## Kahuna big beyond studio

Not everything is as it seems—or is it? Many would think the life of a radio personality is just playing songs and entertaining people.

KOOL (Kqol) 105.5 morning personality, The Big Kahuna, clearly does have all the fun heard on the air but there is a lot more to his work than entertaining—he is involved in a great deal of community service.

In the past year The Big Kahuna, a two-year Henderson resident along with his wife Susie, has participated in several fundraisers for non-profit organizations including a blood drive for United Blood Services, and a fundraiser for Kids Co-op pre-school, where he helped generate approximately \$10,000 for the school's construction.

Born in New York, The Big Kahuna, 42, recently worked with the American Cancer Society and also helped in hosting the annual Earth Day celebration in April.

He participated in a postal food drive with the AFL-CIO and worked with Nevada Child Seekers for two years hosting the fun-run/walk and doing a live broadcast.

Although a lot of the community service work is not part of his job at KOOL, Kahuna doesn't consider the extra work and time to be sacrifices.

"I lend my support by promoting the event on the air and showing up at the event to host it," he said.

So why does he do all this extra work? Kahuna explains it plainly and simply, "Because I can ... when somebody calls the radio station, if it's an hour or two out of my time — big deal," Kahuna said. "Las Vegas and Henderson opened up their arms to me, it's the least I can do to give my time and show my appreciation."

The Big Kahuna and KOOL 105.5's afternoon drive DJ, Larry Martino will soon host a charity golf tournament which will serve to raise money for

abused circus animals.

Over the Christmas holidays, Kahuna held a toy drive to benefit the Boys and Girls Club, to help ensure that children in need would receive a Christmas gift.

Several hundred toys were collected and a Christmas party was held.

Kahuna also does work for the Multiple Sclerosis Society. He is hosting a golf tournament and in September a bike ride

from Las Vegas to Mesquite and back again.

"If I can make even an iota of difference, if I can get one more person to be involved, it's worth my time," The Big Kahuna said.

Due to the large amounts of requests, the radio station can't always fully participate in all public service efforts beyond airing public service announcements. Kahuna said in many cases he will take the next step and help host an event

or interview someone on the air.

So where did "The Big Kahuna" get his name?

Surf reports: While Living in San Luis Obispo, Calif., he worked as an account executive for KZOZ 93.3, a classic rock radio station. He developed a

## Gibson Road will be realigned

Following a heated discussion and questions about the feasibility, the Henderson City Council voted Tuesday night to realign Gibson Road — a move which many anticipate may negatively affect their businesses.

Council members voted 4-1 to approve the realignment plan. Councilman David Wood cast the dissenting vote.

"When you start screwing around with traffic and making people go in different directions, it just doesn't work," said business owner Mervyn Fleisher.

Fleisher, owner of the Texaco Service Station at the corner of Gibson and Sunset Roads, said any of the proposed realignment scenarios will drastically affect his business. If the road is relocated 500 feet east from where the existing road is located, he said he will lose much of the business from traffic at the corners.

To realign the roadway from Cornucopia Avenue to Cape Horn Drive, the Henderson Public Works Department anticipates it will cost the city \$4.5 million.

The city hopes to move the road to the east to help relieve the amount of traffic back-up at the section of Sunset Road. Traffic from expressway interchange and the close proximity of Gibson Road cause traffic to stack at the intersection.

"There must be some other solution," said Mayor Jim Gibson, adding none of the proposed realignments seemed to meet all parties' best interests.

Gibson said the city needs to do something at the intersection to alleviate the problem and moving the road east, though it doesn't satisfy everybody's concerns, may be the only solution.

Wood, however, contends the

## HPRD Jones announces retirement

The head goose is leaving the flock.

After nurturing park growth since its gosling stages, Dundee Jones, director of the Henderson Parks and Recreation Department, is retiring July 14.

Though he is sad to leave the city in an exciting time of park development, he didn't do it all alone.

"One of the things that makes me proud is we all work together like a family," he said. "They're like a flock of geese, once one drops out, the others step up and

take the lead."

HPRD, the "flock" to which Jones refers, will continue on its flight path. The department will continue to soar toward more parks and offering the highest quality of recreation for area residents despite the absence of the head goose of 24 years, Jones said.

City Manager Phil Speight said a decision on whether Jones' position will be filled internally or advertised will likely be determined by next Thursday. It may take up to three months before another person is appointed to the position, he said.

"Dundee can be very proud of the legacy he's leaving for future generations," Speight said. "I think he can take a lot of credit for having the vision [for our parks] along with the supporting committees."

Hired in May 1973, Jones joined the city in its infancy of park and recreation development. At the time, he said, Morrell and Wells Park, along with the Youth Center, were the most prominent parks in the city.

Much has changed since then. "I certainly had no idea that I'd be here for 24 years, but after three to four years, I found there

were still many challenges to be met," Jones said.

In the early years, Henderson didn't have the diverse recreation program it enjoys today, he said. There were some sports being played throughout the city, however, the city did not offer a variety of crafts and more diverse sports for residents to enjoy.

One of the largest challenges during the past 24 years has been keeping pace with the city's enormous population swell by offering parks and recreation programs and facilities.

In 1973, the city's population was 17,310. Most recent projec-

tions have the city's population pegged at 144,900 residents—a more than 700% population increase.

## Council studies appointments

City Council members made little headway during a special Monday meeting in their attempt to overhaul policies on appointments of city boards.

Appointment policy and assignment of Planning Commission and Citizens Advisory Commission members were put on hold following several debates.

"Not only are we not following the policy, but perhaps it needs to be changed," said City Attorney Shauna Hughes, regarding the city's board assignment policy.

The policy, which has existed for the past five years, is being reviewed by Council members after former mayoral candidate Kenny Rogers questioned the policy at an earlier meeting.

Rogers said a Council member ought to have more power to place a person on a board who is not in an elected official's ward. While commissioners agreed taking individuals from outside their wards may strengthen board assignments, they stopped short

of taking action, saying some boards need to be assured of a balanced representation.

"The policy that's in right now certainly is not working," Councilman Jack Clark said. "My ward is pretty much stacked now with Planning Commissioners."

Clark's Ward 3 has three planners residing within its boundaries. Henderson's ordinance says no more than two appointed officials reside in a ward.

Part of the problem of unbalanced representation for an area of the city lies in the fact that members of appointed boards are not discouraged from moving from their existing ward, Council members agreed. Since many appointed board representatives have moved during the past few years, some areas of the city have little representation.

"If you make policy and it makes more confusion, then maybe we shouldn't make more policy," said Councilman Andy Hafen, regarding how to improve the city's existing board appointment policy.

Hafen suggested leaving the policy in place and attempting to balance appointments through mayoral "at-large" appointments.

Though other Council members did not agree with Hafen, they did agree more time was needed to discuss the matter. The Council tabled further discussion until 30 days to further investigate options.

Progress was made during the meeting regarding which committees Council members will attend for the next two years.

The following are some of the City Council member's more prominent committee assignments.

**Mayor Jim Gibson:** Blue Ribbon Commission on Education Excellence and Youth Opportunity, Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors and Senior Citizens Advisory Commission.

**Councilman Jack Clark:** Parks and Recreation Board and Commemorative Beautification Committee.

**Councilman Amanda Cyphers:** Citizen's Traffic Advisory Board, Clark County District Health Board and Southern Nevada Water Authority Board.

**Councilman Andy Hafen:** Citizens Advisory Committee, Planning Commission and Convention Center Board of Directors.

**Councilman Dave Wood:** Henderson Development Association, Regional Flood Control and Regional Transportation Commission.

## Sun City residents salute Flag Day

Afternoon breezes swept through the valley stirring more than impressive displays of American flags which lined the main thoroughfares of Sun City Summerlin and Sun City MacDonald Ranch.

Many residents at Del Webb's two active adult communities for people ages 55 and over paused to admire the spectacle which commemorates a significant moment in American history and reflect upon its meaning, said Sean Patrick, Del Webb community manager of public relations and community affairs.

"Flag Day is an important symbolic holiday to many Americans — particularly those who served in the armed forces during wartime," Patrick said. "Many residents appreciate and understand its meaning and historical significance."

While the Fourth of July is widely celebrated as the U.S. birthday, Flag Day commemorates the origin of the nation's most significant symbol.

In 1777, as his troops braced at Fort Mifflin for the Battle of the Clouds, colonial army Major George Armistead commissioned seamstress Mary Pickersgill to design and craft a flag "so large that the British will have no difficulty in seeing it from a distance."

The original Stars and Stripes, which measured 42 feet long by 30 feet high and included a star for each of the 13 colonies, symbolized the fledgling nation's defiance against British rule.

While celebrating the anniversary of the Flag Resolution of 1777 gained widespread popularity following an 1891 ceremony at the Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia, it was not until 1916 that President Woodrow Wilson established the holiday through an official Proclamation.

Finally, in 1949, June 14 was officially declared a national holiday by President Harry Truman.

Patrick said celebrating the holiday enhanced the sense of community among residents. He said the celebration was a way to pay homage to Sun City founder Del E. Webb, whose sense of patriotism and traditional values were the cornerstone for the

master-planned retirement concept.

"The American flag represents everything that is positive about our country. The dedication, strength, and courage upon which our nation was built are ideals which have stood the test of time," Patrick said.

"Many of those same qualities have been attributed to Mr. Webb, and I believe they are reflected in the communities he created."

Webb's vision of retirement as an active, vibrant time is demonstrated by the variety of social and recreational opportunities available to residents, Patrick said.

Sun City MacDonald Ranch and Sun City Summerlin residents enjoy challenging golf courses designed by PGA Hall of

Fame golfer Billy Casper and renowned golf course architect Greg Nash.

Both communities feature sprawling community centers, providing residents interested in fitness with fully-equipped workout rooms, aerobic dance studios, swimming pools, spas, and tennis, bocce ball and shuffleboard courts.

Centers are also equipped for the "hobbyist, with computer workshops and arts and craft rooms which house wood working, painting, ceramics, quilting, and many other activities.

