

Man dies in copter crash

A 52-year-old man was killed in a helicopter crash at Sky Harbor Airport that sent a woman to University Medical Center in critical condition Saturday morning.

A Hughes model 269A helicopter "was on a training flight when it crashed on the runway at 7:34 a.m.," a spokeswoman for the Federal Aviation Administration said.

"The helicopter was demolished,"she said, adding, "The pilot died in the crash."

Ronald Dickens of Las Vegas died from smoke inhalation, Clark County Coroner Ron Flud said Monday.

Sarah Chandler, 40, was taken to UMC in critical condition with third-degree burns over 50% of her body. She was still listed in critical condition at UMC Monday afternoon.

The cause of the crash is under investigation by the National Transportation Safety Board. The NTSB investigator assigned to the case was unavailable for comment Monday, and his supervisor in California was unable to provide

any information.

The FAA spokeswoman said the weather was clear, with visibility about 75 miles at the time of the crash.

"Eventually, in about six weeks, the government will issue a statement as to what happened," airport owner Arby Alper said Monday.

He said he knew both victims. "a student and an instructor. They've been based at the airport for over a year now."

Alper said the accident was the first fatality at Sky Harbor since 1985. "This happened before the airport opened in the morning [on Saturday]," he said. After surveying the scene, he said, "I'd say that plane burned up in less than a minute or two."

He added, "The woman was thrown clear, and that's why she survived. The wreck was a bundle of burnt metal and ashes."

When Henderson firefighters first arrived at the scene "there was a fire ... that they extinguished with foam," Battalion Chief Brad Kreutzer said.

Planners approve Tamarack zoning increase

The Henderson Planning Commission on Thursday approved a zone change to increase residential density within the Highland Hills neighborhood. The zone change from RS-4 district to RS-6 district (both single family residential) is located on 45 acres in the area bounded by Skyline Drive, Tamarack Drive, Grandview Drive and U.S. 95.

Commissioner Kathy Smith abstained and Commissioner Ron Frame was absent.

According to the planning department, the difference between RS-4 and RS-6 zoning would increase the number of lots by 25 in the area. The proposed project consists of 220 lots with a density of almost five units per acre.

Wayne Loftus, zoning administrator, said the zoning would be consistent with the character of the adjoining single family

neighborhood. Nearby residents said they were concerned that their property values would decrease because of two-story houses in the project. They asked the applicant, E.A. Collins Development, to only build one-story

Russ Dorn, of Green Valley Investments which represented the applicant, did not answer the residents' question. Dorn tried to assure the residents that property values would not diminish because the average lot size of the project will be 6,000 square feet and the median cost of the house will be

The zone change also involves a land exchange. One resident asked why 45 acres were being traded for eight acres. Liza Conroy, deputy attorney, said the two parcels of land were appraised and the difference will be paid to

Numerous residents expressed

concerns about the impact the higher density would have on schools. One person said his son attends Galloway Elementary School in a trailer because of the overcrowding. He wondered if his son would attend school in a tent with the higher density.

The city received a letter from the Clark County School District stating that when Newton Elementary School opens in the fall, there will be enough space to handle the anticipated impact from this particular subdivision.

Concerning the land swap, one resident asked about the water rights for both properties. Conroy said the eight acres is zoned industrial and it was calculated for that land to be the equivalent of 77 dwelling units.

But the project consists of 220 lots and the applicant will have to apply for a water allocation application in the category that is classified as other than residential,

Four arrested in drug bust

A man police suspect "to be a major methamphetamine dealer in the Henderson area" was among four persons arrested on drug charges Wednesday, according to the Henderson Police Department.

"Narcotics detectives were surveilling [his] residence prior to the service of the search warrant," HPD Detective Lt. Michael Mayberry said Thursday.

"The arrest and search teams ... were en route to the residence when the suspects unexpectedly left," an HPD press release stated.

Two cars were pulled in the area of Pacific Avenue and Van Wagenen Street about 4:30 .m., and the four persons were taken Finto custody, police said.

"The search warrant was then immediately served at the Blackridge Road residence" of one of the suspects, Stanley Lee

Police found about four ounces of methamphetamine, half a pound of marijuana and various items of drug-related paraphernalia, police said. "Also seized were three vehicles, two firearms, approximately \$8,000 in cash and other miscellaneous property," the press release stated.

The drugs had a street value of some \$10,000, Mayberry said.

Eubanks, 32, was charged with five counts of trafficking in a controlled substance and two counts of possession of a controlled substance with intent to sell, police said. Bail was set at \$130,000.

