violence that's associated with them," Hawkins warned.

Within Metro 28 commissioned officers are dedicated to work the street gang issue. In 1988 there were only four officers.

He said the police are trying to make "quality arrests" with hopes of longer prison sentences for gang members.

In 1991 they made in excess of 800 arrests, seized 140 guns and served 92 search warrants. They plan to continue targeting the hardcore leaders within the gangs.

Programs are being offered in the valley to deter "wannabees and gonnabees" from becoming hardcore gang members.

"What gangs do is a police problem but why kids join is a social problem and has to be addressed by all of society," Hawkins concluded.

Optometry student completes medical mission to Chile

Alisa McMahon, a Las Vegas native and fourth year optometry student, was a member of a medical delegation which recently visited Santiago, Chile, Assisted by local volunteers, the team examined 2,000 patients.

The mission was organized by AMIGOS, a non-profit organization which has provided free vision care to the underserved since 1975. In addition to prescribing and dispensing eyeglasses, the eyecare team evaluated the health of each patient's eyes. Diabetes, high blood pressure, cataracts and glaucoma were common findings.

"The mission was a challenge," McMahon said. "We flew for two days to reach Santiago via the most circuitous route imaginable. Upon arrival, we discovered that the air carrier out of Miami had left behind over half our equipment, including the majority of our eyeglasses, our electrical conversion supplies, even our visual acuity charts. We were not to receive them until the evening of our third day of clinic. On the second day, we all came down with bronchitis."

Despite the mishaps, McMahon believes the mission was a success.

"I can't say I've seen much of Santiago, but I have gotten to know many wonderful Chileans. The folks who organized the mission on that end were some of the finest people I've every met...And of

course, we helped many people who were otherwise unable to get eye care and glasses, including many schoolchildren."

The eyeglass inventory must constantly be replenished. Once-used eyeglasses are received by the group, each pair is cleaned, evaluated for its prescriptive power, labeled, and catalogued into the AMIGOS inventory.

Timet didn't fare as well in Saturday night's game against Norco, Calif., losing 3-1 in eight innings.

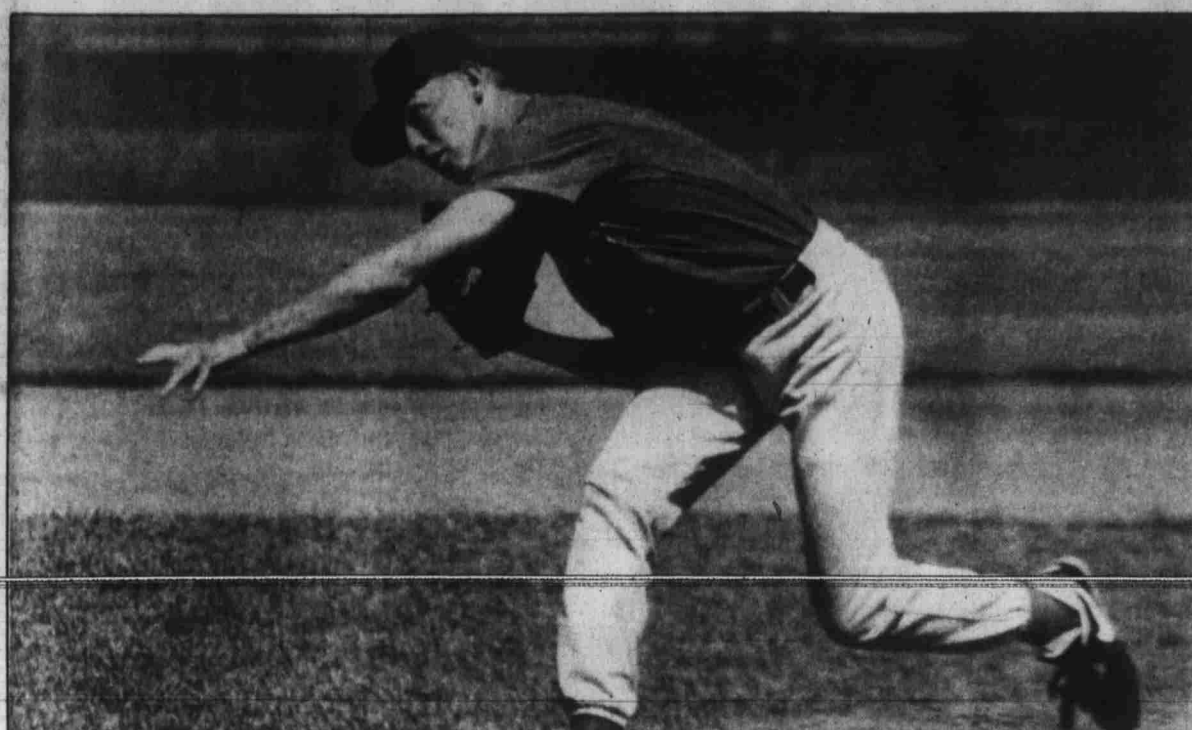
Marshall (2-3) allowed only one run in his first seven innings, but gave up a run in the eighth with-

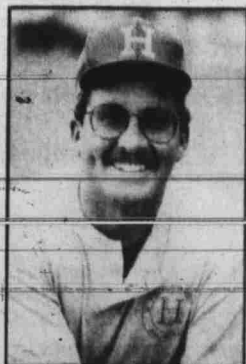

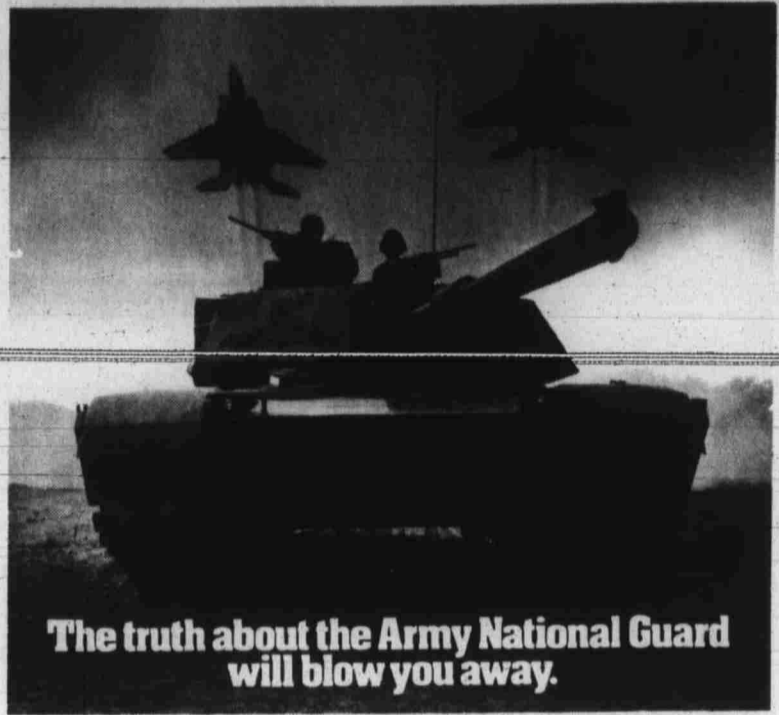