Del Webb Corp. is the developer of Sun City communities in Arizona, California, Nevada, South Carolina and Texas. Del Webb is also the parent company of Coventry Homes, which has active developments in Arizona, California and Nevada.

To meet residents' needs during the years, Jones helped guide projects such as the Arroyo Grande Sports Complex, Discovery Park and the Black Mountain Recreation Center and Aquatics Park.

Though he is leaving the city employment, he hopes to continue offering his insight on parks issues by being involved with various parks boards, he said.

"There are things I'd like to do that I've always talked about doing," Jones said.

His planned retirement activities include numerous fishing expeditions across the nation and gold prospecting in the Yuba River of northern California.

While he may take the time during retirement to dwell on

the nostalgia of the city's parks and recreation achievements, he is quick to point out numerous people who made it all possible.

"There have been so many wonderful people I've met through the years," he said.

Much of the credit for Henderson's parks and recreation services would not have become a reality if it were not for the common vision of city managers during the years.

Since 1973 there have been five city managers. Those he credited most were his first and last city managers. Don Dawson gave him the opportunity to help guide Henderson's nationally credited department and Speight, with his aggressive support of more parks, allowed the department to

continue on its future course.

Since 1988, Henderson has bonded \$76 million in parks improvements to keep the city in the forefront of parks and recreation development for the future.

Jones has been responsible for maintenance of 505 acres of parks and public grounds. He also guided programming and operation of four recreation centers, five swimming pools, a 10-field sports complex and a senior citizens center. HPRD was a finalist for the National Gold Medal Award for parks in 1994 and 1995.

"The whole city has become a star around the state," Jones said. "It's not just a place to call home, it's a great place to call home."

## Martinique Bay apartment damaged in Tuesday blaze

A fire at Martinique Bay Apartments, 3000 Highview Dr., caused an estimated \$30,000 damage and displaced two families from their homes Tuesday afternoon.

When Henderson fire and police units responded to the fire, the attic space and part of the roof above the second floor apartment were in flames.

An aerial ladder was raised to the building's roof and a hole was cut in the roof to release the smoke and superheated fire gases.

The fire did not spread to other apartments, but there was some

water damage to apartment below. The apartment's contents was covered with plastic sheets to protect it from water.

The Clark County Fire Department assisted with one engine under the agencies' automatic aid agreement. Henderson police provided traffic and crowd control.

A total of 30 firefighters were involved in the effort.

One fire captain was slightly injured when he stepped on a nail while cutting the hole in the roof. There were no other injuries.

The investigator could not determine the fire's cause. The apartment complex management is assisting the two families with finding new residences.

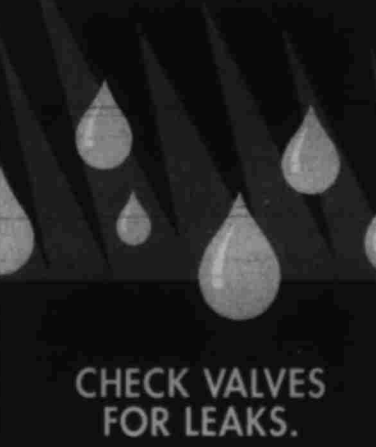

problem is not Gibson Road, but Sunset Road.

He said if the city earmarked the money to help widen Sunset Road and begin interchange improvements, the city's money may be better spent. Traffic is largely generated from commercial growth along Sunset Road, he said, and not from Gibson Road.

Additionally, Wood said, there will be a slip ramp off of the expressway leading to the Valley Auto Mall, a source of much of Gibson Road's traffic. Once the ramp is complete in the next several years, relocating Gibson Road will not prove to have as

much impact.

Roadway projects to improve the area include widening Sunset Road to four lanes from the Pittman Wash to Gibson Road, improving the existing interchange and improving all intersections along Sunset Road—including Stephanie and Marks Streets, the expressway ramp and Gibson Road.

In other news, the Council:   
• Approved 4-1 a hillside development plan map with hillside regulations. Councilman Amanda Cyphers cast the dissenting vote.

Version 19 of the document

was approved, ending a two-year effort by the city to regulate development on Henderson's hillsides. About 80% of a hillside site may be disturbed, according to the document. For some designated properties, 100% of the site may be disturbed. A clause for revegetation and restoration of a disturbed area was also added to the document.

• Entertained discussion regarding a business licence for a psychic arts business. Ron and Laura Marks contend they should not be subject to a background check for their business because it violates their freedom of speech rights.

"What they're really opposed to is releasing information," said Michael Smith, the Marks' attorney.

Council members, however, indicated that a background check is always required of such businesses that require healing. Council members determined that though the business intends to give psychic readings, it fits under the business category of healing, which require an extensive background check. The Marks may pursue their case in District Court.

• Approved an ordinance making parents and guardians responsible for individuals under the age of 21 consuming, purchasing or possessing alcoholic beverages.

• Approved an ordinance to prohibit the use of badges, uniforms and vehicles for private patrolmen-security guards. The

city aims to prohibit false representation of local police by requiring private security companies to receive approval from the chief of police for the use of equipment and uniform similar to local police.

• Approved an architectural review for a Marie Callender's restaurant at 530 N. Stephanie St., in the Whitney Ranch planning area.

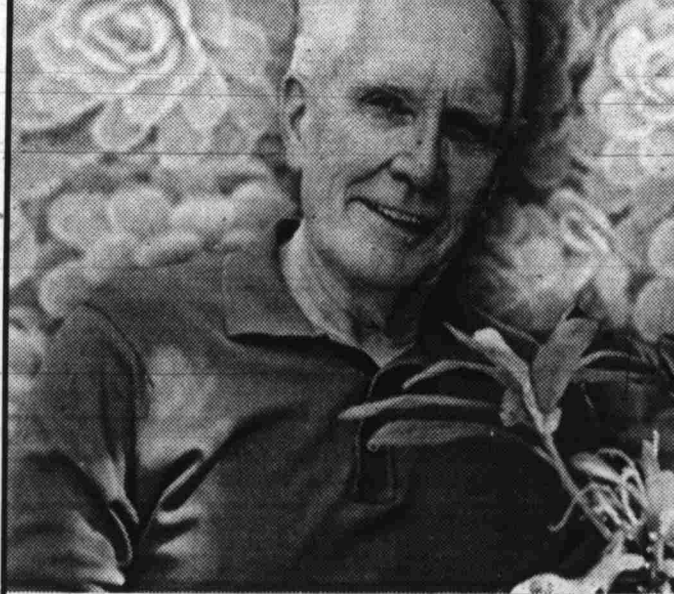

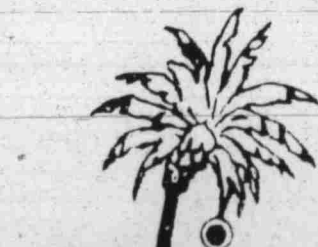

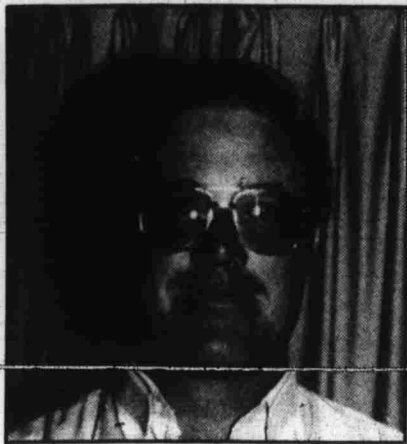
Renaud; Inside Guard, John Goebert; Outside Guard, Ed Rebeaud; Three-year Trustee, Joseph Savone.

### Celebrate safely

Celebrating our country's independence can be a spectacular event if done properly. The best way is to watch professional fireworks shows by professional pyrotechnicians.

Although there might be larger shows in the Las Vegas Valley, none can compare to the closeness of a community show. The Henderson Parks and Recreation Department will host an event at dusk tomorrow at Morrell Park, one block east of Boulder Highway and Major. Fireworks will practically shower down on spectators at the old airport in Boulder City at about 9 p.m. tomorrow at the conclusion of Damboree festivities.

Despite attempts by towns to put on safe and spectacular fireworks shows, some people will be rushed to the hospital because they got carried away with their own fireworks.

According to the National Fire Protection Association and the State Fire Marshal, since 1995, more than 11,000 people from around the country have suffered severe injuries as a result of amateur use of fireworks.

Those at greatest risk are children between the ages of 10 to 14 years old. Even sparklers, often mistaken as safe, can burn as hot as 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit.

Residents wishing to participate in their own private pyrotechnic parties should use fireworks with the Safe and Sane label. Children should always be supervised and a water hose should be nearby in case errant fireworks catch fire.

In addition to protecting family members, people should keep their pets in doors. While the explosions may fascinate spectators, dogs and cats are frightened and will run away to stop the terror they are experiencing.

Remember to celebrate safely and the best way is to enjoy the professionals.

### Salute those who serve

It's about time the secretary of defense and the commander in chief stood up and stoutly defended the 1.4 million men and women in military uniform who serve this country with honor.

In recent months, their reputations and their morale have suffered from a barrage of stories portraying them as the gang that can't keep their clothes on or their rules straight. Their leaders have partly brought it on themselves by mindlessly setting up a hot line—thankfully, it's now closing—for anonymous character assassins to spread dirt about superiors. They only made it worse by publicly drumming 1st Lt. Kelly Flinn out of the service and then allowing decorated combat veteran Gen. Joseph Ralston's nomination as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff to turn into a public relations disaster.

There's no doubt that the military has its problems. Its difficulties in integrating the sexes and regulating behavior off base are now obvious. As Sen. Ted Stevens of Alaska is learning from recent inquiries, it still needs more discipline over its spending. Some generals have gone soft and political. And eight years after the collapse of the Berlin Wall, its roles and missions remain confusing.

But the piling on we see in the press and among politicians has gone far enough. When will the president and the secretary shout out the rest of the story? When will they remind the public that the U.S. armed services today are the finest, most

sophisticated, best-trained fighting force in the world and perhaps in all of world history?