Three other persons were charged with one count each of possession of a controlled substance, police said. Bail was set at \$10,000 each.

Those suspects were Mark David Lotshaw, 22, of Henderson; Troy Lee Hayse, 26, of Las Vegas and Corina Lynne Stanley, 20, of Las Vegas.

Police expect to make further arrests in the case, Mayberry said.

"Henderson narcotics officers have had the Blackridge Road address and Stanley Eubanks under surveillance for several months," the press release stated. Police described Eubanks as a major drug dealer in Henderson.

Maxey details plans for **MGM Theme Park in LV**

When the MGM Theme Park opens in mid-February - six weeks ahead of schedule - the Las Vegas Valley will have a theme park attraction targeted for all ages and interests, members of the Henderson Chamber of Commerce were told last week.

Robert Maxey, president and chief executive officer of MGM Inc., described the hotel-casinoamusement park during the Chamber's monthly membership luncheon at the Henderson Convention Center.

Now under construction on the northeast corner of Las Vegas Boulevard and Tropicana Avenue, the \$825 million project is "a 112acre entertainment mecca," Maxey said.

In addition to an amusement park with eight streets themed after various parts of the world, Maxey said there will be four themed casinos, including one fashioned after the Emerald City from the Wizard of Oz.

There will also be a 15,000-seat Grand Gardens special events center for sports and conventions, Maxey said. "We'll wait a year before making a decision about a permanent, professional team,"he

Although still more than eight months away from completion, Maxey said, "Sixty percent of our total occupancy for 1994 is presold." He said one million roomnights have been booked for next year at the hotel, which includes 700 suites among its 5,000 rooms.

He said the cost for the 33-acre theme park will be a few dollars less than the entry fee to Disneyland. He said it would take about four or five hours to experience the park if the lines are kept at a minimum.

Construction values continue to rise

With the release of May's construction figures, Henderson's overall values continue to rise, according to the Building and Safety Division's monthly report.

Without including \$13 million in court services construction, last month's values edged over April's tallies by more than \$8 million. There was \$41,724,200 in overall construction in May as opposed to \$20,338,737 the previous month. May 1992 saw \$9,713,924 in total construction values.

The figures bring year-to-date totals to \$123,618,419 as opposed to \$105,295,188 at this time last

For the second consecutive

month, single-family values also saw an increase. May's tallies hit \$16,066,052 — a \$2,046,142 increase over April's \$14,019,910. More than 190 single-family permits were issued last month.

However, multi-family values dipped slightly last month, from \$3,729,776 in April to \$2,539,844 in May. The \$1 million-plus deficit came on the heels of only 39 new construction permits.

Commercial construction values have also seen a two-month increase, with May's total of \$7,749,699 passing April's \$562,524 by more than \$7 million. Nine new permits were issued in May.

Cause of death pending toxicology report


The cause of death for a Las Vegas man found dead in the desert in the Valley View neighborhood last week is pending a toxicology report, according to the Clark County Coroner's Office.

The 34-year-old was found last Tuesday afternoon in the desert northeast of Boulder Highway and Lake Mead Drive.

He was identified as James John Baker, who resided on Karen Avenue in Las Vegas. Henderson police said he appeared to have died within "hours as opposed to days" before he was discovered.

Police said there were no signs of trauma to the body, which was found at about 2:20 p.m. by a 15year-old Basic High School student who was riding an all-terrain vehicle in the area.

Baker was identified Wednesday afternoon, HPD Lt. Michael Mayberry said Thursday. He added Henderson police received several telephone calls regarding Baker's identity after his description was printed in the News on Thursday.

The company is exploring options to eliminate lines, including the possibility of "time tickets" to limit access.

The park will probably not be open 24 hours, but will likely close for eight to 10 hours each night, he said.

The eight themed streets will "take on the appearance of movie sets," Maxey said. Included are a various parts of the world, Salem waterfront and Tumbleweed Gulch. New Orleans Street will include a replica of the Cotton Blossom, a riverboat featured in many movies.

"There are 47 individual buildings in the theme park," Maxey said. "Every square foot ... is unique; intensely decorated, highly articulated.

The park will have 12 major attractions, he said, including a 40-foot flume ride, a haunted mine and a ride through the Grand Canyon rapids at 12-feet per sec-

"Deep Earth Exploration is a motion simulator ride," Maxey said. A jungle ride "accidentally" goes off-course to take passengers through action-packed movie sets.

Two movie theaters will be featured, Maxey said. In one, visitors may have themselves filmed "into" an existing movie and purchase a tape to take home. Another will show how cartoons are made, he said.