**Secure and at peace.** Our military has one central responsibility, and it performs that superbly: to protect the security of the nation. In the bloodiest century ever, this country hasn't engaged in a major war for over 20 years and appears safe as far as the eye can see.

Far from a frolic in bed, life in the Army these days can be lonely and tough. Since the end of the cold war, the Army has cut its forces by a third while the White House has tripled the number of its overseas missions. As a result, the average soldier now spends 180 days a year deployed away from home, more than double the number of a decade ago. Late last month, the Army announced that American soldiers are serving in 100 countries, the largest number in its history.

From higher-profile missions in Haiti and the Middle East to lesser-known ones in countries like Belize and Macedonia, these overseas efforts have been carried out with distinction—and not much public notice. In the 19 months since deploying to Bosnia, U.S. forces haven't had a single untoward incident with a civilian there, and not one American soldier has been killed in combat. Whatever else they have accomplished for the long term, our troops have helped give people there a year and a half without slaughter and mass rapes.

Those who say that soldiers must also learn to behave themselves are absolutely right. Throughout the services, the military should crack down hard on cases of sexual harassment and abuses of power. Everyone must be an officer and a gentleman.

But we should not expect our fighting forces to be warriors on the

### Time to investigate Starr

WASHINGTON—What this country needs is neither a good 5-cent cigar nor a (free-range) chicken in every pot, but a special prosecutor to investigate the Whitewater special prosecutor, Kenneth W. Starr. Once asked to look into Whitewater and related matters, he is now questioning Bill Clinton's alleged girlfriends. That makes two Whitewater scandals—one involving the Clintons, the other involving Starr.

The *Washington Post's* Bob Woodward, along with his colleague Susan Schmidt, reports that Starr's investigators have asked former members of Clinton's Arkansas security detail what they know about their one-time boss' extracurricular activities—if any, I am obliged to say.

Two state troopers, Roger Perry and Ronald B. Anderson, said they were asked about 12 to 15 women by name. Perry says that when given a list by the special prosecutor's office, he was able to identify "seven or eight" women with whom Clinton had had clandestine meetings. He was even asked if he had ever seen Clinton engage in sex. Alas for talk radio, he said no.

What could justify such a tasteless question? What could Starr be up to? The *Post* says the independent counsel is seeking out people in whom Clinton may have once confided. Did he tell them the same story he later told the special prosecutor about Whitewater, Castle Grande and other matters so attenuated, complicated and obscure that almost no one can understand them? Or did he, in a triumph of bad judgment, confess to some sort of criminal activity while engaged in some other activity—the immoral about the illegal?

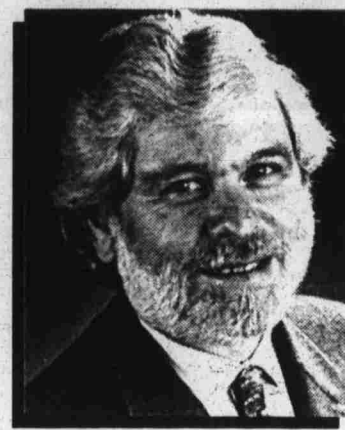
Did this happen with Bill Clinton? I have no idea. But unless Starr can connect, directly and clearly,

Clinton's alleged extramarital affair(s) to some criminal act of consequence, then he has crossed a line respected by even the most aggressive of prosecutors. He seems to be flailing, determined to punish Bill Clinton not for anything he has done but for making Starr waste three years of his life. He knows what it is to be seduced (by fame in his case) and abandoned. He is a prosecutor scorned—by the facts, as it turns out, and his own clumsy handling of the investigation.

We all think we know that Bill Clinton has had his innings. Jennifer Flowers alleged as much but, more convincingly, some very careful reporters have come out and said so. In his meticulously researched biography of Clinton—"First In His Class"—my colleague David Maraniss reported that Clinton's gubernatorial chief of staff, Betsey Weight, confronted him with a list of girlfriends and urged that he not run for president in 1988. "Now I want you to tell me the truth about every one," Maraniss quotes her as telling Clinton. For whatever reason, Clinton waited four years.

But everyone has a private life, and not all are beyond reproach. Large numbers of people, as we are constantly learning to our constant surprise, have committed adultery. This is not a real crime, but it can be the cause of great mortification and, maybe, the dissolution of a marriage. What would you, man or woman, say to avoid appearing as a witness and confessing to an affair?—confessing not just to a court, but, in effect, to everyone around your kitchen table as well?

If, up to now, Kenneth Starr had



conducted himself impeccably I might give him the benefit of the doubt in this matter. But he has persisted in partisan activities (making speeches and campaign contributions) and probably will wind up, when all this is over, at Pepperdine University, taking a position created in good part by

money from Richard Mellon Scaife, the sugar daddy of the right wing. From the manner of his appointment—by right-wing judges—to the manner of his attempted leaving—to that

Pepperdine post—Starr's tenure has been tainted with the stain of partisanship. The Whitewater independent counsel was appointed not to see if the Clintons were morally, ethically, politically and in every other way without fault, but to determine whether they had done something regarding Whitewater that was worthy of a charge—and, in the President's case, possible impeachment. We are talking high crimes here, not really misdemeanors—something so serious that the democratic choice of the people for president might be canceled.

So far, Starr has not shown he has come up with anything close to momentous. If that remains the case, then delving into Clinton's private life, no matter how smarmy, is more repugnant than anything Clinton may have done. It is past time that Ken Starr either put up or shut up. He, maybe more than Clinton, has much to account for.

### Education legislation

Gov. Miller and Sen. Bill Raggio should be commended for their work on the state's educational reform legislation.

While there are parts that concern me, the legislation is well intended. Overall, the benefits far out weigh the drawbacks. The department of education will evaluate the performance of schools, placing schools on academic probation based upon those evaluations, and require the department to establish a panel to supervise a school's academic probation, under certain circumstances.

The legislation also revises provisions governing school district financial reports and accountability reports.

In essence, it tightens up the state's accountability program by ensuring policymakers enough data to make informed decisions.

In the short run, some schools serving kids with the greatest needs, will take a lot of heat. However, done correctly with good intent, a panel overseeing a school on probation will realize that schools can only do so much.

There will be three designations of student achievement. Schools in which 50% of students taking the test receive an average score at least equal to the 75th percentile will have demonstrated high achievement. Adequate achievement requires at least 60% of students taking the test to score at the 26th percentile. Inadequate achievement is indicated if less than 60% of students taking the test receive an average score of the 26th percentile. 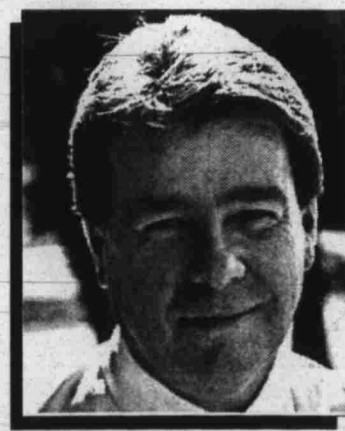
final versions of SB482.

The legislation also creates panels, boards, councils, and committees. The Council to Establish Academic Standards will have nine members, four appointed by the governor, two by the senate majority leader of the senate, two by the assembly speaker and a state board of education member. The council will develop standards and assessments by fall 1998 in English, math, and science. By fall 1999, standards will be in place for arts, computers, health and social studies. The panel sunsets June 30, 1999. The new standards will take effect in the 1999-2000 school year.

I hope this council will look closely at research strongly suggesting the U.S. math curriculum is a mile wide and an inch deep. It will take courage in the face of criticism to establish a leaner curriculum.

The panel to oversee a school placed on academic probation will have nine members appointed by the state superintendent. Two must be from the state's universities, two from the private sector, two parents of students enrolled in the school and three licensed educational personnel, two not in the same district as the probationary school.

The panels have the potential to enlighten state policy makers and communities as to the needs of children coming to school already behind their peers. Parents must get involved with their children's education.



Also created will be the Legislative Committee on Education, to include eight members, four senators and four assembly members. While the legislature currently has education committees, this committee has the potential to create a better understanding of the state educational

system and can support bipartisan legislation to enhance the public education system.

An 11-member Education Technology Commission will develop a state wide plan for the use of technology at each school.

And finally, a Legislative Bureau of Educational Accountability and Program Evaluation will be created within the fiscal division of the Legislative Council Bureau. I believe this will be the meat and potatoes of the reform act. The bureau will analyze information and make recommendations to the legislature in which public education may be improved.

By enacting this legislation, the legislature will be a lot more informed and will be able to make better decisions impacting the state's public education system.

Miller and Raggio deserve a lot of credit for working out such a comprehensive plan.

## HMO patient rights

Managed care, pioneered in California more than a decade ago, is enjoying a huge growth spurt in the state, with 2 million members added to health maintenance organizations in the last two years alone. That pace is expected to pick up as the Wilson administration moves 1.5 million low-income Medi-Cal recipients into HMOs.

But as managed care becomes the California standard, complaints about denial of certain treatments have inundated state legislators. The lawmakers have responded with a flurry of bills attempting to ensure that HMOs balance profit with consumers' need for quality health care. Many of these bills unwisely attempt to legislate the practice of medicine but three of them have broader aims that would help achieve a better balance of power between patients and HMOs.

•When consumers sign up for an HMO, they receive reams of glowing description and plenty of fine print. But nowhere are they likely to find out what's covered or not covered, and why. Later, if a medical procedure is denied, the HMO need not provide a timely rationale for the denial. There are many documented cases in which HMOs have approved treatment selectively—for instance, saying yes to expensive bone marrow treatments for an HMO employee while denying such care to an ordinary policyholder. AB 536, by Assemblyman Martin Gallegos (D-Baldwin Park) would require HMOs and insurers to disclose their rationales for rejections to patients within five days and to make public their coverage criteria and procedures for approving or denying care. This would go far in ensuring fair treatment of policyholders.

•The medical director of a California HMO is ultimately responsible for deciding what care is provided. But current law does not require these directors to be California-licensed physicians, so they are all but beyond the reach of the state medical board. SB 324, by Sen. Herschel Rosenthal (D-Los Angeles), would require physicians making decisions about the necessity of care to be licensed in the state closing an important loophole.

•AB 794, by Assemblywoman Liz Figueroa (D-Fremont), includes provisions similar to the above and adds the requirement for a second physical exam if an HMO denies care that the primary care physician has recommended. Legislators say this potentially expensive requirement would be likely to lead to a veto by Gov. Pete Wilson.

At least the Gallegos and Rosenthal bills should land on the governor's desk. Both enjoy the support of numerous consumer groups and the California Medical Assn.

Last month, consumer complaints about HMOs led Texas Gov. George W. Bush to agree not to veto a law, the first of its kind, allowing patients to sue HMOs directly for medical malpractice if decisions to deny or delay treatment cause injury. The law is expected to significantly drive up HMO operating costs.

Given the growing demand for basic health care rights, California state lawmakers and Gov. Wilson should respond now with the more moderate patient rights guarantees under consideration in Sacramento. Otherwise they could face demands for a Texas-type law that would undermine HMO cost-efficiency.

## Fireworks in safe hands

Each year on the Fourth of July, Americans celebrate the birth of the nation by painting the sky with fireworks displays. Whether these events take place at the community park or in the backyard, they often result in serious injuries to children. In fact, children ages 10 to 14 suffer from fireworks-related injuries more than any other age group.

"Most children are thrilled by fireworks; but unfortunately, they are not always able to handle them correctly," says Barbara Ludwig of the Clark County SAFE KIDS Coalition and director of community relations at Columbia Sunrise Hospital and Medical Center.

"Fireworks involve the use of fire and explosives, which we know can be deadly."

## Fireworks-related injuries

In 1995, more than 4,700 children ages 14 and under suffered from fireworks-related injuries. Two-thirds of all fireworks-related injuries occur in July. Sparklers, often considered the safest type of fireworks, are most frequently associated with injury among children ages 4 and under.

Many parents and caregivers overestimate their children's ability to use fireworks, creating a dangerous environment for injuries. Fireworks-related injuries usually involve the hands/fingers, eyes or head, and can sometimes result in amputation, blindings or even death. More than half of fireworks-related injuries involve burns.

"We generally see a lot of injured children in the emergency room around the Fourth of July because of burns sustained from mishandled fireworks," said Dr. Tamara Pottker, emergency room physician and Columbia Sunrise Hospital and Medical Center. "A burn is one of the most painful injuries for children and tends to be more severe because children have thinner skin than adults."

## What is legal

Consumer fireworks are legal for public sale in 32 states and the District of Columbia. They include fountains, "bottle rockets," cylindrical foundations, Roman candles, rockets with sticks, mines and shells, helicopter-type rockets, certain sparklers, party poppers, missile-type rockets, illuminating torches, toy smoke devices, revolving wheels and firecrackers with no more than 50 milligrams of powder.

Effective March 1997, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) adopted a standard to eliminate the deadly tip-over hazard in large multiple-tube fireworks. This standard requires all domestic manufacturers of these multiple-tube devices to develop a new, safer base.

Fireworks that have been banned from public sale by the CPSC include firecrackers containing more than 50

milligrams of powder, cherry bombs, M-80 salutes, larger reloadable shells, aerial bombs and larger firecrackers containing more than two grains of powder. Mail-order kits designed to create these fireworks also are banned.

Ten states ban all consumer fireworks: Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island and Vermont. Six states allow only sparklers and other novelties: Illinois, Iowa, Maryland, Ohio and Pennsylvania. Two states, Hawaii and Nevada, have fireworks laws only at county levels. However, CPSC regulations are still applicable.

Homemade or illegal fireworks are extremely dangerous and should never be used. Fireworks legally available for sale to the public also can be harmful if not used properly and should never be treated as toys.

The Clark County SAFE KIDS Coalition stresses practicing extreme caution when using fireworks and recommends the following safety guidelines:

- Only adults should handle fireworks. Tell children that they should leave the area immediately if their friends are using fireworks.
- Discuss safety procedures with your children. Teach children to "stop, drop and roll" if their clothes catch fire. Make sure they know how to call 9-1-1. Show them how to put out fireworks by using water or a fire extinguisher.
- Read labels and carefully follow directions. All fireworks must carry a warning label describing necessary safety precautions.
- Never use fireworks indoors.
- Be sure spectators are out of

range before lighting fireworks.

- Never aim or throw fireworks at another person.
- Never place your face or any other body part over fireworks.
- Never try to re-ignite fireworks that malfunction.
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket.

•Only light fireworks on a smooth, flat surface away from the house, dry leaves and flammable materials.

The Clark County SAFE KIDS Coalition recommends that the safest way to enjoy fireworks is at a community-sanctioned, licensed event. Many communities hold a fireworks display sponsored by the fire department or other safety agencies.

"Don't let dangerous sparks stand between your family and a wonderful Fourth of July celebration," said Ludwig. "Following these important guidelines can help keep your fireworks activities enjoyable and safe."

The Clark County SAFE KIDS Coalition is part of the National SAFE KIDS Campaign, the first and only national organization dedicated solely to the prevention of unintentional childhood injury—the No. 1 killer of children ages 14 and under. More than 200 state and local SAFE KIDS Coalitions in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico comprise the campaign. Former U.S. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop, M.D., is chairman of the campaign and Vice President Al Gore and Tipper Gore are honorary chairs.

•Arrive 90 minutes prior to a flight's departure to allow enough time to locate parking space in the new McCarran Airport Parking Plaza, check-in with the airline, and find the gate.

•Be prepared to show photo identification upon check-in; airline check-in lines can sometimes take as long as 30 minutes.

•For current parking information, call 261-5121.

## KNOW BEFORE YOU GO:

•Follow the color coded lanes: Yellow to Arrivals/Passenger Pickup; Green to long term parking; Red for short term and valet parking. Blue for oversized and surface parking located adjacent to the Parking Plaza.

•If parking short term (3 hours or less), be prepared with quarters. Short-term parking cost 25 cents per 15 minute period. Change machines are located throughout the short-term parking areas to provide quarters to use for parking meters.

•Level 6 (long term parking) of the Silver Garage is now closed. Level 6 will remain closed until September to enhance lighting, resurface paving, install intercoms and other improvements.

Friends of education reform reacted with glee to the news that American fourth-graders now score near the top of international comparison lists in both math and science. The president himself greeted the results of the Third International Mathematics and Science Survey of 9-year-olds from more than a dozen countries. He declared the results evidence that every child can learn. This conviction in turn forms the basis of the argument for using tough educational standards—and is evidence, too, that if reformers buckle down to achieving the education goals set out by the governors in 1989, they can achieve them.

But is that really what's happening? The results are good and mark a change from years of insistence that everything under the sun is wrong with American education. In these early grades, things here look pretty solid: American 9-year-olds get about as much homework as kids in other nations, they spend slightly more time in science class than the norm, they watch more TV but also have better access to desks, books and computers, and in math they score higher than

any other nation in the study except Korea.

Comments by the report's own sponsors, however, contrast to the president's effusive claims. It is true that U.S. fourth-graders do well in both math and science, says the commissioner in charge of the study, but "it is not clear whether this relative international standing has changed over time." There is "a possibility that U.S. fourth-graders are improving in mathematics since they fared better than in a previous international assessment of 9-year-olds conducted in 1991." But American kids have long done well at basic math and science, only to fall apart when they reach advanced courses.

To note carefully what parts of the school system aren't in crisis is to help combat that other great foe of useful reform, the tendency to throw up one's hands or insist on sweeping, blue-sky, never-attainable reform of every aspect of every school. What's needed here is more attention to the mysterious problem of what happens to the kids after they leave fourth grade.

field and saints off it. Rules of common sense should prevail. Just as the military should apply the same rules to men and women, and to officers and enlisted personnel, it should call off witch hunts looking into behavior of 15 or 20 years ago. The issue shouldn't be whether a military person has sex off base but whether he or she abuses a position of authority and causes disorder in the ranks. This question must be posed: If "don't ask, don't tell" is the right standard for the sex lives of homosexual soldiers, shouldn't we consider something similar for the sex lives of heterosexual ones?

In the meantime, we should remember that thousands of fine men and women are out there at this very moment, sentries standing watch around the world. They don't do it for the money; most could earn significantly more in the private sector. They do it because they find pride and satisfaction in preserving freedom. It's time their commanders rallied the troops and told them during this period of stress that the nation salutes their honor and service.

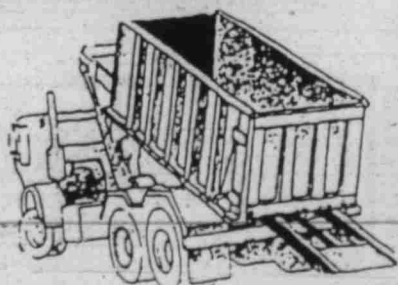
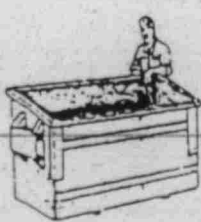
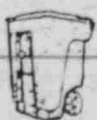

# Akselrad heads conference panel

Rabbi Sanford Akselrad, spiritual leader of Congregation Ner Tamid attended the annual convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis held June 22-June 26 in Miami.

begin." "In addition, there were many who simply wanted to learn more about what they considered 'one of the great religions of the world,'" Akselrad said.

The rabbi is a member of the national commission on Outreach, a joint Commission of the CCAR and the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

# Park Service prepares for big crowd

The National Park Service is expecting a big turnout this July 4th as the holiday occurs on a Friday, making it a three-day weekend for many. Lake Mead National Recreation Area wants safety to be foremost in the public's mind. Rangers will be enforcing a ban on fireworks and will be keeping a watchful eye on other activities to promote visitor safety.

Those who visit other National Park System units will recognize the nationwide ban on fireworks in the parks. Numerous injuries and fires attributed to the use of fireworks led to the ban many years ago. Even using fireworks on a boat can have disastrous consequences due to the presence of gasoline and its vapors on board.