When open, the MGM Theme Park is expected to employ 7,500 people, Maxey said. He said that in addition to seeking the tourist market, they would also like to

attract local residents. "We hope that the people of Henderson, for example [will find] it so attractive that you wouldn't consider having [guests] here for a week without bringing them."

Maxey also discussed future plans during the meeting, including a monorail system between the project and Bally's Grand, on Las Vegas Boulevard and Flamingo Road. They hope to expand that to include a monorail to McCarran Airport.

In addition, he said they purchased 18 acres on the northwest corner of Las Vegas Boulevard and Tropicana, opposite the strip from the theme park. He declined to speculate how that land will be developed.

Vucanovich obtains funding

Rep. Barbara Vucanovich, R-Nev., recently announced an additional \$3 million was added at her request to the Energy and Water Funding Bill to start construction of the flood control project on the Tropicana and Flamingo washes in Las Vegas.

Vucanovich also offered an amendment, accepted by the full Appropriations Committee, that puts report language in the Energy and Water Funding Bill to give \$3.7 million to Nevada universities for research involved with Yucca Mountain. The funds come from the Nuclear Waste Disposal Fund, not from the General Treasury. The Energy and Water Appropriations Bill remains within the Administration's budget limits of almost \$22 billion.

"This \$3 million for construction is an acknowledgment by the Congress that this flood control project will be built," Vucanovich said. "There was \$3.685 million in the administration's budget for the Army Corps of Engineers, but that money is for study of the project. This construction money is the real breakthrough and will begin the first phase of a \$204 million flood control project."

General Manager of the Clark County Regional Flood Control District, Virginia Bax Valentine, said "It is a windfall in terms of completing our flood control masterplan. A major milestone a construction start is always the hardest to get. This means we can actually start construction by January or February of next year." The measure must still be ap-

proved by the full House of Representatives and the Senate, but Appropriations Committee ap-

proval usually means the funds will remain in the bill throughout the process.

Tropicana and Flamingo washes begin in the mountainous region to the west of the greater Las Vegas area. Both washes flow eastward through the developing rural and urban downtown areas to the confluences with Las Vegas Wash, Flood flows from both washes pose a serious threat to about 12,000 residents who live in the flood plain.

Plans for the project include construction of two new detention basins, modifying the Red Rock and Flamingo detention basins and building four debris basins, 27 miles of primary concrete channels and 32 miles of collector

Planners keep Foothills rural

Several homeowners had designs to change the make-up of the Foothills neighborhood by dividing 15 acres into half-acre lots. But the Henderson Planning Commission on Thursday listened to the uproar from a crowd of neighbors vehemently against the zone change and unanimously denied the request. Commissioner Ron Frame was absent.

Ron Nelson told the commissioners that he moved to the Foothills neighborhood 15 years

ago with the intent to build on the land for his children. To accomplish that, he would need a zone change from RR (rural residential) district to half-acre residential development lots. The zoning for RR district is for one acre lots.

Foothills neighborhood resident Tina Reed rejected Nelson's reason for dividing the acre lots in half. Reed said the City Council once before approved a zone change in the neighborhood on the same premise but the family never moved in. Instead the homeowner made more money

on four acres between Major Av-

enue and Greenway Road. Com-

missioner Ron Frame was absent.

on the smaller lots and the neighborhood was left with more traffic and crime and less water, she said.

A dozen other residents spoke against the higher density zoning on grounds that they would lose their tranquility and rural lifestyle. Debbie Christensen described half-acre lots as housing tracts bringing with it more noise and desert dumping.

One resident, who purchased a half-acre lot when the City Council approved the first re-zoning several years ago, said he opposed more half-acre lots because the city can not provide adequate services to the area. Once a month the roads are graded but are worn down to a poor condition in a very short time, the resident said.

Another resident said he barely gets enough water from the well

Your community newspaper for his family. Adding half-acre lots could leave him with a trickle, he added. Wayne Loftus, zoning administrator said, there will be an improvement in water supply

Alper said some 250 passengers pass through Sky Harbor daily. "Total flights is about over 100," he said, adding there are five airlines that operate from the airport.

Sky Harbor is located in the southwesternmost corner of Henderson. "It's little, but it moves," Alper said.

He described the airport as "safety-minded," and said he didn't think there was anything they could have done to prevent the accident.

"They were on a normal procedure, something went wrong," he said. He said the NTSB investigation will determine how the crash occurred.



Sunset Stars steal thunder


Converting 9-of-18 passes for three TDs, Amie was named the game's MVP, and Davis was the Defensive MVP with two fourthquarter interceptions.