Windy conditions can create big problems for the boating public as high waves can be a challenge for novice and experienced operators alike. Rangers suggest checking with local weather information sources such as radio, television, wind warning flags, or "wind-talkers."

The "wind-talker" devices do not forecast the wind speed but can give a velocity reading up to the moment. The public can dial a phone number and obtain information for a specific area. The numbers are: Echo Bay—394-4440; Callville Bay—293-6391; Hemenway Harbor (Boulder Beach area)—294-2400; and

Cottonwood Cove—297-1265. Visitors should be aware of problems which typically arise from the use of alcohol and other intoxicants and careless operation of boats, including the growing numbers of wave runners, jet skis, and other personal watercraft (PWC's).

"We encourage all users of the

Valley roughed up starter Taylor Smith in the first inning and then jumped on reliever Ian Jones in the second inning to build a lead the Gators couldn't overcome.

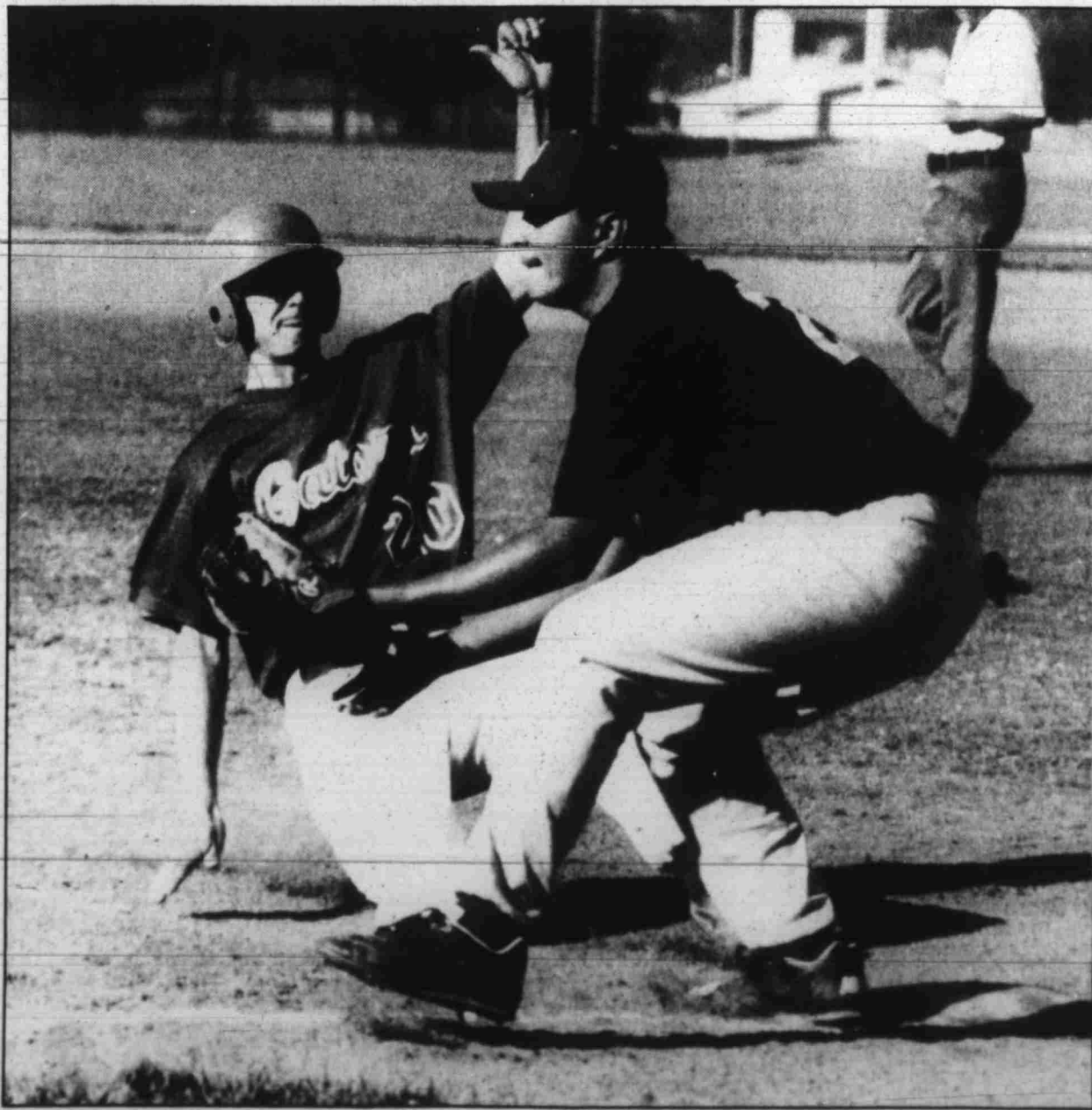
Down 6-0 entering the bottom of the second, Green Valley cut the deficit in half with three runs.

## The joy of Discovery

Lied Discovery Children's Museum features hands-on learning

Just a few short blocks from the neon, souvenirs and slot machines of downtown Las Vegas, nestled off-street in a facility it shares with the Las Vegas-Clark County Library, is one of the valley's cultural and educational crown jewels.

Founded in 1984 by the Allied Arts Council and the Junior League of Las Vegas, the Lied Discovery Children's Museum first opened its doors to the public in 1990. Since then, the museum has seen an estimated one million visitors, with an average yearly attendance of 150,000. It is one of the largest museums of its kind in the country.

More than 100 hands-on exhibits featuring the arts, sciences and humanities are available for exploration in the museum's 22,000 square feet of exhibit space. These include miniature tornadoes, gigantic bubbles, kid-powered lightning, and an eight-story science tower. In one of the most popular exhibits, kids can choose a career, receive a paycheck, deposit some of it, and use the rest to stock up on mock groceries.

Recently, a group of sixth-graders from Garrett Middle School in Boulder City took a field trip to the Lied Discovery Children's Museum. For over an hour, the children pushed buttons, pulled levers, played music, and probably learned more than they realized they could learn while having so much fun.

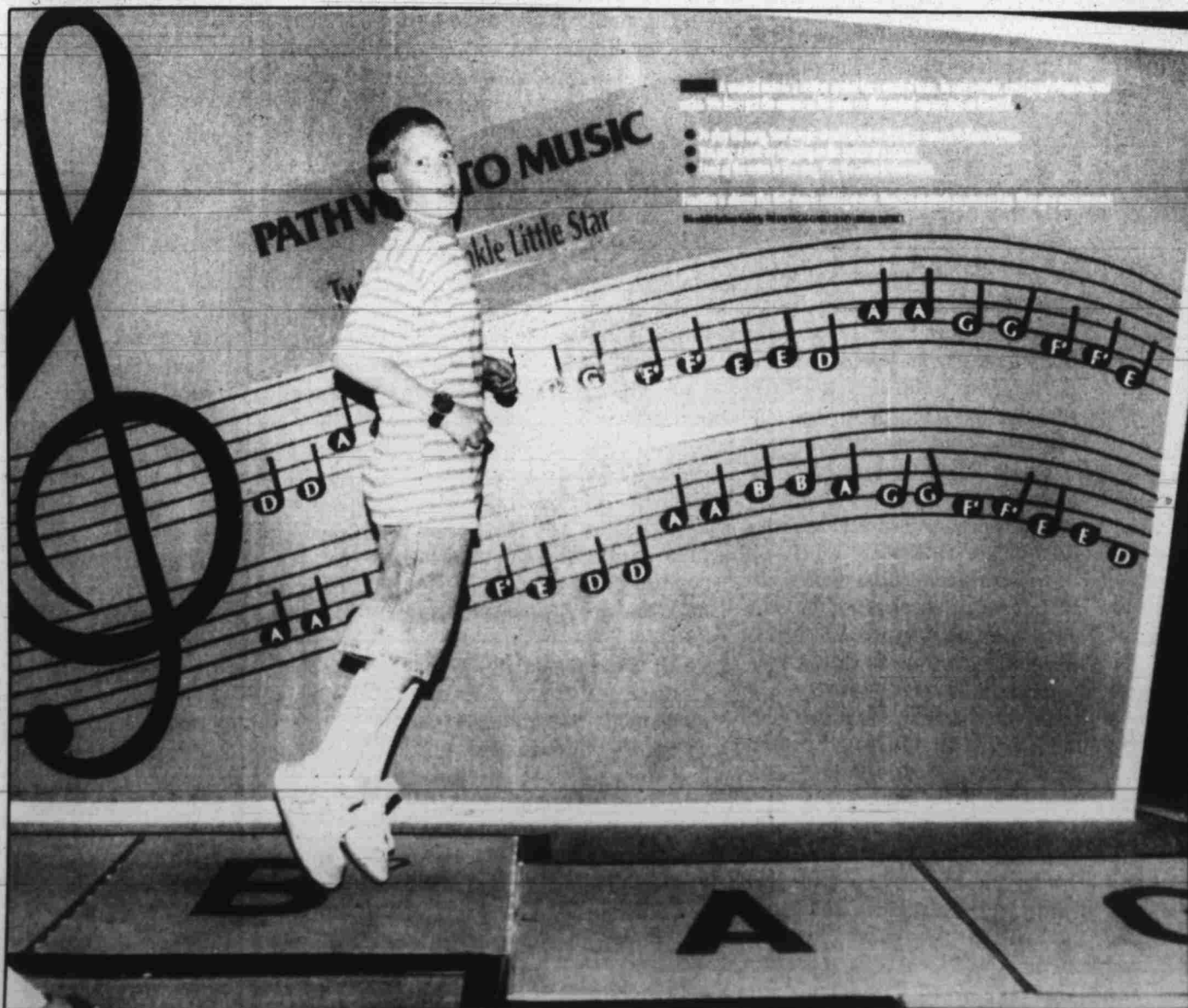


Whitney Wall, left, and Jennifer Berger attract electricity at the "plasma ball" exhibit.

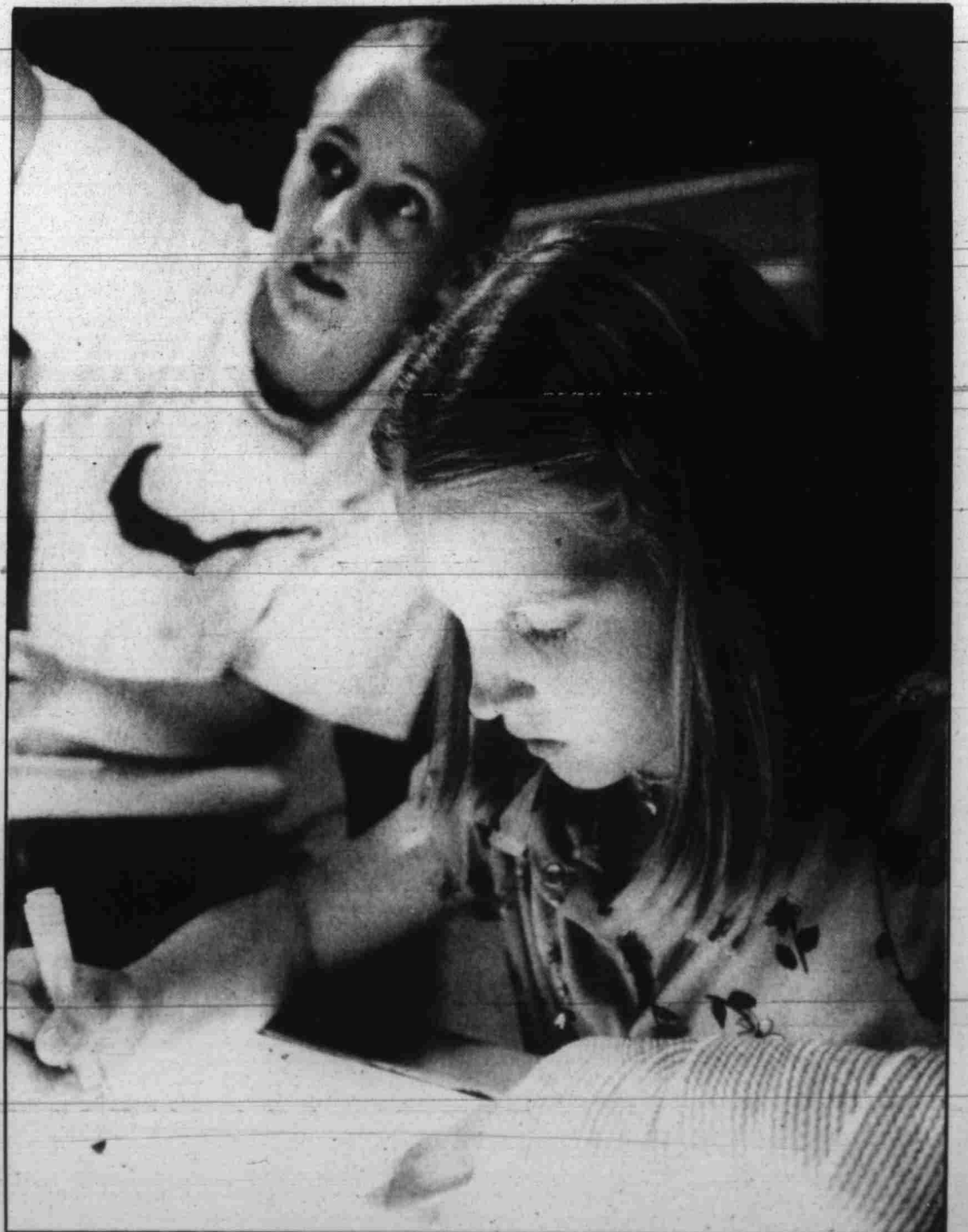

cheese and even marinated eggplant. We tried the calamari salad and the mozzarella; both were excellent.

Pizza, from about \$5 to \$7, were thin sliced and very tasty. Toppings included mozzarella, marinara, and even white with pesto. One pizza can easily serve as a full meal.

Pasta, reasonably priced from about \$7 to \$12, includes fettuccine with meat sauce, ravioli and lasagna, taglioni with salmon and asparagus, spaghetti with clams, and rigatoni with tuna. We tried the capellini angel hair pasta with tomatoes and garlic, which was exceptionally tasty.

For heartier appetites, dinner entrees available were wood roasted chicken, grilled marinated veal chop, spit fired roast pork, and even a pan sautéed salmon steak.

### Consumer tip

The Nevada Attorney General's office provides the following consumer information:

A consumer recently received a check in the mail for \$1,500, seemingly a "dream come true." A letter attached to the check proclaimed "the money is yours, just sign and cash the check."

Closer scrutiny of the letter revealed that this was simply a solicitation for a loan, at an exorbitant interest rate.

While this practice appears to be deceptive, it does not violate the law. Consumers must be wary, however, to use caution with an unexpected check sent by mail.

If you choose to endorse and cash such a loan agreement check, be sure to read all the fine print. Pay particular attention to interest rates and minimum monthly payments, and be aware of what you're paying for.

The bottom line, there is no free lunch. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

# New doors pass 'slam' test

(NU)—As the world becomes a noisier place, North Americans are putting a higher premium on peace and quiet.

There's good reason for the trend. In 1990, a U.S. national conference on hearing loss concluded that with continuous exposure, even low-range noise like that made by the average vacuum cleaner operating at 85 decibels, can cause permanent hearing damage over time.

American seniors have a high incidence of hearing loss, compared to Third World people in rural environments who experience little deterioration in hearing, even in extreme old age.

In the consumer marketplace, the result has been a flood of dishwashers, furnaces and other appliances promising "noise-free" and "whisper quiet" operation. But until recently, no one really thought much about one effective step people can take to reduce household noise—shut the door.

"It was so logical, so obvious, yet everyone in our industry was missing it," says Dave Murray, marketing manager of Premdor Limited, a major North American door manufacturer.

For Premdor, it was a thunderbolt of insight that soon gave

consumers a new choice in interior doors. In spring '94, the company led the way into the market with a solid, composite wood product, "Safe 'N Sound."

The new door had undergone extensive laboratory tests showing it provided more than 75% better protection against sound and was more than five times as fire-resistant as the hollow core door which dominated the market.

### The test

To ensure a quiet home, pay

particular attention to finishing details. Sound can come through gaps or holes, so watch for well sealed walls and electrical outlets.

Murray suggests slamming a few doors as you tour a new home.

"If the sound is tinny and the door feels light, odds are it's a hollowcore door," he says.

"For areas where privacy or noise reduction is important, consider upgrading to a solid door."

# Roof care tips offered

(NU)—A new roof that's chosen carefully and installed correctly should require minimal maintenance. And to assure it will offer years of value and quality service, the Asphalt Roofing Manufacturers Association (ARMA) offers these tips:

- Inspect the roof at least once a year for possible damage.

- Keep downspouts, gutters and roof surfaces free of leaves, twigs and other litter so water will drain freely.

- Never allow water from a downspout to pour onto the roof below to avoid excessive loss of

protective mineral granules; keep the downspout connected to the gutter that drains the lower roof.

- Keep nearby trees trimmed to prevent scuffing of the roof by branches or possible damage from falling limbs. Keep any climbing roses or vines trimmed.

- Don't walk on the roof. It's dangerous and could damage the shingles. To check on the condition of the roof, use binoculars as you circle the roof from the ground. When necessary to work on the roof, use ladders, workboards or scaffolding.

There will also be a report on the Heritage account administered by NDOW. On Saturday morning, the commission will hear several petitions and appoint a deer harvest management task force, set to get underway at 8:30 a.m.

Upland game bird and waterfowl seasons are on the Saturday afternoon agenda, along with the

setting of seasons and bag limits for the hobby collection and possession of unprotected reptiles.

#### Catfish planted

NDOW is scheduled to stock channel catfish today in ponds at Floyd Lamb State Park, Lorenzi Park and Sunset Park.

The limits are three game fish per day and three in possession. This means an angler may have no more than three game fish in possession at any time.

Valid fishing licenses are also required for everyone aged 12 and older fishing at the ponds.

## Consumer tip

The Nevada Attorney General's office provides the following consumer information:

Recently, a consumer inquired about the safety of storing food in plastic garbage bags. The consumer pointed out that the bags contain insect repellent to keep insects out of the garbage can. I'm sure we've all seen people use these bags for food products, such as wrapping a large loaf of bread.

Research into this problem produced a response from a large waste bag manufacturer. The company states that while there are no elements in the bags that are known to be unsafe, the FDA has not designated the ingredients to be of "suitable purity" for use in food packaging materials. The manufacturer therefore cannot recommend their product for use in food storage.

Just to be on the safe side, use those bags specifically designated for food storage purposes. Leave the garbage bags for the trash can.

## Hunter safety class set

Henderson Parks and Recreation Department, with the Nevada Department of Wildlife, will offer a workshop aimed at improving hunters' safety knowledge, from 9 a.m. to noon July 21 and 25, at the Kesterson Valley View Recreation Center, 500 Harris St.

The workshop is open to those age 12 and older, and is designed for beginning hunters and seasoned hunters in need of a refresher course.

Approximately 30 million hunting licenses are purchased every year, and hunting ranks as one of the nation's top 10 outdoor activities. Surprisingly, it also ranks as one of the safest.

"Hunting is largely a team sport because each hunter is so dependent upon others to obey safety codes and it's up to every hunter to know and follow these codes," said recreation coordinator John Sefton. "HPRD is proud to co-sponsor such a vital, safety-oriented program."

The workshop focuses on the role of a hunter in relation to wildlife, environment and fellow hunters. By stressing the importance of behaving responsibly, hunting-related accidents have continued to decline nationally as well as in Nevada.

According to Sefton, proper hunting attire, basic weapons safety, shooting fundamentals, and general hunting courtesies all contribute to making the sport safe.

NDOW will cover these topics during the two-day program. Participants successfully completing the workshop will earn a hunter's safety card.

"Hunting requires a lot of education and experience," said Sefton. "Safety is as important, even more important, as any other element of the sport."

Workshop seating is limited and early registration is recommended. The cost is \$5.

## Sewage lagoons: No significant lake impact

A finding of no significant impact was issued by Lake Mead National Recreation Area Superintendent Alan O'Neill for projects to expand sewage lagoons at Temple Bar on Lake Mead and Katherine Landing on Lake Mohave.

The finding follows earlier public review of an environmental assessment of the projects.

Rapid increases in visitation and changes in environmental

regulations have made the existing sewage lagoon systems at Temple Bar and Katherine Landing, both in Arizona, inadequate to accommodate increases in wastewater flows and remain within standards.

A consent order was issued by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, for which a cooperative agreement was developed to bring systems into compliance with regulations.

# Protecting boats with fenders

Until I purchased my big boat (SLO POK III) many years ago, boat fenders to cushion the boat between a dock or another boat was not a major concern.

When the need presented itself I would just tie one of my seat cushions on the gunwale. Seemed to work most of the time, if I tied them correctly to allow for the up and down movement of the boat.

However, my boat did have some deep hull scratches as a result of my improper application of having a cushion trying to be a fender. Any boat will accumulate dings and scuffs in normal operation but the damage was a result of my bad judgement.

Fenders come in a wide variety of shapes and sizes. Some are color coordinated to match boat colors and the cost varies as much as there are colors. Some are inflated by air, some are filled with foam and most are easily cleaned with liquid soap.

The fenders I had on my big boat came with the purchase and

as I had my rig in a slip, they received constant use. Just before I traded it in for my current boat, I noticed they were showing compression signs where they were coming in contact with the slip sides.

I remember they were also hard to clean. I had to use powder cleanser and a lot of elbow grease. I assume the outer finish had worn off. They were not new when I bought the boat, so age was a factor.

Protection with dock cushions attached permanently to the dock afford a buffer, and won't swing out of the way with water motion.

Corner mounted dock wheels and dock bumpers can certainly reduce hull damage when entering or leaving a slip. They really do work, as my employer installed a wheel for his boat slip

and I saw it used firsthand.

Naturally, you should always check with marina management for permission to add anything to your slip (before going out and buying dock accessories).

And remember, dock bumpers are not meant to replace regular boat fenders. You would need them if you want to tie up along side another boat.

One problem I had was where to store the fenders. I had permanent fender locks attached to the hull, but once under way, having four big fenders presented a challenge to find an out-of-the-way storage area. There are stainless steel fender holders that can be mounted to your bow rail or fender bags that can be fastened to bulkheads. I stored mine under a seat.

For my present boat, I have four small size fenders stored in the side compartment. What size fenders to buy? I would recommend using the ratio of 1 inch of diameter for each 5 feet of boat

length. My 24-foot Bayliner had 8 inch by 20 inch fenders, so I had more than enough but don't be skimpy when protecting your boat. Big fenders offer the most protection.

Hope you are enjoying the hot weather. As the water warms up more boaters will become swimmers. Take it easy the first few times you go out. Swim in areas where you can stand up if you get tired. Check out local pools to see when they offer swimming lessons. Know your limits once in the water. Make this a safe summer.

Until next time...keep your bilge dry.

## Tips to select lawn care service

Opening the Yellow Pages to lawn care services and picking the catchiest name is not the ideal way to find a lawn care company. By taking time to ask a few simple questions, you can make a sound decision when choosing a lawn care service and avoid possible problems later.

**Is it licensed?**  
Nearly all states require lawn care companies to be licensed. Qualifications vary from state to state, but having a license is one indication the company is reputable and operating legally.

**A good track record?**  
Ask neighbors and friends who have dealt with the company if they were satisfied with the service they received. You can also call

the Better Business Bureau or the state or local consumer protection office.

**Association affiliation?**  
Affiliation with a professional association, like the Professional Lawn Care Association of America, helps members stay informed of new lawn care developments.

**Teach solutions?**  
Lawn services generally apply fertilizers and pesticides. You may be the one who mows and waters, and poor watering and mowing practices can lead to disappointing results. The company should advise how it plans to take care of the lawn and what you could do to keep it in good shape.

Take some cool advice — slow down when the weather warms up, and take time when selecting a lawn care service. Chill out because cooler heads make better decisions.

### Birth control after baby arrives

When to resume sexual relations following childbirth is an important question in reestablishing closeness with your partner. As with other activities in the postpartum period, you will need to be patient while your body heals. Nevertheless, you should still have a contraceptive plan in mind by the time you come home from the hospital.

Most couples can begin to have intercourse when the woman's body has healed and she feels comfortable. This usually takes at least a few weeks, but check with your physician about the best time to resume sex. If you experience some vaginal dryness following childbirth, try using a lubricating jelly.

Some women mistakenly believe that until their period resumes (usually in six to eight weeks), pregnancy is impossible. Remember,

ovulation occurs two weeks before menstruation, sometimes soon after delivery. So be prepared.

Until a woman's menstrual cycles are regular after having a baby, the contraceptive method known as natural family planning or periodic abstinence (also called the "rhythm method") will be unreliable in preventing pregnancy. Additional protection is recommended, such as a spermicide combined with a barrier method like a diaphragm or condom. If you were using a diaphragm before childbirth, you probably will need to be refitted for a larger one. This can be done at your six-week postnatal checkup. An intrauterine device (IUD) could also be inserted then.



One of the most effective reversible methods of contraception is the birth control pill. A new pill cycle can be started about two weeks after delivery, for non-nursing women. A long-term contraceptive

implant is an option for women who don't want to get pregnant again for several years.

If you plan to use birth control pills while you are breast-feeding, discuss this with your obstetrician before starting. Birth control pills that contain estrogen may cause a slight decrease in the amount of milk you produce. Some women choose to use the mini-pill, which does not contain estrogen, while they breast-feed. It has only one hormone,

progesterone, and does not interfere with milk production.

Never rely on breast-feeding alone for contraception. Although nursing can delay the return of menstrual periods for several months, protection against pregnancy is unreliable.

Couples who no longer desire children sometimes choose sterilization — either tubal ligation for the woman (which can be performed during hospitalization for the delivery) or vasectomy for the man. Discuss this carefully, since sterilization usually is irreversible.

With patience and good contraception, you can resume a safe and satisfying sex life.

### Solution-oriented living

Solution-oriented living puts the focus on solving problems. Too often we concentrate on the problem and minimize the problem solving process. Everyday life challenges us with questions like: "How did I ever get into this mess?" "What can I do about that problem?" Name it, we all have our problems. We are each concerned primarily with our own problems. We recognize daily life presents situations and difficulties needing remedies and resolutions.

Misunderstandings and individual points of view create tension, stress and conflict. People fight, argue and sometimes go to extremes as a result of disagreements. We believe many people are in troubled relationships because they have never learned or applied the skills of peaceful resolution.

Our formula for healthy living and problem solving begins with a commitment to harmony and a goal to have honest relationships in which everyone's wants and needs are valued. Solution oriented

living requires very basic agreements on the part of the participants. Once an agreement is made it must be respected and honored by each person. Keeping agreements builds trust, the cornerstone of strong, healthy relationships. The following are steps we suggest for solution-oriented living:

- When a disagreement arises, stop before it escalates. Agree that a problem exists.
- Take time to cool off or calm down if there is too much tension. Have an understanding the cool off will always be followed by a problem solving session.
- Sit down together. Define the problem clearly and specifically. Put it in writing.
- Interaction: Take turns sharing. Be very specific about what you each want. Do not be defensive but rather listen with the intention of really understanding what is important about the problem to the other person. Be sure you understand each others' want or need. Write these below your defined problem.
- Brainstorm. Together

develop a list of potential solutions. Make compromises. Your list should contain several options and alternatives. We suggest you have at

least three solutions from which to choose.  
• Agree on a solution with which both of you can live.  
• Recognize that change may be needed if the solution does not provide the results both of you were seeking. Never break an agreement. If you want to change or modify the agreement discuss it together. If necessary, begin the process over.  
Remember to develop and keep a spirit of good will. A positive approach where both people believe they are valued and important to each other creates an atmosphere conducive to cooperation in the solving of disagreements. In



relationships that have trust as a foundation both people share in establishing the quality of an ongoing life experience that yields happiness and peace of mind. Solution-oriented living works. Commitment, honesty and good communication provide the framework for solutions where once only arguments and conflict existed.

## It's not how you say it, but if you mean it

In today's business world, hiring managers seem to value veracity over verbal skills, according to a recent survey.

Close to a third (32%) of executives rated honesty and integrity as the most critical qualities in a job candidate. This represents a major shift from the results of a similar survey conducted in 1990, in which verbal skills were ranked number one. At that time, honesty received only 7% of the vote.

Developed by Robert Half International Inc., the world's first and largest staffing services firm specializing in the accounting, finance and information technology fields, the survey was conducted by an independent research firm, which polled 150 executives from the nation's 1,000 largest companies.

Executives were asked, "Other than the ability and willingness to do the job, what is the one quality that impresses you the most about a candidate during a job interview?" Their responses: Honesty/integrity, 32%; Enthusiasm, 29%; Verbal skills, 28%; Appearance, 3%; Sense of humor, 3%; Other/don't know, 5%.

In the 1990 survey, 38% of executives ranked verbal skills as the most critical factor during a job interview. Enthusiasm received the second highest score

in both surveys, and it was favored by 24% of those polled in 1990.

"Today's more demanding and competitive business environment places greater importance on honesty and integrity," said Max Messmer, chairman and CEO. "Managers need people they can count on—it's the very core of a productive relationship and the cornerstone of the team-building process.

"Because references have become more difficult for companies to obtain, hiring managers are taking more time to determine a job candidate's character and candor during the evaluation process. Without such attributes as trustworthiness and integrity, even the most highly skilled and articulate job seeker or employee will have limited success," he said.

"While it is important to really sell yourself and emphasize the positive during an interview, remember that sincerity counts," said Cecil Gregg, Robert Half's area manager for Las Vegas. "If you're not honest about your skills and experience, the employer may hire you based on someone you're not, which ultimately will be counterproductive to you both."

Covering the lives of some 13 women who experienced the hardships of life on the mining frontier and making brief mention of at least 100 others for whom there was insufficient material to flesh out a lengthier account, Zanjani focuses on questions

asked at the time and of interest to readers today.

Who were they? How did they come to take to the deserts and mountains with golf pan, pick hammer and burro? What was their relationship with men in the same line of work? Marital status? Did they prosper?

Chronicle the California Gold

Rush from 1848 and beyond, the Klondike at the turn of the century and Nevada's Tonopah-Goldfield period, 1900-1910, the author sets forth a new paradigm for the study of mining in the West and adds new elements to the ongoing debate on the nature of women's contributions to history.

All future work on this area of

our past will begin with this pioneering study. Be sure your library includes a copy.

## Improve home security

(NU)—Crime statistics show at least 1.5 million homes will be broken into this year. More and more, home burglaries don't involve bad guys breaking through windows or doors.

That's because burglars now have a way to coax open many automatic garage doors, offering a quick and quiet route into a home. With the garage door open, they can pull their vehicle inside and close the door for undetected loading.

Police logs show burglars using electronic "code-grabbing" devices can intercept the access code sent by a remote control, which activates the garage door opener. Once they steal the code, it's like having keys to the garage.

Unfortunately for homeowners, these devices can be found in some mail order catalogs. Burglars who use the devices often leave no sign of forced entry, making it difficult to figure out how missing property disappeared in the first place.

There is protection available, however, now that garage door opener technology has been developed to stop thieves. Units such as the Quantum rolling code opener from Wayne-Dalton change the access code each time a door is operated by the remote, rendering burglars' devices useless.

Burglars also use store-bought replacement garage door openers to get into homes. Older openers, and some current models, have factory pre-set codes that homeowners are instructed to change after the opener is installed, but many do not.

"I've witnessed demonstrations where replacement openers were used to raise many garage doors of unsuspecting people who hadn't bothered to change their codes," said Joe Mele, a retired Orlando police force lieutenant and security and crime professional.

According to the Insurance Information Institute, nine out of 10 home burglaries are pre-

ventable. Mele, who appears frequently on network television discussing home security, recommends that homeowners take the following precautions:

•**Garage Door Openers:** Consider a rolling code opener when buying new openers. Change codes on openers with preset codes.

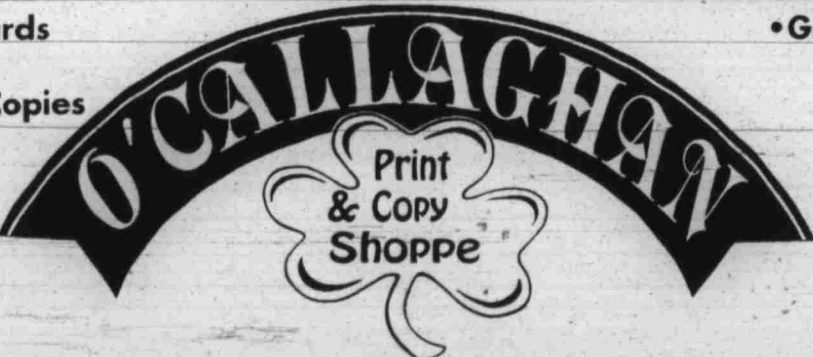
•**Entry Doors:** Outfit exterior doors with good hardware, including quality dead bolts and heavy-duty strike plates. When choosing a new steel entry door, be sure it has a dead bolt or can be fitted with one. Not all can.

•**Mailbox:** Use a mailbox large enough to hold all daily mail. Mail sticking out of a box is a sure sign that no one is home.

•**Home Appearance:** Be sure the home looks occupied. Take in the newspaper and turn off porch lights in the morning.

## Joseph M. Benoit

Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Joseph M. Benoit recently returned from a six-month deployment to the Mediterranean Sea aboard the guided missile destroyer, USS Mitscher.

A 1982 graduate of Basic High School, he is the son of Ronald M. and Anne M. Benoit of Henderson.

Benoit was one of more than 300 sailors who sailed from Norfolk, Va., more than 30,000 miles on the ship's maiden tour while operating with the USS Enterprise Battle Group. The group included nine tactical aviation squadrons, seven surface combatants and two submarines.

In addition to serving as the

premier platform in providing Tomahawk missile strike data updates to other ships in the group, the Mitscher participated in more than a dozen fleet exercises with U.S. Navy, NATO and other allied assets.

The AEGIS-destroyer is one of the most powerful warships ever put to sea. The computer-based weapons system is the heart of the ship's war-fighting capability. It centers around a powerful radar enabling the crew to detect, track and fire on more than 100 targets at a time.

During the tour, Benoit visited Crete, Cyprus, Egypt, France, Greece, Israel, Italy, Sardinia, Slovenia, Spain and Turkey.

# Cult heroine Kapture returns to her old *Stalking* grounds

Fan favorite Mitzi Kapture, formerly of USA Network's *Silk Stalkings*, makes her post-maternity return to acting in *Perfect Crime*, a fact-based USA original drama premiering on Wednesday, July 9.

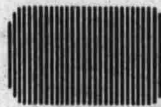

superstar.

The 33-year-old California-born, Atlanta-bred actress confesses she still is a little startled and overwhelmed by the mail that continues to flow in regarding her work on *Silk Stalkings*, the sleek and sexy USA mystery series in which Kapture and co-star Rob Estes (*Melrose Place*) starred for 100 episodes.

As Sgt. Rita Lee "Sam" Lance and Sgt. Chris Lorenzo, Kapture and Estes investigated crimes of passion in wealthy Palm Beach, Fla. When the show premiered in 1991 (CBS aired it in a late-night slot along with USA for the first two seasons), most of the attention focused on how sexy *Stalkings* was.

But a funny thing happened during the series' run, as the writers made Rita and Chris more complex and less reliant on their high-octane sex appeal.

Concurrently, Kapture began to notice that the volume and tone of her fan mail began to change and found, to her surprise, that her work in this little cable series was beginning to touch female readers across the board.

"Some of the initial mail I got early on was about the sexiness of the show, and then it moved into (Chris') and my relationship," she recalls. "Then, amazingly, a lot of the mail I got, and still get, was from young women, like 12 to 17. They're having a hard time in their life. They don't know who their mother is. This one girl who had run away said that my character helped her see that a woman really can turn her life around, that she can achieve what she wants to achieve -- and that gave her hope.

"That really means so much (to me), when you're in a 14-hour workday and you're going, 'What am I doing? I am so exhausted.'

Then you read a letter like that and realize you're having an impact, even in a show that you don't think is likely to have that effect."

Youngsters weren't the only fans, however. Nursing home residents wrote that *Stalkings* got them through many a restless night.

Kapture and Estes realized that their show had an authentic cult following.

As the fifth season rolled around, however, dramatic changes were in the air. The 100 episodes the show needed to merit optimum marketability in syndication soon would be in the can, and Estes previously announced he planned to leave the show at that point.

Kapture was pregnant and announced she, too, was leaving and would take a year off after the birth to be with her newborn.

Their characters, Chris and Rita, were married in the fall of 1995, but shortly thereafter, Chris was fatally shot and Rita walked off to

face an uncertain future. Producers overhauled the show and hired two new leading actors, but fans loudly rejected the new team. (Executive producer Stuart Segall blames the fact that the new characters were too reminiscent of Chris and Rita. A second revamp with new characters played by Chris Potter and Janet Gunn has proven more successful.)

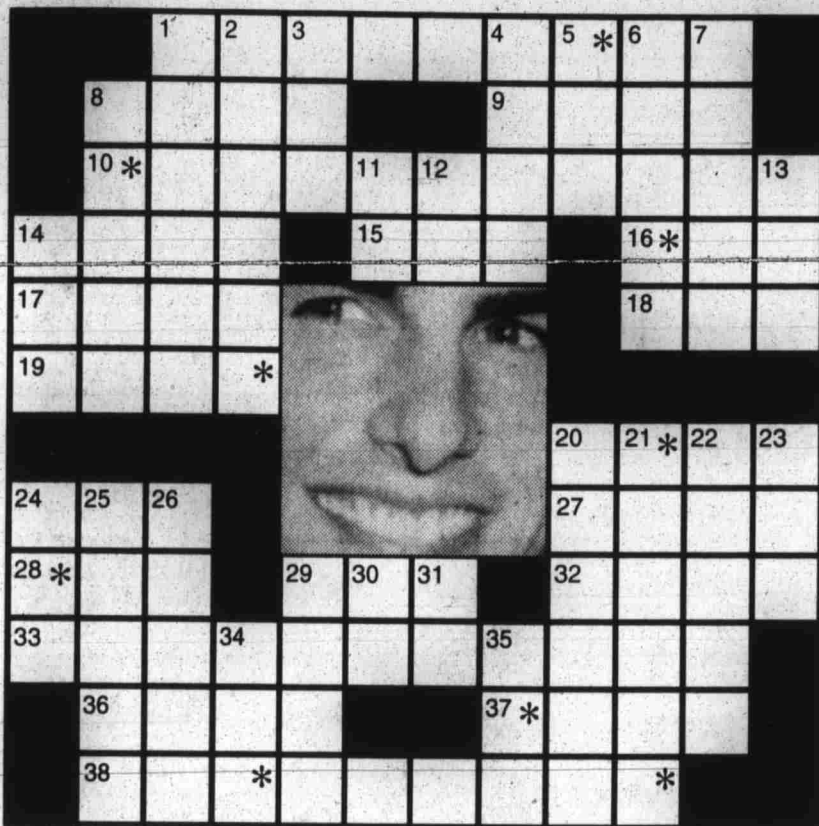
Madison Kapture made her grand entrance on Jan. 24, 1996, and, while the actress jokes that producers were hovering around the delivery bed asking whether she was ready to go back to work, Kapture made good on her vow to spend time with husband Bradley and her baby daughter for a full year.

Now, at almost 18 months, precocious Madison has developed a strong independent streak.

"She already knows what she wants to wear -- picks out her clothes every day," Kapture says. "On her birthday, she went from taking a few steps holding my hand to, within two weeks, walking by herself. She didn't want to hold my hand anymore."
